YSRCP likely to release manifesto on February 18

As the 2024 election season looms, Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy of the ruling YSRCP has positioned himself as a frontrunner in candidate selection, aiming to secure victory under any circumstances. Amidst reports of some sitting MLAs and MPs being sidelined, causing internal strife within the party, CM Jagan has initiated the Siddham' programme to address concerns among party leaders and activists statewide.

The electoral campaign is set to kick off on February 16 with the YSR 'Cheyutha' programme, followed by the 'Siddham' final meeting in Anantapur on February 18, where the manifesto will be unveiled. Subsequent events include the release of input subsidies to farmers in Annamayya district on February 21, the launch of YSR e-BC Nestam third phase in Kurnool on February 24, and the release of Vidya Deevena fourth quarter in Guntur on February 27. The second phase of Vasithi Deevana is scheduled for release in Sathya Sai district on March 5, with the final Cabinet meeting slated for March 6.

Tragedy struck in two separate incidents as five teenage boys lost their lives in drowning accidents in the Eluru and ASR districts on According to police reports, a

group of students had gone on a picnic to the Sitapalli stream at I.Polavaram village in the Rampachodavaram mandal of ASR district. Three of them ventured into the stream for a bath and drowned. The victims were identified as Kakara Veera Venkata Arjun (16), Andiboina Devi Charn (16), and Laveti Raman (16). Their bodies were recovered from the stream, and subsequent procedures were conducted at the area hospital in

SPLIT VERDICT IN PAK

Parties intensify efforts to form coalition govt

The three main political parties in Pakistan on Sunday intensified their efforts for the formation of a coalition government after it became clear that the coup-prone country faced a hung Parliament after general elections.

The general elections were held on Thursday, but the unusual delay in the announcement of results vitiated the atmosphere as several parties cried foul and some resorted to protests.

Former prime minister and the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz supremo Nawaz Sharif received the backing of the powerful Pakistan Army chief General Asim Munir on Saturday for his call for a unity government to pull Pakistan

out of its current difficulties. The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has announced the

results of 264 out of 265 contested seats in the 266-member National

The result of one constituency was withheld by the ECP due to complaints of fraud and it would be announced after redressing the grievances of the aggrieved. Election to one seat was postponed after the death of a candi-

Independent candidates, a vast majority of them backed by jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), won 101 seats in the National Assembly.

They were followed by threetime former Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) with 75 seats, which technically is the single largest party in Parliament.

Malkapuram HPCL facility

Major copper theft rocks

CISF constable under investigation

A significant security breach at the Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) facility in Malkapuram has resulted in the theft of copper bundles valued at approximately Rs 4 crore, marking the largest such incident in the company's Investigations have been launched to recover the stolen materials.

The missing copper, critical for temperature monitoring in oil refining units, was discovered during a routine CCTV review conducted by joint teams of CISF officials and HPCL personnel. Subsequent investigations revealed a collaboration between a CISF constable and a relative of a local company owner, who allegedly orches-

The perpetrator, armed with a forged pass, gained unauthorized access to the HPCL premises. On January 28, they facilitated the removal of the copper bundles in a van, raising red flags for security personnel. The discovery trig-



gered an immediate response from law enforcement agencies. A formal complaint filed with the Malkapuram Crime Police on the night of the incident initiated a comprehensive investigation. Multiple individuals suspected of involvement are currently under interrogation. However, jurisdiction has emerged. While some advocate for the police to handle the matter due to the fraudulent nature of the theft, others argue for the Crime Branch's involvement given the severity of the

Both CISF and HPCL officials have emphasised the urgency of a thorough investigation to ensure the swift apprehension of the perpetrators and prevent similar security breaches in the future. They are working closely with law enforcement agencies to strengthen security measures law-and-order police are leading the investigation, meticulously examining all available evidence to unravel the intricacies of the crime. The community awaits further developments as the pursuit of justice



