

'Drought discerned in BRS rule' 7 killed, 22 hurt in

• KRMB alert on shortage of water came in October itself

PNS HYDERABAD

The Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) had discerned drought in October 2023 and had called for judicious use of the available resource in the Krishna river basin. A three-member committee meeting was held on 6th October, 2023 for water management.

Subsequently, the Water order was released on 9 October,2023, stating: Committee observed that, as per the forecast available, there may not be sufficient inflows in these reservoirs during the balance period of 2023-24." Sources said, "The then Bharat Rashtra Samithi government itself

admitted, as per the minutes of the meeting, that there was already a shortage of water in the state and drought conditions had started. State Irrigation Department ENC (General) C. Muralidhar accepted the drought conditions and signed the minutes at that time. So, the drought started completely under the rule of the BRS government.

The Water order said that the concerned Chief Engineers of both States will be responsible for judicious delivery of water. Still, last year Andhra Pradesh used 51 TMC more than its share, while Telangana used 18 TMC less than its entitlement. Andhra Pradesh had used more than its share in the basin for 2023-24 by 03rd October 2023.

10 IAS officers to monitor drinking water situation

Cop-turned realtor hauled in 'land grabbing case'

When the landowners gave their land on lease to SK Developers in violation of the conditions of land assignment,

the then Chevella Revenue Divisional Officer cancelled all their assignment pattas. The Revenue officials resumed the land as per the rules and handed over that land to HMDA and Tourism Department. However, the assignees approached High Court and the court gave direction to the then RDO to dispose of the case after giving due hear-

ing to the assignees.
Even as the matter was pending, a group of persons, including TJ Prakash, Koneru Gandhi, Dasharatha Rama Rao and others allegedly abetted the petitioners to settle the matter by bribing government officials, the police said.

The petitioners signed agreements and paid some amount in order to get the land registered; however the accused cheated

No Muslim living in India will lose citizenship: Rajnath Singh

Says Opposition creating confusion on Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019



The rules for the implementation of the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019, were notifies in March this year, four years after the contentious law was passed by Parliament to fast-track citizenship for undocumented non-Muslim migrants from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan who came to India before



December 31, 2014.

"Now the opposition people try to create this illusion among our Muslim brothers that now you will be thrown out of the country. I want to tell my Muslim brothers that rest

assured we believe in the concept of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam', i.e, the whole world is our family. No matter what caste or creed one is born in or a follower of any religion or sect, we consider everyone as a member of our

family," Singh said.

"Sisters and brothers, anyone who is a Muslim living in India is not going to lose their citizenship. This kind of confusion is being created by our opponents. You go and tell our Muslim sisters and brothers about this," the BJP leader told the gathering.

The minister said the BJP has delivered on what it promised in its manifestos since the days when the party was known as Jana Sangh, whether it was the issue of Ram temple in Ayodhya or abolishing triple talaq.

"I only want to say one thing for the BJP, we do what we promise. Keiriwal lost 4.5 kg since arrest, alleges AAP

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has been rapidly losing weight since his arrest on March 21, senior AAP leader Atishi claimed on Wednesday and accused the risk by keeping him in jail.

As per official records from the Tihar jail, Kejriwal's weight was 65 kg, sugar level 139 (random blood sugar) and blood pressure (BP) was recorded 120/82 on April 1.

The weight remained at 65 kg, sugar level increased to 182 (RBS) and BP stood at 121/83 on April 2. His weight was recorded at 65 kg, sugar level at 140 (RBS) and BP was

Airborne human DNA aid forensic test

Airborne human DNA could be used in forensic analysis of crime sites that have been wiped clean of fingerprints and trace evidence, a new research has found.

