

Kejriwal in full throttle as ED retains his custody CM to defend his own case against national probe agencies

elhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday questioned the locus standi of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) for arresting him in the multicrore liquor gate scam merely on the basis of statements of some, including his former Cabinet colleague Manish

Sisodia's secretary. Kejriwal asked the court whether these four statements are enough to arrest a sitting Chief Minister

"I am named by four witnesses in the excise policy case. Are four statements enough to arrest a sitting CM?", alleged Kejriwal.

He was produced in a special court on Thursday where his ED custody was extended by four days till April 1. The probe agency had sought seven-day custody of the AAP chief.

Kejriwal was supposed to do an "expose" on Friday as per his wife's, Sunita, statement a day earlier.

Kejriwal submitted in the open court during the proceedings that statements of witnesses recorded by the investigating agency do not in any manner connect him with the alleged offences and questioned his arrest in the matter.

Chief Furthermore, the

Minister said Sarath Reddy, an approver in the case, got bail after he made a statement against him who himself donated ₹55 crore to the BJP. "I have evidence of this. Money trail is established as he donated the funds after being arrested," the Chief Minister said

Kejriwal's submissions were strongly objected to by ED counsel Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, who also questioned why attempts were being made to link the BJP with the excise policy case. Raju had argued that

Kejriwal's statements to the ED's questioning have been evasive.

"He (Kejriwal) wants to play to the gallery. How does he know how many documents are with ED? This is all figment of imagination ... AAP received the kickbacks which they used in Goa elections. There is a clear cut chain ... The money that they say came to BJP has nothing to do with the liquor scam. There is no quid pro quo... The CM is not above law. He is an ordinary man. We have material to show that this very person demanded 100 crore kickback," Raju

contended. In its remand application, the ED said during Kejriwal's custodial interrogation, his statements were recorded over

five days but he was "giving evasive replies". Kejriwal alleged that the ED investigation had two objectives — one, to create a smokescreen in front of the

submissions in Hindi after taking permission from the court despite his lawyers being present and he did not oppose the ED's remand extension request

"Ham ED ki remand oppose nahi kar rahe. Jitne din chaahe wo mujhe custody m rakh le. Par ye ghotala hai (loose translation: I am not opposing the ED's plea for remand. They can keep me in custody for as long as they want. But this is all a scam)," Kejriwal told the court.

"So far, the CBI has filed 31,000 pages in this case in the court and 294 witnesses have been examined in this case. The ED has investigated 162 people and filed a 25,000-page report so far. By combining all these documents and reports, why have I been arrested? My name figures only in four statements," he said in a jampacked courtroom.

Elaborating on the four statements mentioning his name, Kejriwal said C Arvind, former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Ŝisodia's secretary gave a statement. According to it, Sisodia handed over some excise policy-related documents to C Arvind in his (Kejriwal's) presence, in the Chief Minister's official

residence. "He has only stated that Sisodia gave some documents to C Arvind. Madam, several MLAs, Ministers and dignitaries come with their secretaries to my house.

"They do side-talks and hand over documents to each other.

How do I know who is giving what to whom? Is this statement a sufficient reason to arrest the sitting chief minister?" Kejriwal said.

Giving details of the second Giving details of the second statement in which his name appeared, Kejriwal said Magunta Srinivas Reddy is an MP from (Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister) Jagan Mohan Reddy's party (YSRCP). "Magunta Srinivas Reddy came to my office at 4.30 pm

came to my office at 4.30 pm on March 16, 2021. He had sent an e-mail to my office that he is an MP and wanted to meet me. My office gave him an appointment to meet me after 10 days. He came over and said I want to open my family's charitable trust in Delhi. I told him that the land does not come under us, it comes under the Lieutenant Governor (LG)," Kejriwal said. The Delhi Chief Minister further said Magunta Srinivas Reddy gave three statements to the agency but only one was considered.

"Why the only statement that is against Kejriwal has been included in the 25,000 pages of ED report and the other two statements were not considered? All the three statements should have been brought to the notice of the court, so that it could decide the truth in the case," he said.

Vaiko who rushed to Coimbatore said, "He met me twice. We never expected him to make such a decision. He was in a good mood. I cannot believe that he took such a step and passed away. We pay our deep homage." epresentation in democracy should be inclusive of class, Caste and gender and it is more challenging in a multi-cultural and multi-religious country like India. The aspirations of people from different socio-economic status should be represented through their leaders in governance. The 17th Lok Sabha has only 14 per cent women and 4.5 per cent Muslim and other minorities. The majority of members across ruling and opposition mostly belong to the rich class. There should be a basic change in our present electoral system to strengthen democracy and make it more inclusive.

The composition and character of the governing bodies taking decisions on behalf of the people should be changed as per the demand of the present scenario. In the context of electoral reforms, State funding of elections features as one of the most important aspects to ensure participation of all sections in the election. Equally important is the proportional representation (PR) system in place of the present fast past the post (FPTP) system of election. The election system in practice has been pro-rich, where candidates play a bigger role than parties, and candidates from poor economic backgrounds and small parties and fi-

nancially weaker parties have little chance to win, because they cannot compete in campaigning with financially powerful parties supported by upper class of India. The corporate sector decides winners, while corruption, violence and bribing influence the election results. The upper class influences the policy making process of governance in their favour and prevents genuine representation of the candidates by encouraging unfair competition.

The elections in our country for Lok Sabha, State Assembly and local self-government witness huge spending of money on campaigning, road shows, public meetings by parties and candidates. Mostly, vot-

ers are bribed to vote, though a law is there to prevent the practice. Many parties use helicopters and helipads for high-profile campaigning all over the country with special help of film stars and celebrities.

Print and electronic media is used day and night to propagate in support of the parties. All these run into a spending of some thousand crores. Campaigns by ruling parties create problems for local administration and the public by disturbing their normal life. Many party leaders spend a huge amount on building their public image through advertising. Though there is provision for a ceiling on candidates' expenses in elections, there is no ceiling imposed on the political parties' spending during elections.

The ADR sources say that majority of the candidates from ruling parties and elected members are crorepaties. It seems the socially and economically backward classes are reasserting their power in democracy. It is discussed in the media that ruling party's bosses sell out tickets to those who have paid huge bribes to them. The mining and industrial lobbies play a substantial role in the selection of candidates. It has been proven now ,as we see huge donations in form of electroral bonds purchased by corporates for

the political parties.

