#### **NEET-UG ISSUE CBI files FIR over** alleged irregularities

The CBI filed an FIR on Sunday in connection with alleged irregularities in the medical entrance exam NEET-UG held on May 5 on a reference from the Union education ministry, amid countrywide protests and litigation by students for a probe into paper leak claims.

Officials said the ministry alleged in a complaint, now part of the FIR, to the agency that "certain isolated incidents" occurred in a few states during the conduct of the examination.

Giving top priority to the case, the CBI has sent special teams to Godhra and Patna, where cases of question paper leaks have been registered by police, they said.

# **CRDA leads Capital works' revival**

#### Central govt organisations plan to establish offices in Amaravati

The Andhra Pradesh Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA) is playing a pivotal role in the revival of Amaravati's capital works, which have been progressing swiftly since the TDP-led NDA government took office in the State. Several Central government sector organisations are planning to establish offices in the Amaravati region, and efforts are underway to allocate space for them.

The State government is focused on the timely reconstruction of Amaravati. Efforts have intensified to set up several Central government sector organisations in the capital region. CRDA officials are consulting with the Central government organisations that were allotted land between 2014 and 2019. Reports indicate that officials have contacted these organisations to discuss their plans regarding the land allotted during the previous TDP government.

Some Central organizations have requested CRDA officials to show them the allocated spaces, while representatives of these organisations mentioned that they had not been contacted during the previous government's tenure. Additionally, National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD), State Bank of India (SBI), Union Bank, Canara Bank, Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC), Indian Oil, Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL), and Gas Authority of India Limited (GAIL) have expressed interest in setting up offices in Amaravati.

Upon assuming office as the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Chandrababu Naidu prioritised the rapid development of Amaravati. He visited the Polavaram project to assess the pending work and then inspected the ongoing construction in Amaravati.

During his field visit, Chandrababu Naidu personally examined the constructions that were neglected by the previous government and expressed concern over the deteriorated state. He visited Uddandarayunipalem, where Prime Minister Narendra Modi had laid the foundation stone for the capital. Chandrababu also inspected the houses built for MLAs, MLCs, All India Service officers, High Court judges, ministers, gazetted and non-gazetted officers, and the apartment complexes for fourth-class employees.

The Chief Minister emphasized that in Andhra Pradesh, "A" stands for Amaravati and "P" stands for Polavaram. He added that Amaravati will remain the people's capital, where the youth can confidently work without needing to migrate to other states in search of

## Man from AP shot dead in USA

A pall of gloom descended on Yajali village in Karlapalem mandal of Bapatla district as Dasari Gopikrishna, a native of Yajali, was killed in a shootout in the ÚSA on Saturday. The 32-year-old was shot dead at a convenience store in a gas station in Dallas.

Police identified the victim as Dasari Gopikrishna from Andhra Pradesh's Bapatla district. His family, friends, and relatives were devastated by learning about his death. He is survived by his wife and son.

Gopikrishna had gone to the US only eight months ago and was working at the Mad Butcher grocery store in Fordyce, a small town in Arkansas, where a gunman opened fire, killing him. Gopikrishna, a native of Yajali in Karlapalem mandal, had completed his engineering at a private college before moving to the US in search of a job. He was staying with a relative and working at the supermarket when the incident in the early hours of Sunday.

#### **Kejriwal moves SC** against HC's interim stay on bail

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has moved the Supreme Court against the Delhi High Court's interim stay on a trial court's order granting him bail in a money-laundering case linked to the alleged excise scam.

The high court on Friday paused the release of the embattled chief minister after the trial court granted him bail on June 20.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convenor, who was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on March 21, could have walked out of Tihar Jail on Friday had the high court not granted the interim relief to the federal antimoney laundering agency.

"Till the pronouncement of this order, the operation of the impugned order shall remain stayed," a vacation bench of the high court said and asked the parties to file written submissions by June 24. The high court said it was reserving the order for two-three days as it wanted to go through the entire case records

It also issued a notice to Kejriwal seeking his response to the ED's plea challenging the trial court's June 20 order by which he was granted bail.

# Lokesh slams allocation of govt land by Jagan

## Amarnath in centre of storm over illegal construction

Former minister Gudivada Amarnath is at the centre of a growing controversy over an unauthorized construction in Gajuwaka, raising serious questions about regulatory adherence and the misuse of political influence during his tenure with the YCP. This incident has exposed potential favouritism and double standards within the municipal regulatory framework.