Offenders are unlikely to totally prevent their DNA from being released into the environment, as human DNA can be found in the air after people have spoken or even so much as breathed, researchers

explained.
While collecting trace DNA, comprising human cells, is common in criminal investigations, researchers said "envi-ronmental DNA" (eDNA) from solid surfaces, soil, water and air are providing new

avenues for gathering evi-

Comparing samples taken from air-conditioning units in offices and homes, the research team, led by Flinders University in Australia, found that human DNA could be collected on the surfaces of these units and from the air, with air samples likely representing more recent occupation and surface samples representing prior occupation.

"Our study also showed that air circulating through airconditioning could collect human DNA, which further supports the idea that human DNA can be found in the air and settle on surfaces," said Emily Bibbo, a PhD candidate at Flinders University's College

The escalating perils of global terrorism



The recent ISIS-K attack outside Moscow has elicited widespread condemnation and intensified global anxieties surrounding terrorism

he recent ISIS-K (Khorasan) claimed attack outside Moscow, resulting in over 130 deaths and more than 100 injuries, warrants strong condemnation. Khorasan, a splinter unit of ISIS with roots in Iran, Turkmenistan, and Afghanistan, highlights four critical lessons. Firstly, politics, as observed by Thomas Hobbes in 'Leviathan,' remains deeply intertwined with human nature, with greed and fear driving conflicts. Despite global changes, power struggles persist, leading to conflicts like World War I and II. The post-World War II era witnessed the emergence of non-state actors, exacerbated by the Cold War and subsequent conflicts.

Secondly, intervening in internal conflicts, such as Russia's support for Assad against ISIS, can breed enmity and fuel terrorism. Thirdly, while international terror groups may appear subdued, they can resurge with renewed vigour, forming clandestine links in Central Asian Republics. Lastly, any retaliation against ISIS should involve cooperation with neighbouring countries to prevent spillover effects. This attack is eminiscent of past incidents in Russia, such as the 2002 Moscow theatre hostage crisis and the 2004 Caucasus hostage tragedy. The recent attack underscores vulnerabilities in Russia's security apparatus, with terrorists exploiting the ability to choose the time and place of their attacks for maximum media impact.

The global criticism of the attack reflects widespread concern over combating international terrorism. The US, despite geopolitical tensions, has shown commitment to addressing terror threats worldwide. However, trust deficits between major powers hinder cooperation efforts. While Ukraine denies involvement, the Federal Security Agency (FSB) is apprehensive about Ukrainian links to the attack, potentially complicating the ongoing conflict. China's expanding influence in Central Asia further complicates regional dynamics.

Central Asian Republics (CAR) face increasing terrorism threats, with non-state actors exploiting cultural ties for nefarious purpos-

ADHERE TO DHARMA AND SATYA

Dharma and Satya have profound implications on our actions and beliefs

hese two words sometimes confuse about what they convey. What is the relationship between these two? Don't they sound similar? They do. Then, there is 'kartavya' (duty). This word also is interlinked with these two. I will try to unravel their mystery in this article. Beginning with their definitions, dharma is what applies to everyone. For example, the nature of fire is to burn and cause it to burn. Similarly, dharma sustains life, virtue and moral duties on the planet Earth. The word Satya simply means facts like the Sun rising in the East. Some examples will shed more light on these two words. Starting with dharma, what is our svadharma or duty (kartavya)?

Lord Krishna has explained that when we are born we have certain qualities due to which we are suitable naturally to do certain activities. (4.13) This is our svadharma, i.e. our dharma. Some children are naturally inclined to play sports, and if allowed to do so excel. This is his dharma by which he entertains others and also earns his livelihood. Arjuna, who was a Kshatriya had a specific dharma due to his birth, which he was supposed to uphold. He spoke about protecting family dharma (values). If not practised, it could have caused many horrible consequences. (1.38-1.45) Svadharma defines an individual's duties.

