NO RELIEF FOR KEJRIWAL

n a major setback to the AAP supremo, the Delhi High Court on refused Wednesday interfere with the arrest of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) connection with a money laundering case linked to the excise policy 'scam'.

The judge, in the order, clarified the matter would be taken up for final disposal on April 3 and no adjournment shall be granted. "This court deems it

India summons US diplomat over Washington remark

Taking strong objection to remarks by a US official regarding Arvind Kejriwal's arrest, India on Wednesday summoned a senior US diplomat and lodged a strong protest against Washington's remarks. On March 23, German diplomat was summoned by New Delhi over German Foreign Ministry's remark Keirwial. Ministry of External Affairs



(MEA) officials summoned Acting Deputy Chief of Mission Gloria Berbena of US at its office in South Block here. The meeting lasted for more than 30 minutes. Reports had said a US State

Department official had said Washington "encouraged a fair, transparent and timely legal process for Kejriwal". The MEA later in a statement said, "We take strong objection to the remarks of the Spokesperson of the US State Department about certain legal proceedings in India.

"In diplomacy, States are expected to be respectful of

the sovereignty and internal affairs of others. This responsibility is even more so in case of fellow democracies.

"It could otherwise end up unhealthy setting precedents," the statement



Planes graze past each other at Kolkata airport



An IndiGo aircraft grazed the wings of an Air India Express plane at the Kolkata leaving wings of both aircraft damaged, officials said.

The IndiGo flight was headed to Darbhanga, while the Air India Express plane was scheduled to leave for Chennai.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation promptly de-rostered the two pilots and ordered an enquiry into the freak accident, sources said adding both the plane had returned to the bay. The wingtip of a taxiing aircraft of another airline grazed one of our aircraft, which was stationary and awaiting clearance to enter the runway at Kolkata for a scheduled operation to Chennai," an Air India Express spokesperson said in a statement adding an

Woman stripped, paraded, four arrested | Furore over objectionable remarks by Congress MLA

our women were arrested for allegedly beating up, stripping and parading a 30-year-old woman over a dispute at a village in Madhya Pradesh's Indore district, police said on Wednesday.

A video of the purported incident that occurred during the Holi celebrations also surfaced on social media.

"On Monday, four women forcibly pulled the victim out of her house, beat her up and humiliated her by stripping her naked in public at Bachhora village of Gautampura police station area," Superintendent of Police (Rural) Sunil Mehta

All four accused women were later arrested, he said. Mehta visited the village on

Wednesday, and said peace prevails there now. But as the victim is disturbed

One of the accused suspected that the victim was instigating her mother-in-law against her. She also suspected that the victim had taken her mother-inlaw to Mandsaur without informing her, the police offi-

The victim and the accused women belong to the Scheduled Caste (SC) category, he added.

According to him, some

onlookers in the village shot the video of the humiliating act and circulated it.

These people are being identified and appropriate legal steps will be taken against them, he

Eyewitnesses said the accused women dragged the victim out of her house and stripped

They said that the victim woman kept pleading for mercy at the time of the incident, but the accused did not relent and they openly stripped her by tearing her clothes. They also took her to some distance on the common road of the village in the same condi-

A police officer said that a case has been registered under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 354-A (sexual harassment) and 452 (wrongfully restraining and assaulting).

Bhuria also purportedly termed the Bhilala communitv as 'Chor and Daku' (thieves and dacoits) while targeting Anita Chouham, the BJP candidate from the Ratlam Lok Sabha constituency.

Later, while talking to media perosns, he denied making any objectionable remark.

Reacting to the MLA's remarks captured in a video circulating on social media, BJP candidate Anita Chouhan's husband and Madhya Pradesh Forest Minister Nagar Singh Chouhan said he would lodge

As his remarks caused a furore, the MLA later said he respects all communities but refused to answer a query on the 'chop off hands' remark.

Bhuria was addressing villagers while campaigning for Congress nominee for Ratlam Jhabua seat, Kantilal Bhuria, at Madrani village, some 25 km away from Jhabua on Tuesday. Kantilal Bhuria, a former Union minister, was also present on the occasion, during the public meeting.

The Ratlam constituency is reserved for scheduled tribe candidates.

