BJP rolls out stalwarts on Lok Sabha 2024 pitch

Hoping to get a massive first mover advantage as it works towards its target of winning 370 seats in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, the BJP on Saturday released its first list of 195 Lok Sabha candidates from 16 States and two Union Territories (UT), days after a marathon meeting of the party Central Election Committee (CEC) chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. As many as 34 Ministers and two former Chief Ministers are on the list, which also includes 28 women, 47 leaders under the age of 50, 57 members from the OBC community, 27 from Scheduled Castes community and 18 from Scheduled Tribe community. Of the 195 candidates, 51 are from the all important State of Uttar Pradesh, 20 from West Bengal and five from Delhi. The list includes the party heavyweights PM Narendra Modi, who will be contesting from Varanasi for the third time, Home Minister Amit Shah, who will be fielded again from Gandhinagar in Gujarat, Union Women and Child Welfare Minister Smriti

Irani from Amethi, Rajnath Singh from Lucknow, and Bhupender Yadav from Rajasthan Alwar. Sushma Swaraj daughter Bansuri Swaraj, will make her poll debut from the New Delhi seat, Kamaljeet Sehrawat will contest from the from West Delhi, MLA Ramvir Singh Bidhuri from South Delhi, Praveen Khadelwal from Chandni Chowk, while Manoj Tiwari has been retained from the North East Delhi. The list also included two former Chief Ministers -- Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Biplab Deb - as well as Om Birla from Kota in Rajasthan.

Government pulls up Google over apps issue

Taking a strong view of Google pulling out some apps from its Play Store, the Government on Saturday said delisting of Indian apps cannot be permitted and that the tech company and the startups concerned have been called for a meeting next week. In an interview to PTI, IT and Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the startup ecosystem is key to the Indian economy and their fate cannot be left to any big tech to decide. The Minister's comments assume significance as Google on Friday began removing some apps, including popular matrimony apps, from its Play Store in India over a dispute on service fee payments, even as



apps and well-known startup founders cried foul. Taking a serious view of the issue, Vaishnaw said: "India is very clear, our policy is very clear...Our startups will get the protection that they need." The Minister said the Government will be meeting Google and app developers who have been delisted, next week, to resolve the dispute. "I have already called Google...I have already called the app developers who have been delisted, we will be meeting them next week. This kind of delisting cannot be permitted," he asserted.

Stating that India has built a strong startup ecosystem of over one lakh startups, and more than 100 unicorns from scratch in a matter of 10 years, the Minister said the energy of youth and entrepreneurs must be channelised fully and "cannot be left to the policies of any big tech." "I will be telling Google...Our entrepreneurial energy...Startups, look at the whole startup India programme, 10 years back we had practically nothing and today we have more than 1,00,000 startups, more than 100 unicorns...This is something...The energy of our youth, the energy of our entrepreneurs, energy of our talented people that has to be channelised fully well, it cannot be left to the policies of any big tech," Vaishnaw said.

Adani Group gives biggest investment proposal of Rs 75K crores

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav engaged in individual discussions with each investor, fostering one-to-one dialogues with officials from over 20 major industrial groups. The virtual inauguration of 63 units during the conclave was a significant highlight, with programs held across 21 different locations in the state. These units are anticipated to bring an investment of Rs 10,064 crore to the state, creating direct employment opportunities for over 17,000 individuals. Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav's giving land allotment orders to 283 major and MSME units during the conclave, totaling an investment of over Rs 12,170 crore, was a standout moment highly praised by both investors and the general public,

as well as public representatives. This marked the first time in the state's history that such a large number of land allotment orders were given on stage. The Adani Group's substantial investment of Rs 75,000 crore stands out as the largest, while the PepsiCo Group's Rs 1,250 crore investment in Vikram Udyogpuri of Ujjain is expected to create employment for about 500 individuals. LTI Mindtree has inked a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the state government, committing to a Rs 500 crore investment in the proposed campus at Super Corridor Indore. The government has allocated 10 acres of land to the institute under its IT policy. This investment is expected to generate around 10,000 technical job opportunities in the state. Additionally, more than 20

industrial groups in the state held one-to-one meetings with Chief Minister Dr. Yadav, engaging in substantive discussions on investment proposals totaling approximately Rs 17,000 crore. A total of 880 units have expressed their Intention-to-Invest over Rs 1 lakh crore across various sectors.. A Mukhya Mantri Air Ambulance Service was initiated in Madhya Pradesh during the conclave itself. The service will prove to be a boon for the poor class. Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav inaugurated it on the concluding day of the conclave. Under this service, one heli-ambulance and one fixed wing converted flying ICU aircraft will be deployed to serve the citizens of all the districts and administrative divisions of the state. Both will have a team of highly trained doctors and para-

medics. The doctors and paramedics will undergo special training in Aero Medical Sciences Fellowship. All citizens of the state will benefit from this service. The conclave featured five regional sessions in two days to provide detailed information on sector-wise investment opportunities. Serious discussion was held in the sessions MSMEs and start-ups, investment opportunities in Madhya Pradesh, dairy, agro, food processing, investment opportunities in infrastructure development and religious tourism. Similarly, discussions were also held regarding opportunities and challenges of pharma medical devices. These sessions will help explore new investment possibilities in the state. The Regional Industry Conclave showcased diverse investment

opportunities in sectors such as agriculture, food processing, minerals, engineering, textiles, IT and electronics, urban infrastructure. The State government is working simultaneously to promote export and domestic trade of ODOF and other products of the State, for which a separate Buyer-Seller meeting area has been created. The conclave witnessed more than 2500 buyer-seller meetings over two days, highlighting the enthusiasm of the participants. To showcase the industrial environment of Madhya Pradesh, three exhibitions were set-up, in which information about the industrial ecosystem of the state was given through 16 different types of industries. Along with the policies of the state, information about ODOF products was also given in Madhya Pradesh Pavilion.

