BJP rolls out stalwarts on Lok Sabha 2024 pitch

oping to get a massive first mover advantage as it works towards its target of winning 370 seats in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, the BJP on Saturday released its first list of 195 Lok Sabha candidates from 16 States and two Union Territories (UT), days after a marathon meeting of the party Central Election Committee (CEC) chaired by Prime

Minister Narendra Modi. As many as 34 Ministers and two former Chief Ministers are on the list, which also includes 28 women, 47 leaders under the age of 50, 57 members from the OBC community, 27 from Scheduled Castes community and 18 from

Scheduled Tribe community. Of the 195 candidates, 51 are from the all important State of Uttar Pradesh, 20 from West Bengal and five from Delhi. The list includes the

party heavyweights PM Narendra Modi, who will be contesting from Varanasi for the third time, Home Minister Amit Shah, who will be fielded again from Gandhinagar in Gujarat, Union Women and Child Welfare Minister Smriti

Government pulls up Google over apps issue

CALLS TECH FIRMS MEET

PTI NEW DELHI

Taking a strong view of Google pulling out some apps from its Play Store, the Government on Saturday said delisting of Indian apps cannot be permitted and that the tech company and the startups concerned have been called for a meeting next week.

In an interview to PTI, IT and Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the startup ecosystem is key to the Indian economy and their fate cannot be left to any big tech to decide.

The Minister's comments assume significance as Google on Friday began removing some apps, including popular matrimony apps, from its Play Store in India over a dispute on service fee payments, even as



apps and well-known startup founders cried foul.

Taking a serious view of the issue, Vaishnaw said: "India is very clear, our policy is very clear...Our startups will get the protection that they The Minister said the need. Government will be meeting Google and app developers

who have been delisted, next week, to resolve the dispute. "I have already called Google...I have already called the app developers who have been delisted, we will be meeting them next week. This cannot be permitted..This kind of delisting cannot be

permitted," he asserted.

Stating that India has built a strong startup ecosystem of over one lakh startups, and more than 100 unicorns from scratch in a matter of 10 years. the Minister said the energy of youth and entrepreneurs must be channelised fully and "cannot be left to the policies of any big tech."

"I will be telling Google...Our entrepreneurial energy...Startups, look at the whole startup India programme, 10 years back we had practically nothing and today we have more than 1,00,000 startups, more than 100 unicorns...This is something...The energy of our youth, the energy of our entrepreneurs, energy of our talented people that has to be channelised fully well, it cannot be left to the policies of any big tech," Vaishnaw said.



Metro trains started running on test track

▼wo metro trains, which came to Bhopal from Sanwali (Vadodara) in Gujarat in February, are running on the test track and will soon come to the main track for the final trials.

Currently, their technical testing is being done in the Inspection Bay Line (IBL) built at Subhash Nagar Depot. On the other hand, another metro train will come to Bhopal in the last week of March. After this there will be a total of 4 metro trains.

Two metro trains arrived in February. After this, apart from their mechanical and electrical, software testing was also started. More than 50 engineers and supervisors were engaged in this work. After this, they are being run on the track of the depot itself. After March 15, they will be

run on the main line i.e. between Subhashnagar and RKMP station.

Metro Corporation officials said, till now a total of 3 metro trains have arrived in Bhopal. One of these has also run on the main track. The remaining two trains are being tested on the track at Subhashnagar depot itself. The fourth train is also expected to arrive by the end of March.

Anti-bacterial and anti-viral

systems have been installed in every coach of both the trains. The interior has also been completed.

The work of AIIMS station is also going on at a fast pace. There is a special focus on Alkapuri, DRM office and AIIMS station.

The target is to run the metro for the common people in May-June 2024. Therefore, focus is being placed on the remaining work of the metro. Especially the work of Alkapuri, AIIMS and DRM office stations has been expedited. At the same time, after completion of civil work at Subhash Nagar, Opposite DB Mall, MP Nagar, Rani Kamlapati and Kendriya School stations, finishing works are also being completed. Till early morning people kept raising slogans demanding suspension of TI.

