BJP govt respects **Constitution: PM**

Even Ambedkar can't abolish it now

PNS JAIPUR

Amid opposition charges that the BJP was out to destroy the Constitution, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said that his government revered it and even Babasaheb Ambedkar would not be able to abolish it now.

Addressing an election rally in Barmer, Modi alleged that the Congress was standing with antinational forces and hit out at the opposition INDIA bloc for "trying to weaken" the country.

"The Constitution of the country is everything for the (BJP) government and even if Babasaheb Ambedkar himself comes, he cannot abolish the Constitution," Modi said.

The prime minister accused the Congress of trying to "destroy the Constitution" by imposing an emergency in the country.

"The Congress tried to destroy the Constitution by imposing emergency in the country and now it is taking

cover in the name of the Constitution to abuse Modi," the prime minister said. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had last month alleged that the "ultimate goal of Narendra Modi and the BJP is to destroy Babasaheb's Constitution" after BJP MP Anantkumar Hegde's statement that the party needs a two-thirds majority to amend the Constitution.

The BJP had dubbed Hegde's remarks "personal opinion" and sought clarification from him.

Dr B R Ambedkar was the Chief Architect of the Constitution. Without taking any names, Modi

said a party in the INDIA bloc has written in its manifesto about nuclear disarmament.

'Should a country like India, whose neighbours on both sides have nuclear weapons, think about eliminating nuclear weapons? I want to ask the Congress, on whose instructions your INDI alliance is working?"

CM REVANTH REDDY WARNS CHEATING MILLERS AND TRADERS

WILL CANCEL LICENCE'

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy warned of strict action against those who buy paddy from farmers at low prices. The Chief Minister issued orders to officials to crack down on millers who cheat farmers.

The Chief Minister ordered to cancel the trade licenses of millers and traders who buy paddy at low prices from agricultural market vards, stop custom milling and put them on the blacklist.

The Chief Minister reviewed paddy procurement and drinking water supply with top officials on Friday. Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and Information and Public Relations Minister P. Srinivas Reddy also participated.

The CM said that it had come to his notice that traders and millers have reduced prices due to moisture content in the paddy in some places. The CM appealed to farmers to dry paddy which contains high levels of moisture before bringing it to markets.The moisture content will be high if paddy is transported directly to markets from the fields. The Chief Minister asked farmers to keep the paddy dry to get a good price for their produce.

Officials have been asked to make suitable arrangements for drying The CM said that it had come to his notice that traders and millers have reduced prices due to moisture content in the paddy in some places. The CM appealed to farmers to dry paddy which contains high levels of moisture before bringing it to markets.





The combination of the polymers and nanoclusters resulted in a strong hydrogel with the ability to adsorb and degrade large amounts of microplastics, it was stated.

Most microplastics are a product of incomplete breakdown of household plastics and fibres.

The officials were also directed to address complaints immediately and to restore the drinking water

supply on a war footing.
The Chief Secretary will hold a review meeting on drinking water supply every day with top officials of Bhagiratha, Mission Municipal, Irrigation and Energy departments.

The special officers for drinking water supply to old districts have been directed to visit places where drinking water problems arise and take steps to solve the problem and bring it to the attention of higher officials.

The CM noted that drinking water supply was interrupted at a place in Hyderabad due to the officials' excessive action.

The Chief Minister issued orders to immediately remove those who intentionally blocked drinking water supply.

Strict action will be taken against those who damage the government's image. The CM also warned that action will have to be taken against officials if they ignore erring

The Congress has effective-ly cut off farmer's access to low-interest credit from banks for the next crop.

In addition, the Congress

government promised farmers and tenant farmers an input subsidy of 15,000 rupees per acre as Rythu Bharosa. If implemented promptly, farmers could at least get some money into their hands before the next planting season, which is only two months

Unfortunately, the last season's experience shows no hope of this happening. It also promised to pay an additional 500 rupees per quintal of paddy on top of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) as a bonus. A few days back, the Food Corporation of India (FCI) started procuring paddy from the last season. Once again, the Congress government has reneged and kept mum on this promise, too.

