PM Modi stressed the need to ensure regular fire and electrical safety audits in hospitals and other public places as he reviewed the heatwave situation in the country amid fire incidents which have claimed many flood situations in different lives. The Prime Minister

instructed officials that proper drills for preventing and handling incidents of fire must be undertaken on a regular basis, according to an official statement.

He also said that regular drills for the maintenance of fire lines in forests and productive utilisation of biomass must be planned. Modi was briefed that as per forecasts, the heatwave is likely to continue in parts of Rajasthan, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh.

Monsoon this year is likely to be normal and above normal in most parts of the country and below normal in parts of peninsular India, the statement said.

In the meeting to review the post-Cyclone Remal situation, another official statement said, Modi was briefed about its impact in the affected states, including the loss of lives and damage to houses and other properties due to landslides and floods in Mizoram, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya Tripura. National and Disaster Response Force (NDRF) teams have carried out evacuation, airlifting and road clearance operations, it said, adding the Union home ministry is in regular touch with State Governments.PM Modi said the Union Government will continue to extend full support to the States affected by the cyclone, according to the statement.

results of Assembly Aelections two in States northeastern announced on Sunday, both the BJP and the Sikkim Krantikari Morcha (SKM) hold retained their ove Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim, respectively. With 55 per cent vote share and 46 seats, the BJP won the 60 members Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly polls and is set to come back for a third consecutive term. In Sikkim, the ruling Sikkim Krantikari Morcha won 31 seats in the 32 members Sikkim Legislative Assembly polls, comfortably surpassing the majority mark over the Sikkim Democratic Front. SDF which ruled the State for 25 years in a row till 2019, bagged just one seat. Former India football captain and SDF candidate Bhaichung Bhutia lost the Barfung seat by a margin of 4,346 votes, his sixth defeats in the last 10 years since 2014, he had joined TMC to contest from Darjeeling. In Arunachal Pradesh, only 50 of the 60 Assembly seats went to polls, as 10 BJP MLAs, including outgoing Chief Minister Pema Khandu and Deputy CM Chowna Mein, secured victory unopposed.

Vajpayee in a letter to the Prime Minister's Office and the United Nations early on in 2018 wrote that a big disease that causes difficulty in breathing, dry cough, dizziness, vomiting, diarrhea and other such serious issues is just around the corner. After the results of exit polls about Lok Sabha elections in Odisha came to the fore, leaders of various political parties, especially the ruling BJD and the opposition BJP and Congress, have reacted differently. Though exit polls predicted

According to the Health Department, 17 more patients are currently under treatment in different hospitals. "The Puri Collector has already taken steps for payment of exgratia of Rs 4 lakh each to the next of kin of the deceased persons.

Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) Satyabrata Sahu is scheduled to visit Puri on June 5 and conduct an inquiry into the lapses which led to the fire mishap during the fireworks display near Narendra Tank when hundreds of devotees had gathered to witness

the Chandan Yatra of Lord Jagannath and His siblings. Most of the persons who sustained injuries belonged to Khandia Bandha Sahi, located at the extreme end of the Narendra Tank.

The Puri police have registered a suo motu case against

one Chandan Bhoi, who was illegally bursting firecrackers along with a few others. The explosion was triggered after one of the crackers landed on the pile of explosives. No permission was allegedly obtained to burst firecrackers

Three persons had initially died while 30 were injured in the explosion in a firecracker stockpile during the religious event on Wednesday. The toll mounted to six on Friday as three more injured succumbed to the burns while another three died on Saturday.

L he final phase of elections in the State on Saturday witnessed brisk polling with a 70.67-per cent voter turnout in six Lok Sabha constituencies and 42 Assembly segments under them, according to the latest data.

According to the Election Commission of India (ECI), 73.81% polling was reported in Mayurbhanj district, 73.06 %in Jagatsinghpur, 70.41% in Baleswar, 70.34% in Bhadrak, 68.64% in

Kendrapada and 67.91% in Jajpur.

Among the Assembly seats, Bangiriposi saw the highest voting of 77.52% and Aul the lowest at 62.38 %.

Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Odisha, Nikunja Bihari Dhal said voting percentage is expected to touch at least 75 per cent, considering the long queues of people in polling stations and the trend in previous phases

"The overall voter turnout in the four phases is also expected to increase to around 75 per cent after compilation of the final data which is our internal target for the 2024 general elections," he added.

In 2019 polls, the figure was around 73 per cent. Violence was reported dur-

ing polling at some booths in Salepur Assembly segment as BJD and BJP workers clashed with each other. At least two BJP workers, including a polling agent of BJP candidate Arindam Roy, were grievously injured after allegedly being attacked by BJD supporters at the booth in Mala Shasan panchayat.

June 3 is World Bicycle Day Let us make Bhubaneswar friendlier to cycling

communities hen across the country went into lockdown mode during the early phases of the Coronavirus pandemic, driving dropped by nearly half. The pandemic led to an unexpected mobility journey, when people began reclaiming streets in ways that have made urban India more cycle-able, walkable, and enjoyable. Preserving that will take work, but it's worth it.