Jitu Banjara of the organization had a dispute with locals on Friday. He reached the police station with Bajrang Dal's New Bhopal area coordinator Neeraj Prajapati to lodge a complaint at around 4 pm, where he had an argument with Ratibad police station in-charge Hemant Shrivastava over the matter of registering an FIR.

It is alleged that after the argument, the station in-charge and 5 police personnel beat up both the activist. As soon as the information was received, other

activists of Bajrang Dal reached the police station and they were also abused. Bajrang Dal workers gathered at the police station in protestested till 5 am on Saturday. The matter could be pacified after the

intervention of the authorities. Section 155 (NCR) has been

registered against the station incharge and five people of his staff

in their own police station.
Bajrang Dal's Neeraj Prajapati alleged that on March 1, some miscreants had beaten up Bajrang Dal worker Jitu Banjara. Regarding this, he along with Manoj Rathore and Rohit Shriwas had reached the police station to complain about Jeetu Banjara. There, station in-charge Hemant Srivastava used indecency regarding the matter of report (FIR). When they protested, policemen Ravindra Dangi, Anil Verma, Mahesh Dubey and two others abused and beat them. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Ram Ji Srivastava said that there was a dispute between the two parties after the accident. Dozens of people gathered from both sides and were creating ruckus. Police reached the spot after receiving information and registered a case of rioting and assault against people from both sides. Late in the night, when VHP office bearer Madhya Bharat Province Rajesh Jain talked to top police officers, action was taken against about half a dozen policemen including station in-charge Hemant

Government issues advisory to label under trial AI models

Days after Google's AI platform's response to queries on Prime Minister Narendra Modi generated controversy, the government has issued an advisory for social media and other platforms to label under-trial AI models and prevent hosting unlawful con-

In an advisory issued to intermediaries/platforms on March 1, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology warned of criminal action in case of non-compliance. "All intermediaries or platforms to ensure that use of Artificial Intelligence model(s) /LLM/Generative AI, software(s) or algorithm(s) on or through its computer resource does not permit its users to host, display, upload, modify, publish, transmit, store, update or share any unlawful content," the advisory said. All platforms, intermediaries and enabling software shall be

breaches, it added. "Noncompliance with provisions would result in penal consequences.

The advisory comes within days of Google's AI platform Gemini making uncharitable comments about Prime Minister Modi's policies. The response of Gemini to queries about the Prime Minister led to a strong reaction from the government, with Minister of State for IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar calling it a violation of IT laws.

Union Minister Electronics and IT Rajeev Chandrashekhar on Saturday said, "The episode of Google Gemini is very embarrassing, but saying that the platform was under trial and unreliable is certainly not an excuse to escape from prosecution". "I advise all platforms to

openly disclose to the consumers and seek consent from them before deploying any under-trial, erroneous plat-

internet. Nobody can escape accountability by apologis-ing later. Every platform on the Indian internet is obliged to be safe and trusted," he further said.

The advisory asked the entities to seek approval from the government for deploying under trial or unreliable artificial intelligence (AI) models and deploy them only after labelling them of "possible and inherent fallibility or unreliability of the output generated".

Use of under-testing / unreliable Artificial Intelligence model(s) /LLM/Generative AI, software(s) or algorithm(s) and its availability to the users on Indian Internet must be done so with the explicit permission of the Government of India and be deployed only after appropriately labelling the possible and inherent fallibility or unreliability of the output generated," it said.

Indian Navy to upgrade Minicoy detachment, commission it as INS Jatayu

iven the strategic impor-Gtance of Lakshadweep Islands, Indian Navy will upgrade naval detachment Minicov and commission it as INS Jatayu on March 6 in the presence of Navy chief Admiral R Hari Kumar, navy said here on Saturday. Plans are also on to have a dual-purpose airport at Minicoy capable handling fighter jet flying besides commercial aircraft operations.