Metro trains started running on test track

Two metro trains, which came to Bhopal from Sanwali (Vadodara) in Gujarat in February, are running on the test track and will soon come to the main track for the final trials. Currently, their technical testing is being done in the Inspection Bay Line (IBL) built at Subhash Nagar Depot. On the other hand, another metro train will come to Bhopal in the last week of March. After this there will be a total of 4 metro trains. Two metro trains arrived in February. After this, apart from their mechanical and electrical, software testing was also started. More than 50 engineers and supervisors were engaged in this work. After this, they are being run on the track of the depot itself. After March 15, they will be

run on the main line i.e. between Subhashnagar and RKMP station. Metro Corporation officials said, till now a total of 3 metro trains have arrived in Bhopal. One of these has also run on the main track. The remaining two trains are being tested on the track at Subhashnagar depot itself. The fourth train is also expected to arrive by the end of March. Anti-bacterial and anti-viral

systems have been installed in every coach of both the trains. The interior has also been completed. The work of AIIMS station is also going on at a fast pace. There is a special focus on Alkapuri, DRM office and AIIMS station. The target is to run the metro for the common people in May-June 2024. Therefore, focus is being placed on the remaining work of the metro. Especially the work of Alkapuri, AIIMS and DRM office stations has been expedited. At the same time, after completion of civil work at Subhash Nagar, Opposite DB Mall, MP Nagar, Rani Kamlapati and Kendriya School stations, finishing works are also being completed. Sheds have also been installed at DB Mall, Kendriya School and MP Nagar stations.

Ruckus at Ratibad police station by Bajrang Dal activists

Following allegations of assault on a Bajrang Dal activists, massive protest was staged in the Ratibad police station premises on late in the intervening night of Friday-Saturday. Till early morning people kept raising slogans demanding suspension of TI. Jitu Banjara of the organization had a dispute with locals on Friday. He reached the police station with Bajrang Dal's New Bhopal area coordinator Neeraj Prajapati to lodge a complaint at around 4 pm, where he had an argument with Ratibad police station in-charge Hemant Shrivastava over the matter of registering an FIR. It is alleged that after the argument, the station in-charge and 5 police personnel beat up both the activist. As soon as the information was received, other activists of Bajrang Dal reached the police station and they were also abused. Bajrang Dal workers gathered at the police station in protest till 5 am on Saturday. The matter could be pacified after the intervention of the authorities. Section 155 (NCR) has been

registered against the station in-charge and five people of his staff in their own police station. Bajrang Dal's Neeraj Prajapati alleged that on March 1, some miscreants had beaten up Bajrang Dal worker Jitu Banjara. Regarding this, he along with Manoj Rathore and Rohit Shrivastava had reached the police station to complain about Jeetu Banjara. There, station in-charge Hemant Shrivastava used indecency regarding the matter of report (FIR). When they protested, policemen Ravindra Dangi, Anil Verma, Mahesh Dubey and two others abused and beat them. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Ram Ji Shrivastava said that there was a dispute between the two parties after the accident. Dozens of people gathered from both sides and were creating ruckus. Police reached the spot after receiving information and registered a case of rioting and assault against people from both sides. Late in the night, when VHP office bearer Madhya Bharat Province Rajesh Jain talked to top police officers, action was taken against about half a dozen policemen including station in-charge Hemant Shrivastava, Sub Inspector Raghavendra Singh under NCR.

Two miscreants illegally transporting liquor nabbed

Under the direction of Collector Dhar Priyank Mishra, under the guidance of Assistant Excise Commissioner Dhar Vikramdeep Sangar a team led by ADEO R S Rai, a blockade was done on Saturday, on the basis of information on Mhow Pithampur Neemuch Road to control the illegal transporta-

tion of liquor in Excise Circle Sagaur. After some time, a vehicle, Renault Kwid, was stopped by blocking it. 3 boxes of desi liquor plain, 2 boxes of desi masala liquor and 3 boxes of Royal Select whiskey from Renault Kwid MP09 CX 4262, total quantity 72 bulk litres was confiscated. The case under MP Excise Act Section 34(1)(a), 34(2) of

the Excise Act 1915 was imposed by Excise Inspector Munendra Singh Jadaun. The accused arrested in the case, Anuj Tej Bahadur Singh, resident of Pithampur and Rishi Amar Bahadur Singh, resident of Pithampur, were sent to jail in judicial custody. The total estimated value of the seized vehicle and the liquor loaded with it is approximately Rs 270000.

The BJP on Saturday declared candidates in 24 out of 29 Lok Sabha constituencies in Madhya Pradesh. State BJP president VD Sharma claimed that his party is confident of winning all the 29 seats this time. "We were 28 last time and now Modi's guarantee narrative will us strike rate of 100 per cent," he claimed. The BJP has finally got its act together in the state after a series of brainstorming sessions, including through video conferencing to finalise the list of probable contenders for the upcoming LS election. There are 29 seats in Madhya Pradesh including Chhindwara. Earlier BJP fielded 7 MPs in the assembly election, out of which 5 won and 2 lost. The party can field new candidates in these



seven seats. There are currently four women MPs in Lok Sabha and 3 in Rajya Sabha from state. State President VD Sharma said that the party's election roadmap and also the opinion poll on the most promising Lok Sabha candidates, was the core agenda of the brainstorm meetings yesterday. In total, the national BJP declared

a list of 195 candidates on Saturday. They included 24 from madhya Pradesh. They are- Bhopal: Alok Sabjar, Vidisha: Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Guna: Jyotiraditya Scindia, Mandasaur: Sudhir Gupta, Sagar: Lata Wankhede, Gwalior: Bharat Singh Kushha, Khajuraho: VD Sharma, Betual: DD Uike, Rewa: Janardan Mishra, Satna: Ganesh

After the tickets were declared, there was jubilant atmosphere at he residence of Shivraj Singh Chouhan.