It is callous to call a global pandemic an opportunity, but the crisis has altered our view of public spaces in ways no other event could. We still went outside to run, to ride bicycles, to walk with the dog, to see blue skies and green things and to stay sane.

To their credit, many cities moved quickly, closing off streets to cars and opening them by the dozens to non-vehicular use. Some cities did it faster or more aggressively than Indian cities, where the majority of streets converted them to bicycle lane, barring motor ve-

hicle traffic except for local access to encourage exercise and play. The result, there and in other cities, including Indian cities, was something spectacular- stress free walking and cycling on streets where cars are courteous guests rather than dangerous dictators. In some spots, entire blocks were converted into plazas for open air dining.

In Bhubaneswar, several streets too were closed, which wouldn't have happened without a catalyst.

If cities had tried to roll this out pre-pandemic, they would have met with opposition, but the situation changed the people's perspective overnight. Like cell phones, streets are a form of technology they could and should evolve with time. The choice is we can make Bhubaneswar friendlier and safer for walking and cycling, cleaner, greener, quieter, and more liveable. That we've wanted for years, even as we failed to make it happen. How do we do it differently this time?

It won't be easy as for over decades, our cities have made vehicular driving our preferred mode of transportation. Since 2018, the State's spending for cycling and pedestrian infrastructure has increased in Bhubaneswar. But State funding for roads is still on the higher side. The inescapable result is that the transportation systems we've built are hopelessly flawed and deeply discriminatory, and cars are still the easiest, most flexible choice for the most. Without them or with vast reductions in use how will people commute or run errands in bad weather, sometimes carrying large, heavy loads, with family members ranging from infants to the elderly, on trips ranging from half a km to ten km?

What does the Bhubaneswar of the future look like? It's easy to point to someplace like Utrecht in the Netherlands, with its plentiful pedestrian pathways and, at the city's main train station, gleaming new 12,500-spot bicycle garage (the world's largest). But Utrecht, along with Copenhagen, has been building for decades, while London has only begun. Perhaps the best example of a fast, successful, recent transition is Paris, which started just a couple of years ago. Under the Mayor of Paris, bicycle lanes were installed and car access and parking on roads slashed. In response, the Parisians have tripled their trips by bicycle on some roads. The lady Mayor calls the next phase the 15minute city, where residents can

get everything they need or want in that time frame by bicycle or on foot.

Of course, those solutions worked well for dense, compact Paris. But what about sprawling cities like Bhubaneswar? Many of them lack efficient public-transit systems. Still, approximately 60 percent of all vehicle trips in Bhubaneswar are less than 15-20km, according to research. That's a suitable distance for a bicycle, especially one that's e-powered.

For walking, cycling, and socalled micro mobility options like scooters to really function as everyday transportation choices for more than just hard-core commuters, there has to be a safe route from anywhere in a city to anywhere else, just like Paris is adding some kind of bicycle lane to every street ahead of the Olympics. While many of the Indian cities including Bhubaneswar don't have cycling or a pedestrian plan despite having street design guidelines,

explicitly noting for the first time in the city's history that it intends to give pedestrians, cyclists, and micro mobility users the same safe street conditions that motor vehicles enjoy.

When we build these kinds of cities, what will they be like? Quieter, calmer, and cleaner, for starters. As traffic dropped during the pandemic, air quality improved dramatically, with many cities like Bhubaneswar registering a fall in accidents and reduction in PM 2.5 pollutants. Such cities are also safer. Imagine everyday somewhere some cyclists and pedestrians faced traffic collisions while walking and bicycling. Friendly cities like Oslo and Helsinki recorded zero fatalities. Bhubaneswar needs to be one.

Cities friendlier to cyclists and pedestrians are vibrant cities, with ample green space that absorbs heat and boosts emotional wellness. They also have public art, which promotes wonder, boosts civic pride, and creates a sense of belonging for everyone, especially marginalized communities. Bhubaneswar does have such streets but they go unnoticed due to the automobile culture.

June 3, two days ahead of June 5, the World Environment Day, is the World Bicycle Day. Bicycle was never been so much dear to the rich or poor in recent times, it was like a miracle instrument in crisis like a pandemic when migrants returning home in absence of any other option or swanky people pedalling in absence of gym for fitness, or executive pedalling towards workspace or people pedalling for essential services.

Bhubaneswar is not the cycling paradise, it is sometimes made out to be, but it's getting there. And as other Indian cities look to make it easier for people to bicycle, for commuting or just for fun, Bhubaneswar offers lessons in re-thinking transportation infrastructure beyond the hegemony of the car.

The incident involved the Coromandel Express colliding with a stationary goods train, followed by the Yeshwantpur-Howrah Express hitting the derailed coaches on June 2, 2023.

"I cannot forget the day in which the triple train crash occurred. Within moments, the lives of several families changed as a lot of them lost their loved ones. We have witnessed the cries and horrific



scenes after the accident," said a local resident.

Deepak Ranjan, who played a crucial role in the rescue operation on the day of the incident, said, "I was thinking about the train mishap yesterday. We had swung into action during the golden hour. I want to meet the survivors and the 28 passengers whom I rescued are safe.