Currently, farmers' only option for raising funds for the next planting season is to approach money lenders for input costs. This means paying usurious interest rates ranging between 36 and 48

The average land holding in Telangana is a meagre 1.12 hectares (2.8 acres), and 86 per cent of farmers in the state are small and marginal. This makes for a precarious financial situation even when everything goes right. Crop loss in a single season is enough to push them into a

debt trap.
One shudders to imagine the situation when such small farmers lose their crops, but receive neither insurance nor compensation for their lost crops and are cut off from all institutional credit as well as timely input subsidies. We have been there earlier and saw our farmers sink into despair and commit suicides in the thousands per year.

The current Congress government's apathy is shocking. No Minister has conducted a field study to date. Instead of providing assistance and confidence to farmers, the Chief Minister is busy with politics, luring BRS MLAs into the Congress.

The CM has openly declared that his current priority will be his role as the state Congress president. There is no more time to lose. It's time the current government acknowledged its responsibilities and focused on saving our farmers from an impending financial disaster.

SC rejects plea seeking review of verdict on compensation to veteran

he Supreme Court has dismissed a plea seeking review of its judgement directing the Indian Air Force (IAF) to pay around Rs 1.54 crore as compensation to a veteran who contracted HIV due to transfusion of infected blood at a military hospital in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba in 2002. A bench of justices Dipankar Datta and P B Varale said the verdict of September 26 last year does not suffer from any

error warranting its reconsideration. "We have perused the review petition including the grounds urged in support of the prayer for review of the judgment and order dated September 26, 2023... The judgment and order under review does not suffer from any error, much less apparent error, warranting its reconsideration," the bench said in its April 3 order. "That apart, no other sufficient ground has been set up for granting the relief claimed in the review petition.



Conspiracy to impose Prez rule in Delhi: Atishi

Delhi Cabinet minister Atishi on Friday alleged that a big political conspiracy is being hatched by the BJP-led central government to impose President's rule in the national capital.



Karakat Lok Sabha seat. As part of the seat-sharing arrangement in the NDA, the BJP is contesting on 17 seats, the ID-U 16, the LJP-R of Chirag Paswan five and the HAM-S of former CM Jitan Ram Manjhi and the RLM one each.

Manipur violence: SC refuses to entertain plea seeking directions to quash FIRs

The Supreme Court has refused to entertain a plea moved by a transgender activist seeking directions to quash the FIRs registered against her for fasting until death to protest against ethnic clashes in Manipur.

A three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud, however, granted liberty to the activist, Malem Thongam, to approach the Manipur High Court for the redressal of her griev-

"The petitioner would be at liberty to move the High Court of Manipur in the exercise of



its jurisdiction under section 482 of the Code of criminal Procedure, 1973. Hence, we are not inclined to entertain a petition under Article 32 of the Constitution of India," the bench, also comprising Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, said.

Thongam began her hunger strike in the Delhi University

on February 22. She left Delhi for Manipur on February 27, where she continued her hunger strike at Imphal's Kangla western gate.
The Manipur Police arrest-

ed Thongam on March 2 on charges of attempt to die by suicide and promoting enmity between groups, but released her on March 5. A day later, she was arrested again on

charges of protesting in public. Manipur descended into chaos and untrammelled violence in May last year over a high court order directing the state government to consider including the non-tribal Meitei community in the list of Scheduled Tribes (STs).

'Rahul takes out Bharat Jodo but talks about breaking country'

Union minister Ramdas Athawale on Friday took a swipe at Rahul Gandhi, saying that although the Congress leader takes out 'Bharat Jodo Yatra', he talks about breaking

the country. He accused the grand old party of provoking Dalits and Muslims to keep them away from the mainstream, and also alleged that it destroyed the Constitution and imposed Emergency in the country.