It is important to avoid aggression in linguistic exchanges. He expressed hope that this festival will strengthen the efforts to enrich Hindi. He appreciated the efforts and dedication of the founder of the institute, Vijay Dutt Sridhar. The involvement of three generations of his family in the service of the institute was described as a highly commendable contribution. Padmashri Vishnu Pandya said

that the Indian Language Festival is an event that brings together the diverse Indian culture to celebrate the prominence of Hindi. National seminar and lecture session under Vikramotsav-2024

At present, with the concept of Prime Minister Modi, important changes are being made in the Indian Law and Penal Code. The technical session of the National Seminar focused on "Vikramaditya in the light of folklore" was chaired by Prof. Akhilesh Kumar Pandey, Vice Chancellor of Vikram University. Rs 2.35 cr penalty on colonizer

Indore Collector Ashish Singh message to check the illegal mining in district is loud and clear. Under the Guidance of Indore ADM Mineral Department Indore acted on illegal mining. Earlier, permission was obtained for excavation of 5000 cubic meters of mineral murum on the colony being developed on the private land of Vijay Babu Lal Jain Real Estate in Village Panchderia Tehsil Sanwer. On receiving information about illegal excavation on the said land, a spot investigation was conducted by the Mineral Department. The investigation found that illegal excavation of about 15,000 cubic meters more than the permission obtained had been done. A case of illegal

gal excavation was registered under the Madhya Pradesh Mineral (Prevention of Illegal Mining, Transportation and Storage) Rules 2022 for excavation/transportation of much more quantity than the permitted quantity. Notice of Rs 2.35 crore issued to illegal excavator Vijay Babu Lal Jain Real Estate from ADM Gourav Benal court, Indore. According to sources a colony was being developed under the name of Jain Diwakar Hira Manak on the area related to private land Khasra No. 1/3 and 2/181/2/2. After the colonizer took permission, not a single transit pass for the payment of royalty fees was generated. If the case is not resolved, penalty can be increased up to 2 times as per rules.

Classical dancer from India shot dead in US

In yet another deadly attack on Indians and Indian-Americans in the US in recent months, a 34-year-old trained classical dancer from India and a student of Washington University, was shot dead in St Louis, Missouri.

Kuchipudi and Bharatanatyam dancer Amarnath Ghosh, who migrated to the US from West Bengal last year “to follow his dancing dreams,” was shot several times near the border of St Louis’ Academy and Central West End neighbourhoods. He died on the spot. According to the St Louis Metropolitan Police Department, the shooting happened at 7:15 pm on Tuesday at Delmar Boulevard and Clarendon Avenue, news por-

tal ‘5 On Your Side’ reported on Friday. Ghosh was pursuing his master’s in the Performing Arts Department of Washington University.

Hailing from Suri town in West Bengal’s Birbhum district, Ghosh was an alumni of Kalakshetra, a prestigious Chennai institution that is a vital centre for the study and performance of fine arts, from 2007 to 2011.

His uncle Shyamal Ghosh said in Suri on Saturday, he is still in the dark about the details of his nephew’s death in the USA even after four days. “We had informed the district police and administration about what we had heard from various sources. But till today, we don’t have any details about his death,” he said.

Calling him “very friendly and very talented,” Ghosh’s friends Hima Kuppa and Ravi Kuppa in the US said, “He was always travelling a lot for his performances. A lot of organisations called him for performances, but he always wanted to come back to St Louis.”

Ghosh was learning ballet and dance. “I think it was a full scholarship at Wash U. His ultimate dream was to get his PhD in dance and work full-time with us at our Kuchipudi Art Academy,” Hima was quoted as saying by ‘5 On Your Side’.

He enjoyed volunteering as a dance instructor at a local studio and also taught children between the ages 5 and 18. His friends told the news outlet that Ghosh was the only child of his parents; his mother died three years ago and his father died when he was a child.

Gosh’s killing has prompted India’s consulate in Chicago to take up the issue with local police and the university.

Asserting that the mission is “extending all help to the relatives of deceased Amarnath Ghosh,” India’s Consulate in Chicago posted on X that it has “taken up the case strongly with St Louis police and the University for investigation of the reprehensible gun attack.”

Offering deep condolences to family and friends of the deceased in St Louis, Missouri, it said, “We are following up forensic, investigation with police and providing support.”

Washington University, where Gosh was a student, has condemned his killing as “senseless violence beyond comprehension.”

“There are no words to

express the pain and anguish Amarnath’s family and friends are experiencing. His death is a terrible shock to us all. This type of senseless violence is beyond comprehension and we are devastated by this loss. To have this happen in our own St. Louis community is especially heartbreaking,” Anna “Dr G” Gonzalez, Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs said in a statement released to all Washington University students, faculty and staff. It was actor Devoleena Bhattacharjee, who first alerted the authorities on social media about her friend Ghosh’s death. Taking to X, she posted, “The reason, accused details everything are not revealed yet or perhaps no one left in his family to fight for it except his few

friends. He was from Kolkata. Excellent dancer, was pursuing PhD, was taking an evening walk and suddenly he was shot multiple times by an unknown.” She tagged the X handles of the Indian Embassy in the US, Prime Minister Narendra Modi among others and said, “Some friends in US are trying to claim the body but still no update about it” and requested the Embassy to look into it.