The criminal background of the candidates almost is ignored, while candidates with money and backing from industrial, mining and corporate houses are chosen as nominees by the political parties. Their educational background and experience in public life do not matter much. Many of the parties lack internal party democracy and are mostly ruled by a family, an individual and a dominant group. In order to change the situation, there has been a growing demand for State funding of elections, ensuring equal opportunity to all candidates irrespective of their financial background.

Though the matter was discussed in the Constituent Assembly by Prof KT Shah, who moved an amendment that election expenses should be borne by the State, the issue was avoided by the ruling parties. The Dinesh Goswami Committee (Former law Minister) on electoral reforms in 1990, Indrajeet Gupta Committee on State funding of elections in 1998, Second Administrative Reform Commission, 2008, and Law Commission report on reforms of the electoral laws 1999 etc have extensively referred to the issue. Former Chief Election Commissioner of India SY Quraishi had argued in favour of

State funding and said it could help end political corruption. The committee's recommendation suggested for State funding to registered State and national parties with restrictions and further said that the Election Commission had to work out modalities on this. It is argued that this can start with partial funding and the funding should be preferable in kind like rent-free accommodation, rent-free telephone, free time on Doordarshan and AIR, fuel for vehicles engaged in elections, paper for printing, loud speaker, free telephone and support for counting agents etc.

There are parties and individuals who oppose State funding, taking the plea that taxpayers are indirectly forced to pay for election expenses of all political parties. Rather, they want to limit their contributions to the parties whom they support. With State funding, the political parties become part of the State rather than the representative of their supporters in particular and people in general. It will affect the ultimate accountability to people. The party candidates may depend more on the State than on their leaders and the role of elites in the party will be reduced. That may affect the performance of parties dominated by individuals and families. Many Left parties supporting State funding are of the opinion that the parties should not be controlled by the State in the name of funding because it will downsize the political role of a party in holding the State accountable.

However, many argue that the State funding of elections is a necessary cost of democracy and governance and not a huge burden on the State. This process will contribute to reducing the dependency of political parties on the corporate sector. The State funding of elections with strict legal measures will contribute to limiting the role of dominant class, private corporate, communal, casteist and extremist bodies in election. It is further argued that in poor societies, ordinary members of the party cannot support the party's election fund. There are countries like Germany, France, Austria, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Brazil, Japan, Spain, Italy and many others who have already adopted State funding for political parties. The IDEA of Sweden, working with the Election Commission of India on electoral reforms and strengthening democracy, says out of atotal of 180 countries, 71 countries have facilities of giving State funds based on votes obtained and 86 per cent of the countries in Europe and 58 per cent in Asia have adopted this. In a democracy, there

should be fair access to representation which includes fair election and participation. State funding will pave the way for building genuine party representation and the feudal and hegemonic rule in parties will come to an end, which is very much required for a healthier democracy. The process may encourage parties by marginalized groups such as working class, labourers, peasants, Dalits, Adivasis, STs, OBCs, religious and ethnic minorities, women and small parties to improve their participation in elections.

The political parties must follow internal party democracy and must have a transparent candidate selection process based on principles and policy of the parties rather than leaving it to local influential people to decide on behalf of the party. The high command culture must be replaced with a democratic decision making process. The political parties must be the models of democratic reform for inclusive democracy to be followed by the voters. The Government must invest in political education, citizenship, voter awareness and build a sense of political responsibilities with voters to elect the right candidate without fear and influence.





The Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, under which an area is declared as "disturbed" for the convenience of security forces, has been extended in three districts of Arunachal Pradesh, eight districts of Nagaland and some other areas for six more months after a review of the law and order situation in these two northeastern states.

The AFSPA gives armed forces personnel, operating in disturbed areas, sweeping powers to search, arrest and to open fire if they deem it necessary for "the maintenance of public order". An area or district is notified as a disturbed area under the AFSPA to facilitate the operations of the armed forces.

In a notification, the Union home ministry said the central government in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 had declared the Tirap, Changlang and Longding districts in Arunachal Pradesh and the areas falling within the juris-diction of Namsai, Namsai, Mahadevpur and Chowkham police stations in Namsai district of Arunachal Pradesh, bordering Assam as "disturbed area" on September 26, 2023. "And whereas a further review of the law and order situation in the state of Arunachal Pradesh has been undertaken. Now, therefore, Tirap, Changlang and Longding districts in Arunachal Pradesh and the areas falling within the jurisdiction of Namsai,

The National Eligibility Test (NET) scores will be used for PhD admissions from 2024-25 eliminating the need for separate entrance tests conducted by universities and higher education institutions, according to the University Grants Commission. The NET is con-Grants ducted twice a year -- June and December. Its scores are currently used to award Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) and as eligibility for appointment as an assistant professor for those

with a Master's degree. According to University Grants Commission (UGC) officials, the commission had constituted an expert committee to review the provisions of the exam and based on the panel's recommendations, it has decided that from the academic session 2024-25, the score can be used for admission to PhD programmes.

"Starting from the academic session 2024-2025, universities nationwide will have the opportunity to utilise NET scores for admissions to PhD programmes, replacing the need for separate entrance tests conducted by individual uni-versities and higher education institutions (HEIs). This marks an important step in streamlining the admission process and enhancing accessibility for aspiring doctoral candidates. "By leveraging the NET, which is conducted biannually, universities can offer greater flexibility to students, allowing them to utilise their scores from either session to apply for PhD programmes across vari-



ous institutions," UGC Chairman Jagadesh Kumar said.

Kumar explained that the initiative is poised to benefit students in numerous ways. "Firstly, it eliminates the need for students to prepare and appear for multiple entrance tests conducted by different universities, thereby reducing the burden of exam logistics and expenses. Additionally, the biannual administration of the NET provides students with increased opportunities to secure admission to their

desired PhD programmes. "We strongly encourage all universities to adopt NET exam scores for PhD admissions starting from the 2024-2025 academic session. This will undoubtedly contribute to fostering a more conducive environment for academic pursuit and scholarly advancement in our nation," he said.

In an official notification, the UGC said that from June 2024 onwards, the NET candidates will be declared eligible in three categories -- for admission to PhD with JRF and appointment as assistant prossor; for admission to PhD

without JRF and appointment as assistant professor; for admission to PhD programme only and not for the award of JRF or appointment as assistant professor.

Result of UGC NET would be declared in percentile along with the marks obtained by a candidate to utilise the marks for admission to PhD. The JRF-qualified students are admitted into the PhD programme based on an interview as per the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of PhD Degree) Regulations, 2022.