Talking to reporters at the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's Raipur office 'Ekatma Parisar', he said, the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) has set the target of winning

On Prime Minister

Narendra Modi's barb on dynastic politics directed at the NC, PDP and the Congress, the NC leader said, "He (PM) rakes these issues when he comes here. We wait for his programmes so that he says something new.'

Abdullah said Modi, who has been in power for the last 10 years, only talks about 'parivarwad'. "The BJP is not

opposed to families in politics. They are only opposed to those families who are opposed to the BJP," he said.

"If you see the distribution of their mandates this time, almost one-fifth of it belongs to political families. The BJP has given tickets to the families of its leaders.

"If that 'parivarwad' is fine for the BJP, then why do they have an objection when it comes to us? It is only because we oppose them. We have been opposing them and we will continue to oppose them, the NC vice president said.

Softening stance

China responds positively to Modi's peace overtures, says it is for stability in relations

n the realm of international relations, the delicate nurturing of ties between nations often involves a mixture of diplomatic rhetoric, strategic manoeuvrings and the occasional statement to assuage tensions. Recently, two of the world's most populous nations, India and China, indulged in this exercise, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's comments on the border situation drawing a positive response from China. In an interview with Newsweek magazine, Modi underscored the importance of urgently addressing the ongoing border situation; he expressed optimism that through constructive engagement, peace and tranquillity could be restored. In response, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning emphasised the importance of "sound and stable" ties, highlighting mutual interests in regional peace and development. This response underscores China's commitment to maintaining constructive relations with India despite the border challenge. Mao's statement also sought to contextualise the border issue within the broad-



er framework of bilateral relations. Acknowledging the significance of the boundary question, she stressed that it should not overshadow the entirety of India-China relations. This perspective reflects China's nuanced approach to managing bilateral issues, advocating for dialogue, cooperation and strategic thinking to navigate differences.

The backdrop against which these statements unfold is the protracted border standoff that began in May 2020, following a violent clash near Pangong Tso. A research paper shared at the DGPs' Conference revealed that India's access to 26 out of 65 Patrolling Points (PPs) has been compromised. In Ladakh, an

estimated 1,000 sq km of territory has reportedly fallen under Chinese control. However, these figures have not been officially acknowledged. Subsequently, in June 2020, India and China withdrew their troops from Patrolling Point 14 in Galwan Valley. This was followed by disengagement from both the north and south banks of Pangong Tso in February 2021 and from Patrolling Point 17A near Gogra Post in August the same year. Despite numerous rounds of talks at the Corps Commander level, significant areas of contention remain unresolved. India's insistence on disengagement from specific regions, such as Depsang and Demchok, underscores the challenges involved in reaching a comprehensive resolution. The thawing of relations between India and China is not only crucial for both but also carries implications for the broader region and the world at large. As economic powerhouses and nuclear-armed States, their ability to manage their differences and cultivate stable ties is essential for regional peace and stability. Looking ahead, the path to normalised relations between India and China will likely be characterised by continued dialogue, confidence-building measures and pragmatic compromises. While the road may be fraught with obstacles, their shared interests provide a foundation upon which to build a more stable and constructive relationship.

harat Ratna Dr BR Ambedkar, born on April 14, 1891, will ever be revered for his contributions towards building a just and inclusive India. He was a guardian angel of social justice, a harbinger of inclusivity, justice and equality. As an eminent jurist, economist and social reformer, he dedicated his life to eradicating caste-based discrimination and uplifting the marginalised communities in our country. As the architect of the Indian Constitution, he ensured fundamental rights and safeguards for all citizens.