“At least we should know the reason of his murder,” she said in the post on Friday. On Saturday, Bhattacharjee said in another post on X: “Hope we get the update of this heinous crime as early as possible. If I am not wrong, this is 5th or 6th murder of Indian Students in 2 months. We all are worried here & grieving.”

Sunak pleads to protect democracy

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has issued an impassioned plea for Britain to protect its democracy as he warned that extremist forces were out to tear the country apart and undermine its multi-faith identity.

Referencing his own Hindu beliefs, the British Indian leader on Friday stressed that the enduring values of the UK are about embracing migrants of all faiths and ethnicities and urged protesters to ensure peaceful demonstrations are not hijacked by extremist forces.

“Immigrants who have come here have integrated and contributed. They have helped write the latest chapter in our island story. They have done this without being required to give up their identity,” said Sunak in a speech outside 10 Downing Street.

“You can be a practising Hindu and a proud Briton as I am, or a devout Muslim and a patriotic citizen as so many are, or a committed Jewish person and the heart of your local community, and all underpinned by the tolerance of our

established, Christian church,” he said.

“But I fear that our great achievement in building the world’s most successful multi-ethnic, multi faith democracy is being deliberately undermined. There are forces here at home trying to tear us apart,” he added.

He was speaking soon after what he characterised as the “beyond alarming” win in a byelection on Thursday of a controversial politician, George Galloway, in Greater Manchester following a campaign dominated by the divisions of the Israel-Hamas conflict.

He said on too many occasions recently, the streets of Britain had been hijacked by small groups who are hostile to British values and have no respect for its democratic traditions.

“Islamist extremists and the far right feed off and embolden each other. They are equally desperate to pretend that their violence is somehow justified when actually these groups are two sides of the same extremist coin... both loathe the pluralist, modern country we are,” he said.



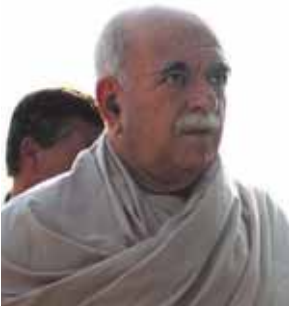
Zardari, Achakzai file papers for Pak presidential poll

Pakistan’s former president Asif Ali Zardari and his rival ethnic Pashtun politician Mahmood Khan Achakzai on Saturday filed their nominations for the presidential election to be held on March 9.

Zardari, from Sindh province, is the co-chairman of the Pakistan Peoples Party and has the support of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz as the two leading parties joined hands to form a coalition government after the February 8 elections produced a split mandate.

Zardari, 68, is set to become the president for the second time as he is being supported by the parties that enjoy a majority in the electoral college. He also served as president from 2008 to 2013. Achakzai, 75, from Balochistan, is the chief of the Pashtunkhwa Milli Awami Party and was nominated by Imran



Khan, the jailed leader of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party. In Parliament, Achakzai would be supported by the Sunni Ittehad Council, the new home of the PTI-backed independent lawmakers. Their nomination papers were filed for the presidential elections and the scrutiny of the nomination papers will be held on Monday. The elections will be held on March 9.

The new president will replace Dr Arif Alvi, who completed a five-year term last year.

However, in the absence of the electoral college required to elect the president, Alvi is still in office. The president is elected by an electoral college comprising members of the Senate, the National Assembly, and the four provincial assemblies. Voting is held through a secret ballot in Parliament and four provincial assemblies.

The president is the ceremonial head of the state and enjoys limited powers as he acts on the advice of the prime minister.

Ship attacked earlier by Houthi rebels sinks in Red Sea

A ship attacked by Yemen’s Houthi rebels has sunk in the Red Sea after days of taking on water, officials said Saturday, the first vessel to be fully destroyed as part of their campaign over Israel’s war against Hamas in the Gaza Strip. The sinking of the Rubymar comes as shipping through the crucial waterway for cargo and energy shipments moving from Asia and the Middle East to Europe has been affected by the Houthi attacks.

Already, many ships have turned away from the route. The sinking could see further detours and higher insurance

rates put on vessels plying the waterway — potentially driving up global inflation and affecting aid shipments to the region.

The Belize-flagged Rubymar had been drifting northward after being attacked on Feb 18 in the Bab el-Mandeb Strait, a crucial waterway linking the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden.

Yemen’s internationally recognized government, as well as a regional military official, confirmed the ship sank. The official spoke on condition of anonymity as no authorisation was given to speak to journalists about the incident.

The Rubymar’s Beirut-based manager could not be immediately reached for comment.

Yemen’s exiled government, which has been backed by a Saudi-led coalition since 2015, said the Rubymar sank late Friday as stormy weather took hold over the Red Sea. The vessel had been abandoned for 12 days after the attack, though plans had been made to try and tow the ship to a safe port. The Iran-backed Houthis, who had claimed the ship sank almost instantly after the attack, did not immediately acknowledge the ship’s sinking. The US military’s Central Command previously warned the vessel’s cargo of fertiliser, as well as fuel leaking from the ship, could cause ecological damage to the Red Sea.

3 held for Dhaka mall fire

Bangladesh police have arrested three persons, including two owners of a restaurant, in connection with the massive fire that broke out at a shopping mall in the capital Dhaka that killed at least 46 people.