69.3 million cats and dogs homeless in India: Study

About 69 per cent (69.3 million) of cats and dogs in India are homeless as per the largest ever international study on pet homelessness - 'State of Pet Homelessness Project' released by a global coalition of animal welfare experts in partnership with Mars Petcare India on Wednesday. The project sets out to understand the scale of pet homelessness in 20 markets, and factors that contribute to pets being on the streets or in shelters, shining a light on the needs of a sizable hidden population of pets. The report reveals that one in three pets are homeless in the world, estimating almost 362 million pets are still waiting to find a home. The across 20 markets is pegged at 35 per cent of the total dog and cat population.

reveal a stark picture with 69 per cent of all cats and dogs without a home. Most homeless pets (60.5 mn) in India are living on the streets, while others (8.8 mn) are in shelters waiting to find a home. In India, 2,565 experts were interviewed from urban (1,402) areas and rural (1,163) areas for the Project. The project also included interviews with pet professionals from nine metro and non-metro cities in the country. About 60.5 million (71 per cent) dogs live on the street or in shelters in India, accounting for approximately 39 per cent of the global homeless dog population. 8.8 million cats live on the street or in shelters, accounting for 4.25 per cent of the global homeless cat population. 537 samples collected in Guntur city

Addressing the pressing issue of alleged drinking water contamination in Guntur, the Guntur Municipal Corporation (GMC) has taken proactive steps by inaugurating a dedicated call centre reachable at 0863-2345103. This initiative is part of a comprehensive effort to ensure the delivery of safe drinking water to the residents. GMC Commissioner Keerthi Chekuri reassured the public, emphasising that stringent measures have been implemented to guarantee clean drinking water within the jurisdiction of the Guntur Municipal Corporation.

Following an unfortunate incident where one woman lost her life and 19 others fell ill due to suspected consumption of contaminated drinking water last Saturday in Guntur city, the GMC promptly mobilized resources to address public health concerns.

Commissioner Keerthi, accompanied by GMC officials, commenced a thorough inspection of various residential areas in Guntur city starting from 4 am on Sunday. Visits were conducted to locations such as Srinagar, Sarada Colony, Vasantarayapuram, IPD Colony, and Sangadigunta, among others. Collaborating with the Regional Lab and



The GMC remains vigilant as engineering and public health officials are instructed to remain on high alert for the next two days to address any emerging concerns promptly.

Engineering Officers of the Guntur Government Medical College, samples of drinking water were collected from households to assess chlorine levels. Initial findings indicated that the chlorine levels were within acceptable limits

within acceptable limits.

To ensure prompt response to water-related issues, a specialized call centre (0863-2345103) has been established at the GMC headquarters. Additionally, three Deputy Commissioners - Ch Srinivas, T Venkata Krishnaiah, and D Venkata Lakshmi - have been

designated as special officers to oversee areas suspected of water pollution, including Srinagar, Sarada Colony, and Sangadigunta.

A comprehensive inspection of the pipeline from Undavalli to Takkellapadu Head Water Works will be conducted by EE Konda Reddy, while responsibilities related to chlorination, filtration, and laboratory testing at Sanganjagarlamudi water works have been assigned to DEE Hanif. Drinking water supply management from the

head water works falls under the purview of EE Srinivas and AE Babar, who will oversee Sarada Kalani, Srinagar, and Sangadigunta areas, ensuring inspection and immediate repair of any pipeline leaks. In light of the situation,

In light of the situation, Commissioner Keerthi emphasized the importance of obtaining prior permission before taking leave. On Sunday morning, a specialized team comprising 53 amenity secretaries conducted chlorine sampling across various locations including BR Stadium, Sarada Colony, IPD Colony, Nalla Cheruvu, and other reservoirs. A total of 537 samples were collected and analyzed, confirming that chlorine levels were maintained at appropriate levels.