Dhratarashtra was born blind. Therefore, he was unfit to rule even though he was the elder brother. His younger brother Pandu was enthroned by the king. Upon his untimely death, Dhratarashtra was made a stopgap



king till the eldest son of Pandu gained adulthood. This was a factual position, ie. Satya. Dhratarashtra's lineage was not entitled to be made king. But he refused to accept this fact, which was against dharma even though his eldest son Duryodhana was unfit to be made king. This resulted in the Mahabharata War, and his family was justly punished for trying to undo dharma. Dharma is worth practising for our good. It is meant for everyone to honour; one should follow it as far as feasible. Dharma is supreme; it is above everything. Satya has also many dimensions. It is a fact that all are similar souls. Satya should be used for correct behaviour, i.e. our activities should be based on it. For example, God should be worshipped by one and all. Satya is frequently situational. For example, children should study in school, but once at home should play. It changes or appears to change in our eyes or vis-à-vis our resources. For example, how much to eat? If not so hungry eat less and if quite hungry more. Similarly, if there is scarcity, the use of resources should be restricted. We have to always see what suits us and is appropriate. Our behaviour should match with the prototype in this matter. Truth is also what we perceive. Because we are too small to know the truth in its entirety, reality or essence. Truth can be known from scriptures like the Bhagavad-Geeta. Still, truth is limited; knowledge takes us to the level of humility, to be modest - a high quality.

Now let us turn to the relationship between dharma and Satya. Truth is an instrument; dharma is the system. Truth should always support dharma because truth is the basis of dharma. Earlier, i.e. in Sattvayuga and Treta yuga, truth and dharma were synonymous. Lord Krishna changed it in Dwaparyuga and made dharma superior to truth because truth is not habitually spoken in this yuga. That is the reason Yudishthir was asked to speak the confusing truth - "Ashavathama hatha it; narova kunjarova". Because dharma was at stake. The same rule applies today. We must always go by dharma; truth can be sacrificed for it. Let's, therefore, make dharma the basis of all our acts.

What is the conclusion? Both dharma and truth are important, but dharma is more important. Truth can be sacrificed for the sake of dharma,

Curb malpractices within private banks



Reports reveal widespread irregularities and malpractices, including gross misuse of public funds by top management, highlighting the urgent need for banking reforms

everal private banks in India are indulging in massive irregularities and malpractices with some of these irregularities highlighted in the Inspection-Reports of these banks ever since the Supreme Court ordered the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to make such Inspection-Reports of banks while and on the RTI Act. But now banks public under the RTI Act. But now even RBI is reluctant to disclose these Inspection Reports public under the RTI Act RBI should remove all confusion by complying original Supreme Court verdict in letter and spirit by making of Inspection Reports of all banks public on the RBI website. Moreover, it should be mandatory for all banks to put their respective Inspection Reports on their websites including all the previous ones. Considering the vast participation of public money in private sector banks, all private sector banks must be under the purview of the RTI Act. Already all employees up to the highest post of CMD are public servants according to section 46A of the Banking Regulation Act. RBI had to impose restrictions on the withdrawal of money for some time on a prominent private sector bank. The former CMD of another prominent private sector Bank is under arrest for serious charges of misappropriation of public money in the Bank. Inspection Reports of private banks revealed under the RTI Act by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reveal gross misuse of public money by top management. Another private sector bank is renowned for a large number of Non-Performing Assets (NPAs). Heavy fluctuation in share prices of certain private sector banks tends to doubt regarding safety of public money in private sector banks. Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation (a subsidiary of RBI) has to pay a maximum rupees five lakhs from state funds to each depositor of the bank including those in the private sector that collapse due to massive irregularities, which is public funding to declare private sector banks as "publicauthorities" under section 2(h) of RTI Act. An example is the closure of a private PMC Bank in Maharashtra which even caused the fatalities of several depositors. Many banks to boost their business provide excessively secured loans more than the real market value of the mortgaged property even though rules allow only some portion of the assessed value of the property for loan purposes. This can and must be effectively checked by formulating a rule with retrospective effect whereby banks may be required to close the loan account in case the borrower surrenders vacant possession of the mortgaged property unconditionally. Strict action under section 46A of the Banking Regulation Act should be taken against officers sanctioning excessive loans higher than the recovered amount by the sale of a mortgaged property when the concerned bank is already in the advantage of having sufficient margin money. A study may be made if some ban can be imposed on giving loans on self-occupied residential properties because, in case of default, the family of the loan-taker is the sufferer for fault/default of the loan-taker.