Ranjan said that they had

forgotten to eat for four days and guarded the tracks till they were cordoned. "We had extended help to the administration and the officials also allowed us to work in the critical situation," he added.

Cries for help rented the air as within minutes of the mishap, bodies were tumbled out of the bogies while many remained trapped. The injured ones who lost their limbs be-

seeched for help. It was at these horrific moments that the locals and volunteers without caring for their lives came forward to help the accident victims by rescuing them, providing them water and instant medical aid. There was a long queue of people in the district headquarters hospital of Baleswar to give blood till late night. The Good Samaritanism by the people of Baleswar was an example for the entire world. As many as 50 doctors, 200 ambulances, 50 buses and 24 mobile health units were deployed. From frying pan into fire B'pur slum dwellers' plight at Rajib Awas apartments

m A}$ recent relocation of slum dwellers to Rajib Awas Apartments, constructed by the BeMC (Brahmapur Municipal Corporation), has led to numerous hardships for the residents. Despite the intention of providing better living conditions, the move has resulted in severe problems for the relocated families, exacerbating their already challenging lives.

The city now boasts of 160 residential apartments under the Rajib Abas Yojana (RAY), equipped with facilities such as drinking water, electricity, and drainage systems. However, many of these amenities are reportedly dysfunctional, leaving the residents in dire straits. The BeMC has constructed about 57 RAY residential apartments across 12 locations in the city, comprising 2,132 residential units. One such complex, Aainabandha Sahi RAY Residence Apartment in Ward No. 10, has been particularly problematic, highlighting the

relocated families. The Aainabandha complex,

significant issues faced by the



consisting of 32 houses across 4 blocks, was built seven years ago. The apartments are now deteriorating, with cement plaster falling off and water seeping through walls during rain, causing significant structural damage. The drainage system is clogged, leading to stagnant, foul-smelling water accumulating around the premises. Additionally, a burst water tank in Block No. 1 has left its residents without a reliable water supply, further compounding their difficulties.

Residents report frequent power outages and inadequate drinking water. Broken pipes in the walls have weakened the structure, raising concerns about potential wall collapses and resulting injuries. Toilets near the apartment lack water and lighting, rendering them unusable and creating additional health hazards for the residents.

Resident Bhaskar Reddy expressed deep frustration and fear, stating, "We are in big trouble. Our women and daughters have to bathe in a nearby pond and use it as a toilet. It is totally unsafe. If anything happens to our women, the BeMC administration will be held responsible." He also highlighted the issue of some apartments being forcibly occupied by outsiders, who allegedly use the premises for illicit activities, further compromising the residents' safety and peace of

Another resident, Laxmi Devi, shared her concerns about the living conditions, "We moved here with hopes of a better life, but it seems like we have been abandoned. The walls are crumbling, and we fear they might collapse any day. The children are getting sick due to the unhygienic

mind.

conditions." Despite these pressing concerns, neither the BeMC nor the local representatives have taken any action to address the issues, leaving the residents to fend for themselves in the increasingly unsafe conditions. The lack of response from authorities has led to growing discontent among the residents, who feel ne-

glected and unheard of. Local activist Rajan Kumar called for immediate action. "The BeMC must take responsibility and address these issues urgently. The health and safety of these families are at risk. We demand immediate repairs and proper maintenance of these apartments," he said.

The situation at Rajib Awas Apartments underscores the challenges faced by slum dwellers even after relocation efforts. It highlights the need for not just providing housing but ensuring that these accommodations are safe, habitable, and equipped with essential services. As the residents continue to struggle, the call for accountability and action from the authorities grows louder.

Exit polls predict an easy win for NDA, though INDIA says it is confident of 295+ seats

If what the exit polls say holds true, the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) is going to form its third successive Government at the Centre. The seventh and final phase of polling has concluded and the nation eagerly awaits on June 4 a formal announcement of the results. The exit poll predictions notwithstanding, the Opposition Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) coalition remains optimistic of securing over 295 seats. This juxtaposition of predictions raises intriguing questions about the electorate's intentions as well as the efficacy of exit polls itself. These polls, often seen as a barometer of public sentiment, do give a sense of the electorate's mood though it may or may not be accurate. If the predictions ring true, we can confidently say that it reflects a continued endorsement of the NDA's policies and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership. We can conclude that the BJP's focus on economic development, national security and social welfare schemes seems to have struck a chord



with a substantial number of voters. Initiatives like the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) and various infrastructure projects have likely contributed to this favourable outlook. On the other hand, INDIA has been claiming, based on its own assessment, a clear majority for itself. Despite the exit polls, the INDIA alliance, comprising 28 major Opposition parties, remains confident of winning over 295 seats.

