Kejriwal stir chokes Central Delhi

AAP seeks Delhi CM release, BJP his resignation

The national Capital on Tuesday witnessed massive protests led separately by the Bharatiya Janata Party and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP).

While AAP workers attempted to 'gherao' the Prime Minister residence in Lutyens' Zone, seeking release of their supremo Arvind Kejriwal from the Enforcement Directorate's custody, the BJP organised protest demanding that the arrested Chief Minister step down from his post.

Kejriwal, who was arrested on March 21 and subsequently remanded to ED custody till March 28 by a Delhi court, faces charges of direct involvement in a conspiracy related to the formulation of the excise policy favouring specific individuals.

The protests led to massive traffic jams in the Central and New Delhi areas and as preventive measures the Delhi Police issued directions to shut down the entry and exit gates of the Lok Kalyan Metro Station from where the PM's residence is nearby.

The Delhi Police beefed up security in several parts of the national Capital,

including around the PM's residence and Central Delhi, by deploying its personnel and those of paramilitary forces. Prohibitory orders under section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure were imposed in the Patel Chowk area.

A senior police officer said they cannot allow anyone to gather and added that in view of this, "we have to clear this area". "We will not allow anybody to gather here," he said. Deputy Commissioner of Police of New Delhi Devesh Kumar had earlier warned that those who gather at the chowk to demonstrate would be detained immediately.

Kavitha remanded in judicial custody till April 9

A court here on Tuesday sent ABRS leader K Kavitha to judicial custody till April 9 on a plea made by the Enforcement Directorate that the "highly influential" arrestee, if released, is likely to influence witnesses and tamper with evidence. The 46-year-old leader was arrested by the Central probe agency on March 15 in a Delhi excise policy-linked money laundering case.

The federal probe agency's application seeking 15-day jail custody was filed before Special Judge Kaveri Bawaja, saying an investigation into economic crimes was more complex than ordinary crimes as economic offenders were influential, resourceful and committed the crime meticulously. The plea sought her judicial custody on the ground that "the arrestee is highly influential and there is every likelihood the arrestee will influence the witnesses and tamper with the evidence if released, (and) it may hamper the ongoing investigation."

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BJP to go solo in Punjab

After days of parleys with the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), the BJP on Tuesday announced that it will contest the upcoming Lok Sabha polls on its own in Punjab, with the announcement coming amid 'hints' from its ex-ally SAD that the latter could go solo in the border State. With this development, the border State will see a four-cornered contest in the general elections. Punjab is the latest State after the BJP and Naveen Patnaik-led BJD alliance did not work out despite days of deliberations and both announced to go solo in Odisha. The BJD last month had supported the Rajya Sabha candidature of Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw.

Both the SAD and the BJD were the natural ally of the BJP for years until SAD broke ranks from the NDA after the controversial farm laws which however now stands repealed.

The SAD's latest decision is a major shift from late Parkash Singh Badal's 24-year policy of "unconditional support" to the BJP from 1996 to 2020. The two parties had formed an alliance in 1996 and had been fighting elections together. In 2019, they won two Lok Sabha seats each in Punjab. This will be the first Lok Sabha poll since 1998 which the BJD and SAD will contest alone. In the first Assembly poll they fought separately and both suffered jolts with the BJP winning two and Akalis 3 seats out of 117 and AAP sweeping with 92.

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US comments on AAP chief arrest

After Germany, the United States of America Government on Tuesday said they are closely watching the arrest of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and support a fair, transparent, and prompt legal process.

"We encourage a fair, transparent, and timely legal process for Chief Minister Kejriwal," news agencies quoted a US State

Department spokesperson as saying.

The US Government's response follows India's summoning of a senior diplomat from the German Embassy to express its objection to the country's remarks regarding Kejriwal's arrest.

In a statement, Germany's foreign affairs spokesperson expressed hope that the "standards regarding the independence of the



judiciary and fundamental democratic principles" would be upheld in Kejriwal's case. "...Like anyone facing accusations, Kejriwal is entitled to a fair and impartial trial, this includes he can make use of all available legal avenues without restrictions. The presumption of innocence is a central element of the rule of law and must apply to him [sic]," the spokesperson said.

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Efforts on to find stolen vehicle of JP Nadda wife

The Delhi Police has launched an operation to find the stolen luxury car linked to BJP National president JP Nadda. A Toyota Fortuner, belonging to Nadda's wife Mallika Nadda, was stolen while it was taken for servicing on March 19. Despite CCTV footage showing the vehicle registration number HP-03-D-0021 heading towards Gurugram with a Himachal Pradesh registration, efforts to locate it remain futile.

According to the report, the vehicle was brought to Govinpur after servicing by its driver Joginder. An FIR has been lodged based on the driver's complaint, as authorities intensify efforts to recover the seven-seater SUV, valued between ₹33 lakh to ₹51 lakh.

Mallika is the chief of 'Special Olympics Bharat', a national sports federation registered under the Indian Trust Act 1882 in 2001. Recognised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, the organisation works to develop sports for persons with intellectual disabilities. In the past, the Delhi Police has demonstrated swift resolution in cases involving prominent figures and leaders. For instance, in the 2019 incident where Prime Minister Narendra Modi's niece Damayanti Ben had her purse snatched in Delhi's Civil Lines area, the Delhi Police mobilised 700 personnel and meticulously reviewed 200 CCTV recordings to apprehend the perpetrators.

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Majestic cats continue to perish

The recent discovery of carcasses of two tiger cubs in Madhya Pradesh's Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve and a tigress in Uttar Pradesh's Kheri forest division has brought the total tiger death toll to 39 even as the third month of this year is yet to conclude.

This accounts to nearly one tiger death every alternate day, underlining the multifaceted threats confronting these majestic animals, particularly territorial fights given that out of the total deaths, majority ie 22 occurred within tiger reserves, while 17 were reported from non-protected areas. The other threats encompass habitat loss, territorial disputes, human-wildlife conflicts, poaching, and other illicit activities.

This alarming rate equates to nearly one tiger death every alternate day and highlights the various threats faced by tigers, including habitat loss, territorial fights, human-wildlife conflict, poaching, and other illicit activities. At least 22 perished inside the tiger reserves while 17 in non-protected areas. Fateh Singh Ninama, the sub-divisional forest officer from Madhya Pradesh said the carcasses of the cubs, both less than a year old, were found in separate locations within the Panpatha and Khitoli ranges of the Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve.

He said while one cub died as a result of a territorial fight, investigations are on to find the reason behind the death of another young tiger whose body was found deceased near Gadhpuri village in the Khitoli range in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve which has already lost five majestic cats till date this year.

Kanha Tiger Reserve in the State has recorded three tiger fatalities. Overall, the top tiger State ie Madhya Pradesh has lost

12 big royal cats so far till March 26, 2024.

In a separate incident in the South Kheri forest Division of Uttar Pradesh, a tigress was discovered dead. Sanjay Biswal, divisional officer of the South Kheri forest division, said the tigress was found dead on Monday, with all vital organs intact, suggesting no involvement of poachers.

The data shows that the royal predators have been unsafe not only in non-protected areas but also inside reserves, given that many deaths have occurred outside the tiger reserves. Overall while Madhya Pradesh reported highest tiger death at 12, followed by Maharashtra at seven fatalities while Karnataka lost five felines. Last year, a total 181 majestic cats had died as per the NTCA data while according to figures compiled by non-profit Wildlife Protection Society of India (WPSI), India lost a record 204 tigers from January 1-December 25, 2023.

Mumbai surpasses Beijing as billionaire hub

India's financial hub Mumbai has emerged as "Asia's billionaire epicentre" for the first time, surpassing Beijing, as per the Hurun Global Rich List 2024.

According to the list, Mumbai now boasts 92 billionaires, edging past Beijing's count of 91. While Mumbai added 26 new ultra-rich to the club, Beijing lost 18. "Mumbai was the fastest-growing billionaire capital in the world, adding 26 in the year and taking it to third in the world and Asia's billionaire capital. New Delhi broke into the Top 10 for the


first time," the report read. India has ranked third in the list of the world's richest people, with 271 billionaires, as per a new global list, which said that Mumbai has

emerged as Asia's billionaire capital, with Reliance Industries chairman Mukesh Ambani occupying a key spot in the list. Globally, Mumbai now ranks third in terms of


billionaires after New York, which has 119 and London 97, as per Hurun's list. Industries that the report attributed India's growth in rank were Pharmaceuticals (39) and Automobile and Auto Components (27). As per the list, there are 3,279 billionaires in the world today, with 167 of them added in the previous year. The United States added 109 billionaires, maintaining its lead with a total of 800 billionaires, while China, despite a decline of 155 billionaires, retained its position as the world's leader with 814 billionaires.

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Election manifesto lands DMK in trouble

The ruling DMK in Tamil Nadu has landed itself in trouble as a fall out of the party's overenthusiasm in amassing maximum number of seats in the ensuing Lok Sabha elections.

The election manifesto of the DMK raised many eye brows because of the content and narrative in it. An outfit by name Hindu Makkal Katchi (Hindu People Party), a non-political organization has complained to the Election Commission of India against the Dravidian major for peddling "blatant lies" through the manifesto. Arjun Sampath, the founder of the HMK, told The Pioneer that the DMK's manifesto drafted by a team led by M K Kanimozhi MP (daughter of late M Karunanidhi, former chief minister, by his third wife Rajathi) who happens to be Chief Minister Stalin's step-sister, has hints of fair amount of secessionism. "This has been added to attract the Tamil chauvinists and secessionists in the State," said Arjun Sampath. He said the manifesto speaks about exemption of Tamil Nadu from the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) for admission to the undergraduate and postgraduate courses in medical schools in the State. "Stalin and the DMK have forgotten the fact that it was the UPA Government that ruled India from 2004 to 2014 that introduced NEET, a uniform med-



ical entrance examination applicable to the whole of India. Though this was challenged by management of private medical schools, the Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court ratified the decision and hence the whole country is following NEET mode for medical school admission. If Stalin declares that NEET would not be allowed in Tamil Nadu, he is forgetting the fact that the State is part of Indian union," said Sampath. He pointed out that the election Manifesto has stated that the Sethusamudram Shipping Channel Project which was stalled by regressive forces would be revived soon if the INDIA front in which the DMK is the major constituent comes to power. The Sethusamudram Project work was stalled by Supreme Court when it found that the channel would be an ecological hazard and not be economically viable. "The DMK wants to destroy

and demolish the sacred Ram Sethu, worshipped by the Hindus under the pretext of constructing the channel," he said. The DMK has also raked up the Rs 15 lakh charge against Prime Minister Narendra Modi. It is alleged in the manifesto that Modi had promised the people of the country that he would deposit Rs 15 lakh in the bank account of each individual but this promise remains unfulfilled. "The allegation that the Prime Minister had promised Rs 15 lakh to the citizens itself is a lie. He has never made such a promise. We are taking up this issue with the Chief Election Commissioner," said Arjun Sampath. He wanted the DMK leadership to prove that Modi had made such a promise to the electorate. He said the DMK and its allies like MDMK and VCK have already made it known that they prefer to secede from the Indian Union.

TMC writes to EC over Ghosh remarks against Mamata

The Trinamool Congress has strongly objected to unparliamentary languages being used by senior BJP leader Dilip Ghosh against Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

In a protest letter to the Election Commission of India the party has demanded action under the Model Code of Conduct, Bengal minister Chandrima Bhattacharya on Tuesday said adding an eight-member team of the party would meet the ECI officials on Wednesday in that regard. The BJP has shifted Ghosh a sitting MP from Midnapore to Burdwan-Durgapur constituency where he will take on TMC candidate and former India player Kirti Azad.

"We have demanded strong action against Dilip Ghosh who is a senior leader of his party for using derogatory and filthy words against a woman who is also the Chief Minister of our State," Bhattacharya said adding the people of Bengal were watching the level of BJP's admiration for women. "Tomorrow an eight-member TMC delegation would go to the ECI and meet the officials there ... the team will also consist of men as we believe men and women are complementary to each other and the men have always played an important role in preserving the dignity of women," she said. RMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh too attacked Ghosh for using uncouth language against the Chief Minister reminding him how his party had "kicked him out of his home constituency at Midnapore for not being polite to people."



Kunal Ghosh said "Dilip Ghosh lacks basic political culture and has a bad groomer as he does not even know how to behave with women ... he has used bad words against Mamata Banerjee earlier also and the people of Bengal make his party pay the price for that ... this time also the people are watching it all and they will definitely give a befitting reply." In its letter to the ECI the TMC wrote "such remarks not only attempt to undermine the stature of Smt. Mamata Banerjee but also directly attack her personal character and modesty, which amounts to blatant violation of the MCC. It is expected that our political representatives engage in responsible and respectful dialogue, regardless of ideological differences or political affiliations."

The ECI has asked the district administration for reports on the matter, sources said. In a passing reference to the Chief Minister Ghosh had earlier during a Holi party said that "Mamata Banerjee should first decide about her parentage before every time calling herself a daughter of this place or that." The TMC rank and file erupted in anger as Ghosh said, "we have seen in the past too how she told in Goa that she is the

daughter of that place ... then she claimed to be the daughter of Tripura during her campaign in that State ... and she has always been asking for votes saying she is the daughter of Bengal ... she should first decide about her real parentage because it is not honourable to change parentage every time."

TMC workers even raised slogans outside a venue where Ghosh had come to celebrate Holi party leading to counter-sloganeering by the saffron workers.

TMC MP Sushmita Deb said "for the past two days, the BJP leaders have been giving long speeches against the insult of one of their women candidates. But the kind of statements the BJP is issuing against the only woman chief minister of this country is against the politics and traditions of this country. The BJP is frustrated in Bengal. It is losing."

Wondering why the BJP's national leadership or for that the National Commission for Women were not speaking a word against Ghosh a former State president and a national vice president of the party Deb "I would like to tell the BJP leaders and NCW chief - you are so concerned about the woman candidate of the BJP but people like you should be ashamed that whenever Mamata Didi is insulted by the BJP, you stay silent. This is your hypocrisy. The country would give you a reply for the same." Meanwhile, experts said that Ghosh's off-the-cuff remark might just have provided the TMC a political device to set off the political advantage the BJP had recently extracted out of the Sandeshkhali incident where the village women were

allegedly sexually victimized by the men of local TMC strongman Sheikh Shahjahan. "As it is not usual for a politician of Dilip Ghosh's experience and maturity to use such insensitive words before the elections without considering their impact it seems that he

may just have consciously done so handing out a weapon to the opposition perhaps to teach a lesson to his rival group in the State party that is apparently responsible for his forced transfer from Midnapore to Burdwan-Durgapur," said BN Majumdar an election expert.

10 injured in TMC, BJP clash in Bengal

At least 10 people were injured as violence erupted in parts of Bengal, sources said adding the members of TMC and the BJP clashed at Kumirmari in Gosaba block under Joynagar parliamentary constituency in South 24 Parganas.

Clashes erupted over alleged "area domination" by the rival parties, sources said adding several members of each party had been injured and were hospitalized. "The BJP is making it a political issue but the clash was local," said local TMC MLA Shaukat Molla conceding that members of both the parties were injured in the clash. The BJP leaders however said that the TMC was "trying to stop our men from campaigning in the area leading to skirmishes." Similar face-offs were reported from Dinhata in Cooch Behar district of North Bengal where a local TMC leader alleged that BJP men had thrown bombs at his house though no one was injured. Clashes also took place at Kanthalia village in Behramore constituency

where the BJP and TMC workers came to blows over the control of a particular area. In Capital Kolkata too the members of the two parties exchanged blows at Bansdroni in South Kolkata. They were fighting for the control of a wall on which the rival parties were staking claims for writing wall graffiti source said. Meanwhile, after receiving complaints that the police were not guiding the central forces to sensitive areas for domination the Election Commission has directed the police administration to report every such move and keep the EC posted on day-to-day basis.

"The police administration will be required to inform the Commission on day-to-day basis and that will again be put online ... the people and all other stake holders are free to bring such lapses if any to the notice of the Commission," officials said. Earlier the voters and even the political parties complained to the ECI saying the police were leading the CAPF to wrong and rather peaceful areas and skirting the sensitive zones for the purpose of area domination.

