Chief Minister Revanth Reddy said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi is trying to deceive Telangana.

The CM slammed Modi saying that he did not give the Bayyaram Steel Factory and the Kazipet Railway Coach Factory to TG. Modi did not give funds and industries to Telangana, Revanth said.

"The BJP will scrap reservations. Modi should come to Telangana only after answering why the BJP is scrapping reservations for SCs, STs and OBCs and why he had failed to grant the assurances in the AP Bifurcation Act. That is why the BJP should be boycotted in Telangana," the CM said.

Addressing an LB Corner Meeting on Sunday for Malkajgiri Congress candidate Patnam Sunitha Mahender Reddy, the CM slammed the BJP saying that some beg in the name of God and that in the same way, the BJP is trying to grab votes in the name of Lord Rama. He said that God must be in the temple and devotion must be in hearts.

Targeting KCR, Revanth said that KCR's car had been sent to the scrap shop and that it would not come back. KCR is enacting dramas in the name of Bus Yatras. Voting for KCR means voting for the BJP, he added.

LOK SABHA POLLS Just 8% women candidates in first two phases

Women constituted only eight per cent of the total 2,823 candidates in the first two phases of the Lok Sabha elections, with political activists saying it reflects a deeper issue of gender bias and that talk of women's empowerment rings hollow. There were 135 women candidates in the first phase of the elections and 100 in the second phase, bringing the combined total for the first two phases to 235.

In the first phase of the elections on April 19, there total number of candidates in the fray was 1,625. In the second phase held on April 26, 1,198 candidates contested the elections.

Of the 135 women candidates in the first phase, Tamil Nadu had the highest share at 76.

MISSILE ATTACK FROM MILITANTS Indian Navy rescues Panama-flagged crude oil tanker crew

The Indian Navy swiftly assisted a Panama-flagged crude oil tanker with 30 crew members including 22 Indians after the vessel came under missile attack from Houthi militants.

Indian Navy's destroyer INS Kochi responded following the attack on the vessel, MV Andromeda Star, on April 26, officials said, adding all the crew members are safe.

The US Central Command said Iranian-backed Houthi militants launched three anti-ship ballistic missiles from Yemen into the Red Sea in the vicinity of merchant vessel Maisha and MV Andromeda Star. MV Andromeda Star is a Panaman-flagged and Seychelles-operated ves-



sel. The vessel reported minor damage, the US Central Command said. "A mission deployed Indian Naval destroyer INS Kochi responded to a maritime security incident involving the attack on Panama-flagged crude oil tanker MV Andromeda Star on April 26," the Indian Navy said.

Intense heat wave grips Telangana

Karimnagar records highest temperature of 45.4°C

The Indian Meteorological Department Hyderabad (IMD-H) said on Sunday that the heat wave is likely to continue in Telangana. Meanwhile, Karimnagar recorded the highest temperature of 45.4 degrees Celsius on Sunday.

Hyderabad recorded a maximum temperature of 42.8 degrees Celsius. Nalgonda and Mulugu districts (45.2) recorded the second-highest temperature. Jagtial (45.1), Jayashankar Bhupalpally and Mancherla (44.8), Peddapalli (44.7) and Komaram Bheem Asifabad (44.6) districts also recorded high temperatures.

The IMD report said that on April 28 hot, humid weather pre-

vailed in the districts of Adilabad, Komaram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherla, Jagtial, Rajanna Sircilla, Karimnagar, Peddapalli, Jayashankar Bhupalpally, Mulugu, Bhadradi Kothgudem, Khammam, Nalgonda, Suryapet, Mahabubabad, Warangal, Hanamkonda, Nagarkurnool, Narayanpet and Jogulamba Gadwal.

Similar conditions are expected to prevail in the state on April 29 too. The IMD-H has forecast isolated light to moderate rains in some areas of Telangana. On April 30 too similar conditions are likely to prevail in the above-mentioned districts and the heat wave is expected to continue in Telangana till May 2.

SINGARENI MD'S NEW HANGOUT

When it comes to a corporate set-up, the person designated as Managing Director must not only strike a chord with all sections of employees, but also know which way the wind blows so as to keep the organization in perfect alignment with outside forces. Otherwise, he could end up being derided as a 'damaging director'.

Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) Managing Director N Balaram seems to have opened a camp office in Jyoti Rao Phule Bhavan -- the official residence of Bhatti Vikramarka, Deputy Chief Minister and Energy Minister - perhaps to keep himself always charged. A little bird told us that Balaram has been frequenting the Minister's residence like there is no tomorrow. This has prompted bureaucratic circles to talk about this new-found association. Otherwise, Balaram comes across endearingly as an "employees' MD".

CMD POWERS TSSPDCL

"Authority flows downwards; and responsibility, upwards" is one of the cardinal principles in management. Few take it seriously in letter and spirit. With both the ruling and opposition parties plugging into the power sector to trade shocking charges amid a slew of probes, Telangana State Southern Power Distribution Company Limited Chairman and Managing Director Musharrarf Faruqi himself is handling any complaint related to 'power cuts', especially those made by high-profile individuals. With the Opposition making allegations after allegations of power cut (ex-CM K Chandrababhan Naidu in fact joined 'X' on Saturday with a bang by posting on 'power cut'); no wonder, there is always a response within a couple of hours. To ensure that the department does not get a bad name due to mud-slinging or even minor instance of mismanagement, Musharrarf is literally on top of the issues. He keeps tabs even at the level of DTRs with appropriate staff. Whispers in the corridors of power are that he is literally battling the Opposition more than the Minister heading the energy department.

KCR STILL UNDER SPELL OF SMITA SABHARWAL

Officials with consummate skills cast their spell in several departments and their grip over complex administrative matters often tends to become the subject of discussions over chai, paani in office canteens. In this context, it is indeed rare for an official to fascinate a chief minister so much that he remembers and cites her account even after being dislodged from power. Former chief minister K Chandrababhan Naidu continues to draw from his memories of working with former CMO secretary Smita Sabharwal. He recently dropped her name again while making his point about how she had given him budget estimates in the initial days following bifurcation without really understanding the in and outs of fiscal management. Previously, at a press conference, he had mentioned that Smita used to helm Mission Bhagiratha very competently, unlike present-day officials. Interestingly, the opposition party continues to invoke her name for having written a significant letter to the Krishna River Management Board during her last posting in the BRS regime. Reflecting unusual prowess, the bureaucrat, despite holding a post in the loop line, continues to be in the news.

IS AP UNDER DE FACTO PRESIDENT'S RULE?

Is Andhra Pradesh now under *de facto* President's Rule? This is what babus in Andhra Pradesh are discussing in hushed voices. For, under President's Rule in a state, every direction to the state administration invariably comes from Delhi. The situation now in Andhra Pradesh is similar, with almost every direction coming from Delhi, with the only difference that the directives are coming, not from the Rashtrapati Bhavan, but the office of the Election Commission of India. Of late, the involvement of the ECI in the administrative matters of states going to polls has increased manifold. In the past, the ECI used to get involved in one or two, and that too important, issues. However, bureaucrats in AP today feel that the ECI has taken the entire administration into its hands. The ECI can be expected to give directions related to conduct of elections and related issues, but not on day-to-day matters relating to administration. If any officer violates the Model Code of Conduct, the ECI has a right to take action against him or her. In AP, the bureaucrats are right now confused over the propriety of the distribution of pensions in view of the directions of ECI. They aver that never in the past has ECI changed as many bureaucrats as this time.

A SMALL STEP, BUT A GIANT LEAP TOWARDS FAIR POLLS

Change need not come with hungama for people to feel the difference. Any official with initiative can bring a small change with far-reaching consequences in his own sphere of influence. The SAMARTH app, launched by Bapatla SP Vakul Jindal, is a case in point. SAMARTH (security arrangement mapping analysis response tracking hub) is so designed that, should there be any untoward incident at any of the polling centers or at other places on the day of polling, the police officers in the vicinity will be alerted so that they can immediately reach the spot and maintain law and order. As its name suggests, it is a powerful tool with multi-tasking abilities. The SAMARTH mobile app serves as a real-time application for the authorities to track location of personnel, maintain vigil on problematic polling stations, call the control room directly from the app, and immediately reach police forces in troubled areas. It has the numbers and all essential details relating to all the police officers in the district.

PEN LAUNCHED TO EASE MIGRATION WOES

Soon after AP's School Education Department made the use of Permanent Education Number (PEN) mandatory for the academic year 2024-25, Commissioner School Education S Suresh Kumar got going and has already released PEN for the first time in the state. Launched during the release of Class 10 results, PEN is a unique identification number provided by the Union Ministry of Education and assigned to every student through the UDISE+ (Unified District Information System for Education Plus) portal that covers more than 14.89 lakh schools, 95 lakh teachers, and 26.5 crore children. It is designed for streamlining and simplifying the process of the students' transition from one school to the other in the new academic year. Students' class 10 pass certificate will henceforth have PEN, which can be used during further education.

BJP is a 'dangerous' party, says KCR

Former Chief Minister K. Chandrababhan Naidu described the BJP as a 'dangerous' party and appealed to the youth to think about it.

Addressing the gathering during a Warangal roadshow on Sunday on the fifth day of his bus Yatra, KCR asked whether Rs 15 lakh had been deposited in Jandhan accounts.

"No ache din came but only dying days. Has the Railway coach factory come," he asked.

However, that figure accounted for just 8 per cent of the total candidates in the state. Kerala had the maximum number of women candidates at 24 in the second phase. Partywise, the Congress fielded 44 women in the two phases and the BJP 69. This significant gender imbalance has sparked criticism from political analysts and activists, who asked why parties are waiting for the Women Reservation Act to be implemented instead of proactively fielding women.

Dr Sushila Ramaswamy, an associate professor at Delhi University's Jesus and Mary College, said political parties should take concrete steps to promote women's candidacy. "Political parties should have been more proactive and fielded more women candidates," she underscored, citing the effectiveness of seat reservations for women within party structures, as seen in the UK's Labour Party.

"RSS chief makes a statement that RSS is not against

reservation. It was he (Mohan Bhagwat) who had made a statement that he was opposed to reservation. Those who are against the reservation (policy) are joining their party (BJP).

They welcome all those who are against reservation, and then he (Bhagwat) says he is not against reservation," Gandhi alleged.

Stating that the battle between the Congress and the RSS-BJP is an ideological one, Gandhi appealed to people to vote for "protecting" the Constitution.

"The Constitution has served as the foundation, the seed from which these institutions have emerged. They want to abolish the Constitution, democracy, and different institutions, and make the RSS-BJP kings (leaders) the kings of the country," the Congress leader said.

WATER SCARCITY IN HOSTELS

OU students on 6-hour sit-in at night

As they are facing water scarcity for a week, as many as 6,000 female students of Osmania University, especially those staying in hostels, staged a sit-in between 9 pm on Saturday to 3 am on Sunday on the varsity premises. However the authorities have not so far resolved the issue.