This coalition, which includes the Congress too, believes that their emphasis on inclusive growth, social justice and a more decentralised governance model has resonated with a significant segment of the population. INDIA's campaign has centred on addressing econom-

ic disparities, improving education and healthcare and promoting secular values. Their optimism suggests a belief that there is a substantial undercurrent of support not fully captured by the exit polls. As far as exit polls are concerned, it would be too early for the NDA to start celebrating and for INDIA to sulk. There have been instances when exit polls have been wide of the mark and actual results have been at total variance with the predictions. Experts say the sample size must be at least five per cent (which is rarely the case) and it should be spread across demographics. Besides, predicting the number of seats based on exit votes is always subjective. What is important right now is a smooth transition/retention of power by whichever alliance takes Delhi. As the nation waits for the final results, the exit polls and INDIA's confidence set the stage for a potentially transformative election. The voters' message appears to be multifaceted, reflecting a balance between a desire for stability and development on the one hand and a push for inclusive growth and accountable governance on the other. Ultimately, regardless of the outcome, the next Government will need to respect the mandate and address the aspirations of the populace without discrimination and bias. So, till the actual verdict comes, keep your fingers crossed!



Dawn of a new era in Indian politics

Beyond the immediate winners and losers, the aftermath promises to be marked by potential new alliances, power shifts and the rise of emerging political forces

he 2024 Lok Sabha elections are closing and the results will be on June 4. The aftermath of the election is not simply about winners and losers. It is about more than just the anticipated outcomes. It includes the potential for unfore-seen alliances, dramatic shifts in power dynamics and the emergence of new political forces, all of which are yet to be unveiled. The BJP's potential win in the election is a significant event that could reshape the political landscape. However, the outcome is uncertain, with two possible scenarios, each with implications. One scenario predicts a massive victory for the BJP, possibly even exceeding 400 seats. The other scenario suggests a more modest result for the BJP with fewer seats. A landslide victory for the BJP

could have far-reaching consequences. In a worst-case scenario, if the BJP wins fewer seats, the party could still secure support from other parties. If the party emerges as the single largest, albeit with fewer seats than in the 2019 poll, it has a plan B to form the Government with the help of

some neutral parties. The strategic decisions made by the Congress party, such as reducing the number of contested constituencies, highlight the depth and complexity of Indian politics. Each move is a calculated step towards a larger goal. As the sixth phase of the Lok Sabha polls concluded on Saturday, the Congress claimed the BJP's fate is "all but sealed," with the INDIA bloc having already crossed the halfway mark of 272 seats and is on course for a total of over 350 seats.

The INDIA Alliance, a significant player in Indian politics, was formed by 26 Opposition parties last year to fight Modi unitedly. However, if the BJP returns to power, the alliance may face a significant challenge. Some partners, such as the Trinamool Congress and the AAP, have decided to refrain from forming partnerships for the Lok Sabha polls, weakening the Congress's position. A BJP victory could lead to reevaluating the INDIA landscape, potentially leading



If the BJP wins more seats, smaller parties may rush to join the alliance. This rush may be fueled by their desire to align with the winning side, which could impact the postelection scenario. However, this rush to join the coalition may be more than just motivated by political interests. Some parties want to oppose Modi, while others see alliances as a failed attempt. Others, like the Trinamool Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in Punjab, have chosen to refrain from engaging in partnerships. They, along with the Congress and the Left Parties, would challenge the NDA.

This could result in the collapse of the newly formed India coalition, as this alliance has many fair-weather friends who may ally with any party based solely on their selfinterest. The BJP's ability to secure more seats or gain support from other parties will not be a surprise. This could impact the political to a realignment of political forces, including the INDIA Alliance.

The BJP has lost some crucial allies, such as SAD, Shiv Sena and JD(U). However, JD(U) and the TDP have now rejoined. In Tamil Nadu, the AÍADMK, a former NDA ally, may also rejoin the NDA depending on its performance in the polls. Even the ruling THE UDDHAV DMK is considering its THACKERAY options after the election. The party understands the importance of maintaining a solid working relationship with the NDA and PM Modi. FACTION OF THE SHIV SENA AND THE SHARAD These potential alliances and shifts in power dynamics could significantly impact the **PAWAR-LED** political landscape after the NCP WERE elections.

PREVIOUSLY The BJP could seek support from parties led by influential WITH THE leaders such as Naveen Patnaik, Jagan Mohan Reddy, **BJP AND IT** K Chandrashekhar Rao, WOULDN'T BE Mayawati and others. Though not aligned with any coalition, SURPRISING these leaders have significant political influence and have IF THEY helped the BJP in the past

The Uddhav Thackeray faction of the Shiv Sena and the Sharad Pawar-led NCP were previously with the BJP and it wouldn't be surprising if

they helped the NDA. Delhi Chief Minister Kejriwal is ambitious and eyeing the prime ministership. He will remain in opposition. Kejriwal predicted that

if Modi wins again on June 4, he will put Uddhav Thackeray, Sharad Pawar, Rahul Gandhi and Mallikarjun Kharge in jail. He would also be sent back to jail. However, it's important to note that these are potential scenarios and not confirmed outcomes. Various factors, including the election out-

come, can influence it. The June 4 election results will show how politics will shape the Indian alliance, splintering or strengthening it. They will also indicate whether the BJP will become more arrogant with a hat trick under its belt. A third consecutive BJP win could embolden the party, leading to a more assertive political landscape. (The writer is a popular columnist; views *are personal)*

Tobacco addiction grows steadily among the youth



With 24 per cent of children under 16 already using tobacco, the urgency for immediate intervention and education cannot be overstated

◄he escalating trend of addiction among the youth in India is a serious challenge to public health. Each year, tobacco consumption claims the lives of 1.2 million people in the country. The theme of World No Tobacco Day 2024, 'Protecting Children from Industry Tobacco Interference, underscores the urgent need to shield the younger generation from the harmful influence of the tobacco industry.

Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable deaths and diseases worldwide. It significantly contributes to heart disease, cardiovascular issues and brain strokes. The Global Adult Tobacco Survey 2016-17 revealed that approximately 29 per cent (270 million) of Indian adults use tobacco products, including cigarettes, gutkha, supari tobacco, jarda, bidi and hookah.

Alarmingly, about 24 per cent of children under 16 years old in India consume tobacco in some form, leading to devastating health outcomes. The National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5) indicates that about 38 per cent of Indian men are addicted to cer cases linked to cigarette are available to help individ-



tobacco. Notably, tobacco consumption is higher in rural areas (42.7 per cent) compared to urban regions (28.8 per cent). Among women, tobacco use stands at approximately 8.9 per cent, with rural women showing higher consumption rates than their urban counterparts. These statistics are a cause for significant concern. World No Tobacco Day, celebrated by the World Health Organization and global partners, aims to raise awareness about the detrimental effects of tobacco use and promote cessation. The 2024 theme focuses on protecting children, as the majority of regular smokers start before the age of 18. This highlights the necessity of safeguarding adolescents from the perils of tobacco

Smoking damages the alveoli in the lungs, leading to lung diseases, with most lung cansmoking. Tobacco increases the risk of cancers such as oral, throat, oesophagal, bladder, kidney and lung cancer. It also leads to chronic diseases like COPD, heart attacks and strokes. Smoking is

responsible for approximately 90 per cent of cancer deaths. The risk of death from heart disease and strokes rises significantly among tobacco users.

Smokers are prone to numerous diseases, with a general decline in overall health. Additionally, tobacco use reduces fertility in both men and women and can cause severe complications during pregnancy. Smoking and use of tobacco can lead to severe lung diseases, including COPD, Asthma, TB and Lung Cancer causing significant suffering. Smokers are significantly more likely to die from COPD and are at a higher risk of developing TB. People should avoid tobacco products and seek medical help if addicted. Various resources, including nicotine replacement therapy, pre-

scription medications, counselling services, support groups and smartphone apps,

uals quit tobacco. Among youth, smoking is often wrongly perceived as a sign of masculinity. Additionally, tobacco use is not universallv seen as a vice.

The Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA) 2003 aims to protect consumers, reduce tobacco use and prevent related diseases. It includes measures such as banning smoking in public places, regulating sales near educational institutions and issuing health warnings to inform the public. The Telangana Government in May 2024 has recently banned all tobacco products for one year, realising the grave consequences of tobacco usage.

The rising addiction among youth threatens their future health. Young people must resist industry influences that target youth and promote ecigarettes and flavoured nicotine pouches and candy which are also harmful and lay the foundation for tobacco use later on.

Hezbollah fighters shoot down Iran's ex-President registers for June 28 presidential election Israeli drone in Lebanon

AP BEIRUT

The militant Hezbollah group said it shot down an Israeli drone over southern Lebanon and fired rockets at an Israeli military base on Saturday, hours after Israeli drone strikes killed at least one person and wounded several others.

Hezbollah said in a statement that its fighters struck the Hermes 900 Kochav drone, saving such aircraft have been targeting militants and civilian homes. The exchange of fire along the Lebanon-Israel border has been intensifying over the past weeks with Israel's military push on Gaza's southern city of Rafah.

The Israeli military said a surface-to-air missile was fired toward a drone operating in Lebanese airspace, adding that it was hit and fell in Lebanese territory.

"The incident is under review," the military said.

The Hermes 900 Kochav is a medium altitude and long endurance drone that can carry four anti-tank guided missiles.

Hezbollah said on Saturday that its fighters also attacked an Israeli army base in the border town of Kirvat Shmona with Burkan rockets "scoring direct hits, igniting a fire and destroying part of it'

Burkan rockets can carry a warhead that weighs between 300 kilogrammes and 500 kilogrammes

The Israeli army confirmed a rocket hit a military base in Kiryat Shmona, without giving details

Israeli media reported the rocket attack on Kiryat Shmona, and released images showing significant damage to infrastructure. No casualties were reported.

UN development specialist arrives in Haiti to take up PM's post

Miami (AP): A UN develop-ment specialist tasked with restoring order to Haiti arrived on Saturday to the Caribbean nation to take up his new post as prime minis-

Russia's goal is to move voices from the "fringes of the political debate to the mainstream," said David Salvo, Managing Director of the Alliance for Securing Democracy at the German Marshall Fund in Washington, DC.The Kremlin does that partly by pushing Russian points of view under the guise of news and social media posts that look like they originate in the West. Salvo noted that disagreements in Congress that delayed an aid package to Ukraine followed a Russian social media cam-

Istanbul (AP): An apartment building collapsed in the Turkish city of Istanbul on Sunday, killing one person and injuring eight, authorities said. The collapse renewed fears about the resilience of fears about the resilience of buildings in a city prone to earthquakes.