IIT Mandi develops solution to OTP frauds

With the alarming rise in OTP frauds and instances of password hacking, the researchers at IIT Mandi have developed a revolutionary system which will capture unique user biometric-based behaviour patterns for secure authentication, eliminating the use of conventional methods. The system called "adapID" has been developed in collaboration with Deep Algorithms with Amit Shukla from the Center for Artificial Intelligence and Robotics (CAIR) at Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Mandi and J P Mishra from Deep Algorithms, spearheading the development of the tool -- a behaviour biometric-based authentication system leveraging haptics data. Deep Algorithms is an IIT Mandi and IIT Kanpur incubated company with its head office in Hyderabad, Research and Development office in IIT Mandi and partner office in the USA. The system has already been granted a patent and has



been deployed at a bank and a forensic company. The team is currently in talks with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MEITY) to use it for authentication in government schemes. Those involved in the development of the system explained that in today's digitally driven landscape, organisations encounter the daunting challenge of safeguarding sensitive data against relentless cyber threats while ensuring a seamless user experience. "Conventional authentication methods relying on passwords and static security measures

prove inadequate, leaving organisations susceptible to breaches and burdening users with cumbersome access processes. The escalating instances of cyber fraud, notably attributed to OTP compromises, have spurred organisations to seek robust solutions to fortify against unauthorised access and data breaches," according to Shukla. "Traditional authentication methods, dependent on passwords and OTPs, increasingly succumb to phishing attacks and brute force breaches, thereby compromising security and user satisfaction. AdapID will

herald a paradigm shift in secure authentication by harnessing the potency of behavioural and physiological biometrics, offering unparalleled security measures," he added. Shukla explained that the innovative approach will obviate the necessity for passwords and OTPs, streamlining user access processes while bolstering defences against emerging threats. "The adapID AI adaptive authentication integrates behavioural and physiological biometrics, presenting a multi-layered authentication framework that dynamically adapts to evolving user behaviour. This password-less authentication system will employ advanced technology, encompassing invisible keyboard features and decentralised web protocols, to establish a novel standard in secure authentication," he said. "Our groundbreaking behaviour biometric-based system will redefine secure authentication, effectively eliminating the reliance on passwords and introducing seamless continuous authentication. With adapID, we not only aim to rev-

olutionise security protocols but also empower organisations to navigate the complexities of the digital age with unwavering confidence," he said. Deep Algorithms' J P Mishra explained that adapID addresses an array of cyber threats, including fraud, unauthorised access and phishing attacks, spanning across industries such as financial services, government, technology and critical infrastructure. "By furnishing the most robust form of authentication and discerning anomalies in user behaviour, adapID equips organisations with a dynamic and adaptive security posture. As organisations navigate the intricate landscape of cyber-security threats, adapID will emerge as a pioneering solution, presenting a dynamic, adaptive and secure authentication framework. "With its innovative integration of behavioural biometrics and continuous authentication, the innovation will establish a new benchmark in secure authentication, empowering organisations to safeguard sensitive data," Mishra said.

When questioned about India's protest to Germany, the US State Department spokesperson directed inquiries to the German Foreign Ministry for comments on their discussions with the Indian Government.

Kejriwal, the chief of the Aam Aadmi Party, was arrested on March 21 by the Enforcement Directorate in connection with the Delhi liquor policy case. The case involves allegations of corruption and money laundering in the formulation and implementation of the Delhi Government's excise policy for 2021-22, which was subsequently revoked. Kejriwal has denied any wrongdoing, and his party has labeled his arrest as a "political vendetta" by the ruling BJP ahead of the general elections.

Meanwhile, India witnessed a significant rise in its billionaire population, ranking third globally with 271 billionaires, marking an addition of 84 individuals, the second-highest rise after the United States. "The 2024 Hurun Global Rich List underscores India's ascension as a future economic titan, poised to secure its place as the world's third-largest economy. Surpassing all but the United States, India's unprecedented billionaire boom propels Mumbai past Beijing, crowning it as Asia's billionaire epicentre. Yet, as we stand on the brink of

revolutions in electric vehicles, space technology, and AI, India's startup ecosystem is just beginning to unveil its potential. The next decade holds a clear message: overlooking the Indian narrative is a risk no visionary can afford," said Anas Rahman Junaid, founder and chief researcher of Hurun India.

The report added that China had a bad year, "HK was down 20 per cent, Shenzhen down 19 per cent, and Shanghai down per cent." Other nations with the maximum number of billionaires are the UK, Germany, Switzerland, Russia, Italy, France and Brazil.

The purse, containing Rs 56,000 cash, two mobile phones, and crucial documents, was promptly recovered. AAP leaders and workers tried to march towards the Prime Minister's residence on Lok Kalyan Marg raising slogans of 'Inquilab Zindabad' and 'Kejriwal Zindabad', with many being detained at Patel Chowk including senior AAP leader Somnath Bharti, Delhi Assembly Deputy Speaker Rakhi Birla and Punjab Minister Harjot Singh Bains. Claiming that the Delhi Police has turned Delhi into a 'fortress', AAP Delhi unit convener Gopal Rai told a Press conference that the way the BJP-led Central Government has imposed restrictions under section 144 'across the city', it seems Delhi has become a 'police state'.

Rai asserted that the fight against the 'dictatorship' in the country is the struggle of those who love democracy and the Constitution, and announced that preparations are now underway for a "maharally" at the Ramlila ground, by the INDIA Bloc, on March 31.

"I want to warn the Centre that this movement will not stop with the use of police force," Rai said and claimed that women workers of his party were dragged and detained.

Meanwhile, at least 57 BJP members, including the

party's Delhi chief Virendra Sachdeva, were detained and water cannons used during its protest march to demand the resignation of the CM.

BJP workers and leaders, including national secretary Manjinder Singh Sirsa, sitting MPs Dr Harshvardhan, Manoj Tiwari, Ramesh Bidhuri, Leader of Opposition in Delhi Assembly Ramvir Singh Bidhuri and BJP Lok Sabha candidate Bansuri Swaraj took part in the protest, demanding that Kejriwal resigns.

They gathered near the Ferozshah Kotla stadium and marched towards the Delhi Secretariat, carrying their party's flag and raising slogans such as 'Kejriwal Sharm Karo' and 'Kejriwal Istifa Do'.

"To disperse the protesters, water cannons were used. Some of them were detained from near the Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg when they tried to break through a layer of barricades," a police officer said. Police said some workers climbed over barricades while marching towards the secretariat.

"Kejriwal has been arrested, and therefore, he should resign on moral grounds and give his responsibility to someone else," Harshvardhan said.

Scores of party workers, along with Sachdeva, were taken to Kamla Nagar Police Station by Central District Police.

Slamming Kejriwal for issuing directions to his Ministers while being in the ED custody, BJP national secretary Manjinder Singh Sirsa said that a Chief Minister cannot issue directions while being in custody and alleged that the AAP was creating a drama. He also said a complaint has been lodged to the Lieutenant Governor (LG) Vinai Kumar Saxena urging him to take strict action in the matter.

BJP MP Manoj Tiwari said a Government cannot be run from jail. "You can run a gang from jail but not a Government. A Government can run only as per the Constitution," he said.

In his latest order from ED custody, Health Minister and AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj said Kejriwal has issued directions to ensure that medicines and tests are available to people at all Government hospitals and Mohalla Clinics. On Sunday, Water Minister Atishi had said the Chief Minister from ED custody had directed her to solve water and sewer related problems in some areas of Delhi.

BJP to go solo...

Meanwhile, the BJP received a shot in the arm in Punjab on Tuesday as three-term Congress MP Ravneet Singh Bittu from the State joined the party. Bittu is the grandson of former Punjab Chief Minister Beant Singh, a hero of anti-terrorism campaign in the State who was assassinated in a terror attack while still in office. He currently represents Ludhiana in the outgoing Lok Sabha.

"... The party has decided that we will contest all 13 seats on our own. We want to remain in direct contact with the people of Punjab... We are sure, Modi will win in Punjab also..." said Delhi BJP leader Manjinder Singh Sirsa, former MLA from Delhi Assembly and prominent Sikh leader said on Tuesday. Earlier, Punjab BJP unit president Sunil Jakhar issued a video statement on X (formerly Twitter) to announce that the party will fight alone in the State. "The BJP is going to contest the Lok Sabha elections alone," Jakhar said in a video message posted on X. This decision was taken based on the feedback of people, party workers and leaders. The decision has been taken for the future of Punjab and the betterment of the youth, farmers, traders, labourers and the downtrodden, he

said.

Jakhar exuded confidence that the people of Punjab will further strengthen the BJP by voting for it in large numbers on June 1.

After the BJP announced its decision, SAD chief Sukhbir Singh Badal said "for us, principles are more important than the number game," and reiterated his party's commitment to Punjab and the community. The alliance talks are learnt to have failed on a range of issues mainly the Akali Dal insistence on a larger share of Lok Sabha seats. The BJP was seeking five of the 13 segments and preferably six. The Akali were comfortable giving four, said sources, adding that even the electoral situation signalled that it was better for the BJP to go alone. Besides, the BJP believes Ram Mandir consecration and the PM's pro-development pitch may generate greater support for it this time. The Akalis meanwhile were also learnt to be wary of the alliance in the wake of farmers' agitation.

In September 2020, however, Akali Dal left the NDA after the Central Government brought in the contentious farm laws, which led to farmer protests in north India. While most cultivators were from Punjab, those from neighbouring States such as Haryana and Uttar Pradesh joined in as well.

Commuters face hardship as BJP, AAP protest

Amid protests by the BJP and the AAP in the national Capital on Tuesday, commuters travelling in the city faced inconvenience while being met with traffic jams in Central Delhi during their journey.

Taking note of the situation in light of the protests organised by the political parties, Delhi Police beefed up security in several parts of the national Capital, including around the PM's residence and Central Delhi, by deploying its personnel and those of paramilitary forces.

Due to protests, nine hours after shutting the gates of Lok Kalyan Marg metro station due to security reasons, the

DMRC has opened its entry and exit on Tuesday evening, officials said. Two gates of Patel Chowk and Central Secretariat metro station were also opened, they said.

Ahead of the AAP's protest against Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's arrest, the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) on Tuesday closed the entry and exit gates at Lok Kalyan Marg metro station. The entry and exit have been restricted at Patel Chowk and Central Secretariat metro stations.

"Due to security reasons, entry/exit at Lok Kalyan Marg Metro station, Gate no 3 of Patel Chowk Metro Station and Gate no 5 of Central Secretariat Metro station will remain closed till further

notice," the DMRC said in a post on X.

Later in the evening, the DMRC said that the entry and exit gates at Lok Kalyan Marg metro station have been opened. Gate number 3 of Patel Chowk metro station and gate number 5 of Central Secretariat metro station are now open for entry and exit.

"There is no permission to hold protest. We also got information that protesters will gather at the Patel Chowk Metro station. In view of that, we have stepped up security arrangements," Deputy Commissioner of Police (New Delhi) Devesh Kumar said.

Security personnel in anti-riot gear were seen around the metro stations and at other places in the Central Delhi area.



Kumar said if protesters try to reach and gather, they will be detained immediately.

"We have proper security arrangements at the prime minister's residence and the Patel Chowk metro station. Protest will not be allowed. As

common people also travel by the metro, they will not be disturbed. We have deployed staff to identify protesters and to detain them," the DCP said.

Another senior police officer said that "robust security arrangements have been made.

We have installed layers of security to maintain law and order situation in the area".

Prohibitory orders under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure have been already imposed around the prime minister's residence, and no one will be allowed to protest there, the officer said.

Traffic movement is likely to be affected in parts of New Delhi and Central Delhi due to the proposed "gherao", an officer of the Delhi Traffic Police said.

Diversions have also been put in place at seven points, police said.

"Commuters must avoid Kemal Ataturk Marg, Safdarjung Road, Akbar Road and Teen Murti Marg on Tuesday in view of protest," the officer said.

The security arrangements

come after AAP leader and Delhi Minister Gopal Rai had announced plans of the party to "gherao" the prime minister's residence on Tuesday, as a form of protest against the arrest of Kejriwal by the ED.

The Delhi Traffic Police has made special arrangements, restricting the movement of vehicles in the national capital's central part.

In an advisory, it said traffic in central Delhi will be affected and parking of vehicles will not be allowed on Tughlaq Road, Safdarjung Road and Kemal Ataturk Marg.

Traffic will be affected in the New Delhi area due to a special law and order arrangement, the advisory stated.

"To ensure smooth traffic management in the New Delhi

area, no vehicle will be allowed to halt or park anywhere on Tughlak Road, Safdarjung Road and Kemal Ataturk Marg, general entry for the public will not be allowed, and vehicles found parked on the above roads shall be towed away and prosecuted for improper parking and disobedience of lawful instructions," it said.

If needed, traffic will be diverted from Aurobindo Chowk, Tughlaq Road, Samrat Hotel roundabout, Gymkhana Post Office roundabout, Teen Murti Haifa roundabout, Niti Marg roundabout and Kautliya Marg roundabout, it added.

The traffic police also requested commuters to avoid Kemal Ataturk Marg, Safdarjung Road, Akbar Road and Teen Murti Marg.

Kejriwal issues another order from jail: Minister

Amid the ongoing controversy surrounding the Delhi Chief Minister's first order issued from the custody on Sunday which is being investigated by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj on Tuesday came out with another directive issued to the health department by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on smooth functioning of the AAP's flagship Mohalla Clinics.

After the AAP supremo's directions, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government has called a special session of Delhi Assembly on Wednesday to discuss the availability on free medicines in Mohalla Clinics.

The chief secretary has been asked to give a status report on the free medicines and free tests in hospitals and mohalla clinics.

The Health Minister has said that if there is a shortage of free medicines, then the chief secretary should come up with an action plan to fix the issue.

He further asked the chief secretary to also give a complete plan to tackle the issue of a shortage of free tests, if there is any.

Taking cognizance of the second directions, ED sources said it will probe the party's claim as no stationery is allowed for those in custody.

Sources said both Atishi and Saurabh Bharadwaj will be questioned on the source of the purported "order", and who brought it and delivered it to her and when. Sources said the agency will verify the claim through CCTV footage.

Earlier, addressing a press conference, Bharadwaj said that despite being in jail, Arvind Kejriwal is worried about the health of the people



of Delhi. "He has issued me a direction in this regard. In his direction, he said that free medicines are not available in some of the Delhi hospitals and mohalla clinics. Besides, free tests are also not being conducted in some of them," Bharadwaj said. "He has directed me to solve these issues."

The Health Minister said Kejriwal received information about problems in laboratory tests available at Mohalla Clinics and issued the directions. "His order is God's order to us. Shri Arvind Kejriwal is in jail, but he is fully concerned about the health facilities in Delhi," said the Health Minister.

The health department will act immediately to address the issues, Bharadwaj said. He said the latest directions from Kejriwal show that despite being in custody, he always thinks about the wellbeing of the people of Delhi.

Bharadwaj said in Delhi, lakhs of people are fully dependent on free medicines in government hospitals as they cannot afford to buy them. "Some people need life-long medicines such as those suffering from diabetes and blood pressure. There are some kidney patients who need dialysis," said the Health Minister.

Earlier on Sunday, Kejriwal had issued the first order while in the ED's custody, directing Water Minister Atishi to resolve water and sewage issues in the national Capital.

Hospitals directed to ensure all CCTV cameras functional

The Delhi Government on Tuesday directed all hospitals and medical colleges under its jurisdiction to ensure that all the CCTVs installed in their premises are functional to ensure safety of doctors and students, particularly women.

The directive follows Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj's call for urgent action by the Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena on March 21, against a professor accused of assault at BSA college, Rohini, citing the Chief Secretary's perceived lack of empathy for victims.

Protests had erupted outside the college premises earlier this week after several female students alleged physical abuse and sexual harassment by the professor. A case has been registered in the matter and police have been deployed outside the college premises to avoid any untoward incident.

However, to ensure that such untoward incidents do not happen in other colleges and hospitals, the State Government has issued a directive, seeking necessary CCTV provisions to be made immediately to cover all relevant areas to ensure safety and security of all girl students in all the medical colleges.

The direction further instructed for proper arrangement of audio-video recording in viva-voices of all girl students in all medical colleges taken by the male faculties within a week's time, and till such time, a female observer during such viva-voices.

False information being spread, do not fall prey to it: Government to Delhiites

The Delhi Government on Tuesday appealed to citizens to not fall prey to misinformation being spread by "notorious elements" who are trying to "take advantage" of the situation arising from the arrest of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

A statement issued by the Planning Department said "speculations and rumours are being spread by notorious elements with vested interests in Delhi" that welfare schemes and subsidies will be stopped.

"Even as the law takes its own course in the process of criminal investigation, it merits clarification that administration of schemes and governance are never specific to individuals and shall continue in normal course, as in the past," it read.

Sources in the AAP dispensation said the statement was issued following directions from Kejriwal. All public services, social welfare schemes and subsidies currently given by the Delhi government will continue uninterrupted, it said, asking people not to be misled by "any fear-mongering and malicious disinformation in this regard".

"Appeal to all citizens of Delhi to stay away from any rumour mongers, who would try to take advantage of situation

arising from the arrest / remand of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi by Enforcement Directorate on 21 March, 2024, by spreading misinformation," it said.

Kejriwal was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate last week in connection with the money laundering case linked to the now-scrapped Delhi excise policy. He is in ED custody till March 28.

In the statement, Planning Secretary Niharika Rai said "such rumours create an atmosphere of fear within the general public".

"There shall be no disruption of any kind in disbursement of admissible subsidies, pensions, welfare benefits etc. Social welfare schemes are funded with public money through the consolidated fund, backed by budgetary allocations."

The statement clarified that social welfare funds are "neither the personal property of any individual or political entity nor funded by an individual or entity's personal money".

"There is an architecture of civil services and processes laid down in the National Capital Territory of Delhi, which continues as usual. Hence, these public services, social welfare schemes and subsidies are not at all affected by the arrest/remand of Chief Minister," it stressed.

BJP terms reading of Kejriwal message by wife unconstitutional

Delhi BJP MLA Vijender Gupta voiced concerns over Constitutional impropriety and disrespect for democratic institutions by Aam Admi Party (AAP) over reading of Delhi Chief Minister message by his wife, Sunita Kejriwal, wife of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, was observed delivering a statement from Kejriwal in a setting that strikingly resembled the official backdrop used by the Chief Minister for addressing media and public announcements.

This setting included the prominent display of India's national flag on either side of her, a symbolism reserved for official communications from the Chief Minister's office.

The visual arrangement led to perceptions of an unofficial assumption of the voice and authority of the Chief Minister during his absence.

Expressing his concerns, Gupta pointed out what he



considers a blatant misuse of the Chief Minister's office and a disregard for the sanctity of Constitutional positions.