During the YCP regime, GVMC officials swiftly demolished

a building owned by the current TDP state president and Gajuwaka MLA Palla Srinivasa Rao for similar regulatory violations. In stark contrast, these same officials have ignored the unauthorized structure built by Amarnath, sparking accusations of biased enforcement and undue favouritism.

Amarnath's property, a 400-yard plot near the highway at Chattivanipalem, was under an online application for a commercial complex less than two years ago. Despite paying the required application fee, the approval ocess stalled due to the incomplete Road Development Plan (RDP). The proposed site is part of an 80-meter road expansion master plan, requiring a GVMC survey and potential compensation for landowners.



However, Amarnath proceeded with construction without the necessary approvals.

The building violates several regulations, including a mandatory 20-foot front setback and

back violations, and building additional floors without approval. Amarnath allegedly contacted a key GVMC official, instructing the town planning team to disregard these violations. This issue has resurfaced after YCP's loss of power and Amarnath's electoral defeat in Gajuwaka. The contrasting enforcement actions are stark. MLA Palla Srinivasa Rao complied with all regulatory require-

ments for his shopping complex,

the inherited 400-yard plot, paid all necessary fees, and registered the land for road widening. As GVMC faces mounting pressure to act, the community is closely monitoring to see if the corporation will enforce regulations impartially or continue to exhibit double standards.

The Gujarat government, meanwhile, issued a notification on Sunday, handing over the probe to the CBI. Additional Chief Secretary A K Rakesh issued the notification handing over the case registered at the Godhra Taluka police station on May 8 under IPC sections related to criminal conspiracy, cheating and criminal breach of trust among others. The central agency plans to take over the investigation of the cases registered by the police in Gujarat and Bihar, the officials said.

The CBI action came a day after hand over the probe into the alleged irregularities to the central agency, a demand raised by a section of protesting students. "The ministry of education has requested the CBI to conduct a comprehensive investigation into the entire gamut of alleged irregularities, including conspiracy, cheating, impersonation, breach of trust and destruction of evidence by candidates, institutes and middlemen," a CBI spokesperson said.

## Funds released for development of Guntur misused: Pemmasani

## Diarrhoea outbreak: 168 cases registered in State

#### Jaggayyapet alone accounts for 58 cases

A total of 168 diarrhoea cases have been reported across 23 villages in Andhra Pradesh, with 58 cases registered in Jaggayyapet alone. Health department officials are working to control the situation.

On Sunday, officials visited the Social Health Centre in Jaggayyapet, where diarrhoea victims are receiving treatment. They inspected the drinking water supply systems and discussed treatment protocols and water supply issues with the locals.

Deputy Chief Minister K. Pawan Kalyan conducted a comprehensive review of the diarrhoea outbreak, stating that immediate actions are being taken at the field level, alongside long-term planning nels, pipeline leaks due to contaminated.

efforts. Since the onset of the drainage water, and the divermonsoon season, 168 cases have been reported in 23 villages, including Kakinada, Guntur, and Jaggayyapet in the NTR district. Of the 58 cases in Jaggayyapet, 14 people have been discharged, while the rest are still undergoing treatment in hospitals.

Authorities assured that full treatment is being provided to the victims. They identified contaminated water as the primary cause, citing issues

# Vizag faces uncertainty as Smart City

As the Smart City Mission initiated in 2015 approaches its end of June this year, the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) finds itself grappling with uncertainties regarding the future management of key projects that have significanty enhanced the city's infrastructure and identity.

The Smart City Mission, a flagship initiative aimed at fostering sustainable urban development and improving qualiof life, initially included Visakhapatnam among its first 20 cities nationwide. Over the past decade, substantial investments from both the central and state governments totalling Rs. 100 crores annually each, along with corresponding contributions from local bodies, have been directed towards transforming designated areas into 'smart' zones.

Under the oversight of the Greater Visakha Smart City Limited (GVSCL), jointly established by the central and state authorities, numerous



projects have been undertaken. These include the development of smart roads at Coastal Battery, Jagadamba Junction, Peda Waltair, and Park Hotel Junction as the focus for Area Based Development (ABD). This initiative includes the installation of smart roads, advanced lighting systems, continuous water supply, and the establishment of a City Operation Center (Command Control Room) at the GVMC

headquarters.

These measures aim to proactively detect and mitigate disasters, along with the deployment of smart poles, floating solar panels at Mudasarlova reservoir, intelligent traffic signals, CCTV surveillance, and smart amenities in 27 high schools.
In total, 51 projects have

been initiated, including solar rooftops on 12 GVMC build-ings, the restoration of the old

municipal office and town hall in One Town as heritage sites, and smart bus shelters. The estimated cost for these developments is approximately Rs 2000 crores, implemented across phases. While some projects are nearing completion, the government's tenyear timeline for these initiatives concludes at the end of this month

Despite significant progress, concerns loom large as the

Smart City Mission draws to a close. There has been no clear directive from the central government regarding the transiongoing projects post-June. Officials fear that the burden of continuing these initiatives may disproportionately fall on the GVMC, given the lack of clarity on financial support and operational guidelines.