F u r t h e r m o r e , Commissioner Keerthi personally interacted with victims and their families undergoing treatment at the Sarada Colony Urban Health Centre, ensuring necessary support and guidance. Residents are advised to boil drinking water before consumption as an additional precautionary mea-

Developmental projects neglected in Anakapalli: CAG

Key infrastructure initiatives like irrigation schemes, road constructions abandoned

A recent report by the Comptroller Auditor General (CAG) for the fiscal year 2022-23 has exposed critical development projects in Anakapalli lying incomplete and neglected. Despite allocated funds and promises of progress, key infrastructure initiatives like irrigation schemes and road constructions have been abandoned due to mismanagement and lack of funds.

Despite an allocation of Rs 2.02 crore for surplus works for Palagedda reservoir in Madugula mandal, only 43 percent of the intended work has been completed since its sanctioning in 2019. Delayed progress has led to cost overruns, further exacerbating the issue. Emergency repairs for the Vaddadi groin in Butchayyapeta mandal, sanctioned at Rs 83.21 lakh during the TEDPA regime, have been left unfinished. While 80 per

cent of the work remains incomplete, only a fraction of the allocated funds has been utilised.

Sanctions for repairs in S. Rayavaram mandal have seen minimal progress, with only 15 percent completion for Penugollu Groins and 30 percent for Moolapalem Groin. Flooding and erosion have hindered construction efforts, leaving farmers grappling with irrigation issues. Despite a substantial allocation of Rs 4.48 crore for ELBP Agrahara Uplift Scheme in

Uplift Scheme in Butchayyapeta mandal in 2016, 88 percent of the works have been completed, leaving farmers in limbo.

Despite an estimated value of Rs 84 crore for road widening from Narsipatnam to Sileru, none of the packages, divided and assigned in 2019, have been completed as per schedule. Delays in completion and minimal progress signal a dire situation for drivers nav-

igating these roads. A sum of Rs. 208.06 crore was sanctioned for road development in the joint Visakha district as part of the AP Roads and Bridges Reconstruction Project (APR RP). However, only 5 percent of the sanctioned works have been completed in four years. Contractors have expressed reluctance due to concerns over payment from

the government. The CAG report highlights systemic failures in project management and financial oversight, raising concerns about the efficient use of public funds. Citizens are demanding accountability and swift action from the Chief Minister's administration to address the issues and prioritise the development needs of Anakapalli. On the third day of the Gunadala Feast, Information and Public Relations Commissioner T Vijaya Kumar Reddy visited the shrine and offered prayers.

'Fish Andhra' stalls face hiccups

The Andhra Pradesh government's 'Fish Andhra' initiative, aiming to invigorate the local fishing industry through dedicated stalls, is facing significant roadblocks in the Visakhapatnam district. Despite initial excitement, the programme has encountered numerous issues, leaving stakeholders disillusioned and progressing far below expec-

The Department of Fisheries envisioned a network of 150 stalls across the district, but only 20 currently operate. Selecting and securing suitable locations has proven problematic. Of the 400 applicants, only 150 were chosen, leaving many aspiring entrepreneurs in limbo despite promised financial incentives

and equipment discounts.

Identifying appropriate sites within Visakhapatnam has been arduous. The fish pier, a seemingly ideal option, presented ownership and zoning challenges. Attempts to secure space in commercial complexes also proved unsuccessful. Ultimately, only 23 stalls were established in rural areas, where they struggled with low footfall and concerns regarding odour and environmental impact from residents.

These roadblocks have resulted in Visakhapatnam's dismal ranking of 28th among districts participating in Fish Andhra, falling far short of the government's aspirations. Despite extensive publicity and financial support, the Visakhapatnam case exemplifies the complexities of revitalising local economies.



