

## 18 Naxalites killed in encounter with jawans

At least 18 Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Kanker district on Tuesday, the Border Security Force (BSF) said.

Three security personnel suffered injuries in the fierce gun-battle and a large quantity of weapons was also recovered from the spot, the state police said.

The gunfight took place at around 2 pm in Hapatola forest between Binagunda and Koronar villages under Chhotebethiya police station limits, when a joint team of the Border Security Force (BSF) and the state police's District Reserve Guard

"Bodies of 18 Maoist cadres were

recovered from the encounter spot. Seven AK series rifles and three Light Machine Guns were also recovered from the spot," the statement said. "One BSF personnel sustained bullet injury on his leg in the gunfight and he is reported to be out of danger," the statement added.

The Chhattisgarh police said three security personnel were injured in the gunfight and they were being shifted to a hospital for treatment.

## YSRCP MLC Thota sentenced to jail

The Visakhapatnam SC/ST Special Court has finally given a verdict in the case regarding the tonsuring of Dalit youths in 1996. The judgment was delivered on Tuesday.

has been sentenced to 18 months in jail, with an additional six months under another section of the law. This ruling also includes a fine of Rs 42,000 on each of the nine convicts involved in the case. Trimurthulu is currently vying for Konaseema district, representing the YSRCP in the upcoming elections scheduled for next month.

During the pronouncement of the verdict, MLC Thota Trimurthulu was present in court. The sentencing carries significant

## 5 of family killed as car crashes into lorry

Tragedy struck in Nellore on Tuesday as a devastating road accident claimed the lives of five persons, including three women and a young boy - all belonging to one family. which took place in the afternoon, resulted in the instantaneous loss of five lives. The deceased have been identified as Ganta Ramanamma, Davuluri Srinivasulu, Davuluri Varalakshmi, Ganta Neelima, and a six-year-old boy named Ganta Nandu.




## Shah, Nadda & Yogi to campaign for NDA candidates in Andhra







## Oncologist to take on industrialist

An election showdown is on the horizon in the Machilipatnam Lok Sabha segment within the combined Krishna district for the upcoming general elections. The contest will feature an oncologist, Dr. Simhadri Chandrasekhar Rao, based in Hyderabad, and Vallabhaneni Balashowry, an industrialistcum-politician who currently holds the MP seat.

Vallabhaneni Balashowry recently parted ways with the YSRCP, aligning himself with the Jana Sena Party (JSP). Consequently, the YSRCP nominated Dr Simhadri Chandrasekhar Rao, the son of prominent Oncologist and for-mer minister Simhadri Satyanarayana, as their candidate for the Lok Sabha. This sets the stage for a head-to-head battle between Chandrasekhar Rao and the seasoned politician Vallabhaneni Balashowry in

the upcoming elections.

Despite Dr Simhadri Chandrasekhar Rao's newcomer status in electoral politics, he has been actively engaged in campaign activities. Both candidates have commenced their election cam- Pedana,

paigns in the Lok Sabha constituency. The opposition TDP and BJP have thrown their support behind JSP candidate Balashowry. Political analysts foresee a closely contested battle between the YSRCP and ISP candidates in the impend-

ing elections.
Traditionally, Machilipatnam Lok Sabha seg-ment was a stronghold for the Congress party. However, it has been under the dominance of the TDP since the inception of the latter. Of the nine general elections held for the Machilipatnam LS so far, the TDP emerged victorious five times, while the Congress secured the seat thrice. The YSRCP clinched victory in

the 2019 election. The Machilipatnam LS comprises seven assembly segments: Machilipatnam,





Pamarru, Gannavaram. In the previous elections, except for Gannavaram, all six segments were won by the YSRCP, with Gannavaram being secured by the TDP. However, following recent political shifts, TDP's Gannavaram MLA Dr. Vallabhaneni Vamsi Mohan

YSRCP from the TDP. Kavuri Sambasiva Rao, a veteran politician, has etched his name in history by winning three times from the Machilipatnam Lok Sabha constituency. He secured victories as a Congress party candidate in the 1984 and 1989 general elections. Subsequently, he clinched the seat again in the 1998 elections as an MP. Following his tenure,

switched allegiance to the

including TDP's Konakalla Narayana Rao and Congress party's Maganti Ankineedu, who served two terms each.

In the inaugural general elections of 1952, Sanaka Bucchikotaiah of the Communist Party of India (CPI) emerged victorious as a Parliament Member from the Machilipatnam Lok Sabha. Additionally, Mandali Venkata Krishna Rao (1957), Mandala Venkata Swamy Naidu (1962), Y Ankineedu Prasad (1967), and Meduri Nageswara Rao (1971) represented this seg-ment. Apart from Mandala Venkata Swamy Naidu, who was elected as an Independent, the remaining MPs represented the Congress party.
Similarly, KP Reddaiah

Yadav contested as a TDP candidate in the 1991 elections, defeating Congress party's Kavuri Sambasiva Rao. This was followed by Kaikala Satyanarayana (1996) and Ambati Brahmanaiah (1999), who were elected as MPs from the TDP. However, in the 2004 elections, Badiga Ramakrishna of the Congress party emerged victorious. Apart from Kavuri Sambasiva Rao, no other candidate has been elected as MP from this segment three times.

