Prime Minister Narendra Modi eyes a record-equalling third straight term in power amid the INDIA opposition bloc's hope of springing a surprise as the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha election is set for Tuesday, bringing an end to a marathon polling exercise stretching over 80 days.

Andhra Pradesh Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Mukesh Kumar Meena on Monday said all arrangements have been made for counting of votes on Tuesday, and the procedure will begin at 8 am.

The CEO said the number of counting locations are 33 across the state, in 401 halls which will have 2,443 EVM tables for Parliamentary constituencies and 2,446 for assembly constituencies.

"All the DEO (District Election Officers) reported that all arrangements have been made for counting of votes. Counting of votes will be taken up at 8 am on June 4," said Meena, addressing a press conference.

There are 443 postal ballot tables for Parliamentary constituencies and 557 for assembly constituencies. As many 454 candidates contested for the Lok Sabha and 2,387 for the legislative assembly, while 3.33 crore voters exercised their franchise on May 13, including 26.4 lakh voters who were over 85 years of age and persons with disabilities. There were 26.7 lakh service electors (members of armed forces) and employees of essential services and 4.61 lakh voters on election duty, said Meena.

The Election Commission has deployed 119 observers to supervise the counting process and has also allotted a micro-observer for each counting table. Likewise, two additional micro-observers have been appointed for each counting hall to assist the observer, while a sufficient number of counting supervisors and assistants have been deployed with a 10 per cent reserve.

# Rumours on driving licences from private schools debunked

PNS VISAKHAPATNAM

Deputy Transport Commissioner GC Raja Ratnam on Monday issued a clarification regarding recent rumours on social media suggesting that driving licences can be obtained from private driving schools starting June

1. The clarification revolves around the rules and regulations that govern accredited driver training centres (ADTCs) and other driving schools. Raja Ratnam emphasized that individuals must still visit Road Transport Authority (RTA) offices to obtain their driving licences.

Raja Ratnam explained that the rules pertaining to ADTCs were added to the Central Motor Vehicles Rules (CMVR) on June 7, 2021, and have been in effect since July 1, 2021. These rules, outlined in Rules 31B to 31J of CMVR, set the standards and procedures for ADTCs. These

guidelines ensure that ADTCs are well-equipped to provide high-quality driver training.

The Centre specified the minimum infrastructure requirements for driver training centres to qualify as AĎTCs. To qualify as an ADTC, a

driving school must meet specific infrastructure requirements. For two-wheelers, three-wheelers, and light motor vehicles, a minimum area of one acre is required. For medium and heavy vehicles, a minimum area of two acres is necessary.
Additionally, the facilities

must include two classrooms equipped with computers and projector systems, simulators, broadband internet connectivity, and various driving tracks designed in S, H, 8, gradient, and reverse S shapes. Training vehicles must include at least one vehicle with dual controls, excluding two-wheelers.

Instructors must have at least 12th-grade qualifications and five years of experience with the respective vehicle type. All training provided must comply with the relevant provisions of the Motor Vehicles

schools meeting these criteria have been open since July 1, 2021, but no applications have been received for establishing such driving schools capable of issuing licences in the State. Therefore, individuals seeking to obtain a driving licence must continue to apply through the Saradhi portal and attend the Learner's Licence Registration (LLR) and driving tests at designated centres," the DTC

The YSRCP aimed to overturn the AP CEO's memo approving postal ballots validated by an official seal and specimen signature without designation. The Central Election Commission had upheld this decision. YSRCP's petition sought to challenge the Andhra Pradesh High Court's recent ruling on postal ballots.

During the hearing, YSRCP's counsel urged the Supreme Court to expedite the inquiry, arguing that uniform rules and regulations should be enforced by the Election Commission nationwide. They contended that issuing specific orders solely for Andhra Pradesh was unfair. Nevertheless, the Supreme Court bench affirmed it could not interfere with the Election Commission's decisions at this time.

Further, the apex court asked the Andhra Pradesh High Court to decide the pleas for anticipatory bail on merits without being influenced by its earlier observations granting interim protection. In an interim order passed on May 23, the Andhra Pradesh High Court barred police from taking any action against him till June 5 in the case relating to the destruction of the EVM during polling.

Against this, a plea was filed by a polling agent of Telugu Desam Party before the Supreme Court alleging that by using his influence, Ramakrishna Reddy made the VRO to lodge a report as if unknown persons damaged the EVMs in the polling booth. He explained regarding rice seeds, 2, 24,154 quintals are needed, and beyond that, 2, 35,000 quintals are available, and presently 67, 617 quintals of seeds are ready to distribute.

Similarly, regarding cotton cultivation, Special CS Gopalakrishna Dwivedi stated that while there is a general area of 5,77,000 hectares in the state, it is estimated that cotton will be cultivated in 5,21,000 hectares for which 26,06, 260 packets of cotton seeds are needed. Dwivedi explained that 13, 69, 428 packets belonging to famous companies such as Rasi, Kohinoor, etc. and 4, 58, 300 packets of other types of cotton seeds have been made available.