Gupta said the act is indicative of disrespect not only for the office itself but also for the foundational principles of the Indian Constitution.

He labeled this incident as an embodiment of 'Parivarwaad' (nepotism) and dictatorial tendencies within AAP's culture. Furthermore, Gupta criticised the reluctance of Kejriwal to step down from his position amid serious allegations and his ongoing arrest, portraying it as indicative of a desire to cling to power at the cost of ethical governance and accountability.

Woman killed, son injured as speeding car hits their scooter

A woman was killed and her son sustained serious injuries when a speeding car allegedly hit their scooter in west Delhi's Paschim Vihar area. According to police, the son of the deceased woman alleged that the driver of the SUV was in an inebriated state.

Police said the accident occurred on Monday during Holi celebrations in the area. The car first hit the scooter and came to a halt after hitting another vehicle, they said.

According to the FIR, the complainant Jagmeet Singh, a resident of New Mahavir Nagar, said that around 4 pm on Monday, he and his mother Mohini were on the way to west Delhi on a scooter. Singh was driving the seat with Mohini rising pillion, it said.

"When we reached near a hotel on Outer Ring Road, a white speeding car came from behind and collided with my scooter," read the FIR. Due to the impact, his mother fell on the road, and his scooter got stuck to the car, dragging him along for a considerable distance, it said.

HC to hear Kejriwal plea challenging arrest today

The Delhi High Court will on Wednesday hear a petition by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal challenging his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in a money-laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam. Kejriwal's petition, which has sought his immediate release on account of the arrest and the subsequent remand to ED being "illegal", is listed for hearing before Justice Swarnan Kanta Sharma at 10.30 am. The Aam Aadmi Party

(AAP) national convener was arrested on March 21 and subsequently remanded to the ED's custody till March 28 by a Delhi court. Kejriwal had moved the high court last week with his petition but according to highly-placed sources, his request for an urgent hearing was turned down as the high court was closed for Holi.

On Friday, the trial court had remanded Kejriwal in the ED's custody till March 28 "for his detailed and sustained interrogation". The ED arrested Kejriwal hours after the high

court refused to grant him protection from coercive action by the federal anti-money laundering agency.

Kejriwal had earlier approached the court for quashing and setting aside all proceedings, including summonses, issued against him. In that petition, Kejriwal had said he is a "vocal critic" of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at the Centre, he is an opposition leader and a partner in the INDIA bloc, and the ED, which is under the Union government's control, has been "weaponised".

Dispute over who invented butter chicken heats up as Daryaganj moves HC

The legal dispute over who actually "invented" iconic Indian dishes butter chicken and dal makhani is heating up. Weeks after the Delhi High Court decided to adjudicate the dispute between two Delhi-based restaurant chains Moti Mahal and Daryaganj, some alleged defamatory remarks are now at the centre of a savoury battle.

Daryaganj has moved the high court against certain alleged defamatory remarks made by the proprietors of Moti Mahal in a newspaper interview on the issue of the origin of "but-

ter chicken".

However, the owners of Moti Mahal have asserted that the remarks in question were an "editorial perspective" and cannot be attributed to them.

The food fight entered the legal arena after the Moti Mahal owners had filed a lawsuit in January claiming that their predecessor Late Kundan Lal Gujral had "invented" butter chicken and dal makhani and accused Daryaganj of "misleading people" on the origin of the two dishes.

Justice Sanjeev Narula asked the proprietors of Moti Mahal to submit an affidavit, affirming their effort to distance

themselves from the statement in articles that have been published.

In its application, Daryaganj has raised concerns regarding the "defamatory" statements in the article -- first published in the "Wall Street Journal" and then further circulated and replicated by other websites -- saying they cause substantial negative impact on the restaurant's reputation.

The statements, it has been alleged, not only disparaged their business but also prejudiced a fair adjudication on the lawsuit, and immediate corrective action should therefore be taken by the other side to



retract and remove those. The proprietors of Moti Mahal have sought to dissociate themselves from the remarks attrib-

uted to them, suggesting that the expressions found in the article were not reflective of their direct communications or

intentions.

Plaintiffs (Moti Mahal owners) are directed to submit an affidavit, elaborating on the assertions and affirming their effort to distance themselves from the disputed statement in the published articles. Let the same be filed within two weeks from today," Justice Narula said in a recent order.

For several years, the two restaurant chains have claimed that they "invented" butter chicken and dal makhani. But in January Moti Mahal sued Daryaganj for taking the credit for the two popular dishes.

Moti Mahal's owners sought to

restrain Daryaganj restaurants' proprietors from claiming that their predecessor, Late Kundan Lal Jaggi, was the inventor of these two dishes, which are now world famous, and from using the tagline "by the inventors of butter chicken and dal makhani" on its website www.Daryaganj.Com and various social media platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn and Twitter, as well as in print and electronic media.

The high court had earlier issued a summons to the owners of Daryaganj and asked them to file a written statement in response to the suit.

In their suit, the Moti Mahal

owners have claimed that it was their predecessor, Kundan Lal Gujral, who created the first tandoori chicken and later also went on to make butter chicken and dal makhani and brought it to India after Partition.

The counsel for Daryaganj restaurants have vehemently opposed the claims and contended that the suit was misconceived, baseless and lacking a cause of action.

The counsel have argued that the defendants have not engaged in any false representation or claim, and the allegations made in the suit are far from the truth.

Modi calls Sandeshkhali survivor and BJP Lok Sabha candidate

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday called up the BJP's Lok Sabha poll candidate from Basirhat, Rekha Patra, who had highlighted the plight of women in West Bengal's Sandeshkhali, and lauded her as "Shakti Swaroopa", BJP leaders said. Patra, who had raised her voice against the alleged atrocities by local Trinamool Congress (TMC) strongman Shajahan Sheikh and his cronies, was picked by the BJP as its candidate from Basirhat Lok Sabha seat, under which the village falls. Modi spoke to her about her campaign preparations and the support for the BJP among voters and other issues, while she narrated the ordeal of Sandeshkhali women. Patra told Modi she feels good that he is standing by them and said, "It is like Ram ji is with us". She said she has not voted since 2011 due to the situation in the area, to which Modi assured that the Election Commission will hold free and fair elections and ensure everyone can vote. Patra also said that the TMC supporters around her initial-



ly opposed her candidature from the BJP, but are supporting her now. She said she has no enmity with anyone. She also said that she hails from a poor family and her husband works in Kerala and Tamil Nadu. "I will do something so that no one has to go so far for work. They will get employment here only," she said. PM Modi hailed her as "Shakti Swaroopa". Shakti is a Hinduism term associated with goddesses like Durga and Kali. "You fought the battle in Sandeshkhali, you are 'Shakti Swaroopa'...", PM Modi said. He also said that she should take the message to the masses about how the Trinamool Congress government is working against the people of the

state. "Work in the midst of people, take the message to them that the TMC government is creating problems for the people, they do not allow implementation of the BJP (union) government schemes in West Bengal. Tell people that they are indulging in corruption, and changing names of schemes," the prime minister was quoted as saying by a BJP leader. Basirhat, one of the 42 Lok Sabha seats in West Bengal, is currently represented by the TMC. Sheikh, who has been suspended by the TMC, and some of his associates have been arrested in connection with attacks on ED officials and are in CBI custody.

Varun absence from BJP list stirs up political speculation

Varun Gandhi's absence from the BJP candidate list for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections has stirred up political speculation, particularly in the Pilibhit constituency, indicating a significant rift between the outspoken parliamentarian and the party leadership. Sources indicate that Varun Gandhi's vocal criticisms of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's policies have caused discomfort among party higher-ups, resulting in his exclusion from the electoral lineup. The decision has fueled conjecture about Gandhi's potential political maneuvers, with speculation rife regarding his possible candidacy as a Samajwadi Party (SP) nominee or as an independent candidate. Such a move could potentially disrupt the BJP's aspirations to secure all 80 seats in Uttar Pradesh. Senior Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury too extended an invitation to him to join the grand old party. Chowdhury described Varun as a "dabang neta (strong leader)" and said he is a learned man with a clean image. "He is a dabang neta and a very educated man. He has a clean image. Varun Gandhi



has a connection with the Gandhi family. This is why the BJP denied him a ticket (for Lok Sabha polls). I think he should come (join the Congress), we will be very happy," Chowdhury, the leader of the Congress party in the outgoing Lok Sabha, said. Varun and Congress leader Rahul Gandhi are cousins. Varun, a two-term Lok Sabha MP from Pilibhit, has often aired views deemed critical of his party's governments at the Centre and in Uttar Pradesh. However, the BJP has renominated his mother Maneka Gandhi from Sultanpur. Varun has been substituted with former Congress member Jitin Prasada to run for the Pilibhit seat in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections in Uttar Pradesh. Renowned for his candid opinions, Gandhi has been a

vocal opponent of several key initiatives of the Modi government, including its agricultural policies, retirement schemes, and employment programs. His dissenting stance has resonated with opposition factions, amplifying discussions on contentious issues and injecting vigor into political discourse. The SP's offer of a seat to Gandhi has added an intriguing dimension to the unfolding narrative. Party leaders, including national President Akhilesh Yadav and national general secretary Ram Gopal Yadav, have hinted at a possible induction if the BJP fails to nominate him. However, Gandhi's response to this overture remains uncertain, given his longstanding association and ideological alignment with the BJP. A recent comment by Akhilesh Yadav indicating the SP's open-door policy for

Gandhi underscores the potential for a realignment of political allegiances. Meanwhile, Bhagwat Saran Gangwar has been announced as the SP's official candidate for Pilibhit, though he has expressed willingness to step aside if Gandhi joins the fray. In a surprising move, the BJP has nominated Jitin Prasada, the Public Works Department Minister in the Yogi Adityanath cabinet, as its candidate for Pilibhit, replacing Varun Gandhi. Additionally, Meneka Gandhi, Varun's mother, has been tasked with contesting from Sultanpur, the constituency she successfully represented in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. The Gandhi family's stronghold over the Pilibhit parliamentary constituency has been undeniable for over three decades. Beginning with former Union Minister Maneka Gandhi's victory in the 1989 elections, the family has maintained a formidable presence in the region. Varun Gandhi succeeded his mother in representing Pilibhit, solidifying the family's legacy in Indian politics. However, the decision to deny Varun Gandhi a ticket for the upcoming elections marks a significant departure from tradition. In 2014, he was shifted to Sultanpur while his mother contested and

won from Pilibhit. Nonetheless, Gandhi reclaimed the seat in 2019, securing a decisive victory by a staggering margin of over 2.5 lakh votes, reaffirming the family's enduring dominance. Gandhi's commentary on social and political issues has often made headlines. In December 2021, he criticized the government's handling of job opportunities and recruitment processes, highlighting the plight of millions of unemployed youth. Similarly, his response to the withdrawal of the contentious agricultural laws and his condemnation of communal narratives in the aftermath of the Lakhimpur Kheri violence showcased his willingness to challenge prevailing narratives. Moreover, Gandhi's advocacy for government employees' rights and his call to reevaluate pension schemes have underscored his commitment to social justice and equitable governance. As the political landscape evolves and alliances shift, Varun Gandhi's exclusion from the BJP ticket raises questions about the party's internal dynamics and its approach to dissenting voices within its ranks. It also presents Gandhi with a pivotal decision regarding his political future and ideological alignment.

Congress leader post on Kangana sparks row

Every woman, irrespective of her background and profession, deserves dignity, actor Kangana Ranaut said on Tuesday as Congress leaders' comments on Mandi from where she is contesting the Lok Sabha elections snowballed into a massive political row. Ranaut, who makes her political debut as a BJP candidate from Mandi in Himachal Pradesh, said she was particularly pained by the derogatory comments on the constituency that is often referred to as "Chhota Kashi" the world over. The Congress has been in the crosshairs after demeaning remarks on Ranaut and Mandi were posted on the social media handles of its leaders Supriya Shrinete and HS Ahir. The party has always believed there is no place for such language in public discourse and the matter should end with Shrinete clearing the air, Congress leader Sandeep Dikshit told reporters at the AICC headquarters. "Whatever be the profession of a woman, be it teacher, actress, journalist, politician or sex worker, all of them deserve dignity. I'm pained especially because of the deplorable comments made about Mandi... All of us who



come from Mandi have been hurt by the comments," Ranaut told reporters outside the Chandigarh airport. Asked whether she plans to take any action against the two Congress leaders, the "Queen" actor, often in the news for her controversial comments on a range of issues, said she had been called to Delhi by BJP president J P Nadda and would respond only after meeting him. "I have to maintain the dignity of the party. I can't walk before it. I have to walk with them and follow their instructions," the 37-year-old said. A host of BJP leaders, including Bansuri Swaraj, Amit Malviya and former Himachal Pradesh chief minister Jai Ram Thakur, spoke up on the issue. Congress spokesperson

Shrinete said in her defence on Monday, when the controversy erupted, that many people have access to her Facebook and Instagram accounts and one of them made the inappropriate post. She also said she had deleted the post and will take action against a parody account that is using her name. But that had little impact. "If your account is posting what a parody account posts, then it simply means that admins of both accounts are same. One has to be self-concited, to the point of being deranged, to do so. Also the admins must have very low opinion of you to post such offensive stuff and get away," Malviya said. Bansuri Swaraj, daughter of the late Sushma Swaraj and the party's candidate from New Delhi, said the

top leadership of the Congress must apologise. "Such derogatory words were used for someone who is India's daughter and a woman. This is very shocking, and has shown the mentality of the Congress. The top leadership of the Congress should apologise for this," she said. Thakur added in a statement that the remarks would be legally examined and the BJP was moving towards registering a case. Shrinete, he said, had made a "big mistake" as people of faith come to Mandi, which is known as "Chhoti Kashi" and is an abode for over 300 temples. "It is unfortunate that being a woman herself, the Congress spokesperson has made such remarks against another woman and now she is trying to retract by saying that someone has used her other account," Thakur said. Union minister Smriti Irani and BJP's Chandigarh MP Kirron Kher have also added their voice to the chorus of condemnation. While Irani is a former TV actor, Kher continues to be a prominent face in Hindi films. There were others who backed Ranaut. "Targeting Shrinete, former Congress leader Sharmistha Mukherjee said, "She's saying 'access', not hacked! One gives access to SM accounts only to known & trusted people.

Nothing left of Congress ideology with the Rahul Congress gang. 'Nari Nyay' is nothing but an empty slogan by a bunch of hypocrites!" Former diplomat Lakshmi Puri termed the remarks against the actor "despicable, derogatory & condemnable". "That it should come from another woman politician is all the more galling - how can we as women become transmitters of toxic patriarchy & demeaning slurs & insults that scrape at the bottom of the barrel of indignity!" she posted on X. Congress spokesperson Pawan Khera took up cudgels on his colleague's behalf. "Anybody who has known my colleague @SupriyaShrinete will vouch for the fact that she can never resort to such objectionable language ever." Dikshit added that Shrinete had said she will find out who has done it. "Supriya ji has said whoever has done it, it's a mistake. She has explained and the matter should end there," he said. The party's Srinivas BV agreed that the remarks against Ranaut from Shrinete's account were "absolutely derogatory". However, he also raked up Ranaut's past controversial statement in which she had called actor-politician Urmila Matondkar a "soft porn star".

Jaishankar visits Indian Coast Guard ship Samudra

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar visited Indian Coast Guard ship Samudra Paheredar, a specialised Pollution Control Vessel, which is in Manila Bay in the Philippines as part of an overseas deployment to the EAN countries, and said the civilizational imprint of India's long and distinguished maritime tradition is still visible in the region. The ICG ship arrived at Manila Bay on March 25 on a three-day visit. The ship is equipped with specialised marine pollution control equipment and a Chetak Helicopter in pollution response configuration designed to contain and recover spilled oil and augment the operation, officials said on Tuesday. "Pleased to visit the Indian Coast Guard Ship Samudra Paheredar during its port call to Manila. My visit and the ship's presence signifies the deepening India-Philippines relations. India's long and distinguished Indian maritime tradition's civilizational imprint is still visible in this region. Our Act East policy and Indo-Pacific vision will continue giving it a more contemporary form," the External Affairs Minister (EAM) posted on X

on Tuesday. The Union minister is on an official visit to the Philippines. The Defence Ministry earlier in the day said the ICG ship is on an overseas deployment to the EAN countries -- the Philippines, Vietnam and Brunei -- from March 25 to April 12. "The visit of a specialised Pollution Control Vessel is part of a broader initiative aimed at demonstration of the ICG's marine pollution response capabilities and shared concern and resolve towards marine pollution in the EAN region besides bolstering bilateral cooperation with the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)," the ministry said. "The deployment is the third in a row by the Indian Coast Guard to the EAN countries.

Earlier in the year 2023, ICG Pollution Control Vessels visited Cambodia, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand and Indonesia as part of the initiative," it said. During this deployment, the ship is also scheduled to make port calls at Ho Chi Minh (Vietnam) and Muara (Brunei). The demonstration at visiting ports includes pollution response training and a practical display of various equipments, the statement said. Additionally, the ship has also embarked 25 cadets of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) to participate in the Indian government's initiative 'Puneet Sagar Abhiyan' and provide it an international outreach in coordination with partner nations, the officials said.