It is quite usual that many private banks often get blank papers, loan kits and cheques signed by the borrower and his family members as guarantors to misuse as per their convenience in case of default of loans. Borrowers generally sign such

blank documents without realising the consequences in a hurry to get loans. Erring banks do not give consumer copies of the loan kit to the borrowers who are thus always practically financial slaves of such banks. The system should be that a copy of the duly filled loan kit and cheques may be compulsori-ly sent by Registered Post to the borrowers, guarantors and a spe-cially set-up section of RBI with-in seven days of loan disbursal to ensure that banks may not be able to misuse any other paper earlier got signed blank in case of default. The same should be applicable for non-banking financial companies

(NBFCs).
The rule should be that all bank accounts of Government offices, LOAN KIT TO THE Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and state-run corporations (both central and state Governments) must be compulsorily only in public sector banks. Rather their employees should also have their salary accounts in any of the branches of the same public-sector bank for getting salaries through simple bank transfers. Government employees thereafter may shift funds to any bank of their choice. There were serious allegations of favouritism with a particular private bank for having salary accounts of employees of a Government department in Maharashtra because the wife of a heavyweight political ruler was a senior executive in that private bank. Maharashtra has otherwise also the unique facility of having the smallest public-sector bank having a widespread network of branches all over Maharashtra. Bank of Maharashtra was not merged with any larger public-sector bank only to retain its identity as a state-specific bank in Maharashtra state. Governments

both central and state should be duty-bound to promote public sector banks. Using public-sector banks will increase deposits and profitability of public-sector banks and ensure the safety of public

RBI bonds issued by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) should be issued only through public-sector banks and companies. Once there was a news item that China Central Bank had tried to raise its stake in HDFC Bank from 8 percent to 1.1 percent with China Central Bank already holding about 17.5 million shares in HDFC Bank. Even though the Indian Government subsequently tightened rules for increasing such stakes by neighbouring companies, the episode developed a feeling of uncertainty amongst investors in RBI bonds made through HDFC Bank. There should be provision of auto-renewal in RBI bonds at the interest rate prevailing at the time of maturity.

Frauds are reported through some bank employees misappropriating funds in such inoperative accounts where the amount is large. RBI should direct all banks to inform account holders about their existing balance and to approach banks either to make accounts operative or close these in a time-bound period after which all such balances may be transferred to Depositor-Educative-Awareness-Fund (DEAF). With the private sector dominating the banking sector, public money lying in inoperative accounts must not be retained by banks.

Frequent changes of account numbers by banks should be prevented by making it mandatory for all banks to allot 15-digit account numbers. Confusing and frequently changing account numbers

result in the bouncing of electronic fund transfers. Rather such a 15digit account number should be a unique one with banks being recognised by the first two digits of the account number. Such 15digit account numbers should also be for Public-Provident-Fund (PPF) and Senior Citizens Savings Schemes (SCSS) and other such deposit accounts under Government schemes.

Cover-page of pass-books of all banks should compulsorily have all details submitted in account-opening forms including nomineedetails. The inclusion of nominee details on pass-books will allow nominees to claim rights on the death of the account holder by going through left-out important documents including pass-books after the death of the account holder. All banks especially public-sector ones should have a common and uniform style of forms used for various banking purposes with provision to download the same after filling on the computer like is a facility available for application forms for passports. Additional facility to email computer-filled forms with necessary enclosures like copies of ID proof, PAN-card etc to the Bank can save huge manhours of bank staff in re-filling all details on the computer apart from eliminating any chance of wrong/incomplete entry in computers. Customers can go to banks just to put signatures on such emailed computer-filled forms. A system should be formulated whereby all requirements like Minimum Balance, interest rates, bank charges and other procedures may be uniform for all public-sector banks.