TV images showed firefight-ers shifting rubble by hand from the flattened five-story building in Kucukcekmece, on the city's European side. Seven people were initially pulled from the debris, including two who were seriously injured, Istanbul Governor Davut Gul said while visiting the scene. His office later said one more injured person was rescued and a body was recovered. The governorship said the 36year-old structure collapsed at 8:40 am (0540 GMT). The cause was not immediately clear but there was no sign of an explosion or seismic activity. Only the top two floors were being used as resi-dences, with the rest of the

building being occupied by businesses. Images from a camera across the street showed passengers waiting to board a public minibus at the time of the

collapse narrowly escaped being struck by falling debris. More than 59,000 people were killed last year when a magnitude 7.8 earthquake struck parts of southern Turkiye and neighbouring Syria. The disaster highlighted the poor enforcement of building regulations in

Turkive. Istanbul, with an official population of 16 million, lies near the North Anatolian Fault. A 1999 earthquake centred to the south of the city killed at least 18,000 people. The municipality has said there are 200,000 buildings housing 3 million people that are in urgent need of improvement.

China's Chang'e-6 successfully lands on Moon's far side

Chinese spacecraft suc-Acessfully touched down on the far side of the Moon on Sunday, in the first endeavour of its kind to collect samples from this rarely explored terrain. The Chang'e-6 landed at the designated landing area at 6:23 am (Beijing Time) in the South Pole-Aitken (SPA) Basin for the first time in human history, the China National Space Administration (CNSA) announced.

Change-6 consists of an orbiter, a returner, a lander and an ascender

Since its launch on May 3 this year, it has gone through various stages such as Earth-Moon transfer, near-Moon braking, lunar orbiting and landing descent.

The lander-ascender combination separated from the orbiterreturner combination on May 30, the CNSA said.

For the powered descent, regarded as the most complex manoeuvre, an autonomous visual obstacle avoidance sys-

The choice was made for the Apollo Basin's potential value of scientific exploration, as well as the conditions of the landing area, including communication and telemetry conditions and the flatness of the terrain, Huang Hao, a space expert from the China Aerospace Science and Technology Corporation (CASC) said. The terrain on the far side of the Moon is more rugged than the near side, with fewer continuous flat areas Huang told Xinhua

However, the Apollo Basin is relatively flatter than other areas on the far side, which is conducive to landing. The lan-der is equipped with multiple sensors, including microwave, laser and optical imaging sensors which can measure distance and speed, and identify obstacles on the lunar surface, Huang said.

To prevent interference to optical sensors by lunar dust during landing, the lander is also equipped with gamma-ray sensors to accurately measure the height through particle rays, ensuring that the engine can be shut down on time and the lander can touch down smoothly on the lunar surface, he added. After the landing, the probe is scheduled to complete sampling within two days. It has adopted two methods of Moon sampling, which include using a drill to collect subsurface samples and grabbing samples on the surface with a robotic arm.

Due to the Moon's obstruction, the Earth-Moon communication window period on the far side of the Moon, even with the help of the Queqiao-2 relay satellite service, is still shorter than that on the near side. Therefore, the sampling time of Change-6 will be reduced to about 14 hours, compared with the 22 hours used by its predecessor Change-5, the report

The Change 5 brought samples The CNSA said earlier that the mission is poised to make breakthroughs in key technologies, such as automatic sample collection, take-off and ascent from the far side of the Moon. Meanwhile, the probe will carry out scientific exploration of the landing zone. The CNSA announced that scientific instruments from

France, Italy and the European Space Agency/Sweden will be on board the lander of the Chang'e-6 mission and a Pakistani payload on the orbiter. This is the first time China has included an orbiter from its all-weather ally Pakistan in its Moon mission. According to reports from Pakistan quoting the Institute of Space Technology (IST), the satellite ICUBE-Q has been designed and developed by IST in collaboration with Shanghai Jiao Tong University and Pakistan's national space agency Suparco.

The Chang'e lunar exploration probe is named after the Chinese mythical Moon god-

from the Moon's near side. Chinese said during the analysis of the samples it was found they contained water in tiny beads embedded in lunar dirt.

China also plans to have a lunar station on the Moon in future. A major space power, China in the past successfully launched unmanned missions to the Moon which included landing a rover. China has also sent a rover to Mars and built a space station which is currently in operation.

Earlier, China announced plans for a manned lunar landing by 2030.

The country's plans include landing astronauts on the Moon by 2030 and building a research base at its south pole - a region believed to contain water ice.

Sunday's landing comes as a growing number of countries, including the United States, eye the strategic and scientific ben-efits of expanded lunar exploration in an increasingly competitive field.