BJP urges EC to take actions against poll code violations

The BJP on Tuesday raised the issue of objectionable comments by Opposition leaders, including Tamil Nadu Minister Anitha Radhakrishnan, against Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the lack of action against him, as it urged the Election Commission to take stringent measures on its own against poll code violations. A BJP delegation flagged the "differing" approaches of poll officials in various States to similar infractions by politicians and claimed that not much is done against the errant leaders in states like Karnataka, Telangana, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal. All these states are ruled by the BJP's rival parties. A BJP delegation, including Union minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and its general secretary Vinod Tawde, met the poll watchdog to highlight this "discrepancy". Opposition leaders are continuously "abusing" Modi and denigrating women power and Indian culture, Tawde told reporters later. The poll process has just started and the EC should take "suo moto action" against any violation of the poll code, he said. He said while action was rec-



ommended against Union minister Shobha Karandlaje, who is contesting the Lok Sabha polls from Karnataka, for her controversial comments against Tamils, objectionable remarks of a Tamil Nadu minister and DMK leader have not drawn any censure. In this context, Tawde also highlighted Shiva Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut's comparison of Prime Minister Narendra Modi with Mughal king Aurangzeb, considered by many a religious zealot. While action was called for in the case of Shobha Karandlaje, poll officials are seen to be having a different stand in other states, he said. "We urged the Election Commission to take stringent action at the right time and we were assured that it will

look into the issue," he said. BJP leaders Om Pathak and Sanjay Mayukh were also part of the delegation. The BJP's written submission to the EC was in reference to Radhakrishnan's alleged use of profanities against the prime minister during an election rally. The party demanded that the poll body bar him from the campaign and direct the DMK leader to tender an apology. An FIR should also be registered, it said. Its complaint also highlighted the alleged insult of Indian culture and personal attacks by DMK leaders, including former Union minister A Raja. Raja had said that Tamil Nadu will never accept phrases like Bharat Mata and Jai Shri Ram, the BJP noted.

ECI issues advisory for voter safety against heatwave

With the seven-phase Lok Sabha poll occurring at the peak of the summer amid warnings of above normal temperature and heat wave conditions by the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the Election Commission (EC) issued an advisory to States and Union Territories and sought "strict compliance" of its directive of providing assured minimum facilities on the day of polls at polling stations for voters as well as polling personnel, including drinking water, shade and medical kit, ramp, polling states at ground floors, proper lighting and electricity, furniture's and proper signages at polling stations. The Commission has also shared with its state chief electoral officers a set of 'dos and don'ts' issued by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) to minimise the impact of the impending heat wave. The commission has cited IMD to note that there is a high probability of above normal temperatures during summer season, "which may translate into stronger and longer spells of heatwave especially during months of March to June, 2024". The Meteorological Scientists have advised political parties to factor in the



impacts of rising temperatures while campaigning outdoors and conducting big rallies. The NDMA in its do's and don'ts advised to avoid going out in the sun, especially between 12.00 noon and 3.00 p.m.; Drink sufficient water and as often as possible, even if not thirsty; Wear lightweight, light-coloured, loose, and porous cotton clothes. Use protective goggles, umbrella/hat, shoes or chappals while going out in sun, avoid strenuous activities when the outside temperature is high. Avoid working outside between 12 noon and 3 p.m. The April 19 to June 1 polls are likely to witness an above-normal number of heatwave days in most parts of the country, barring a few pockets in the western Himalayas, north-east and peninsular India. Traditionally, polls in India used to happen either in the winter or in the spring until 2004, when the then-prime minister, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, decided to dissolve the Lok Sabha eight months in advance

and went to polls in April-May. Subsequently, four Lok Sabha polls were held amidst the heat and dust. With the Indian subcontinent emerging as a "hotspot" of extreme heat waves owing to global warming, studies have documented the deaths of thousands due to extreme heat events. In cities, there is an additional contributor in the form of "urban heat island" effects. In a letter sent out to its Chief Electoral Officers, the Commission reminded them about its earlier set of instructions on assured minimum facilities at polling stations. According to the June 2023 instructions on assured minimum facilities, which have been circulated afresh, during summer, every polling party shall be supplied with oral rehydration salts (ORS) for their own use as well as for any voter needing the same due to heat-stroke. "A hand bill on 'Dos and Don'ts' in case of heat stroke may be prepared and supplied to each of the polling parties. An appeal to the electors may be issued to carry wet towels to protect themselves against dehydration and also advise women electors to avoid bringing children along with them to polling stations during hot weather conditions," the instruction said.

Pets in peril due to humans: Study

Amidst the common practice of culling animals to curb the spread of diseases to humans, a study has brought to light a startling reversal: It is pets that are in more peril due to humans. After analysing 12 million viral genomes, the scientists from University College London (UCL) found that humans pass on more viruses to domestic and wild animals than the other way around. The researchers whose study is published in the journal Nature Ecology & Evolution have called for better understanding and monitoring of viral transmission between animals and humans to prepare for future outbreaks and aid conservation efforts. Generally speaking, the majority of emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases are attributable to animal viruses. When these pathogens transmit from animals into humans (a process called zoonosis), it leads to disease outbreaks and epidemics such as Ebola and new flu strains. Considering the tremendous impact zoonotic diseases can have on public health, humans have historically been seen as a "sink" for viruses rather than a source. In other words, human-to-animal transmission of viruses usually gets far less attention.



Moreover, as the study noted that even more animal-to-animal host jumps that didn't involve humans at all. "We should consider humans just as one node in a vast network of hosts endlessly exchanging pathogens, rather than a sink for zoonotic bugs," said study co-author Professor Francois Balloux (UCL Genetics Institute). "By surveying and monitoring transmission of viruses between animals and humans, in either direction, we can better understand viral evolution and hopefully be more prepared for future outbreaks and epidemics of novel illnesses, while also aiding conservation efforts." On average, viral host jumps show an association with an increase in genetic changes, or mutations in viruses, relative to their continued evolution alongside just one host animal. Study authors say this reflects how viruses must adapt to better exploit new hosts.



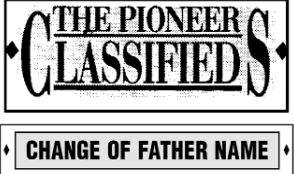
BJP fields four Congress turncoats for Assembly bypolls in Gujarat

Four Congress turncoat MLAs, including former leader of opposition Arjun Modhwadia, and an independent legislator, all of whom resigned from the Gujarat assembly membership in the last few months, were on Tuesday fielded by the ruling BJP for bypolls in five constituencies. These five seats — Vijapur, Porbandar, Manavadar, Khambhat and Vaghodia — fell vacant after their sitting MLAs, four from the Congress and one independent, resigned between December 2023 and March 2024 and subsequently joined the BJP. An official list declaring them to be BJP candidates for the bypolls to these five seats was issued by the party here. The Congress MLAs who resigned were CJ Chavda

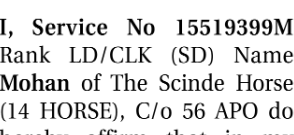
(Vijapur), Arjun Modhwadia (Porbandar), Arvind Ladani (Manavadar) and Chirag Patel (Khambhat). Apart from them, independent MLA from Vaghodia, Dharmendrasinh Vaghela, had also resigned as legislator and joined the saffron party. Now, the BJP has chosen these five former MLAs to fight the bypolls on the party's symbol from their respective seats. They all were elected as legislators after defeating BJP candidates in the assembly polls held in December 2022, in which the saffron party won 156 of the 182 seats. The Congress is yet to announce its candidates for these five assembly seats. The by-elections for five out of six vacant assembly seats in Gujarat is scheduled on May 7, when voting would take place for all the 26 Lok Sabha constituencies in the state. The Election Commission has not declared bypoll on the

Visavadar seat because a case about the election of its former MLA Bhupat Bhayani is pending before the Gujarat High Court. Bhayani, who won as the AAP candidate from the seat, also resigned in December and later joined the BJP.

BJP demands sedition case against Kerala CM for speeches on CAA

The BJP on Tuesday demanded the registration of a sedition case against Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan over his recent speeches on the Citizenship Amendment Act, alleging they aimed to instill insecurity in the Muslim community and create "extreme religious blindness" among them. Senior BJP leader P K Krishnadas accused the Marxist veteran of trying to create division in society and promote enmity among religious groups through his speeches against the CAA, implemented by the Centre.

The recent speeches made by Vijayan on the topic were in violation of constitutional norms and the oath of office, and thus he lost the legal right to continue in the office, he claimed. Referring to the statements made by Vijayan during the anti-CAA rally in Malappuram on Monday, the BJP leader said these were the arguments made by Mohammed Ali Jinnah while demanding two nations decades ago. "The CM said that Muslims were second-grade citizens in the country, and the Union government, the BJP, and the RSS were trying to drive them away into Pakistan by



suspending their citizenship," Krishnadas said. His words were a reflection of the ideology of Jinnah, who

had also said that Muslims were second-grade citizens and insecure in India, and so there should be a separate nation for them. "Vijayan was reiterating what Jinnah had said...His words were anti-national. So, a case of sedition should be registered against him," he said. He also accused Vijayan of

paving the way for a "religious riot" by creating division between Muslims and Christian and Hindu communities. "Vijayan's speeches aimed to instill insecurity in the Muslim community and create "extreme religious blindness" among them," he further alleged.

Much ado about nothing

Arvind Kejriwal governing from jail may look unconventional, but it is not unconstitutional

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is keeping his word so far: That he would rule the Capital from behind bars upon being arrested in the multicrore liquor scam. The issuance of Government orders from prison, however, has sparked a controversy. His political opponents, including the BJP, are raising concerns about the influence of criminal elements within the Government apparatus. The saga began when Kejriwal, also the national convener of AAP, was incarcerated following his alleged involvement in the liquor scam. Despite being in jail, he continued to issue orders related to governance matters in Delhi. This is unprecedented as no serving Chief Minister has ever been jailed. While Kejriwal's supporters argue that his actions demonstrate a commitment to his responsibilities, critics point to the broader implications of a jailed politician running a Government. BJP leaders have wasted no time in alleging that this development is emblematic of the pervasive influence of criminal elements. The BJP leaders



assert that allowing individuals facing serious criminal charges to wield power from jail sets a dangerous precedent. Moreover, they argue that it raises questions about the efficacy of the justice system in curbing such abuses of power. On the other hand, AAP supporters claim the BJP's allegations are aimed at tarnishing their party's image. They maintain that Kejriwal's actions are within bounds of his duties as Chief Minister and emphasise his commitment to serving the people of Delhi. Furthermore, they contend that Kejriwal's governance from jail reflects the resilience and determination of a leader who refuses to be deterred by legal challenges. In reality, the entire

controversy is unfounded. If the Constitution permits an individual to retain a constitutional position while under judicial custody, it logically follows that they have the right to govern from wherever they are. Given its lack of prudence, it might appear unconventional, but it aligns perfectly with the constitutional framework of India's political system. Unlike Laloo Yadav and Hemant Soren, Kejriwal chose not to comply with the establishment's expectations by resigning and instead remained in his post. Additionally, being in judicial custody alone does not constitute a conviction or indictment, regardless of the strength of the allegations, and thus holds no legal validity. In the wake of the controversy surrounding Kejriwal's governance from jail, the next logical step for him would undoubtedly be to pursue avenues for securing bail. For a sitting Chief Minister to be in jail is an extraordinary circumstance, and Kejriwal's legal team will likely be working diligently to secure his release at the earliest opportunity. Amidst the heated exchange of accusations and counter-arguments, the broader implications of this controversy cannot be ignored. It highlights the complex interplay between politics, law enforcement and the justice system in India. As the debate rages on, it remains to be seen how this controversy will shape the political landscape in Delhi and beyond in the days to come.

Water, an elixir of life and an agent of peace

Ineffective water management practices contribute to water scarcity by water loss, inefficient allocation and degradation of water resources

Water is an indispensable factor in the survival of humanity on this planet. For everything related to humans, we have one or other alternative. But for water, there is no alternative. Water is essential for life, playing a critical role in various bodily functions and processes. Science and religion have a consensus on one point. The first life on the planet originated in water. Water is often referred to as the "elixir of life" because it is essential for all living organisms' existence and survival. Without water, life as we know it would not be possible. All our civilizations and international co-operations have taken place through water bodies.

But the recent water shortage plaguing the silicon city of India, Bengaluru, has sent shocking waves among the city dwellers, who, despite having financial stability, are finding it difficult to get water for their daily use. If it's Bengaluru today, it will be in other cities shortly. According to a recent United Nations report, multiple zones within India's Indo-Gangetic basin have surpassed a critical level



of groundwater depletion, with the entire northwestern region projected to face significantly diminished groundwater resources by 2025. Groundwater depletion occurs when the water extraction rate from aquifers exceeds the recharge rate, leading to a decline in groundwater levels over time. In the Indo-Gangetic basin, excessive groundwater pumping for irrigation, urban water supply, and industrial use has resulted in the widespread depletion of aquifers. The conversion of agricultural lands to high-rise commercial buildings also affects proper recharging. Ineffective water management practices contribute to water scarcity by exacerbating water loss, inefficient allocation, and degradation of water resources. Over-extraction of groundwater, inefficient irri-

gation techniques, leaky distribution systems, and inadequate conservation measures all contribute to the mismanagement of water resources. Urban planners should leave a "water buffer space" within every 1 km radius for proper recharging of the groundwater. For this, they should construct beautiful artificial lakes that harvest rainwater and recycled water. Similarly, in every household or high-rise building, the Government should see that they have proper working rainwater harvesting facilities. Access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation is a basic human right and is essential for preventing waterborne diseases and maintaining health and hygiene. Without sufficient water, people cannot meet their basic drinking, cooking, and sanitation needs, jeopardising their health and well-being. Water is a key driver of socioeconomic development, supporting various sectors such as agriculture, industry, and tourism. Water infrastructure investments, water-based industries, and water-related services contribute to eco-

nomic growth and job creation. In regions where water is already scarce or shared by multiple parties, disputes over water allocation, usage rights, and infrastructure development can arise, leading to tensions and conflicts. In India, we have seen severe conflicts over water sharing in the states of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh. More such tensions will erupt in future when water scarcity increases. The developments in science and technology can artificially produce anything related to human life, including food products or even human babies; however, research to date has not made it possible to produce water artificially. Hence, we need to maintain the natural water balance on this planet without disturbing it. In the current pace of urbanisation and environmental degradation being carried out by humans, it would be very difficult to regenerate water if it gets depleted.

A showdown of arch-rivals

This electoral battle is shaping up to be a multi-party contest, primarily between the ruling BJP-led NDA and the INDIA bloc

Who will win the 2024 Lok Sabha polls? The election scene has become clear after the Chief Election Commissioner announced the poll schedule last week. They will begin next month and end on June 4, when the results will be announced. It will be a multi-party contest, with the ruling BJP-led NDA alliance and the opposition coalition of the INDIA bloc being the primary contenders. Meanwhile, alliances are being built and major parties have announced the candidates. Party hopping and secret deals are also going on. Prime Minister Modi aims to perform a hat trick. Currently, it is a one-horse race, with the BJP dominating and the opposition parties trailing behind.