GVSSL, responsible for proect management throughout the mission's tenure, currently expends approximately Rs 10 crores annually, primarily towards the maintenance of heritage structures and operational costs of the City Operation Center.

With several projects still underway or awaiting completion, the absence of a clear roadmap for post-mission governance poses a pressing challenge. In response to these uncertainties, GVMC officials have sought clarification from the state government, urging prompt intervention to ensure sustainable management and funding mechanisms beyond the mission's stipulated timeline.

# National Emergency: No, never again!

e cannot forget the Emergency in India. It was a dark period when most newspapers went blank and there was no freedom of speech or expression. Nowadays draconian pieces of legislation like the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, of 1967 also remind one of the

Emergency days.
Our country was in a black phase for 21 months -- from 1975 to 1977, when a state of emergency was declared for political purposes. Then President Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed had used his power under Article 352 of the Constitution claiming that there was a need for it because of the prevailing "internal disturbance". That Emergency was in effect from 25 June 1975 to 21 March 1977; i.e. 49 years back and it was the darkest time for the spirit of our Constitution. The clamp-

ing of Emergency was not done under a valid law, but as per the decree of then Prime Minister. It allowed elections to be cancelled and civil liberties to be suspended. Can anybody cancel Fundamental Rights? Imposition of Emergency amounts to arbitrary authority to kill, or imprison for an unreasonable time, as people witnessed during the days of Emergency. The dark theme of the Policy was to arrest political opponents, imprison media personnel, and censor newspapers. The censorship ended on 21st March 1977 but scores of journalists were detained while media voluntarily observed censorship. The authorities could exercise the 'right' to kill, despite Article 21.

Indiscriminately many members of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) were arrested; their houses were raided, including those of popular leaders like the general secretary of the CPI (M) Sitaram Yechury, Prakash Karat, and others leading the Students Federation of India. Many others like Pinarayi Vijayan, present-day Chief Minister of Kerala, were arrested too. During the Emergency, the police used third-degree methods on innocent people and brave

even killed as in the case of the Kerala student P. Rajan. It was the total manifestation of unfettered power and blatant violation of human rights.

The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh -- RSS was leading the people all over India. The police clamped down on RSS and thousands of its workers

were imprisoned. Besides RSS, many defied the 'draconian act' and participated in Satyagraha (peaceful protests) against the ban and fought against the curtailment of Fundamental Rights. The newspapers and literature were heavily censored while agitators clandestinely published and distributed material on a large scale and funds were collected for the movement.

#### Attack on the Constitution in the name of unity

There have been two attacks on the Constitution through the 42nd Amendment in 1976 and in 2014. The 42nd Amendment changed the description of India from a 'sovereign democratic republic' to a 'sovereign, socialist secular democratic republic'. The Act also changed the words 'unity of the nation' to 'unity and integrity of the nation'. They added some more words to the original Preamble. It was called Mini-Constitution.

Most of the significant provisions of the Constitution were sought to be changed. It looked as if the entire Constitution was re-drafted, destroying the principles incorporated by the Constituent Assembly before 1950 under the leadership of B R Ambedkar.

#### The Forty-Second Amendment

Every provision was serious, whether it was done to remove or add something to change the Constitution. For instance, it sought to amend the Preamble and articles leading to Fundamental Rights, 31, 31C, 39 and significantly disturbed several articles including Emergency provisions. With these amendments, though called the 'Amendment Act' it almost redrafted Ambedkar's basic statute through the Forty Second Amendment besides significant distortions as ratified by more than half of the State Legislatures, turned 'Mini' Constitution without basic

#### Reaffirmed the Preamble with secularism

In the Keshavanada Bharti case in 1973, the apex court confirmed the secular nature of the Constitution. Among the 'basic features', as expounded by Justice Khanna, are the Fundamental Rights guaranteed to individuals by the Constitution. In 1983, the Supreme Court said that an official of the government should not join religious activities while on duty and not use public funds for that purpose. In 1994, SC emphatically reaffirmed the importance of secularism as explained in the Preamble, whether because of the 42nd Amendment or with-

"The anniversary is a reminder why terrorism should never be tolerated," he added. The 'Kanishka' flight exploded 45 minutes before it was to have landed at London's Heathrow Airport on June 23, 1985, killing all 329 people on board, most of them Canadians of Indian descent.