Swati, an OU student said, "For the past 10 days we have been facing water scarcity. There are three blocks in the ladies complex hostel and ours is block 3. About 700 students are in our block and only one drinking water tap is set up for all of us. However, Block 1 and 2 students are forced to depend on block-3 for drinking water. We are waiting for hours together for water in front of washrooms and sometimes we are facing water issues for a whole day. We are reporting this issue to the hostel authorities. However they are ignoring our complaints and are not taking any action until we are on the roads. They are not taking this issue to the higher

authorities. The main reason for water scarcity is leakages, inadequate infrastructure."

Satya, an AISF member said, "For last one week, the stu-

dents, especially hostellers or those staying in hostels are facing drinking water and normal water issues. Despite the students complaining to the hos-

tel authorities, they haven't taken any action. The registrar of the varsity has not responded to the issue despite the sit-in staged by the students on

Saturday night." Vinay Kumar,OU student said, "It is a shame that the management of Osmania University who spent lakhs of rupees of university students' money is negligent in providing basic facilities to the students."

The varsity, which became famous in the world, is suffering from problems today. The students have been complaining this issue to the hostel management however the Director for Women's hostels Dr. Kalyana Laxmi isn't responding and is not available to students. She is like the inefficient person in charge. Many corrupt practices are happening in the office of the chief warden & office of the director for women's hostels, (Fake bills, granting tenders to same bidders, fake MRPs, illegal allotments of hostels to non boarder students)."

The OU officials said that they arranged tankers to address the water scarcity issue. They denied that they turned a deaf ear to the complaints made by the students.

Job aspirants on tenterhooks as exam results yet to be released

Government job aspirants are waiting for the various examination results. Due to the elections to the Assembly, the results and marks list of various examinations were put on hold. Though the elections are over, still the group service examination results are not released

Telangana State Northern Power Distribution Company of Telangana Limited (TSNPDCL) released a notification for recruitment of junior assistant cum computer operator on March 31, 2023 and conducted the examinations on June 4. An aspirant from Warangal, Sai Kumar, said, "Since the TSNPDCL conducted the examinations there is no update to the candidates till now. It has been more



than 10 months. The examinations are also conducted in Optical Mark Recognition (OMR) mode. Why the TSNPDCL is taking more time unnecessarily.

Some of the notifications are at the General Ranking list (GRL) but have not reached the final recruitment, though

the notification was released more than one and half a year ago. TSPSC announced the results for the Assistant Executive Engineer (AEE) posts on 14 March. The commission is going to fill a total of 1,540 AEE posts. The Commission held the exam on 18 May 2023.

DCA seizes medicines sold with misleading ads

Telangana Drug Control Administration (DCA) on Sunday seized stocks of eight Ayurvedic medicines and one Allopathic formulation over their misleading claims of treating various medical conditions through advertisements.

The seized Ayurvedic medicines include Khadirarisha that claimed to treat tumours, Ekangveer Ras claiming to treat paralysis, Simhadi Guggulu that claimed to treat Rheumatism and 'Tumour', Stonil 24 Tablets for treating kidney stones, Ayur Phala Neem Leaf Powder claiming to treat fever and Allopathic medicine Diclodan Forte Tablets

(Diclofenac Sodium and Paracetamol Tablets) that claimed to treat fever.

The DCA clarified that such claims are in contravention of the Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954. The Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954, prohibits advertisement of certain drugs for treatment of certain diseases and disorders.

In another raid, the DCA seized overpriced antibiotic ointment 'Mupima Ointment 5gm' (Muprin Ointment IP2 percent) at Beeramguda, Ameenpur mandal Sangareddy on Saturday. The product Mupirocin Ointment (sold

under brand name 'Mupima Ointment 5gm') is under price control as per Drugs (Prices Control) Order, 2013 and the price of product shall be in accordance with the 'Ceiling Price' fixed by National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA), Government of India.

Marketed by Maathrey Pharmaceuticals, Keesar, Medchal-Malkajigiri district, the product has an MRP of Rs 189 for 5 gm of pack while the ceiling price of NPPA for 5 gm of the product is Rs 101.45. The firm was overpricing the product by charging Rs 75.40 excess, which is a violation of Drugs (Prices Control) Order, 2013, said the DCA.

Election officials distributing voter information slips: DEO

Voter information slips are being distributed to educate citizens on their voting rights along with extensive voter awareness programs, as part of the sweep program in the district. A door-to-door campaign aimed at boosting voter turnout has been taken up.

The District Election Officer and GHMC Commissioner Ronald Rose is striving to increase the voting percentage in the two Lok Sabha constituencies of Hyderabad district, with the help of Booth-level Officers, members of self-help soci-

eties, RCs, POs, and PDs collaborating to conduct awareness programs in their respective areas. He said, "We are engaging women's groups, organising visiting drives, conducting rallies, visiting street vendors and vegetable markets to emphasise the importance of voting, and securing commitments from individuals to vote, along with voter information slips being distributed directly to households." Ronald Rose said, "Stickers bearing the polling date and the slogan 'I am proud to be a voter' are being pasted on walls to ensure that voters remember the polling date."

BC unions ask BJP to clarify stance on SC, ST, BC quotas

R Krishnaiah, President of National BC Association, stated that the opposition parties, especially the Congress Party, CPI-M, CPI and other parties are accusing the BJP party of conspiring to change the constitution and scrap SC/ST/OBC reservations. But BJP has failed to rebut once and for all. About 13 BC Sanghas have demanded that the BJP party should make a clear statement on the reservations provided to the Backward Classes. The meeting of BC unions was held under the chairmanship of Gujja Krishna Neela Venkatesh on Sunday.

He said that the BJP party has been in power at the Center for ten years but not a single plan has been made for the welfare of the BCs. In addition, some reservations were given to upper castes. It is free from the doctrine of reservation.



"We are demanding that caste census be done and reservations be provided basing on population. The Center is not paying attention to the demand for the Constitutional amendment as a permanent solution, he added. The President of National BC Welfare Association said that they are fighting to ensure that reservations go up to 50 per cent, for setting up a special ministry, allocation of two lakh crore budgets for education and self-study of BCs, to make reservations for AP/ST/BCs in private sectors - to put SC/ST/BC reservations in the High Court and Supreme Court.

"They are not paying attention to the demand for caste census in the census, educational schemes for BCs at the center and constitutional measures for the development of BCs. The Prime Minister should announce clear statement about them", he added. He criticized the fact that the Prime Minister, being a member of the BC caste, did not resolve even a small demand for the development of the BCs, saying that the 70 crore BCs of the country could not digest it. After 76 years the share of 70 crore BC people in the country will not be given to BCs? This is a democratic country BCs are not beggars and if shareholders don't give their share there is bound to be a coup. This is justice. Bharata Mata urged everyone to observe justice. He warned that if injustice is done to the BCs, there will be a rebellion. Even now, the BJP party should adopt a pro-BC attitude and announce that they will implement 50 percent reservation in legislatures. It should be announced that a fee reimbursement scheme will be implemented for BCs at the national level, a scholarship scheme will be implemented, and a budget of two lakh crores will be earmarked annually for the development of special ministries. India will emerge as a top country only by developing the BCs who are the majority of the people.



Owaisi to be served notice for 'communal' remarks in UP

A notice will soon be issued to AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi for making alleged communal comments during a speech at a public meeting of PDM Nyay Morcha in Varanasi on April 25.

Kashi region BJP legal cell convener Shashank Shekhar Tripathi had complained to the Election Commission, alleging that AIMIM chief Owaisi delivered communal statements during a public meeting in Varanasi.

Confirming that such a complaint was received, Additional Returning Officer Sub-Divisional Magistrate Neeraj Patel said on Sunday that after the initial probe, a notice is being issued to Owaisi.

Only BRS can stop BJP from scrapping reservations: KTR

If the BRS can win 10-12 seats, it would be in a position to dictate terms to the Central government. KCR has been conducting bus yatra to interact with people though he is 70 years old despite suffering a fracture to his pelvis. He condemned the arrest of BRS MLC and his sister K Kavitha.

"Let us give the slogan 'Jai Sriram' as Lord Sri Rama belonged to one and all and he is not a BJP MLA or BJP MP," said KTR.

Students protest 'poor quality food' in hostel

The authorities reportedly turned a blind ear to the complaints made by the student. The police swung into action and persuaded the students to withdraw their protest.

Non-payment of rent: 9 ESI dispensaries locked by landlords

Across Telangana, nine ESI dispensaries catering to medical needs of the industrial workers have faced closure due to a host of reasons. Many dispensaries are facing the threat of closure. The ESI dispensaries owed a total of Rs 2.10 crore in rent to the landlords, according to reports.

The condition of the dispensaries has been worsening with each passing day. In fact, they have been facing series of problems like inadequate medical and health personnel, pharmacy not stocked with enough drugs and disposables and so on.

The dispensaries cater to the medical treatment needs of employees and industrial workers. Shortage of medicines and mounting arrears of rents

payable to the landlords have led to closure of some of the dispensaries. More dispensaries are in the pipeline. The building owners have been locking the dispensaries as the management of the ESI hospitals has failed to clear the dues.

The patients are referred to the main ESI hospital by the doctors at the dispensaries. But patients are not accepted at the main ESI hospital, it is alleged.

In undivided Warangal, Khammam, Adilabad, Nalgonda, Nizamabad districts, there are a total of 1,55,525 ESI cardholders. There are 17 dispensaries in the four districts. Each dispensary treats at least 200 as outpatients. If the patients could not get the treatment locally,

they are referred to Warangal and Hyderabad hospitals, where the patients are treated free of cost.

All employees working in factories and other private establishments drawing a salary of less than Rs 21,000 come under the purview of the ESI hospitals. The worker out of his salary will contribute 0.75% of his salary to the ESI, while the factory management contributes 3.25% to the ESI. Out of the total 71 ESI dispensaries in the state, 57 are being run from rental premises. For non-payment of rent, 9 have been put under lock and key. Some of the dispensaries owed rent for over two years. Therefore, the landlords have been locking the dispensaries.



Rs 1.29 cr warehouse built in 2021 awaits inauguration by VIP

A warehouse built in 2021 at a total cost of Rs 1.29 crore in Manakondur mandal in Karimnagar district under the aegis of the Utoor Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society still is still waiting for VIP inauguration.

Former legislator Rasamayi Balkishan and KDCC chairman Konduri Ravinder Rao laid the foundation stone for the project without preparing the estimates. The cost of the project surprisingly went up to Rs 1.29 crore.

On a complaint lodged by the farmers with the officials over embezzlement of funds, the officials seized the records of the cooperative society four months ago, but no concrete action was taken against the offenders.

Last year, during Vanakalam and Yasangi seasons over 50-60 agricultural workers were provided shelter in the warehouse without the knowledge of the directors of the PACS. It became an issue with the officials objected to farmworkers being given shelter in the warehouse.

BRS to focus on LS constituencies where it has winning chances

The BRS leadership has reportedly decided to concentrate on Lok Sabha constituencies where the party has winning chances. The BRS leadership wants to retain the seats it had won last time in the coming Lok Sabha elections.