The Opposition INDIA coalition comprises 26 parties. They have formed a pre-poll alliance to challenge the BJP. It aims to field a single opposition candidate against the BJP in the upcoming elections. The Opposition suffered two consecutive defeats in 2014 and 2019, significantly damaging its image. It needs to connect with voters, including millennials. Congress, leading the Opposition, is a 138-year secular party that used to represent marginalised groups like SCs, STs, OBCs and Muslims. It has been weakened since the eighties, with the rise of regional satraps and today, it is a mere shadow of its former strength. It lacks leadership. After the 2014 and 2019 defeats, Congress now claims it is committed to social justice and empowering India's poor, oppressed, Dalits, farmers, youth and women with its five guarantees: Yuva Nyay, Bhagidaari Nyay, Naari Nyay, Kisan Nyay and Shramik Nyay. The Opposition mainly aims to challenge Modi by consolidating anti-BJP votes and offering incentives. This strategy worked for Congress in recent Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana Assembly polls, which Congress won. Congress hopes to gain from the BJP's anti-incumbency buffering sops and freebies. They also highlight Rahul



Gandhi's recent Bharat Jodo Yatra, which was meant to connect with the people. To succeed, Congress must raise bread-and-butter issues such as inflation, joblessness and social discord to engage with young voters who play a decisive role in elections. They must show an alternate strategy to appeal to them. Simultaneously, some powerful chief ministers of state-level parties dominate their states, making it a tough fight for Prime Minister Narendra Modi in these areas. 2019, the BJP and its allies secured only 45 per cent of the votes. The remaining 55 per cent were up for grabs for the INDIA bloc. Although no national leader matches Modi's popularity, some influential regional leaders can sway voters in their respective regions. This is particularly true for West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. The biggest challenge for the coalition is to project a single leader against Modi. Unfortunately, there is an ego clash among the coalition partners, which makes it difficult to agree on someone. Secondly, the BJP boasts a strong organisation with immense financial and political power. The Opposition doesn't seem to have a solid

and compelling storyline, except for its commitment to safeguarding the Constitution and democratic values. However, voters are more concerned about basic needs such as food, clothing and shelter. For instance, Sonia Gandhi's Aam Admi slogan in 2004 resonated well with the masses. Low-income people generally live paycheck to paycheck and may not relate to abstract political concepts. The Congress Party is still clinging to its glorious past and failing to acknowledge the current scene. As the second-largest Party, Congress automatically expects to lead the coalition. It has been losing its leaders to the BJP and a steady flow of these leaders demoralises the Party. The Opposition needs a solid counter to the BJP's propaganda and religious narrative. The BJP has grown since 1980; today, it is the biggest Party in India. It has a strong organisation with unlimited money power. The Party seeks votes in the name of the Prime Minister. The BJP has a better chance of winning this time. The BJP's lucky mascot is Modi. His supporters consider him a doer due to the implementation of various measures. These include the Triple Talaq, CAA,

Conspiracy theories abound for terror attack

A cloud of speculation surrounds the Moscow terror attack; allegations range from claims of internal collusion to Ukrainian complicity, supported by the West

In the end, neither these corrupt politicians nor the manifestos of these inhuman actions, but unarmed civilians will have to pay the price. Over a hundred unarmed civilians were mercilessly killed by those brutal assailants, while hundreds more were wounded in Saturday's terrorist attacks on the outskirts of Moscow. Conspiracy theories, as in many other cases, are deepening. Some say it was an inside job orchestrated by certain parties to gain sympathy. Second, Ukrainians planned it with the help of Western intelligence agencies. Third, this was perpetrated by extremists. Consequently, conflicting yet interesting reports are emerging from all sides. Though these warning messages sound fishy, the amount of intelligence activities in the region certainly emphasises recent detailed reports on CIA activities in Ukraine published by The New York Times, stating that the US and UK were in Ukraine long before the war. "At the end of 2021, Putin was considering whether to launch a full-scale invasion. He met with the head of one of Russia's main spy services, who told him that the CIA, together with British intelligence MI6, controlled Ukraine and turned it into a staging ground for operations against Moscow." However, it is interesting to note that in this brutal attack, terrorists who targeted concertgoers at Moscow's Crocus City Hall not only successfully executed the operation, but also managed to evade capture and attempted to cross the border located over three hundred kilometres away. Later, according to Russian media, all four attackers were apprehended by Russian security forces. A man detained on suspicion of involvement in the Crocus City Hall attack has reportedly confessed to being promised a reward of 500,000 rubles, according to Russian journalist Margarita Simonyan. The alleged killer stated in a video posted by her, 'I shot down people at the Crocus for money; [I was promised] about 500,000.' Strangely, Russia was attacked by the Islamic State, or more accurately, according to Western media outlets, by ISKP. The Islamic State—Khorasan Province is a regional branch of the Islamic State terrorist group active in South-Central Asia. At the beginning of this month, on March 7, the FSB stated that it had stopped an ISKP cell from carrying out a terrorist attack targeting a synagogue. "On the territory of the Kaluga Region, a stop was put to the activity of Wilayat Khorasan, a cell of the Afghan branch of the international terrorist organisation Islamic State, which is banned in Russia, whose members were planning to commit a terrorist act against one of the Jewish religious institutions in Moscow," the Russian Federal Security Service (FSB) said in a statement to the state-run TASS news agency. What is fascinating is that almost all Western countries currently supplying arms, personnel, and other vital support, including precious intelligence, to Ukraine for its fight against Russia, were issuing early warnings about such brutal terrorist attacks. On March 7 and 8, several foreign embassies in Russia warned their citizens about the threat of terrorist attacks in Moscow. The U.S. Embassy in Moscow posted a security alert late on March 7, stating, "The embassy is monitoring reports that extremists have imminent plans to target large gatherings in Moscow, including concerts, and U.S. citizens should be advised to avoid large gatherings over the

next 48 hours." The Finnish Foreign Ministry urged its citizens on Saturday to avoid public gatherings in Moscow over the weekend, following the US warning about possible terrorist attacks in Russia. The US Embassy further stated that it is actively monitoring reports indicating that "extremists have immediate intentions to target large gatherings in Moscow." After the US warning, the UK issued a similar advisory advising UK citizens to avoid travelling to Russia due to the risks and terrorist threats. The British Foreign Office recommended against all travel to Russia. Germany, Latvia, and Estonia also urged their citizens and those with dual citizenship not to travel to Russia shortly. These advisories essentially highlight the reliability, effectiveness, and capability of Western intelligence agencies in the region. However, it is important to pay attention to the argument made by the Ukrainian Defence Authority on the attack: "The behaviour of the criminals is also an important factor. They fled, although such attacks are characterised by suicides with the victims and the voicing of demands, or at least reasons. Accordingly, the criminals wanted to survive. But how did they cover a distance of more than 300 kilometres without being noticed? Why, having prepared so thoroughly, did they not do the simplest thing—buy a few spare cars to change on the way? Was it because they were guaranteed security by the Russian special services?" These questions are undoubtedly crucial not only for unravelling the mysteries behind the attack but also for preventing its recurrence. This distinctive IS attack contradicts its previous behaviours; typically, IS members launch attacks to become martyrs. However, in this instance, they attacked to obtain "money"

from unknown sources, a practice strictly prohibited, Haram, according to Islam. Meanwhile, in his address to the nation, President Putin asserted, "All perpetrators, organisers, and masterminds of this crime will face fair and inevitable punishment, whoever they may be and whoever directed them. I emphasise once more: we will identify and bring to justice every individual who stands behind these terrorists, those who orchestrated this atrocity, this assault against Russia and our people." Whatever the conspiracy theories or any other ground reports that came to the public domain after this horrific terrorist attack, one thing is certain: Russia indeed has internal security loopholes, and enemies are capable of sneaking through their system. It is clear that, according to Western pre-warnings of the attacks leading us to presume that these brutal attacks were pre-planned to execute during the recently concluded election where Putin marked the highest percentage of any elections since 2000. This signalled which side the majority of Russians were standing on, while the West kept repeating the same mantra of authoritarianism. On the other hand, can the Ukrainian President go for an election and prove the same, despite remaining in power by manipulating the constitutional clauses? However, Ukrainians, alarmed by the election, launched a risky invasion to halt voting in Russian border areas, particularly in Belgorod city and its region. During the three-day operation, Ukraine killed 11 civilians with drones and rockets and injured 82, including nine critically. Among the casualties were an election official and a thirteen-year-old girl, whose father was seriously injured. Ironically, most Western nations with imperfect democracies expect their enemy countries to be "per-

fect democracies". This paradox can only please a mind accustomed to duplicity but will never overcome common challenges such as normalising the global supply chain and achieving peace while mitigating the burning risk of a possible nuclear attack. The most powerful nations, despite engaging in dirty politics to reaffirm their supremacy, will never hesitate to engage in anything contradictory to their preaching. Nevertheless, determining whether this attack was carried out by ISKP or another group influenced by various integrated parties is a matter that requires verification. However, this attack has the potential to inspire other terrorists in countries facing genuine threats from IS, ISKP, and other extremist factions. We cannot underestimate the importance of security in the forthcoming Indian elections and ISKP's direct threats against China and its investments in Pakistan, Afghanistan, and other places. In early September 2022, the ISKP published its most comprehensive critique of China to date, belittling the Belt and Road Initiative and calling on Muslims to take up arms against "red atheists whose hands are soaked with the blood of innocent Uyghur Muslims." Ironically, the tone of these threats is very similar to how the United States evaluates its competitors. Should we take lightly what the Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump repeatedly referred to as the president as 'Obama and Hillary Clinton are as ISIS co-founders'? Controversial issues reignite India-Lanka relations

The contentious issues of Katchatheevu and Sethusamudram resurface amid Tamil Nadu's election fervour

The schedule for the General Election 2024 has been announced and the State of Tamil Nadu is full of rattle and brouhaha over non-issues. The ruling DMK which has been maintaining silence over issues like the provision of drinking and irrigation waters and the fate of the State's fishermen arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy have dusted and taken out age-old topics for use as campaign materials in the election. A cursory glance over the election manifesto of the DMK drafted under the chairmanship of M K Kanimozhi, the late Karunanidhi's daughter by his third wife Rajathi, makes the reader doubt whether Tamil Nadu is a part of India or not. One of the salient points of the



DMK's election manifesto is to make Tamil Nadu a NEET-free State. This means that admission to the undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the State's medical colleges would be free of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test, the selection system ordered by the Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court. It was the UPA Government (2004-2014) in which the DMK was the second largest constituent

that brought the NEET into practice. Similarly, the DMK would revive and resume the works of laying a canal through the Palk Strait known as the Sethusamudram Channel. The project work has been put on hold following directives by the Supreme Court based on the fact that it is neither economically sustainable nor commercially viable. The only motivating factor behind the revival of Sethusamudram Channel is that the DMK Government would be able to demolish the Ram Sethu, a stone structure believed to have been built by the army of Lords Ram to cross the sea in their mission to same Maa Sita from the custody of the Ravana. This is being seen as the Dravidian's reply to the Pranaprathista of

the Ram Temple at Ayodhya held in January. The DMK has declared its mission to destroy Sanatana Dharma once and forever. Udhayanidhi Stalin, heir apparent to the DMK throne and the chief minister-ship in the eventuality of Stalin leaving Tamil Nadu for an early rendezvous with his father M Karunanidhi and ideological father Ramasamy Naicker, have declared time and again that Sanatana Dharma is more dangerous than Covid and Cancer and should be banished from the face of the earth. Yet another promise made by the DMK is the retrieval of Katchatheevu, a small islet handed over to Sri Lanka by the Government of India in 1975. The decision to secede this 285-acre uninhabited islet

to Sri Lanka in 1975 was taken after a series of discussions involving top-level diplomats of Sri Lanka and India including G Parthasarathi, a close aide of Indira Gandhi. Katchatheevu is an uninhabited islet in the Palk Strait. The islet once used for pearl farming was strategically important for fishing activities and was owned by the Raja of Ramnad and later became part of the Madras Presidency after the delimitation of Gulf of Mannar and Palk Strait during British rule between the then Governments of Madras and Ceylon. In 1921, both Sri Lanka and India claimed this piece of land and the dispute remained unsettled. The agreement signed by Indira Gandhi and her Sri Lanka counterpart Sirimao

Bhandarenaik in 1975 and 1976 says that with the establishment of the Exclusive Economic Zones by the two countries, India and Sri Lanka will exercise sovereign rights over the living and non-living resources of their respective zones. The fishing vessels and fishermen of India shall not engage in fishing in the historic waters, the territorial sea and the Exclusive Economic Zone of Sri Lanka, nor shall the fishing vessels and fishermen of Sri Lanka engage in fishing in the historic waters, the territorial sea and the Exclusive Economic Zone of India, as the case may be, according to the agreement. The agreement made it clear that Katchateev belongs to the territory of Sri Lanka.

From 1976 to 2008, the DMK and its leader Karunanidhi were silent over Katchateevu. It was a case filed by AIADMK general secretary J Jayalalitha in 2008 that made Karunanidhi take up the issue as part of his political one-upmanship. When the case came up for hearing, the then chief justice R M Lodha asked Mukul Rohatgi, the then attorney general, what were the possibilities of retrieval of Katchatheev. "If you want Katchatheevu back, you will have to go to war to get it back" Rohatgi told the Court. In another development, the Coast Guard in an affidavit filed by it in Madras High Court said that it was the Tamil Nadu fishermen who violated the International Maritime Boundary Line and fished in

Sri Lankan territorial waters. Sinha Ratnatunga, a respected editor of a popular newspaper in Sri Lanka said that more than 600 fishing boats from India cross over the IMLB and carry out bottom trawling in the island's territorial waters violating all norms. The bottom trawling using purine nets destroys the entire marine wealth in the Sri Lankan waters. The demand for the retrieval of Katchatheev is with an ulterior motive. The Dravidians do not want a cordial relationship between India and Sri Lanka. Should Lanka too end up as the Maldives? asks R R Wijayabalan, who is one of the best friends of India in the island nation. *(The writer is special correspondent with the pioneer; views are personal)*

Assange’s extradition on hold until US rules out death penalty

A British court ruled on Tuesday that Julian Assange cannot be extradited to the United States on espionage charges unless US authorities guarantee he won't get the death penalty, giving the WikiLeaks founder a partial victory in his long legal battle over the site's publication of classified American documents. Two High Court judges said they would grant Assange a new appeal unless US authorities give further assurances within three weeks about what will happen to him. The ruling means the legal saga, which has dragged on for more than a decade, will continue — and Assange will remain inside London's high-security Belmarsh Prison, where he has spent the last five years. Judges Victoria Sharp and Jeremy Johnson said the US must guarantee that Assange, who is Australian, "is afforded the same

First Amendment protections as a United States citizen, and that the death penalty is not imposed". The judges said that if the US files new assurances, "we will give the parties an opportunity to make further submissions before we make a final decision on the application for leave to appeal". The judges said a hearing will be held May 20 if the US makes those submissions. The US Justice Department declined to comment on Tuesday. Assange's supporters say he is a journalist protected by the First Amendment who exposed US military wrongdoing in Iraq and Afghanistan that was in the public interest. Assange's wife Stella Assange said the WikiLeaks founder "is being persecuted because he exposed the true cost of war in human lives". "The Biden administration should not issue assurances. They should drop this shameful

case, which should never have been brought," she said outside the High Court in London. The ruling follows a two-day hearing in the High Court in February, where Assange's lawyer Edward Fitzgerald said American authorities were seeking to punish him for WikiLeaks "exposure of criminality on the part of the US government on an unprecedented scale", including torture and killings. The US government said Assange's actions went beyond journalism by soliciting, stealing and indiscriminately publishing classified government documents that endangered many people, including Iraqis and Afghans who had helped US forces. The judges rejected six of Assange's nine grounds of appeal, including the allegation that his prosecution is political. They said that while Assange "acted out of political conviction... it does not follow however that the

request for his extradition is made on account of his political views". The judges also said Assange could not appeal based on allegations, made by his lawyers, that the CIA developed plans to kidnap or kill Assange during the years he spent holed up in the Ecuadorian Embassy in London, to prevent him from trying to flee. The judges said "plainly, these are allegations of the utmost seriousness", but concluded they had no bearing on the extradition request. "Extradition would result in him being lawfully in the custody of the United States authorities, and the reasons (if they can be called that) for rendition or kidnap or assassination then fall away," the ruling said. They accepted three grounds of appeal: the threat to Assange's freedom of speech, Assange's claim that he faces disadvantage because he is not a US citizen, and the risk he could receive the death penalty.

Cargo ship collides with Baltimore’s key bridge, causing collapse

A container ship rammed into a major bridge in Baltimore early Tuesday, causing it to snap and plunge into the river below. Several vehicles fell into the chilly waters, and rescuers searched for survivors. It was also not clear what caused the cargo ship to crash into the Francis Scott Key Bridge long before the busy morning commute in what one official called a "developing mass casualty event" in a major American city just outside of Washington. Two people were rescued, and it was not clear how many more might be in the water. The ship crashed into one of the bridge's supports, causing the structure to snap and buckle at several points and tumble into the water in a matter of seconds — a shocking spectacle that was captured on video and posted on social media. The vessel

caught fire, and thick, black smoke billowed out of it. "Never would you think that you would see, physically see, the Key Bridge tumble down

like that. It looked like something out of an action movie," said Baltimore Mayor Brandon Scott, calling it "an unthinkable tragedy."

Chief James Wallace said authorities "may be looking for upwards of seven people" but said that number could change and other officials wouldn't give figures. It was not clear if the two rescued were included in the seven cited by the fire chief. Authorities said a crew of unknown size was working on the bridge at the time of the collapse and that sonar had detected cars in the water, which is about 50 feet (15 meters) deep. The water temperature was about 47 degrees Fahrenheit (8 degrees Celsius) before dawn Tuesday, according to a buoy that collects data for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Earlier, Kevin Cartwright, director of communications for the Baltimore Fire Department, told The Associated Press that several vehicles were on the bridge at the time of the collapse, including one the size of a tractor-trailer truck.

Israel, Hamas dig in as international pressure builds for Gaza cease-fire

Hamas has rejected the latest proposal put forward by international mediators for a cease-fire and hostage release, and Israel has blasted a UN Security Council resolution that called for both without linking them. As the war in Gaza grinds through a sixth month, each side has publicly insisted that its own idea of victory is in reach, and late Monday they rejected the latest international efforts to stem the bloodshed. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said Israel can achieve its aims of dismantling Hamas and returning scores of hostages if it expands its ground offensive to the southern city of Rafah, where over half of Gaza's population has sought refuge, many in crowded tent camps. Hamas has said it will hold onto the hostages until Israel agrees to a more permanent cease-fire, withdraws its forces from Gaza and releases hundreds of Palestinian prisoners,

including top militants. It said late Monday that it has rejected a recent proposal that fell short of those demands — which, if fulfilled, would allow it to claim an extremely costly victory.

There is no end in sight to the war, which has killed over 32,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's Health Ministry. The fighting has left much of the Gaza Strip in ruins, displaced most its residents and driven

a third of its population of 2.3 million to the brink of famine. An Israeli strike late Monday on a residential building in Rafah where three displaced families were sheltering killed at least 16 people, including nine children and four women, according to hospital records and relatives of the deceased. An Associated Press reporter saw the bodies arrive at a hospital. On Monday, the Security Council finally managed to pass a resolution calling for a cease-fire as the United States abstained instead of vetoing the measure, angering Israel in a major escalation of tensions between the two close allies. The resolution calls for the release of all hostages held in Gaza but does not condition the cease-fire on it. Israeli Foreign Minister Israel Katz told Army Radio on Tuesday that the resolution had emboldened Hamas by signalling that international pressure would end the war without it having to make any concessions.

