Future of Rushikonda mansion in limbo after change of govt

PNS VISAKHAPATNAM

The fate of a sprawling mansion on Rushikonda beach, constructed during the YSR Congress Party's tenure to serve as the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), hangs in the balance following a dramatic political shift in Andhra Pradesh. The mansion, a key part of the controversial threecapital plan, now faces an uncertain future. The recent electoral victory of the TDPled NDA, which has pledged to develop Amaravati as the sole capital of Andhra Pradesh, has effectively scrapped the proposal for decentralising the State's capital. The mansion, part of a larger Rushikonda development project, includes seven structures spanning 9.88 acres. Initially, a three-member IAS officers' committee had endorsed the site for its strategic and security benefits.

The YSRCP administration, advocating for decentralised development, invested around Rs 500 crore in the project. This included the demolition of the popular Haritha Beach Resorts, managed by the

Andhra Pradesh Tourism Development Corporation (APTDC), to make way for the new structures. However, legal challenges have since hindered the establishment of an executive capital in Visakhapatnam, with ongoing cases in the National Green Tribunal and the Supreme

In the wake of the election results, TDP supporters forcibly entered the mansion,

which was previously off-limits to the public, and raised their party flag. This act has fuelled widespread speculation regarding the future of the newly constructed buildings near GITAM Deemed University and Gayatri

Haritha Beach Resorts, known for offering panoramic views of the Bay of Bengal, was a significant tourist attraction. Rushikonda beach itself,

recognised with the presti-gious Blue Flag for meeting international environmental standards by the Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE), is also part of the Government of India's Beach Environment and Aesthetics Management (BEAMS) project.

EAS Sarma, a prominent social activist and former IAS officer, has been vocal in his criticism of the previous government's environmental policies. Speaking to The Pioneer, he said, "The previous government caused significant envi-ronmental damage at Rushikonda, violating environmental laws for the CMO, despite clearance only for a tourism structure, which failed judicial scrutiny."

"Ironically, the earlier TDP government's unilateral decision to establish a grandiose capital at Amaravati also compromised the environment," he added.

Non-bailable arrest warrant against K'taka ex-CM Yediyurappa

A Bengaluru court on Thursday issued a non-bailable arrest warrant against former Chief Minister and senior BJP leader B S Yediyurappa in a POCSO case. The Special Investigation Team of the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) had moved the First Fast Track court seeking an arrest warrant against him since he failed to appear for questioning on Wednesday.

Yediyurappa had sought time to join the probe. The BJP veteran, who is also a member of the party's parliamentary board, is presently in Delhi, and he is likely to join the probe after he returns, sources close to him have said.

According to police, Yediyurappa has been booked under the POCSO Act and Section 354 A (Sexual harassment) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) based on a complaint by the mother of a 17-year-old girl who alleged that he molested her daughter during a meeting on February two this year, at his residence in Dollars Colony here.

The victim's brother had filed a petition in the court earlier this week alleging that though the case was registered on March 14, no progress has been made in the investigation.

Kuwait vows to promptly investigate the incident

Kuwait Thursday said authorities have identified the bodies of 45 Indians and three Filipino nationals killed in the tragic fire incident in a building housing Kingdom vowed to promptly investigate the incident and assured full support in repatriating the mortal remains of the victims.

At least 49 foreign workers were killed and 50 others injured in the fire on Wednesday at the seven-storey building where 196 migrant workers were staying in the southern city of Mangaf.

Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousuf Al-Sabah, serving as the First Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Interior, and Minister of Defence, said that authorities have identified 48 bodies, among which 45 are of Indians and three are of Filipino nationality, English language daily Arab Times reported.

The efforts are still underway to determine the identity of one remaining body, said the first deputy prime minister.

Kuwaiti authorities are conducting DNA tests on the bodies of those killed in the devastating fire incident in southern Kuwait's Mangaf area and an Indian Air Force aircraft is on standby to bring back the Indians injured in the massive Kuwait for pro-active facilita- back to their homeland.

Allegations against VC Prasada Reddy trigger inquiry calls

Andhra University Vice-Chancellor Prof PVGD Prasada Reddy faces mounting accusations of mismanagement and political favoritism during YCP government's tenure. The allegations, centered around decisions purportedly influenced by the outgoing YCP government, have sparked widespread concern among educationists and the public alike.