"If someone tries to scare you in any village, inform us even at midnight. We 500 people will stand there and fix it. Take a pledge that we have to win elections with great power,' "If someone talks about......cut-

ting votes and JAYS (Jai Adivasi

Yuva Shakti Sangathan), then chop off their hands, don't spare them. Treat them in such a manner, only then they will recognise you," he said. JAYS is a tribal organisation which has pockets of influence in tribal-dominated areas of

Veer Singh Bhuria further said that nobody knows about the BJP's candidate (Anita Chouhan). "They are Bhilalas (a tribal

community). These people are Daku-Chor. They are from Alirajpur (constituency). Nobody knows her (the BJP candidate) but Bhuria ji (Congress' Lok Sabha candidate) was a former MLA and MP. He also held the post of Union minister," the Congress MLA said.

He also appealed to men who attended the gathering to ask their wives to no walk into the 'Ladli Behna Yojana trap'- the flagship scheme of the Madhya Pradesh government under which the state government gives an amount of Rs 1250 each to the eligible women.

When contacted after the video surfaced on social media, Bhuria told that all communities are united and they express their own ideology in elections. "I don't want to say anything that hurts anybody," he said and denied making any objec-

tionable comment.
Asked about the 'chop off the hands' remarks, Bhuria disconnected the phone.

On the other hand, Forest Minister Nagar Singh Chouhan alleged the Congress MLA had insulted the Bhilala community and that he would lodge an FİR against him.

'Congress leaders are making such statements in desperation after losing ground in this Lok Sabha seat (Ratlam-Jhabua)," he added.

Wednesday morning. The night before this was recorded as the hottest night of the season. According to the Meteorological

Department, the night temperature on Tuesday night was 25.2 Senior Scientist of the Meteorological Center, said that

now there will be a trend of increasing night temperature in the city. It is expected that the minimum temperature will remain above normal in the coming days. Due to this there will be more humidity at night. According to the Meteorological Department, the night of Narmadapuram was the hottest in the state. The temperature here was recorded at 25.4 degrees on Tuesday night. After this the mercury in Bhopal remained

The temperature of the last five nights, the mercury has increased by 7.8 degrees. The minimum temperature was recorded at 17.4 degrees on the night of March 17, which has now reached 25.2 degrees Celsius. The mercury is continuously increasing. The temperature is likely to increase further in the coming days.

Amidst the summer, clouds are also appearing in Bhopal. It remained cloudy for some time in the morning. Due to this the humidity has also increased.

There is a trend of extreme heat in Bhopal in the last days of March. Between 2014 and 2023, there has been intense heat from 26 to 31 March. This time the effect of heat is already strong. For the eighth time in the last 11 years, the day temperature has crossed 38 degrees. However, this time there is also a possibility of drizzle in the last week.

Nadir Rashid shot himself in the jaw in the bathroom of his home Shyamala Kothi in Nadir Colony in Shyamala Hills area. Police received information about the incident at 10 am. Senior police officers and relatives of Nadir Rashid reached his house. Police sent the body to Hamidia Hospital for post-

Nadir Rasheed has two sons, Zafar and Faza and aas a daughter, who lives abroad. As soon as the information was received, the police reached Shyamala Kothi, the house of Nadir Rashid.

for six months due to which he hence committed suicide. Shyamala Hills Police Station

TI R.V. Singh Vimal said that Nadir was suffering from BP, sugar and prostate problems for a long time. He had unbearable pain while urinating. Due to this disease he had fallen into depression. Preferred to live in solitude for the last 6 months. Interaction with relatives was also reduced. On Wednesday morning, he went to the attached bathroom of his bedroom in Shyamala Kothi. There he shot him below the jaw with his 275 bore rifle. His employee Shamsher was the first to see him. After this the family informed the police station. Nadir Rasheed's body was taken to Hamidia Hospital in a private ambulance.

After Nadir Rashid committed suicide, his wife Sonia's health deteriorated. Dr. Moiz called to the bungalow. On coming out of the bunga-

low, Dr. Moiz said that there are a lot of police inside. Can't say what happened. Such a big incident has happened. It is natural for his wife's health to deteriorate. Gave him medi-Nadir was interested in sports.