Giving details about the naval base, officials said the event marks an important milestone in the Navy's resolve to incrementally augment security infrastructure at the strategically important Lakshadweep. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had visited there in the first

week of January. Naval Detachment Minicoy was setup in early 1980s under the operational command of Naval Officer-in-Charge (Lakshadweep). Minicoy is the southern-most island of Lakshadweep which straddles the vital Sea Lines of Communications (SLOCs). Basing of an independent naval

unit with requisite infrastructure and resources will enhance the overall operational capability of the Indian Navy in the islands. The base will enhance operational reach and facilitate

Classical dancer from India shot dead in US Sunak pleads

n yet another deadly attack on Indians and Indian-Americans in the US in recent months, a 34-year-old trained classical dancer from India and a student of Washington University, was shot dead in St Louis, Missouri.

Kuchipudi and dancer Bharatnatvam Amarnath Ghosh, who migrated to the US from West Bengal last year "to follow his dancing dreams," was shot several times near the border of St Louis Academy and Central West End neighbourhoods. He died on the spot. According to the St Louis Metropolitan Police Department, the shooting happened at 7:15 pm on Tuesday at Delmar Boulevard and Clarendon Avenue, news por-

Friday. Ghosh was pursuing his master's in the Performing Arts Department of Washington

Hailing from Suri town in West Bengal's Birbhum district, Ghosh was an alumni of Kalakshetra, a prestigious Chennai institution that is a vital centre for the study and performance of fine arts, from 2007 to 2011.

His uncle Shyamal Ghosh said in Suri on Saturday, he is still in the dark about the details of his nephew's death in the USA even after four days. "We had informed the district police and administration about what we had heard from various sources. But till today, we don't have any details about his death," he said.

Calling him "very friendly

friends Hima Kuppa and Ravi Kuppa in the US said, "He was always travelling a lot for his performances. A lot of organisations called him for performances, but he always wanted to come back to St Louis."

Ghosh was learning ballet and dance. "I think it was a full scholarship at Wash U. His ultimate dream was to get his PhD in dance and work full-time with us at our Kuchipudi Art Academy," Hima was quoted as saying by '5 On Your Side.'

He enjoyed volunteering as a dance instructor at a local studio and also taught children between the ages 5 and 18. His friends told the news outlet that Ghosh was the only child of his parents; his mother died three years ago and his father died when he was a child.

This type of senseless violence is beyond comprehension and we are devastated by this loss. To have this happen in our own St. Louis community is especially heartbreaking," Anna "Dr G" Gonzalez, Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs said in a statement released to all Washington University students, faculty and staff. It was

Devoleena Bhattachariee, who first alerted the authorities on social media about her friend Ghosh's death. Taking to X, she posted, "The reason, accused details everything are not revealed yet or perhaps no one left in his family to fight for it except his few

Excellent dancer, was pursuing PhD, was taking an evening walk and suddenly he was shot multiple times by an unknown." She tagged the X handles of the Indian Embassy in the US, Prime Minister Narendra Modi among others and said, "Some friends in US are trying to claim the body but still no update about it" and requested the Embassy to look into it.

"At least we should know the reason of his murder," she said in the post on Friday. On Saturday, Bhattacharjee said in another post on X: "Hope we get the update of this heinous crime as early as possible. If I am not wrong, this is 5th or 6th murder of Indian Students in 2 months. We all are worried here & grieving."

He was speaking soon after what he characterised as the "beyond alarming" win in a byelection on Thursday of a controversial politician,

George Galloway, in Greater Manchester following a campaign dominated by the divisions of the Israel-Hamas con-

He said on too many occasions recently, the streets of Britain had been hijacked by small groups who are hostile to British values and have no respect for its democratic tradi-

"Islamist extremists and the far right feed off and embolden each other. They are equally desperate to pretend that their violence is somehow justified when actually these groups are two sides of the same extremist coin... both loathe the pluralist, modern country we are," he said.