The upcoming elections promise a fierce contest between YSRCP's Chandrasekhar Rao and JSP's Vallabhaneni Balashowry. Notably, Balashowry previously served as an MP from the Tenali Lok Sabha in the 2004 elections and later contested as a YSRCP candidate in 2019. His departure from the YSRCP to join the JSP stemmed from differences with Machilipatnam MLA Perni Venkatramaiah, alias

## Packaged commodity ads must mention quantity info: Metrology Dept

PNS VIJAYAWADA

The Andhra Pradesh Legal Metrology Department on Tuesday said companies advertising the price of their pre-pack-aged commodities must also mention their quantity and noncompliance is a violation, citing the case of Hindustan Unilever

Selectively mentioning the price of the pre-packaged commodity and refraining from revealing its net quantity violates Section 18 (2) of the Legal Metrology Act, 2009, an official

"Any advertisement mentioning the retail sale price of a pre-packaged commodity shall contain a declaration as to the net quantity or number of the commodity contained in the package in such form and manner as may be prescribed," said Andhra Pradesh Legal Metrology controller H Arun Kumar in a press release.

Kumar, who is also the civil supplies commissioner, noted the inspector of Legal Metrology, Visakhapatnam City has registered a case under Section 18 (2) of the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 against Hindustan Unilever Ltd on October 4, 2023.

He said the inspector registered the case for not declaring the quantity of an advertisement on YouTube in connection with Bru instant coffee.

Incidentally, the global FMCG giant appealed to the controller, claiming the advertisement was telecast on a private YouTube channel and argued it was not the autho-

rised channel of Hindustan Unilever Ltd, prompting the controller to initiate a

In this backdrop, Kumar highlighted that every advertisement of packaged commodities indicating their sale price must also inform their corresponding weight.

"Such cases where MRP (maximum retail price) is only indicated without (the) corresponding net quantity is a violation of Legal Metrology provisions and consumers may take note of it and such violations may be brought to the notice of the controller," Kumar

Parvathipuram Manyam's remoteness, difficult terrain, and limited access to healthcare previously contributed to its high IMR. PRISM 10 tackled these issues head-on with a multi-pronged approach designed for the tribal population. The initiative focuses on improved prenatal and postnatal care, enhanced nutrition programmes, increased immunisation rates, and tackling anaemia in pregnant and lactating women.

A key factor in PRISM 10's success is its innovative use of technology and data-driven solutions. Advanced analytics and digital health platforms allow healthcare providers to identify high-risk pregnancies and closely monitor health metrics. Additionally, the programme deployed 29 mobile health clinics and recruited 282 new community health officers to bridge geographical limitations. 
District Collector K Madhavilatha has made it clear that the government machinery has fully prepared to conduct elections transparently and all required arrangements are being made.

## Not correct to take steps that can overlap legal and judicial process

Amid the Opposition charge of being targeted by central probe agencies in the poll season, the Election Commission on Tuesday said it is committed to protecting level playing field but asserted that it is not correct to take any step that can overlap the legal and judicial

Several political parties from the INDIA bloc had approached the poll panel seeking its intervention in the alleged misuse of probe agencies by the government to target their leaders over graft.

Following the arrest of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal by the Enforcement Directorate in a money laundering case linked to the alleged excise scam, the opposition parties had mounted renewed attack on the government for its alleged bid to silence their leaders ahead of parliamentary

In a statement, the EC said

it was guided by constitutional wisdom when presented with "live situations" involving political persons which have been under active consideration and orders of the courts based on criminal investiga-

"While the Commission remained unwaveringly committed to protection of level playing field and campaign entitlement of political parties and candidates, it has not found it correct to take any step that could overlap or overrun the legal judicial process," it

The poll panel said though it is not obliged to do so, it has put in public domain, for the first time, its enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) during first month of its operation, along with details of action taken.

The EC said its move will help address and stop "misgivings and insinuations" coming from certain quarters, "howev-

## Modi has given 'guarantee' to bring UCC: Amit Shah

## 'Breast cancer may cause a million deaths a year'

Breast cancer is now the world's most common carcinogenic disease with the ailment likely to cause a million deaths a year by 2040, according to a new Lancet

Commission on breast cancer. Around 7.8 million women were diagnosed with breast cancer in the last five years until 2020 and about 685,000 women died from the disease the same year, it said.

