# **Army to turn heat**

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday here reviewed the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of several terror incidents in the region recently and also took stock of the preparations for the annual Amarnath Yatra scheduled to commence from June 29 and will continue till August 19.

The Home Minister was given a comprehensive briefing on the prevailing situation in Jammu and Kashmir where security forces are expected to intensify counter-terror operations in the coming days, it was learnt. The operations against

terrorists will be carried out in line with the Prime Minister's directive, sources said. Shah presided over the high-level meeting here at North Block, three days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a similar meeting where he directed officials to deploy the "full spectrum of counter-terror capabilities"

after a spate of terror incidents, including an attack on a bus carrying pilgrims. # Jeevan dayini Ganga in distress amid intense heatwave

On the auspicious day of Ganga Dussehra, the Ganga River in Varanasi reached an unprecedented low,

measuring 189.66 feet against the expected 193 feet. The river's width, typically spanning 70 to 80 metres in June, has now been reduced to 30 to 35 metres, exposing the ghats and revealing environmental dis-"In summers, the water level

generally goes down, but this year's drop is unprecedented due to the intense heatwave sweeping across Northern India," said Vijay Kumar, General Manager of the Jalkal Department. Three days ago, 1,800 cusecs

of water were released from

the Kanpur Barrage to sustain

the Ganga's level in Varanasi, resulting in only a 2-centimeter rise. "If the water level of the Ganga decreases further, there will be a problem," Kumar warned, noting that he had requested additional water releases from Kanpur Irrigation Department to stabilise the



river's level. The city's water supply, which relies on 120-125 million from the Ganga, currently adequate supply.

"Although the Ganga is considered life-giving (Jeevan dayini), the recent heatwave has exposed the river's vulnerability. "The declining water levels have caused the Ganga to recede from the ghats, revealing broken boats, scattered garbage, and shattered boulders," said Ashutosh Shukla, a Varanasi resident.

Pandit Dinesh Chandra Mishra, a priest at Assi Ghat, reminisced about Ganga traditional Dussehra's significance, when rising water levels used to mark the onset of floods 50 years ago. "This trend has diminished in the past five years," he said. Mishra emphasised the need for additional water releases, pointing out the challenges faced by boatmen and the looming threat to the city's water supply. "The river has already receded from the ghats, creating major challenges for boatmen. The ghats, biggest crisis will be in our water supply," he warned. The past month and a half have seen relentless scorching heat, causing significant drying of the Ganga.

### Delhi continues to sizzle

The maximum temperature in Delhi on Sunday was recorded six notches above normal at 44.9 degrees Celsius, the India Meteorological Department said. The minimum temperature was recorded at 33.2 degrees Celsius, 5.7 notches above the season's average. For Monday, the Met office has predicted mainly clear skies and heatwave to severe heatwave to with warm night conditions and strong surface winds.

At 5.30 pm, the humidity was recorded at 19 per cent. The national Capital's Air Quality Index (AQI) was recorded in the 'moderate' category with a reading of 195 at 6 pm, according to Central Pollution Control Board data. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'.

Meanwhile, Uttar Pradesh continued to be in the grip of heatwave conditions with the maximum temperature remaining above 45 degrees Celsius at most places in the State.

# on J&K teppopists Tension flares up in Capital over water woes

The ongoing water crisis in Delhi has sparked protests, vandalism, and heated political exchanges across the Capital. On Sunday, unidentified individuals vandalised the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) office in Chhatarpur amid the severe water shortage while tensions also flared in the Dwarka, where a dispute over access to water from a common tap resulted in three people being injured and hospitalised at Indira Gandhi Hospital.

The Aam Aadmi Party on Sunday accused the BJP workers of vandalising a Delhi Jal Board office during their protests over the water crisis in the national Capital. Sharing a video of the purported incident on X, AAP Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj wrote, "See the BJP leaders wearing sashes and workers wearing sashes and workers

shouting slogans in support of BJP leaders, destroying government property at the Delhi Jal Board

Reacting to the Chhattarpur incident, former MP and BJP leader Ramesh Bidhuri expressed empathy with the anger of the people but condemned the destruction of public property. "It is natural. The people can do

anything when they are angry. I am grateful to the workers who controlled those people...It is the government's and people's property. There is no benefit in damaging this property."

The incident occurred as Delhi is grappling with one of the worst water crises amid the boiling hot weather. The footage shared by on social media showed shattered window pane and broken earthen pots at the DJB office. There have been significant allegations against the AAP Government, where the protesters and the political parties are claiming that the senior officials, including some from the Delhi Government are running a "tanker mafia". # **Unease in NDA over NEE**

n what could be the first sign of "political" Luneasiness in the just formed Narendra Modi-led NDA Government, its partner JD(U)'s Nitish Kumar-led Bihar Government has come down cracking by registering an FIR in the infamous NEET entrance paper leak though the Centre has been defending from day one and termed all the controversy an allegation a conspiracy by the Opposition to malign the Centre.

A regular massive protests from the across the country, including Bihar which sees a large number of aspirants, is being reported on a daily basis ever since the expose giving the Opposition-led by the Congress an opportunity to attacking the Dharmendra Pradhan-led Education Ministry.

After the things were getting murkier, Pradhan addressed the NEET controversy once again on Sunday reiterating the Government's commitment to accountability and fairness. He emphasised that strict actions will be taken against any officials found guilty of malpractice. "On the recommendations of the Supreme

Court, a re-test has been ordered for 1,563 candidates. Irregularities have been found in two places. The Government is taking this issue seriously. If any high-ranking officials of the NTA are found guilty, they will face strict consequences. Significant improvements are needed in the NTA. We are committed to ensuring that no wrongdoer escapes punishment," Pradhan said.

The Centre and the NTA have told the Supreme Court they had cancelled the grace marks given to 1,563 candidates who took the examination for admission to MBBS and other such courses. They will have the option to either take a re-test or forgo the compensatory marks awarded to them for loss of time, the Centre has said.

The Economic Offences Unit (EOU) of Bihar, which is probing allegations that the paper of

the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) was leaked ahead of the exams held on May 5, has said they found evidence that suggests that some students knew the questions before they appeared for the examination. EOU said 13 people, including four students, have been arrested for their suspected involvement in the alleged leak and some have also been accused of receiving the question papers ahead of the test.

According to Additional Director General of Police, EOU, NH Khan, during the probe they had asked a set of questions to the National Testing Agency (NTA), which organises the NEET exam, and while they might have some follow-ups to their questions, their investigation is "very much suggestive of a paper leak." EOU Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Manavjeet Singh Dhillon said they recovered a list of the 13 people from a "safe house" located on the outskirts of Patna. Sources said around 30 medical aspirants had

reportedly been summoned by people they described as the "exam mafia" to receive questions and answers ahead of the exam. Dhillon claimed that four arrested candidates had "confessed" during interrogation that the questions were identical to those they had received at the "safe house" on May 4. The NEET exam was held on May 5 in 4,750 centres across India and around 2,400,000

candidates took it. The results were expected to be declared on June 14 but were announced 10 days earlier since the evaluation of the answer sheets was completed earlier. The results sparked outrage and protests amid alleged irregularities after as many as 67 students scored a perfect 720.