Gopalakrishna Dwivedi said that necessary measures are being taken to provide the required 100% quality seeds to the farmers in a timely manner. He further said that MoUs have been signed with 40 leading seed companies and appropriate measures have been taken to supply the necessary seeds on time. He said that in order to take strict action against them, the Department of Agriculture is constantly monitoring up to the village level. ## 1 more held in human trafficking racket

City police have made another arrest on Sunday in connection with an ongoing investigation into a human trafficking and cybercrime racket linked to agents in Cambodia.

The recent arrest brings the total count of individuals apprehended in the case to 11. The arrested individual, identified as Bongu Murali, resides in the Prasad Gardens area of Visakhapatnam's One Town

According Visakhapatnam Cyber Crime Inspector Bhavani Prasad, Murali, allegedly operating an institute named 'Bhavana Fabricators and Engineering Works, is accused of facilitating the trafficking of unemployed youths to Cambodia under false pretenses of employment in computer data entry. Reports suggest that Murali allegedly took money from unsuspecting individuals, promising them lucrative job opportunities in Cambodia. However, upon into participating in cyber scams against their home country.

One victim from Srikakulam reportedly endured mistreatment and coercion to engage in cyber scams after being promised a computer data entry job in Cambodia for a payment of Rs 1.6 lakh. The victim's plight came to light when his elder brother reported the situation to cybercrime police, leading to an investigation and Murali's detention.

Police investigations revealed that Murali orchestrated the trafficking scheme under the guise of providing legitimate employment opportunities.

He allegedly arranged travel logistics through Akbar Travels in Mumbai and facilitated currency exchange for the victims. In some instances, Cambodian agents provided flight tickets and e-visas, enabling Murali to dispatch individuals to Cambodia for illicit activi-

Following his arrest, Bongu Murali has been remanded into custody as the investigation continues into the wider network of human trafficking and cybercrime. Murali is also under scanner in multiple cases, including four charges of cheating. The uncovering of this racket is credited to the efforts of Visakhapatnam Commissioner A Ravi Shankar, Joint CP K Fakirappa, and Visakhapatnam City Cyber Crime Inspector K Bhavani Prasad. Their collaborative

efforts, including 'Operation Cambodia, have led to the rescue of numerous Indian nationals ensnared in the scheme.

#### 'Over Rs 1,100 cr laundered'

The Enforcement Directorate has alleged in its supplementary charge sheet filed against BRS leader K Kavitha before a court here that more than Rs 1,100 crore was laundered in the alleged Delhi excise

scam. According to the ED, out of Rs 1,100 crore, Kavitha was involved in proceeds of crime (PoC) worth Rs 292.8 crore.

The allegations were made in a supplementary prosecution complaint, ED's equivalent to a charge sheet, filed before Special Judge Kaveri Beweja, who on Monday extended Kavitha's judicial custody till July 3.

The judge extended the custody after Kavitha was produced before the court in pursuance of its earlier order issuing a production warrant

The court had issued the warrants after taking cognisance of a charge sheet against the BRS leader in the case on May 29.

# Home-based dialysis gains traction amid rising kidney ailments

PNS VISAKHAPATNAM

Hemodialysis is a common treatissues, typically requiring patients to visit the hospital two to three times a week. This frequent travel can be challenging, especially for those living far from medical facilities. However, Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis (CAPD) offers a valuable alternative, enabling patients to perform dialysis at home, thus reducing costs and travel bur-

Despite being available at King George Hospital (KGH) for the past 18 years, awareness about CAPD has been limited. Recently, however, there has been a slight increase in patients opting for CAPD. Dr G Prasad, Head of the Department of Nephrology at KGH, notes that although only 150 patients have utilized CAPD over 18 years, around 90 have started in just the



last two or three years. Currently, 40 patients are receiving CAPD

"CAPD is suitable for anyone needing dialysis, given they have a dedicated room and a trained caregiver at home," says Dr. Prasad. This method involves a catheter inserted into the abdomen, enabling patients to administer dialysis fluids themselves. Maintaining a sterile environment is crucial to avoid infections. Unlike hemodialysis, which relies on blood purification through a machine, CAPD uses fluids to cleanse the blood, allowing patients to remain active dur-

ing the process. At KGH, CAPD services, including the necessary fluids for 15 days, are provided free of charge, which would otherwise cost up to Rs. 25,000. Inserting the catheter, a procedure that private hospitals charge Rs. 30,000

to Rs. 40,000 for, is also free at KGH. However, despite these benefits, few patients opt for ment providing pensions only to those undergoing hemodialysis. Extending pension benefits to CAPD patients could encourage more to adopt this home-based dialysis method. Dr Prasad highlights the increasing interest in CAPD, noting its benefits of home-based management and continuous monitoring.

He advises regular health check-ups for early detection of kidney issues, recommending BP, serum creatinine, and urine albumin tests for those over 40, and biannual tests for individuals over 50. Kidney disease incidence is rising, fueled by obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure, and the overuse of painkillers. Unhealthy lifestyle choices, such as alcohol and tobacco use and insufficient water intake, further exacerbate the problem.