Further, in 2020, women around the world on average had a 1 in 12 risk of being diagnosed with breast cancer before turning 75 years old, and this incidence is rising, researchers found. They estimated that cases

increase from 2.3 million in 2020 to more than 3 million by 2040, with low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) being "disproportionately affected". By 2040, deaths due to the

disease will be a million a year, the team added. "This is neither acceptable nor inevitable as action now can pre-

vent many of these future cancers," the authors wrote. Knowledge gaps, such as unknown numbers of women with metastatic breast cancer in

other parts, continue to prevent effective action, they said. The scale of suffering associated with breast cancer, along

which the cancer spreads to



with other costs, are not wellmeasured, with the society and policymakers only seeing the tip of an iceberg," the authors of the commission said.

"Recent improvements in breast cancer survival represent a great success of modern medicine," said the commission's

It points to "glaring inequities" and suffering from symptoms, despair and financial burden due to breast cancer, which are often "hidden and inadequately addressed". ## **Shower of blessings**

For the first time in a decade, IMD predicts above-normal rainfall across the nation

he Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has marked a significant milestone by releasing its long-term forecast. For the first time in a decade, the IMD has predicted above-average rainfall across almost the entire expanse of the country. This forecast carries profound implications for various sectors, ranging from agriculture to water resource management and beyond. Policymakers and farmers will welcome this news, although ordinary individuals may find themselves contending with a more pronounced monsoon season than usual. It would indeed be a sigh of relief for all farmers. The agricultural sector, which forms the backbone of India's economy, is heavily reliant on timely and adequate rainfall. abilistic in nature; even a good monsoon across the country is a rare occurrence. While above-normal rainfall brings several benefits, it also presents certain challenges. Excessive precipitation can lead to flooding, particularly in low-lying areas and regions prone to inundation. Flooding not only causes damage to property and infrastructure but also poses risks to human life. Therefore, authorities must undertake pre-emptive measures such as strengthening infrastructure, improving drainage systems and implementing effective flood management strategies. Heavy rainfall increases the risk of soil erosion and landslides, particularly in hilly terrains. Adequate soil conservation measures and afforestation efforts are essential to mitigate these risks and safeguard vulnerable ecosystems. Also, authorities need to ensure efficient water management practices to prevent wastage and optimise the utilisation of water resources. The IMD's forecast heralds promising prospects for farmers to enhance productivity and for authorities to address water scarcity concerns. By adopting a comprehensive approach that combines preparedness, conservation and sustainable practices, India can harness the benefits of abundant rainfall while minimising associated risks, paving the way for socio-economic development and environmental sustainability.

# Ignoring neighbours to embrace the world-



The BJP Government has put Neighbourhood First Policy on backburner, leaving it underperforming amid rising anti-India sentiments in the region

JP government has made foreign policy a key election issue: Prime Minister Modi has stated, 'Neighbour first and Act East second.' Foreign Minister S Jaishankar is campaigning how G20 has enhanced India's image and influence as a global player. Quest for High Table has shifted focus from Neighbourhood First Policy (NFP) . S Jaishankar explained that politics can go up and down in neighbourhood but people generally have good feelings for India. That is certainly not the ground reality today when in almost every country, anti-India feeling is prevalent. NFP which was formally launched in 2008, has not performed optimally due to internal and external factors. Act East appended later has also failed to take off . Followed several add-ons: *sab ka saath sab ka* vikas; SAGAR; Vishva Mitra; First Security Responder and so

Former Minister Jaswant Singh in

his book Defending India, has noted that India is strategically confined by Macmahon Line, Durand Line, LAC and LoC. Still it was once the regional hegemon having promulgated the Indira Doctrine and employed military force in national interest. India's geography and asymmetry with neighbours are both sset and liability. Congenital problems with Pakistan and later China have made it the least connected South Asian region. NFP was designed to shape the neighbourhood, especially the periphery, extending the neighbourhood to Mauritius and Iran in the West and Myanmar in the East. Curating friendly regimes, winning the goodwill of people through economic linkages and connectivity, creating strategic assets, minimising liabilities and most of all, being sensitive to genuine concerns of neighbours were some objectives of NFP. Rubbing neighbours the wrong way was nor meshing domestic politics with diplomacy. That an aspirational India would create glitches for NFP was not envisioned. China, gate- crashed after hiding its strength and biding its time arriving with deep pockets, BRI, MSR and Wolf Warrior

With ups and downs in politics regional rivalries were in full flow. Nepalese scholars were first to note change. The founding father, King Prithvi Narayan Shah had observed that Nepal is a yam between two boulders: China and India. They corrected that gospel to three boulders, adding US. Till late last year, Maldives followed India First policy, the only country to publicly proclaim the choice.

That has changed to India Out with President Muizzu demanding the 88 Indian soldiers leave before elections next month. He even hinted that Delhi tried bullying Male. The two of us leaders who complained They pointed out that I was

spent innumerable hours studying the machine. I became an apprentice to a more knowledgeable person, even though he was lower in the hierarchy. Then and even later in my subsequent postings, or even after I quit an active professional life, I learnt a lot about handling workrelated issues and even man management, from my junior colleagues, by not dwelling on the so-called finer nuances of a superior status.