Landslide early warning system likely to set up in Odisha

he Odisha government is planning to set up a user-friendly landslide early warning system (EWS) in Gajapati district as a proactive measure, officials said on Sunday. A team of seven experts from Coimbatore-based Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham's World Centre of Excellence on Landslide recently visited landslide-prone Gajapati district to conduct a comprehensive study on the causes of landslides and potential mitigation measures, including setting up a user-friendly

landslide EWS. During their two-day field visit, the expert team surveyed the most vulnerable areas for landslides, including Baraghara and Madha in Rayagada block of the district. The district administration has identified 139 sites highly susceptible to landslides across six blocks in the southern Odisha district. The experts conducted assessments on various factors such as topography, landscape pattern, soil textures, vegetation, slope percentage, rainfall trends. rock types, agriculture patterns, and the location of water bodies



17-year-old stabbed in Delhi, 5 juveniles apprehended

ive juveniles have been apprehended in connection with the stabbing of a 17-year-old boy in Central Delhi's Patel Nagar area, an official said on Sunday. An FIR under sections 307 (attempt to murder) and 34 (common intention) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered. Further investigation into the matter is underway," said the officer.

Karnataka Budget session begins today

The Karnataka legislature's Budget Session, which will begin on Monday, is expected to be fraught, with the Centre's alleged discrimination against the state and the accusations of corruption and poor governance faced by the Siddaramaiah-led government likely to take centre-stage.

El Nino weakens, raises hopes of 'bountiful monsoon'

PNS NEW DELHI

After delivering a warm 2023, El Nino conditions are set to dissipate by June this year raising hopes of "bountiful monsoon" rains this season, meteorologists have predicted.

At least two global climate agencies announced last week that El Nino, the warming of the equatorial Pacific Ocean that impacts weather across the world, has started to weaken and there is a probability of La Nina conditions setting in by

Weather scientists in India, tracking the developments closely, have said that La Nina conditions setting in by June-August could mean monsoon rains would be better this year than the last year.

However, they also struck a word of caution citing the 'spring predictability barrier', considered a forecasting headache as weather models

delivers about 70 per cent of India's annual rainfall, critical for the agriculture sector that accounts for about 14 per cent of the GDP and employs more than half of its 1.4 billion pop-

The United States' National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAÂ) said last week that there is a 79 per cent chance that El Nino will transition to ENSO-neutral by

April-June and a 55 per cent chance of La Nina developing in June-August.

The European Union's Copernicus Ĉlimate Change Service (C3S) confirmed that El Nino has started weakening. La Nina is the cyclic counterpart to El Nino. 'Currently, we cannot say

anything with certainty. Some models indicate La Nina, while some predict ENSO-neutral conditions. However, all models suggest an end to El Nino," D Sivananda Pai, a senior scientist at the India Meteorological Department, said. NOAA, the American national forecaster, said there was a historical tendency for La Nina to follow strong El Nino

"The forecast team is in agreement with the latest model guidance, with some uncertainty around the timing of transitions to ENSO-neutral and, following that, La Nina,"

the US agency said.
"But even if El Nino transitions into ENSO-neutral conditions, the monsoon this year should be better than last year,"

the senior meteorologist said. India received "below-average" cumulative rainfall of ?820 mm compared to the longperiod average of 868.6 mm ?in the 2023 monsoon season, which was attributed to a

strengthening El Nino. Assuming El Nino continues through the first half of 2024, the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) earlier predicted that 2024 would be warmer than 2023, Pai said.

"If La Nina develops, 2024 would not be warmer than 2023," he said. Roxy Mathew Koll, a climate scientist at the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology, said latest forecasts indicate a quick transition to La Nina by June, which could result in an on-time and bountiful monsoon.

"Is laying thorns-nails in the path of farmers 'amritkaal' or 'anyaykaal'? This insensitive and anti-farmer attitude had cost the lives of 750 farmers. Working against farmers and not even allowing them to raise their voice what kind of government does this," Gandhi said in a post in Hindi.

"The promise made to the farmers was not fulfilled neither was the MSP law made nor was the income of farmers doubled if farmers do not come to the government of their own country, where else will they go," she added.

"Mr Prime Minister! Why such behaviour with the country's farmers? Why don't you fulfil the promises made to farmers," the Congress leader said.

According to an order issued by Deputy Commissioner of Police (northeast) Joy Tirkey, farmers were likely to sit at Delhi borders till their demands were met.