In total, 25,209 staff have been deployed for the counting process. The CEO said that in 111 assembly constituencies there will be fewer than 20 rounds of EVM vote counting, in 61 constituencies between 21 and 24 rounds, and in three constituencies there will be over 25 rounds. Similarly, 102 assembly constituencies are expected to have up to two rounds of postal ballot counting, 48 constituencies up to three rounds

and 25 constituencies four rounds. The CEO observed that there will be uninterrupted CCTV coverage of the movement of VVPAT machines, control units and relevant documents from strongrooms to counting halls and back.

"Entire counting process in the counting halls will also have 360degree ČCTV coverage or videography with date and time stamping and stored in appropriate retrievable storage devices safely," said Meena.

Speaking about the seizure of cash, liquor, drugs, precious metals and other freebies during the election period, he said the value of the seizures amounted to Rs 483 crore from January 1 to June 2. For maintaining law and order during the counting procedure, the CEO said a three-tier cordoning system will be in place at all counting centres and the areas surrounding the premises have been declared as red zones. Moreover, CrPC Section 144 has

been promulgated in and around EVM strongrooms and counting centres, among other tight security measures. The poll body has identified 1,985 sensitive locations in 26 districts while 83 assembly segments out of 175 have also been identified as sensitive.

To ensure an incident-free election results day in these 83 segments, Meena said one ADGP, two IGPs, two DIGs, 11 SPs, 26 ASPs, 79 DSPs, 206 inspectors and 228 sub-inspectors have been deployed.

# Hectic preparations for counting: Collector

Dr A Mallikarjuna, District Election Officer and Collector, has announced that robust preparations have been made for the vote counting scheduled for June 4 at the Andhra University venue. Addressing counting observers, Dr Mallikarjuna detailed the extensive training provided to officers and staff to ensure a smooth and transparent process.

At a special meeting held at the Collectorate meeting hall, Dr Mallikarjuna gave a PowerPoint presentation outlining the meticulous arrangements for the counting process. The second round of randomisation was completed for 1,045 individuals, including reserves, with 857 allocated as necessary for the task.

Seven centres have been designated for counting votes in the Parliament constituency, and another seven for the Assembly segments. Six additional centres will handle postal ballots, while one centre is specifically set for ETPBS (Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot System) votes. Postal ballots from Pendurthi and Gajuwaka will be counted at their respective EVM centres.



Emphasising stringent security, Dr Mallikarjuna confirmed adherence to three-tier security standards. To expedite the counting process, 14 tables will be set up per centre. The overall setup includes 21 centres spread across six buildings, equipped with necessary technical arrangements and staffed with adequately trained personnel. Both staff and counting agents have been thoroughly briefed on the procedures and rules, which include a strict ban on mobile phones. Agents are permitted to bring only white paper, pens, and pencils. Closed-circuit cameras and proper seating arrangements have been installed within the counting centres to ensure

transparency and order. Police Commissioner Dr A Ravi Shankar confirmed the security measures in place, ensuring the integrity and safety of the counting process. The meeting was attended by counting observers Amit Sharma (Visakhapatnam East and South constituencies), Ajay Kumar Mishra (Bhimili), Abhishek Agarwal (North constituency), and Amit Kumar Pamasi (West). Joint Collector K. Mayur Ashok, Joint Commissioner of Police K. Fakkirappa, MCC Nodal Officer CM Saikanth Verma, District Revenue Officer K. "There has been an increase in the incidents of Indian nationals falling victim to the international crime syndicates active in the Myawaddy region on the Myanmar-Thailand border," the embassy said.

"We would re-emphasise the importance of adhering to our advisories on the subject for not taking any such job offers without consulting the respective Indian embassies," it said. "A new location at Pha Lu area, South of Myawaddy town, is reported to have

emerged recently where most of the Indian victims are being trafficked into, via Thailand, after being recruited from India as well as from countries

The embassy urged Indians not to take up job offers made

like Malaysia, the UAE, etc," it

through social media. "In view of the above, it is reiterated that Indian nationals should not accept such job offers floated through social media platforms or other

unverified sources," it said. "Indian nationals are advised to check/verify credentials of foreign employers through the Indian embassy," it said.



15 per cent in 2009. f the 8,337 candidates analysed, 1,643 have criminal cases, while 1,191 (14 per cent)



face serious criminal charges, including those related to rape, murder, and crimes against

The financial profiles of the candidates show a substantial number of wealthy individuals

running for office.
Out of the total candidates, 31 per cent are crorepatis (millionaires), which translates to 2,572 candidates

This is a notable increase from previous elections, indicating a trend towards more affluent candidates entering the political fray. The average assets per candidate amount to Rs 6.23 crores, reflecting significant wealth among the con-

testing candidates.

The elections were conducted in seven phases, with varying candidate statistics for each

In the first phase, 16 per cent of the candidates had criminal cases, with 10 per cent facing serious charges. By the seventh phase, 22 per cent of the candidates had criminal cases, and 17 per cent had serious charges.