Critics contend that Prasada Reddy's decisions have prioritised political gains over the university's global reputation. Accusations range from questionable appointments that allegedly violate the AP Universities Act and UGC regulations to administrative irregularities impacting the institution's academic integrity. The controversy has escalated with calls for a thorough inquiry into these allegations. Last year, the SC, ST, BC, and Minority Alumni Association took the matter to



the High Court through a Public Interest Litigation, seeking intervention by either a Lokayukta or a High Court Judge. Governor Abdul Nazir also forwarded complaints, underscoring the seriousness of the accusations against the Vice-Chancellor.

Among the specific grievances, it is alleged that Prasada Reddy appointed an under qualified individual from a private college as the temporary chair professor of the Ambedkar Study Center, raising questions about academic standards and due process. Additionally, concerns have been raised regarding administrative appointments, including the contentious

extension of tenure for Prof B Krishna Mohan, former Registrar, amidst procedural discrepancies.

Further complicating matters are allegations of irregularities in the appointment of adjunct and honorary professors, with claims that established protocols were disregarded in favor of expediency. One such decision involving the reallocation of faculty from aided degree colleges resulted in legal intervention and subsequent administrative challenges, adding financial strain to an already tumultuous situation. As the political landscape shifts with the prospect of a new govern-ment, stakeholders within the academic community are intensifying their demands for transparency and accountability. With the university's credibility at stake, there is a growing consensus for swift action to address these allegations and restore public trust in the institution's leadership

Newly elected MLAs favoured over seniority

The recent formation of the BJP-TDP-JSP coalition government in Andhra Pradesh, under Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu for his fourth term, has sparked considerable debate and dissatisfaction among senior leaders from North Andhra Pradesh. Traditionally, cabinet formations in the State have favoured political veterans, but this time, the selection process took a different approach, emphasising newly elected MLAs over seniority.

Notably, only a handful of MLAs from North Andhra, such as Kinjarapu Atchannaidu Naidu, Vangalapudi Anitha, and Kondapalli Srinivas, managed to secure ministerial positions. Figures like former minister Ganta Srinivasa Rao and BJP's P Vishnu Kumar Raju were expected to feature

in the cabinet lineup but were ultimately overlooked. Similarly, hopes were dashed for Gajuwaka MLA-elect Palla Srinivasa Rao, despite his strong electoral mandate. Senior TDP stalwarts like Velagapudi Ramakrishna Babu and PVGR Naidu, with longstanding contributions from Visakhapatnam constituencies, were also left out, signaling a departure from

past cabinet compositions. The new cabinet reflects a strategic shift towards appointing MLAs-elect rather than relying solely on seniority and past contributions. This move is seen as an effort to infuse fresh talent and potentially align the govern-ment's priorities with new faces from diverse backgrounds. However, it has also raised questions about the criteria used in the selection process and the implications for governance

Amidst speculation on the tenure of the newly appointed ministers—whether it will be the standard five years or a truncated two-and-a-half-year term-the decision-making rationale remains under scrutiny. Political analysts suggest that performance metrics and key result areas will likely dictate future reshuffles, potentially offering opportunities to sidelined leaders as the coalition progresses.

Sankar Rao, a final-year MA Political Science student at Andhra University, observed that although there was initial discontent among constituents and party loyalists, the inclusion of fresh faces from diverse backgrounds has been seen as a step towards achieving balanced regional development. Chief Minister Naidu's ambitious plans to establish Visakhapatnam as the State's financial hub add another layer of significance to the cabinet's composition.

Vegetable prices hit roof in Telangana

Prices may come down when fresh crop arrives at the market

Household budgets are taking a severe beating with vegetable prices rising by the day in Telangana. The rise in the vegetable price is attributed to shortage in supply. Vegetable crops had been hit by heatwave in the beginning and later by unseasonal rains.

The inflationary tendency of vegetables and other essential commodities hit the poor and middle classes. Very high tem-peratures during the summer and heavy rains lashing the Narayanapeta district led to vendors selling some vegetables at Rs 100 per kg and some others at Rs 80-90 per kg. The traders have been importing



Yadgir in Karnataka. Therefore, they pass on the incidental costs like the cost of transportation to the consumers and hence the very high price of vegetables in the open market.

The prices of the vegetables here are more by Rs 10 to Rs 20 in the open market when compared to their prices in

Rytu Bazaars. Bitter Gourd and green chillies sell at Rs 100 per kg, while the pries of ridge gourd and beans exceeded Rs 100 by Rs 20 (Rs 120 per kg). Capsicum is being sold at Rs 90 a kg, while long beans have

been priced at Rs 80 a kg. Cauli flower is also being sold at Rs 80 a kg. Beans seeds are being sold at Rs 200-240 a kg.
The Rytu Bazaars have no

variety of vegetables. They merely sell locally produced tomatoes, brinjals and spinach.