"For students who qualify in categories 2 and 3, 70 per cent weightage will be given for test scores and 30 per cent for the interview for admission to PhD programmes. The PhD admission will be based on the combined merit of NET marks and the marks obtained in the interview or viva voce," the notification said. The marks obtained in the NET by the candidates in categories 2 and 3 will be valid for one year for admission to PhD.

The registration process for UGC NET June 2024 is expected to begin next week.

n 2022, every day, households worldwide wasted over 1 billion meals, while a heartbreaking 783 million people struggled with hunger, and a third of the global population faced food insecurity, as per a UN report published just ahead of the International Day of Zero Waste marked on March 30. The economic toll due to waste food is estimated at roughly

USD 1 trillion, highlighting the urgent need for action, said the UNEP Food Waste Index Report 2024, prepared by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP), in collaboration with the environmental charity WRAP, which has brought to attention the grave consequences of food waste while underscoring the glaring disparity between abundance and deprivation that

persists worldwide. The report has also highlighted how this issue not only hurts the global economy but also fuels climate change, loss of biodiversity, and pollution. A detailed analysis of the data reveals an alarming scenario: In 2022, a staggering 1.05 billion tons of food waste were generated, equivalent to 132 kilograms per person and nearly one-fifth of all available food. Surprisingly, a significant portion of this waste, 60 per cent, occurred at the household level, with food services responsible for 28 per cent and retail contributing 12 per cent.

Inger Andersen, Executive Director of UNEP said, "Food waste is a global tragedy. Millions go hungry as food is wasted across the world. Not only is this a major develop-

ment issue, but the impacts of such unnecessary waste are causing substantial costs to the climate and nature. If countries prioritise this issue, they can significantly reverse food loss and waste, reduce climate impacts and economic losses, and accelerate progress on global goals."

At the same time, Harriet Lamb, CEO of WRAP called for more G20 countries to measure food waste and work towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goal. Public-private partnerships were highlighted as a key tool in addressing the complex challenges of food waste.

The report notes that despite efforts to track food waste, many low- and middle-income countries lack adequate systems to monitor progress towards Sustainable Development Goal 12.3, which aims to halve food waste by 2030. Only a few G20 countries, along with the European Union, have suitable

estimates to track progress. Interestingly, the report debunked the notion that food waste is only a problem in wealthy nations. Household food waste levels varied only slightly among high-income, upper-middle, and lower-middle-income countries. Hotter countries appeared to generate more food waste per person, possibly due to higher con-sumption of fresh foods with inedible parts and limited cold chain infrastructure.

The environmental impact of food waste is substantial, contributing 8-10 per cent of annual global greenhouse gas emissions and causing significant biodiversity loss.

UPPL files complaint against Congress

Over photo of suspended member sleeping with money

B JP ally United People's Party Liberal (UPPL) has lodged a complaint with the Election Commission against Congress' Kerala unit and its media platform INC TV for allegedly spreading false news over the viral photo of its one suspended member sleeping with currency notes.

A viral picture purportedly of a suspended UPPL member sleeping with currency notes triggered a controversy in Assam on Wednesday. The opposition grabbed the opportunity and slammed the BJP-led alliance, saying the ruling bloc is "wallowing in the quagmire of corruption

UPPL filed two identical complaints -- one against Kerala Congress with the Election Commission of India and the other against INC TV with the Chief Electoral Officer of Assam -- and referred to the posts on X of the two entities.

"The tweet in question falsely claimed that 'Assam BJP's alliance partner UPPL led by BTR's Pramod Boro was found sleeping

on stacks of Rs 500 currency notes'. Such misinformation has the potential to manipulate public opinion, deceive voters and disrupt the integrity of the electoral process," UPPL chief Pramod Boro said in the complaint.

He claimed that the news in question is "absolutely false, fabricated and manufactured", which is circulated with the intent to "malign the image" of the president of the UPPL and the party as well.

"The dissemination of such fake news not only violates the ethical standards of journalism but also undermines the fundamental principles of democracy," said Boro, the Chief Executive Member of Bodoland Territorial Council.

He appealed to the Election Commission to investigate the matter promptly and take necessary actions to address the spread of the "fake news" by Kerala Congress and INC TV.

'It is imperative to uphold the principles of free and fair elections and prevent the false dissemination of



electoral outcomes. Safeguarding the truth and ensuring transparency in the electoral process are essential for the credibility of our democratic

system," Boro said. He also urged the Election Department of Assam to conduct a thorough investigation into the matter to ascertain the extent of the misinformation spread by Kerala Congress and INC TV, information that could influence and to take necessary steps to

mitigate its impact on the upcoming elections.

Sharing screenshots of the posts of Kerala Congress and INC TV, Boro said his name was

mentioned in those without verification.

In a post on X, Boro said, "In its penchant to spread lies and fake news, Congress has stooped so low that they have become a fake news factory and will malign anyone. The people will not be

misled by their fake news and false promises and will give them a fitting reply. Congress will be zero in Assam this time."

"In these screenshots, CONgress and @RahulGandhi's Fake News Factory have used my name without even verifying. Have without even verifying. Have lodged official complaint with Election Commission of Assam and request @ECISVEEP to take strict action against Congress and their fake news social media pages," he added.

Boro said an FIR will also be lodged with Kokrajhar police station over the matter. In the image, Benjamin Basumatary, identification in the photograph as identified in the photograph as a Village Council Development with a base of the provided the with a heap of Rs 500 denomination notes.

"The photo that has gone viral is five years old. It has been made viral due to political conspiracy. We will find out who has done this" Beauty table this," Basumatary told reporters when asked about the picture.

He admitted that the photograph was authentic, but claimed that some people had blackmailed

him at that time after he was clicked in that pose.

"Five years ago, I had taken a loan of Rs 3 lakh for some work from my sister. That particular night, some of us were having a party and my partner clicked the photo with the money I had borrowed in a fun moment," he added. The UPPL sought to distance itself from the image, stating that Basumatary has been suspended and removed from the VCDC post.