# Tourist guides to turn saviours

Tn the wake of rising incidents **L**of heart attacks, the IATO (Indian Association of Tour Operators) has proposed a crucial initiative aimed at ensuring first aid for tourists in emergencies: Training guides and drivers in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) skills.

The move, though, has come

quite late from the IATO given that countries world over train their guides and drivers in such skills to effectively respond ensuring emergencies, prompt and potentially lifesaving interventions for visitors in distress. An IATO official said they are

advocating training comprehensive programme to equip tour guides and drivers with CPR skills. "We have written to

TouristsFederation of India (TGFI) and Indian Transporters Association (ITTA) to organise the skill development training programme enabling the drivers and guides to provide quality services to the international standard to the foreign tourists. 'Training of first aid and CPR

is needed as sometimes medical facilities are not available in remote areas and guides can save the lives of tourists." There have been a few reported cases of heart attack among tourists also. The IATO official stressed that such

training programmes should be organised annually as this will create confidence especially amongst foreign tourists, amid growing interest of inbound tourists for India.

# Punjab Police File 'Zero FIR' Over Assault on Punjabi NRI in Dalhousie

PNS CHANDIGARH

In a significant development, the Punjab Police on Sunday lodged a 'Zero FIR' concerning an alleged assault on a Punjab-origin NRI Kawaljit Singh, who claimed that he was brutally beaten by a group of men over a parking dispute in Dalhousie, Himachal Pradesh. The incident has triggered a political uproar and drawn attention to regional tensions.

Punjab NRI Affairs Minister Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal reached out to Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, urging a comprehensive investigation into the matter. Dhaliwal emphasized the need for swift and thorough action to ensure justice and maintain the goodwill between tourists and locals in Himachal Pradesh.

The Zero FIR, a legal mechanism allowing complaints to be registered at any police station irrespective of jurisdiction, was filed under sections including 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 341 (wrongful restraint), 354 (assault or criminal force to

her modesty), 506 (criminal intimidation), and 148 (rioting) of the Indian Penal Code at the Ranjit Avenue police station in

#### Allegations of Assault and Discrimination

Kawaljit Singh, who is currently receiving medical treatment in Amritsar hospital, alleged that he and his family were attacked by a mob of around 100 people after a parking dispute in Dalhousie. Singh, who has been residing in Spain with his Spanish wife for the past 25 years, recently returned to Punjab and was visiting Dalhousie with his wife and a relative when the altercation occurred. He claimed that the attack was fueled by regional discrimination, stating that he was targeted specifically because he is Punjabi.

### **Political and Public**

The incident has prompted strong reactions from various political figures. Punjab NRI Affairs Minister Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal, who visited Singh in the hospital, expressed grave

letter to Himachal Pradesh's Chief Minister, Dhaliwal highlighted the potential impact such incidents could have on tourism, especially during the peak summer season when many visitors from Punjab and other regions flock to Himachal Pradesh's scenic spots.

'Tourists from Punjab and across the world come to visit Himachal Pradesh. This highly condemnable and unfortunate incident shall impact tourism in the Hill State if we collectively do not take strict action against the culprits," Dhaliwal wrote. He requested that the Himachal Pradesh Government undertake a thorough investigation and take stringent action to prevent future occurrences.

"I shall be highly grateful if you look into the matter personally and please direct the authorities concerned to thoroughly inquire the matter. I would also request some of your precious time to personally discuss this unpleasant incident," he added.

Dhaliwal said that thousands of people from Punjab visit tourist places such as Dalhousie every day and such incidents are not good for

#### **Himachal Pradesh Police's** Response

Contrary to Singh's allegations, the Himachal Pradesh Police had stated that the incident was not related to any inter-state or inter-community dispute. Inspector General of Police (Northern Range) Santosh Patial had, a day before, clarified that Singh was involved in a scuffle while performing palm readings for some women in Khajjiar, Chamba district, which offended some locals. The situation reportedly escalated into a scuffle, but both parties later reached a compromise in the presence of the police, and Singh chose not to pursue legal

"There is nothing like an interstate or inter-community dispute. Tourists are welcome in Himachal," Patial asserted, describing the altercation as a "stray incident". He added, Thousands of tourists are coming to the State every day during the summer season and it is just an isolated incident that offended by Singh's actions."

#### **Broader Implications**

The incident has also drawn parallels to other regional disputes, including the recent controversy involving Bollywood actor and BJP MP ĭnvolving from Mandi, Himachal, Kangana Ranaut, who was allegedly slapped by a CISF woman constable at Chandigarh airport. Amritsar MP Gurjeet Singh Aujla and Akali leader Bikram Singh Majithia have suggested that these incidents reflect underlying regional tensions that need to be addressed to maintain harmony and mutual

As the investigation progresses, both the Punjab and Himachal Pradesh Governments face the challenge of addressing the immediate concerns of justice and accountability while ensuring such incidents do not mar the reputation of these touristfriendly states. The emphasis remains on a fair and transparent inquiry to uphold the law and protect the interests of all parties involved.

In a resolute move to make Punjab a drug-free state, the Punjab Police on Sunday conducted an extensive Cordon and Search Operation (CASO) targeting drug hotspots and vulnerable areas, focusing on curbing the drug supply at the 'Point of Sale'. The state-level operation was carried out under the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann and Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav.

The operation, which took place from 11 am to 2 pm, was meticulously planned and supervised by senior police officials including range Additional Director General of Police (ADGPs), Inspector Generals of Police (IGPs), Deputy Inspector Generals (DÎGs), and Commissioners of Police, Senior Superintendents of Police (SSPs) across all 28 police districts in the State.

Special DGP, Law and Order, Arpit Shukla personally led the operation in SAS Nagar, accompanied by Deputy Inspector General of Police (DÎG) Ropar Range Nilambari Jagdale and Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Dr Sandeep Garg.

#### Three-Pronged Strategy for **Drug Eradication**

Special DGP Arpit Shukla highlighted the Punjab Police's multi-pronged strategy to eradicate the drug menace, which includes Enforcement, Deaddiction, and Prevention (EDP). He emphasized that the police are focusing on controlling drug supply by targeting small drug peddlers and forfeiting illegally acquired properties of major drug traffickers under Section 68F of the NDPS Act. The police have also strengthened the Second Line of Defence along the border to prevent drug smuggling from across the border.

The conviction rate under the NDPS Act has also improved significantly from 59 percent in 2018 to 81 percent in 2023.