The prices will ease only when the Vanakalam vegetable crops arrives at the market. The South-West monsoon is active all over the state and farmers have been preparing the fields for cultivation of vegetables in the district. In Armoor of Nizamabad district, the prices

of vegetables have almost dou-

bled in a span of just one week. The high prices are attributed to shrinking of the area under cultivation of vegetable and green and leafy vegetable crops. The consumers were heard commenting that the prices of vegetables have almost been on a par with the prices of chicken and meat. In Khammam, the traders in Rytu Bazars have been selling vegetables at an exorbitant prices. Let alone speaking of high prices of vegetables in the open market.

The vegetable yield has gone down because of the high temperature in Khammam. The wholesale market imports 800-900 quintals of vegetables daily. Currently, the market imports only 400-500 quintals.

TN govt to operate LNG, CNG buses on experimental basis for select routes

ith an aim at reducing the environmental impact of running buses using diesel and to save costs, The Tamil Nadu government on Thursday launched CNG and LNG buses for select routes, on an experimental basis. The move to run buses using alternative fuels would enable the government to save 7-20 per cent on the total expenses, and reduce the carbon footprint of the state transport department. According to an official

release, about 1.76 crore people are served by the 20,160 diesel buses operated by the various transport corporations, every day. Nearly, 27 per cent of expenses incurred by the transport corporations account for fuels. Based on the orders of Chief Minister M K Stalin to use buses run on alternate fuels, Minister for Transport S S Sivasankar said that 14 buses using Liquified Natural Gas (LNG) and Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) would be operated by seven transport corporations, on an experimental basis.



Armed forces ready to face every challenge: Rajnath

The new government will focus on further bolstering national security by modernising the armed forces and significantly enhancing domestic defence production, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Thursday after taking charge of office.

China in eastern Ladakh. Reflecting growing salience of the Indian Ocean Region in India's defence calculus, Singh decided that he will undertake the first visit in his second term as defence minister to the Eastern Naval Command in Visakhapatnam to interact with the officers and sailors.

"Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, our aim will be to further strengthen the security apparatus of the country, with focus on achieving self-reliance in defence manufacturing," he

"Armed forces modernisation and the welfare of the soldiers, both serving and retired, will continue to be our main focus," he said.

National Security Advisor Ajit Doval called on Singh and is understood to have discussed issues relating to national security.

Singh was among the senior BJP leaders including Amit Shah, Nitin Gadkari and Nirmala Sitharaman who retained the ministries that they handled in the previous government.

He said the government will also focus on boosting India's defence production. "Defence exports had touched a record Rs 21,083 crore in financial Year 2023-24. It was historic. Our target will be to export over Rs 50,000 crore worth of defence equipment by 2028-2029," he said.

India rejects 'unwarranted' references to J&K in China-Pak joint statement

India on Thursday categorically rejected "unwarranted" references to Jammu and Kashmir in a latest joint statement by China and Pakistan and asserted that the Union territory and Ladakh have been, are and will always remain its integral parts.

The joint statement was issued in Beijing on June 7 fol-lowing talks between Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif

and Chinese Premier Li Qiang. India also criticised mentioning of projects under the so-called China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) in the joint statement and said New Delhi rejects any moves to reinforce or legitimise Islamabad's illegal occupation of territories.

The CPEC passes through Pakistan-Occupied-Kashmir. "We have noted unwarranted references to the Union territory of Jammu & Kashmir in the joint statement between

China and Pakistan of June 7. We categorically reject such references," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said.

"Our position on the issue is consistent and well known to the concerned parties. The Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and the Union Territory of Ladakh have been, are and will always remain integral and inalienable parts of India," he said.

Jaiswal was responding to a media query on the joint state-

"No other country has the locus standi to comment on the same," he said.

The China-Pakistan joint statement said the Pakistani side briefed the Chinese side on the latest developments in Jammu and Kashmir.

It said the Chinese side reiterated that the "Jammu and Kashmir dispute is left over from history, and should be properly and peacefully resolved in accordance with the UN Charter, relevant UN Security Council resolutions and bilateral agreements".



"Our study is like a photograph at a particular moment in time and what we see in that image is that participants more exposed to cold and heat show differences in a parameter -the mean diffusivity -- which is related to a lower level of maturation of the white matter," said Granes.