I also learnt empathy for others. In yet another posting, as a branch head, I was

always respectful even though I was from the same region. This was another lesson learnt, never to be forgotten, about the futility of status discrimination. We were visiting relatives a

few days back. My wife's uncle, now nearing 80, narrated a recent experience. He had gone to some office for work, where a much younger person jumped the queue. The uncle objected which was rudely brushed aside by the young man, "How is it material? Have I pointed a gun at you?" This was a status discrimination of another kind - a perceived superiority of the youth against old age. Or was it the gun power? We ought to remember what Nelson Mandela said, "No one is born hating another person because of the colour of his skin, or his background, or his religion. People must learn to hate and if they can learn to hate, they can be taught to love, for love comes more naturally to the human heart than its opposite."



# Iran strikes threaten regional stability

t a time when people in several countries in South Asia and East Asia were celebrating the traditional new year, Iran, the second-largest country in West Asia, launched a series of missile attacks targeting its arch-enemy Israel. Jordan and Saudi Arabia supported Israel and intercepted most of the missiles fired by Iran. The attack appears to be symbolic, aimed at boosting the morale of organisations such as Hamas in Palestine, Yemen's Houthis, pro-Iranian militias in Iraq and Hezbollah in Lebanon, all of which have declared war against Israel in West Asia, as well as countries like Lebanon and Syria, rather than engaging in an official war against Israel. This attack serves as a morale booster. Shortly after the attack, Hamas rejected the Cairo agreement, a result of discussions between top intelligence agencies, the CIA and Mossad, together with other stakeholders mediated by Egypt, concerning Israeli

However, many encouraged Israel to respond quickly. However, United States President Biden stated that he would not yield if attacks were made against Iran. It is seen as a matter of prior agreement by both parties rather than a threat. The truth is, that the US administration cannot afford to assist Israel in another war at this point. At a time when the country's reputation has been tarnished at the international level and when Biden's political power is extremely weak if the United States makes such an unwise decision, it will have to face unprecedented consequences shortly, similar to how the United States has caused irreversible damage to world peace and order. Elon Musk's recent statement that the possibility of the United States becoming the victim of a September 11-style surprise attack is very high seems to hold deep truth. The consequences of these conflicts may not only affect Washington or New York but also American military bases around the world. The likelihood of an attack similar to the one on Pearl Harbor is high. The United States cannot always continue to create military conflicts in other countries for its war trade and keep its superpower status as it desires. The superpower, as history has proven, will inevitably crumble at any

Compared to its lifespan, the United States is a relatively young superpower in the grand scheme of civilisation, considering

the collapse of great empires.
Throughout history, mighty empires have risen and fallen, leaving lasting legacies. The Roman Empire, spanning from 27 BC to AD 476, peaked in the 2nd century AD, but internal strife, economic instability and external invasions, such as by the Visigoths and Vandals, led to its fragmentation. The Ottoman Empire, dominant in the 16th and 17th centuries across the Eastern Mediterranean, North Africa and Western Asia, declined due to internal conflicts and challenges from European powers like Russia and Austria. The Mongol Empire, founded by Genghis Khan in the 13th century, stretched from Eastern Europe to the Pacific Ocean, but internal divisions and the death of ey leaders led to its fragmentation by the late 14th century. Lastly, the British Empire, spanning from the 16th to the 20th century, faced economic strain and nationalist movements, ultimately dissolving due to internal weakness and external pressures. These collapses, driven by political, military and socioeconomic factors, reshaped the world, underscoring the transient nature of power and the enduring impact of history on modern geopolitics and

However, the deep state of the United States has certainly studied and comprehended global history better than many other countries. That is why the basic strategy of the United States has been to create new wars while talking about peace and turn those wars into long-term tragedies to keep uncertainties. This strategy can weaken its rivals and maintain its power continuously. These issues become clear when many conflicts are understood in their political and economic context. The ideology that Israel has continuously pursued against Iran in tance of prudent governance and national and international forums is not a single opinion or rivalry of Israel, but it is a long-term propagation through carefully selected facts and objectives together with the United States. On one hand, the West fuels wars against hostile countries. On the other, it manufactures internal crises in those nations by imposing international sanctions. This remains a persistent behaviour

of the West. The thing that should not be forgotten here is that the attack by Iran was a retaliation. It is a response to the Israeli provocation on the Iranian consulate in Syria, a gross violation of the Vienna Convention, which claimed the lives of the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps. Iran's calculation, as some analysts pointed out, was that if it did not respond, Israel would seek to push back and degrade the axis of resistance across the region. However, it is unreasonable to think that Israel miscalculated its attack on the Iranian diplomatic site in Syria as Israel continues to keep deep intelligence penetration of IRGC and Hezbollah networks in Syria, making those networks highly vulnerable to Israeli attacks. Iran must uphold its reputation among its allies and address internal political crises effectively. Therefore, prioritising attacks conducted through proxies is advisable, while occasional skirmishes from both sides should be acknowledged.