# **Green thumbs**

Unless reversed, the deforestation in Delhi will lead to its desertification, says HC

ahatma Gandhi rightly said that what we do to forests is but a reflection of what we are doing unto ourselves. And this apathy to our environment is now caus-Ing us untold miseries. The Delhi High Court has issued a dire warning, observing that if the current deforestation trends continue, the city could become a barren desert. This alarming forecast highlights the urgent need for sustainable environmental policies and practices. As urbanisation, construction and pollution intensify, the green cover in Delhi and other metropolitan areas is rapidly depleting, leading to severe ecological and climatic consequences. Delhi's deforestation crisis is fuelled by several factors, including rampant construction, illegal logging and urban expansion. The city's green spaces are shrinking, leading to increased pollution levels, a rise in temperatures and a reduction in natural groundwater recharge areas. The adverse effects are already evident in the city's deteriorating air quality, with smog and particulate matter reaching hazardous

levels during winter months. The reduction in tree cover also exacerbates the urban heat island effect, making Delhi increasingly uninhabitable during summer.

The High Court's stark warning underscores the broader implications of this environmental degradation. Trees play a crucial role in carbon sequestration, temperature regulation and maintaining biodiversity. Their removal disrupts these natural processes, leading to soil erosion, loss of habitat for wildlife and a decline in the overall quality of life. If the current trajectory continues, Delhi could face rising temperatures, severe water shortages, loss of biodiversity and a significant decline in public health due to worsening air quality.

Unfortunately, the general tendency is that the Government should do something about it, but the people themselves can bring about a substantial change. In stark contrast to Delhi's environmental challenges, the village of Piplantri in Rajasthan offers a beacon of hope and a model for sustainable development. Located near Udaipur, Piplantri has gained international acclaim for its unique initiative of planting 111 saplings every time a girl is born in the village. This practice, started by former village head Shyam Sundar Paliwal in the memory of his deceased daughter, has transformed the village's landscape and socio-economic fabric. Since its inception, Piplantri has planted over 350,000 trees, turning the once arid region lush green. This has had multiple benefits of improving air quality, increasing groundwater levels and fostering a sense of community ownership over local resources. The initiative also challenges the deeply rooted gender biases in rural India. The environmental benefits in Piplantri are manifold. The increased green cover has helped combat soil erosion, improved agricultural productivity and provided habitat for various species, thus enhancing biodiversity. Delhi's situation and Piplantri's success highlight the critical need for proactive environmental policies and community engagement. Urban areas like Delhi can draw several lessons from Piplantri's example.


# Epic election festival concludes smoothly

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### **FIRST COLUMN CRIME AND CONSCIENCE**

Spiritual resilience through meditation can help reform criminal behaviour

he whole nation was jolted by a recent hit-and-run tragedy, wherein a teenager, reportedly intoxicated behind the wheel of a luxury car, collided with a motorbike, claiming the lives of two promising young IT professionals . As per criminal psychologists, before a crime can be said to have occurred, it has to be committed. So, without action, there can be no crime. Hence, they say that in most of the cases, a person commits a crime in a moment of high tension, irresistible temptation, uncontrollable passion, deep infatuation, extreme provocation or utter frustration or in answer to an undying call of conviction or conscience. So, according to them if he/she could withstand the pressure of these conditions of restlessness for even a couple of minutes or perhaps, even for a few seconds, he/she would have, perhaps, been out of the crime zone and be free at least from any charge of a cognisable offence. Considering it from another perspective, it could be said that, if a man's rational sense, his self-respect, his control over the emotions, his sober judgement, his noble sentiments and his spiritual or ethical sense had not forsaken him, then, perhaps, the blinding storm of negative forces would have subsided and subdued and he would have refrained from the actual committal of crime and would thus have been saved from the traumatic experience that generally follows the crime. Once a gory crime has been committed, the gentle spirit in man has to go through a humiliating and excruciating experience even before he is jailed for a criminal offence or has to pay a heavy amount as punishment, under the relevant act for his civil offence, or has to suffer both. Not only does he feel depressed and carry a heavy burden on his chest but also, he is unable to face his conscience, stand before a mirror and



see his face as before. We have to consider does the law cover all acts that may cause injury to public welfare? Hence one can say that there is no objective, simple definition of crime. Because the meaning of crime is affected by the particular society in which we live.

Like, there are crimes that occur within strict legal definitions and those that relate to codes or conventions known as normative definitions. They are usually formal moral codes such as religions, or informal codes such as socially acceptable behaviour. The acts of crime and the punishment by the court go on as usual. However, one important question to which no government or judiciary has seriously and assiduously addressed itself lingers on. The question relates to the state of mind of a person before he commits the crime and after he has done the act. It is common knowledge that the forces that goad a person to committal of crime are none other than the maddening feelings of anger, consuming fires of hatred, jealousy, rivalry, vengeance or enmity, expanded greed, aroused strong passion, inflated or injured ego, surge of emotional attachment or grave fear of the unknown. We cannot reduce crime or have a crimeless society unless and until we have greatly reduced or fully removed these negative traits from the minds of the citizens.