Previous studies have shown changes in mean diffusivity to be related with poorer cognitive function and mental health problems.





Looming catastrophe

The ongoing heat and water crisis across north India is claiming lives, and there is no relief in sight

serious heat and water catastrophe that has already claimed lives and is threatening many more is plaguing the northern parts of India, including the Capital. An unfavorable weather pattern marked by extreme heatwaves and weak rainfall is making it worse. For millions of people, the situation is getting unbearable as temperatures rise and water supply becomes scarce. North India is experiencing one of the worst heatwaves in recorded history. Many locations have regularly seen temperatures above 45 degrees Celsius, with some recording considerably greater values. Many occurrences of heatstroke, dehydration and other heat-related ailments have been reported. There is an increased danger for vulnerable groups, especially for youngsters and the elderly. The number of people enduring the heat in hospitals is overwhelming, and the availability of healthcare resources is limited. Compounding these problems, the monsoon season has started abnormally slowly. Rain, which



usually provides much-needed relief, has been irregular and delayed. There are serious ramifications for both urban and rural communities from this delay. The lack of rain in cities like Delhi makes the heat unpleasant and living conditions nearly intolerable. The delayed monsoon in rural areas is disastrous for agriculture as it greatly depends on timely rainfall. Food security and livelihoods are expected to be threatened by crop failures and lower yields. There is severe water deficiency in northern India as a result of the heatwave and delayed monsoon. The levels of major rivers and reservoirs are perilously low, and groundwater has fallen.

Delhi's water supply is significantly impacted by the historically low levels of the Yamuna river; in fact, some areas get water for only a few hours a day. Concerns over waterborne illnesses have been raised, which has led to disputes over access to water and forced many people to rely on contaminated sources. Water rationing, the establishment of cooling facilities and the distribution of drinking water to communities badly impacted by the problem are just a few of the steps the administration has taken. However, because of the situation's seriousness, these actions have not seen much success. Long-term fixes are necessary to preempt disasters. This entails making investments in infrastructure for water conservation, such as effective irrigation systems and rainwater collection, as well as encouraging the groundwater resources to be used sustainably. To counter the urban heat island effect, green spaces and cooling strategies must be included in urban planning. Furthermore, raising people's knowledge of climate change and its effects helps promote a resilient culture. Millions of people are starkly reminded of their vulnerability in the face of climate change by the heat and water crises in north India. The people of this country continue to be its greatest strength as it fights this humanitarian and environmental crisis.

Time for BJP to set its house in order

he swearing in of Narendra Modi 3.0 is over and it is now business as usual. But there is an eerie uncertainty pervading across India as the BJP Government is dependent on the life-support system provided by the TDP's Chandrababu Naidu and the JD(U)'s Nitish Kumar.

The BJP had won 282 seats on

The speech delivered by M Venkaiah Naidu, former Vice-President, at the Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA) should be noted seriously. "There is a message in the election. I hope people understand the message. The ruling BJP failed to reach the majority mark in the Lok Sabha on its wn though it emerged as the single largest party while the Opposition put up an impressive performance," Naidu said. A discernible feature of this election was the absence of RSS volunteers from the campaign. What upset the RSS was the declaration made by party president JP Nadda that the BJP has no relation with the Bhagwa Dhwaj, the saffron flag that is emblematic of Sanatana Dharma. "Our flag was apparently created by lord Indra himself. The flag carries the saffron color of the lord. We chose the flag for our kingdom. The flag need to ensure that we live up to its representation," Shivaji, the great Maratha emperor, told his ministers and commanders. It is time for Nadda to move out of party presidentship. He has

Nadda should read and learn about two gentlemen from south India, K Kamaraj and S Nijalingappa, both former presidents of the Congress who were rated as titans of Indian politics. Public memory is not that short as they remember the efforts undertaken by Naidu to topple Modi in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. UNDER MODI 3.0 Modi's G7 debut amidst global turmoil underscores diplomatic finesse

In less than a week of assuming office as the Prime Minister for the largest democracy in the world, Mr Modi is back where he excels. He was in Italy this week, meeting the leaders from the powerful group of nations also known as the G7. On the sidelines were several bilateral meetings with leaders of African, and Arab nations, besides several clear messages to the primarily American and European groups lead-

This was PM Modi's first trip abroad, after assuming office for a third time (a remarkable feat in itself), where nearly 670 million voters patiently waited in queues under an extremely harsh summer sun over a period of nearly two months to choose the leader of the largest democracy. PM Modi and his party, despite setting ambitious expectations, could not manage a majority by themselves and are now dependent on a bunch of pre-poll alliance political parties to lead the National Democratic Alliance government. This assumes significance at a time when several parts of Europe, not to mention the US are going their own set of democratic churns. The US goes to poll end of the year, and voices on either side of the aisle, are getting harsher and louder. Similarly, the elections to the European Parliament have thrown a resurgence of far-right parties, which is likely to have an impact on the geopolitical dynamics for a long time. What Mr Modi may be comforted by is the fact that he may not need to look around for carefully worded diplomatic statements while explaining the state of Indian democracy to the Western nations.