"Keeping in view the kind of behaviour and adamant approach farmers showed during protests in the past.

ast year, three Indian Wushu players i.e., Nyeman Wangsu, Onilu Tega and Mepung Lamgu, were given stapled visas to travel to Čhina, for the World University Games. All three were proud Indian Arunachalis, and the entire Indian squad pulled out of the ompetition in protest of the Chinese sleight. It was reminiscent of the 2016 incident when the Manager of the Indian Badminton team, Bamang Tago, was denied a visa to travel to China - he too was a Arunachali! Much earlier in 2011, a 45-team Indian Karate team travelling to China were issued standard visas, except five members who were given stapled visas, again all Arunachalis. Chinese are past masters in psychological warfare and no domain or opportunity is too irrelevant for them to resist partaking a 'ping'. It is culturally part and parcel of their patented three warfare approach where they relentlessly invoke psychological, legal, and public opinion warfare. The recurring bone of contention is the Indian State Arunachal Pradesh which expansionist China falsely claims as socalled 'South Tibet', and therefore shadow boxing on the same.

It's the same pressure tactic that it applies with Taiwan and forces its athletes to compete under an unfamiliar name called 'Chinese Taipei', in Olympics and other events. Taiwanese athletes also compete under an alien flag (1981 agreement with the International Olympics Committee led a newly designed white flag with a flower outline around a sun and the Olympic rings in the middle) with an unheard flag-raising song. The Chinese are constantly looking to score a symbolic and psychological 'hit'. Therefore, with such fixation with political posturing and insistences in everything that it does and imagines, it also leads to hallucinations or pereived indignities whenever it is on the receiving end, deliberately or inadvertently.

The latest issue of a 'non-starter' by the global football superstar, Lionel Messi, whilst in Hong Kong owing to an ostensible 'swollen and painful injury' got



doubly compounded by the football icon subsequently playing in Japan, within three days thereafter. The angst against Messi started early with fans booing the 'no-show' on field (which extended to even avoiding interacting with fans or receiving the trophy). The SUSPICIONS OF Chinese finally got a flavour of a dish that they so routinely serve, even if Messi who is an 'SPORTSWASHING' Argentine (which little or no sovereign stakes for or against China) is not known to make political points, unlike some **CREDENTIALS BY** other stars. This incident harks back to 2019 when the then Arsenal football club legend Mesut Ozil openly condemned China's treatment of the coun-

thin-skinned Chinese reacted furiously, and Arsenal club had humiliatingly buckled under pressure, offering meek clarification, "The content published is Özil's personal opin-ion. As a football club, Arsenal has always adhered to the principle of not involving itself in politics". The Chinese had flexed muscle and extracted their revenge. In fact, Messi now plays for Inter Miami owned by the English star David Beckham, who had his own 'moment' against rival Argentines when he kicked their captain Diego Simeone in the crucial FIFA World Cup match of 1998.

So, it is extremely unlikely that Messi would be making a political point this late in his career, and especially given the lucrative contracts he has with Chinese conglomerates. If anything, Messi has been in the news for milking his stardom by signing brand endorsements without bothering too much about the brand product or service itself. Incidentally, he had signed up with the now-in-news Byju's as their global ambassador, only to be put on hold when the company started going belly-up.

Nonetheless, the Chinese are feeling insulted and aggrieved, troversies. With a permanent Messi's likely innocence and apology notwithstanding. But it is a providential taste of China's own medicine.



A JOURNEY THROUGH **LOSS AND HEALING**

The Buddhist approach offers a grounded and rational way to cope with grief

The doctor was an early riser. Upon waking he hit the gym. He remained fit and in proper shape by maintaining this regimen. The medico was a noted pediatrician, his wife an eminent cardiologist. Unfortunately, their only daughter suffered from a compromised heart condition. The trio had attended a party the previous evening. It was time to drop the daughter to school and the father knocked at the door. But the cherubic girl did not respond. Life was snuffed out; tragedy had struck the family and a pall of gloom descended.