It is unfortunate that pre-natal and post-natal aspects of crime have never been adequately dealt with by our society. It is hardly realised that what is required, in fact, are such measures that increase the psychological and spiritual immunity of the citizens to situations of stress and strain or to tempests of greed, ego and passions. This cannot be done except by spiritual education and guidance in Meditation. Because it is meditation which can burn the hidden roots of anger, hatred and other negative and criminal tendencies in a person. The over-all expenditure and the manpower and effort required for this will be "far far less" than is involved to keep the cogged wheels of law oiled and moving.

# Uncertainties dwindle investors' confidence

Global uncertainties over rising interest rates, jittery noises of LS elections surpass the RBI's ₹2.10 lakh crore dividend boons, pushing down the Sensex



rom its highest 76,010 in the beginning of the week it plunged to 73,866 as the BSE and Nifty indices close in the last six sessions. The RBI forecast of 7 percent growth too has not boosted the spirits as the equity market has been pining for a higher growth. However, RBI claims that even at 7 percent the country would be one of the fastest growing economies in the financial year 2025. The Asian Development Bank and Fitch also concur. But IMF, S&P and Morgan Stanley put it at 6.8 percent and World Bank, Moody's and Deloitte put it at 6.6 percent.

The RBI has set a target of inflation at 4.5 percent though the central bank repeatedly has said that for the last ten years average inflation hovered over 5.5 percent. The central bank also notes a slowdown in the last quarter of 2023-24. Global markets remained under pressure due to rising bond yields and denting hopes of a rate cut. A major concern is the spike in US bond yields pushing the 10-year yield above 4.6 per cent. Some of the top companies that raised dollar bonds include India Bulls HF-\$ 350 million; IRB Infra - \$ 540 million; Adani Green Energy - \$ 409 million and Sriram Finance - \$ 750 million, as per Bloomberg. The bond market can trigger continuation of the FII selling which will depress the prices of large stocks fur-ther. Volatility is likely to continue the next week as well due to the political uncertainty and global developments. This has been a phenomenon since the elections began in April and now it is spiking to 24.8 - a more than two-year high on the benchmark for volatility India VIX. Except for occasional rises, the stocks remained stagnant.

In different phases the losses to investors have been heavy. In the present melee, foreign funds were major sellers at Rs

3,050 crore. In earlier, trading also the FPIs sold stocks worth Rs 27,500 crore. The domestic funds were net buyers at Rs 53,600 crore. It means largely the PSU funds were the buyers. This has a risk to mutual fund investors. During the weekend the BSE sensex had a minor rise of 0.18 percent or 132.44 points and the NSE Nifty 50 closed 61.75 points or 0.27% higher. These minor ELECTION HAS movements are not capable of recovering the losses.

It is found that some of the major corporates like the Tata Steel's profit slides 65 percent to BEING HIT. Rs 555 crore down from Rs 1566 crore. It suffered a loss of Rs 594 crore. Most of the southern states had a one-day poll schedule. Only in states of northern and eastern India had multiphase polls. Even Tripura, one of the tiniest states with two seats, witnessed polls being held in two

Longer an election stretches, the administrative cost multiplies. All political parties should sit together with the Election Commission of India (ECI) to discuss how the modalities could 17 percent rise in income, 56 perbe simplified to hold elections in the shortest possible time to take care of administrative, economic and trading activities. Apart, it also needs to decide whether announcing dividends by organisations like RBI or other PSUs could be announced during the elections. Such moves tilt the bal-

Overall, there are risks to the economy, RBI says in its annual report. It has asked banks to address trading norms, banking book risks, and diversify deposit sources to mitigate risks associated with interest rate fluctuations. This variation has also its impact on the stock markets. Its decision to review priority sector lending guidelines and work towards formulating norms for the National Strategy fir Financial wider impact on trading and businesses.

The RBI functioning is also being discussed. Its dividend payment of Rs 2.10 lakh crore is linked to

cent drop in expenses due to a much lower transfer to contingency provisions during 2023-24. As against Rs 1.3 lakh crore in 2022-23, only Rs 42,819 crore was transferred to the contingency fund in 2023-24.

Another matter that has drawn attention is the domestic assets made up 23.3 percent against 76.7 percent in foreign currency assets, including gold deposits and gold held in the country as also loans and advances to financial institutions outside India. This could cause further flight of capital from India even as rupee continues to fall against the dollar and further fall in the equities are not ruled out. The market awaits new policy formulations. Till such time the volatility is likely to continue. It would require innovative approach to the financial and budgetary policies to boost the overall market so that investors from across the globe are tempted to put their funds in Indian scrip and other instruments. 






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

# 'PEOPLE SHOULD SEE POLICE IN A POSITIVE LIGHT & NOT AS A PUNCHING BAG'

ether it's cult classic cop dramas or new-age cop licks with comic dialogue, Bollywood has suc-cessfully made the most of the demographic's preference for cop dramas. But how many have uncovered the veracity of the struggles of the cops, especially the women in the force?

Unlike the other cop dramas dominated by superstars, a true supercop has now made her mark on the world. Simala Prasad, a real-life IPS officer from MP, portrays the investigating officer in the newly completed thriller film, *The Narmada Story*.