In the past few years, several questions have been raised across the Western nations and in the US regarding the health of the Indian democracy, its report card on minority rights, religious freedom, the existence of the press etc. The near majority verdict, by the Indian electorate, with ample scope of checks and balances to keep the party with the highest seats under leash, a robust opposition presence in the parliament would be a clear talking point for the PM and his set of diplomats to set out a gold standard for democracy when engaging with several nations. Mr Modi, with his nearly three decades of experience as head of the state and nation, is not new to diplomacy and in several interviews, leading up to the general elections, has articulated his target of enhancing India's global image. The grand spectacle around G20 (not to forget backroom diplomatic negotiations to arrive at a joint statement), several high-level state visits, a bunch of rescue operations carried out for citizens and neighbours from war-torn areas, supply of emergency medicines during COVID are all pointers towards the focus the Prime Minister's Office attaches to global reputational management. PM's third-term visit to G7 assures continuity and explores fresh engagement strategies with current and potential allies, emphasizing continuity and innovation.

Mr Modis' visit to Italy comes at a time when the Ukraine war is unrelenting, and despite severe reluctance, there seems to be chinks in the united European approach towards the aggressor Russia. Many of them, would have, similar concerns regarding Israel's war on terror, which has refused to die down in months. It may be recalled that both Israel and Russia are close allies of India, and India has so far walked a tightrope when commenting on both of these volatile situations. The dynamics of the past relationship, while building deeper relations with recent allies such as the US are likely to be a sensitive diplomatic trope. It is no wonder, that PM Modi has picked up S Jaishankar, a seasoned diplomat as the External Affairs minister for a second term, to retain the continuity and foreign policy focus achieved during his last term. The evolving geopolitical landscape and India's role in global affairs would continue to

Populism cripples revival of discoms



The twin problems of AT&C losses and under-recoveries on sale to certain households or farmers in some States have existed for close to a quarter century

he Centre is planning to launch 'another' scheme to enable pub-lic sector power distribution utilities (discoms) to cut technical losses via "transition financing" of the required capital expenditure. The discoms stand at the core of the power supply and distribution network in the country. Mostly owned and controlled by State Governments, they buy electricity from the generating companies (call them gencos) in the public sector such as National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) etc and gencos in the private sector commonly referred to as independent power producers (IPPs) and supply to the consumers.

Technical losses to be more precise, the aggregate technical and commercial (AT&C) losses are a sophisticated nomenclature for leakage from the system or power theft. According to Union Power Minister RK Singh, AT&C's losses used to be high at 27 per cent. When, out of say 100 units of electricity that leaves the generating stations/power dispatch centre, 27 units are stolen and hence not paid for, this is bound to have a debilitating effect on the discoms' operations.

The discoms could charge more on sale of the balance 73 units to compensate for the 'nil' revenue on the 27 stolen units. But this is theoretical. So, the discoms would end up making a loss to the extent of revenue lost on stolen units. There is another potent factor that exacerbates their loss-

The Electricity Act (2003) and the Guidelines issued by the Ministry of Power require the discoms to fix the tariff on electricity supplied to consumers in a manner such that the average revenue realisation (ARR) from its sale is equal to the average cost of purchase, transmission and distribution (ACS). Yet under diktat from the State Government, either they don't bill certain households (HHs) at all (on consumption up to 200/300 units a month in Delhi/Punjab) or a flat subsidy of ₹800 on consumption (between 201 and 400 units a month in Delhi), besides free supply to farmers as in Punjab.

The discoms seek to make up for the resulting under-recoveries by charging more from industries and businesses for which the tariff can go up to a high of ₹16 per unit (this indeed is a major reason for making Indian products and services uncompetitive in both the domestic and international markets). While the States also promise to compensate for a good portion of the under-recoveries, most of them make only partial reimbursement and that too after considerable delay. This further adds to discom losses.