Saini, presiding over a review meeting of the Forest and Wildlife Department in Chandigarh on Sunday, also released a brochure for 'Pran Vayu Devta Scheme. The meeting was attended by the Minister of State for Environment, Forests, and Wildlife Sanjay Singh. The Chief Minister said that

illegal cutting of trees from the forest areas will not be tolerated, and if any employee is found to be complicit, action will be taken against them. He reviewed in detail the annual plantation drive conducted by the Forest Department during the monsoon season and directed that these plants be geo-tagged and their growth should be monitored for five years with the help

Expressing concern over forest fire incidents, the Chief Minister said that such incidents not only kill wildlife but also cause damage worth crores of rupees in wood and contribute to pollution. He said, "If there is unnecessary delay in responding to a fire incident, officers from forest guards to district-level officers will be held accountable," he said. He directed the officers to

The main meeting of iCET will be held on Monday with the focus being a review of all the projects considered at the Washington meeting on January 31, 2023 including transfer of technology of GE-414 jet engines for Tejas Mark

# Railway Board sets up panel to find out reasons for violation of speed limits by drivers

 $T^{\text{he Railway Board has set}}_{\text{up a committee to find out}}$  the reasons for the violation of speed restrictions by train drivers at various points between originating and destination stations which is detrimental to safe train oper-

According to sources, the Board came into action after recent incidents in which two train drivers violated the speed restriction of 20 kmph at a river bridge, which was under maintenance and drove their trains at 120 kmph

In the first incident, the loco pilot and assistant loco pilot of the Gatiman Express, India's first semi-high-speed train

which runs at 160 kmph speed between Hazrat Nizamuddin in Delhi and Virangana Lakshmibai Ihansi Junction in Uttar Pradesh, violated the advisory speed restriction between Jajau and Mania railway station near Agra Cantt. Just a couple of days after the Gatiman incident, the drivers of another train Malwa Express, which runs between Katra (Jammu) and Indore (Madhya Pradesh), too committed a similar violation at the same spot and steered the train at 120 kmph.

Soon after these incidents, the Railway Board on June 3 issued a circular to all zones and informed, "Railway Board has constituted a committee to review the caution orders being issued to Loco Pilots



and Train Managers (guards)." "The committee desires to interact with Loco Pilots through video conference to

pilots from each division to attend a meeting on June 5. "Over 180 loco pilots and loco inspectors took part in

The Railways imposes speed restrictions for the safe operation of the trains for various reasons such as track condition, ongoing track repair work, old railway bridges and station yard remodelling etc. The Railway officials say that before boarding the engine, the loco pilots and their assistants obtain a complete route chart along with advisories and cautionary speed limits from the concerned operating department and they are supposed to maintain the speed accordingly.

these advisories and cautions and the driver repeats it to confirm. "In the meeting, various suggestions came, For instance, a section of drivers suggested that a train guard should remind a driver on a walkie-talkie 3 km before the order. starting point of the speed restriction.

This practice is being followed by the guards of Kota division and a request was made to make it applicable across the board in Railways," said another loco pilot, who attended the meeting.

'Some drivers wanted the caution order to be given on bold letters with bigger font size on A4 size white paper. They also said that drivers should be issued different colour highlighters to mark the restrictions for their convenience," he added. The transatlantic ferry of Rafale fighter aircraft was enabled by the IL-78 Air to Air Refuellers (AAR), while the transportation of personnel and equipment was undertak-



en by the C-17 Globemaster aircraft. The contingent landed at Eielson, USAF base in

Alaska on 29 May 24. Red Flag is an air combat exercise conducted with multiple scenarios designed to provide realistic combat settings. A demarcation of forces is done for simulating the desired environment, with the Red Force simulating Air Defence elements, and the Blue Force simulating the Offensive Composite elements. During this Exercise (Ex), the Red Force was mainly constituted by the USAF Aggressor Sqn flying the F-16 and the F-15 aircraft.

This was the first time the IAF Rafale aircraft participated in Ex Red Flag, wherein, they operated alongside the RSAF and USAF F-16 and F-15s, and the USAF A-10 aircraft. The missions included Beyond Visual Range (BVR) combat exercises as a part of Large Force Engagements (LFE), in Offensive Counter Air and Air Defence roles. The IAF crew were actively involved in mission planning and also assumed the role of Mission Leaders for designated mis-

sions during the exercise. In spite of the challenging weather and almost sub-zero temperatures, the IAF maintenance crew worked diligently to ensure serviceability



Gene responsible for fragrance, safety against pathogens in lavender found

n a discovery that is partic-Lularly significant for India, which is exploring lavender cultivation as part of the Aroma Mission launched in 2016, a team of researchers has found that gene, LaMYC7, plays a crucial role in the aromatic plants for enhancing its distinctive both the fragrance as well as safeguarding the plant against pathogens, a team of researchers has found.

The study published in the

The researchers explained that the LaMYC7 transcription factor regulates the biosynthesis of key terpenoids, such as linalool and caryophyllene, which are responsible for lavender's characteristic aroma. These terpenoids also play a vital role in the plant's defense mechanisms

ly Pseudomonas syringae, a sig-nificant threat to plant health. Talking about the research techniques, they said they employed advanced techniques including RNA sequencing, transgenic technology, and enzyme assays to explore the function of LaMYC7. These methods revealed that LaMYC7 enhances terpenoid biosynthesis, thereby boosting lavender's resistance to pathogens, said the study.

# In protest against planned airport, Parandur villagers say they will relocate to Andhra

R esidents of Parandur and neighbouring villages in Kanchipuram district have announced their decision to relocate to Andhra Pradesh to the Tamil Nadu government's attention to their nearly 700-day-old protest against the greenfield proposed to be established near here. The Tamil Nadu government

issued the notification for acquisition of land for the Parandur airport soon after the results of the Lok Sabha polls were declared. Chief Minister M K Stalin

had in August 2022 announced that a second airport for Chennai would come up at Parandur at an estimated outlay of Rs 20,000 crore that can handle 10 crore passengers annually.

The government's decision did not go down well with the



residents of 13 villages who immediately commenced their strike stating that the project would affect their livelihood as majority of their farm lands would be acquired for construction of the airport. However, the state government has assured that villagers would be 'adequately compensated.'

Nearly 15 protesters have planned to call on Chittoor district Collector on June 24 and seek permission to move to Andhra Pradesh.

"We have planned to meet him on June 24 as our protests Tamil Nadu government is not showing any interest to demands. Initially, about 15 members are planning to relocate," G Subramaniyan, secretary, Against Parandur Airport Movement,

We want the Tamil Nadu government to invite us for talks. They should withdraw their proposal for the airport. We are firm in our decision, he added. Residents of Ekanapuram, Valathur, Ediayarpakkam, M a d a p u r a m , Akkammapuram villages surrounding Parandur have been on strike since August 2022 urging the government to withdraw its decision. Their agitation will enter its

### After AIADMK declares Vikravandi bypoll boycott, DMDK follows suit

**P**he Desiya Murpokku Dravida Kazhagam, which fought the recent Lok Sabha polls in alliance with the main AIADMK. opposition announced on Sunday that it will boycott the July 10 bypoll to the Vikravandi assembly constituency. The DMDK's decision came

following the announcement by the AIADMK on June 15 that it was giving the bypoll a miss, alleging that the ruling would unleash "violence" and not allow people to vote "independently". The DMDK, founded by late actor-politician Vijayakanth, said it does not have "faith" in this

bypoll. In a statement, DMDK General Secretary Premalatha Vijayakanth said her party had so far contested all the general elections and bypolls but it would now "boycott" the Vikravandi bypoll. "The Vikravandi bypoll. "The reason is: Elections should be conducted honestly in a democratic manner," she said, adding that in the present-day context, elections are, however, held in the "wrong" fashion.