He was fond of playing golf. For the last 6 months, he had also distanced himself from his favorite game, golf. At the time of the incident, both his sons were having breakfast in the second room of Shamla Palace. After hearing the sound of the bullet, he reached his father's house. Where he saw his father's dead body. Nadir Rashid's funeral procession will be taken out

When should you worry about a headache?

While headache seems to be a common problem, it can also result in disability and even death, if not promptly recognised and treated on time, said Sudhir Kumar, a Hyderabad-based neurologist. The doctor, from Apollo

Hospital in Hyderabad, in a post on X.com, said that headaches are usually not serious, and commonly are migraine and tension-type headaches.

These present no serious complications and are easily often effectively treatable.

"However, not all causes of headache are benign. Some of the conditions that cause headaches are serious and may result in disability and even death if not promptly recognised and treated on time," said Sudhir.

The doctor noted that the most severe headache is due to "subarachnoid haemorrhage", which causes



life-threatening bleeding in

This severe headache recently motivational speaker Jaggi Vasudev, who suffered from it for several weeks. He, later, emergency underwent surgery to relieve the

bleeding in the skull. "Headache that often wakes up a person from sleep, or is worse in

mornings on waking up, or that results in vomiting, double vision, etc, could be suggestive of brain tumour," said Sudhir. He added that headaches coming along with weakness of the arm or leg could indicate a risk of

Further, the expert said that headache linked with fever, and reduced alertness "could be meningitis (brain

fever)", and that which comes along with fever and seizures (fits) is "suggestive of encephalitis (brain fever)"

"New-onset headache in a person aged above 50; headache lasting for more than 72 hours; a headache that is not responding to pain-relief medications," could also be "red flags" requiring attention, Sudhir

Recent changes headache frequency, severity, or character may also be a risk factor that warrants further investigation.

"If you notice any of the above "red flags" associated with headaches, it is better to consult a neurologist and undergo a brain scan (CT or and/or other investigations to determine the underlying cause, so that the appropriate treatment can be started," Sudhir said.

"Early recognition and prompt initiation of appropriate treatment can be conditions," he added.

| Must address dipping fertility rates in India: Experts

The decline in fertility rates in India is a matter of concern and must be addressed properly by taking into account factors like urbanisation, education, and women's empowerment, said health experts on Wednesday. According to a recent

study published in The Lancet, India's total fertility rate saw a significant decline from 6.18 in 1950 to 1.91 in 2021.

The study predicted that it may further drop to 1.3 by 2050 and 1.04 by 2100. "Numerous factors such

as education, religious beliefs, and the contraceptive prevalence rate influence the total fertility rates of a country. In addition, delay in marriage and childbirth and change in social norms favouring smaller family size, financial independence, more and more women pursuing careers over motherhood, also result in a reduced fertility rate," Dr. Rachita



Munjal, Senior Consultant, Birla Fertility & Gurugram, told IANS.

Other reasons that lead to infertility include rising levels of obesity, stress, smoking, pollution, and unhealthy lifestyles, said the doctor.

Infertility can affect the total fertility rate (TFR) by delaying childbearing age and reducing probability.

TFR can be defined as the average number of children born to a woman in her lifetime.

psychological impact of infertility and related complications prompts couples to reconsider family plans, potentially leading to fewer children. The societal stigma surrounding infertility and fertility treatment further restricts couples from seeking medical help, contributing to a lower TFR by limiting access to treatment," Dr. Rachita said.

Dr Nisha Bhatnagar, Medical Director at Infinite Fertility, told IANS that the declining fertility levels can have manifold ramifications for public health policy and

However, reproductive

technology developments like egg freezing can provide personalised answers to infertility problems, the doctor said.

"Egg freezing has become a recognised technique for maintaining fertility, especially for those who choose to delay having children for personal or professional reasons," Dr Nisha said. However, these are not a cure-all for the general trends in population, the expert said, emphasising the need for more comprehensive public health policies that take into account "socioeconomic factors such as urbanisation, education, and women's empowerment."

"Increased awareness to empower informed family planning, supportive and paternity maternity policies like paid leave and childcare support, and financial incentives such as childcare benefits are also a few measures that can help improve fertility rates in the country," added Dr. Rachita.

Yet, beneath this calmness lies a domain "fraught with competition where contest for aerial superiority" has shaped the destiny of many nations and decided the outcome of many wars, the chief of the Indian Air Force (IAF) said.