A few weeks back an old aunt had kicked the bucket. It was a double whammy for the family, and they were inconsolable. Several centuries ago, in the time of the Buddha, a woman lost her only child to the cruel hands of fate. In an anguished state she implored the Enlightened One to resuscitate the dead child. Buddha, the compassionate, agreed to perform the miracle. He asked the lady to collect mustard seeds from all the houses of the village which had never seen death or grief. The woman knocked at the doors of all the houses in the village but returned empty handed. Handling grief is a challenging task and only skillful minds can undertake this responsibility.

The doctor couple who could not save their precious child were subsumed into a cesspool of anger, guilt, sadness, pangs of loneliness, numbness, and a yearning for their beloved one. To overcome their grief and desolation, the husband, a moderate drinker, became a quotidian one and his spouse began administering herself sedatives.

Several eminent psychologists like Parker, Arewill and Worden have zeroed in on the point that those suffering from grief, need to move on from the feeling of numbness, pining, depression, a feeling of shock and despair



to the process of recovery. It is important for the grieving to accept the reality of the loss, experience the pain of the departed one, adjust to the environment of living without the deceased person.

Medical science has made rapid advancements such that proper diagnosis, therapy, and counselling along with proper medication can trig ger the change agent in the wrecked mind. Alternatively, there are techniques like hypnosis and even providing ECT (in the worst-case scenario) to address the problem.

The Theravada Buddhist traditions have dealt with the subject of handling grief in a dynamic manner. The human mind by the process of strong internal resolution can overcome this vicissitude in life by mindfulness. The process is called Satipatthana.

The emotionally wrought can find solace and succour by becoming aware of the reality about the impermanence of events, happenings, and people. The mind should become strong to accept the reality and look ahead. There are breathing techniques like Vipassana and Sudarshan Kriya which have proven ability to transfigure the mind from a depressed state to a positive one. Both the techniques have been validated by medical science as alternative therapies and have the power to alter the thought process, bringing it to the present moment.

Several grieving souls adopt holistic measures like the breathing techniques mentioned, meditation, pranayama, yoga, chanting of mantras, being in communion with nature or seva to overcome their grief and restore normalcy in their lives. It is the recalcitrant human mind which acts as a deterrent and needs to be tamed. "Grief is in two parts. The first is loss. The second is remaking of life," writes Anne Roiphe.



Tata Group firm Voltas is facing a major headwind in Qatar as around Rs 750 crore has been stuck due to delays in the realisation of overdue receivables and execution timelines, said its MD and CEO Pradeep Bakshi.

In some projects, bank guarantees were "unethically" encashed by some contractors, which was an "uncalled" action to make quick money, derailing the international project business of Tata Group firm in the December quarter, he added.

"Unprecedented things are happening in that area, especially in Qatar, wherein, unfortunately, our dues are not being paid to us timely, and inordinate delays are happening. We have completed the project and handed it over, and despite that, payments are not made,' Bakshi told PTI.

Voltas has already approached the Indian government for help on the issue and also approached

Govt examining FDI flow from China in Paytm firm

The government is examining foreign direct investment from China in Paytm Payments Services Ltd (PPSL), the payment aggregator subsidiary of One97 Communications Ltd, sources said.

In November 2020, PPSL had applied for licence with the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to operate as a payment aggregator under the guidelines on Regulation of Payment Aggregators and Payment Gateways. However, in November 2022, RBI rejected PPSL's application and asked the company to resubmit it, so as to comply with Press Note 3 under FDI rules.

One97 Communications Ltd (OCL) has investment from Chinese firm Ant Group Co.

Subsequently, the company filed the required application on December 14, 2022 with Government of India for past downward investment from OCL into the company in order to comply with Press



Note 3 prescribed under FDI guidelines.

An inter-ministerial committee is examining investments from China in PPSL and decision would be taken on the FDI issue after due consideration and comprehensive examination, sources said.