Attacks on infrastructure trigger energy shutdowns in Ukraine

Ukraine imposed emergency power shutdowns in most of the country on Sunday, a day after Russia unleashed large-scale attacks on energy infrastructure and claimed it made gains in the eastern Donetsk province. The shutdowns were in place in all but three regions of Ukraine following Saturday's drone and missile attack on energy targets that injured at least 19

beople. Ukraine's state-owned power grid operator Ukrenergo said the shut-downs affected both industrial and household consumers.

Sustained Russian attacks on Ukraine's power grid in recent weeks have forced the government to institute nationwide rolling blackouts. Without adequate air defences to counter assaults and allow for repairs, though, the shortages could still worsen as need spikes in late summer and the bitter-cold winter.

Among the most significant recent strikes were an April barrage that damaged Kyiv's largest thermal power plant and a massive attack on May 8 that targeted power generation and transmission facilities in several

regions. Following Saturday's barrage, Ukraine's air force said Sunday that air defences had shot down all $2\dot{5}$ drones launched overnight.

Russia claimed Sunday that it had taken control of the village of Umanske in the partially Russian-occupied Donetsk region.Russia's coordinated

Firefighters battle wind-driven wildfire east of San Francisco

San Francisco (AP): California firefighters aided by aircraft battled a wind-driven wildfire burning Saturday in an area Straddling the San Francisco Bay Area and central California, authorities said. The Corral Fire began burning Saturday near the city of Tracy, 60 miles (96 kilometers) east of San Francisco, and the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in the city of Livermore, according to the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, or Cal Fire.

Dark plumes of smoke travelled high into the sky over the fire area comprised mostly of grassy hills, where strong winds were expected to continue overnight.

Late Saturday, Cal Fire updated the size of the fire to 15.6 square miles (40.4 square kilometers) with 13% contained, which increased from an ear lier report of 13.7 square miles (35.4 square kilometers).

Interstate 580, which connects the San Francisco Bay Area to San Joaquin County in central California, was closed in both directions from Corral Hollow Road to Interstate 5 due to the lack of visibility from the smoke, the California Department of Transportation said in a statement.

Cal Fire Santa Clara Unit Chief Baraka Carter said two fire workers were injured, the San Francisco Chronicle reported The San Joaquin County Office of Emergency Services issued an evacuation order, pinpointing the wildfire in an area east of Interstate 580. Residents between Corral Hollow Road and Tracy Boulevard were ordered to leave their homes, with residents south of Tracy Boulevard told to be prepared for evacuation.

Overnight shooting in Ohio street kills 1, wounds 2 dozen

Akron (US) (AP): An early morning shooting on a street in Ohio killed one person and injured 24 others, some critically, police said. Police said shots were reported early Sunday just after midnight in the city of Akron, where mul-tiple victims struck by gunfire were reported. Local hospitals told emergency dispatchers soon afterward that people were arriving in their emer-

gency departments with gunshot wounds. Capt Michael Miller, an Akron police public information offi-

Two NASA astronauts, including Indian-origin Sunita Williams, were strapped in the company's Starliner capsule when the count-down automatically was halted at 3 minutes and 50 seconds by the computer system that controls the final minutes before liftoff.

With only a split second to take off, there was no time to work the latest problem and the launch was called off.

Technicians raced to the pad to help astronauts Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams out of the cap-sule atop the fully fueled Atlas V

rocket at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station. Within an hour of the launch abort, the hatch was reopened.

The team can't get to the computers to troubleshoot the problem until the rocket is drained of all its fuel, said Tory Bruno, CEO for the rocket maker, United Launch Alliance.

Bruno said one of the three redundant computers located near the rocket at the pad was sluggish. All three must work properly to pro-ceed with a launch, he said.

Depending on what needs to be fixed, the next launch attempt could be as early as Wednesday. If it doesn't blast off this coming week, then that would be it until mid-June in order to move the rocket off the pad and replace bat-



"This is the business that we're in," Boeing's Mark Nappi said. "Everything's got to work perfect-

It was the second launch attempt. The first try on May 6 was delayed for leak checks and rocket repairs. NASA wants a backup to SpaceX, which has been flying astronauts since 2020.

Boeing should have launched its first crew around the same time as SpaceX, but its first test flight with no one on board in 2019 was plagued by severe software issues and never made it to the space station.

RBI unlikely to cut interest rate on June 7, say experts

 $R^{\text{eserve Bank of India}}_{\text{(RBI) is unlikely to cut}}$ rate at its upcoming monetary policy review meeting, taking place soon after the announcement of the Lok Sabha election results, amid inflation challenges, said experts.

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) may also refrain from rate cut as economic growth is picking up, notwithstanding the elevated interest rate of 6.5 per cent (repo) prevailing since February 2023.

The meeting of the Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das headed MPC is scheduled for June 5 to 7. The decision will be announced on June 7 (Friday). Results of the Lok Sabha elections will be announced on June 4.

The central bank last hiked

the repo rate to 6.5 per cent in February 2023 and since then it has held the rate at same level in its previous six bimonthly policies. If the interest rate remains untouched again on June 7, it

would be the eighth time for the RBI to maintain the status quo on the benchmark repo rate.

On expectations from the June policy, Madan Sabnavis, Chief Economist, Bank of Baroda, said economic conditions have largely remained unchanged since the last policy. High-frequency indicators like PMI and GST collections do show that growth is on course. 