Jaishankar's comments came two days after India strongly objected to Canadian parliament observing "one minute silence" in memory of Khalistan extremist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, who was gunned down in British Columbia in

In an unusual move, the Canadian parliament observed "one minute silence" to mark one year of the killing of Nijjar.

Nijjar, who was declared a terrorist by India, was shot dead outside a gurdwara in British Columbia on June 18 last year. India has been insisting that the Canadian authorities must take action against those advocating violence.

The relations between the two countries came under severe strain following Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegations in September last year of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in Nijjar's killing.

## West Bengal not consulted over Ganga water treaty with Bangladesh: TMC

The ruling Trinamool Congress in West Bengal on Sunday criticised the Centre for not consulting the state before taking the decision to start negotiations with Bangladesh for the renewal of the 1996 Ganga Water Sharing

The criticism by the TMC comes a day after talks were held between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina on a range of issues including the treaty.
TMC's Parliamentary Party

Leader in Rajya Sabha, Derek O'Brien, said the state is a party to the treaty, but was not consulted

Farakka-Ganga treaty is being renewed without consulting West Bengal, he said.

"The state is a party to the treaty. Even our dues for the previous treaty have not been cleared," O'Brien told reporters here. Dredging of the Ganga

has been stopped. It is the primary reason for floods and erosion. This is a plan to sell off Bengal," he alleged. Prime Minister Modi on Saturday announced India

## Man cremates 'wife' in Gorakhpur, finds her alive 600 km away located her at the address

A man who cremated his 40year-old "wife" four days ago in this Uttar Pradesh district was reunited with her after she was found alive about 600 kilometres away in Jhansi, police said on Sunday.

Ram Sumer (60), a resident of Bansgaon in Gorakhpur, lodged a complaint that his wife Phoolmati had gone missing on June 15. Four days later, on June 19, a woman's body was found in the Uruva Bazaar area. Sumer identified the body as that of his wife and completed the last rites, the

police said. However, the case took a mysterious turn after her postmortem revealed that the woman had been strangled to death, prompting a further

To nab the suspected killer, the police traced Phoolmati's mobile phone, which was found active about 600 kilometres away in Jhansi.

Call records showed frequent communication between

Phoolmati and a number belonging to one Shubham from Sultanpur.

When questioned, Shubham told the police that Phoolmati was alive and he had brought her to Jhansi. The police subsequently

## Friend in need

Both India and Bangladesh stand to beneficially feed off each other with the new tranche of agreements

lew Delhi and Dhaka have signed a comprehensive bunch of collaborations that includes pledging to begin negotiations on a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), deciding to launch a medical e-visa facility for Bangladeshis and agreeing to send a technical team to discuss the Teesta river watersharing, besides announcing the opening of an Assistant High Commission in Rangpur. Additional goodies in the bouquet include new train and bus services, export of 40 MW power to Bangladesh via the Indian grid, an inland container depot at Sirajganj and 350 training slots for Bangladeshi police officers. For India, four major imperatives have significantly driven the nation's increased strategic engagement with Bangladesh: Improving the country's economic standing, attending to the healthcare requirements of Bangladeshis, increasing India's presence in the region and attempting to counter China's increasing influence in Bangladesh. In office since 2008 and earlier heartily praised for



leading her country's economic and social development, Bangladesh's Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is now facing difficulties in post-pandemic recovery. Her plan to use the bilateral relationship to address these issues includes the outreach to New Delhi in a major way. It makes sense that New Delhi is responding to her advances with a bit more warmth than usual this time, in part because of Beijing's looming shadow in the background. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Bangladesh PM Sheikh Hasina deepened their partnership with a "futuristic vision" for transformative cooperation during the latter's two-day visit to India from June 21.

India holds a special place in Bangladesh's history, particularly owing to the 1971 Liberation War wherein India played a key role. However, relations between the nations became tense during military rule in the mid-1970s, marred by anti-India sentiment. But the shared history has helped forge a strong bond, with Modi's tenure since 2014 giving a new fillip to bilateral ties. Earlier, a significant shift occurred in 1996, when Hasina took over as the Prime Minister for the first time; since then, bilateral relations have steadily improved. Since 2019, the two leaders have met on 10 occasions, ushering in an era of remarkable transformation and strengthening bonds. Prime Minister Hasina, who began her fourth consecutive term in January 2024, joined six other world leaders at Modi's swearing-in ceremony on June 9, 2024. However, challenges persist, such as border management, illegal migration, the National Register of Citizens, Rohingya and river water sharing, necessitating ongoing dialogue. Bangladesh has established an island for the persecuted Rohingyas and seeks India's help in persuading Myanmar to repatriate the displaced minorities. The Modi-Hasina partnership has the potential to further cement India-Bangladesh relations, navigating these challenges and leveraging their shared vision for mutual prosperity.