As his legacy continues to inspire

millions globally even today, standing as a beacon of hope for deprived communities striving for dignity and equality, there is a lot we can learn and inspire ourselves from his vision of social justice, which was profoundly rooted in the principles of equality, liberty and fraternity. He recognised the deep-rooted inequalities entrenched within Indian society, particularly the caste system, which relegated millions to a life of discrimination and oppression. He fought for the abolition of untouchability, which is against ne teachings of the Vedas. the Atrocious caste system had jolted him from within. To give shock treatment to Hindu society, he embraced Buddhism, which is so deeply rooted in Indian ethos and value system. He was not inimical to Hindutva. He had resentment against Hinduism but he was not opposed to Hinduism. He did not embrace any other alien religion though Islamic and Christian scholars tried their best to influence him. Coming from a very poor family, Dr Ambedkar suffered multiple social and economic hardships but he did not give up. He fought against the odds bravely. He was the 14th child of his parents. His father gave him good Zanskar and used to share stories and thoughts of great saints like Sant Tukaram, Sant Gyaneshwar, Sant Shiromani Ravidas, teachings of the Ramayana and the Mahabharata. He did his matriculation in 1908 from Elphinstone High School. He studied Economics and Political Science at Elphinstone College. In 1912,



he got a degree from Bombay

University. With a scholarship from Maharaja of Baroda, he went to Columbia University, New York City from where he got a Master's degree in June 1915 after completing his thesis on 'Ancient Indian Commerce.' In 1916, he went to the London School of Economics. In 1920, received the D Sc by London University! He also went to the University of Bonn, Germany. In June 1927, he was awarded a Doctorate by the University of Columbia. He was a rare Indian politician of his time who studied at Columbia University, LSE and University

of Bonn. Dr Ambedkar inspires us to imbibe the principle of 'Study and Struggle' to create an incredible niche for himself as an intellectual as well. His vision of social justice emphasised the importance of education and political representation for the oppressed castes, viewing them as essential tools for empowerment and emancipation. Honouring the martyrs of Jallianwala Bagh



As the nation commemorates the 105th anniversary of the Jallianwala Bagh massacre, it reaffirms its commitment to justice, equality and nonviolence

omen Sengupta, in his Spiece "Jallianwala Bagh revisited" published in his paper's April 10, 2022 edition on its 103rd anniversary, reflected, "This incident alone serves as a damning testament to the collective atrocity of firing upon an unarmed gathering." The actual number of casualties likely far exceeded the reported count. Somen further notes, "Dyer, facing the Hunter Commission in Lahore, ultimately lost his position with a measure of reprimand."

April 13, 2024, marks the 105th anniversary of this tragic episode. It was amidst the auspicious Baisakhi celebrations on April 13, 1919, that Punjab was engulfed in tragedy, as around 20,000 rural attendees congregated at Jallianwala Bagh, oblivious to the impending horror. Durgadas Vaidya, editor of Waqt newspaper, addressed the peaceful protesters who were voicing opposition to the oppressive Rowlatt Act, passed on March 21, 1919. The non-violent Satyagraha led by Mahatma Gandhi against the Act on April 6, 1919, culminated in his arrest



Dr. Satyapal. The unjust repercussions sparked widespread anger, leading to violent clashes, including the tragic killing of nearly 30 Indians on April 10 by police gunfire as they sought to cross Hall Gate Bridge into the civil lines.

However, at Jallianwala Bagh, the scene turned chaotic as Brigadier-General Reginald ('Rex') Dyer arrived unannounced. Dyer, with meticulous planning, ordered troops to open fire on the unarmed crowd, plunging the gathering into chaos and leaving an indelible mark on history and the land. The bullet-riddled walls and the well, where desperate individuals sought refuge, continue to evoke

The Jallianwala Bagh massacre claimed the lives of 379 individuals, with numerous on April 9 near Delhi, along others sustaining injuries. the justness of British rule in