The twin problems of AT&C losses and under-recoveries on sale to HHs/farmers have existed for close to a quarter century. Since the beginning of 2000, the Centre has come up with four financial restructuring packages (FRPs) to help discoms. While, the first two (2002, 2012) merely sought to condone their losses, the third namely Ujwal DISCOM Assurance Yojana (UDAY) launched in November 2015 required discoms to set their house in order and achieve certain milestones in

exchange for financial assistance. Under ŬDAY, discoms' staggering debt of about ₹400,000 crore was condoned. Of this, while 75 per cent was taken over by the States, for the balance, they were allowed to issue bonds at a concessional rate of interest. In lieu of the FRP, discoms

losses from 20.7 per cent during 2015-16 to 15 per cent by 2018-19. Further, they were to reduce the ACS-ARR gap from ₹0.59 per unit of electricity during 2015-16 to 'zero' by 2018-19. But, the discoms failed to deliver.

During 2019-20, their AT&C loss-

es were 18.9 per cent against the 15 per cent target for 2018-19. The ACS-ARR gap during 2019-20 stood at ₹0.42 per unit against target of 'zero' for 2018-19. During 2020-21, even these limited improvements were reversed as ATC losses zoomed to 22.3 per cent and ACS-ARR gap ₹0.69 paise per unit. As a consequence, discoms losses which had decreased from ₹52,000 crore during 2015-16 to ₹17,000 crore during 2017-18 (courtesy, FRP) increased to about ₹30,000 crore during 2019-20 and further to ₹58,000 crore during 2020-21. Correspondingly, this has led to their ballooning debt which at the end of FY 2021-22, stood at ₹620,000 crore.

This prompted the Centre to come out with a fourth package called 'Reforms-Linked, Result-Based Scheme for Distribution' (RLRB-SD). The scheme was unveiled by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in her Budget speech for FY 2021-22. Involving an outlay of ₹300,000 crore, it was aimed at trimming discoms AT&C losses to 12-15 per cent and gradually narrow the ACS-ARR gap to 'zero' by March 2025. This was to be achieved by upgrading the distribution infrastructure and capac-

ity building, thereby improving the reliability and quality of the power supply. It had a provision for compulsory pre-paid and smart metering component to be implemented across the power supply chain, including in about 220 million households.

Apart from gross budgetary support (GBS) of close to ₹100,000 crore by the Centre, implementation of the Scheme involves funding by State-run sector-specific lenders; viz, Power Finance Corporation (PFC) and Rural Electrification Corporation (REC) under irrevocable

Government guarantee. The funds release is subject to discoms meeting the pre-qualifying criteria and achieving the basic minimum benchmark in reforms. The RLRBSD launched in FY

2021-22 talks of achieving the targets, which should have been achieved by 2018-19, by March 2025. This by itself is laughable. What about the progress? According to the Power Ministry, the Government has so far identified 57 discoms from 32 States and Union Territories under the scheme and has prepared detailed project reports (DPRs) for these. Further, in reply to a question in Parliament given by then Power Minister RK Singh in December 2023: "Till today, ĎPRs having total outlay of ₹120,000 crore has been approved for loss reduction works and ₹130,000 crore for smart metering works.'

Beyond this paperwork, as of January 2024, the total loan disbursed by PFC-REC under the States, while sanctioned amount was ₹133,000 crore.

As for the gross budgetary support, the release of funds by the Centre during FY 2023-24 was a mere ₹6,000 crore against budget allocation of ₹12,000 crore. That things are moving at a snail's pace may be seen from the fact that 'against the sanctioned smart meters of around 220 million, only about 0.8 million have been installed so far'. One wonders whether the money is being used by discoms to merely pay back the loans taken earlier to fund their recurring losses --- as happened under UDAY.

Now that the tenure of this scheme (launched in 2021-22) will end in just about 10 months on March 31. 2025, the Government is keen to launch its second version call it RLRBSD- II with similar aggregate outlay of ₹300,000 crore. Who knows, even the funds garnered under this scheme could end up being used to clear the continuous pile up of discoms' debt. The

vicious cycle continues. The problem is entirely political. In a bid to win elections (these are held round the clock), almost every political party promises sops which include, among others, power supply to farmers and poor households at throwaway price or even free; they even ignore theft happening in slums/jhuggis that promise votes en masse. They use discoms as 'guinea pigs' for achieving these populist goals.

The inclusion of President Muizzu is being interpreted as a good diplomatic move, especially when both nations currently have strained ties .It may be recalled that Modi invited leaders from the eight member States of the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) to his swearing-in ceremony in 2014. For his 2019 inauguration, the guests included leaders from the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIM-STEC), along with Mauritius and Kyrgyzstan.