Naidu's comeback will redefine Andhra's future

After being sidelined for over two decades, Naidu's resurgence signals a major shift in the State's politics and sets the stage for a renewed focus on development

he recent swearing-in of Nara Chandrababu Naidu as Andhra Pradesh's Minister was a significant event for Naidu personally, his Party and Indian politics. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other top BJP leaders witessed the 74-year-old politician taking the oath for the fourth time, marking a significant political comeback.

Despite being marginalised in State and national politics for over two decades, Naidu is grateful for his new role. He has once again proven that one should never underestimate a politician until they are out of the game.

He has served as the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh multiple times, overseeing significant development projects and facing controversie Throughout it all, Naidu kept up his unwavering spirit. Naidu has announced that the 2024 election will be his last, a move intended to emotionally appeal to voters while grooming his son Lokesh as his successor. This strategic deci-

other parts of the State. In his fourth term, Naidu should avail the opportunity to bring back the importance of Andhra Pradesh, once the country's rice bowl. Naidu's top priority is securing additional funds for Andhra Pradesh, which is a crucial step towards the State's development. Naidu's vision for Andhra Pradesh's development includes reviving long pending irrigation projects like the Polavaram project to boost the State's agricultural sector. With his Party's support, Naidu is determined to maximise the State's resources

and drive development. 'We are not negotiating on the composition of the Narendra Modi cabinet when it comes to State interests," was his response to a question about the TDP securing only one cabinet minister and one Minister of State in the Modi cabinet. However, they still

hope to secure more positions during the next expansion. The second important task is to build the Andhra Pradesh State capital, Amaravati. His predecessor, Jagan Mohan Reddy, suspended this ambitious project during his two terms. Now that Babu is back in charge, he aims to complete Amaravati. he will put pressure on the Centre to secure funds for building capital, various new projects and his six welfare schemes. Being a show-

man, he would like to project Amaravathi as a model capital. The State is facing a severe financial crisis. There is a significant shortage of funds, with a total debt of around Rs 14 lakh crores, including Rs 12 lakh crore borrowed from various sources and pending bills

of Rs 1.5 lakh crore. During his four decades of political career, Naidu, aged 74, has proved himself a survivor. He was much ahead of his time in his first and second terms. He projected himself as a forward-thinking, pro-technology and tech-savvy Chief Minister. The atmosphere is excellent, as Naidu has the comfort of a kingmaker. Being part of the Modi Government gives him a chance to share power. He has no opposition in the Assembly, with YSRCP reduced to just 11 seats.

The TDP needs to address the issue of reservations for Muslims. This topic could lead to conflicts with the BJP. Naidu's positive relationship with Modi is expected to last a year, after which they could pressure the Government on this issue. Additionally, the TDP must resolve the corruption case as Naidu is currently out on bail. His conduct in his fourth term is crucial for his future and that of his son Lokesh.

In a world hustling and bursting with technological advancements every now and then, the way everyone engages with literature has undergone a significant transformation. The traditional means of reading a book have found themselves in tug-of-war with their digital and audio counterparts. Moreover, the production of physical books involves various materials and processes, including ink, chemicals and packaging materials, which can generate waste and pollution. E-books do not involve these manufacturing processes, thereby reducing the environmental footprint associated with production and waste disposal. While reading e-books requires electronic devices that consume energy, the environmental impact can be mitigated by using energy-efficient devices, renewable energy sources for charging and by considering the longer lifespan and potential reuse of electronic devices compared to physical books



But what depresses the most is when these e-books are available on devices such as a tablet or a phone resulting in the biggest sources of distraction and thereby reducing the focused reading time. Moreover such devices also offer multimedia enhancements (like videos or interactive elements), which can either enhance or distract from the reading experience, depending on individual preferences. Some people prefer the tactile experience of physical books.

Several research and studies reflect a complex interplay of factors influencing the preference for e-books versus physical books. Physical books tend to offer better comprehension, retention and a more comfortable reading experience, while e-books provide convenience, portability and cost efficiency. The choice between the two often depends on the specific needs and preferences of the reader. Instead of immersing oneself in a book, social media browsing encourages quick, fragmented reading of short posts or articles, which can ultimately diminish the habit of sustained, deep reading. The immediate gratification and constant novelty of social media can make reading books seem less appealing or rewarding by comparison.