The relentless firing of 1,650 India. Within India, the masunder Dyer's command many viewing it as an unparresulted in a bloodbath. alleled atrocity. Mahatma Moreover, Dyer's imposition of a curfew post-massacre exacerbated the tragedy, denying grieving families access to their deceased loved ones. The scale of suppression delayed the event's revelation in the media, only brought to light by courageous journalists like B G Horniman of Bombay Chronicle and later Amrita Bazar Patrika, prompting global leaders like Lenin to express solidarity with the suffering Indian populace. Professor K L Tuteja, a histo-

rian at Kurukshetra University, describes the massacre as a pivotal moment that drew sharp criticism both in England and India. Winston Churchill labeled it a 'monstrous event, an event which stands in singular and sinister isolation, while former Prime Minister Herbert Asquith deemed it 'One of the worst outrages in the whole of history. These reactions underscored the profound shock and dismay even among those who believed in

rounds by British troops sacre left a deep scar, with Gandhi's poignant response encapsulated the sentiment: "We do not seek to punish Dyer. We harbor no thirst for vengeance. We seek to transform the system that bred Dyer." The massacre significantly influenced the trajectory of the anti-imperialist struggle, bolstering forces that challenged British rule in India.

Prominent figures like Gandhi, Rabindranath Tagore, Jawaharlal Nehru and Annie Besant vehemently condemned the massacre, advocating for peaceful resistance against British colonial oppression. Gandhi relinquished the title of 'Kaiser-i-Hind,' bestowed by the British, while Tagore renounced his knighthood in protest. THE SPIRITUAL POWER **OF NAVRATRAS**


Navratras encapsulate a profound spiritual journey of detoxification and realignment

avratras come twice a year and mark the transition in seasons, winter-summer and summer-winter. According to Ayurveda, during this time, one should consume nourishing foods in minimal quantities to rid the body of the toxins collected during the rains. The nine nights and ten days of Navratri hold within them the energy of ten forms of shakti- shailaputri, brahmachari, Chandrakanta, kushmanda, skandmata, Katyayani, kaalratri, mahagauri, siddhidatri and paratha thus each Navratri has a specific purpose. In the Navratri weather changes, ie, various energies of this creation move from imbalance towards new normalcy, including our body. In these nine days, the prana shakti inside our body undergoes a process of re-alignment, ie from imbalance to new balance for the new season.

For this re-aligning the body has to be kept light. Therefore our ancients prescribed fasting or upvaas in these nine days. Upavaas has a much greater connotation than what it is generally misunderstood as — mere holding back from eating certain foods. At Dhyan Ashram, sadhaks observe Upavaas in their authentic sense, that is, giving up pleasure to observe austerities during sadhana. This is done by celebrating, eating food for energy, not sensual pleasure, following a niyam of the sadhana your Guru has given you — a mantra, dhyan or a tantric practice where senses are kept under strict control and the focus is your ishta deva and all your thoughts and actions during those days are devoted to the ishtadeva. Charity and service are an intrinsic part of such sadhnas.



Apart from fasting, there are certain mantras also which are chanted on these days for a complete body detox. For the beginner, these nine days may be divided into 3 parts of 3 days each for the three parts of the body — the region below the navel, between the navel and shoulders and the upper head region, corresponding to the energies of the goddess Saraswati, goddess Lakshmi and goddess Durga respectively. The 9 devis originate from these 3 devis which in turn have their origin in Adi Shakti. These 3 parts are further divided into 3 parts each, thus the body is divided into 9 parts in all.

In the first 3 days, the sadhak stops having spicy food and performs a navan at the morning and evening sandnya with the chants invoking ma durga. The offering of kala til along with ghrit is made and desi cows up and palash samadhi is used. In the next three days, sadhak stops intake of anna and only light foods are ingested to keep the body light. Havan for Ma Lakshmi is done at the two sandhya by making an offering of a sweet along with ghrit. In the last three days, the sadhak only consumes water and juice (not even milk as it is considered an animal product) and havan for Ma Saraswati is performed at the two sandhyas by making offerings of ghrit and guggal. On the 10th day, a complete fast is kept and once more Ma Durga or Ma Kali is invoked as on this day Ravan had invoked Ma Kali and Ram had invoked Ma Durga. This process brings about the required re-alignment. After this, the sadhak performs his sadhana and chants a specific mantra as prescribed by his/her Guru. With yog sadhna, all the energies that are invoked come to the sadhak. Navratras are days to prepare your body to accept the new energies of the coming season. For 9 days you re-align your body and after that on the 10th day accept new energies.