Hinting at abuse of power, without explicitly naming Tamil Nadu's ruling DMK, Premalatha said, "We do not want the hard work of our cadres to go to waste; we are not inclined to waste our time and money since we have no faith in this bypoll."

# Minister: We consulted with all before deciding to implement new criminal laws from July 1

Union Minister of State for Law and Justice U Law and Justice (Independent Charge) Arjun Ram Meghwal on Sunday said the new criminal laws will be introduced from July 1, dismissing opposition allegations of not being consulted before the decision was made.

Meghwal said the Indian Penal Code, Code of Criminal Procedure, and the Evidence Act will be replaced by the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Bharatiya Sanhita, and Sakshva Act.

He added that necessary training programmes and infrastructure development for implementing the new laws are already underway.

"The three new laws will be implemented from July 1 for providing timely, speedy, and error-free justice," Meghwal said during the inaugural session of 'India's Progressive Path in the Administration of Criminal Justice System' held here on Sunday.

addressed Meghwal allegations of inadequate consultation, saying, "Some people claim they were not consulted. This is untrue. The demand for change of colonial laws has been longstanding, and the process began long ago.'

The minister explained that although suggestions were sought from all states, only 18 states and six Union Territories responded. "Even the Chief Justice of India,

courts, five law academies, and 22 law universities provided their suggestions," 'We contacted all MPs, but only 142, including members from both houses, responded.

Suggestions were also requested from all MLAs nationwide, with only 270 responding. We consulted widely, but not everyone provided feedback," Meghwal added. ## **Heatwave crisis**

To mitigate the health impacts of extreme heat, urgent Govt action is essential

his summer has been unlike any other. The relentless heat intensifies with each passing day, and there is no relief in sight. India is currently grappling with one of the most intense heat waves in recent history, with temperatures soaring above 45 degrees Celsius in many regions. This extreme heat is taking a significant toll on the health of the people, straining healthcare systems, and prompting urgent government action to mitigate the crisis. The immediate health impacts of the heatwave are severe and widespread. Hospitals across the country are reporting a surge in cases of heatrelated illnesses such as heat exhaustion and heatstroke. Heat exhaustion, characterised by symptoms like heavy sweating, muscle cramps, and fatigue, can escalate into heatstroke. Heatstroke is a life-threatening condition that occurs when the body's temperature regulation fails, leading to confusion, unconsciousness, and potentially fatal organ damage. Individuals with cardiovascular diseases are at increased risk of heart attacks and strokes as the body struggles to cool itself, leading to higher heart rates and blood pressure. It is time the Indian Govt declared a health emergency and implemented measures aimed at protecting public health and alleviating the impact of the heatwave. The government must actively disseminate information through various media channels, advising people to stay indoors during peak heat hours and drink plen-

ty of water. The office timings must be changed. Some states like Rajasthan are doing good jo. External coolers have been installed on public buses to mitigate the soaring temperatures. In response to the extreme heat, the Jaipur administration has initiated the use of artificial rain. Large water tankers have been stationed along the roads to spray water on pedestrians, adopting this method to combat the sweltering conditions. The rest of the country could take a cue from Rajasthan. Indeed, healthcare systems are under significant pressure, with hospitals and clinics witnessing a sharp increase in heat-related medical emergencies. To cope with the surge, additional medical staff must be deployed, and temporary medical facilities must be set up in some areas to handle the overflow of patients. What we are witnessing can be attributed to climate change. Urban areas must have more green spaces which help lower temperatures. Climate experts warn that such events are likely to become more frequent and severe in the coming years due to climate change, necessitating comprehensive plans to protect public health. By investing in sustainable infrastructure, enhancing healthcare system capacities, and promoting public awareness, India can build resilience against future heatwaves and safeguard the health of its population in an increasingly warming world.

# Biblical rhetoric stirs controversy



As Netanyahu faces mounting pressure, his future leadership hangs in the balance amidst growing calls for a more humane approach to the conflict

n politics, symbolism matters. In the biblical-civilisational land of Palestine or Ha'aretz Hamuvtakhat ('Promised Land') which birthed Abrahamic faiths, symbolism is even more significant. Therefore, Israel's most extremeright Prime Minister ever i.e., Benjamin Netanyahu, upped the incendiary rhetoric by invoking the 'Amalek' narrative to appeal to the basest of instincts. Netanyahu provoked, "You must remember what Amalek has done to you, says our Holy Bible" - referencing the Biblical Amalekites who were seen as the archetypal enemies of the Jews. It was suggestive of not sparing any of the so-called modern 'Amaleks' (read, Palestinians). Many were horrified at the attempt to seek justification in holy scriptures, to defend the indefensible. Similarly, many are deeply concerned at the import and usage of the Palestinian expression "From the river to the sea" as the same finds mention in the terror group Hamas's charter, which is construed as the complete extermination of the Israeli State and the Jews. The polemics are deeply symbolic. Israel is today conducting a

brazen and no-holds barred retaliation (already accounted for over 35,000 Palestinian deaths) that remains unheeding and unconcerned to global calls for restraint. In some ways, the horrific 7th Oct attack by the terror group Hamas was serendipitously timed for the already unpopular, dictatorial, and tainted Benjamin Netanyahu. Expectedly, after the attack the opposition parties put their differences aside and joined the National Unity Government to stand together in the face of national crisis. It also distracted the attention from Netanyahu's misgovernance till then and offered a much-needed distraction. Netanyahu grabbed the opportunity of the wounded moment to launch an unprecedented revenge that has now got his initial allies like the USA to retnink. After many supportive vetoes in the Security Council, the US was forced to agree with motions that called out the disproportionality of Israeli revenge. Netanyahu cared two-hoots and persisted with his onslaught, as he gambled that it allowed him time and space to do even more fear mongering, 'othering', and manufactured-outrage that could somehow justify his continu-

Already, Israel (especially under Netanyahu) has regularly cocked a snook at the United Nations by becoming the most 'sanctioned' nation in the world. It also cares little about international condemnation. But perhaps it has overplayed its trademark belligerence for now, as the reactions from countries that were once clearly pro-Israel (e.g., the USA) or cautiously guarded (e.g. Western European nations) are finding it increasingly difficult to maintain their stand, as the global outcry over Israeli excess becomes louder. While typically it wouldn't have mattered to Israel under Netanyahu – but perhaps now it does, given that it could backfire on the public mood in Israel which in any case is tiring of the bloodshed and even more wary of Netanyahu's ability to lead the nation, hereinafter.