The fire broke out around 9:50 pm on Thursday at the restaurant named “Kacchi Bhai” on the first floor of the building, Green Cozy Cottage, and quickly spread to the upper floors that had more restaurants and a garment shop, according to fire service officials.

Two owners of an eatery called Chumuk and the manager of Kacchi Bhai restaurant were arrested on Friday, Dhaka Metropolitan Police Additional Commissioner Kh Mahid Uddin said.

He said, “The fire started from the food shop on the ground floor of the building. The police will file a case over negligence in connection with the deaths in the fire incident.”

Besides, anyone from the victim’s family can file a case if they want, said the police official.

At least 46 people were killed, and over 20 others sustained severe injuries by a devastating fire on Thursday night. Firefighters rescued 70 people, including 42 in unconscious

state, from the rooftop and different floors of the seven-storey Green Cozy Cottage.

Legal action will be taken against whoever is found responsible in this incident, he added.

He said that three people arrested in this incident are being interrogated.

The building did not have permission to house restaurants.

The building had permission for office use, not restaurants and eateries, according to Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk). But the building housed eight restaurants, a juice bar and a tea and coffee shop, the report said.

‘Mt Everest crowded and dirty now’

The only surviving member of the mountaineering expedition that first conquered Mount Everest said Saturday that the world’s highest peak is too crowded and dirty, and the mountain is a god that needs to be respected.

Kanchha Sherpa, 91, was among the 35 members in the team that put New Zealander Edmund Hillary and his Sherpa guide Tenzing Norgay atop the 8,849-meter (29,032-foot) peak on May 29, 1953.

“It would be better for the mountain to reduce the number of climbers,” Kanchha said in an interview in Kathmandu on Saturday. “Right now there is always a big crowd of people at the summit.”

Since the first conquest, the

peak has been climbed thousands of times, and it gets more crowded every year. During the spring climbing season in 2023, 667 climbers scaled the peak, but that brought in thousands of support staff to the base camp between the months of March and May.

There have been concerns about the number of people living on the mountain for months on end, generating trash and waste, but authorities have no plans to cut down on the number of permits they issue to climbers.

There are rules that require climbers to bring down their own trash, equipment and everything they carry to the mountain or risk losing their deposit, but monitoring has not been very effective.

“It is very dirty now. People throw tins and wrappings after eating food. Who is going to pick them up now?” Kanchha said. “Some climbers just dump their trash in the crevasse, which would be hidden at that time but eventually it will flow down to base camp as the snow melts and carries them downward.”

For the Sherpas, Everest is Qomolangma or goddess mother of the world, and is revered by their community. They generally perform religious rituals before climbing the peak.

“They should not be dirtying the mountain. It is our biggest god and they should not be dirtying the gods,” he said “Qomolangma is the biggest god for the Sherpas but people smoke and eat meat and throw them on the mountain.”

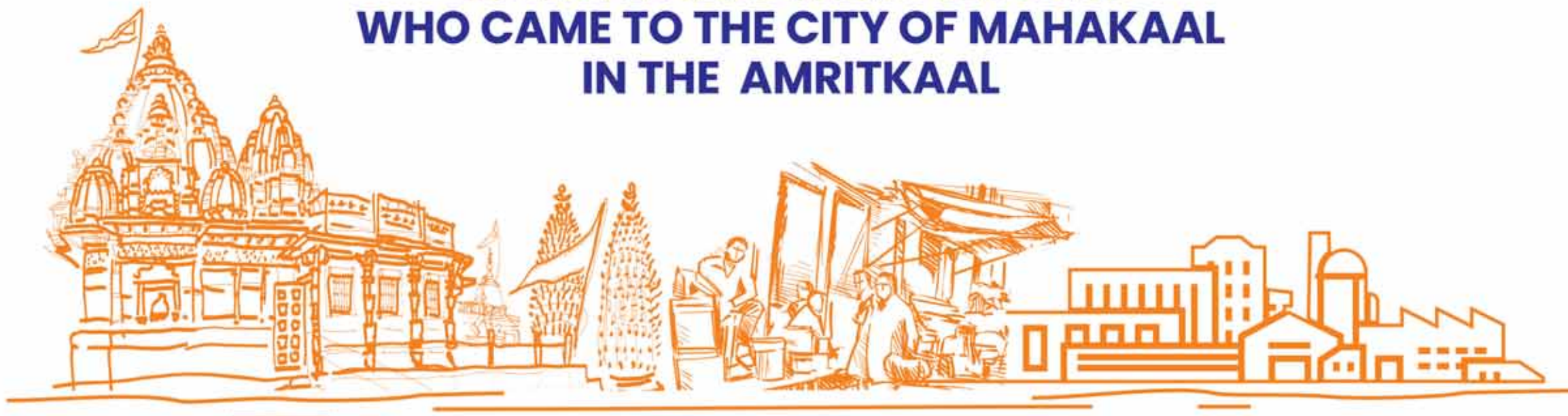

NEW ZEALAND BOWL OUT AUSTRALIA, CHASES 369

AP ■ WELLINGTON (NEW ZEALAND)

Part-time off-spinner Glenn Phillips took 5-45 as New Zealand bowled out Australia for 164 in its second innings Saturday on the third day of the first cricket test. Phillips' maiden five-wicket total comprised the wickets of Usman Khawaja (28), first-innings century-maker Cameron Green (34), Travis Head (29), Mitch Marsh for a first-bull duck and Alex Carey (3). Matt Henry took 3-36 as Australia was bowled in less than four hours.