Most people lighten their bodies by fasting for 9 days, only to make it heavy on the 10th day by crowding to restaurants and liquor shops. It is something like you clean your room and after that, you bring all the garbage back to the room. Fasting or any such technique will bear fruits only if carried out with a sense of detachment, for evolution. Therefore it is of utmost importance to observe fasts in tandem with yogic practices such as the Sanatan Kriya to reap maximum benefits.

Battle lines drawn in western UP



As the battle intensifies, the BJP faces the formidable challenge of safeguarding its Hindu vote bank amidst the evolving electoral dynamics

very unique, a kind of first time, battle is being fought in politically significant 16 Lok Sabha seats of western Uttar Pradesh, which votes in the first phase on April 19 or the second phase on April 26. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's whirlwind tour of the region is largely to counter the not so visible division in the Hindu votes. While the attack has been more direct on the Congress (its manifesto to be more specific) but an eye has also been kept on the moves of the BSP.

This part of the state has two dominant communities — the Jats and the Muslims. The two together formed the part of former Prime Minister Chowdhary Charan Singh's electoral calculus. The Dalits, specially the Jatavs, numerically have the third largest presence. Charan Singh last contested a Lok Sabha polls in 1984 and managed to hold ground despite the Rajiv Gandhi juggernaut passing through the country. The Jat leader did not live very long after the polls and his traditional seat came to his son Chowdhary Ajit Singh in 1989. Here started the story of the shrinking of the fortunes of the Charan Singh Kisan politics.

Ajit Singh in 1989 committed the

grievous error of challenging his father's close lieutenant, Mulayam Singh Yadav's claim to the Chief Minister's chair of Uttar Pradesh. Mulayam Singh enjoyed backing of party veterans like Chowdhary Devi Lal and then Young Turks like Lalu Prasad Yadav and Nitish Kumar. Ajit lost and herein started the erosion in political stature of Charan Singh's family.

Mulayam Singh in the 1990s, pushed a combination of the Muslims and non-Jat landholding agricultural communities like the Yadavs, Tyagis and to an extent the Gujjars under the umbrella of Samaiwadi Party

This decade also saw rise of Dalit icon Kanshi Ram and Mayawati and their Bahaujan Samaj Party. Mulayam Singh initially sought an alliance with them to add large numbers of Jatavs to counter the Jat dominance, it, however, ended in a bitter dispute as Mayawati decided to piggy ride on the BJP support to become chief minister. So by the turn of the millennium west UP had three major political forces Samajwadi Party, BSP and the BJP, correspondingly shrinking the influence of Chowdhary Ajit Singh's Rashtriya Lok Dal and of course the

Entering into the second decade of the 21st century BJP had come to create its own set of lat leaders. With the rise in the Ram Mandir sentiments and arrival of Narendra Modi on the scene, consolidating the non-Jat, other backward classes (OBC) votes in addition to the upper castes created a Hindu vote bank which was best exemplified in the loss of Chowdhary Ajit Singh

and his son Jayant Chowdhary both in the 2014 and 2019 Lok Sabha elections.

Since 2019 a lot of developments have taken place. The region saw a huge farmer unrest which was expected to adversely affect the fortunes of the BJP in the 2022 assembly polls but that did not happen. The coming together of Jayant Chowdhary and Mulayam Singh Yadav's son Akhilesh Yadav was not of much consequence as chief minister Yogi Adityanath held on the challenge based largely on an affirmative administration and also much improved law and order

This time around another interesting battle is building up. Javant Chowdhary moving to BJP side initially looked to have a solved a lot of problem for the Gautam Buddh Nagar and a opposition alliance, which Tyagi from Meerut. In

quickly resolved their seats arrangement issues. However since then the third factor — BSP has entered the fray. The direct fight between the ruling alliance and the opposition block has now a third element to it.