Senior BRS leaders T. Harish Rao and KT Rama Rao who are known as troubleshooters of the party have been given important jobs in the Lok Sabha elections. The BRS leadership assesses the winning chances in LS constituencies based on the Assembly seats won by the BRS.

The BRS leadership has given top priority to the Medak Lok Sabha constituency. As the erstwhile home district of BRS

President K. Chandrasekhar Rao, the Medak Lok Sabha constituency is a prestigious one for the BRS.

The BRS leadership has given the responsibility of the Medak Lok Sabha seat to troubleshooter Harish Rao. In the next two weeks, Harish will confine himself to Medak.

In the recent Assembly elections, the BRS won most of the Assembly seats in the Medak district. The BRS leadership wants to retain its upper hand in Medak in the Lok Sabha elections too.

BRS Working President KT Rama Rao has been given the responsibility of Malkajgiri, Chevella and Secunderabad Lok Sabha constituencies. In the next two weeks, KTR will concentrate on these seats.

Both Harish and KTR have already completed their election campaigns. If necessary, Harish and KTR will campaign in any Lok Sabha constituency that needs their presence. But they will concentrate on Medak, Chevella, Malkajgiri and Secunderabad.

BRS President KCR will campaign in all Lok Sabha constituencies. BRS leaders think that KCR's campaign has given confidence to party cadres. At the ground level BRS cadres have become active, says BRS leaders.

The BRS won nine seats in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. In the coming Lok Sabha elections also the party is aiming to win at least nine seats.

The BRS thinks that in the Nizamabad Lok Sabha con-

stituency, the main fight will be between the Congress and the BRS. The BJP has become weak in this constituency even though it is sitting seat.

In Medak, the fight will be between the Congress and the BRS. But in Malkajgiri, Chevella and Secunderabad the fight will be between the BJP and the BRS. The BRS will fight the Congress in some constituencies and the BJP in other constituencies. The BRS leadership thinks that the weaknesses of the Congress and the BJP will help them win most of the LS constituencies.

Whatever it may be the coming Lok Sabha elections are a litmus test for the BRS brass. The future of the BRS depends on the outcome of the Lok Sabha elections.

Sanjay undertakes door-to-door campaign in Huzurabad

In his address to the public, Chief Minister Jagan pledged the establishment of an Agriculture College in the Tadipatri Constituency post-elections. "We have remained steadfast in fulfilling the commitments laid out in our manifesto, treating it with reverence akin to a holy book. History will bear witness to the fact that we've disbursed over Rs 2.70 lakh directly into the accounts of beneficiaries, with your child (Jagan) personally overseeing the process," remarked the Chief Minister amidst the enthusiastic crowd.

In a critique aimed at TDP Chief Chandrababu Naidu, CM Jagan

accused him of peddling unattainable schemes and false promises designed to exploit the impoverished masses. "Chandrababu's return with his fabrications and deceitful assurances is akin to a recurring nightmare, preying on the vulnerabilities of the poor," he emphasized.

Emphasizing the importance of the upcoming elections, Chief Minister Jagan reiterated that the choice isn't merely about selecting MPs and MLAs but ensuring the continuity of transformative welfare schemes for the next five years. "A vote for YSRCP ensures the uninterrupted progress of these schemes, whereas a vote for TDP threatens their very existence," he asserted firmly.

During a campaign event near YSR

Circle in Venkatagiri on Sunday afternoon, CM Jagan Mohan Reddy lambasted TDP President Chandrababu Naidu for his failure to deliver a single substantial achievement despite holding power for 14 years.

"In stark contrast to Chandrababu's empty promises, we have implemented a slew of welfare schemes transparently, including YSR Cheyutha, Asara, Jaganna Chedodu, financial aid to farmers, Jaganna Thodu, Kapu Nestam, and EBC Nestham, aimed at uplifting the masses," he declared, daring Chandrababu to challenge the efficacy of any of these initiatives.

75% of pensions to be disbursed via DBT

Seventy-five per cent of pensions will be distributed through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), while the remaining 25% will be disbursed door-to-door from May 1st to May 5th, according to Sasi Bhushan Kumar, Principal Secretary. Out of the total 65,49,864 pensioners, 48,92,503 (74.70%) will receive their pensions via DBT using the Aadhaar-enabled Payment



System (AePS), as confirmed by

NPCI. The remaining 16,57,361 pensioners (25.30%) will benefit from the door-to-door distribution, as per directives from the Election Commission of India.

The Government of India has instructed the state government to ensure the smooth distribution of ongoing scheme pensions to selected beneficiaries through DBT or other means during the Model Code of Conduct period. In compliance

with the Election Commission's directives, alternative arrangements have been made to ensure timely and hassle-free disbursement of pensions for May and June 2024.

DBT beneficiaries, whose Aadhaar is linked to their bank accounts, will receive their pensions via AePS. Payments will be transferred on May 1st, 2024, with pensioners receiving SMS notifications confirming the credit to their accounts.

3 held for tampering with ATM to dupe people

Three men have been arrested for allegedly tampering with ATMs for duping people, police said on Saturday. Vishal Negi (30), Amit Mehra (37), and Vijay Kumar (26) used to damage card reader slots in ATMs so that when someone puts their card in, it gets stuck there, Deputy Commissioner of Police (south) Ankit Chauhan said. "Later, they would secretly see the PIN number and ask the customer to raise a complaint with the bank. If the customer leaves the ATM without removing the card, the accused used to remove it later and make the transactions," the DCP said. On April 19, at around 7 pm a PCR call regarding an attempt to break into an ATM and gunfire in the area was received at Hauz Khas police station, he said. Police team was sent to the spot and investigation suggested that two people were attempting to tamper with the ATM and some people tried to nab them, one of them fired a shot in the air and fled.



Controversy erupts over mayor blocking bus in traffic dispute

A controversy erupted on Sunday over Thiruvananthapuram city Mayor Arya Rajendran allegedly blocking a state-run passenger bus here for not giving way to her private car. Video footage aired by news channels showed the mayor and her co-passengers in the car engaging in heated arguments with the bus driver after blocking the bus at Palayam junction on Saturday. Police arrested the driver based on the mayor's complaint that he misbehaved with her. The driver was released as the case was registered for a bailable offence, police said. The driver has also lodged a complaint with the police against the mayor. Later, speaking to reporters, the driver alleged that the mayor's vehicle attempted to overtake the KSRTC bus on the wrong side. He also alleged that the mayor's husband MLA K M Sachin Dev forced passengers to get down from the bus after blocking it on the road.



Child trafficking racket busted in Mumbai

The Mumbai police have busted a child trafficking racket and arrested a doctor and six others involved in selling an infant and a toddler, an official said on Sunday. The crime branch on Saturday arrested the accused, Dr Sopanrao Khandare, Vanadana Armit Pawar (28), Sheetal Ganesh Vare (41), Sneha Suryavanshi (24), Naseema Haneef Khan (28), Lata Survaade (36) and Sharad Maruti Devar (45), the official said. The police had received a tip-off that Vare, a resident of Vikhroli, had allegedly sold a five-month-old baby for Rs 2 lakh, he said. Vare was apprehended from Govandi, following which the police arrested Dr Khandare, who allegedly helped her sell the infant, the official said. The baby was later rescued from Guhagar in Ratnagiri, he said. Investigations revealed that the accused had also sold a two-year-old girl, and she has also been rescued, the official said.



BJP will neither remove reservations nor allow anyone to do so: Amit Shah

The BJP will neither remove reservations for SCs, STs, and OBCs nor will it allow anyone to do so, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Sunday, calling it a "Modi guarantee".

Opposition parties have repeatedly claimed that the BJP's call for "abki baar 400 paar" is aimed at winning 400 seats in the Lok Sabha elections to have the numbers in Parliament to scrap quotas for Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs) and Other Backward Classes (OBCs).

Speaking at a rally in support of Rajveer Singh, the BJP candidate from Etah-Kasganj,

Targeting Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, he said, "Rahul Gandhi says that if the BJP gets 400 seats, it will remove reservation. I want to say that we had a full majority for two terms but Narendra Modi is a supporter of reservation." "I want to say that it is a Modi guarantee that neither will the BJP remove reservations for SCs, STs, and OBCs nor will it allow anyone to do so," Shah said.



Shah alleged that the opposition parties ignored people from backward communities, who were granted their rights by Narendra Modi after he became prime minister.

Targeting Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, he said, "Rahul Gandhi says that if the BJP gets

Health secretary urges states, UTs to link ABHA IDs with health portals

The Union Health Secretary has urged states and union territories to take necessary action to link Ayushman Bharat Health Account (ABHA) with various health portals, such as Reproductive Child Health (RCH), National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NIKSHAY), among others.

As per the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) dashboard, total ABHA IDs created in the country as on April 3, 2024 is 5,894.60 lakhs, Health Secretary Apurva Chandra said. However, total beneficiaries linked with ABHA under Non-communicable diseases (NCD), Sickle cell, RCH, NIKSHAY, National Viral Hepatitis Control Program (NVHCP) and Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme (PMNDP) are only 827.99 lakhs, 0.89 lakhs, 15.78 lakhs, 2.46 lakhs, 0.056 lakhs and 0.17 lakhs, respectively, he said.

"This shows that though the states have taken huge interest in creation of the IDs but non-linking of health records with these IDs is not allowing the stakeholders, including the patients, from reaping the benefits of digital health records," the health secretary said.

"You are, therefore, requested to kindly take necessary action for linkage of existing beneficiaries with ABHA in the various portals and do regular review of the progress at your level," he stated in a letter to all the state and UT governments.

Chandra said the National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi

on September 27, 2021 and all the health facilities in the country are to take part in this mission.

Further, via Health Facility Registry and Health Professional Registry, the ABDM platform has to be utilised to the optimum extent, he said in the letter.

"In this regard, all states and UTs have been requested in the past through a letter on June 13, 2023 for the 100 per cent compliance in ABHA seeding on various portals. Some states and UTs have shown impressive progress in the creation of ABHA IDs," he said.

Chandra said currently, beneficiaries are being linked with ABHA under various health portals like NCD, Sickle Cell,

Reproductive and Child Health (RCH), NIKSHAY, NVHCP and PMNDP, etc.

Additionally, states and UTs have to link the beneficiaries under the IDSP-IHIP (Integrated Health Information Platform) portal, the health secretary said in the letter.

Under the ABDM, citizens can create their ABHA numbers, to which their digital health records can be linked. This will allow patients to hassle-free access and digitally share their health records.

This will enable creation of longitudinal health records for individuals across various healthcare providers, and improve clinical decision making by healthcare providers, officials said.



Stalin awards chess champion Gukesh Rs 75 L cash incentive

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin on Sunday gave away a cash incentive of Rs 75 lakh to star D Gukesh, days after he won the prestigious Candidates Tournament in Toronto.

As a mark of honour, Stalin also presented Gukesh with a shield and shawl in the presence of Sports Development Minister Udhyanidhi Stalin, top officials and the champion's parents. The CM congratulated Gukesh for his accomplishment. The Candidates Tournament, organised by chess's international governing body FIDE since 1950, is an eight-player chess tournament held to determine the challenger for the World Chess Championship. The winner of the Candidates earns the right to a match for the World Championship against the incumbent world champion.