Australia still increased its overall lead to 368 after following by 204 on the first innings. At stumps New Zealand was 111-3 and 257 runs behind.

Rachin Ravindra reached a half century from 77 balls just before stumps and was 56 not out at the close of play and Daryl Mitchell was 12.

Australia struck a major blow when it dismissed Kane Williamson for 9 in the last session. Williamson fell to Nathan Lyon, the off-spinner who likely holds the key to the match.

After being run out for 0 in the first innings, Williamson was caught by Steve Smith at leg slip from a ball that bounced more than he expected. Smith moved to first slip and caught Will Young (15) off Head as New Zealand's hopes of winning began to melt away.

Ravindra revived those hopes a little before stumps with his first half century in his first match against Australia. The only previous time he passed 50 in his test career, he made 240.

A New Zealand win remained unlikely and of the three possible results still in play an Australia win is most probable. A draw also looms as a possibility as rain is forecast for most of the fourth day.

New Zealand's highest successful fourth-innings run chase in New Zealand is 324 and the current target would represent the 10th-highest successful chase in the history of test cricket. Still, Phillips' incredible contribution in the middle session when four of his five wickets fell helped save some face for New Zealand after it was bowled out for 179 in reply to Australia's 383.

New Zealand captain Tim Southee threw the ball to Phillips as his first spin option of the second innings. New Zealand didn't take a specialist spinner into the match but relied on Ravindra who took 1-24 in the first innings. Southee then backed Phillips who bowled his 16 overs without a break.

"It's a dream come true absolutely," Phillips said. "Tim (Southee) is an incredible captain and he really gives me the confidence to go out there and stick to my plan and also gives you the chance to be able to miss every now and then. As a spinner you really need that."

"The bowling unit today really stuck to the things we wanted to stick to. Partnership bowling all the way." Phillips has a reputation in the New Zealand team as a player who can make things happen in all three formats: a hard-hitting middle-order batsman, an athletic fielder and now as a serious bowling option. He

had taken only 11 wickets in his five previous tests with a best of 4-53.

When Green became his fifth victim, brilliantly caught by Will Young under the helmet at short leg, Phillips set off on a long, jubilant run around the Basin Reserve, finally ending the Henry's arms.

"I've got a six-year-old daughter and any celebration a six-year-old girl would do, that's probably me," Phillips said. "I've never really thought what to do if I got a five-for but the emotion, the way the crowd went up. It was just an unbelievable moment."

Phillips acknowledged New Zealand's chance of winning the test is slight but happy to

able to give his team a chance. "I understand we've got to combat the situations that are out there," he said. "Obviously there's a bit of turn so it's a matter of how we go about combating (Nathan) Lyon. The way their big fast bowlers bowl as well is going to be a challenge."

"I definitely think we've got the time on our hands to be able to pull this off."

Australia resumed Saturday at 13-2 after losing Steve Smith and Marnus Labuschagne late on the second day. Nathan Lyon was once again a useful nightwatchman and he made 41 before he fell in the first session and Khawaja also was out stumped before lunch.

AIFF women committee discusses appointment of new coaches

Indian boxers renew quest for Paris Olympic quotas in Italy

The seasoned Shiva Thapa, Deepak Bhorla and Nishant Dev will be among nine Indian boxers fighting it out for Paris Olympic berths at the 1st World Qualification Tournament, starting in Busto Arsizio, Italy on Sunday.

Seven men and two women from India will be aiming to secure Olympic berths at the qualifiers being conducted by the Paris 2024 Boxing Unit (PBU), an ad-hoc body created by the International Olympic Committee Executive Board.

The tournament has 49 quota places on offer and a boxer will be assured of a Paris ticket after reaching the semifinals.

In the women's 60kg category, however, there will be a box-off between the losing semifinalists to decide the Olympic berths as only three spots are available.

While several boxers have already obtained quota places via their respective continental events, there are many world-class pugilists including Colombia's Yuberjen Martinez and Tomoya Tsuboi of Japan in the men's 51kg, reigning 57kg world champion Makhmud Sabyrkhan of Kazakhstan and Olympic silver medalist Yoel Finol of Venezuela, who will be keen to seal the deal in Italy this month.

champion Sanjeet (92kg). Super heavyweight boxer Narender Berwal (+92kg) is also a strong contender. He came the closest to clinching a quota among all Indian male pugilists at the Asian Games, which was the first qualifying event for the boxers from the continent.

Among women, Jaismine Lamboria will have her task cut out in the women's 60kg category. She was given strong competition by Simranjit Kaur at the

bronze medallist Lovlina Borgohain (75kg) have already secured their passage to Paris. This is, however, not the last chance for boxers to qualify for the Paris Games as the last qualifying event will be held in May-June in Thailand.

India had nine boxers competing at the Tokyo Olympics, which yielded one medal—a bronze by Borgohain.

ACTRESS OF DEPTH AND VERSATILITY



I WAS INTO THEATRE IN COLLEGE AND THAT’S WHERE I DISCOVERED MY LOVE FOR ACTING. I MOVED TO MUMBAI WITH THE INTENTION OF BECOMING AN ACTOR. IN MY INITIAL DAYS IN THE INDUSTRY, I DID A COMMERCIAL WHICH WAS DIRECTED BY ANURAG KASHYAP AND HE OFFERED ME GANGS OF WASSEYPUR. THAT’S HOW MY JOURNEY IN CINEMA WAS KICKSTARTED

CAN YOU share a bit about your journey into the film industry and how you got your start as an actress?