Boro on Wednesday claimed that the Harisingha Block Committee of the party had recommended disciplingary disciplinary action against Basumatary on January 5 this Basumatary on January 5 this year and accordingly, he was suspended on January 10 over the photograph. "Additionally, the BTC Government suspended and removed him from the post of VCDC Chairman on 10th February, 2024. I urge all media outlets and social media users to refrain from linking Mr Basumatry with UPPL," he said

in a post on X. Boro further said that Basumatary's actions are solely his own responsibility and the party is not accountable for any of his personal acts

Truth travels freely

Kejriwal's arrest gets international attention; vendetta politics may boomerang on ED

D rought to the Rouse Avenue Court amid high drama, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has described his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate in the excise pol-icy case as a "political conspiracy." Himself making submissions in the court after taking the special judge's permission, he expressed confidence that the public will give a "fitting reply to this injustice". Seeking to establish a link between the Electoral Bond donations received by the ruling party and his arrest, the Delhi Chief Minister said that people were being turned 'approver' in the case and being forced to change their statements. "My arrest by the ED is a political conspiracy ... the approver gave the BJP Rs 55 crore," he said. As a precursor to this setting, Kejriwal's wife, Sunita, broke her silence and hinted at the impending revelation of this crucial piece of information. Kejriwal, known for his anti-corruption stance and vocal criticism of the Centre, was arrested last week on charges of being embroiled in a multi-crore liquor scam. The arrest sparked wide-



spread outcry and protests, with supporters of Kejriwal alleging political vendetta and the BJP's bid to settle political scores with the AAP upon losing the MCD elections after 15 years. Apart from being charged with soliciting kickbacks from liquor traders in exchange for favours, the Delhi Chief Minister is also accused of being the "kingpin and key conspirator" in the nowscrapped policy. The agency has already arrested at least 14 top AAP leaders, including Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia and Minister Sanjay Singh, in connection with the case.

Meanwhile, the international community has also been drawn into the fray, with the US making remarks regard-

ing Kejriwal's arrest that have drawn the ire of Indian officials. The US State Department expressed concern over what it termed as "the apparent suppression of dissent" in India, calling for due process and respect for human rights. However, Indian authorities swiftly responded, asserting that the comments were unwarranted interference in the country's internal affairs. Germany was the first country to speak against Kejriwal's arrest. Whenever a politician is put behind bars, there are consequences to it. The Union Government should be doubly sure that it has a watertight case against the accused person, else there are high chances that it will boomerang. Due to the lack of information on the case in public domain, we shall assume that the authorities have a strong case against the Delhi CM and that due process of law would be followed. But if it is an exercise in haste, Kejriwal's words might prove prophetic as elections are just around the corner. The citizens are discerning enough to read any signs of political vendetta. The outcome of this legal battle and its broader implications remain uncertain, but one thing is clear – the events unfolding around Kejriwal have captured the attention of the nation and the world, highlighting the enduring struggle for transparency, accountability and justice in the corridors of power.

he 1980s film 'Mard' immortalised a poignant scene that encapsulates the essence of patriotism, rebellion, and sacrifice in Indian cinematic history. Social media often promotes formation of echo chambers and spread of false news

O ocial media, a ubiquitous phenomenon in contemporary society, has revolutionised the way people communicate, share information and interact with one another. From its humble beginnings as online forums to the expansive platforms of today like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Telegram, Snapchat and many more, the term 'social media' has reshaped human interaction and societal norms to a large extent.

Today, it has become an integral part of everyone's life, especially Generation Z and the impact is complex and multifaceted, encompassing both positive and negative aspects. Social media has fundamentally transformed communication dynamics, making it easier for individuals to connect with others globally. It has transcended geographical barriers, enabled real-time interaction and fostered virtual communities based on shared interests, identities and ideologies. Moreover, social media platforms have become instrumental in political discourse, activism and social movements, empowering voices that were previously marginalised and amplifying diverse perspectives.

Millennials and Generation Z rely heavily on social media as a primary source of news and information which at times can lead to issues such as the spread of misinformation, echo chambers and filter bubbles, where individuals are only exposed to viewpoints that align with their own beliefs. Various studies have also shown that spending too much time on social media, especially before bedtime, disrupts the sleep pattern. Blue light suppresses the production of melatonin, a hormone that regulates sleep, making it more difficult to fall asleep and reducing the overall quality of sleep. Studies also reveal that constant exposure to short-form content and distractions on social media platforms can lead to a decrease in attention span and difficulty concentrating on tasks that require sustained focus. Another major role of social media platforms which is responsible for various disruptions is promoting of unrealistic beauty standards through the use of filters, photo editing tools and the prevalence of influencers with idealised appearances, leading to body dissatisfaction and negative body image among Generation Z.



Such platforms are designed to be addictive, with features such as likes, comments, and notifications triggering dopamine release in the brain and can lead to compulsive use and dependency which is no less like other forms of addiction. Moreover, the constant exposure to carefully curated images and posts can create unrealistic expectations and foster feelings of FOMO (Fear Of Missing Out) among users. To mitigate the negative effects of FOMO irrespective of the generation gap, it becomes important to promote digital literacy, encourage healthy social media habits and foster offline connections and experiences such as practicing mindfulness, setting boundaries for screen time and cultivating meaningful relationships and activities that are not dependent on social media val-Additionally, fostering a supportive and inclusive online community can also help alleviate feelings by emphasising authenticity, empathy and acceptance. There is no denying the fact that social media has brought about numerous benefits for Millennials and Generation Z in terms of connectivity, self-expression, and access to information, but at the same time it also poses challenges and risks that require careful consideration and management. Despite its transformative potential, social media presents a myriad of challenges that warrant attention. The addictive nature of social media and its impact on mental health, particularly among young people, raise concerns about excessive screen time, cyberbullying, and negative self-comparison. Balancing the advantages and drawbacks of social media usage is essential to harness its potential while mitigating its negative impacts on their well-being and society as a whole (The writer is an educator, views are personal)

Quantifying happiness is perplexing

The World Happiness Report places India at 126th rank, raising legitimate concerns about the methodology and biases inherent in such assessments



appiness is complex and difficult to define, but this in no way implies that we do not know when we are happy. Happiness cannot be a permanent state of euphoria as the mind constantly changes its contours and shades and, by and large, remains an individual experience. Hence any exercise that seeks to generalise the impressions of a large number of individuals like those living within a country and brand them as happy or unhappy peo-ple is bound to be fraught with controversies. It will also inevitably reflect the biases of the measurers. When the definition of a variable cannot be agreed upon, its measurement will raise more controversies, but when such rankings are internationally publicised for branding countries and peoples which may influence the decisions of investors and donors, it is no longer a benign exercise without any accountability. On March 20 every year for the last seven years, which date has been marked by the UN as the International Day of Happiness, a New York-based agency called Sustainable Development Solutions Network has been bringing out an annual World Happiness Report, whose 2024 edition has placed India 126th rank among 143 countries, much below countries like Saudi Arabia (28), China (60), Russia (72), Venezuela (79), Senegal (99), Iran (100), Palestine (103), Ukraine (105), Pakistan (108) even Myanmar (118).