The Modi-led Government will have its plate full of national and international issues, which will warrant



immediate attention and formulation of strategy and action plan. Experts feel that India must resolve the US threat to impose sanctions if the Chabahar Port deal with Iran was not scrapped. Interestingly, the US did not raise any objection when India took up the construction of the port because it suited the Afghanistan. But now that the US has moved out, it has no interest in the port.

Former Prime Minister Pt Jawaharlal Nehru's Indian National Congress achieved a remarkable victory, securing 44.7 per cent of the vote and winning 361 out of 494 seats in 1962. In contrast, the BJP, under Narendra Modi, won US owing to its occupation of 238 seats out of 543, with the ence. Regarding Pakistan,

NDA collectively securing 294 seats. Unlike the BJP, which relies on coalition partners like the TDP and others, the Congress under Nehru stood strong on its own. This scenario isn't unique to India. In Britain, leaders like Margaret Thatcher and Tony Blair also managed to secure three terms. However, managing a coalition Government with a thin majority presents its own challenges. The reduced strength can increase the bargaining power of smaller coalition partners.

The Modi Government's foreign policy has alienated neighbours like the Maldives, Nepal etc. Hence it needs a 'relook' as they have drifted towards China, which is using them to expand its influ-

India should respond to its initiative to have trade ties by keeping the political issues aside. The Sharif brothers may not be averse to it. China's expanding ties in the region are evident, and India needs to tread cautiously to counter its influence, as seen in the case of Nepal. The recent political shift in Nepal towards a communist Government ideologically aligned with China is concerning, especially considering China's 'Debt Trap' strat-

egy. Pakistan serves as a stark example, with China extending a massive debt of \$23 billion, a substantial portion of which is tied to the Belt and Road Initiative. Pakistan's mounting debt to China, totalling \$67.2 billion from

2000 to 2021, underscores the risks associated with this debt dependency.

Regarding neighbours, India needs to be worried as Maldives has already moved in the lap of China, and Nepal has also shown red flag as the communist Government led by Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda' has moved closer to China.

Modi will govern India for the next five years with a relatively weakened position but he has shown resolve to carry on economic reforms to make India a world power. In this backdrop, the Opposition is expected to play a constructive role in the interest of peo-

ple of the country.

The majority of the respondents feel that there has been no reduction in frauds despite multiple regulatory changes in India, a KPMG survey said on Thursday. KPMG in India conducted

a survey with more than 75 experts from the finance/ compliance domain in various organisations in the consumer markets sector (FMCG, consumer durables, agriculture, retail and e-commerce), covering questions about frauds and leakages faced by them.

As many as 79 per cent of the survey respondents said there has been no reduction in frauds despite regulatory changes, and only 21 per cent



responded by saying that frauds have been reduced due to the changes.

As per the survey, procurement, sales and distribution and e-commerce were voted as the major areas prone to fraud.

About 72 per cent of the respondents cited reputational damage as the most severe impact of fraud, whereas 16 per cent believed that financial losses would also impact

Around 61 per cent of the respondents believed that implementing a tech-based early warning signal mechanism is the most effective measure for detecting and mitigating fraud, as per the survey.

KPMG in India, Partner -Forensic Services, Mustafa Surka said the consumer markets sector is rapidly transforming and growing. Consequently, the frauds in the sector are also evolving, leading to substantial

leakages for organisations. "It is imperative for organisations to be agile and mitigate these leakages in a timely manner by investing in technology and developing a strong monitoring mechanism,"

Rampaging Rutherford powers West Indies into T20 World Cup Super 8

Sherfane Rutherford career-best unbeaten half-century before pacer Alzarri Joseph and left-arm spinner Gudakesh Motie ripped through the New Zealand line-up to steer West Indies into the T20 World Cup's Super Eight stage with a 13-run win here.

Rutherford came up with the innings of his life, smashing half a dozen sixes and two fours for his 39-ball 68 to lift West Indies to 149 for 9 from 76 for 7 in 12.3 overs after New Zealand opted to bowl in a virtual knock-out Group C

In reply, West Indies restricted the Kiwis to 136 for 9 with Rutherford's fellow Guyanese Motie returning with splendid figures of 3/25. Joseph turned up the heat lower down the order to become the wreckerin-chief with his 4/19.