The BSP's strategy in the distribution of tickets is to build its core vote bank of Jatavs by using discontentment among specific communities to its advantage and hoping that Muslims would support its candidates wherever they are in position of strength vis-a-vis the opposition alliance. How does that affect the BJP?

Playing on the bruised pride of the Thakur and Tyagi communities, on being ignored by the BJP, the BSP has fielded Rajput candidates in Ghaziabad and

Muzaffarnagar, it has played the most backward caste (MBC) card by positioning a Prajapti candidate against BJP's sitting MP Sanjeev Balyan. MBCs have remained with the BJP since the

On such seats where there is huge presence of minority voters and where the opposition SP-Congress alliance is seen to be strong, BSP has another strategy. It has fielded Muslim candidates from seats that have Muslim population to the tune of 40 to 45 percent. The presence of these candidates have made the contests very tight. Given the scenario, the challenge for Modi-led BJP is to not let its Hindu vote bank disinte-





Restoring glory is the goal!

anaging Director of Myraa Group Ajay Chauhan's inspirational path is proof of the strength of resiliency and willpower in the face of difficulty. When he was sixteen years old, he was responsible for providing for his family when they were forced to flee because of the total collapse of the financial system. The hustler, on the verge of bank-ruptcy, was forced to put his studies on hold in order to support his family! Taking the plunge into entre-preneurship and offering some thoughts on it, he says, "For me, it has been an extremely hectic trip from the start. It all began when I was only 16 years old, driven by the stark truth of my family's financial collapse to travel to a different city with just 1500 rupees and an enormous amount of resolve. The metropolis, with its frantic pace, turned into my hub for bustle. I had to take odd jobs to make ends meet, therefore I had to start from scratch and learn the ropes of the hospitality business."

Equipped with doubt and unmatched tenacity, he began his journey at the busy VT station by meandering around until he happened to find his first position in the hotel sector. He applied the same strict work ethic to every hospitality position, no matter how tiny, and he was well-versed in the inner workings of the restaurant industry from the ground up. A turning point was reached at one of the eateries! At his place of employment, a fortuitous meeting led to a change in focus towards recruitment. This change signalled the start of an adventure that would completely alter his course.

"However, things changed when I happened to run into someone by accident while waiting tables at a restaurant. I wandered into the recruitment industry, and all of a sudden, I had a new road ahead of me! At Al Taher, which served as my launching pad, I put in a ton of work. And when the chance presented itself, I jumped at it, and my tenacity enabled me to transform my faltering company into a major player on the world stage. Yes, the journey from modest beginnings to managing director of Myraa Group has been quite an experience. However, I wouldn't alter a thing. Since each obstacle has helped me become the person I am today," the speculator spoke to us in a tone that conveyed

a distinct kind of spirit. "Moving from the hospitality industry to recruitment marked a significant turning point in my career," he says, continuing with the same level of zeal.

'The choice to switch to recruitment after starting my career in hospitality was not taken lightly, but it ended up being one of the best ones for my professional path. The disparities between the two industries made it difficult at first, but I made the decision to face it head-on and adjust as needed. I am appreciative of the mentorship I got, which enabled me to make the adjustment." The adventure that shaped him into the person he is today started in 1995. He put everything he had into working fulltime at Al Taher, where he developed his client management skills and helped close the demand-supply gap. He soon left for the UK to seek a career in management course that served as the basis for a new chapter, and while working in the UK gave him experience, he began to doubt whether it was in line with his aspirations.

"Although going worldwide was a challenge, my life's events had equipped me to never give up. When the company underwent a restructuring in 1999, I recognised that the African market, which was then beginning to gather traction, had a lot of promise. I have to say that entering the African market was not easy, and the first three to four years were difficult without any significant clients. One pivotal milestone occurred in 2004 when, in spite of several challenges, including a short timeline, visa issues, and a dearth of technology, I managed to successfully hire 300 people for a project in Mali," he continues. After completing his management school and returning to India, he happened to speak with his boss, who had paid for his studies in the UK, about an unforeseen opportunity. The recruitment firm was about to close, so Ajay took the opportunity to suggest taking over. Along with the same tenacity and will, he traversed the complex terrain, turning the little hut into the cornerstone of a workforce that would eventually expand not just throughout India but the entire world! He continued, "Taking over the company when it was facing closure wasn't just a business move; it was about restoring its glory."