(20), USA (23), Germany (24), or France (27). This is no surprise, because to the materialistic West hung on a culture of conspicuous overconsumption, money remains the primary and often the only source of happiness, unlike in Asian and other continental cultures.

The only Asian country to feature in the list is Kwait at 13th position, and the next one is Saudi Arabia at 28th. While Singapore features in 30th position, Japan, which has the largest concentration of longest-living people in the world, at 51st posi-tion, below Uzbekistan (47) and Kazakhstan (49). This raises natural questions about whether the index also reflects the inherent civilizational bias of the West against Asia, most of which used to be their colonies once-to treat them as superior or even equal would be an anathema to the West. Bhutan which reckons happiness as a core responsibility of Government and has adopted its Gross National Happiness (GNH) Index as a development indicator in its 2008

life choices, (5) generosity, and (6) perceptions of corruption. The happiness rankings are based on what the authors say are "life evaluations", on which Gallup World Poll (GWP) provides the data by asking respondents to evaluate their current life on a scale of 0 to 10 (happiest), using a typical sample size of 1000 for each country regardless of its population,

and using a three-year average. The sample size is too small for a country like India to represent all its diversity and complexity. Data for per capita GDP on purchasing power parity (PPP) are taken from the World Development Indicators (WDI) of the World Bank, and then a natural log that fits the observations better.

Data for healthy life expectancy at birth is provided by the WHO Global Health Observatory data repository. Social support is the national average of the binary responses (0=no, 1=yes) to the GWP question: "If you were in trouble, do you have relatives or friends you can count on to help you whenever you need them, or not?" Freedom to make life choices is again the national average of binary responses to the GWP question: "Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with your freedom to choose what you do with your life?" Generosity is the residual of regressing the national average of GWP responses to the question: "Have you donated money to a charity in the past month?" on log GDP per capita, while perceptions of corruption are the average of binary answers to two GWP questions: "Is corruption widespread throughout the Government or not?" and "Is corruption widespread within businesses or not?" It does not require superlative intelligence to divine that all these parameters are derivatives of a single parameter, i.e., income or wealth of a nation, and hence will

always favour rich nations over the

poorer ones.

So, the richer you are, the happier you are; in other words, income is synonymous with happiness, an assumption not validated by facts, just as happiness cannot be equated with success in material terms. The mind is influenced by social and cultural factors; hence how we perceive happiness also depends on these factors. It also depends on the questions asked and the way they have been framed: Just ask "How much time you spend with your parents every week", or "For how long you have been married to your present spouse", and see how the scales turn against the rich western nations.

In collectivist societies in Asia, people reckon happiness more as a shared experience rather than individual satisfaction with life, whereas in individualistic societies, people perceive happiness more in terms of individual satisfaction. Happy people increase the happiness of others around them; hence bonding within social groups and families contributes positively to nappiness. Individualistic western nations would score higher given the way the GWP questions have been framed. As every Indian knows from experience, we are not unhappy people, having been brought up to regard values and relationships as more important than wealth and to be content to live a simple life with few material possessions, with strong bonds with our extended families and the community. Even though perceptions are changing in a growing economy, these basic values have remained intact. We do not need to feel depressed at our 126th ranking. Instead, we should ignore such a phoney index and go about our lives and business as usual. These countries are either strife-torn or warravaged, where the basic security of human life is not guaranteed, or ruled by autocrats and dictators who ruthlessly suppress the civil liberties of their people, especially of women, countries which are reeling under relentless crises in their democracy, polity and economy

This raises legitimate questions about the methodology used in the exercise that can produce such weird results. Finland has topped the ranking in each year so far, and the top 10 countries have also remained more or less the same, Finland, Denmark, Iceland, Sweden, Israel, Netherlands, Norway, Luxemburg, Switzerland and Australia. A common thread runs through all of them - high per capita income. Other higher-capita income countries also rank higher in the list, like New Zealand (21), UK

onstitution, was ranked 95th in 2019 and has not been ranked this year. GNH was the first such index and is far broader - having nine parameters, all non-income.

Trying to measure the immeasurable will have its inherent contradictions. Happiness is a state of being, rather than a fixed state like a goal to be achieved that can be quantified and measured. Such measures therefore confuse happiness with "well-being" which is produced by the interplay of numerous extraneous factors like income, health, education, liberties, choices, relationships, physical and social security, etc. But even then, it is a subjective sense of well-being, which is neither measurable nor quantifiable.

The rankings used in the World Happiness Report are based on six parameters of "subjective wellbeing": (1) per capita income, (2) healthy life expectancy at birth, (3) social support, (4) freedom to make

President Mahmoud Abbas, who has led the PA for nearly two decades and remains in overall control, announced the new government in a presidential decree on Thursday. None of the incoming ministers is a wellknown figure. Abbas tapped Mohammad Mustafa, a longtime adviser, to be prime minister earlier this month. Mustafa, a politically independent US-educated economist, had vowed to form a technocratic government and create an independent trust fund to help rebuild Gaza. Mustafa will also serve as foreign minis-

Doctors stunned by war's toll on Palestinian children

n international team of Adoctors visiting a hospital in central Gaza was prepared for the worst. But the gruesome impact Israel's war against Hamas is having on Palestinian children still left them stunned. One toddler died from a brain injury caused by an Israeli strike that fractured his skull His cousin, an infant, is still fighting for her life with part of her face blown off by the same strike.

An unrelated 10-year-old boy screamed out in pain for his parents, not knowing that they were killed in the strike. Beside him was his sister, but he didn't recognise her because burns covered almost her entire body. These gut-wrenching casualties were described to The Associated Press by Tanya Haj-Hassan, a pediatric intensivecare doctor from Jordan, following a 10-hour overnight shift at Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital in the town of Deir al-Balah

Haj-Hassan, who has extensive experience in Gaza and regu-



larly speaks out about the war's devastating effects, was part of a team that recently finished a two-week stint there. After nearly six months of war, Gaza's health sector has been decimated. Roughly a dozen of Gaza's 36 hospitals are only partially functioning. The rest have either shut down or are barely functioning after they ran out of fuel and medicine, were surrounded and raided by Israeli troops, or were damaged in fighting.