Three Western countries i.e., Spain, Ireland and Norway have announced that they will now recognise a Paiestinian State (with borders that existed prior to the 1967 war, with Jerusalem as the joint capital). It is a wholly symbolic move

that comes with the rider that they are willing to change the contours of the sovereign borders after the final negotiated settlement of the 'two-nation' formula, something Netanyahu has opposed tooth-and-nail. It is an attempt to defame Netanyahu's stand and propel the national mood towards ceasefire and rapprochement. Given that these three countries are 'Western' and have ostensibly no axe to grind with Israel (unlike any of the Arab Sheikdoms or Iran) and hence their action is only rooted in genuine concern and morality. A country like Norway, is in any case the beacon of ethics and humanity, in the global comity of nations hence that bears its own significance with such an action. It could therefore impact and galvanise public opinion within Israel to put internal pressure on Netanyahu. Such a develop-ment, if it were to accrue, is possibly Netanyahu's worst nightmare come true. His survival and legitimacy are predicated on the still popular notions of extracting 'justifiable' revenge, and the sudden siding of Western powers (once pro-Israel) towards his nemesis i.e., Palestine, deligitimises those notions.

Even its staunchest ally, the United States of America, is facing consequences of affording an initial 'blank cheque' onto Israel with rising protests across its campuses, something Joe Biden can ill-afford in the election year. Americans have now become mealymouthed and wishy-washy in their support towards Netanyahu and have started talking about ceasefire, reiterating the 'two-state' formula as the way forward and talking about direct dialogue with the Palestinians. Whereas the United Kingdom, Malta, Australia, and Slovenia have gone one step further and threatened to follow suit with Norway, Spain, and Ireland in recognising the Palestine State. While all of this is still in the realm of symbolism without any concrete interference in the expanding Israeli footprint and flattening of the Gaza Strip it will be significant in checkmating Netanyahu's amoral politics and untenable approach in Gaza Strip. Even Netanyahu's instinctive reaction that such moves by onetime allies tantamount to 'rewarding' Hamas will not have too many takers as truly neutral countries like Norway are not known to take sides in conflict one way or the other, or even to 'derecognize' Israel, but only to drive peace with the insistence of the 'twonation' formula of Oslo Agreement and peace, as the

# Mushroom farming empowers women in rural Bihar

Women in Bihar thrive through mushroom cultivation, achieving financial independence and contributing significantly to local economies

ly gaining recognition and popularity in the culinary world for their unique taste and versatility. Dishes such as mushroom curries, pudding, pickles and snacks are becoming favourites on many people's palates. Along with this growing culinary trend, mushroom farming is expanding swiftly across various States in India, including Bihar. According to National Horticulture Board data, Bihar produced approximately 28,000 metric tonnes of mushrooms in 2021-22, accounting for 10.82 per cent of the total mushroom production in India. In the previous year, the State produced a total of 23,000 metric tonnes of mushrooms.



The Bihar Government is providing up to a 50 per cent subsidy to farmers engaged in mushroom cultivation, which is boosting production and increasing farmers' incomes. Under the Integrated Horticulture Mission scheme, these subsidies have also raised farmers' morale, leading to a surge of women farmers entering the field. In

For the past ten years, Manorama Singh, a farmer, has been recognised for her mushroom production not only in the Vaishali district but across the State. She cultivates mushrooms herself and also trains nearby farmers in mushroom farming. Manorama prepares mushroom seeds and makes the necessary compost.

Mushroom farming has emerged as a powerful cata-lyst for financial independence among many women. Neelam Devi, a 34-year-old farmer from Bandra block in Muzaffarpur district, was many districts of Bihar, married off at a very young women have established a age due to her family's poor

financial condition. She always aspired to be selfreliant. One day, she learned about a mushroom farming training programme offered by an NGO called 'Atma.' She joined the programme, received training and began cultivating mushrooms in a room of her house. Despite facing disapproval and opposition from her in-laws, Neelam remained steadfast and determined to pursue her Gradually, she began to

achieve success and earn significant profits from mushroom production. Today, she has become so proficient in this field that she is teaching 200 women how to cultivate mushrooms, supporting them in their journey to become self-reliant.

Neelam has been honoured as a successful farmer by Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa. Her reputation as a mushroom trainer and producer has spread far and wide. Those who once opposed her, including her in-laws, now take pride in her determination and passion. Like Neelam, dozens of women farmers in Muzaffarpur are creating a new identity through mushroom farming and earning substantial profits annually.

45-year-old farmer Lal Bahadur from Kothiya village in Kanti block, about 17 km from the Muzaffarpur district headquarters, believes that both women and men find

For her commendable work, ficial because it is easy to grow. It can be cultivated easily at home, with low costs and high profits. The mushroom crop is ready in just 25 days. He shared that initially, he too lacked knowledge about mushroom farming. Then, in 2012, he met Dr. Daya Ram, a professor at Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University, Pusa. After training with him in mushroom farming, Lal Bahadur began raising awareness about mushroom cultivation among farmers in the

surrounding villages. He explained that initially, due to a lack of proper information, people did not support him. They believed that mushrooms were wild plants, known in the village as 'gobar mushroom cultivation bene- chhata, some of which are

highly poisonous. After much explanation, people began to understand the difference between edible mushrooms and gobar chhata. Once this distinction was clear, the villagers started mushroom farming with him and women actively participated. Lakshmi Devi, another farmer from the same village, shared how Lal Bahadur's understanding of mushroom farming opened a new avenue for them in farming. "Before we knew about mushroom farming, we would go to the city for labour work, but even then, it was difficult to make ends meet. Since we started mushroom cultivation, our household situation has

improved." In recent years, the demand for mushrooms has increased

significantly across various districts in Bihar. From hotels and restaurants to wedding functions and feasts, mushroom dishes are becoming a status symbol. Beyond the capital city of Patna, mushrooms are now easily available in the vegetable markets along the roadsides in cities like Hajipur, Samastipur and Muzaffarpur. As the mushroom market continues to grow, so does its demand. This increasing demand has opened new doors for farmers, allowing them to benefit from this trend. # Israel army to pause daytime fighting in Gaza Sunak running

srael's military announced **L**on Sunday that it would pause fighting throughout daytime hours along a route in southern Gaza to free up a backlog of humanitarian aid deliveries destined for desperate Palestinians enduring a humanitarian crisis sparked by the war, now in its ninth month. The "tactical pause" announced by the military, which applies to about 12 kilometres (7.4 miles) of road in the Rafah area, falls far short of a complete ceasefire in the beleaguered territory that has been sought by the international community, including Israel's top ally, the United States. If it holds, the limited halt in fighting could help address some of the overwhelming needs of Palestinians that have surged even more in recent weeks with Israel's incur-

The army said the pause would begin at 8 am (0500 GMT) and remain in effect until 7 pm (1600 GMT). It said the pauses would take place every day

sion into Rafah.

The pause is aimed at allowing aid trucks to reach the nearby Israel-controlled Kerem Shalom crossing, the main entry point for incoming aid, and travel safely to the Salah a-Din highway, a main north-south road, the military said. The crossing has suffered from a bottleneck since Israeli ground troops moved into Rafah in early May. COGAT, the Israeli military body that oversees aid distrib ution in Gaza, said the route would increase the flow of aid to other parts of Gaza, including Khan Younis, Muwasi and central Gaza. Hard-hit northern Gaza, which was an early target in the war, is being served by goods entering from a crossing in the north.