According to the makers, the film is based on true life inci-

dents, defying the pattern of Bollywood's larger-than-life masala movies. This distinct technique lays the groundwork for a picture that will have viewers on the edge of their seats.

So without further ado, The Pioneer rang a call to the police officer to gather more insights about the films and get onboard. She is also the daughter of Padmashri awardee Mehrunnisa Parvez and Dr. Bhagirath Prasad, a IAS officer from the 1975 batch. She was never forced to take up any of the fields that her parents were in. "We are here serving people and mak-ing the place we are a better place to live" begins the real-life IPS officer on an exclusive note.

"However, there are certain aspects we feel as a civil servant; there are limitations. Our society has a stereotypical mindset that encourages a person to indulge in criminal activity. I feel cinema is a big medium because even an illiterate person can watch it without being restricted to a particular audience. The message a film wants to give is taken in a big way."

Well, moving ahead, as we talk of The Narmada Story, initially, as she got to know that she was going to play the lead role in the film alongside Raghubir Yadav and Mukesh Tiwari, among the rest, she was certainly a little nervous and was not sure if she'd be able to deliver it or not. "Of course in real life. I'm a police officer, but in the film, I'm playing a sub-inspector, a different rank of an officer, which is low from my reallife rank. We are portraying all the traumas that the person goes through and what all the mental baggage is carrying when anyone joins the service. She has to prove herself; she has to come out of it," she says.

Her character is a small-town girl who is of the mindset that being in the police force is a very powerful position and that it's very important to be in uniform. Irrespective of her family constraints, like her father not being willing to send her into the police force, she has a negative mindset about the police, but she wants to be in the police. "As she gets into the forces, she faces a lot of issues, and with the day-to-day work that she tries to manage, the story unfolds. She overcomes the obstacles, and I feel the film shows solutions to certain things

that the police are facing," further shares the IPS officer and

The Narmada Story marks her third collaboration with the director. Both her previous films also highlighted some important messages. Her mother and director, both of them writers, led her to her passion for acting. "I wanted to be a part of this project highlighting a very important aspect of police, and as a police person, we want people to see police in a positive light. For the public, the police are like a punching bag! So far, how police have been portrayed in maybe the cop universe in Bollywood is very larger-than-life, and the issues they show are one person fighting with 20 people or criminals. It is like a superhero in a uniform. This film aims to highlight the real issues the police are facing that even the public needs to be aware of."

Speaking of managing her passion and her duty, she highlights, "I don't indulge in recreational activities like going on vacation, and so for me, acting is just like a hobby that I pursue. It's less management on my part and more management on Zaigham Ji's part in this case. I was not called for any reading sessions or any look tests. It was the team that came over, and we had discussions over the script and my role. The schedule was also such that I could easily manage."

When the shooting began, she revealed that she as if she was working with them for the first time. However, there were certain limitations for her due to her job, and she couldn't afford to be present in the reading session. So, it was on the sets that she got to interact with the NSD grads and people who are polished in their work. It was all about having a learning experience for her.

The film beautifully portrays all the hardships a person has to go through, especially in a rural police station. Moreover, she shares that as a woman in the force, she goes through constraints, be it the infrastructure or the stereotypical mindset of the colleague, because though many women are joining the forces, she feels there's still a long journey ahead.

The film is thus beautifully portraying these small issues. I feel it was an eye-opener for me also because one of the things the film highlights is about times when washrooms were not available for women in the police stations. On the other hand, she has family issues and attends regular phone calls. Like I said, I am playing a sub-inspector, and there's another constable also in the police station. I haven't seen any of the films highlighting these issues because police are either portrayed in a negative light in Bollywood or portrayed as a superhero who can give solutions to each and every problem, who can jump from anywhere or appear anytime when anyone is in

Though there's a long way for women police officers to go, these films, she shares, are going to change the stereotypical mindsets of the people that have been formed over the years.

British DJ, producer, and singer born and raised in East London, Lyan is a multi-faceted, contemporary musician who combines inspirations from South Asian and Western music to create his own istinct genre.

Juss Nandhra and Khushi K, two of the UK's most exciting and upcoming Punjabi stars, have collaborated on a massive, garage-infused single, which we learn all about in this exclusive interview. However, let us start at the beginning, because it can be exciting to discover where every-

The DJ discloses, "Growing up in a multicultural environment, I was exposed to a diverse range of musical traditions from a young age. My family loved classical and modern South Asian music at home, but I grew up listening to Western genres like hip-hop outside. I was inspired to establish this own genre by a desire to honour my heritage while also embracing the numerous musical influences I encountered. I understood that music has a great ability to link individuals from different cultures, and I wanted to create a sound that expressed my dual identity."