Moreover, it is very important to consider the government's domestic policies and openly mention Iran's inherent weaknesses amid escalating tensions among some politicians and officials in Iran. They highlighted the many crises facing the Iranian government and warned against engaging in direct conflict with Israel without first addressing these pressing issues, which they argued would only worsen the situation. They emphasised the imporeffective crisis management and the need to mitigate ongoing crises to prevent system collapse.

Economic challenges and psychological instability in society are urgent issues that need to be addressed as they are now breeding grounds for enemy penetrations. They advocated the adoption of conciliatory policies to reduce tensions and promote harmony and empathy in Iranian society. The regime's repressive domestic policies, particularly regarding the mandatory hijab enforcement cam-paign, have fuelled widespread discontent and delegitimised the government. Recent anti-Israel actions, like seizing a cargo ship, have caused Iran's markets to react negatively. The national currency's value has hit a record low. President Ibrahim Raisi faces criticism and calls for a cabinet reshuffle to address economic hardships affect ing many Iranians.

Over the years, Israel has demonstrated its capability in targeting Iranian nuclear scientists and infrastructure. Notably, the Stuxnet cyber-attack, jointly orchestrated by the United States and Israel, delivered a significant blow to Iran's nuclear ambitions. This proves that national interests are never compromised for domestic political issues, except for former President Trump. Stuxnet marked a pivotal moment, ushering in the era of cyberwarfare, where lines of code wielded the power to reshape geopolitical landscapes. Its impact reverberated globally, highlighting the evolving nature of warfare and the formidable role of technology in modern conflicts. In this situation, Iran cannot continue to be silent. It must prove its power numerically. Therefore, the recent attack was more a reputational-preservation move than a declaration of war.

Forex traders said a weak appetite for riskier assets and recent foreign capital outflows also dragged down the local unit. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.51 and finally settled at

83.57 (provisional), registering a loss of 14 paise from its previous close. On Monday, the rupee declined 6 paise to settle at 83.44 against the US dollar. According to Anuj Choudhary Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, the 10year US bond yields rose to 4.66 per cent, the highest since November 2023. Weak domestic markets and simmering geopolitical tensions too weighed on the rupee.

## **IMF** raises India's growth projection to 6.8 per cent

"Growth in India is projected to remain strong at 6.8 per cent in 2024 and 6.5 per cent in 2025, with the robustness reflecting continuing strength in domestic demand and a rising working-age population," said the latest edition of the World Economic Outlook released by the IMF ahead of

In the past three days, the BSE benchmark tanked 2,094.47 points or 2.79 per cent.

"Markets extended their losing streak for a third straight session on the back of weak global cues as a sharp rise in JS bond yields due to rising Middle East tensions has made equity markets less attractive and prompted investors to resort to profit-taking.

"Investors are fearing that the ongoing conflict could fuel buoyancy in crude oil prices and in turn weigh on inflation," Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research) at Mehta Equities Ltd, said.

From the Sensex basket, Infosys, IndusInd Bank, Bajaj Finserv, Wipro, HCL Technologies, Tech Mahindra, Finance, Tata Consultancy Services and Larsen & Toubro were the major laggards.





he 'Boss Lady', who has been an inspiration to not only people of her times but of the current generations too, is the one who ruled the 90s era with her hits at an early age itself. Right from her debut with Daddy and further going ahead with Dil Hai Ke Manta Nahin, Sadak, Prem Deewane, Kranti Kshetra, and so on, she has proved every now and then who Pooja Bhatt is, apart from being the daughter of the renowned director Mahesh Bhatt!

Apart from her finesse in acting, she has also donned the roles of producer and director. But of course, things didn't come to her plate as easily as they may seem. Recently, in one of our interviews with the star, she revealed her father was clear about not lying about whether she was good or not with her work and not giving the world the privilege of telling her that she can't act. Now, as we go ahead and bring to you

some personal insights, during our exclusive chat, she recalled the time when she had put on the producer's cap: "When I was making *Tamanna*, people had come up to me and were like it's not the work of a woman. Production is not for women. I made it." And guess what? *Tamanna* won Best Film on Other Social Issues at the 44th National Film Awards. But still, people didn't stop their bad talk there. "When I was making *Dushman* with Kajol, people pointed out, saying, 'Oh, you're taking a woman; now it's finished'. I was like, "I'm going to do what I want to do, and here I am doing it" When I became a producer I am doing it." When I became a producer, I was told why I wanted to become a producer. This is not for women; stick to acting and focus on your acting career.
People are going to say so, and I was like,
Do hell with you guys."