That leaves hospitals such as Al-Aqsa Martyrs caring for an

overwhelming number of patients with limited supplies and staff. The majority of its intensive care unit beds are occupied by children, including infants wrapped in bandages and wearing oxygen masks. "I spend most of my time here resuscitating children," Haj-Hassan said after a recent shift. What does that tell you about every other hospital in the Gaza Strip? A different team of internation-

al doctors working at Al-Aqsa Martyrs in January stayed at a nearby guesthouse.

Hunter Biden's lawyers push judge to toss out tax case charges

ttorneys for Hunter Biden Aasked a judge Wednesday to toss out the tax case accusing him of a four-year scheme to avoid paying USD 1.4 million in taxes while living an extravagant lifestyle. President Joe Biden's son has pleaded not guilty to the nine felony and misdemeanour tax offences. His attorneys argued the prosecution is politically motivat-ed, was tainted by leaks from IRS agents who claimed publicly the case was mishandled and includes some allegations from before he moved to California.

Prosecutors framed the claims as far-fetched during the threehour hearing. Prosecutor Leo Wise scoffed at the idea that the case was tainted by the IRS agents "who I couldn't have picked out of a lineup".

Defence attorney Abbe Lowell, on the other hand, maintained the case was hopelessly contaminated by partisan politics, calling it "the least ordinary prosecution a person could imagine".

US District Judge Mark C Scarsi appeared to be sceptical, telling Lowell the hard evi-dence for some of his claims was lacking. "You cite to a lot of things on the internet," he caid said.

Scarsi said he would likely rule on motions to dismiss by April 17.

Hunter Biden has also been charged in Delaware with lying on a federal form to buy a gun in 2018 by saying he wasn't using or addicted to illegal drugs, even though he has acknowledged being addicted to crack cocaine at the time. He has pleaded not guilty in that case, which also accuses him of possessing the gun illegally. Both cases are overseen by special counsel David Weiss and now have tentative trials scheduled for June, though defence attorneys are also trying to get the Delaware gun charges

tossed out. The two sets of charges come from a yearslong federal investigation that had been expected to wrap up over the summer with a plea deal in which Hunter Biden would have gotten two years of probation after pleading guilty to misdemeanour tax charges. The president's son, who has since repaid the back taxes with a loan, also would have avoided prosecution on the gun charge if he stayed out of trouble.

Defence attorneys argue that immunity provisions in the deal were signed by a prosecutor and are still in effect, though prosecutors disagree. But the deal that could have spared Hunter Biden the spectacle of a criminal trial during the 2024 presidential campaign unravelled after a federal judge in Delaware began to question it. Now, the tax and gun cases are moving ahead as part of an unprecedented confluence of political and legal drama: As the November election draws closer, the Justice Department is actively prosecuting both the Democratic president's son and the pre-sumptive Republican nomi-

nee, Donald Trump. Hunter Biden's original proposed plea deal with prosecutors had been pilloried as a "sweetheart deal" by "sweetheart deal" by Republicans, including Trump. The former president is facing his own criminal problems -91 charges across four cases, including that he plotted to overturn the results of the 2020 election, which he lost to Joe Biden.

Hunter Biden's criminal pro-ceedings are also happening in parallel to so-far unsuccessful efforts by congressional Republicans to link his business dealings to his father. Republicans are pursuing an impeachment inquiry into President Biden, claiming he was engaged in an influencepeddling scheme with his son. No evidence has emerged to prove that Joe Biden, as president or previously as vicepresident, abused his role or accepted bribes, though questions have arisen about the ethics surrounding the Biden family's international business dealings. In launching their Biden impeachment inquiry last year, the House Republicans relied in large part on unverified claims from an FBI informant released by Senate Republicans suggesting that payments totalling USD 10 million from Ukrainian energy company Burisma to the Bidens were discussed.

Russian President Vladimir Putin scoffed at the possibility of his country launching an attack on a NATO member, calling it "sheer nonsense," but warned that any Western air base hosting US-made F-16 fighter jets that are slated for deployment in Ukraine would be a "legitimate target" for the Kremlin's forces.

"Their statements about our alleged intention to attack Europe after Ukraine is sheer nonsense," Putin said late Wednesday, referring to warn-ings in the US and Western Europe that Russia could turn its sights on other countries unless it is stopped.

He noted that the US defence budget is more than 10 times higher than Russia's. "In view of that, are we going to wage a war against NATO? It's ravings," he told military pilots during a visit to an air base. Ukraine is awaiting the deliv

ery of F-16s, which will increase military pressure on Russia, from its Western partners. Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said last year that 42 F-16s had been promised. Ukrainian pilots have been training in the West for months on how to fly the warplanes

The F-16s require a high stan-dard of runways and reinforced hangars to protect them from bombing attacks when they are on the ground. It is not clear how many Ukrainian air bases can meet those requirements, and Russia would be certain to quickly target a few that could accommodate them

once the jets arrive. Putin warned Ukraine's Western allies against providing air bases in their countries from where the F-16s could launch sorties against the Kremlin's forces. Those bases would become a "legitimate target," he said. "F-16s are capable of carrying nuclear weapons, and we will also need to take that into account while organizing our combat operations," Putin added.

Military analysts have said the arrival of F-16s won't be a game-changer in view of Russia's massive air force and sophisticated air defence systems, though Ukrainian offi-



cials have welcomed them as an opportunity to hit back at Russia's air dominance.

Putin insisted the F-16s "won't change the situation on the battlefield?

"We will destroy their war-planes just as we destroy their tanks, armored vehicles and other equipment, including multiple rocket launchers," he said. F-16s can be used to bolster Ukraine's capability to target Russian facilities with longrange missile strikes. Pakistan SC allows military courts to announce verdicts

Pakistan's Supreme Court on Thursday conditionally allowed military courts to only announce verdicts of only announce vertices of those May 9 suspects who could be released before the upcoming Eid festival. The case is about the trial of 103 civilians for their alleged involvement in the attacks on army installations during the riots that erupted after the arrest of former premier Imran Khan.

A six-member bench of Justice Aminuddin Khan, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar, Justice Syed Azhar Hasan Rizvi, Justice Shahid Waheed, Justice Musarrat Hilali and Justice Irfan Saadat Khan heard a set of intra-court appeals (ICAs) against its Oct 23, 2023 unanimous ruling nullifying the military trials of civilians.