With three wins in a row, the tournament co-hosts qualified for the Super Eight stage, while New Zealand's hopes were all

but over following back to

back losses. They had earlier lost to Afghanistan by 84 runs after being shot out for 75. The 2021 runners-up, among the most consistent sides in World Cups, have been found wanting this time.

They made the semi-final in the 2015, 2019 and 2023 editions of the ODI World Cup, and in 2016, 2021 and 2022, the Black Caps ensured a last-four appearance in the T20 World Cups. It was half past midnight in Trinidad but the locals erupted in the table to the locals enupted in the table to table to

in joy to celebrate their team's Super Eight qualification, erasing the disappointment of successive setbacks in the big event.

two-time former champions were eliminated in the Super-12 stage of the competition in UAE in 2021, while in 2022 in Australia, they failed to make the tournament proper and exited in the group stage.

But Rutherford had other ideas and played one of the best innings of his career.

The 25-year-old Guyanese allrounder hung around before turning up the heat in the final five overs, blasting five fours and two sixes

Rutherford brought up his 50 off the final ball of the 19th over and pounded 18 runs of it in all, leaving Mitchell Santner perplexed. Rutherford scored all 37 runs in the closing partnership with Motie which became a new 10th wicket record in the ICC

T20 World Cup history. In reply, New Zealand got off to a poor start and lost both their openers -- Devon Conway (5) and Finn Allen (26) -- in the powerplay.

Thereafter left-arm spinner Motie foxed the Kiwi batters finishing with a match-turning spell of 4-0-25-3 before Joseph turned on the heat with his four-wicket haul. Motie dismissed Rachin Ravindra after he ended up flicking straight to Russell at deep mid-wicket.

He bowled shorter and induced a faint edge from

Williamson, who looked to cut it away. The ball went straight into the hands of Pooran. Glenn Phillips kept the Kiwi hopes alive with his 33-ball 40 before being dismissed by Joseph.

New Zealand needed 33 runs from the last over and Mitchell Santner smashed three sixes off the first four balls but eventually fell short.

Nassau Stadium, home to tense T20 World Cup matches, set for demolition

The makeshift Nassau County cricket ground, which was built specifically for the T20 World Cup, is all set to be demolished after the New York leg of the event came to an end with India's sevenwicket victory over co-hosts USA here.

Built in just over 100 days, the stadium became notorious for its challenging drop-in pitches, which were sourced from Adelaide. The massive structure sat on the edge of the 930-acre Eisenhower Park in

Long Island here. The stadium had 10 drop-in pitches, four for the main ground and six for the adjacent training facility in Cantiague Park.

"After the last match is held at East Meadow on June 12, the stadium will be dismantled, the parts shipped back to Las Vegas and another golf event, and Eisenhower Park will return to normal, but with a report had stated a few days

The stadium that "almost popped up overnight" will be dismantled over a period of six weeks. It had a capacity of 34,000 and hosted a housefull crowd during India's marquee clash against Pakistan on June 9 with some tickets sold at an astronomical price of USD 2500 to USD 10,000.

India played four matches at the venue, including a warm-up game against Bangladesh after the ground was thrown open on June 1.

The drop-in pitches hosted eight matches and produced unpredictable and occasionally dangerous bounce, resulting in particularly low scores in the first two matches where no team crossed 100 runs.

In India's match against Ireland, who were bowled out for 96, Rishabh Pant and Rohit Sharma also copped body

It led to widespread criticism prompted and world-class cricket pitch left International Cricket Council behind," a New York Times to issue a statement

acknowledging that the pitches have not played consistently".

The highest successful chase at the venue was only 111 runs by India in their win over USA on Wednesday. Canada's 137/7 against Ireland

was the highest total recorded, while India successfully defended a low total of 119 against Pakistan. In a nail-biting match, South

Africa barely chased down 103 runs against the Netherlands losing six wickets in the process, and later defended 113 runs against Bangladesh, winning by a narrow margin of

four runs. The venue was finalised by the ICC in 2023 and was built in just 106 days.

The playing field, with the rectangular pitch in the middle, was fashioned from special grass grown in Florida. "The grandstands borrowed materials most recently used at Las Vegas's Formula 1 race professional golf events," the NYT report added.

The spinners were not needed as much in New York but once vou enter the second leg for the Super Eight, the spinners have had a big role in the West Indies. Our spinners will come into play now," he added. Chawla picked Kuldeep as his

first choice even though Chahal finished the Indian Premier League (IPL) as one of the most successful bowlers. "To be very honest only one will play, and I think Kuldeep will be the first preference because of what he has done in the last one and a half years.