The instantly recognisable instrumental pays tribute to the UK Garage classic *Body Groove*, skillfully reinvented by the DJ as a modern-day mega-hit. It finds the ideal mix between preserving the oldies that many people grew up with and embracing the new sounds and British DJ and musician DJ Lyan,

abilities that appeal to the younger generation.
"When composing a track, I never adhere to a set procedure. Inspiration comes from everywhere. I might hear a cool tune on the radio, hear an outstanding soundtrack or instrument in a Bollywood film, or even notice a distinct rhythm in common sounds such as glass clinking or city traffic. These moments create ideas, which I enjoy playing with in the studio. This method of working keeps things new and allows me to naturally merge different musi-

cal influences, resulting in a unique sound that combines both traditions." A mesmerising music video filmed in the heart of London immerses viewers in the contagious energy of the single as Juss,

Khushi, and Lyan groove to the rhythm. The music producer continues, "East London is a great cultural hotspot, and the different noises that surround me influenced my work. You have neighbourhoods with a large South Asian population where the stores and streets are alive with the tunes and rhythms of my origin." At the same time, he was engrossed in the UK music scene, particularly UK grime and UK Garage, as well as any American music he came across, which all had a significant impact on his track. You can hear that in his music, especially in the percussions and bass lines, which are heavily influenced by gritty, intense vibes!

What else has this vocalist got in store for us? Well, "Working with both Juss and Khushi was incredibly essential to me since İ believe in their potential so much, and all three of us are at the beginning of our musical careers. Khushi and I met at a friend's wedding, along with her team, and we instantly clicked. When I came up with the original idea, she was the first person that sprang to mind. She has the perfect tone that cuts through and is almost nostalgic for UKG. Juss, I met him at one of my film sessions and have been following

him since. He has a ridiculous voice that sounds like a traditional Punjabi vocalist, which lends an authentic sound to the record. I filmed them in various studios on different days, and they met for the first time during the video shoot. But, honestly, the connection is incredible, and it seems like

we've been working on music together for years."

When it comes to paying homage to legendary music, he makes it a point to say, "If you grew up in the 2000s like I did, *Body Groove* is one of those tracks that instantly brings back memories. South Asians have a strong affinity for UK Garage, so it seemed like the ideal opportunity to create a song that reflects my heritage while also appealing to a new generation that may be unfamiliar with the original. I consider myself fortunate to be alive at a time when society and worldwide music are fast expanding, and UK Garage is regaining popularity. All of this contributes to the record's feeling of freshness and excitement, connecting the past

and present in a way that everyone can enjoy."

When working with director Sameer on the video, their objective was to capture the essence of three budding UK artists having fun while doing what they love. They both agreed on the significance of creating a true feeling in the video. For Lyan, a music video should elicit a specific sensation, and in this case, it was all about authenticity and making viewers feel as if they were right there with them on the

Furthermore, in the interview, he tells us, "For individuals who aren't South Asian and have never heard these sounds, I want to bring them to a whole new universe of tones, melodies, and rhythms that will make them feel something new while also feeling relatable. Dance music is fantastic because everyone loves to dance, and incorporating these ethnic elements may create a whole new palette of sound. For South Asians, I want to bring an expensive feel to our music; the globe is constantly looking to the West for

his music among more. inspiration, and being able to reflect our culture with a western sound would make the people feel seen, heard, and represented. On the most recent Desi Trill Brown Is Everywhere night, I played Body Groove into Kokka with both Juss and Khushi live on the mic; that moment felt special since the crowd was a diverse mix of nationalities, and everyone felt connected to what the music and movement represented."

For him, it's all about progress and, most importantly, having pleasure while creating. He enjoys many types of music, genres, and languages, and he hopes to expand his musical horizons while maintaining a strong South Asian influence. He wants to do a hip-hop album, a pop record, a funk album, and everything. And while some of it may never be released, he is now experimenting in the studio. "As a produc-er, my main influences have always been other producers and songwriters. I've always respected produc-

# ENGLAND HOPE TO SET TONE AGAINST SCOTLAND

preparation by rain, defending champions England will hope to get their act right straightaway when they face Scotland in their T20 World Cup opener here on

Tuesday.
Phil Salt will look to continue his red-hot form of the Indian Premier League in the T20 showpiece, even as pacer Jofra Archer's return adds firepower to the English bowling attack. Rain played spoilsport in the preceding four-match T20I series at home against Pakistan, but England will still enter the tournament as one of the strong contenders to lift the title for an unprecedented third time.

In what will be their first ever meeting against the Scots in the shortest format, the Jos Buttler-led England will be the overwhelming favourites to emerge winners at the Kensington Oval, which offered a two-paced wicket for the game between Namibia and Oman on Sunday evening. Placed in Group B, England traditional rivals

for company besides Scotland. To reach the Super Eight stage, teams will have to finish in the top two of a group.
In white-ball cricket, it hasn't

been smooth sailing for England since their fivewicket-victory over Pakistan in the final of the last T20 World Cup in Melbourne in 2022. A year after their success in Australia, Buttler's men

endured a disastrous campaign at the ODI World Cup in India, finishing seventh after winning three and losing six of their nine matches including a painful defeat to Afghanistan. Their poor run in the whiteball game continued with a series of defeats to West Indies in both the 50-over and 20over format.

In the rain-marred rubber against Pakistan recently, England regained some of their lost ground with a 2-0 series win.