Even when attempting to read, the temptation to check social media notifications or browse feeds can interrupt concentration and disrupt the

# Centralised testing faces credibility crisis



High costs, allegations of corruption and systemic inefficiencies underscore the need for a comprehensive overhaul of the 'One Nation, One Test' policy



he country needs to go back to drawing board on centralising entrance tests as the big ones - JEE, NEET, CUET and UGC-NET - are having far too many glitches and questions raised on the National Testing Agency (NTA). The NEET scam and NET cancellation

have shocked the youth and raises questions on credibility of the testing agency. Let the country note that within 48 hours of NEET results, four students took their own lives. Should not the country rethink on the One Nation-One Test? The tests are designed to make coaching redun-

Few have an idea of the cost of one NEET - National Eligibility-cum-Entrance (Undergraduate) Test, previously called Pre-Medical Exam. It costs over Rs 400 crore borne by the parents of 2406079 candidates registered for the 2024 exam at the rate of Rs 1700 fee per applicant. The system does not say how much is the profit for NTA. It is common knowledge that no entrance fee is fully spent. Should it not be considered as a tax on the unemployed knowledge seekers! There are approximately 108,915 MBBS seats available across 706 medical colleges for NEET 2024. Around 55,000 of these seats are in Government medical colleges; the rest are in private medical colleges. One wonders why private colleges are included which have a devious fee structure backed by severe capitation fees. The quality of faculty is also questionable. Of course, even newly set-up many State medical colleges too have such issues. Many even do not have a cardiologist or neurologist.

Add the cost of coaching, travelling and other expenses, together to cost quite a few hundred crores more, big drain on the economy plus parental and societal stress. The Kota coaching system has an estimated business of Rs 600 crore. There are reports that the UGC-NET having nine lakh aspirants was cancelled as there was paper leak. Each question paper was sold for Rs 5,000 for transfer

to the students' Telegram app. For NEET Rs 30-35 lakh per student was charged as alleged by a student witness, who got the paper with its answers a day before. It's possibly one of the biggest scams that spanned from Vadodara and Godhra to Patna and where not! It has sparked countrywide protests. No wonder the moves against generation of black money has not succeeded. Add to this the various recruitments stalled for scams, 13 in UP, many in West Bengal and the worst known VYAPAM in Madhya Pradesh. The irregularities are thriving with the highest

THE 2406079 and now pareits paid to be and more. Eight students from the same examination centre in Haryana who secured all-India rank (AIR) 62 to 69, had largely similar roll numbers. On 5 May 2024 at two NEET centres in Haryana, students received a wrong question-paper set, which was taken back after 25 minutes. A paper scam in Gujarat, featured a Vadodara-based coaching centre and at least 16 students who each paid Rs 10 lakh to pass the exam. Fresh accusations arose when news reports of a paper leak emerged only days after conduction of the competitive exam. A Godhra school teacher is accused of the NEET exam cheating scandal, Rs 7 lakh were found in his car, while cheques worth 2.50 crore were found from the office of the director of the coaching centre. Reportedly, this money

was given by the students.
"There is a perception of mismanagement by the NTA", says ABVP general secretary Yagyawalkya Shukla. BJP MP Rakesh Sinha calls for severe criminal action

against any nexus found between paper setter and coaching institutes. It has rattled everyone. The reality is the NTA does not have competence to hold the examinations as many professional autonomous institutions have been doing for decades. None could raise a finger against any of them, including the All India Institute of Medical Science. They also selected students with proper aptitude. An issue that has cropped up now with many of the national institutions with CUET in particular.

The only action against weeks after the NEET fiasco has been the are gateway to careers and future professional excellence. If it is mired with malpractices and money power, the future of the nation is at stake. Would those adapting devious methods could ever have ethical bindings! The implementation is shoddy. The NTA does not conduct the tests on its own. # **GST Council needs to** reconstitute three GoMs

The GST Council will have to reconstitute three Group of Ministers (GoM) under it as new ministers from 11 states joined the body on Saturday.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has said that in the 53rd GST Council meeting on Saturday, there were 11 new ministers from Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Mizoram, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Telangana and Tripura.

The 52nd GST Council meeting was held on October 7, 2023. With new ministers joining the council, the reconstitution of three GoMs on analysis of revenue from GST, boosting the real estate sector under GST, and GST system reforms are on the cards. While the GoM on GST rate rationalisation has already been reconstituted in February, making Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Chaudhary its convenor, the reconstitution of the other

The panel on GST on system reforms, under the convenorship of Pawar, has to be reconstituted with five new ministers from Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Chattisgarh, and Odisha.