"The message delivered to Hamas yesterday... is that you don't have to hurry," Katz said. The war began on October 7, when Hamas-led militants stormed across the border and attacked communities in southern Israel, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting around 250 others. It is still believed to be holding about 100 hostages and the remains of 30 others, after most of the rest were freed in November in exchange for the release of Palestinian prisoners. The United States, Qatar and Egypt have spent several weeks trying to negotiate another cease-fire and hostage release, but those efforts appeared to have stalled. Hamas said in a statement late Monday that it has informed the mediators it will stick to an earlier position. Hamas said Israel has not responded to its core demands of a "comprehensive cease-fire, an (Israeli) withdrawal from the Strip, the return of displaced people and a real prisoner exchange."

Hamas has previously proposed a phased process in which it would release all the remaining hostages in exchange for a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza, the opening of its borders for aid and reconstruction, and the release of hundreds of Palestinian prisoners, including top militants serving life sentences. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has rejected those demands as unrealistic. He has vowed to resume Israel's offensive after any hostage release and keep fighting until Hamas is destroyed, saying it's the only way to prevent a repeat of the October 7 attack. But he has provided few details about what would follow any such victory and has largely rejected a postwar vision outlined by the US. That approach has brought him into increasingly open conflict with President Joe Biden's administration, which has expressed mounting concern over civilian casualties

while supplying Israel with crucial military aid and backing Israel's aim of destroying Hamas. The US had vetoed previous UN resolutions calling for a cease-fire. The White House has urged Israel not to undertake a major ground operation in Rafah, warning that it could cause a humanitarian catastrophe. The administration was set to brief visiting Israeli officials on an alternative approach, but Netanyahu called off their visit in response to the US abstention at the UN. Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant is in Washington on a separate trip, however, and is to meet with US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin on Tuesday. On Monday, Gallant vowed to continue the offensive until Israel's aims are met. "We will operate against Hamas everywhere — including in places where we have not yet been," he said. "We have no moral right to stop the war while there are still hostages held in Gaza."

South Africa's ANC fails in bid to ban Zuma's party from polls

Johannesburg (AP): A South African court on Tuesday dismissed the ruling party's case demanding a rival opposition party be deregistered and banned from participating in the upcoming election. The Electoral Court said the ruling African National Congress party's objection to how the Independent Electoral Commission handled the uMkhonto weSizwe Party's registration had no merit, adding it should have addressed the Electoral Commission before filing a court case. Former South African President Jacob Zuma, who headed the country from 2009 to 2018 when he was removed amid wide-ranging allegations of corruption, parted ways with the ANC in December and is now leading the uMkhonto weSizwe Party, or MK Party. His popularity — especially in his home province of KwaZulu-Natal, expected to be a key battleground in this year's elections — has helped MK Party emerge as a potentially significant contender in the upcoming polls. The party is named after the former military wing of the ANC, which was disbanded at the end of white minority rule and racial segregation policies of the regime known as apartheid. On Wednesday, the ANC will launch another court bid against Zuma's party, challenging its right to use the name and trademark of the now-defunct organization. South Africa's 29 May elections are expected to be highly contested with the ANC, once led by anti-apartheid leader Nelson Mandela, under pressure to remain in power following declining support in successive elections as the country faces stagnant economic growth, high levels of poverty among its Black majority, and an unemployment rate of over 32 per cent. According to recent polls, the ANC may dip below 50 per cent of the national vote for the first since it came into power in 1994 when Mandela became the country's first democratically-elected leader.

Kennedy Jr. expected to announce his VP pick for WH bid

Robert F. Kennedy Jr. plans to announce his running mate Tuesday as he races to secure a place on the ballot for his independent campaign for president. In advance of an event Tuesday in Oakland, Kennedy and his aides have circulated the names of several contenders, including celebrities with no political experience. Those names include NFL quarterback Aaron Rodgers and "Dirty Jobs" star Mike Rowe as well as former Minnesota Gov. Jesse Ventura. Speculation most recently has centred on Nicole Shanahan, a lawyer and philanthropist who bankrolled a Super Bowl ad for Kennedy. "This announcement is really going to shake up the political establishment," Kennedy said in a video he posted on social media last week. Kennedy's campaign has spooked Democrats, who are fighting third-party options that could draw support from President Joe Biden and help Republican former President Donald Trump. As they head into a 2020 rematch, Biden and Trump are broadly unpopular with the US public and will compete for the votes of people who aren't enthusiastic about either of them. Without the backing of a party, Kennedy faces an arduous task to get on the ballot, with varying rules across the 50 states. He's picking a running mate now because about half of the states require him to designate one before he can apply for ballot access. The requirement is already bedeviling Kennedy's ballot access effort in Nevada, where Democratic Secretary of State Francisco Aguilar said in a March 7 letter to independent candidates that they must nominate a vice presidential candidate before collecting signatures. The letter came days after Kennedy's campaign announced he'd collected enough signatures in the state. If Aguilar's opinion

Farmers block Brussels to protest EU policies

Brussels (AP) Dozens of tractors on Tuesday sealed off streets close to European Union headquarters where the 27 EU agriculture ministers were planning to discuss the crisis in the sector that has led to months of protests across the bloc. The farmers were protesting anything from what they see as excessive red tape to increased environmental measures, cheap imports and unfair trading practices. "Let us make a living from our profession," read one billboard on a huge tractor blocking a main thoroughfare. Even if smaller than previous demonstrations, the impact on the Belgian capital was sizable during the morning rush hour, and authorities asked commuters to stay out of Brussels and work from home as much as possible. With protests taking place from Finland to Greece, Poland, and Ireland, the farmers have already won a slew of concessions from EU and national authorities, from a loosening of controls on farms to a weakening of pesticide and environmental rules. Earlier this month, the European Commission, the EU's executive arm, proposed weakening or cutting rules in areas like crop rotation, soil cover protection and tillage methods. Small farmers, representing some two-thirds of the workforce and the most active within the continent-wide protest movement, will be exempt from some controls and penalties under the new rules. Environmentalists and climate activists say the change in EU policies under the duress of protesting farmers is regrettable. They say the short-term concessions will come to haunt the bloc in a generation when climate change will hit the continent even harder. Politically, the bloc has moved to the right over the past year. The plight of farmers has become a rallying cry for populists and conservatives who claim EU climate and farm

Senegal’s president-elect pledges to fight corruption after stunning victory

Senegal woke up Tuesday to a new president-elect, Bassirou Diomaye Faye, a former tax inspector and political newcomer who was released from prison just weeks ago and had inspired voters, many of them unemployed youth, with a vow to fight corruption and reform the economy. Faye was catapulted into a presidential campaign after popular opposition leader Ousmane Sonko, who was barred from running due to a prior conviction, had backed him. As he gave his first speech as president-elect on Monday evening, it represented a dramatic rise for the 44-year-old who is due to be the youngest leader of the West African nation. "I pledge to govern with humility and transparency, and to fight corruption at all levels. I pledge to devote myself fully to

rebuilding our institutions," he said, restating promises made during his campaign. While official results of Sunday's vote were not yet available, the other front-runner — the former prime minister who was backed by incumbent President Macky Sall — had conceded defeat. Sall followed with congratulations, also naming Faye as the winner. The election followed months of unrest ignited by Faye and Sonko's arrest last year, and concerns that the president would seek a third term in office despite constitutional term limits. The violence shook Senegal's reputation as a stable democracy in a region that has seen a wave of coups. Rights groups said dozens were killed in the protests, while some 1,000 people were jailed. Considered the anti-establishment candidate, Faye's campaign messages of economic

reform and anti-corruption resonated with the youth. Almost a third of young people are unemployed with thousands risking their lives on dangerous journeys in search of jobs in the West. Faye has vowed to improve Senegal's control over its natural resources by promoting national companies to prevent the country from falling into what his campaign called "economic enslavement." His manifesto promised to renegotiate Senegal's oil and gas contract and introduce a new currency. On Monday night, Faye outlined some early foreign policy priorities, which included reforming the troubled West African regional bloc known as ECOWAS. "A win by the opposition also means major changes ahead in domestic and foreign policies," said Rida Lyammouri of the Policy Center for the New South, a Morocco-based think

tank, adding that a promise to move away from former colonial power France could define the foreign policy of the country's new government. The election was largely peaceful and early counts showed voters turned out overwhelmingly in favor of the opposition. Sonko had promised a resounding victory on his YouTube channel. By Monday evening in Dakar, Faye had been declared the winner and celebrations erupted in neighbourhoods around the capital, where supporters danced, played music and set off fireworks. Faye's roots lie in a small town in central Senegal. He is a practicing Muslim and has two wives. Ahead of Sunday's election, Faye published a declaration of his assets, and called on other candidates to do the same. It lists a home in Dakar, and land outside the capital and in his hometown.

King Charles III to attend Easter service

London (PTI): Britain's King Charles III will attend the traditional royal Easter service at St. George's Chapel in Windsor on Sunday, Buckingham Palace said on Tuesday, confirming the 75-year-old monarch's first major public appearance as he undergoes treatment for an unspecified form of cancer. The King had taken a back seat from public-facing duties since his cancer diagnosis was made public last month. But in a sign that he intends to begin a return to a more active schedule gradually, Charles also took part in an audience at the palace in London with community faith leaders from across the UK. "Their Majesties The King and Queen [Camilla], accompanied by other members of the royal family, will attend the Easter Mattins Service at St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle on Easter Sunday," Buckingham Palace said. Several royal family members

gather to celebrate Easter and are annually photographed walking into the service at St. George's Chapel. However, unlike in the past, Prince William and his family will not be joining the service after his wife Kate Middleton revealed she is undergoing preventative chemotherapy following her cancer diagnosis. The family, including children Princes George and Louis and Princess Charlotte, are privately spending the school Easter holidays this year. The latest palace announcement comes as the King met faith leaders from the Windsor Leadership Trust at Buckingham Palace. "In February 2024, 18 influential leaders from the Muslim, Jewish and Christian faiths were invited to St. George's House, Windsor Castle, by the Windsor Leadership Trust for the Faith Leaders' Forum," the palace said.

UK police share family tribute to Indian student killed in collision

The Metropolitan Police in London on Tuesday officially named a former NITI Aayog employee Cheistha Kochhar as the 33-year-old woman who was killed in a road collision in north London while she cycled back home from London School of Economics (LSE). There have been no arrests a week after the incident, police said. The police said Kochhar, who was pursuing her PhD in behavioural research at the LSE, died following a collision involving a refuse lorry on Clerkenwell Road near the junction with Farringdon Road on March 19 evening. The force said enquiries into the circumstances of the collision are ongoing as officers continue to appeal for witnesses and for any road users with dashcam footage from the scene to come forward.

Cheistha was cycling when she was involved in a collision with a refuse lorry — the lorry stopped at the scene and the driver is helping police with their enquiries. There has been no arrest and enquiries into the circumstances continue," the Met Police said. The police also released a statement on behalf of Cheistha Kochhar's family, which praises her "deep intelligence" and "sprightly demeanour" which

won her many friends. "She always had a hug to spare for anyone and she lived her life with the principle that it was more important to be the kindest person in the room, than to be the smartest person in the room. In the short span she had on this planet, she touched tens of thousands of people in extremely meaningful ways and the magnitude of this loss is incomprehensible," the family tribute reads. Cheistha was born in Bareilly in 1990 and graduated high school from the Convent of Jesus and Mary, New Delhi. After graduating from Delhi University with a BA in Economics and Mathematics in 2008, she went on to finish the PGP in Liberal Arts as a Young India Fellow from Ashoka University and then did another post-graduation from the University of Chicago in International Development and Policy (MAIDP).

5 Chinese among 6 killed IN Pak suicide attack

At least five Chinese nationals were among the six persons killed on Tuesday when an explosives-packed vehicle rammed into their bus in Pakistan's troubled province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, officials said, in the second suicide attack on the personnel working on the China-backed hydropower project since 2021. The Chinese were working on the Dasu hydropower project, which is about 300 km to the north of Islamabad. The 4,320 MW project is being constructed by the China Gezhouba with funding from the World Bank. In Tuesday's attack, several others were injured in the incident that occurred in the Bisham area of Shangla district of the province when a bus, escorted by a five-vehicle convoy, en route from Islamabad to Kohistan was hit by a vehicle coming from the opposite direction in the hilly terrain, police said. The incident occurred around 1 pm. One of the vehicles of the 13-vehicle convoy caught fire and fell into a ravine, follow-

ing the attack, China's Xinhua news agency said, quoting the sources.

Senior police officer Muhammad Ali Gandapur confirmed the incident and the death toll, adding that apparently, it was a suicide attack. "Five Chinese nationals and their Pakistani driver were killed in the attack," Gandapur told the media. No group has so far claimed responsibility for the attack. The police and officials of other security agencies rushed to the scene of the attack and launched a probe into the incident.

The Pakistan Army said that strategic projects and sensitive sites vital for Pakistan's economic progress are being targeted as a conscious effort to retard progress and sow discord between Pakistan and its strategic allies and partners, most notably China.

Pakistan's Foreign Ministry said the attack was "orchestrated by the enemies of Pakistan-China friendship" and added that "Such dastardly acts cannot dent the resolve of Pakistani nation to fight against the scourge of terrorism." The Chinese Embassy

here announced taking all necessary measures to protect the Chinese citizens, institutions and projects in Pakistan, and to ensure such incidents will not happen again. This is the second such attack that has killed Chinese nationals since 2021.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi rushed to the Chinese embassy here and met Chinese ambassador Jiang Zaidong. Naqvi offered condolences and also assured the envoy that the Pakistan government would bring the perpetrators to justice.

President Asif Ali Zardari strongly condemned the attack and said, "Anti-Pakistan elements will never succeed in damaging Pak-China friendship." Chief Minister Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province Ali Amin Gandapur also has condemned the suicide attack and sought a detailed report from the provincial police chief into the attack on the Chinese vehicle. Meanwhile, the Pakistan Army said that the recent incidents of terrorism in Pakistan, notably in Gwadar,

Turbat, and Besham on Tuesday were dastardly acts aimed at destabilizing the internal security situation. "While the first two attempts were successfully thwarted by the armed forces, the latest incident at Besham claimed six innocent civilians including 5 Chinese nationals," the army said in a statement, condemning the incident. "Certain foreign elements are complicit in aiding and abetting terrorism in Pakistan, driven by their vested interests. Despite the veneer of innocence, these elements are being continuously exposed as sponsors of terror," it said. The army declared that Pakistan with the unwavering support of the resilient nation and "our iron-clad ally China" will ensure that all those involved in aiding terrorism, directly or indirectly, are held accountable and find their due comeuppance.

The Foreign Ministry also "strongly condemned" what it called as the "heinous act of terrorism" and said it will take all necessary measures to bring the terrorists and their facilitators to justice. "Such dastardly acts cannot

dent the resolve of the Pakistani nation to fight against the scourge of terrorism. Today's attack was orchestrated by the enemies of Pakistan-China friendship. We will resolutely act against all such forces and defeat them," it said. "Pakistan and China are close friends and iron brothers. The life and safety of Chinese nationals in Pakistan is of paramount importance. Pakistan will continue to work with our Chinese brothers in ensuring the safety and security of Chinese nationals, projects and institutions in Pakistan," the statement added.

Separately, the Chinese Embassy, in a statement, too "strongly condemned the attack" and expressed "deep condolences" to the victims and sincere sympathy to the bereaved families. The Chinese Embassy and Consulates General in Pakistan have launched an emergency plan immediately, requesting the Pakistani side to thoroughly investigate the attack and severely punish the perpetrators, it said. The embassy announced tak-

ing all necessary measures to protect the Chinese citizens, institutions and projects in Pakistan, and to ensure such incidents will not happen again.

It also reminded the Chinese citizens, and enterprises in Pakistan to pay close attention to the security situation, enhance security alerts, strengthen security measures, and make every effort to take safety precautions.

Chinese experts believe the latest attack is a copy of the July 2021 Dasu terror attack in which nine Chinese nationals and four Pakistani people were killed.

This latest case should serve as a wake-up call for Pakistan that it needs to improve the security situation in the country and for China that it should be aware of the terrorist forces that are trying to sabotage the success of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, Chinese security experts told the Global Times. Thousands of Chinese personnel are working in Pakistan on several projects being carried out under the aegis of the USD 60 billion China-Pakistan Economic Corridor.

‘Pak to seek US waiver for Iran pipeline project’

Pakistan has decided to plead "vigorously" and seek exemption from potential US sanctions against the planned construction of a multi-billion dollar pipeline to import cheap gas from neighbouring Iran, the petroleum minister has said, asserting that it "can't afford sanctions" on the project.

Minister for Petroleum Dr Musadik Malik said that the government would seek exemption from US sanctions for the multi-billion-dollar Iran-Pakistan (IP) gas pipeline project, the Dawn newspaper reported.

"We will seek exemption from US sanctions. Pakistan cannot afford sanctions in the gas pipeline project," he told journalists during an informal chat on Monday evening. The development came after US Assistant Secretary of State for South and Central Asia Donald Lu said at a congressional hearing that Pakistan had so far not sought exemption for the 1,150-kilometre gas pipeline.

Malik said the government would "plead vigorously" Pakistan's case for the waiver on technical, political and economic grounds at relevant forums, including through lobbying.

He also expressed the hope that the project's construction would begin soon while complying with contractual obligations with Iran. Malik's remarks were in contrast to the stance put forward by the Foreign Office, whose spokesperson told a press briefing last week that there was no room for any discussion or waiver from a third country. An official said the caretaker government had delayed the filing of a request for exemptions from US sanctions due to the changing geopolitical situation, though its draft had been finalised, according to the report. Pakistan and Iran signed an agreement in May 2009 for the supply of 750 million cubic feet per day of gas for 25 years from Iran's South Pars gas



field. Both countries were required to implement the project in their respective territories.