The military said the pause came after discussions with the United Nations and international aid agencies.

Aid agencies, including the UN, did not immediately respond to requests for comment. The pause along the southern route comes as Israel and Hamas are weighing the

latest proposal for a cease-fire, a plan that was detailed by President Joe Biden in the administration's most concentrated diplomatic push for a halt to the fighting and the release of hostages taken by the militant group. While Biden described the proposal as an Israeli one, Israel has not fully embraced it and Hamas has demanded changes that appear unacceptable to Israel.

Israel's eight-month military offensive against the Hamas militant group, sparked by the group's October 7 attack, has plunged Gaza into a humanitarian crisis, with the UN reporting widespread hunger and hundreds of thousands of people on the brink of famine. The international community has urged Israel to do more to ease the crunch and has said the ongoing fighting, including in

deliveries throughout the war. From May 6 until June 6, the UN received an average of 68 trucks of aid a day, according to figures from the UN humanitarian office, known as OCHA. That was down from 168 a day in April and far below the 500 trucks a day that aid groups say are needed.

The flow of aid in southern Gaza declined just as the humanitarian need grew. More than 1 million Palestinians, many of whom had already been displaced, fled Rafah after the invasion, crowding into other parts of southern and central Gaza. Most now languish in ramshackle tent camps. using trenches as latrines, with open sewage in the streets.

COGAT says there are no restrictions on the entry of trucks. It says more than 8,600 trucks of all kinds, both aid and commercial, entered Gaza from all crossings from May 2 to June 13, an average of 201 a day. But much of that aid has piled up at the crossings and not reached its final destination.

A spokesman for COGAT, Shimon Freedman, said it was the UN's fault that its cargos stacked up on the Gaza side of Kerem Shalom. He said the agencies have "fundamental logistical problems that they have not fixed," especially a lack of trucks

The UN denies such allegations. It says the fighting between Israel and Hamas often makes it too dangerous for UN trucks inside Gaza to travel to Kerem Shalom, which is right next to Israel's border.

It also says the pace of deliveries has been slowed because the Israeli military must authorise drivers to travel to the site, a sys tem Israel says was designed for the drivers' safety. Due to a lack of security, aid trucks in some cases have also been looted by crowds as they moved along Gaza's roads.

With less than three weeks until Britain's election day, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak is running out of time to change an ominous tune for his Conservative Party. The UK leader - who in recent days travelled to a Group of Seven summit and a Swiss conference on the Ukraine war — has been dogged by questions about whether voters are about to bring his time in office to an abrupt end on July 4.

Polls continue to give the leftof-centre opposition Labour Party under Keir Starmer a double-digit lead over Sunak's Conservatives, who have been in power for 14 years under five different prime ministers.

Sunak's attempts to close the gap have had little apparent impact. The biggest splash he's made in the campaign so far was a gaffe – the prime minister's decision to skip an international ceremony in France on June 6 marking the 80th anniversary of the D-Day invasion. He has been apologising ever since.

Commentators are starting to talk about doomsday scenarios for the Conservatives, who have governed Britain for almost two-thirds of the past 100 years and won 365 of the 650 seats in the House of Commons in the 2019 election.

University of Strathclyde politics professor John Curtice, one of Britain's most respected polling experts, said Conservative sup-port is at its lowest point in UK polling history, and Sunak "must be beginning to doubt his decision to call the election

In the past week, both Conservatives and Labour have released their election manifestos, the detailed packages of promises that form the centrepiece of their pitch to voters.

The Conservatives focused on reducing immigration and lowering taxes, pledging 17 billion pounds (USD 22 billion) in tax cuts by 2030, to be paid for largely by slashing welfare costs. Labour promised to get the economy expanding after years



ing a new industrial policy investing in infrastructure, cut ting planning red tape and building 1.5 million new homes It has promised not to increase personal taxes, but the Conservatives say the tax burden will rise under Labour. Critics say neither party is being upfront about the tax increases that would be needed to repair public services left threadbare after years of Conservative-led

spending cuts, Brexit, a global pandemic and the cost-of-living crisis triggered by Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine. The gaping hole in both par ties' manifestos is a reckoning with the scale and severity of the fiscal problems that will confront whoever wins the election," said Hannah White, direc-

tor of Independent think-tank the Institute for Government. The Conservatives' electoral prospects worsened when populist firebrand Nigel Farage entered the race at the helm of the right-wing party Reform UK. Though it is unlikely to win many seats in Parliament, Reform's vote share appears to be rising, largely at the expense of the Conservatives.

In recent days, the Conservative message has shifted from aiming at victory to warning that voting Reform could help Labour win a landslide. "If you vote for anybody else other than a Conservative candidate, you're going to get a Labour government with a large majority," Transport Secretary Mark Haper told the BBC on Sunday.

### Two killed in shooting at **Texas park**

Texas (AP): A shooting in a Texas park left two people dead and several wounded on Saturday, authorities said. The victims were shot shortly before 11 pm Saturday during a Juneteenth celebration at Old Settlers Park in Round Rock about 19 miles (30.5 kilometres) north of Austin.

An altercation began between two groups during a concert at the event and someone started shooting, Round Rock Police Chief Allen Banks said during a news conference at the scene. The two victims who were pronounced dead at the scene were not involved in the altercation, Allen said. The shooting occurred near a vendor area away from the stage set up for the concert, Allen said. Police officers and fire department personnel who were attending the event immediately began providing emergency medical care to multiple wounded victims, who were then transported to local hospitals, Allen said.

m ine}$  people were injured, including two young children and their mother, after a shooter opened fire at a splash pad in a Detroit suburb where families gathered to escape the summer heat Saturday. Law enforcement tracked a suspect to a home, where the man died by a self-inflicted gunshot wound, authorities said.

An 8-year-old boy was shot in the head and in critical condition Saturday night, Oakland County Sheriff Mike Bouchard said during a news conference. The boy's mother also was in critical condition after being wounded in the abdomen and leg, and his 4year-old brother was in stable condition with a leg wound. Authorities initially said they believed as many as 10 people had gunshot wounds from the shooting in Rochester Hills, but that number was revised after they checked with area hospitals. The other six victims, all 30 or older, were in stable condition, Bouchard said, They

At least one witness reported that the shooter appeared to use two hand guns during the attack, but that has not yet been confirmed, the sheriff said. In the chaos, "People were falling, getting hit, trying to run," Bouchard said. "Terrible things that unfortunately all of us in our law enforcement business have seen way too

The gunman was "apparently in no rush. Just calmly walked back to his car," the sheriff said Police heard the 911 call reporting the shooting as it came in,



agency uses a service that simultaneously sends emergency calls to first responders. An officer was at the scene within two minutes, he said. Bouchard said the first deputies who arrived immediately began providing first aid including tourniquets. Officers also were able to quickly come up with a likely address, and a car matching the suspect's vehicle was at the residence.

Deputies surrounded the home and tried to make contact with the suspect inside, to no avail, Bouchard said. They sent a drone inside the home and then entered to find the suspect was dead.