Under Press Note 3, the government had made its prior approval mandatory for foreign investments in any sector from application.
"This is part of the regular

process where everybody applying for a payment aggregator licence has to get FDI approval," the spokesperson said. The spokesperson said PPSL fol-lowed the relevant guidelines and submitted all relevant documents to the regulator within the stipulated time. During the pending process, PPSL was allowed to continue with its online payment aggregation business for existing partners without onboarding any new merchants.

"Since then the ownership structure has changed. The Paytm founder remains the largest stakeholder in the company. Ant Financial reduced its stake in OCL to less than 10 per cent in July 2023. Subsequently, it does not qualify for beneficial company ownership. OCL founding promoter now holds a 24.3 per

Direct tax collections up to 10th February, 2024 show that gross collections are at Rs 18.38 lakh crore, which is 17.30 per cent higher than the gross collections for the corresponding period of last year," Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) said in a statement.

Direct tax collection, net of refunds, till February 10 of FY24 stands at Rs 15.60 lakh crore, which is 20.25 per cent higher than the net collections in the corresponding period last year. This collection is 80.23 per cent of the total revised estimates of direct taxes for 2023-24.

LIC expects income tax refund of Rs 25,464 cr in Q4

The composition of the gas promised to be delivered has also changed. RasGas, which is now QatarEnergy, had originally signed to supply 'rich' or gas containing comthat contained methane ponents of ethane and

Investors flocked to large-cap oriented mutual funds with influx of Rs 1,287 crore in January, making it the highest fund infusion in 19 months, as a significant run-up in small and mid caps prompted them

to book profit. This is a huge turnaround following a net outflow of Rs 281 crore in December. Also, the quantum was 80 per cent higher than inflows of Rs 716

crore in January last year. The latest inflow helped push the asset base of large-cap equity category by 26 per cent to Rs 3 lakh crore at Januaryend from Rs 2.38 lakh crore a

year ago. According to latest data by Association of Mutual Funds in India (Amfi), equity mutual funds focused on large-cap received inflow to the tune of Rs 1,287 crore in January. This was the highest level since July 2022, when the category saw an inflow of Rs 2,052 crore.

Given the significant run-up in small and mid caps, investors are booking some profits and rebalancing into arge-caps, Kaustubh Belapurkar, Director Manager Research at Morningstar Investment Research India, said.

Akhil Chaturvedi, Chief Business Officer, Motilal Oswal AMC, said,"Large- caps demonstrated positive contributions in January, reversing the net outflows experienced in December 2023. This shift in trend is in line with valuation differentials among large v/s mid and small caps, suggesting that large caps or flexi caps oriented schemes may attract higher flows in the future".

From initially playing a cameo in *Jug Jugg Jeeyo* to a remarkable main cast in *Karmma Calling*, he enthuses, "I'm just extremely grateful for every opportunity I have got. I'm glad that it's been a slow process because it gave me time to learn and also be humble about every step that I climbed."

Basically, for the series, it was the opportunity that drew him to the project. For an outsider, he says, "We need people to believe in us, and I knew this was a really big show, and the audience will also be massive. The audience is what makes an artist, and I took this as an opportunity for the audience to accept me as an actor."

The biggest star of the show is Raveena Tandon.
As one of her co-stars, his biggest fanboy moment was when he saw her picture with the rest of the cast during the look test. And then, "When I stepped outside the room, there she was. I was in awe. Someone who I have admired all my life is now standing in front of me, and I will be sharing screen space with her. It still gives me jitters! Her aura is magical and powerful."