Chennai-based Gukesh drew with American Hikaru Nakamura in the final round to not only win the prestigious tournament but also become the youngest ever challenger to the world title at 17.

Mamata wants govt at Centre that is soft on terrorism: Nadda

BJP president J P Nadda on Sunday alleged that Trinamool Congress supremo Mamata Banerjee desires a central government that is "soft on terrorism" and believes in appeasement.

Addressing back-to-back rallies in Baharampur in Murshidabad district and

Ranaghat in Nadia district of West Bengal, Nadda claimed that the TMC government in the state helmed by Banerjee is known for corruption, extortion, appeasement, and discrimination.

"We want a 'Majboot Sarkar' (strong government), but Mamata Banerjee desires a 'Majboor Sarkar' (weak government). She aims for a government in Delhi that con-

done appeasement, corruption, discrimination, and sympathises with terrorists," he alleged.

"On the contrary, Modi ji's 'Majboot Sarkar' believes in development, prosperity, national security, and responds to terrorism with surgical strikes," Nadda asserted.

Further criticising the TMC government, Nadda

said, "Mamata Banerjee's administration fosters appeasement, discrimination, and a lenient approach toward terrorists, extending sympathy to them."

He slammed the TMC for allegedly spreading misinformation about the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA), emphasising that the Act aims to grant citizenship, not revoke it.

K'taka CM holds dharna protesting Centre's 'injustice' over drought relief

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and his deputy D K Shivakumar along with several ministers and legislators on Sunday staged a dharna here alleging injustice to the state by the union government while releasing drought relief funds.

The state government has declared 226 out of the total 236 Taluks in Karnataka as drought-hit and said there was a crop loss in 48 lakh hectares of land.

According to Siddaramaiah, against the demand for Rs 18,171 crore for drought relief, the union government ordered release of only Rs 3,454 crore,

that too after the state was driven to the Supreme Court to get its rights enforced.

The sanction is "woefully inadequate" and just a quarter of the state's demand, he noted.

Displaying 'Chombu', a water pot symbolising emptiness and deception, the leaders charged the Centre with "cheating" Karnataka by not releasing adequate relief to face acute drought, the kind of which was not witnessed in the past several decades. They held the symbolic dharna in front of the Mahatma Gandhi statue on the premises of Vidhana Soudha, which houses the Legislature and Secretariat.

Congress, CPI(M) helping BJP in Bengal: Mamata

Asserting that the Trinamool Congress is contesting the Lok Sabha elections alone in West Bengal, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Sunday alleged that the Congress and CPI(M) are helping the BJP in the state.

Addressing an election rally here at Malda Dakshin Lok Sabha seat, Banerjee claimed that the TMC will put up a spirited fight against the Narendra Modi-led dispensation at the Centre and will play a major role in installing an INDIA bloc government after the Lok Sabha polls.

"We don't have any alliance in Bengal with Congress. Here the



CPI(M) is having an alliance with Congress. Both are hand-in-gloves with BJP and if you (voters) cast vote for Congress or CPI(M) that tantamounts to cutting the anti-BJP vote share and helping Narendra Modi. Congress and CPI(M) are the two eyes of BJP in this state," she said.

Banerjee claimed that the TMC had wanted to discuss seat sharing with Congress with the condition that they should not have any deal with CPI(M) in Bengal but they didn't listen.

"The Congress and CPI(M) leaders in West Bengal have been speaking in the same voice of BJP and plotting against pro-people policies of the TMC-run government in the state," she said.

Asserting that the INDIA alliance is alive outside Bengal, Banerjee said "I gave INDIA alliance its name, but the alliance does not exist in Bengal, it will be functioning outside this state because of the pro-BJP stance of its state leaders."

BJP won't win any seat in 3rd phase: Akhilesh

Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav on Sunday claimed the BJP will not win any seat in the third phase of the Lok Sabha polls and that the ruling party misunderstood the "direction of the wind" when it made its slogan of "400 paar".

Addressing a rally in Sambhal, Yadav also said the Samajwadi Party had an advantage in the third phase, saying that elections on May 7 will be held between Sambhal and "his home" in Etawah and Mainpuri. "BJP people did not know the direction of the wind, so they kept saying '400 paar' (winning over 400 seats) and when they realised the public sentiment after the two phases of the election, BJP forgot its slogan," the former UP chief minister said.

"The wind from the west (western UP) in the first phase will change the BJP government. A similar trend was seen in the second phase also. People are not accepting the BJP," the SP chief said.

"It is now your responsibility in the third phase," he added to those gathered for the rally in support of party candidate Zia ur Rahman Barq.

"These elections are being held from this part till our home. Netaji (SP founder Mulayam Singh Yadav) has also been an MP from this area (Sambhal). Voting is going to take place from here to Mainpuri. I can say that the BJP is not going to open its account in any Lok Sabha seat here," Yadav said.

"When the seats where BJP lost with the highest number of votes are counted, the name of Sambhal Lok Sabha should be included in that count also," he

further urged the voters. Yadav also said the election in Sambhal is an opportunity to pay tribute to party MP Shafiqur Rahman Barq, who was declared as the SP candidate but died earlier this year. After his death, his grandson, Zia ur Rahman Barq got the party ticket.

"We gave the ticket to the very popular Shafiqur Rahman Barq Saheb but he is no longer with us. This is an opportunity to pay tribute to him... He always stood for the rights of his people," he said.

The SP chief also said that the Lok Sabha polls are a fight between those who want to "abolish the Constitution" and the INDIA bloc and the socialists who want to protect the Constitution.

BJP govt politicising probe agencies just like Cong earlier :Mayawati

Bahujan Samaj Party chief Mayawati on Sunday claimed the BJP was politicising probe agencies just like the Congress earlier and asserted poverty and unemployment had increased in the country in the last two years.

Addressing a Lok Sabha poll rally here, the former Uttar Pradesh chief minister claimed it would not be easy for the Bharatiya Janata Party to win if "free and fair" elections are held and there is no "tampering" of EVMs.

"It seems the BJP has politicised investigation agencies just like the Congress earlier. The BJP government has also failed to check poverty, unemployment, and prices, all of which have risen in the past two years. The Centre is giving rations to the extremely poor but the solu-



tion is creating employment," she said.

"Corruption has not gone down and the borders of the country are not completely safe till now. This is a matter of concern. You must take every effort to stop the BJP and Congress from coming to power," she said. The BJP's promise of "achhe din" (good days) for the poor and weaker sections as well as the middle class and labourers has not been fulfilled and people now know the ruling party's "guarantees" are hollow, Mayawati said.

Traffic noise can increase risk of cardiovascular disease: Study

Spike in traffic noise can increase the risk of cardiovascular diseases, including heart attack, researchers have found.

Having found evidence linking traffic noise and the risk of developing heart and related conditions, researchers are calling for this type of noise pollution to be recognised as a risk factor for cardiovascular diseases.

The researchers found evidence that for every 10 decibel increase in noise coming from road traffic, the risk of developing cardiovascular diseases, including heart attack, stroke and diabetes, heightened by 3.2 per cent.

In particular, they said,



night-time traffic noise that disrupts and shortens sleep time can increase levels of stress hormones in the blood vessels, thereby promoting inflammation, high blood pressure and vascular diseases.

"It is also important for us that traffic noise is now finally recognised as a risk factor for cardiovascular disease due to the strong evidence," Thomas Münzel, senior Professor at the University

Medical Centre Mainz, Germany, and lead author of the study published in the journal Circulation Research, said.

The researchers also suggested strategies for local authorities to mitigate noise from road, rail, and air traffic. Erecting noise barriers along busy roads in densely populated areas can significantly reduce noise levels by up to 10 decibels, they said.

Constructing roads using noise-reducing asphalt has been shown to reduce levels by 3-6 decibels, the authors said.

Other strategies they suggested included limiting driving speed and developing and promoting the use of low-noise tyres.

Orange hills

Nainital is just one example of ongoing forest fires damaging the fragile ecosystem in Uttarakhand

Historically, Uttarakhand is somehow a little more prone than other hill States in India to the scourge of frequent forest fires, especially in summers. Otherwise famous for its breathtaking beauty and lush greenery, the State has of late again experienced a series of jungle blazes: To give an idea of the seriousness of the situation, more than 500 have been reported since January and one almost every hour in the past 24 hours. The latest incident has struck perilously close to the inhabited areas in Nainital, gutting 108 ha of forest land and sounding alarm bells for the residents and authorities alike. With the situation worsening, the Army and IAF have been pressed into action to aid containment efforts. These fires, often man-made to clear dead vegetation or fuelled by natural friction amid dry vegetation and exacerbated by strong winds, pose a significant threat to the fragile ecosystem. Despite concerted containment efforts, the inferno has spread its tendrils closer to human population. The IAF helicopters equipped



with water-spraying capabilities are deployed to douse the flames, offering a crucial advantage in reaching inaccessible terrain. Additionally, Army personnel are working on ground to create firebreaks and prevent further spread. As for the bright side of this challenge, the wildfires have brought out the best in humans — cooperating with authorities and fighting it together. Amid the suffocating chaos and burning uncertainty, the spirit of community resilience has shone brightly. Local residents, alongside volunteers and NGOs, have rallied together to support firefighting efforts and offer assistance to those affected.

From food and shelter to lending a helping hand in evacuation efforts, the collective response has underscored the strength of solidarity in the face of adversity. However, these forest fires carry grave environmental implications. The loss of precious flora and fauna, coupled with the release of harmful pollutants into the atmosphere, underscores the urgent need for proactive measures to mitigate future fire outbreaks. Strengthening forest management practices, implementing early warning systems and fostering community awareness are paramount in safeguarding the region's biodiversity and mitigating the risk of catastrophic wildfires. It is about time that a comprehensive policy was framed to fight the wildfire menace. The Uttarakhand Government must draw from the US experiences in California, where such fires are frequent but they manage them rather well and swiftly with an early warning system, besides a mechanism for controlled burns. As the battle against the Nainital forest fire rages on, it serves as a stark reminder of the fragility of our natural ecosystems as also the resilience of the human spirit. With the combined efforts of authorities, armed forces and local communities, there is hope that the flames will soon be extinguished. However, the aftermath of this crisis should serve as a catalyst for concerted action towards building a more resilient and sustainable future for Uttarakhand and beyond.