India receives highest FDI from Singapore in 2023-24 PTI NEW DELHI from

India received the highest Lforeign direct investment (FDI) from Singapore in 2023-24 even as overseas capital inflows into the country contracted by about 3.5 per cent due to global economic uncertainties, according to the latest government data. Though FDI from Singapore has dipped by 31.55 per cent to

USD 11.77 billion in 2023-24, India has attracted the maximum inflows from that country, the data showed.

During the last fiscal, FDI equity inflows decreased from major countries, including Mauritius, Singapore, the US, the UK, UAE, Cayman Islands, Germany, and Cyprus. investments However,

from increased the Netherlands and Japan. Since 2018-19, Singapore has been the largest source of such

investments for India. In 2017-18, India attracted the

FDI maximum Mauritius.

According to experts, after the India-Mauritius tax treaty amendment, Singapore has emerged as the preferred jurisdiction for investment in India.

Rumki Majumdar, Economist, Deloitte India, said that as one of the world's prominent financial hubs, Singapore attracts global investors who want to invest in Asia.

"Recently, India's initiatives such as amendments by the SEBI to the REIT Regulations 2014 have created new opportunities for Singaporebased investors, which is why India is likely seeing high FDI from Singapore," Majumdar said.

She also hoped that FDI into India would pick up in the latter half of 2024-25. Sanjiv Malhotra, Senior Advisor, Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas & Co, said that Singapore and Mauritius are



jurisdictions used by global investors to route their money into developing economies such as India.

"While there are many geoeconomic and political factors why Singapore has gained more prominence in the recent past, the primary reason for it topping the FDI charts for India is tax," Malhotra said, adding Singapore has a very competitive domestic tax regime and efficient regulatory set-up.

Historically, the double tax avoidance agreement between India and Singapore provided for many beneficial provisions exemption in India for investments made from Singapore and even though provision has been this amended, Singapore still is a credible place to create operations with substance to invest further in South-East Asia (including India), he added

Malhora added that in 2023-24, India witnessed a drop in FDI primarily due to the global uncertainty on account of the disturbances in the Middle-East and Europe. "Hopefully FDI inflows to

India may improve in 2024-25 (from 2023-24) but they may still remain below 2022-23 levels. A stable government post elections surely will help the cause of more FDI into India but I see the global headwinds to be too strong as of now," he said.

Anindya Ghosh, Partner, INDUŚLAW, too said that prior to 2016, Mauritius was a preferred jurisdiction for foreign investment in India due to the significant tax advantage it offered as a lowtax jurisdiction for routing investments. However, in 2016, India

amended its tax treaty with Mauritius to introduce a for capital gains, eliminating reinvested earnings and other

the tax advantage and reducing the attractiveness of Mauritius as an investment hub for India. After the India-Mauritius tax treaty amendment, Singapore has emerged as the preferred jurisdiction for foreign investment in India due to various factors, Ghosh said. She added that many multinational companies have their regional headquarters or holding companies based in Singapore, making it a convenient location for channelling investments into India. She added that global economic conditions, geopolitical tensions, and domestic policy developments may influence the overall FDI inflows in 2024-25. FDI equity inflows in India

declined 3.49 per cent to USD 44.42 billion in 2023-24 as against USD 46.03 billion in 2022-23.

The total FDI -- which source-based taxation regime includes equity inflows,

capital -- declined marginally by one per cent to USD 70.95 billion during 2023-24 from USD 71.35 billion in 2022-23. In 2021-22, the country received the highest ever FDI inflows of USD 84.83 billion. Sectorally, inflows contracted in services, computer software and hardware, trading, telecommunication automobile, pharma and chemicals. In contrast, construction

(infrastructure) activities, development and power sectors registered a healthy growth in inflows during the period under review. FDI from Mauritius dipped to

USD 7.97 billion in the last fiscal from USD 6.13 billion in 2022-23.

The US is the third largest investor in India in 2023-24 with USD 4.99 billion foreign investments, though it is down from USD 6 billion in 2022-23. It was followed by the Netherlands (USD 4.93

billion), Japan (USD 3.17 billion), the UAE (USD 2.9 billion), UK (USD 1.2 billion), Cyprus (USD 806 million), Germany (USD 505 million), and Cayman Islands (USD 342 million). As per the data, Mauritius



The scrappy German team I missed a slew of big chances against Real Madrid in the Champions League final before losing 2-0 at Wembley Stadium on Saturday.

"You have to use your chances in the final," midfielder Emre Can said. "Unfortunately we didn't."

The loss comes a year after Dortmund failed to clinch the Bundesliga title on the last day of the season, and 11 years after losing to Bayern Munich 2-1 the last time they reached the Champions League title game, also at Wembley.

Füllkrug faulted himself for not converting his opportunities and said he feels particularly bad for Marco Reus, who played his final game for Dortmund. Reus is leaving Dortmund after 12 years at the club.

Reus and Mats Hummels were members of the last Dortmund team to make it this far. They lost the 2013 Champions League final to Bayern Munich.