A five-member SC bench comprising Justices Ijazul Ahsan, Munib Akhtar, Yahya Afridi, Syed Mazahar Ali Akbar Naqvi and Ayesha Malik had unanimously declared that trying the summary," it noted. accused civilians in military During today's hearing, the

A set of ICAs followed and the court on December 13 last year suspended the verdict by a 5-1 majority till the adjudication of the appeals. The appeals were filed by the thencaretaker federal government and provinces of Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab as well as by the defence ministry.

During the last hearing on March 25, the court asked authorities to provide details about the military trials of civilians for their alleged involvement in the violent events. It ordered that it be informed about "how many suspects could be acquitted and how many could not be", adding that all details be submitted by March 28.

It also sought information on the suspects who were to be sentenced for shorter periods. "The stay order on the military courts' case will be amended according to the

gave conditional permission to military courts to announce the reserved verdicts. "Only verdict in those cases be announced in which the nominated suspects could be released before Eid," the court ruled. The attorney general also informed the court that about 20 suspects may be released after completion of their trial and other formalities, including concession in the sentence by the army chief. The court noted the assurances by Awan that those with lesser sentences would be given legal concessions. The court further said that permission to decide further appeals would be subject to the final decision on the appeals against the Oct 23 ruling. The court also directed the attorney general to submit a report on the issue to the registrar and adjourned the hearing until the last week of April. Japan leader seeks meeting with N Korea, end to deflation, to boost public support

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida reiterated on Thursday his determination to work toward a summit with North Korea's Kim Jong Un to realise the return of Japanese people believed abducted by North Korean agents in the 1970s and 80s.

"I remain committed to realising this for Japan," he told reporters, while declining to directly address the recent comments from North Korea that suggested such a meeting would be possible only if Japan stops pressing the abductions issue. Speaking at a news conference after the government budget cleared parliament, Kishida stressed he was directly involved in high-level negotiations to fix various bilater-

al problems, amid growing worries about neighbouring North Korea's missiles and nuclear weapons programmes. In 2002, Kim Jong Il, the late father of Kim Jong Un, told then-Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi that its agents had kidnapped 13 Japanese in the 1970s and 80s, and allowed five of them to return to Japan.

Japan thinks hundreds more may have been abducted during that period and that some are still alive. Koizumi's second visit to North Korea in 2004 was the last summit between the two nations.

Kishida, prime minister since 2021, also promised to wrest the nation out of decadeslong deflation and set off "a positive cycle" of higher wages, company profits and strong productivity.

"We have this historic chance to get out of deflation," Kishida said, noting that the changes will come under his "new capitalism" programme, based on economic changes such as a more mobile labour force, investments in artificial intel ligence and income growth for the middle class. He promised that legal revi

Subramanian further said that clearly 8 per cent growth target is ambitious, because India has not grown consistently at 8 per cent before, but it is achievable.

"So, the basic idea is that with the kind of growth that India has registered in the last 10 years, if we can redouble the good policies that we have implemented over the last 10 years and accelerate the reforms, then India can grow at 8 per cent from here on till 2047," he said at the Times Now Summit.

India's economy grew at better-thanexpected 8.4 per cent in the final three months of 2023, logging the fastest pace in the past one-and-a-half years.

The growth rate in October-December helped take the estimate for the current fiscal to 7.6 per cent.

Domestic drug firms to witness 8, 10 per cent revenue growth in FY25: Report

Revenue growth of leading 425 domestic drug firms is expected to moderate to 8-10 per cent in the next fiscal year, rating agency Icra said on Thursday.

The revenue of the companies, which account for 60 per cent of the overall Indian pharmaceutical industry, witnessed an increase of 13-14 per cent in the current fiscal vear.

Commenting on key risks being faced by the industry, Icra Assistant Vice President and Sector Head Mythri Macherla said the number of warning letters and import alerts issued by the USFDA to Indian drug firms have increased in the past year.

This has led to delays in product launches, translating into failure to supply penalties and entailing significant cost burden towards remedial measures like hiring consultants and consuming additional management bandwidth, thus impacting the profit margins, she added.

Further, while the ongoing Red Sea crisis has not had an impact on the Indian pharmaceutical companies as of now, any adverse impact in the form of supply chain disruptions or increase in logistics costs will be a key monitorable," Macherla stated. Besides, since price growth has been a key revenue driver, any favouring developments genericisation and inclusion of more products under the NLEM remain key risks for the industry players, she added.

In a regulatory filing, ICICI Securities said 83.8 per cent of institutional investors voted in favour of the scheme, while 67.8 per cent of non-institutional investors voted against it. Overall, 72 per cent of public shareholders voted in favour of

the delisting scheme. The shareholders of the broking firm on March 27 voted on the proposal to delist the company and make it a wholly-owned subsidiary of parent entity ICICI

the public shareholders of our company, which is in excess of the requisite majority of twothirds of the public sharehold-ers' votes required under applic-able SEBI regulations," ICICI Securities said.

The brands are likely to pass on the increase in rates, resulting in a hike in smart TV prices, according to the latest research from Counterpoint's IoT Service. However, the report also expects "smart TV shipments to increase by 9 per cent" this year, as the demand for models premium will increase and consumers will likely upgrade to a larger screen.

"The push towards online purchases is set to increase as consumers' confidence in online platforms will increasing, which encourage them to buy premium models from these platforms. The increasing preference for premium TVs

will drive the overall market's average selling price (ASP) further," it said

In 2023, India's smart TV shipments declined 16 per cent, impacted by a hit in the first half due to macroeconomic challenges inventory and excess according to a Counterpoint Research report on Thursday. The year also witnessed the premiumisation of the TV market, where consumers moved towards premium devices and large-screen smart TVs.

Now, smart TV penetration reached its highest level of 93 per cent of the overall TV shipments during the year ready and the share is expected to

continue rising, it added. "QLED TVs are gaining popularity as leading brands such as TCL, Hisense, Acer, Kodak, Thomson, and other long-tail brands have started offering them in 43," screen size variants and at lower prices (sub-Rs 30,000), due to which its shipments more than doubled in 2023, it said. | companies in India are ready

Rupee falls 6 paise to settle at 83.39 against US dollar

The rupee depreciated 6 paise to settle at 83.39 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday due to a strengthening greenback against major rivals overseas and rising crude oil prices in the international markets.

However, a firm trend in domestic equity markets and recent foreign fund inflows supported the domestic currency, forex traders said.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.32 and oscillated between the intra-day peak of 83.30 and the lowest level of 83.40 against the greenback. The local unit finally settled at 83.39 (provisional), registering a loss of 6 paise from its previous close.