All the characters in this show are so layered and complex. But talking of his character, Ahaan, he says, he had individual readings with everyone to develop characters. So what was the brief for Ahaan Kothari? It was the poor billionaire boy who wanted to make something special of his own. She is a pretty humble and loving person, but she has grown up among the Kotharis. The MTV Roadies fame had to find a right balance that didn't take away Ahaan

from the fact that he also belongs to that world. Apart from the intensive workshops, Varun had his own method of getting into the skin of a character. "I try to look different physically for every character I get. For Ahaan, I hired a trainer for the first time ever. I was on this crazy fancy diet." All this was not to feel like Varun but to build on Ahaan. What you put out will come back to you in the most unexpected ways they eave about because. In fact

most unexpected ways, they say about *karma*. In fact, the makers too have rightfully personified *karma* and made it appear believable. But does Varun personally believe in it? "Oh yes, I do believe in the con-

cept of karma," shares the handsome hunk, adding, "I have always wished well for others. No matter what has happened to me in my life, I don't wish bad things on others at all. Maybe unknowingly, I have hurt some people, but I also believe karma has done it's job for that. I believe I'm a good human being, and I'm honestly grateful that karma works both ways, good

and bad. Basically, it's all the good karma I've done, which gave me a beautiful family and such amazing friends. All in all, a beautiful life, indeed!"

Well, guess what? Every day was so special for the rising star that he had his amazing moments on the sets, just by loving to spend time on the set. So much that he kept looking forward to being back on the sets and now misses it much.

With much discussion happening around the challenges for young actors to maintain the balance between their work and social media personalities, the MTV Splitsvilla fame gleefully shares, "I think it's a choice we have to make. Social media is in our control, and we get to choose what to make of it. For the last 2 years, I have been away from social media because I only want people to see my work and very less of me on my social media. I'm intentionally keeping my private life, my travels, and my family time to myself. Being yourself on social media is very important, and it's important to be honest, but everyone should find that healthy balance

between what to post and what not to."

Not to forget, though Varun has made sure to keep his private life private, the 'thirst trap' has been incessant. And he couldn't agree much, as he asserts with a laugh, "The thirst traps will be a constant, and so will be my private life. I was in the public eye ever since I was 19, and because of the things happening around me, it was hard to keep things private. And it was probably affecting me in some way. So in the last 2 years, I thought of working on myself, travelled, and had a lot of fun without

letting the world know about it. But only for myself."

From being that outsider making a mark in this industry to headlining a big-scale show, he feels it's all just getting started, and further comes a revelation: "I have two more releases in 2024." An ecstatic Varun further shares, "I'm just happy that I have people around me who believe in me and trust me with their vision. Watch out, Premier League. The competition's most lethal attacking combination is back in tandem.

Erling Haaland and Kevin De Bruyne - both recently back from long injury absences - linked up for the clinching goal in Manchester City's 2-0 win over Everton on Saturday in what will be a worrying sight for the defending

champions' rivals. Liverpool remained in first place after a 3-1 victory over Burnley but City is owinously placed on the leader's shoulder, two points behind with a game in hand, and with its superstar attackers back in

the groove. Make it 12 times that De Bruyne has set up Haaland for a goal since they started playing together at the beginning of last season following the striker's move to England. No other League Premier partnership has delivered

that many goals in this period. With him, I know I'm going to get it perfect. You

know the ball is going to come," Haaland said of De Bruyne, English soccer's king of the assists. "I watch a lot of football and I already saw for many

and I already saw for many years where he plays the ball, and he hasn't changed anything for the last five years. For me, it was about coming in and finishing those actions." And there was something

so familiar with the way De Bruyne collected the ball in center-field and deftly slid in Haaland, who bundled his marker off the ball and opened his body to steer home a finish in the 85th minute. National record holder in high jump Tejaswin Shankar won the top prize in the International High Jump Gala Elmos 2024 athletics meet in Heist-op-den-Berg, Belgium with a leap of 2.23 metres.

Shankar, competing for the first time since October last year, finished ahead of Greece's Antonios Merlos (2.20 metres) in the World Athletics Indoor Tour Challenger event on Saturday. The 25-year-old, who holds both the men's high jump and decathlon national records, however, could not better his personal best of 2.29m.

Shankar is also focusing on decathlon and had won bronze and silver in the discipline in the Asian Championships and Asian Games last year.