Pakistan paying for its misplaced priorities

Ambassador Asif Durrani acknowledges the Pak Government's shortcomings in handling the Afghanistan situation and underscores a reality check for Islamabad's foreign policy

Pakistan's Special Representative on Afghanistan, Ambassador Asif Durrani, conceded the grave reality of the Pakistani Government's abject failure in Afghanistan. Speaking at a conference titled, "Pakistan in the Emerging Geopolitical Landscape", the diplomat accepted that the ensuing price of the flared tensions along the Durand Line far exceeded the human and financial cost of all the wars with India, put together! Cold and frightening statistics like the loss of over 80,000 lives in the so-called 'War on Terror' which Islamabad joined in 2001 (including 8000 security personnel) and an estimated economic loss of \$150 billion—the reality check of what ought to worry Pakistan, i.e., between its traditional enemy across the Line-of-Control, or the one across the Durand Line—couldn't have been clearer. To make matters worse for Islamabad, it isn't even close to the end of its miseries as the deadly attacks by Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) have shot up by 65% and the accompanying suicide attacks by 500%! In such a scenario to persist with India as the 'enemy number 1' is not only to suffer from an acute sense of Ostrich syndrome, but also to refuse the hard lessons of Karma i.e., what goes around, comes around.

The fixation with India owes itself to the wounds of the partition and the desperate need of various institutions to have an 'enemy' to legitimise themselves in the eyes of the citizenry e.g., clergy, military, politicians etc., as also, as to defend the flawed 'two-nation theory' that ostensibly rationalises Pakistan. The creation of Bangladesh in 1971 exposed the hollowness and amorality of a nation created in the name of religion - the current equation with Afghanistan further exposes the untenability of a relationship based on co-religionism. That religion can never be the basis of nationhood or indeed ensure a 'brotherly relation' (as insincerely claimed with a neighbour, is further proved. At the end of the day, what matters is, 'intent' or neat. Over time, intent has an



inevitable way of revealing itself that cannot be suppressed by homilies of co-religiosity. As the speech by Ambassador Durrani accepted, "After the withdrawal of NATO forces, it was hoped that peace in Afghanistan would bring peace to the region. However, such expectations were short-lived". Anyone with a modicum of understanding about history (especially about Afghanistan, the home to many 'Great Games') ought to have known that to 'control' the narrative in Afghanistan was not just impossible and impractical, but also counterproductive. The worst-kept secret of nurturing a desire to have 'Strategic Depth' in Afghanistan could not be hidden even from its creation, the Afghan Taliban. While the Afghans had accepted the support and infrastructure afforded by Pakistani regimes of all hues and shades since the late 1970s — to expect the proud Afghan (even a Pak-created Taliban) to toe Islamabad's line blindly was an affront to the cultural-civilisational identity of an Afghan. Not only did the Taliban Government bolt out from the shackles of controls, 'advisories' and condescending platitudes from Islamabad, but it knowingly harboured and supported its ideological offshoot i.e., the Pak-facing Tehreek-e-Taliban

Pakistan (TTP) fighters, who attack Pakistan with impunity and deadly consequences. A grim observation of the situation suggests that the attacks on Pakistan are not just a phenomenon afflicting disaffected Pakistani folks across the Afghan side, but that the "worrying aspect is the participation of Afghan nationals in these attacks". Basically, either as genuinely motivated or even as trained mercenaries, Afghan nationals are attacking Pakistan! The project of demonising India by the Pakistanis has failed spectacularly amongst the conservative Afghans, as even they harbour a rather warm perception of the Indians, as opposed to that of the Pakistanis. At the end of the day, the difference in sovereign intent emanating from Islamabad, versus those emanating from Delhi, has surfaced. Beyond certain constraints mandated by their self-invented image, ideology and inert conservatism, the language used by the Taliban Government officials bears a stark contrast, from the one that was imagined when the US/NATO forces abandoned Kabul and the Taliban stormed into Kabul. Today, given the 'dark' investments made by the Pakistani State it finds itself in an awkward and inextricable position. Try hard as it might, the

Pakistanis are struggling to undo and trace back the steps that it took to create the prevailing environment, infrastructure and instinct in the region. As Ambassador Durrani lamented, "Afghanistan has become a permanent fixture in Pakistan's regional paradigm for over four decades". Therefore, all support or otherwise to Pakistan is seen from the lens of Afghanistan. Ironically, Pakistani complaints about the situation with Afghanistan fall on deaf ears as the global community attributes much of what went wrong with the Afghan storyline, to the Pakistanis themselves. In some sense, it is a cry wolf situation for the Pakistanis and there simply aren't too many takers or sympathisers of the Pakistani woes. A deeper introspection would reveal the rot in the thinking of the Pakistani system set in 1947 when it thought that religion was to be its trump card. History is instructive, that religion can never be a basis of Statehood for any moral and sustainable nation. Both Bangladesh and Afghanistan discredit the 'two-nation theory' (The writer, a military veteran, is a former Lt Governor of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Puducherry. Improper waste management practices at these events can result in plastic litter ending up in the environment. Why can't the Government ban plastic from its production source? Chemicals released by plastic degradation can also harm coral health, contributing to reef degradation and loss. Political parties can influence public opinion and behaviour through messaging

Market-oriented gig skill sets under focus

As the job landscape evolves, the focus is now on fostering market-driven skill sets to meet the demands of a changing workforce



In today's fast-paced and ever-evolving job market, employers are not just interested in hiring candidates with degrees from prestigious institutions like the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) or the Indian Institutes of Management (IIM), they now prioritise hiring candidates with specific skill sets.

Despite the widespread recognition of IITs for academic excellence and coveted placement opportunities, recent worrisome reports have revealed that they are not delivering as per their ranking and perception.

Every year among thousands of students who dream to get admission in IITs, only 20-25 per cent of them remain lucky charm to clear the JEE (Joint Entrance Exam) advanced process to get admission while pursuing their academic excellence and coveted placement opportunities every year they look forward to the placement season with an eye on big-ticket jobs.

However, The 2024 placement season is described as "lacklustre" by IIT students. This is a worrying situation in IIT-Bombay, which is ranked third among engineering institutes in India by NIRF. According to the Global IIT Alumni Support Group, nearly 36% of students were unable to secure jobs for the 2024 placements. Although IIT-Bombay contested this report, stating that only 6.1% of students remained unplaced, the situation is still concerning.

The Global IIT Alumni Support Group data shows that nearly 30-40% of IIT students are still unplaced in the top-ranked 8 older IITs like Bombay, Delhi, Kanpur and others, while around 50-60% of students are still unplaced in the 15 newer IITs like BHU (Varanasi), Ropar and others.

The unemployment crisis in India is par-

ticularly acute among educated youth. The cost of an engineering degree remains at Rs 8-10 lakh, yet the placement rate remains around 30%. Furthermore, there is an influx of MBA degree holders entering the market, even though the demand has dropped by 55% this year. This raises the question of the value of a college/university degree.

Being highly educated is no guarantee of employment in India, as the International Labor Organisation (ILO) report reveals. Nearly 83% of those unemployed in India are young and among these unemployed young Indians, nearly 66% are educated. According to the ILO report, the "youth unemployment rate has increased with the level of education, with the highest rates among those with a graduate degree or higher." On the other hand, those without university degrees or even school dropouts have a higher employment rate.

Several highly educated youths set an example by adopting odd entrepreneurship and proudly titled it MBAs Chaiwalas and Chatwalas.

Despite the promise of creating 100 million jobs through the flagship "Make in India" initiative, the expected job creation did not materialise in the last 10 years. Raghuram Rajan, the former governor of the Reserve Bank of India, has emphasised the need to make the workforce more employable and create jobs. Every year, around 7-8 million young

Indians enter the workforce, but many remain unemployed.

It is a proven fact that our youth with higher education degrees are not well-skilled. One of the main reasons why skills are more important than higher degrees is because they are directly applicable to the job at hand.

A candidate with a degree may have a broad understanding of a subject, but without the specific skills needed to perform the job, they may struggle to succeed. On the other hand, a candidate with the right set of skills, even if they don't have a higher degree, may be able to hit the ground running. It is essential to note that having relevant skills is more crucial than having higher degrees since skills are directly applicable to the job at hand.

A candidate with a degree may have a broad understanding of a subject, but without the specific skills required to perform the job, they may struggle to succeed. Conversely, a candidate with the right set of skills, even if they don't have a higher degree, can hit the ground running and perform exceptionally well. For example, gig skill courses like digital marketing and beauty-wellness are available for around Rs 30 to 50 thousand and have a placement scope of over 90 per cent.

A gig economy offers a shot: The gig economy in India is vibrant, skill-driven and bucking the unemployed youths. According to a report by gig work platform Taskmo (which has over 7,50,000 gig workers registered) youth participation in the gig economy

has increased an astounding eightfold between 2019 and 2022, with most of the young people coming from Tier-I and Tier-II cities. In 2022, a projection report by Niti Aayog on the gig economy predicted a higher demand for skilled gig workers in the future. Areas such as digital marketing, social media management, logistics, healthcare and beauty-wellness will be in high demand, reflecting the diverse needs of employers and the evolution of the job market. The gig workforce is expected to expand to 23.5 million by 2029-30, from 7.7 million in 2021-22.

It's fascinating to see that a professionally trained gig worker, such as a hairdresser, can earn more than an MBA or IITan's. Jawed Habib, a hair stylist expert entrepreneur, is an excellent example of this. With his global exposure, he's inspiring young people to envision beauty wellness as a profession of the future. It's important to note that having a higher degree is no longer the only way to get hired or advance in a career. Employers are increasingly looking for candidates with specific skills that are directly applicable to the job and can help the company succeed. Therefore, it's crucial to focus on market-driven gig skill sets.

Taiwan urges for stronger global health governance

Taiwan advocates for global health governance, urging inclusion and collaboration to ensure human rights

Despite not being a WHO member State, Taiwan emphasises the importance of contributing insights into pandemic management and learning from international best practices. Taiwan's proactive approach to pandemic response underscores its commitment to global health. Advocating for amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) and inclusion in the pandemic agreement, Taiwan seeks to collaborate on monitoring, reporting and exchanging vital health data to enhance global health security. Additionally, Taiwan champions universal health coverage and humanitarian efforts to uphold the fundamental human right to health worldwide. The three years of

the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a terrible loss of life and exacerbated health inequalities. The global economy slumped and, worldwide, people's lives were affected. This experience demonstrated that the present global health governance framework is not effective in responding to threats to global health. Although COVID-19 is no longer labelled a public health emergency of international

concern (PHEIC) and trade and economic activity globally have returned to normal, the World Health Organisation (WHO) cautions against the threat of a Disease X pandemic. Therefore, countries across the globe must unite to bolster health governance. WHO and many countries began reviewing response strategies during the COVID-19 pandemic. Weaknesses in the International Health Regulations (2005) as concerns managing this crisis were revealed. As a result, changes are afoot. Proposed revisions include enhanced surveillance, reporting and information sharing; improved response readiness; and revised criteria for declaring PHEICs. At the same time, there is vigorous debate around a new

pandemic agreement, which aims to craft a robust global pandemic governance framework grounded in accountability, transparency and equity. It may be approved at the 77th World Health Assembly. As Taiwan is not a WHO member State, it cannot directly influence revisions to the International Health Regulations (2005) or the drafting of the pandemic agreement. Nevertheless, we remain greatly concerned about the content of and developments regarding these central documents. We are eager to contribute our insights into pandemic management and learn from international best practices. Taiwan was the nation that initially identified the epidemic risk and promptly executed adap-