He revealed more such intriguing insights. "In February, we will have been together for 25 years, although it doesn't seem like that long. I'm glad I

took advantage of the chance to grow the business at the time and made it even better. My career with the company began when I decided to take a risk and transfer my emphasis to Africa, where prospects awaited. At the time, I was working with the Middle East market, but I also saw how saturated the sector was. My career was defined by the move from hospitality to recruitment, which also made me an entrepreneur." He reorganised the business in 1999 and set out on an arduous quest to acquire clients. The first major project involving the recruitment of 300 people for Mali in Africa in 2004 marked the beginning of new opportunities brought about by the expansion to Africa! His remarkable journey of diversification did not end there. Amidst the difficulties caused by COVID-19 in 2020, the firm changed its focus to contracting and building, landing a significant project in Madagascar. Investing in vocational skills training in 2019 demonstrated a dedication to upskilling the African labour force.

"Although obstacles are unavoidable, I have learned to view them as chances for improvement. Overcoming barriers has become simpler thanks to technological improvements like evisas and better diplomatic services. In addition, my robust net-work—which is based on mutual respect and trusthas been crucial in getting over obstacles. The pandemic had caused havoc, and manpower consulting had stopped. Everyone was going through a difficult period, and my people's safety came first. I had to make a difficult decision since I couldn't jeopardise anyone's safety. However, obstacles might occasionally present unanticipated chances. I had a moment to reflect and take a



step back during the break. It became evident to me that, in order to weather such storms in the future, I needed to diversify my business. At that point, the notion of going into contracting and building was raised. Since I witnessed some of my clients liquidate their businesses during the epidemic, I was initially hesitant to enter the industry. Álthough it wasn't a snap

choice, my long history of closely collaborating with African construction companies gave me the courage to take the risk."

He made the decision to take the risk because he was confident in his knowledge

and connections inside the construction sector. Although it took him some time to get the hang of the construction industry, he managed to succeed with the help of regional com-panies and the African government. The path has been full of benefits as well as hardships. Above all, it has enabled him to maintain the safety and well-being of his workforce. He made sure to include, "Since 2012, taking up marathon running has evolved from a pastime to a lifestyle decision that has taught me discipline, which I use in both my personal and professional life. Running has allowed me to have more time for reflection. This path has influenced not only my physical health but also my outlook on life, which goes beyond the workplace." Running is Ajay's escape from the boardroom; he has been pursuing this hobby for the last seven or eight years. His participation in marathons all over the world—from Berlin to Bhutan, Amsterdam to Mumbai-testifies to his

tenacity and resolve, both on and off the field.







The Royals had an excellent chance to register their fifth win on the trot and consolidate their totem pole position, but Rashid Khan's daring assault helped Gujarat Titans snatch a last-ball victory on Wednesday.

It might have come as a rude shock for the Royals at Fort Jaipur, and as such, they would want to treat it as an aberration and dish out a more refined outing against the Punjab side.

Mary Kom steps down as Paris **Olympics Chef de Mission**

Six-time world champion boxer M C Mary Kom on Friday stepped down as India's chef-de-mission for the upcoming Paris Olympics, saying she is "left with no choice" due to some personal reasons.

Indian Olympic Association (IOA) President PT Usha announced that Mary Kom had asked to be relieved from her position in a letter addressed to her.

"I consider it an honour to serve my country in every way possible, and I was mentally prepared for it. However, I regret that I will not be able to uphold the prestigious responsibility and would like to resign, owing to personal reasons," the 41-year-old stated in a letter to Usha.

"It is embarrassing to retreat from a commitment, which I seldom do, but I am left with no choice. I am there to cheer on my country and the athletes