Going very much aboad, when she was

Going very much ahead, when she was back after a 21-year-long break with Bombay Begums, she recalled, "People were so generous. It was so overwhelming. The response I got for *Bombay Begums* was greater than that I got for my first 3–4 films to keep together. Even when I stopped, people were like, Why did you stopped, people were aller, stop acting? When this came my way, I felt like life was bringing something to me I just felt to take it upon myself to open the door to life, a dead life into my life! I did *Bombay Begums*, and I was privileged to play the part of a 49-year-old. The director would not want me to look younger, thinner, darker, or fairer. She just wanted me for what I was and who I was, and there can be no greater gift than a director can give an actor for who they are. You feel very comfortable in that person's gaze, and you want to give it your all. Being away from it for 21 years and understanding the nuances of filmmaking

and running a set has made me more respectful of the process. I can take instructions far better today and far more easily today.

The Dil Hai Ke Manta Nahin star was recently seen playing the character of Anita Verma in *Big Girls Don't Cry*, winning many accolades for the same. Sharing some personal relatable aspects Sharing some personal relatable aspects from the series, she strongly explains, "What I related to a lot was these young girls who are kind of like Anees character, for example, where she comes from this dysfunctional home, and supposedly the parents are trying to put on this facade. I mean, my parents were not like that, but I remember feeling relief when my parents decided to kind of sit me down and say that, you know, this relationship of ours is technically over but will never be over as technically over but will never be over as far as you are concerned. That, for me, was such an important conversation. I realised the relationships are not made on paper or broken on paper either. Your father might shift from your geography, but he never stops being your father. In the conversation that Anees has in her head, she says that guys don't do it for me. It was also where she became the parents of her parents. That comes to a point in children's lives when you got to come and be generous back with your parents too."

Well, as we head towards the end, how could we not ask her about her darling niece Raha? In fact, in one of the posts wishing Pooja a happy birthday, Mahesh Bhatt shared how he could see the resemblance of Pooja's attributes to those of his granddaughter.

"I'm glad you are the first one who has read it clearly," she gleefully enthuses adding, "He felt the wide eyes of looking into the world and the passion and that is something that you bond with."

Infact, as we went on ahead, she shares that she still looks at the world with wide eyes and still gets butterflies in my stomach when she gave her first shot. "I feel so excited when I have a show coming out. We had a countdown before 12 and I couldn't sleep after that. Nitva was like even after so many years you feel like this and I was like the day I stopped feeling like this that means I am dead. ## Shattering stereotypes to become **Telangana's first transgender PMEGP loan recipient**

Asha Ashadam, a transgender photographer from Telangana who has had her share of struggles to set up her photo studio and take up her passion for photography, gets candid with *The Pioneer*, sharing her journey and hardships in this exclusive chat.

sha, as we are all aware, refers to hope. Well, that's what kept Asha Ashadam, a transgender person from Telangana, keep up the zeal to set up a photo studio here. In the heart of adversity, Asha's journey is one of her extra-ordinary strength, determination, and victory of the human spirit. Asha faced societal judgment and personal tribulations. However, her firm desire to thrive led her to a transformative encounter with the transgender

community, a pivotal moment that became the catalyst for her journey.

Asha holds a PG Diploma in Hotel Management from the city and lives in Karimnagar. She has always had a zeal to do something around photography, and it was in 2017 that she became a photographer.

Speaking to *The Pioneer* about her jour-

ney, Asha shared, "I have a huge passion for photography. I love to take photos for my community, especially when there are events such as birthdays, weddings, and baby photo shoots. These photographs capture everyone in our community. The community members appreciated my talent and motiraphy on my own, I am still not aware of how to design or edit

photos and make them creative and memorable. Since then, my desire to learn Photoshop and editing has led me to enroll in computer

training institute. This decision has turned a new leaf in her life. When she enrolled in a computer training institute to learn Photoshop and editing. As encountered various challenges due to her gender. She said that, being transgender, her classmates looked down on her and made fun of her. Not only her classmates, but society negative-ly treats her due to her gender issues. At one point, she even asked her professor,

Shanti, to teach her

separately. However, her professor didn't approve her request but instead asked her to focus on classes

On witnessing her burning passion, Shanti encouraged her to pursue Photoshop and editing courses. Asha blindly followed her professor's words; she completed her course in photo and video editing. She also overcame several societal judgments and personal tribulations.

During her journey as a professional photographer, the Karimnagar collector advised her to approach We Hub and apply for a PMEGP loan. This small piece of advice changed her entire life.

We Hub was the place where Asha could showcase her talent to the world. She became the first transgender person in Telangana to acquire a Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) loan. This is where the WE Hub came into play.