tive measures. Taiwan also proactively shared vital information with global partners and garnered public trust through a commitment to openness. We strongly endorse the passage and implementation of amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) and the pandemic agreement. We call on WHO to include Taiwan as a signatory to these documents. We urge WHO to support Taiwan's inclusion in overseeing global health. Taiwan remains committed to participating based on the principles of professionalism, pragmatism and making contributions. Taiwan seeks to cooperate with WHO to remedy geographic gaps in global health security and to con-

struct a comprehensive global health framework. The WHO Council on the Economics of Health for All has found that at least 140 countries recognise health as a fundamental human right in their constitutions. Despite this, many nations have not passed and implemented laws to ensure that their citizens have access to healthcare services. Taiwan has worked hard to reach universal health coverage and has consistently improved the quality of health care over the past few decades in line with WHO recommendations. Taiwan has effectively integrated and allocated social welfare resources to enhance primary and oral health care for all, implement mental health programs and

strengthen the social safety net. Taiwan has put in place an agile and resilient healthcare system able to combat both communicable and non-communicable diseases. We are improving health for all individuals throughout their entire lives. The theme for World Health Day 2024 is "My health, my right." This is a way to advocate for every individual, everywhere, to have access to quality health services, education and information, as well as enjoy safe drinking water, clean air, good nutrition, quality housing, decent working conditions and freedom from discrimination. Through a public-private partnership, Taiwan has been contributing to global efforts to realise the

right to health in collaboration with partner countries and international organisations. Taiwan should be included, as a matter of pragmatism, in the World Health Assembly and all WHO meetings, activities and mechanisms, particularly those concerned with the WHO pandemic agreement. This would better empower Taiwan to collaborate with global partners to uphold the fundamental human right to health stipulated in the WHO Constitution and the vision of leaving no one behind espoused in the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Two-day summit on critical minerals from today

The government will hold a two-day summit on critical minerals beginning Monday to foster collaboration, share knowledge and drive innovation in the field of critical mineral beneficiation and processing. The Ministry of Mines, in collaboration with the Shakti Sustainable Energy Foundation (Shakti), Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW), and Indian Institute of Sustainable Development (IISD), will hold 'Critical Minerals Summit: Enhancing Beneficiation and Processing Capabilities' from April 29 to 30th, 2024 here. The summit will bring together a diverse array of Indian and international stakeholders, including industry leaders, startups, government officials, scientists, academics, and policy experts, the mines ministry said in a statement. Participants will engage in active dialogue and interactive workshops focused on critical issues such as mineral auction progress, policy incentives for CRM ecosystem development, and the advancement of commercially viable and environmentally sustainable solutions.



Need to be watchful about steel imports: T V Narendran

As steel imports continue to surge, Tata Steel CEO T V Narendran has said there is a need to be watchful about the situation. The comment comes at a time when India has reported a 38 per cent surge in steel imports to 8.319 million tonnes, becoming a net importer of the commodity during the 2023-24 financial year. Speaking to PTI, the industry executive said, "It would be a pity if the situation continues in the long run. We have to be watchful about imports." As long as it is unfair imports, the government needs to deal with it, Narendran said without elaborating further. Steel consumption is expected to grow 8-10 per cent in the ongoing 2024-25 fiscal year, he said in reply to a separate question on demand. Steelmakers have been raising concerns on increasing imports from certain countries, including China and seeking the government's intervention on the issue. Domestic players have also been demanding a curb on imports and review of free trade agreements (FTAs) with several countries.



Former Tech M India biz head to set up AI startup

Former Tech Mahindra India business head Jagdish Mitra has set up an AI startup with a proposed initial investment of Rs 65-80 crore. The startup is likely to commence operations in the next three months. "We will start going to customers in 8-12 months. Initially, we will invest USD 8-10 million," Mitra -- one of the contenders for the post of Tech Mahindra CEO position after CP Gurnani resigned -- said. "Cost arbitrage factor, driven by manpower, is going to be seriously impacted. It will be driven by values. We need to move from a cost-driven proposition to a value-driven proposition. We are going to focus on value proposition. Our firm will start operations within a quarter," Mitra, who moved out of Tech Mahindra earlier this month, said. Without disclosing the name of the company, Mitra said the firm will focus on manufacturing, retail, and sportstech and operate both from the US as well as India. Everyone will not develop chatGPT models. It will cost a huge amount of money.



AdaniConneX raises \$1.44bn from global banks

AdaniConneX, a joint venture equally owned by Adani Enterprises and EdgeConneX that is building data centres, secured India's largest sustainability-linked financing arrangement, raising up to US\$ 1.44 billion (around Rs 11,520 crore), the company said on Sunday. Adani Enterprises Ltd, the flagship of billionaire Gautam Adani-run conglomerate, is investing around US\$ 1.5 billion on its fledgling data centre business in the next three years. Its joint venture with EdgeConneX plans to build nine data centres with a total capacity of 1 gigawatt by 2030 to provide infrastructure for the booming digital services demand. In a statement, the firm said the "financing has an initial commitment of US\$ 875 million, with an accordion feature to extend commitment up to US\$ 1.44 billion."

'Startups in India grew over 300 times in ten years'

From just about 350 startups in 2014, their number in India grew over 300 times in the past ten years after Narendra Modi took over as the Prime Minister, Union Minister Jitendra Singh said on Sunday. He said the country today has the 3rd largest startup ecosystem globally and is home to the fastest-growing unicorns. "For the first time in the history of independent India, Modi as PM made a painstaking and conscious effort to educate the youth of this country that employment is not confined only to a government job and he has promoted new avenues of livelihood which may be more lucrative than a government job," Singh, the Minister of State for Personnel, told PTI here. From just about 350 startups



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in the year 2014, startups in India grew over 300 times in ten years after Narendra Modi took over as the Prime Minister, he said. Singh further said PM Modi unleashed India's space research by opening up the hitherto conservative and secluded sector. "India has reached for the moon and beyond with the twin feats of Chandrayaan-3 and Aditya L1 solar mission in the last year alone," he added. Singh said the number of space startups has gone up from a single digit to three dig-

it s just about four years since the space sector was opened up to the private sector. PM Modi's out-of-the-box decisions have given a push to different sectors including space, railways, roads, infrastructure, and electronics-communication, and which has posted India's economy from 11th rank to 5th largest economy and is now on the verge of occupying third rank, the Union minister said. Singh said, in 2014, when PM Modi took over, India stood as the world's tenth-largest economy. "In less than ten years, we jumped to 5th position. Hopefully this year it will emerge as the 4th largest economy and during PM Modi's 3rd term, India will be the world's 3rd largest economy, marching on to become the no 1 economy by 2047," he added.

Banks may have to slowdown loan growth: S&P

Indian banks' credit growth, profitability and asset quality would remain robust in current fiscal reflecting strong economic growth, but they may be compelled to slow down their loan growth as deposits are not growing at a similar pace, S&P Global Ratings has said. In the Asia-Pacific 2Q 2024 Banking Update, S&P Global Ratings Director SSEA Nikita Anand said the agency expects the sector's strong credit growth to moderate to 14 per cent in FY25, from 16 per cent in FY24, if deposit growth, especially retail deposits, remain tepid. Anand said there is a deterioration in loan-to-deposit ratio in every bank, with loan growth being 2-3 percentage points higher than deposit growth. "We expect banks to bring down their loan growth in FY25 and bring it in line with



deposit growth. If banks do not do that, they would be paying higher to get wholesale funding, which will impact profitability," she said at a recent webinar of S&P Global Ratings. Generally, loan growth has been led by private sector banks which see around 17-18 per cent growth, public sector banks on the other hand see loan growth in the range of 12-14 per cent. Anand said Indian banks can support loan growth of as high as 15-20 per cent over

three years without need for raising capital. The loan growth is 2-3 percentage points higher than deposit growth of the banking sector. "For India, we expect credit growth, profitability and asset quality to remain robust reflecting strong economic growth. Loan growth is 1.5 times of nominal GDP growth, while deposit growth is in line with nominal GDP growth. "Loan growth should come in line with deposits rather than outpacing deposits.

Market valuation of 6 firms rises Rs 1.30 L cr

SBI, ICICI Bank top gainers

The combined market valuation of six of the top-10 most valued firms increased Rs 1,30,734.57 crore last week, with State Bank of India and ICICI Bank emerging as the biggest gainers in line with an overall positive trend in equities. Last week, the BSE benchmark advanced 641.83 points or 0.87 per cent. The valuation of the State Bank of India rallied Rs 45,158.54 crore to Rs 7,15,218.40 crore. ICICI Bank's market valuation rose Rs 28,726.33 crore to Rs 7,77,750.22 crore.



Bharti Airtel added Rs 20,747.99 crore to Rs 7,51,406.35 crore, and that of ITC jumped Rs 18,914.35 crore to Rs 5,49,265.32 crore. The market capitalisation (mcap) of Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) advanced by Rs 9,487.5 crore to Rs 6,24,941.40 crore, and that of Infosys went up by Rs 7,699.86 crore to Rs 5,93,636.31 crore. However, the mcap of Reliance Industries declined by Rs 26,115.56 crore to Rs 19,64,079.96 crore. The valuation of HDFC Bank dipped by Rs 16,371.34 cr to Rs 11,46,943.59 cr.

China's share in India's goods imports jump to 30%

With increasing India's dependence on Chinese industrial goods like telecom, machinery and electronics, Beijing's share in New Delhi's imports of such goods rose to 30 per cent from 21 per cent in the last 15 years, a report said. According to the report by the economic think tank Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), the growing trade deficit with China is a cause of concern, and the strategic implications of this dependency are profound, affecting not only economic but also national security dimensions. From 2019 to 2024, India's exports to China have stagnated at around US\$ 16 billion annually, while imports from China have surged from US\$ 70.3 billion in 2018-19 to over



US\$ 101 billion in 2023-24, resulting in a cumulative trade deficit exceeding US\$ 387 billion over five years. The Indian government and industries must evaluate and potentially recalibrate their import strategies, fostering more diversified and resilient supply chains, GTRI founder Ajay Srivastava said. This is imperative not only to mitigate economic risks but also to bolster domestic indus-

tries and reduce dependency on single-country imports, especially from a geopolitical competitor like China, he added. "Over the last 15 years, China's share in India's industrial product imports has increased significantly, from 21 per cent to 30 per cent. "This growth in imports from China has been much faster than India's overall import growth, with China's exports to India growing 2.3

Corporate earnings, US Fed interest rate decision to drive mkts

Quarterly earnings from corporates, the US Fed interest rate decision and other global trends will be the major driving factors for determining movement in the domestic equity market in a holiday-shortened week ahead, analysts said. Besides, factors like trading activity of foreign investors, global oil benchmark Brent crude and rupee-dollar trend would also influence trading. Domestic equity markets would remain closed on Wednesday on account of Maharashtra Day.