The Rubymar's Beirutbased manager could not be immediately reached for com-

ment, which has been backed by a Saudi-led coalition since 2015, said the Rubymar sank late Friday as stormy weather took hold over the Red Sea. The vessel had been abandoned for 12 days after the Houthis, who had claimed the ship sank almost instantly after the attack, did not immediateing. The US military's Central Command previously warned the vessel's cargo of fertiliser, as ship, could cause ecological damage to the Red Sea.

The seasoned Shiva Thapa, Deepak Bhoria and Nishant Dev will be among nine Indian boxers fighting it out for Paris Olympic berths at the 1st World Qualification Tournament, starting in Busto Arsizio, Italy on Sunday.

Seven men and two women from India will be aiming to secure Olympic berths at the qualifiers being conducted by the Paris 2024 Boxing Unit (PBU), an ad-hoc body created by the International Olympic Committee Executive Board.

The tournament has 49 quota

places on offer and a boxer will

be assured of a Paris ticket

after reaching the semifinals. In the women's 60kg category, however, there will be a box-off between the losing semifinalists to decide the Olympic berths as only three spots are available. While several boxers have already obtained quota places via their respective continental events, there are many worldclass pugilists including Colombia's Yuberjen Martinez and Tomoya Tsuboi of Japan in the men's 51kg, reigning 57kg world champion Makhmud Sabyrkhan of Kazakshtan and Olympic silver medallist Yoel Finol of Venezuela, who will be keen to seal the deal in Italy this month.

India's hopes will be spear-headed by the trio of 2023 world championship medallists — Bhoria (51kg), Mohammed Hussamudin (57kg) and Dev (71kg).

Bhoria and Dev have emerged as strong contenders in their respective weight classes over the last year.

Two-time Commonwealth Games bronze medallist Hussamudin will be back in the ring for the first time since last year's world championships, having undergone a surgery on his left knee.

Expectations will be high from the six-time Asian Championship medallist Thapa (63.5kg) as well as former Asian



champion Sanjeet (92kg). Super heavyweight boxer Narender Berwal (+92kg) is also a strong contender. He came the closest to clinching a quota among all Indian male pugilists at the Asian Games, which was the first qualifying event for the boxers from the

continent. Among women, Jaismine Lamboria will have her task cut out in the women's 60kg category. She was given strong competition by Simranjit Kaur at the

nationals in December and the CWG bronze medallist will have to up her game for a favourable outcome





one has been the most challenging, and why? I have played roles which have challenged me as an actor and made me push myself out of my comfort zone. It's difficult to choose any one role. I thoroughly enjoyed playing both Mohsina and Jhilmil even though they belong to completely different worlds. In the recent past, whether it was Tarla, Monica, Shalini or Rani Bharti - they are all strong women who will not be deterred by society or it's norms and will rise above their circumstances with sheer will power and be unapologetic about their ambitions

Can you tell us about any upcoming projects that you are excited about?

The third season of Maharani will be streaming soon. I think this is one of the only shows which has a female protagonist and has been commissioned for the third season. I am really looking forward to how people receive it.

How do you approach preparing for a new role? Are there any specific methods you follow?

Not really. For me, reading the script multiple times helps. I just follow the script and the director's vision. Of course as an actor I improvise where it makes sense. But, essentially, I rely on the script for shaping my role.



t's impeccable to christen NOTA in the truest sense of the word as the 'Sankat Mochan' of democracy in political Lanka, as each vote deserves a political Ayodhya, not a chaotic Lanka. With the 2013 judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (PUCL v. Union of India), a firm position was set that in an exceedingly legal system, electors must be given the right to reject, which owes its genesis to freedom of speech and expression (Art. 19(1)(a)). For a democracy to survive in its true form it is essential that the best available men should be chosen as people's representative and if electors find none from the roaster to be suitable enough, negative voting is necessitated. 