The project was initially conceived as an India-Pakistan-Iran gas pipeline, but later, India left it and became a bilateral project between Pakistan and Iran.

According to the agreement, the project was to start supply by January 2015. While Iran has already built over 900 km of the pipeline, the remaining 250 km segment has yet to be completed.

The caretaker government opted to start building an 80-kilometre segment of the gas pipeline, extending from the Iranian border to Gwadar, at an estimated cost of USD 158 million (Rs 44.2 billion) to ward off USD 18 billion potential penalties from Tehran. In August last year, Pakistan temporarily shelved the gas pipeline project, apparently under pressure from the US, which imposed sanctions against Tehran over its nuclear programme. On December 21, 2023, the National Iranian Oil Company (NIOC) served a material breach notice to Pakistan's Inter-State Gas Systems (Pvt) Ltd (ISGS), an entity of the petroleum division, alleging material breach of buyer's warranties. The NIOC gave the ISGS 180 days to remedy the alleged material breach and referred the matter to the coordination committee for resolution. If Pakistan doesn't implement the project, Tehran has the option to move the Paris-based International Court of Arbitration, with potential contractual liability estimated to be USD 18 billion, according to the report.

Pak PM says cash-strapped country has to seek another IMF bailout

Islamabad (PTI): Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday said his government is planning to approach the IMF for "another programme", days after the cash-strapped country struck a staff-level agreement with the global lender regarding the disbursement of the final tranche of USD 1.1 billion. Shehbaz, who took oath as the country's premier on March 4 for a second time since 2022 amidst staggering economic and security challenges, said, "We have to do another IMF programme and it won't work out without one." "Rome wasn't built overnight," the 72-year-old added while addressing the Tax Excellence Awards in Islamabad, The News International reported. Washington-based IMF's global team reached a staff-level agreement with the Pakistani authorities last week on the second and final review of Pakistan's stabilisation programme supported by the global lender's USD 3 billion standby arrangement approved in July last year. Shehbaz, the younger brother of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo and three-time former premier Nawaz Sharif, said, "While the programme has some limitations, it is important for ensuring economic stability."

The prime minister, who came to power with the formation of a coalition government supported by the Pakistan Peoples Party and four smaller parties, reiterated that a "route will have to be taken to ensure economic stability as well as focus on the country's growth, provide job opportunities to people and address inflation". Last week, Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb also maintained that Pakistan will discuss an Extended Fund Facility (EFF) with the IMF in Washington next month, the report said.

Armed Baloch militants tried to infiltrate one of the main naval air bases in Pakistan's restive Balochistan province, but security forces foiled the attack and killed all four terrorists.

The attack on Monday night took place in Turbat, a turbulent district in the sparsely populated province. Makran Commissioner Saeed Ahmed Umrani told the media that security forces had foiled an armed terrorist attack at the PNS Siddique Naval Air Base which is among the biggest naval air stations in the country.

"The armed men attacked from three sides of the airport boundary, but security forces responded immediately and foiled their attempt to infiltrate the premises," he said. Eyewitnesses reported they had heard gunfire and explosions



throughout the night. According to a statement by the army, terrorists on the night of March 25/26 attempted to attack Pakistan Naval Base, PNS Siddique in the Turbat area of Balochistan province. However, it was thwarted due to the swift and effective response by the troops ensuring the safety and security of personnel and assets. "Security forces in the vicinity

were immediately mobilized to support the naval troops. Synergetic and effective response by the armed forces enabled the killing of all four terrorists in ensuing joint clearance operation," the army said. However, during an intense fire exchange, a 24-year-old Sepoy of the paramilitary Frontier Corps Balochistan was killed. A security official said on condition of anonymity that terror-

ists were unable to cause any damage at the airbase or to aeroplanes.

No loss of sensitive naval installations was reported, the official said.

A sanitisation operation was being conducted to eliminate any other terrorists found in the area and Pakistan Armed Forces were committed to eliminating the menace of terrorism from the country at all costs. The banned Balochistan Liberation Army claimed that its Majeed Brigade was behind the attack.

This is the third major attack on security forces and installations this year in Balochistan claimed by the BLA with the first two attacks being also being repulsed by security forces.

Earlier in the year, security forces were attacked in Mach town in which at least ten people were killed but attempts to breach the Mach jail were

thwarted by security forces.

On March 24, the BLA also claimed responsibility for an attack on the Gwadar Port Authority Complex. Security forces had killed eight militants of the banned separatist group in the gunfire.

Balochistan, bordering Iran and Afghanistan, is home to a long-running violent insurgency. Baloch insurgent groups have previously carried out several attacks targeting the USD 60 billion CPEC projects.

The BLA accuses China and Islamabad of exploitation of the resource-rich province, a charge rejected by the authorities. BLA's Majeed Brigade, which was formed in 2011, is a particularly lethal guerilla cell of the BLA.

It has been alleged that the group also maintains sanctuaries in areas along the Pakistan-Iran border.

Senior PML-N leader rebukes PPP over approach towards coalition government

In the first reported public spat between Pakistan's ruling coalition members, a senior leader of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) has launched a scathing criticism of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) for its "attitude" towards the coalition government at the Centre.

PML-N leader Rana Sanaullah, while speaking on a Geo News programme, said the "attitude of the PPP will remain the same throughout the tenure of the government". "Look at their reaction to the Indus River System Authority (IRSA) chairman (appointment) issue," he said.

The former interior minister of Pakistan said it is clear the Bilawal Bhutto Zardari-led PPP will have their "own position on everything".

"An impression is coming from allies to have the same attitude. However, we will try to move forward," he added. Sanaullah's remarks come after the PPP strongly objected to



the Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif government's decision to appoint Zafar Mahmood, a retired federal government officer, as the IRSA chairman, The News International reported. The PPP termed Mahmood's appointment for a three-year tenure as a violation of constitutional procedures. Following the party's concerns,

the government backtracked on the appointment with Shehbaz Sharif assuring Sindh Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah of retracting the notification regarding the appointment.

Sanaullah said the PPP should have approached the PML-N directly before reaching out to the media on the appointment.

Sanaullah said if PML-N supremo Nawaz Sharif had been the prime minister instead of Shehbaz, he might have said "a decision had been made and it would be reviewed later".

In the February 8 general elections, the Sharifs-led party failed to garner a clear majority, albeit technically, it was the largest party with 75 out of 265 seats.

In a surprise move, the elder Sharif stepped back in favour of Shehbaz to allow him to lead the coalition as he is believed to have the knack of taking along diverse groups in the polarised country.

The elections saw more than 90 independent candidates backed by jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's PTI winning the maximum number of seats in the National Assembly.

The PPP and four smaller parties joined the coalition with the PPP supporting the government from outside in return for PML-N support for the election of its senior leader and former president Asif Ali Zardari as the president.

Prisoners jailed for national security crimes unlikely to get early release: HK leader

Hong Kong (AP): Hong Kong's leader said Tuesday that prisoners convicted for serious national security crimes would not likely be granted early release under the tightened rules of a new national security law, signalling a hardening government stance against jailed political activists.

Chief Executive John Lee said the Safeguarding National Security Ordinance stipulates that people found guilty of endangering national security must not be granted remission unless the commissioner of correctional services believes the move would not be a national security risk. This also applies to inmates who received sentences before the new law was introduced last Saturday, Lee said.

Previously, inmates could have their prison sentences reduced by up to one-third for good conduct under the city's prison rules, provided they were serving terms longer than one

month.

At a weekly press briefing, Lee urged residents not to defy the law. "We need to make sure everyone understands that if someone was convicted of serious national security offenses, normally there would not be remission of sentence," he said. Lee's comments came after local media, including the South China Morning Post, reported that the early release of activist Ma Chun-man, which had been scheduled for Monday, was blocked under the new national security law. The remission had been granted due to his good conduct and the blockage was the first of its kind, according to the reports, which cited unnamed sources. The revised practice is expected to affect other activists who are jailed or undergoing trials under a similar sweeping security law imposed by Beijing four years ago to quell massive anti-government protests in 2019.

NZ joins US, UK in alleging it was targeted by China-backed cyberespionage

Wellington (AP): Hackers linked to the Chinese government launched a state-sponsored operation that targeted New Zealand's Parliament in 2021, the country's security minister said Tuesday.

New Zealand's allegation comes a day after American and British authorities announced a set of criminal charges and sanctions against seven hackers, all believed to be living in China, who targeted US officials, journalists, corporations and pro-democracy activists, as well as the UK's election watchdog.

"The use of cyber-enabled espionage operations to interfere with democratic institutions and processes anywhere is unacceptable," Judith Collins, the defense minister responsible for the Government Communications Security Bureau, said in a statement.

Multiple victims of Moscow attack in serious condition: Russian officials

Moscow (AP): Twenty-two victims of the Russia concert hall attack that killed more than 130 people remain in serious condition in the hospital, Health Minister Mikhail Murashko said Tuesday, according to state news agency Tass. Two of them are children, it said.

Russia is still reeling from the attack Friday in which gunmen killed 139 people in a concert hall on the outskirts of Moscow. Russian President Vladimir Putin said Monday that the gunmen are "radical Islamists," but despite all evidence pointing to the involvement of Islamic State, Putin repeated his accusation that Ukraine could have played a role. Kyiv has strongly denied any link to the attack. Four men accused of carrying out the attack appeared before a

Moscow court on Sunday on terrorism charges and showed signs of severe beatings. One appeared to be barely conscious during the hearing.

The men are citizens of Tajikistan, authorities said, and were named by investigators as Dalerdzhon Mirzoyev, 32; Saidakrami Rachabalizoda, 30; Shamsidin Fariduni, 25; and Mukhammadsobir Faizov, 19.

They were charged with committing a terrorist attack resulting in the death of others. The offense carries a maximum sentence of life imprisonment. Russian officials said they detained a total of 11 people over the attack. Another of those detained appeared in court Monday. Alisher Kasimov, a citizen of Kyrgyzstan in Central Asia, was charged

over renting an apartment to the men accused of carrying out the attack. A senior Turkish security official confirmed Tuesday that two of the Moscow attackers had spent a "short amount of time" in Turkey before travelling together to Russia on March 2.

One of the attackers, Fariduni, entered Turkey on February 20, checked into a hotel in Istanbul's Fatih district the next day and checked out on February 27, the official said. The other, Rachabalizoda, checked into a hotel in the same district on January 5, checking out on January 21. The official said Turkish authorities believe the two suspects "became radicalized in Russia" because they were not in Turkey for long.

Ukraine ramps up spending on homemade weapons

Ukraine needs any edge it can get to repel Russia from its territory. One emerging bright spot is its small but fast-growing defence industry, which the government is flooding with money in hopes that a surge of homemade weapons and ammunition can help turn the tide.

The effort ramped up sharply over the past year as the US and Europe strained to deliver weapons and other aid to Ukraine, which is up against a much bigger Russian military backed by a thriving domestic defence industry. The Ukrainian government budgeted nearly USD 1.4 billion in 2024 to buy and develop weapons at home — 20 times more than before Russia's full-scale invasion. And in another major shift, a huge portion of weapons are now being bought from private-

ly owned factories. They are sprouting up across the country and rapidly taking over an industry that had been dominated by state-owned companies. A privately owned mortar factory that launched in western Ukraine last year is making roughly 20,000 shells a month. "I feel that we are bringing our country closer to victory," said Anatolii Kuzmin, the factory's 64-year-old owner, who used to make farm equipment and fled his home in southern Ukraine after Russia invaded in 2022. Yet like many aspects of Ukraine's war apparatus, its defence sector has been constrained by a lack of money and manpower — and, according to executives and generals, too much government red tape. A more robust private sector could help root out inefficiencies and enable factories to churn out weapons and ammunition even faster.

Russia controls nearly a quarter of Ukraine and has gained momentum along the 1,000 kilometre front line by showing a willingness to expend large numbers of troops to make even the smallest of advances. Ukrainian troops regularly find themselves outmanned and outgunned, and this has contributed to falling morale. "You need a mortar not in three years, you need it now, preferably yesterday," said Taras Chmut, director of the Come Back Alive Foundation, an organization that has raised more than USD 260 million over the past decade to equip Ukrainian troops with machine guns, armoured vehicles and more.

Kuzmin, the owner of the mortar factory, fled the southern city of Melitopol in 2022 after Russia invaded and seized his factory that mostly made spare parts for farm equipment.

He had begun developing a prototype for mortar shells

shortly after Russia invaded Ukraine in 2014, when it illegally annexed the Crimean Peninsula. Kuzmin took over a sprawling warehouse in western Ukraine last winter. His long-term goals include boosting production to 100,000 shells per month and developing engines and explosives for drones. He is just one of many entrepreneurs transforming Ukraine's weapons industry, which was dominated by state-owned enterprises after the break-up of the Soviet Union. Today, about 80 per cent of the defence industry is in private hands — a mirror image of where things stood a year ago and a stark contrast with Russia's state-controlled defence industry. Each newly made projectile is wrapped in craft paper and carefully packed into wooden crates to be shipped to Romania or Bulgaria, where are loaded with explosives. Several weeks

later, they're shipped back and sent to the front.

"Our dream is to establish a plant for explosives," said Kuzmin, who is seeking a partner to make that happen. Ukraine's surge in military spending has occurred against a backdrop of USD 60 billion in US aid being held up by Congress and with European countries struggling to deliver enough ammunition. As impressive as Ukraine's defence sector transformation has been, the country stands no chance of defeating Russia without massive support from the West, said Trevor Taylor, a research fellow at the Royal United Services Institute, a London-based think tank. "Ukraine is not capable of producing all the munitions that it needs for this fight," Taylor said. "The hold up of USD 60 billion of American help is really proving to be a significant hindrance."

Sreejesh, a former captain, and Punia have been among the most consistent performers for India and have also been nominated for the goalkeeper of the year award. India men's team captain and defender Harmanpreet Singh has also been shortlisted in two categories. He will be in contention for the player of the year as well as the defender of the year award. The player of the year award in

both categories comes with a prize of Rs 25 lakh each, while the goalkeeping trophy will fetch the winner Rs five lakh. From eight different categories, a total of 32 nominations have made the shortlist for a total prize purse of Rs 7.56 crore, Hockey India said in a press release. "Notably, the pinnacle of the event, the Hockey India Major Dhyan Chand Lifetime Achievement Award, will carry the most substantial cash purse of Rs 30 lakh, honouring an individual's extraordinary contributions to the sport over the years," the HI added. The Jugraj Singh Award for Upcoming Player of the Year (Men) and Asunta Lakra Award for Upcoming Player of the Year (Women), which are meant for Under-21 players, offers a cash prize of Rs 10

Sreeja rises to career-high 40 in ITTF rankings

Leading Indian table tennis player G Sathiyam on Tuesday leapfrogged 43 places to be 60 while Sreeja Akula rose to a career-high 40 in the ITTF World Rankings, following their WTT Feeder Series title wins last week. Sathiyam, who has a career-best ranking of 24, had dropped out of the top 100 recently. The title in Beirut earned him 125 points. Veteran Sharath Kamal, who has dropped a place to be 35, continues to be the top-ranked Indian. Manav Thakkar and Harmeet Desai also find themselves in the top 100. Manav, who reached the men's doubles final in the WTT Feeder last week, has moved 11 spots to be 63, while Harmeet has dropped two places to be 67.



Like Sathiyam, the 25-year-old Sreeja who won her second WTT singles career title on Sunday. Manika Batra held on to her 38th spot in the women's singles rankings while Archana Kamath advanced 13 places to be 99. India has already qualified for the team events at the Paris Olympics. Two singles entries in men's and women's singles will be decided by the Table Tennis Federation of India by May 16 after considering the world rankings at the time.

BOXING SUB JUNIOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Haryana crowned champions

Haryana clinched the team titles in both the boys and girls categories with an impressive combined haul of 19 medals at the boxing Sub Junior National Championship here. Haryana, the reigning champions in the girls section, successfully defended their title after finishing on top of the table with 64 points. Haryana boxers stamped their authority with a dominating display as six out of seven boxers won comfortably with unanimous 5-0 decisions. Diya (61kg) continued her phenomenal form with a convincing 5-0 win over Delhi's Yashika. She was also adjudged the best boxer. The other gold medallists for Haryana in the girls category were Bhoomi (35kg), Nischal Sharma (37kg), Rakhi (43kg), Naitik (52kg), Navya (55kg) and Sukhreet (64kg).



Delhi and Maharashtra finished second and third with 34 and 31 points respectively. Boxers from

three silver and two bronze medals. Bronze medallist Hillang (37kg) of Arunachal Pradesh secured the most promising boxer award in the girls category. Haryana boxers showcased their might in the boys category as well, winning nine medals which included six gold, two silver and one bronze to secure the first position with 62 points. Uday Singh led Haryana's domination with 5-0 victory in 37kg against S Sujith of Tamil Nadu. Nitin (40kg), Ravi Sihag (49kg), Lakshay (52kg), Naman (58kg) and Anmol Dahiya (64kg) also won their respective finals to give Haryana a perfect end to their impressive campaign. Uttarakhand finished second with 34 points (three gold and three silver medals) followed by UP (one gold, three silver, one bronze medal). The tournament witnessed the participation of 612 boxers, including 337 boys and 275 girls.