I was into theatre in college and that’s where I discovered my love for acting. I moved to Mumbai with the intention of becoming an actor. In my initial days in the industry, I did a commercial which was directed by Anurag Kashyap and he offered me Gangs of Wasseypur. That’s how my journey in cinema was kickstarted.

What motivated you to pursue a career in acting?

In school I used to keenly participate in extra-curricular activities. Whether it was elocution, debates or plays. When I went to college, I was deeply attracted to theatre and was bitten by the acting bug. I moved to Mumbai with the dream of becoming an actor.

Of all the roles you’ve played so far, which one has been the most challenging, and why? I have played roles which have challenged me as an actor and made me push myself out of my comfort zone. It’s difficult to choose any one role. I thoroughly enjoyed playing both Mohsina and Jhilmil even though they belong to completely different worlds. In the recent past, whether it was Tarla, Monica, Shalini or Rani Bharti - they are all strong women who will not be deterred by society or it’s norms and will rise above their circumstances with sheer will power and be unapologetic about their ambitions.

Can you tell us about any upcoming projects that you are excited about?

The third season of Maharani will be streaming soon. I think this is one of the only shows which has a female protagonist and has been commissioned for the third season. I am really looking forward to how people receive it.

How do you think the film industry has evolved during your career, especially in terms of roles for women and what changes would you like to see in the entertainment industry, particularly in Bollywood?

It’s important for every actor to figure out their own path. There always will be a plethora of roles to play and actors must

choose roles that work for them. The parameters for choosing roles are one’s own. The sets have more women in all departments of filmmaking. Even though it’s still not a level playing field, for example, the pay gap between male and female actors is still an issue, the industry has space for everyone and is constantly evolving

How do you approach preparing for a new role? Are there any specific methods you follow?

Not really. For me, reading the script multiple times helps. I just follow the script and the director’s vision. Of course as an actor I improvise where it makes sense. But, essentially, I rely on the script for shaping my role.

Balancing personal and professional life can be challenging. How do you manage to maintain that balance? What are your favorite ways to unwind and relax when you’re not working? I love sleeping. On days when I am not shooting, I am usually catching up on my sleep or hang out with my friends and family.

In recent years, many actors have become advocates for social issues. Are there any causes that you are particularly passionate about? How do you see your platform as an actress contributing to social change or awareness? I made a film which addressed body shaming called Double XL. As an actor one is expected to fit a mould but I have never adhered to that. My film was about how the skills a person has is far superior and what matters more than the looks or the how much they weigh. There has always been a lot of pressure on women to look a certain way and I have always advocated against that thought process.

What advice would you give to aspiring actors who are looking to enter the film industry?

Every individual’s journey is different and they have to write their own story. What worked for me might not work for someone else. Focus, determination and resilience are key qualities.

Are there any lessons you’ve learned in your career that you wish someone had told you earlier?

I am glad that I got the opportunity to be on the journey and experience it for myself.