"Domestically, the next batch of Q4 earnings reports will drive stock-specific movements," said Santosh Meena, Head of Research, Swastika Investmart Ltd. Monthly auto sales figures will be announced at the beginning of May, and the next phase of voting will be significant, he said. "On the global front, the outcome of the US Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting on May 1st will be important. Economic data releases from China and the US, along with movement in the global currency market, will also be the factors to consider," Meena added.



CII launches corporate governance charter for startups

Industry body CII on Sunday announced it has launched a charter for startups that enlist voluntary recommendations on corporate governance keeping in view unique nuances to govern startups. The Corporate Governance Charter also prescribes guidelines appropriate for startups based on the specific stages of their life cycle.



"This charter is designed for entities incorporated under the Companies Act, 2013 only, and therefore the term 'Startup'. However, entities which are in the nature of sole proprietorship, limited liability

partnership, partnerships may adopt similar structures/guidelines for corporate governance within their organization," the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) stated. The purpose of this charter is to help startups become responsible corporate citizens and also enable them to share it with their stakeholders to establish themselves as being well-governed, it said.

Vedanta best-placed to ride rising commodity prices, say analysts

Mining conglomerate Vedanta Ltd is likely to see less pressure on cash flows after liability management at the holding company level and is now best placed to ride rising commodity prices, analysts said. Improved performance in aluminium, power and zinc enabled the company to turn in EBITDA of Rs 87,600 crore in the January-March quarter, up by 4 per cent quarter-on-

quarter. The improved performance was attributable to lower cost of production in aluminium and zinc and higher sales volume, partially offset by softer zinc prices. Despite marginal delays, Vedanta is set to complete its alumina/aluminium/intermediate zinc expansion during the current fiscal year (FY25), which will provide visibility around volume growth and cost reduction FY26 onwards.

Sebi bars Growpatal, other entities from securities markets

Markets regulator Sebi said that Farm Tech Silo LLP, also known as Growpatal, and other related entities and their directors will remain barred from securities markets till the outcome of a probe into collection of money through unauthorised investment schemes. However, the regulator modified its earlier order and unfroze the bank accounts of agricultural investment platform Growpatal's directors Rituraj Sharma, Gayatri Rinwa and Krishna Sharma. A detailed investigation in the matter is in progress, which may bring out additional acts of omission or commission of the entities, if any, Sebi said, adding that the findings in the extant order are prima facie. "I, under sections of Collective Investment Schemes (CIS) Regulations, hereby confirm the directions issued vide the interim order, till further orders, subject to the modification that the bank accounts of the individuals namely, Rituraj Sharma, Gayatri Rinwa and Krishna Sharma shall be unfrozen," Sebi's whole-time member Amarjeet Singh said



in the latest order on Friday. Singh said the ban will continue as the "proceedings seek to ensure that the funds that are available to the entities are not misused". "Given the lack of clarity around revenues, the apparently exaggerated claims on the land under cultivation and the deficiencies in submission on fund utilisation and financial projections, the balance of convenience lies in favour of continuance of the restraint against the entities till the time the proceedings in the present matter are complete." In an interim order passed in January this year, Sebi had barred Farm Tech Silo LLP (Growpatal), related entities

and their directors from collecting money from investors and prohibited them from the securities market till further directions. Also, they were directed to "cease and desist" from floating any collective investment scheme (CIS) directly or indirectly in any manner. Additionally, they have been stopped from collecting money from partners or investors through existing schemes. In its probe, Sebi found that Growpatal offered various investment plans to the public in the agricultural sector. It also claimed to offer fixed tax-free profits in the range of 11 to 14 per cent through investments in the agriculture sector.

Musk in China amid efforts to promote Tesla's tech

Billionaire Elon Musk arrived in Beijing on Sunday amid speculation that he may unveil Tesla's autonomous driving technology in the burgeoning electric vehicle (EV) market in China. The SpaceX and Tesla chief travelled to China at the invitation of the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade, meeting with CCPIT president Ren Hongbin to discuss further cooperation with the country, according to Chinese state-run broadcaster CTGN.

Musk is expected to meet senior Chinese officials at the State Council and "old friends" in Beijing, Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported. His Tesla has become a popular EV in China after he set up a USD seven billion factory in Shanghai which went into production in 2020. Musk, who recently skipped a scheduled visit to India to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi to firm up plans to open a Tesla factory in the country, is visiting Beijing when his Tesla market in China is threatened by the local EVs' increas-



ing sales. The Austin-based (Texas) Tesla has faced fierce competition from Chinese EV makers in the past few years. It has cut the prices of its Shanghai-

made vehicles by up to six per cent to maintain its leading position in China's premium EV segment. Grace Tao, Tesla's vice-president of external relations in China, wrote a commentary piece in China's official newspaper People's Daily on Friday, saying autonomous driving is a key growth driver for the country's new energy vehicle sector, arguing that the technology will hatch new business models such as robotaxis, a vision that Musk has embraced, the Post reported. Musk's latest visit to China coincides with the 2024 Beijing

Auto Show, which kicked off on Thursday. As a stronger backer of Beijing in the US despite concerns over China's rise across the political divide in Washington, Musk enjoys red carpet treatment in China. In 2019, Tesla was allowed to drive cars into the Zhongnanhai compound, the living and working area of Chinese leaders, when former Premier Li Keqiang hosted the CEO, and during Musk's three-day visit to Beijing last June he was received by then foreign minister Qin Gang, according to the Post report.

Priyansh Srivastava and Garvit Soni's artistic path is a monument to their unrelenting dedication and unlimited inventiveness, from the seamless integration of Indian classical and contemporary elements to intense live performances that truly connect with audiences. Discover their most recent endeavours, impending partnerships, and the touching backstories of their most well-known songs in this unique look into their musical career!

Each song showcases a combination of passion and the ability of words to arouse feelings, with tunes composed in a matter of days. Garvit reveals that *Jiya Mera*, *Keh Do Na*, *Rasta*, and *Baaton Hi Baaton* are the four tracks of the EP *Lafz*. "*Jiya Mera* was created in September or October, while *Keh Do Na* was created more than a year earlier. The song *Baaton Hi Baaton* featured voices and compositions added to it by songwriters Shikar and Dhairya, who provided a track they immediately identified with. The fourth track, *Rasta*, was written a few months ago. The fact that each song took no more than five or six days to compose is what sets them apart from other tunes. We purposefully chose the name *Lafz* because it means "words," which we feel are a potent means of conveying love and feelings. This truly matches the EP's atmosphere, which is why the title is appropriate."

"Priyansh and I have a strong foundation in Indian classical music, with him having completed both his bachelor's and master's degrees in the field," Garvit says, discussing their journey through both modern and Indian classical music. "We both have a strong passion for Indian classical music and take great pleasure in writing and performing ragas. To increase the variety of our musical expression, we are naturally curious to investigate various genres, including pop music. Our most recent project combines modern beats with melodies from traditional Indian music. Previously, we would usually compose something before we would produce it. However, as of late, we have been experimenting with the opposite order—that is, producing before composing. It's been a thrilling exploration voyage. Our fusion style is a representation of our individuality, free from strict formulas that let us explore other genres while maintaining a connection to our cultural heritage. When writing a song, we just go with the flow and feel a strong connection to the music as it develops."

Every song in their repertoire—which ranges from intimate tales to joint ventures—embodies a distinct story and demonstrates the flawless blending of their creative views. Garvit says, "Writing is what we do best, and it's a passion that comes naturally to us. I quickly wrote the lyrics after listening to their music, and we produced a demo. We immediately added a tabla group to improve the sound as we semi-produced it. The procedure was simply amazing. We tried to add an Afro flavour to the song *Rasta*, hoping to create a catchy, energetic vibe that would appeal to listeners right away."

As we went on ahead in this interview, Garvit further shared that a challenge they encountered is navigating through the myriad of individuals who may offer misguided advice, claiming expertise they lack and lacking respect for the craft of music. However, "With my partner's help, we added a variety of viewpoints to our songs, which makes it simpler to sort through and stay loyal to our vision. Sometimes our minds work together perfectly since we both love to combine Western, Indian classical, and modern music styles. We are directed toward a shared creative destiny by our shared vision. We may have different opinions at times; when Priyansh writes, I make recommendations for enhancements, and vice versa. Working together as a pair comes naturally to us, and we both strengthen the composition by balancing each other out. We follow our gut feelings and share our works with people we love, highlighting the significance of having faith in one's music and being true to one's artistic vision."

Resurgent Delhi Capitals will look to exploit Kolkata Knight Riders' bowling vulnerabilities and ascend to top-four in the table during their Indian Premier League match here on Monday.

With four wins in their last five matches, the Rishabh Pant-led side is gradually assembling their pieces and starting to look like a force to be reckoned with.

On the other hand, the Gautam Gambhir-mentored side has endured three defeats in their last five matches with their profligacy in bowling hurting them badly. Signed up as Lungi Ngidi's replacement, Aussie Jake Fraser-McGurk has proved to be their X-factor with his ferocious batting display at the top.

A natural power-hitter with superb hand-eye coordination, the 22-year-old has taken the IPL by storm scoring 247 runs

in five matches at a strike-rate of 237.50.

His brutal treatment of the otherwise sensational Jasprit Bumrah stands as a testimony of his skill-level. McGurk slammed a slower ball from the Mumbai Indians pacer for a six and it was the first time a batter lofted Bumrah for a first-ball six.

The pacer conceded 18 runs in his first over, the most by him in this season in a single over as DC overcame MI by 10 runs on Saturday.

He made a 27-ball 84 against MI, and McGurk will relish the batting-friendly conditions at Eden Gardens where 523 runs, including a record 42 sixes, were scored between Punjab Kings and KKR.

The PBKS on that occasion had scaled down a world record 262.

But DC's batting is not only about McGurk, the South African Tristan Stubbs also left everyone in awe with his astonishing power-hitting, smashing a 25-ball 48 not out



against Mumbai. Pant is also making rapid progress with every match as the DC top-five in Fraser-McGurk, Abhishek Porel, Shai Hope, Pant and Stubbs will be

a cause of concern for KKR bowlers. The KKR replaced injured Mitchell Starc with Sri Lankan pacer Dushmantha Chameera but the latter gave away 16 runs

per over in his debut for KKR and failed to inspire any confidence. Barring spinner Sunil Narine, who returned with 1/24 from his four overs, none of the KKR

bowlers made any impact. IPL's costliest buy Starc has been their biggest letdown and KKR would hope that the Aussie hits his stride soon after overcoming the thumb injury.

In bowling, Kuldeep Yadav who was sidelined under Dinesh Karthik while he was with KKR, will look to prove a point against the Kolkataans as he along with left-arm spinner Axar Patel has formed a formidable spin pair.

However, the home side has some positives to look up to. Narine's sensational form with the bat -- 357 runs from eight matches with two fifties and one century -- has given a thrust to their batting up the order this season.

Narine and Phil Salt have scored bulk of their runs at the top, but the likes of Angkrish Raghuvanshi, Shreyas Iyer, Rinku Singh, Andre Russell and Ramandeep Singh will have to chip in with a bit more runs.