India, too, has been addressing the water needs of its citizens with the promise of tap water in each home, especially in the last decade, where nearly piped water access has reached 75% based water treatment plants serve such civilian needs. Water and Health (SEWAH) carried out by SWN in collaboration with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and data from ten other imple-

The study found that the water revenue in these water ATMs, priced affordably at Rs 1 per litre and Rs 5 per 20 litre, barely met the current local operating costs, such as raw water, electricity, and operator salaries. The field service costs, such as the technician's fee and high-value spare parts, overburden the operator's expenditure. The implementers also do not cover expenses relating to cluster supervision, quality monitoring, equipment or facility upgrades, etc.

Financial and Operating Performance of Water ATMs in 2023, warranted a relook at the sustainability of Water ATMs in India. This time, through a new lens, that would shift the total cost burden away from the operators and onto the taxpayers' rupee for govt-funded systems or CSR grants of willing companies for grant-funded systems. The report specifically proposed a result-based funding model in which SWEs received funding depending on the volume of water sold, facility up-time or revenue collected, and quality compliance.

A global result-based funding organisation, Uptime Catalyst Facility, selected SWN's iJal Stations for a sustainable performance-based incentive model for the implementers.


ROAD TO RECOVERY **POST-COLON SURGERY**

olon cancer, also known as colorectal cancer, begins in the ✓ colon or rectum, the two of which are part of the digestive system. It usually starts as small, noncancerous clusters of cells called polyps, which may lead to cancer. If left untreated, these tumors can spread to other parts of the body. Changes in bowel patterns, blood in the stool, discomfort in the abdomen, and unexplained weight loss are some of the symptoms of the disease.

Early detection through screening tests like colonoscopy can greatly improve the chances of successful treatment. Undergoing colon surgery, whether for colon cancer or other gastrointestinal diseases, is an important step toward healing and better health. The success of surgery goes beyond the operating room; it is heavily dependent on the quality of post-operative care and the patient's dedication to recovery. These surg-eries remove tumours, polyps, or damaged sections of the colon while keeping it functional. While surgery is important, the recovery time is important for long-term success and well-being.

To better understand the key to recovery, below are some essential ways for post-operative care:

- Follow post-operative instructions: It's important to follow the surgeon's and the medical team's postoperative instructions to the point. These instructions usually cover wound care, food restrictions, giving medications, and activity limitations. Neglecting or failing to follow these recommendations could lead to issues and extend the healing period.
- Effectively manage pain: To maintain comfort and encourage healing during the recovery phase, pain management is important. Painkillers will be prescribed by the doctor to help with discomfort. It's important to take these drugs as prescribed and to let the doctors know right away that you notice any concerns or negative effects. Also, complementary, and additional pain relief can be obtained from alternatives to drugs such as guided visualisation, heat therapy, and relaxation techniques.
- **Proper diet:** Sufficient water and nourishment are necessary for the recovery after colon surgery. But initially, certain changes in diet could be required, like switching from clear



liquids to solid foods gradually as allowed. To support the repair of tissues and increase immunity, a diet rich in fruits, vegetables, lean meats, and whole grains must be consumed in a balanced manner. Also, drinking lots of water to stay hydrated helps avoid constipation, which is a typical side effect following colon surgery.

- Physical activity: Rest is important during the initial phases of recovery, but to improve circulation, avoid blood clots, and rebuild strength, one must return to physical activity. As accepted, progressively increase the intensity and length of the activities. Gentle activities to start with include quick walks and mild stretching exercises. However, until the doctor gives the all-clear, patients must refrain from hard lifting and challenging
- Attend follow-up sessions: It's necessary to keep track of progress and address any issues or complications that may surface throughout the recovery by scheduling follow-up meetings with the doctor. Make sure that show up for all of the appointments on time, and be honest with the doctors about the signs, your experience recovering, and any doubts or questions they might have.