Another weapon was found inside. The quick containment of the suspect may have prevented a "second chapter" to the shooting, the sheriff said, displaying a photo of a semiautomatic rifle on a table inside the home.

# S'pore rushes to clean up oil slick after boat hits ship

n oil spill caused by a An on spin cases , dredger boat hitting a stationary cargo tanker has blackened part of Singapore's southern coastline, including the popular resort island of Sentosa, and sparked concerns it may threaten marine wildlife as a clean-up operation was underway on Sunday. The Netherlands-flagged dredger Vox Maxima struck the Singaporean fuel supply ship Marine Honour on Friday. It damaged the cargo tank on Marine Honour, which leaked oil into the sea. Singapore's Maritime and Port Authority said in a statement late Saturday the oil leak from the vessel had been contained, and that the oil that escaped from the damaged tanker had been treated with dispersants. But due to the tidal current, it said the treated oil had landed along shorelines including of container booms, tempoislands, a nature reserve and

a public beach park. Sentosa, which attracts millions of visitors annually, houses one of Singapore's two casinos, golf courses and Southeast Asia's only Universal Studios theme park. Part of the beachfront at the public park and at the nature reserve have been closed to facilitate clean-up efforts, it said

The Sentosa beach will remain open to the public but sea activities and swimming are prohibited.

On Sunday, workers in orange suit were seen scooping up sand in a clean-up operation at an empty beach in Sentosa. Black water washed up on the oil-stained shore.

Authorities have deployed 18 crafts for the clean-up efforts and laid close to 1,500 meters the oil spill.

'More will be laid over the next few days to prevent further spread of oil onto the shore, and facilitate the recovery of the trapped oil off the affected shorelines and lagoons to prevent them from going back to sea," the statement said.

Conservationists and biologists are monitoring the full extent of the damage on marine and wildlife.

Local conservation group Marine Stewards reportedly said there were photos of dead fish, otters and kingfishers covered in oil slick.

Group founder Sue Ye told Singapore Straits Times that oil spills smother and suffocate fish, birds and marine animals that have to go to the surface for air, such as turtles and dolphins.

The revolt prompted France on May 15 to impose a state of emergency on the archipelago and rush in reinforcements for police who were overwhelmed by armed clashes, looting and arson. Both sides of New Caledonia's bitter divide — Indigenous Kanaks who want independence and those loyal to France — erected barricades, either to revolt against authorities or to protect homes and properties.

hinese Premier Li Qiang's visit to Australia on Sunday focused on positive aspects of the bilateral relationship including shared giant pandas and a rebounding wine trade as he promised a new breeding pair of the rare bears and urged both countries to put aside their differences

China's most powerful leader after President Xi Jinping arrived late Saturday in Adelaide, the capital of South Australia state, which has produced most of the Australian wine entering China since crippling tariffs were lifted in March that had effectively ended a 1.2 billion Australian dollar (\$790 million) a year trade since 2020.

Li visited Adelaide Zoo, which has been home to China-born giant pandas Wang Wang and Fu Ni since 2009, before he was to have lunch at a restaurant at Adelaide winery Penfolds Magill Estate.

He announced that the zoo would be loaned another two pandas after the pair are due to return to China in November. "China will soon provide another pair of pandas that are equally beautiful, lively, cute and younger to the Adelaide Zoo, and continue the cooperation on giant pandas between China and Australia," Li said in Mandarin, adding that zoo staff would be invited to "pick

Li was impressed by the 18-year-old male Wang Wang's appetite and indifference to his high-ranking visitors.

The panda is very obsessed with eating and doesn't pay attention to us even when we are the people from its hometown visiting," Li said at the panda enclosure.

"It has completely treated here as its second hometown," Li said. "Very pretty, adorable,

with charming naivety." The pair are the only pandas in the Southern Hemisphere and failed to produce offspring in elected in 2022.

Australia. Foreign Minister Penny Wong thanked Li for ensuring that pandas would remain the zoo's star attraction. "It's good for the economy, it's good for South Australian jobs, it's good for tourism, and it is a signal of goodwill, and we thank you," Wong said.

Tom King, the managing director of Penfolds, one of Australia's oldest wineries, told Chinese state media ahead of Li's arrival that such visits helped strengthen economic and cultural ties. "It's pleasing to see the stabiliz-

ing of relations between the Australian and Chinese governments, including regular high-level visits between the two countries," King was quoted as saying by the Global Times newspaper last week. Li's visit is the first to Australia by a Chinese premier in seven vears and marks an improve-

ment in relations since Prime

Li noted that Albanese in November was the first Australian prime minister to visit China since 2016.

# Pilgrims commence final rites of Haj as Muslims celebrate Eid al-Azha

Masses of pilgrims on Sunday embarked on a symbolic stoning of the devil in Saudi Arabia under the soaring summer heat. The ritual marks the final days of the Haj, or Islamic pilgrimage, and the start of the Eid al-Azha celebrations for Muslims around the world.

The stoning is among the final rites of the Haj, which is one of the Five Pillars of Islam. It came a day after more than 1.8 million pilgrims congregated at a sacred hill, known as Mount Ararat, outside the holy city of Mecca, which Muslim pilgrims visit to perform the annual

five-day rituals of Haj. The pilgrims left Mount Arafat on Saturday evening to spend their night in a nearby site known as Muzdalifa, where they collected pebbles to use in the symbolic stoning of pillars representing the devil.


The pillars are in another sacred place in Mecca, called Mina, where Muslims believe Ibrahim's faith was tested when God commanded him to sacri-

fice his only son Ismail. Ibrahim was prepared to submit to the command, but then God stayed his hand, sparing his son. In the Christian and Jewish versions of the story, Abraham is ordered to kill his other son, Isaac.

On Sunday morning, crowds headed on foot to the stoning areas. Some were seen pushing disabled pilgrims on wheel-chairs on a multi-lane road leading to the complex housing the large pillars. Most pilgrims were seen sweltering and carrying umbrellas to protect them against the burning summer

An Associated Press reporter saw many pilgrims, especially among the elderly, collapsing on the road to the pillars because of the burning heat. Security forces and medics were deployed to help, carrying those who fainted on gurneys out of the heat to ambulances or field hospitals. As the temperature spiked by midday, more people required medical help.

Despite the suffocating heat, many pilgrims expressed joy at being able to complete their pil-grimage. "Thank God, (the

process) was joyful and good," said Abdel-Moaty Abu Ghoneima, an Egyptian pilgrim. "No one wants more than this?

Many pilgrims will spend up to three days in Mina, each casting seven pebbles at three pillars in a ritual to symbolize the casting away of evil and sin. While in Mina, they will visit Mecca to perform their "tawaf," or circumambulation, which is circling the Kaaba in the Grand Mosque counterclockwise seven times. Then another circumambulation, the Farewell Tawaf, will mark the end of Haj as pilgrims prepare to leave the

The rites coincide with the four-day Eid al-Azha, which means "Feast of Sacrifice," when Muslims with financial means commentate Ibrahim's test of faith through slaughtering livestock and animals and distributing the meat to the poor.