#### SBI plans to open 400 branches in FY25: Chairman Khara

As part of the network expansion plan, State Bank of India (SBI) is planning to open 400 branches across the country in the current financial year. The country's biggest lender opened 137 branches last fiscal. Of the total, 59 new branches were rural launched. "Somebody asked me if 89 per cent of digital and 98 per cent transactions were happening outside the branch, whether the branch is required anymore. My answer is yes. It is still required because there are newer areas which are emerging," SBI Chairman Dinesh Kumar Khara told PTI in an interview. There are certain services like most of the advisory and wealth services that can be offered only from the branch, he said.

## Taxpayers can amend sales return form before GST payment

PNS NEW DELHI

GST taxpayers will now have the option to amend outward supply or sales return form GSTR-1 before payment of taxes for a month or quarter.
The GST Council in its meet-

ing on Saturday had recommended providing a new optional facility by way of Form GSTR-1A to facilitate taxpayers to amend the details in Form GSTR-1 for a tax period and/or to declare additional details.

GSTR-1A will, however, have to be filed before filing of return in GSTR-3B for the said tax peri-

This will facilitate the taxpayer to add any particulars of supply of the current tax period missed out in reporting in form GSTR-1 of the said tax period or to amend any particulars already declared in GSTR-1 of the current tax period (including those declared in IFF, for the first and second months of a quarter, if any, for quarterly taxpayers), to ensure that correct liability is

GST

auto-populated in GSTR-3B. Currently, GST taxpayers file outward supply return GSTR -1 by the 11th day of the subsequent month. Taxpayers with an annual turnover of up to Rs 5 crore can file GSTR-1 quarterly within the 13th day of the end of

the quarter. Sĥardul Amarchand Mangaldas & Co Partner Rajat Bose said this is a positive change recommended by the council from a compliance perspective and will facilitate ease of doing business.

Head & Partner, KPMG, said allowing revision of filings made in GSTR-1 is a good move to rectify clerical and inadvertent errors before the payment of taxes and curtailing unwarranted notices for reconciliation of disclosures in GSTR-1 and payment of taxes vide GSTR-3B.

"It'll be interesting to see the mechanism for a population of GSTR-2B for the recipient and the time gap available to the recipient for reconciling credits," Jain added.

BDO India Indirect Tax Partner Maulik Manakiwala said the introduction of Form GSTR-1A to report particulars which were missed during the submission of GSTR 1 indicates that through proactive consultation with industry, the government's intention is to simplify GST law and ease compliances for the

## DGFT, Revenue dept working on dedicated hubs to boost e-commerce exports

PNS NEW DELHI

In a bid to boost India's ecommerce exports, the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) is working with the Department of Revenue to establish designated e-commerce hubs across the country to streamline the process for online export shipments.

The country's e-commerce USD 2 billion as compared to China's staggering USD 350 billion, according to industry

The government aims at bridging the gap by establishing a supportive e-commerce ecosystem, they said.

"A lot of streamlining is required in this regard. We are working with the Department of Revenue to have designated e-commerce hubs so that clearance of goods happens fast," Director General of Foreign Trade Santosh Kumar Sarangi told PTI.

He said these hubs will have facilities like dedicated customs and security checks, allowing cleared parcels to proceed through a green channel at airports, eliminating the need for further inspec-

This approach mirrors best practices observed in other countries, Sarangi said.



He also pointed out that the e-commerce hubs will be built and maintained by private entities, while the government toms clearances.

In addition to expediting clearances, the proposed hubs would offer warehousing facilities, returns processing, labelling, product testing, and repackaging services.

This public-private partnership aims at creating a robust infrastructure for efficient e-commerce exports, the official said.

These hubs could function similarly to bonded zones, facilitating e-commerce exports, said Ajay Sahai, Director General of the Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO).

A report estimated that with policy reorientation, India's e-commerce exports could reach USD 350 billion by 2030.

Streamlining the export process through dedicated hubs is a crucial step in this direction, experts mentioned.

#### Adani drew Rs 9.26 cr salary in FY24 - lower than his executives, industry peers

India's second richest person Gautam Adani received a total remuneration of Rs 9.26 crore in the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024, lower than most industry peers as well as his own key executives. Adani, 61, drew salary from

He became the richest Asian in 2022 but lost that position after a damning report by US short-seller Hindenburg Research wiped out almost USD 150 billion of market value of his group stock at its lowest point last year.