Now focussed on their opener against Scotland, England have fond memories of playing at the Kensington Oval as it is at this very venue the team won its first-ever T20 World Cup title back in 2010 under Paul Collingwood's captaincy, beating Australia by seven

showdown. In the last 14 years since that triumph, England have become a dominant force in limited overs cricket, winning the 2019 ODI World Cup before their glory Down Under two years ago.

Playing in their third consecutive T20 World Cup,

Scotland are no match to their fancied opponents on paper wickets in the summit but they will nonetheless look to make an impression after having breezed through the

European qualifiers. Scotland won all six of their matches in the qualifiers to finish top of the standings, which guaranteed them a ticket to the the West Indies and the USA for the marquee tournament.

# Trumpelmann, Wiese shine as Namibia win in Super Over

Namibia's Ruben Trumpelmann became the first player to take wickets in the first two deliveries of a T20 international as his team beat Oman via the Super Over in a thrilling T20 World Cup match here. David Wiese and skipper Gerhard Erasmus smashed 21 runs for Namibia in the oneover eliminator with Oman managing 10 from the allotted six deliveries bowled brilliantly

by the seasoned Wiese. Asked to bat first, Oman were earlier bowled out for 109 in edition of the T20 World Cup 19.4 overs at the Kensington Oval. In reply, Namibia were also stopped at the same team score with Jan Frylinck making 45 in 48 balls and Mehran Khan taking 3/7 to force a Super Over.

This was after Namibia's South Africa-born left-arm fast bowler Trumpelmann created

history. The 26-year-old achieved the feat when he dismissed opener Kashyap Prajapati and Oman skipper Aqib İlyas for golden ducks on the first two balls of

the match. Khalid Kail top-scored for

Oman with 34 in 39 balls. Trumpelmann took another wicket in his second over and returned with the career-best

figures of 4-21. He trapped Kashyap Prajapati leg before wicket with an inswinging yorker on the first ball of the match and then dismissed Ilyas with one that crushed onto the batter's toes. In the process, Trumpelmann also registered the best figures for the team in T20 World Cup history. He beat the previous record of 3/17 set by him

held in the UAE. After sending back Prajapati and Ilyas off successive balls, Trumpelmann dismissed opener Naseem Khushi and then returned to pick up the wicket of Kalemullah at the death for his fourth scalp.

Wiese too was among wickets, returning fine figures of 3/28 in 3.4 overs as Oman found it hard to tackle the Namibia

bowlers. However, defending a small total, Oman bowlers showed a

lot of discipline and refused to go down without a fight, eventually managing to tie the

game. But, on the day, Nambia

had the last laugh.
While many thought Namibia captain Erasmus would hand the ball to Trumpelmann to bowl the Super Over, he chose the 39-year-old Wiese for his years of experience and it paid dividends.

After the nervy win, Player of the Match Wiese, who was also born in South Africa, said, "Aged a couple of years tonight. Don't have a lot of years left in me (laughs). It was emotionally draining evening."

Speaking about batting and bowling in Super over, "It helped that I had a feel of the game and knew if I get a few hits out in the Super Over .... Then with the ball, felt like taking the ball and executing.
"Pitch was difficult, didn't play the way we thought. But we adapted well. It was two-paced, it was a difficult wicket to get vourself in. Definitely one you needed to spend a bit of time before capitalising."

Namibia were on course to chase down the target of 110 until Mehran Khan (3/7) brought Oman back into the contest with his two wickets in the final over.

Afghanistan batters have developed skills and confidence of chasing down big totals and the team has ceased to rely on their bowlers for pulling off favourable results, captain Rashid Khan expressed on Monday.
Afghanistan, who have relied

on their world-class spinners more often than not, have been bolstered with the rise of the explosive

Rahmanullah Gurbaz, Ibrahim Zadran and Azmatullah Omarzai.

"That is something in the past. We were struggling a little bit in the batting area. Earlier, the bowlers would do a lot more and help us win the games," Rashid said on the eve of Afghanistan's T20 World Cup

opener here against Uganda.

"Later on, we got those youngsters — especially from Under-19 — the way they came up to the national side, the way they have worked hard and got the opportunity to play for Afghanistan at a very young age, and then start

exploring all around the world (while) playing the leagues, where they got better and better," he added. Rashid feels with a mix of talent, skills and the right mindset, anything is possible. "We have that kind of batting line-up where we can say, 'it's fine if there is 200 as well on the wicket," he said. "We have that kind of ability, skills and talent where we can express (all) that on the ground

"We're just focusing on one game at a time and making sure we do the right things and take the right decisions at the right time. That's something I think is going to help us, and

(we) don't (need to) think about the next round a lot. That's something which is an extra pressure I feel like to be as a player."

With slow pitches expected in the West Indies, many have picked Afghanistan to make the semifinal given their arsenal of high-class spinners.

Pachid is delighted that Rashid is delighted that Afghanistan are not

considered minnows anymore. "They have mentioned Afghanistan is going to be there for semis. We take that as a very positive sign. Before, it used to be hard for us to qualify. "You never know what's going to be the behaviour of the wicket. You have to react to that. You shouldn't be someone (who is) already having in the mind, this is how it's going to be (or) this is how it's going to swing, spin, things like that. But for us, it's like we're well