Most countries marked Eid al-Azha on Sunday, others, like Indonesia, will celebrate it

Once the Haj is over, men are

expected to shave their heads and remove the shroud-like white garments worn during the pilgrimage, and women to snip a lock of hair in a sign of renewal and rebirth.

Most of the pilgrims then leave Mecca for the city of Medina, about 340 kilometers away, to pray in Prophet Muhammad's tomb, the Sacred Chamber. The tomb is part of the prophet's mosque, one of the three holiest sites in Islam, along with the Grand Mosque in Mecca and the Al Aqsa Mosque in Ierusalem.

All Muslims are required to

make the Haj once in their lives if they are physically and financially able to do so. Many wealthy Muslims make the pilgrimage more than once. The rituals largely commemorate the accounts of Prophet Ibrahim and his son Prophet Ismail, Ismail's mother Hajar and Prophet Muhammad, according to the Ouran, Islam's holy book More than 1.83 million Muslims performed Haj in 2024, Saudi Haj and Umrah Minister Tawfig bin Fawzan al-Rabiah said in a briefing, slightly less than last year's figures when 1.84 million made the rituals. Most of the Haj rituals are held outdoors with little if any shade. It is set for the second week of Dhu al-Hijjah, the last month in the Islamic lunar calendar, so its time of the year varies. And this year the pilgrimage fell in the burning summer of Saudi Arabia. The heat soared to 47 C (116.6 F) at Mount Arafat on Saturday.

This year's Haj came against the backdrop of the devastating Israel-Hamas war, which has pushed the Middle East to the brink of a regional conflict. Palestinians in the Gaza Strip

weren't able to travel to Mecca for Haj this year because of the closure of the Rafah crossing in May when Israel extended its ground offensive to the city on the border with Egypt. And they will not be able to celebrate the Eid al-Azha as they used to do in previous years.

Dozens of Palestinians gathered Sunday morning near a destroyed mosque in Gaza's southern city of Khan Younis to perform the Eid prayers. They were surrounded by debris and rubble of collapsed houses. In the nearby town of Deir al-Balah in central Gaza, Muslims held their prayers in a school-turned shelter. Some, including women and children, went to cemeteries to visit the graves of loved

# Russian forces rescue staff taken hostage

Security forces stormed a detention center in southern Russia on Sunday, killing inmates accused of links to Islamist terror cells who had taken two staff members hostage, state-funded news channel RT reported.

Journalists on the scene reported the sounds of gunfire, while multiple ambulances were seen arriving at the prison in footage on social media.

The hostages at the pretrial detention center in Rostov-on-Don were uninjured, Russia's Federal Penitentiary Service said in an official statement. It said that the hostage takers had been "liquidated," but did not comment further.

A number of local news outlets, including RT, reported that at least some of the prisoners had

Earlier, state news agency Tass,



citing unnamed sources in law enforcement, had said that six hostage takers were in the central courtyard of the Rostov region's Detention Center No. 1, armed with a penknife, a rubber baton and a fire ax. The prisoners include men accused of links to the Islamic State group, it said.

Images posted on social media appeared to show at least two of the hostage-takers wearing a headband that resembled the Islamic State's flag. Other images showed prisoners wielding knives.

RT reported that three of the hostage-takers had already been sentenced on terrorism charges, including disseminating extremist information and plotting to blow up a Russian cour-

IS have carried out a number of attacks on Russian soil in recent years. An affiliate of IS claimed responsibility for the most recent attack in March, when gunmen opened fire on a crowd at a concert hall in suburban Moscow, killing 145 people.

### Pak SC moved against dismissal of plea seeking Imran's disqualification

Apetition has been filed in Pakistan's Supreme Court against the dismissal of a plea seeking former prime minister Imran Khan's disqualification for concealing his alleged daughter Tyrian White while submitting his nomination papers for the 2018 general elections. The Islamabad High Court (IHC) last month dis-

missed the petition. The petition alleged that the 71-year-old Pakistan Tehreeke-Insaf (PTI) party founder had not disclosed his alleged daughter — Tyrian White in his nomination papers for contesting the 2018 general elections

Khan's PTI party won the 2018 general elections, and the former cricketer-turnedpolitician served as the prime minister of Pakistan from August 2018 to April 2022. The IHC rejected the petition after noting that a three-judge

bench had previously dismissed it. Justice Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri read the opinion of the two judges given last year

and ruled that the case has

already been dismissed.

The petitioner, Mohammad Sajid, through his counsel Saad Mumtaz Hashmi, moved the Supreme Court on Saturday, pleading that the full bench of the IHC has erred in considering the concurring opinion of two of the three judges as court judgment.

According to the petitioner, Khan did not mention the existence of his alleged daughter, when he filed nomination papers to contest the election from the Mianwali constituency and only furnished the details of his spouse, Bushra Bibi, and two sons living abroad, namely Qasim Khan and Sulaiman Khan.

The petitioner said since Khan furnished a false affidavit, he was liable to be disqualified. The petition pleaded that it was an undeniable fact that White, born on June 15, 1992,

was the real daughter of Khan after her paternity was confirmed by the judicial record in the courts in California, the United States.

A single bench hearing the matter decided on Feb 2, 2023 that the case be heard by a full bench comprising three judges. After that, the matter was taken up by IHC Chief Justice (CJ) Aamer Farooq, Justice Mohsin Akhtar Kayani Justice Arbab Mohammad Tahir.

After the hearing, they reserved the judgment on March 30, 2023.

However, before the Chief Justice could have given his opinion, the concurring opinion of two other judges was uploaded on the IHC's website mentioning that the petition was dismissed by a majority of

two to one The CJ then ordered an inquiry besides ordering the removal of the concurring opinion of the two judges from the website, as it could not have been uploaded before the case was fixed for announcement of judgment. Later on May 10, 2023, the CJ decided to recuse himself from hearing the case and directed that the "opinion of the two judges be sealed" and ordered that the

The petitioner claimed the petition was fixed before the IHC full bench on May 21, 2024, but the bench rather than hearing the case afresh dismissed the petition.

# **Income tax relief for those in lowest slab** may need to be considered in Budget: CII

Income tax relief for the people in the lowest slab may need to be considered in the upcoming full Budget for 2024-25 considering the high levels of inflation, according newly-elected President Sanjiv Puri.

In an interview with PTI, he also suggested creation of an institutional platform for consensus building between the Centre and states to successfully carry out all reforms, including those related to land, labour, power and agriculture.

The industry body also said it does not see compulsions of coalition politics hampering the reforms in the third term of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. In stead, it believes that the performance of Indian economy and the success of policies in the previous two stints would set the base to accelerate the process.

"Broadly, I would say at this point of time it is public capex, adherence to fiscal glidepath, roadmap investment in the social infrastructure, green fund and greater investment in the rural sector. These are the broad principles," he said, when asked about CII's expectations from upcoming full Budget for

approach, integrating human, animal, and environmental comprehensive response. However, effective implementation demands robust efforts at both state and healthcare facility levels. Despite only five states having developed their State Action

IPC aims to reduce the spread of infections through stringent hygiene protocols, while DS ensures accurate and