Asha said, "WE Hub is like God sent it to me. I am very grateful to the officials, as they have supported and guided me from the start of setting up a studio. With their aid, I have finally set up my own photography and design studio. Since then, a lot of opportunities have come where I can showcase my talents. People began appreciating my work. Currently, two more members are working

However, Asha still faces societal judgment. She said, "Upon knowing my gender, some firms or clients don't approve of giving opportunities to me, while others give me opportunities." tunities upon seeing my work. So, no mat-ter how many hurdles life throws at me, my talents speak volumes about me. I have confidence in my talents and myself. I only request that people around me change their perspective on transgender people. Itss realy pathetic to witness such people having narrow mindsets in the fast-moving world."

Hemophilia is a rare bleeding disorder manifested by the inability of the blood to clot. The disease occurs due to alterations in save the occurs due to alterations in genes that regulate our body to stop bleeding. As we celebrate World Haemophilia today, *The Pioneer* brings to you a detailed write-up on Haemophilia. Haemophila A and B are the most common. It is caused by alterations or mutations in the F8 or F9 genes, respectively, on X chromosomes. The genes associated with hemophilia A and B, F8 and F9, respectively, provide instructions for producing clotting factors VIII and IX. Mutations in these genes result in reduced or non-functional clotting factors, leading to bleeding disorders. The severity of hemophilia in affected individuals can vary depending on the specific mutation and the level of clotting factor present in their blood. Haemophilia C, caused by a deficiency in factor XI located on an autosome, however, is rare. Haemophilia A/B is an X-linked recessive genetic disorder. This means that the affected gene responsible for hemophilia is located on the X chromosome. Since males have one X and one Y chromosome (XY) and females have two X chromosomes (XX), haemophilia primarily affects males. Females can be carriers of the hemophilia gene if they inherit one normal X chromosome and one with a mutation, but they usually do not show symptoms themselves.
Dr. Dipanjana Datta, a BGCI Level II certified genetic counsellor at Renew Healthcare, shares that though hemophilia A and B have treatment in the form of factor and gene therapy, males affected by hemophilia suffer from various co-morbidities, including joint pain, bone-related issues, swelling, and internal bleeds, apart from related issues, swelling, and internal bleeds, apart from excessive bleeding even in minor injuries. Undiagnosed, in the case of mild hemophilia, surgery or an accident can cause death! Thus, the diagnosis of the disease is of utmost importance. "Affected individuals are diagnosed through biochemical testing of the factors. Genetic testing can confirm the diagnosis of hhemophilia and help in understanding the specific type and severity of the condition. A carrier female will have normal factor levels in most cases. Thus, female family members may choose to undergo carrier testing by genetic studies to determine if they carry a mutation in the F8 or F9 gene, which could

be passed on to their children. Biochemical testing is not

a suitable method, as biochemistry might be normal."

**HEMOPHILIA AND PREGNANCY** 

Up to 50% of neonatal males with severe hemophilia have no previous family history. In these cases, there is a 90% chance that the mother is a carrier, with risk to the next male child.

A family tree should be constructed to assess the likelihood of hemophilia carriership in at-risk female families.

**RISKS IN PREGNANCY FOR MOTHER AND BABY:** 

The levels of clotting factors VIII and IX should be checked before an invasive procedure or in association with bleeding symptoms. Carriers of hemophilia are at increased risk of bleeding with invasive procedures, termination, spontaneous miscarriage, and at the time of delivery. Male neonates with hemophilia are at increased risk of bleeding, including intracranial hemorrhage (ICH), extracranial hemorrhage (ECH), and iatrogenic bleeding following delivery.

Dr. Kinjal Kothari, Associate Consultant Obstetrician Gynecologist, Manipal Hospital, shares, "The baseline factor level should be determined before the onset of pregnancy. Before pregnancy, the general health of women who are carriers of hemophilia should be optimised. Genetic counselling should be provided to women at risk. Carriers of severe hemophilia should be offered a preimplantation genetic diagnosis. Antenatal care should be delivered in the context of a multidisciplinary team setting with hematologists and obstetricians with expertise in this field. Maternal factor VIII/IX should be checked at booking, before any antenatal procedure, and in the third trimester. Drugs like tranexamic acid, desmo-pressin (DDAVP), and recombinant factor VIII/IX

can be considered given the altered clotting factor profile. A clear plan for the intrapartum care of a carrier and the baby should be available in advance of 37 weeks of gestation. The woman should be seen in the anesthetic clinic, and the neonatologists should be informed of the intended delivery of a baby with hemophilia. A decision regarding the timing and mode of delivery should be agreed upon jointly between the woman and the multidisciplinary team."

There needs to be a full assessment of the advantages and disadvantages of the mode of delivery and consideration of obstetric factors, maternal bleeding risk, patient preference, and reproduc-

tive expectations. "Measures should be taken to ensure expertise and necessary resources are avail-

External cephalic versions and the use of ventouse and mid-cavity forceps should be avoided for male babies at risk of hemophilia. Experienced clinicians should be involved in decisions about whether or not to perform a central neuraxial anesthetic technique, and the woman should be given all the information she needs to make an informed choice based on the level of clotting fac-

To minimise the risk of postpartum hemorrhage (PPH), it is important to recommend or offer active management of the third stage of

labour & management should be guided by the results of factor assays," shares Dr. Kinjal.