Murray sustains serious ankle injury

Three-time Grand Slam champion Andy Murray said he suffered a significant ankle injury at the Miami Open that he expects will keep him out for some time. Murray said on an Instagram post Monday he had a "full rupture" of the anterior talofibular ligament (ATFL) and a "near full thickness rupture" of the calcaneofibular ligament (CFL). He said he will see an ankle specialist to determine what's next. "Goes without saying this is a tough one to take and I'll be out for an extended period,"

Murray continued. "But I'll be back with 1 hip and no ankle ligaments when the time is right." Murray had hip resurfacing surgery in 2019. He lost to Tomas Machac 5-7, 7-5, 7-6 (5) on Sunday. "I obviously still love competing and still love the game, but it obviously gets harder and harder the older you get to compete with the young guys and keep your body fit and fresh," Murray said in an on-court interview after a win in Dubai last month. "I probably don't have too long left, but I'll do as best as I can these last few months."

Flamengo striker Barbosa suspended for two years in doping fraud case

Brazilian striker Gabriel Barbosa was suspended for two years following a doping fraud investigation. The country's Anti-Doping Sports Court of Justice voted 5-4 to punish Barbosa to April 2025. He brought attention to himself by his erratic behavior during a surprise test on April 8, 2023, one day before Flamengo played the Rio de Janeiro state championship. Anti-doping officers who came to test players at the club training ground were largely ignored by Barbosa, who took his test hours after his teammates. Barbosa's lawyers argued his blood test at the time, which is considered a more effective test, proved he was clean, and added his unfriendly behavior toward the officers



did not mean he tricked the test. "Despite my respect for the court, I stress that I never tried to obstruct or fraud any test. I trust that I will be found not guilty in my appeal," Barbosa said on his social media channels. "Since the beginning of my career as a footballer I always

followed the rules of the game and I never used prohibited substances. I have been a subject of dozens of tests, they all came negative, which shows my commitment with my club and with Brazilian fans." Flamengo said "there was no fraud, not even an attempted fraud."

"The club received the decision with surprise and will help the athlete in his representation at the Court for Arbitration of Sport," it added in a statement. Nicknamed Gabigol, the 27-year-old Barbosa is in the final year of his contract with Flamengo, which has given him national acclaim after failed stints at Inter Milan and Benfica. The striker was part of Brazil's Olympic gold medal squad at the Rio Olympics in 2016. He left that year for Europe but returned to Santos in 2018, and became one of the most prolific scorers in Brazil. He moved to Flamengo in 2019 and helped it win two Copa Libertadores and two Brazilian leagues. But he has been benched since former Brazil coach Tite took over at Flamengo last October.

Bopanna, Ebden advance to Miami Open quarterfinals

Indian tennis player Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden moved to the men's doubles quarterfinals of the Miami Open with a hard-fought win against Hugo Nys and Jan Zieliński here. Top seeds Bopanna and Ebden toiled for one hour 39 minutes before pulling off a 7-5 7-6 (3) win over Monegasque Nys and

Poland's Zieliński in the second round of the ATP Masters 1000 on Monday night. The 43-year-old Bopanna and Ebden will take on Australia's John Patrick Smith and Netherlands Sem Verbeek. The reigning Australian Open champions hit four aces and won 84 per cent (37/44) of their first serve points. The match was contested on an even keel. Bopanna and Ebden broke Nys and Zieliński in the 11th game to take a 6-5 lead. They then fought off a late challenge, saving a couple of break points before taking the 12th game and the opening set. There was not much separating the two pairs in the second set as well with both of them holding serve till 6-6 to take the match to the tiebreaker.



Top ranked Iga, Coco knocked out of Miami Open

Top-ranked Iga Swiatek and U.S. Open champion Coco Gauff have been knocked out of the Miami Open. Swiatek lost to Ekaterina Alexandrova 6-4, 6-2 on Monday night, hours after the third-seeded Gauff fell in three sets to No. 23 Caroline Garcia 6-3, 1-6, 6-2. In the men's draw, top-seeded Carlos Alcaraz advanced to the round of 16 with a 6-4, 6-2 win over Gael Monfils. Garcia defeated her second straight Grand Slam champion to reach Miami's quarterfinals. She ousted four-time Grand Slam winner Naomi Osaka 7-6 (4), 7-5 on Sunday. Garcia said it had been a while since she had a victory over a top-10 opponent like Gauff. "You keep working and trying to stay positive about what's coming, that it's going to pay off," she said. "Sometimes, it's very hard. But I'm lucky enough to have very good people behind me to help me and stay positive when I'm

struggling." "It means a lot to have this little reward and keep going in the tournament," she said. Also moving into the quarterfinals was No. 4 seed Elena Rybakina, who defeated 17th-seeded American Madison Keys 6-3, 7-5. Rybakina will next face No. 8 seed Maria Sakkari, who advanced to her second Miami Open quarterfinal when Anna Kalinskaya, seeded 22nd, withdrew with a right thigh injury. Victoria Azarenka, who's won the Australian Open twice, made the quarterfinals with a 7-5, 6-1 victory over Katie Boulter. Yulia Putintseva also advanced, defeating No. 27 seed Anhelina Kalinina straight sets, 6-4, 7-6 (5), and No. 5 seed Jessica Pegula beat Emma Navarro 7-6 (1), 6-3. Alcaraz will next face Lorenzo Musetti, who beat Ben Shelton 6-4, 7-6 (5). Alexander Zverev, the fourth seed, defeated Christopher Eubanks 7-6 (4), 6-3, and No.

Germany to impose security checks on all its borders during soccer European Championship

Germany will carry out Gborder controls at all its frontiers during soccer's European Championship in June and July, the country's top security official told local media. Interior Minister Nancy Faeser told the daily Rheinische Post in comments published Tuesday that checks will be carried out at all German borders during the tournament "to be able to prevent possible violent criminals entering." She added that "this is necessary to protect this major international event as best possible."

Authorities' focus is on protection against Islamic and other extremists, hooligans and others, and securing networks against cyberattacks, she said. Faeser's comments come shortly after the attack on a suburban Moscow concert hall that was claimed by an affiliate of the Islamic State group. However, the decision to restore border checks during the soccer tournament had long been expected. It has become standard practice for countries in Europe's nominally ID check-free travel zone known as the Schengen area during big sports events and major summits.



Germany already is carrying out checks on its eastern and southern borders with Poland, the Czech Republic, Austria and Switzerland as a result of concerns over migration. The European Championship starts June 14, with host Germany playing Scotland in the opening match in Munich. The final will be played in Berlin on July 14. Italy followed France on Monday in stepping up security after the Moscow attack. Faeser's ministry said Monday that while the threat from Islamic extremists remains acute, German authorities' risk assessment hasn't changed so far as a result of the attack.



MI, SRH LOOK TO MAKING WINING COMEBACKS

Mumbai Indians will aim to land the killer punch after fluffing an easy run-chase in their opener when they meet a dangerous Sunrisers Hyderabad in the Indian Premier League here on Wednesday.

Hardik will also be expecting an improved performance from spinners Shams Mulani and Piyush Chawla.

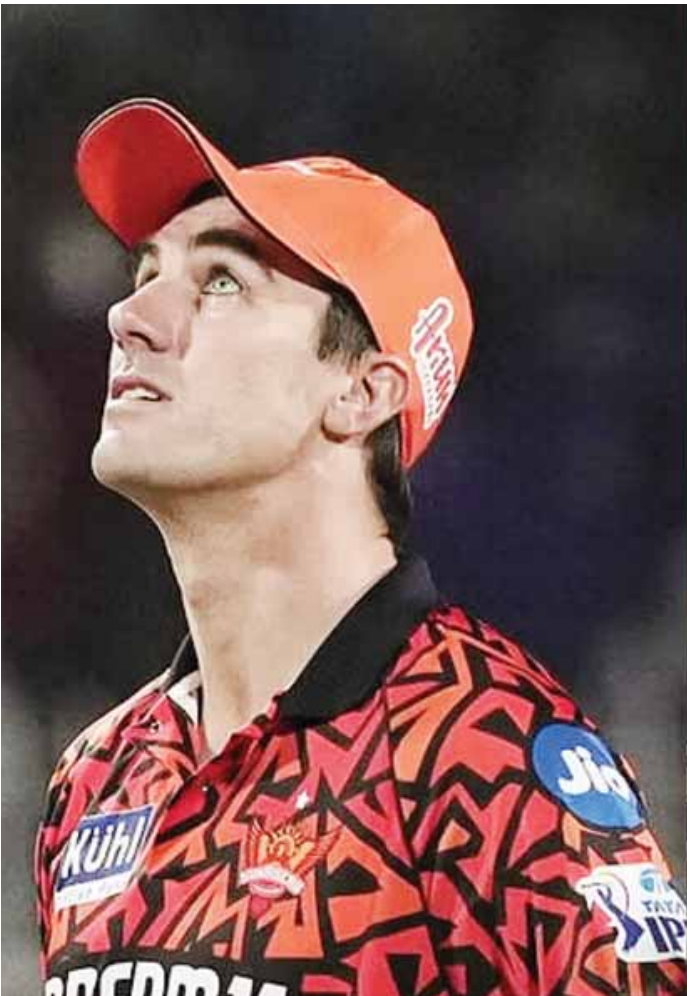

Lomror, who replaced Yash Dyal during the chase of 177 as Impact sub, made an eight-ball 17 and assisted Karthik (28, 10b) in knocking off 47 runs in 22 balls that powered RCB to a four-wicket win over Punjab Kings.

But his maiden foray into the world of 'Impact Players' taught Lomror how "weird" that role could be, particularly because of its hurried nature.

"To be honest, it (being an Impact Player) was quite weird when I went into bat. The Impact Player rule is such that you have to be ready as you can get a call at any time to go in," said Lomror in the post-match press conference.

However, the 24-year-old said the RCB management had communicated the possibility of him being used as the substitute player against Punjab.

"As the name suggests, you have to make an impact on the game from the word go. The management had discussed it last night. They told me: 'If we are chasing, we might use you down the order.' So mentally, I was prepared."

During the IPL 2023, RCB had availed the 'Impact Player' option in 12 matches out of 14,



and Anuj Rawat came in twice as the No. 8 finisher, similar to what Lomror did against PBKS at the Chinnaswamy Stadium.

On the other 10 occasions, it was either a bowler or a top/middle-order batter who walked in as 'Impact Player'.

However, Rawat could not make the desired impact as he could score only 16 runs off 27 balls in those two games.

Perhaps, that failed experiment prompted the RCB thinktank to give that duty to the big-hitting Lomror in this IPL.

The Rajasthan-born player, who joined Royal Challengers ahead of IPL 2022 from Rajasthan Royals, was ready for the grind too as it was his best chance to get a place in the eleven.

"This is what the team management wants me to prepare for. They are very clear because we have a really strong batting lineup, and this is the only place where they can use me,"

he said.

Lomror has been quietly upskilling himself at nets once the RCB top brass conveyed their decision.

"Earlier, I used to bat up the order, and that gave me more balls to bat. But now as an Impact sub, there's not going to be many balls to play. So, whenever I'm going into nets, I just try and hit boundaries from the very first ball," he offered.

But polishing the skills against your own teammates or local trundlers at nets is quite different from what a batter gets in a real match situation.

Lomror, though, aced the test against proven performers like Arshdeep Singh and Sam Curran at a stadium with an unusually gripping pitch that made shot-making a tricky proposition.

He, however, reduced the equation to 43 off 21 balls and thereby the pressure on Karthik

too with a first-ball boundary off left-arm pacer Curran.

But Lomror soon bettered that effort against Arshdeep. On the third ball of the 18th over, he smoked the left-arm quick over the cow-corner for a six and in the next ball pulled him for a four through backward square leg.

That over had started with RCB needing 36 runs from 18 balls and three balls later it became a more comfortable 24 runs from 14 balls.

Lomror was not hesitant to give a slice of credit to his senior partner Karthik for keeping his pulse against racing.

"I think batting with him makes things really easy. He has some 15-17 years of experience in IPL. He was telling me to stay calm and focus on the next ball, not to get overexcited or not to get too aggressive," he said.

The apprentice has certainly left the master a beaming man.

Rachin, Dube power CSK to 206/5 against Gujarat Titans

Rachin Ravindra started with a bang and Shivam Dube finished with a flourish as Chennai Super Kings posted a commendable 206 for 5 against Gujarat Titans in an IPL match here on Tuesday.

Rachin made full use of the Powerplay, racing to 46 off 20 balls while Dube, a nightmare for spinners, then used his long levers to whack 51 in only 23 deliveries to increase the challenge of GT batters by manifold.

Dube's innings had as many as five sixes.

In between, skipper Ruturaj Gaikwad's chiselled 46 off 36 balls also was a significant contribution in another impactful batting performance by the team on a hard bouncy track that was on offer.

Not to forget CSK's Rs 7.60 crore recruit Sameer Rizvi (14 off 6 balls), who pummelled Rashid Khan (2/49 in 4 overs) for two sixes to mark a memorable IPL debut.

Rachin, who has already become a darling of the CSK fans, enthralled all and sundry with his audacious stroke-play. While he missed out again on a half-century but team's 'spiritual skipper' Mahendra Singh Dhoni would be all smiles knowing that his choice was perfect to the T.

The three sixes — a flick



behind the square and one over long-on off the normally profligate Umesh Yadav and one off Azmatullah Omarzai were hit with so much disdain that it did put Gujarat Titans in a spot.

There were some crunchy cover drives as well as Ravindra let his skipper Gaikwad breathe a little easy at the other end.

Finally, it was GT's 'Go-To' bowler Rashid, who drew the first blood but more because of smart work from Wriddhiman Saha, who

removed the bails in a flash after the Black Caps opener lost his balance and moved out of his crease trying to whip the delivery.

Saha's next stumping was way easier as Sai Kishore shortened the length and drew Ajinkya Rahane out of his crease for an indiscreet loft. The ball deviated enough and the keeper completed mere formality.

Gaikwad wasn't as fluent as Rachin to begin with but in his five boundaries and a six, he oozed class before

becoming Saha's third victim with the gloves, trying to pull Spencer Johnson, only to end up edging one behind the stumps.

After that it was Dube, who just plonked his front-foot and bludgeoned Sai Kishore for two monstrous sixes and also sent Johnson's delivery soaring for a maximum.

Dube had the composed Daryl Mitchell for company, who also chipped in with an unbeaten 20-ball 24 in a stand of 57 runs for the fourth wicket in 5.5 overs.

Not just a marketable name to promote T20 cricket, he's still got the game. This was the subtle message Virat Kohli sent out amid unfounded chatter surrounding his place in the side ahead of the World Cup's debut appearance in the United States.

Kohli, who is back after a two-month paternity break, scored a match-winning 77 off 49 balls for Royal Challengers Bengaluru on Monday night against Punjab Kings and deservedly walked away with the player of the match honours.

"I know my name is nowadays quite attached to just promoting the game in many parts of the world when it comes to T20 cricket. But, I've still got it, I guess," said the 35-year-old father of two in the post-match presentation.

His comments came in the backdrop of never-ending media speculation surrounding the team's

composition for the big event to be jointly hosted by the USA and the West Indies starting June 1.

Former players like Kevin Pietersen have asked whether Kohli would make the Indian squad purely on merit or for being a megastar who will pull in fans.

Kohli averages over 50 in the format and has a strike rate of 138.15.

On Monday night, hallmark of Kohli's classy knock was the way he stepped out to dispatch the fast bowlers over the extra cover boundary.

The former India captain has nothing left to prove but he realises the need for constant evolution in T20 format.

"Well I mean you have to (make additions to your game)," he said when asked about going aerial against the

pacers on the off-side.

"People know I play the cover drive pretty well so they're not going to allow me to hit gaps and with guys like KG (Kagiso Rabada) and Arshdeep (Singh) as well, he's tall. So, I mean, if they're hitting length, you have to create some momentum in the ball.

"And once you're closer to the ball, you kind of negate the bounce that's going to happen. You meet it earlier. So, I mean, you have to come up with a game plan here and there and try to keep improving your game," he explained at the post-match presentation.

IT WAS SURREAL NOT TO BE RECOGNISED FOR TWO MONTHS: Kohli had missed the five-match Test series against England as he was overseas for the birth of



his second child. The long break allowed him to spend much needed quality time with his family and not being recognised on the streets was something that he enjoyed the most.

"We were not in the country. We were at a place where people were not recognising us. Just time together as a family, just to feel normal for two months. For me, for us as a family, it was a surreal experience.

"Of course, having two kids, things become totally different from a family perspective. So just the ability to be together, the connections that you make with your older child, it's amazing.

"I mean, I couldn't have been more grateful to God for the

opportunity that I got to spend time with my family." For Kohli, not being mobbed by the guys (RCB teammates) that when we came back, the voices back home felt that much louder.

"I couldn't look up because I was just not used to being called my name for two months. And then immediately you hear these loud noises and then you're back in it all again.

"But it was beautiful. It's an amazing experience to just be another person on the road and not be recognised and just carry on about life that normally people would on a

daily basis," he said.

Kohli is also forever grateful to the loyal and passionate RCB fans who keep backing the team that is yet to win the IPL.

"It's been going on for years and you know, people talk about a lot of other things when you play sport. The achievements, the stats, the numbers. Look at the end of the day when you look back you're not going to think of the numbers and the stats.

"It's the memories that you create. Famously, Rahul bhai (India head coach) in the change room nowadays says exactly the same to us. When you play, you play your heart out because you're going to miss these times when you're with your friends in the change room playing in front of fans.

"So the relationship that's happened organically over so many years it's something that I can never ever forget. Just the love and the appreciation and the backing I've received for so many years that's been amazing," Kohli added.