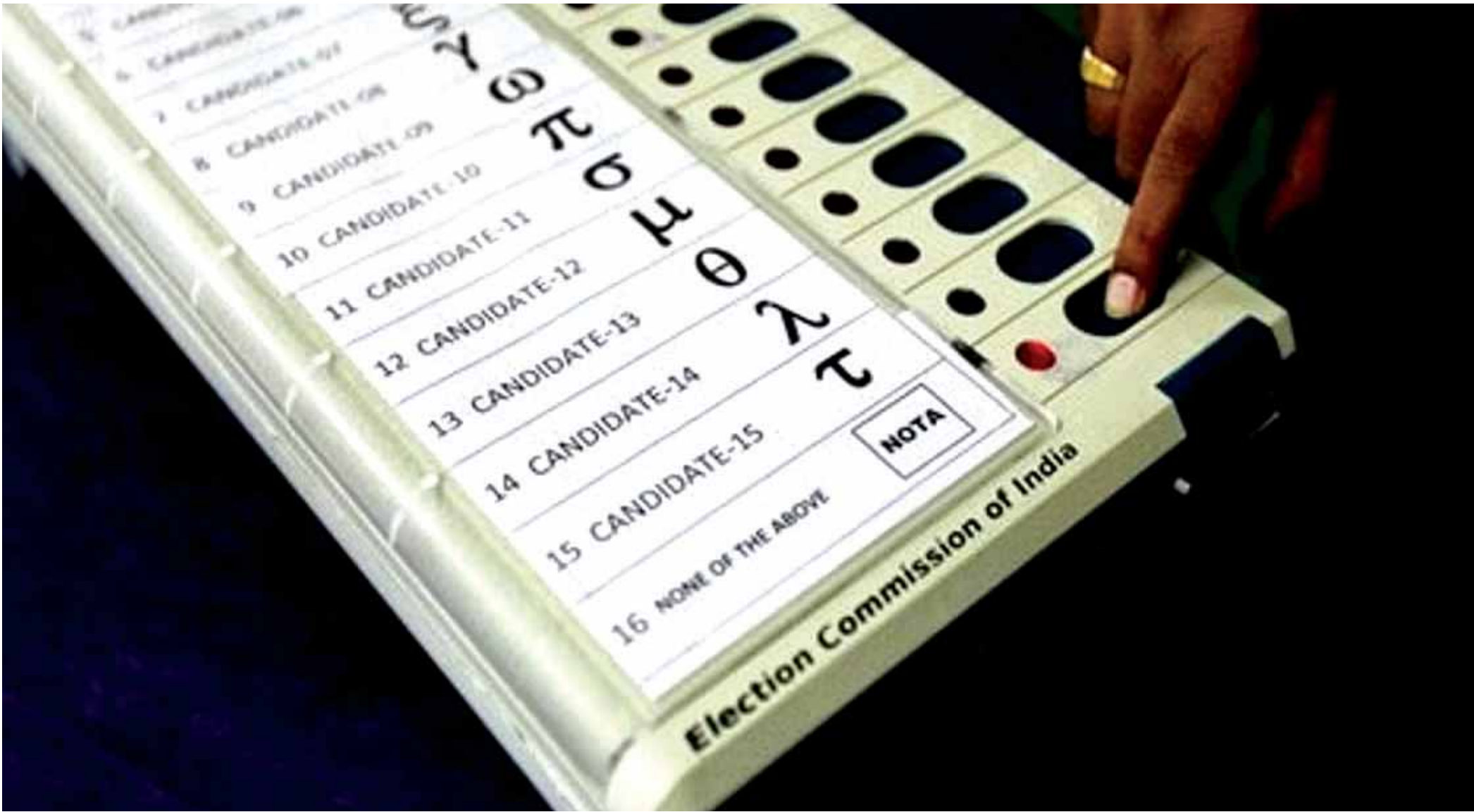

NOTA: THE SILENT REVOLUTION OR THE ILLUSION OF CHOICE?



NOTA CONTINUES TO BE A TOOL OF DISSENT IN THE ELECTORAL DEMOCRACY. IT EMPOWERS THE ELECTORS TO REGISTER THEIR DISCONTENT WITH THE POOL OF CANDIDATES WHILE MAINTAINING SECRECY, THUS PERSUADING PARTIES TO FIELD BETTER CANDIDATES



It's impeccable to christen NOTA in the truest sense of the word as the 'Sankat Mochan' of democracy in political Lanka, as each vote deserves a political Ayodhya, not a chaotic Lanka. With the 2013 judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India (PUCL v. Union of India), a firm position was set that in an exceedingly legal system, electors must be given the right to reject, which owes its genesis to freedom of speech and expression (Art. 19(1)(a)). However, this was substantially necessitated on account that secrecy of casting a vote was duly recognised under the provisions of the Representation of People's Act, 1951, and the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961, as being fundamental to free and fair elections. The 170th Report of the Law Commission, 1999, while laying down the chassis of NOTA,

recommended a method to ensure the purity of elections, keep out criminals and other undesirable elements, and minimise the role and importance of caste and religion. Pursuant to this, no candidate could be declared returned unless he obtains at least 50% of the votes cast, and to determine such a percentage, even the negative vote would be treated as votes cast. The report also recommends a 'run-off' and fresh election if candidates fail to secure the requisite percentage. This was endorsed by the Background Paper on Electoral Reforms, 2010. Even in Columbia, blank votes are considered to be valid ones and there stands similar provision to this effect. However, in its press release dated October 28th, 2013, the Election Commission of India clarified while referring to provisions of the Conduct of

Elections Rules, 1961 (clause (a) of Rule 64) read with the Representation of the People's Act, 1951 (Section 65), that even if the number of electors opting for NOTA option is more than the number of votes polled by any of the candidates, the candidate who secures the largest number of votes has to be declared elected. This implies that even if 99% of the electors rejected the candidature of all the candidates, conversely, in defiance of their mandate, the candidate who managed to secure just 1% of the votes could be declared to be returned. This serves as a testimony of NOTA having no electoral value in India, ergo, there's no wrong in deeming it nothing more than a protest vote. Be that as it may, to justify the forthcoming quote "Not all battles are fought for victory. Some are fought simply to tell the world that someone was there on the battlefield"

(Ravish Kumar) in an electoral democracy could set the stage for catalysing NOTA as just a token of gesture which is bound to be unjust. Nevertheless, NOTA continues to be a tool of dissent in the electoral democracy. It empowers the electors to register their discontent with the pool of candidates while maintaining secrecy, thus persuading parties to field better candidates. In the 2018 Assembly election of Madhya Pradesh, NOTA bagged fifth largest tally of votes polled (1.42%) which was more than SP (1.3%) and AAP (0.66%). Similarly, in Karnataka, NOTA secured more votes than BSP and CPI (M) which are national parties. The figures are indicative of the significant usage of NOTA in numeric sense, however, its impact still remains insignificant. The State Election Commission of Haryana deviated from the

practice of Election Commission of India during the Municipal Elections. A notification dated November 22nd, 2018 by the SEC, Haryana deemed NOTA to be a 'Fictional Electoral Candidate'. It further went on to state that if a situation arises where NOTA receives the highest number of votes, then a fresh election would be conducted. All candidates who received lesser vote than NOTA would become ineligible from contesting the re-election. Similar notification was also published by the SEC, Maharashtra in the same year. In yet another development from the past, the Supreme Court issued a notice to the Centre and the ECI on March 15th, 2021 on a PIL which sought a direction to the poll panel to nullify an election result and conduct a fresh poll if the maximum votes in a particular constituency were for NOTA.

For a democracy to survive in its true form it is essential that the best available men should be chosen as people's representative and if electors find none from the roster to be suitable enough, negative voting is necessitated. However, the rationale behind the 2013 judgement of the Apex Court has failed to bear fruits. In a vibrant democracy, voter's choice must be of paramount and if they palpably reject all the contesting candidates, their choice should be empowered by way of a fresh election. In the existing scenario, if we picture the electoral stage as a grand theatre; NOTA plays the role of a silent spectator, leaving no tangible mark on the political drama. Thus, even with the popularity of NOTA among the electors experiencing a significant rise over the years, the question of whether it is 'revolutionary' or mere 'illusionary' lingers.