Genetic testing involves analysing a person's DNA to identify mutations in the F8 or F9 genes from blood or buccal swabs. In cases where there is a family history of hemophilia, invasive diag-nostic methods like chorionic villi sampling and amniocentesis, followed by specific targeted genetic testing around 11 weeks (about 3 months) of pregnancy, can help determine the status of the fetus. This can help families make informed decisions about the pregnancy and prepare for the care of a child with hhemophilia. Aternatively, pre-implantation genetic testing can be performed by taking a biopsy of the embryos formed by IVF at 5th day and screening for the targeted muta-tion. This process is called PGT (M), which can help to identify healthy embryos without the trauma of repeated abortions after prenatal diagnosis.

Genetic testing and genetic counselling can play a pivotal role in diagnosis and management. Understanding the genetic basis and inheritance patterns helps predict recurrence risk and plan a

healthy baby.



"It is obviously knockout time and every game is like a semifinal for us now. But we will have to think that we will come back stronger," Flower said on RCB Game Day.

RCB conceded the highestever IPL total - 287 for three as the Hyderabad batters went



on a merry ride against their directionless bowlers. Flower admitted that it was a

tough night for his side. "It was a really tough night in the field, of course, as they finished so powerfully that it probably took the wind out of our souls," he said.

However, Flower found shards of positives during RCB's chase such as Dinesh Karthik's superlative 83 off 35 balls and skipper Faf Du Plessis' 28-ball

The Zimbabwean wanted to build on them in the coming matches.

"I am really proud of the way we fought with the bat out there in the middle. We lost the game but I was really proud of the way we fought," said Flower.

The former England coach lauded Karthik for the way he took on SRH bowlers, and said it would not be surprising if the wicketkeeper batter made it to India's T20 World Cup squad. "Dinesh Karthik is really making a push for the World Cup team (of India) as well and is only getting better on the field," he added.

RCB will next face Kolkata Knight Riders at Eden Gardens on April 21.



## RCB-SRH game was one of sixes, not of batsmanship: Finch

Cunrisers Hyderabad and Royal Challengers Bengaluru unleashing a barrage of sixes in their IPL match left little room for batsmanship and what mattered was who hit the most number of sixes, said Australia's T20 World Cup-winning skip-

per Aaron Finch. Travis Head's maiden T20 ton and Heinrich Klaasen's pillaging 67 drove SRH to a recordbreaking 287 for three, which helped them go past their own 277/3 against Mumbai Indians at Hyderabad this March 27.

Dinesh Karthik then smashed a blazing 35-ball 83 but RCB ended up losing the match in which 38 sixes were hit all around the park.

"It was never going to be a game where you talk about batsmanship. It's a game where you talk about who hit the most sixes and that was the difference," Finch said on Star Sports.

They (RCB) had to start at 14 (runs per over). And if you have one bad over it goes to 16." Finch said the Hyderabad side used the Powerplay segment well.

"They (SRH) were getting lucky in the first powerplay and they needed those sixes and Travis Head was the difference there. "He started off well, his intent to get the ball rolling and then a courageous move to keep Klaasen at No. 3 and say we need to keep going, we have a deep batting line-up and we are going to put the bowlers to the sword here," added Finch.

Head's destructive hundred, crafted off 39 balls, was the fourth fastest in the tournament. the cornerstone of SRH's 25-run Finch said IPL teams had started changing their strategies by bringing in big-hitters like Klaasen up the order as they play fearless cricket.

"A lot of times teams think that Klaasen has so much power to the back end, let's hold him back. Like (RCB's) Glenn Maxwell at times, you don't want to expose him right now because if he gets out, then we've got to rebuild. Teams don't think like that any-

(SRH coach) Dan Vettori has talked about that, play aggressive, play fearlessly and bear the consequence if it doesn't go right. If it does go right, you don't

Dinesh Karthik once again underlined his value making a 35-ball 83 at a strike-rate of 237. Finch said the ability to strike the ball comes naturally to Karthik, given his more than two decades of experience in the game.

"Well, once you've got 20-25 years of experience behind you, and you've got that bulk of balls you've hit throughout your whole career since you were five years old, you don't lose that ability to bat.

Śo, I think, it works in their favour because they train specifically for that role which they play for their team. They don't over train, they aren't trying to improve on their skills or they aren't trying to improvise any-more, they just train specificallv," said Finch.

The Victorian cricketer added that players like Karthik are examples for others preparing to be specific about their roles.

"That should be a lesson for players around the world, that you have to be really specific with your preparation and how you go about it.