After this match, KKR will be on the road to face Mumbai and Lucknow, hence they will be eager to register a win before those tougher assignments and keep themselves in the play-off race.

India should pick two wrist spinners for T20 WC: Irfan

Former all-rounder Irfan Pathan said India must pick five specialist bowlers along with two wrist-spinners in their squad for the upcoming T20 World Cup to be played in the Caribbean and the USA.

With the May 1 deadline for the squad announcement approaching fast, discussions have intensified around the combination of India's squad for the showpiece event starting on June 2.

"You need five good bowlers - that's a must. What are your wicket-taking options? When you're talking about Ravindra Jadeja at No. 8 and playing as a spin (all-rounder), I would rather have two wrist-spinners playing," Pathan told Star Sports.

"I would rather have two proper wrist-spinners playing, (Ravi) Bishnoi and Kuldeep (Yadav), in my playing XI. If you look at Bishnoi's numbers, you know, when he played, he was pretty good." Pathan, however, is not in favour of calling up Rajasthan Royals' Yuzvendra Chahal for the World Cup.



"Yes, we're talking about Chahal right now because of the IPL performances but don't forget the fielding part of it as well. If you have to balance the fielding, you have to balance where a bowler can bowl at the particular area," he said. Pathan conceded that Jasprit Bumrah is the only automatic selection among the bowlers. "There's only one player who you can blindly say (certain for selection) is Bumrah. But apart from Bumrah, you need at least two fast bowlers who can be part of the regular XI," the former India cricketer said. "The biggest problem the Indian team has is the

combination of fast bowling. It's very important to fix that combination, so go towards experience. "With Bumrah, you can see (Mohammed) Siraj and Arshdeep (Singh) there, which I don't think is ideal, but this is the only option you have now," he said. Former India batter K Srikanth, meanwhile, is not in favour of Siraj being selected for the World Cup. "Bumrah is in the squad. Arshdeep as well. But the third pacer can't be Siraj. He'll bowl well in one game and then not perform in 10 games. He's an erratic bowler, you saw it in the World Cup," he

said. "That's why I'm saying we should look at who's bowling well in the death overs, and that is Avesh Khan. He's been performing well and he's done well on the international front, he has a little experience as well. He's mastered the wide yorkers also," Srikanth added.

However, former Australia all-rounder Tom Moody backed Siraj. "He looks mentally and physically fatigued. He has come into this IPL having played a lot of all format cricket for India for a long period of time," he said.

"He plays his cricket in the IPL at probably the hardest venue (Bengaluru) whether you bowl quick or you bowl spin - that needs to be taken into consideration. The third thing is he's playing in a poor side. RCB have been a poor side this year and it's very hard to rise with what's happening around you." "I would back him 100 per cent to step up in the World Cup, purely because if you look at historically what he's done for India and even what he did in the IPL last year," Moody added.

Samson, Rahul put their hands up for WC selection: Smith

The classy fifties made by Sanju Samson and KL Rahul in the IPL has intensified the race for the second wicketkeeper's slot in the Indian team for the upcoming T20 World Cup, reckoned former South African captain Graeme Smith.

The Indian squad for the marquee event in June is set to

be announced soon and Rishabh Pant is set to be drafted in as the first-choice wicketkeeper-batter.

"They (Rahul and Samson) needed to build a partnership. Rahul did it with (Deepak) Hooda and Sanju did it beautifully with Dhruv Jurel. The difference was that Sanju finished the game, while KL got out at a key phase. But it was brilliant to see both excellent players put their

hands up for World Cup selection," said Smith in JioCinema.

Rahul made a 48-ball 76 for Lucknow Super Giants, but Samson trumped that effort with an unbeaten 71 off 33 balls as Rajasthan Royals cruised to a seven-wicket victory.

Former Australian pacer Brett Lee lauded Jurel for supporting Samson with a fine 52 not out off 34 balls

during their unbroken fourth wicket stand that was worth 121 runs.

"He's a quality batter. He's got proper cricket shots. He can play all formats of the game and knows when to go through the gears as needed."

"His shots are classy and have the power to go towards the cow corner. He shows his class and continues to grow in stature," said the New South Welshman.

Batters have evolved quicker than bowlers in IPL: Klusener

Lucknow Super Giants assistant coach Lance Klusener placed the quicker evolution of batters as reason behind the frequent tall team totals in the ongoing Indian Premier League.

The teams have been going past 200 and even 250 quite effortlessly in this IPL, and the former South African all-rounder opined that the modest performance by bowlers at death overs too has helped batters to add quick runs. "Just looking at the bowling

performances throughout the competition, for me, they have been quite disappointing. There hasn't been a lot of good bowling," Klusener told the media after LSG's seven-wicket loss to Rajasthan Royals here on Saturday.

"There's been a lot of ordinary bowling and batsmen are just so good these days, they're taking advantage. Maybe the batsmen have evolved a lot quicker than the bowlers in this competition. "I haven't seen a lot of good death bowling in the competition and that's why



teams have been able to take advantage. Sure, surfaces have

been flat. I haven't seen a lot of swing either," he added. Klusener observed that the bowlers are opting for several variations at death but they have not been using the wide yorkers enough.

"It's easy to overcomplicate. If you run in and execute even four out of six yorkers... We don't see that anymore. We don't see that skill," he said.

"We're going to slower balls and a whole lot of other variations. That pure death bowling of yorkers, whether it's wide or straight, that's a skill that we don't see very often these days," he added.

Archery WC: India men team shocks Olympic champions Korea to bag historic gold

Indian men's recurve team of Dhiraj Bommadevara, Tarundeep Rai and Pravin Jadhav shocked reigning Olympic champions South Korea in a historic win to land an Archery World Cup gold medal after 14 years, here on Sunday.

This triumph over the archery powerhouse in well over a decade also comes as a boost to their chances of securing a berth in the upcoming Paris Olympics. The trio of Dhiraj, Tarundeep and Pravin showed ice-cool composure to get the better of mighty Koreans without dropping a set.

The 40-year-old Army man Tarundeep was also a part of



the gold medal-winning team in Shanghai World Cup Stage 4 in August 2010. Then the recurve team comprising Rahul Banerjee, Tarundeep and Jayanta defeated Japan. In a battle between the top two seeds of the competition, India won 5-1 (57-57, 57-55, 55-53), taking their gold medal count to five in the season-opening Stage 1 World Cup.

The success also rubbed on

the recurve mixed team of Ankit Bhakat and Dhiraj who trounced Alejandra Valencia and Matias Grande of Mexico 6-0 (35-31, 38-35, 39-37) to win bronze.

On a comeback trail after missing the whole 2023 after becoming mother in December 2022, Deepika Kumari faltered in the final hurdle to settle for a silver in the women's recurve individual section.

Messi gets two goals in front of record New England crowd

Lionel Messi scored two goals to excite a New England Revolution-record crowd, leading Inter Miami CF to a 4-1 victory on Saturday night.

Messi didn't disappoint the crowd of 65,612 that filled Gillette Stadium, scoring on a left-footed kick from deep inside the box for his ninth goal of the season, breaking a 1-all tie in the 68th minute. In fact, he made a little history, too. Miami posted on the social platform X that he was the first player in MLS history to record 16 goal contributions in his first seven games of a season. "Obviously, he's done it his whole life. We expect it from him," said teammate

Benjamin Cremaschi, who scored the third goal after Messi's shot was stopped. "He makes it look so easy. We're just happy that we have him by our side. When he has the opportunity, he takes it."

The attendance beat the previous record of 61,316, when the Revolution lost to the LA Galaxy in the 2002 MLS final.

In the opening half, he was a few feet inside the box, scoring on a left-foot kick to tie it at 1-1 in the 32nd minute.

"I thought in the first half, after (our) goal, we had them locked up pretty good," New England coach Caleb Porter said. "They weren't getting many chances, they weren't getting a lot of time and space to operate," he said.

Indian women team seals Uber Cup quarterfinal spot

Asian champions India, who had defeated Canada 4-1 in the opening tie, produced another fine show as they recovered from the opening match loss of Ashmita Chaliha and went on to win the rest of the contests with ease to come up trumps.

It turned out to be a fine weekend for the young and inexperienced Indian side who were missing the big guns, but they displayed their skill and temperament at the big stage to win two out of two ties.

China blanked Canada 3-0 in another group A match and



the result was enough for both India and their Asian neighbours to seal the quarterfinal spot.

With the twin victories, India are now placed in the second position behind China in Group A. The two teams will clash on Tuesday in their final group match to decide the top spot.

The 53rd-ranked Chaliha, who had outwitted Canada's Michelle Li on Saturday, found the going tough

against world No. 18 Yeo Jia Min on Sunday, going down 15-21, 18-21.

National champions Priya Konjengbam and Shruti Mishra, ranked 67, then brought India back with a 21-15, 21-16 win over Xiao En Heng and Jin Yu Jia in the final women's doubles.

Isharani, ranked 83rd, went on to double India's lead by claiming a 21-13, 21-16 win over Insyirah Khan in the second singles.

2012 Olympic champion Gabby competes for first time in eight years at American Classic

Whether the gymnastics star's return to the sport carries all the way to the Paris Olympics remains to be seen.

Douglas, who became the first Black woman to win the Olympic all-around title when she triumphed in London in 2012, competed for the first time in eight years on Saturday at the American Classic.

The 28-year-old looked rusty in spots and promising in others while posting a score of 50.65 in the all-around. Douglas qualified in multiple events for the U.S. Championships in Fort Worth, Texas, next month. She will get another chance to qualify for the all-

around competition at nationals when she takes the floor at the U.S. Classic in Hartford, Connecticut, on May 18.

Douglas last competed at the 2016 Rio Olympics, where she helped the Americans claim a second straight gold in the team competition. She took an extended break from the sport but never officially retired. The itch to come back returned while watching the 2022 U.S. Championships, and she's spent the better part of the last two years training in the Dallas area with an eye toward trying to make the five-woman U.S. Team that will be heavily favored to win gold in Paris this summer.

Her comeback, however, has been shrouded in mystery. She was



supposed to compete at Winter Cup in February but she pulled out of the competition just days before after testing positive for COVID-19. She has limited press exposure and unlike 2020 Olympic gold medalist Sunisa Lee and Jade Carey - both of whom competed at American Classic - she opted not to participate in podium training on Friday.

Douglas walked out onto the floor about an hour before competition and showed flashes of what turned her into a star in London. Her double-twisting Yurchenko on vault had plenty of amplitude and on bars - her best event - she had the pieces of a routine that would certainly be competitive at the elite level.

consistently.

Douglas came off bars twice and her floor routine lacked the crispness and endurance to stack up with what will be required for anyone hoping to make a serious bid for the Olympic team. There is time for Douglas, but not much. The U.S. Classic is in three weeks. The U.S. Championships are in five and the Olympic Trials await in Minneapolis in late June.

Carey, who won gold on floor exercise in Tokyo, captured the all-around with a score of 55.000 while also recording the top scores on vault and floor. Lee, who has dealt with kidney-related health issues the last two years, put together a dazzling beam routine to win easily with a score of 14.