On Wednesday, the rupee declined 4 paise to close at 83.33 against the US dollar.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.34 per cent higher at 104.42. Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said the Indian rupee depreciated on Thursday on strong US dollar and dollar demand from oil marketing companies (OMCs). Weak Asian



currencies and a rise in crude oil prices also weighed on the rupee. However, the surge in domestic markets and FII inflows cushioned the downside.

"We expect the rupee to trade with a slight negative bias on strong US dollar and weak Asian currencies. Demand for dollars from importers and OMCs towards the end of the financial year may put downside pressure also weigh on the rupee. However, strong domestic markets may support the rupee at lower levels. Traders may take cues from final GDP, weekly unemployment claims, pending home sales and revised

consumer sentiment data from the US. USD-INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of Rs 83.20 to Rs 83.70," Choudhary said.

Brent crude futures, the global oil benchmark, rose 0.52 per cent to USD 86.54 per barrel.

On the domestic equity market front, Sensex surged 655.04 points, or 0.90 per cent, to settle at 73,651.35 points. The Nifty rose 203.25 points, or 0.92 per cent, to close at 22,326.90 points. to tackle today's threats, with 59 per cent of organisations falling into the "beginner or formative stages of readiness". Globally, 3 per cent of companies are at a "mature stage", meaning they are prepared to har cybersecurity risks, it said.

Cisco said while companies are building defences against these attacks, they are slowed down by their own overly complex security postures that are dominated by multiple-point solutions. The study is based on a survey



of 8,136 private sector business leaders - over 1,000 of them from India — who have cybersecurity responsibilities in their organisations.

The study revealed that 82 per cent of the participants expect surveyed а

cybersecurity incident to disrupt their business in the next 12-24 months.

"The cost of being unprepared can be substantial, as 74 per cent of respondents said they experienced a cybersecurity incident in the last 12 months, and 55 per cent of those affected said it cost them at

least USD 300,000," it said. It further said the traditional approach of adopting multiple cybersecurity point solutions has not delivered effective results, as 88 per cent of respondents admitted that having multiple point solutions slowed down their team's ability to detect, respond, and recover from incidents. While companies are aware of cybersecurity risks, talent gap further intensifies the issue, it said

"Progress is being further hampered by critical talent shortages, with 91 per cent of companies highlighting it as an issue. In fact, 59 per cent of companies said they had more than 10 roles related to cybersecurity unfilled in their organisation at the time of the survey," the study noted. However, businesses are

increasing their investments to tackle the issue with 71 per cent planning to significantly upgrade their IT infrastructure in the next 12-24 months, the study added.

Juan says he is bitter about Italian league not punishing Acerbi

AP MILAN

Napoli defender Juan Jesus says he has been left feeling "very bitter" and "crestfallen" by the Italian league's decision not to punish Inter Milan player Francesco Acerbi for an allegedly racist remark toward him.

The Italian league's sporting judge announced on Tuesday that there wasn't enough proof that Acerbi's insult to Juan Jesus was racist to impose what would have been a lengthy ban on the Italy defender.

The alleged incident happened during a match between Inter and Napoli on March 17 and the match was halted for about 90 seconds when Juan Jesus, who is Black, told the referee that Acerbi directed a racial slur at him. "I have read several times and

with great disappointment the decision of the sports judge, who felt there was no evidence that I was the victim of a racist insult during the match," Juan Jesus said in a statement on Wednesday. "While respecting the decision, it is one I find difficult to comprehend and it leaves me feeling very bitter. "Quite honestly I am



crestfallen by such a serious incident in which my only mistake was that I dealt with it as a gentleman,' deciding not to interrupt an important game, with all the inconvenience that would have caused the spectators watching the match. I did so believing that such an attitude would have been respected, and perhaps taken as an example."

Juan Jesus was visibly upset when he approached the referee during the second half at San Siro and was also pointing at his shirt sleeve which had a Keep Racism Out' badge - as part of the league's anti-racism

campaign. The 32-year-old Brazilian said after the match that Acerbi apologized and seemed to wish to put the matter behind him, adding, "What happens on the field, stays on the field

... he is a good guy." The Italian soccer federation prosecutor questioned the players and witnesses last week and a report was sent to the Italian league sporting judge, who also studied images from the match, as well as audio from the referee and VAR before making the decision not to sanction

Acerbi. "Following this decision, I imagine that anyone else finding themselves in a similar situation to mine will act in a very different manner, in order to protect themselves and to curb the disgrace of racism, which, sadly, we are struggling to rid ourselves of," Juan Jesus' statement continued.

"I do not feel in any way protected by a decision which both admits that there was certainly evidence of the insult' and maintains there is no certainty that it was of a discriminatory nature, which only I perceived in good faith?

Chelsea, Lyon advance to Women Champions League semifinals

Egoing out on the ultimate high at Čhelsea moved a step closer on Wednesday as the London club reached the Women's Champions League semifinals after a 1-1 draw with Ajax. Chelsea advanced 4-1 on aggregate after winning the first leg in Amsterdam 3-0. Hayes takes over the U.S.

Women's national team at the end of the season, when she will lead its bid to win Olympic gold in Paris.

Before that, she is aiming to win a quadruple of trophies with Chelsea - including the Champions League for the first time.

The Women's Super League champion had effectively secured its place in the next round after a dominant performance in the first leg of the quarterfinals at Ajax. And it extended its overall advantage to 4-0 on aggregate after Mayra Ramirez's goal in the 33rd minute at Stamford Bridge. Chasity Grant scored in the

65th to give Ajax some consolation and a 1-1 draw on the night. While Chelsea is searching for its first Women's Champions League trophy, Lyon is hunting a record-extending ninth.

The French champion advanced to the semifinals for a record 13th time after a 4-1 win over Benfica.

Delphine Cascarino and Kadidiatou Diani scored two goals each as record eighttime champion Lyon won 6-2 on aggregate at Groupama Stadium after a 2-1 first leg win in Portugal.

Cascarino's goal in the first leg had set up Lyon's comeback win after trailing 1-0 at halftime of that match. And she tightened the French champions' control of the tie when she opened the scoring in the 43rd of the second leg with a

"We need to show what we are truly worth, who we are, and that we are Ukraine, that Ukraine is a great, united, and strong country in many respects," he said.

Trying to live life as normally as possible has become a way for Ukrainians to show defiance amid Russian missile strikes and drone attacks.

Keeping youth active in sports and other activities is also a way to keep their minds off a war that has deeply traumatized families across the country, said Anatolii Kartashov, a coach at Sporting Kyiv.