## Electronic components demand to jump to \$240 bn by 2030

PNS NEW DELHI

Demand for electronic components and sub-assemblies is estimated to grow over five-fold to USD 240 billion by 2030, including includes some of the key parts like motherboard, lithium ion batteries, camera module etc that are largely imported, a CII report released on Sunday said.

The report recommends the government to come up with revised electronic components schemes with higher incentives in the range of 35-40 per cent to reduce dependence on imports.

"The demand for components and sub-assemblies stood at USD 45.5 billion to support USD 102 billion worth of electronics production in 2023. This demand is expected to scale to

USD 240 billion to support the ics production by 2030. Priority components and sub-assemblies, including PCBAs, are projected to grow at a robust CAGR of 30 per cent, reaching USD 139

billion by 2030," the report said. The report identifies components and sub-assemblies of batteries (lithium-ion), camera

modules, mechanicals (enclosures etc), displays and PCBs as high priority for India that cumulatively account for 43 per cent of the components demand in 2022 and is expected to grow to USD 51.6 billion by 2030.

These components have either a nominal production in India or are heavily import dependent. India can hardly afford to sustain this trend of nents.

"Similarly, PCBA is a high potential category for India since most of the demand is met by imports. This segment is expected to grow 30 per cent, leading to a demand creation of around USD 87.46 billion by 2030," the report said.

## As many as 458 infra projects hit by cost overrun of Rs 5.71 lakh crore

PNS NEW DELHI

As many as 458 infrastructure projects, each entailing an investment of Rs 150 crore or above, were hit by a cost overrun of more than Rs 5.71 lakh crore in May this year, accord-

ing to an official report. According to the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), which monitors infrastructure projects worth Rs 150 crore and above, out of 1,817 projects, 458 reported cost overruns and 831 projects were delayed.

The total original cost of implementation of 1,817 projects was Rs 27,58,567.23 crore, and their anticipated completion cost is likely to be Rs 33,29,647.99 crore, which reflects an overall cost overrun of over Rs 5,71,080.76 (20.70



per cent of original cost), the ministry's latest report for May 2024 showed.

According to the report, the expenditure incurred on these projects till May 2024 is Rs

1,707,190.15 crore, which is 51.3 per cent of the anticipated cost of the projects.

However, the number of delayed projects decreased to 554, provided the delay is calculated on the basis of the latest schedule of completion, it added.

Of the 831 delayed projects, 245 have overall delays in the range of 1-12 months, 188 have been delayed for 13-24 months, 271 projects for 25-60 months, and 127 projects for more than 60 months.

The average time overrun in these 831 delayed projects is 35.1 months. Reasons for time overrun, as reported by various project implementing agencies, include land acquisition, environmental clearance, financial issues, contractual/internal issues, manpower shortage and litigation issues.

I was instructed to make sure the audiences connected with every action I made in *Munjya*. It was truly becoming challenging for me." The *Marzi* fame doesn't end there: "Knowing the fascinating aspects of being a hairstylist in *Munjya* was something truly fascinating. I am quite capable in cutting hair! After that, I discovered Marathi, along with its cultures and Marathi, along with its cultures and customs, which I would have known

In an exclusive conversation with *The* Pioneer, Abhay Verma—who is now slaying the internet with his charisma following his role in Munjya shares his thoughts about playing the character and how the movie is a completely other ball-game.

aside from that, enlightening."
"Normally action sequences are more difficult to shoot for an actor, but working with Munjya was a whole different ballgame," he continues. "I found it easier to shoot them! I had to make my CGI character appear really unnatural on television, which made it hard for me to

Since the story and the setting are similar to "home," the intensely personal always finds resonance and becomes universal. "I was raised in a small town and have always aspired to be successful in the movie business. My accomplishment, in my opinion, will serve as a spur for those who are interested in entering this field.'

being eliminated at the group stage of the 2022 World Cup.
Tielemans gave the No. 3-ranked team in the world a flying start with a goal from the edge of the area. De Bruyne converted direct from Belgium goalkeeper Koen Casteels' length; in the 20th long kick in the 80th.



The result means all four teams in Group E have three points and there is all to play for in the final round of games on Wednesday, when Belgium plays Ukraine and Romania takes on Slovakia.

"I'm very relieved we won the game. It was very important to get the three points," Belgium coach Domenico Tedesco said.

While Belgium won, there was more frustration for Romelu

Lukaku, who had a third goal ruled out by VAR at these Euros. Still, he was at the center of his

team's great start when laying the ball off for Tielemans to drive in low from the edge of the box.