"As we navigate these uncharted skies, air power being a key component of national power, would undoubtedly play a pivotal role and also serve as a symbol of national strength, a tool for peace and cooperation,"

The IAF chief said, "We all need



to acknowledge that wars of the future will be fought different-Future conflicts will be characterised by a blend of simultaneous application of kinetic and non-kinetic forces, high-levels of battle space transparency, multi-domain operations, a high-degree of precision, enhanced lethality, a compressed sensor-to-shooter cycle. and of course, all under intense media scrutiny, he said.

The air chief marshal also said. "Balakot-like operations have shown that given the political will, aerospace power can be effectively carried out beyond enemy lines, in a no-war, nopeace scenario, under a nuclear

overhang without escalating into a full-blown conflict."

The IAF struck a Jaish-e-Mohammad terrorist training camp in Pakistan's Balakot area on February 26, 2019, in response to the February 14 Pulwama terror attack in which 40 CRPF personnel were killed. The Pakistan Air Force had retaliated the payt day have retaliated the next day by unsuccessfully targeting various military installations in Jammu and Kashmir.

Chaudhari said space has also emerged as a "critical domain for conduct of military operations", wherein seamless communication, navigation and surveillance capabilities would enhance survivability of modern military forces.

direction, officials said. On March 28, the conference will be chaired by Army Chief General Manoj Pande with

commanders participating in a virtual mode from their respective Command Headquarters, it

said. The deliberation will be on a critical agenda impacting the field army and veterans' welfare.

The conference will also feature talks by distinguished subject matter experts on the evolving geopolitical landscape and ramifications for national security, the

officials said.



Political zealotry

Leaders indulge in blabbering and frenzied talk as election fever grips the nation

n avoidable political controversy has erupted after certain derogatory remarks against Kangana Ranaut, the BJP nominee from Mandi, Himachal Pradesh, were attrib-Luted to two Congress leaders. Supriya Shrinate, one of the two offending Congress leaders, has pulled down the X post and apologised, pleading that somebody with access to her Meta account had written the "extremely inappropriate post". Kangana, meanwhile, is breathing fire: "... Mandi is being used in sexual context everywhere, just because it has a young woman candidate...". In response to the controversy, it is encouraging to see condemnation from across the political spectrum, with many leaders calling for restraint and civility. This collective outcry underscores the broader recognition of the need to uphold standards of respectful dialogue in politics. In the age of digital communication, words carry immense weight and have the potential to shape public perceptions; naturally, political leaders need to exercise caution and mindfulness. Therefore,



the leaders involved in making disparaging remarks against others must be held accountable. As public personalities, they bear the responsibility to uphold standards of decorum and refrain from engaging in language that is inflammatory or derogatory. Political differences should be debated based on ideas and policies, rather than resorting to personal attacks.

Though not the first such occurrence, the latest incident underscores the delicate balance between freedom of expression and the responsibility to maintain respectful dialogue, especially during poll campaigns. A quick recap of similar incidents will take us back to 2005 when the then Railways Minister Lalu Yadav

famously likened the good condition of roads in Bihar to Hema Malini's cheeks (though he later claimed the simile was wrongly attributed to him!). During campaigning for the 2009 Rampur Lok Sabha elections, BJP candidate Jaya Pradha alleged that her former colleague and SP leader Azam Khan was circulating her morphed photos and proclaiming that she "wears khaki underwear." His rebuttal: "Tell me, if I entertain this 'naachne gaane wali⁷, how will I concentrate on politics?" In 2012, Congress leader Sanjay Nirupam had this to say to Smriti Z Irani during a TV debate: "Aap to TV pe thumke lagati thi, aaj chunavi vishleshak ban gayi!!!" Another senior Congress leader Digvijaya Singh was praising his party colleague Meenakshi Natarajan in Mandsaur in July 2013: "Main puraana jauhari hu, ye 100 tunch maal hai." During the 2018 Rajasthan elections, JD(U) leader Sharad Yadav fat-shamed the BJP leader: "Let Vasundhara rest, she is too tired. She has become fat." Former Madhya Pradesh CM Kamal Nath said about then BJP Minister Imarti Devi during Dabra bypoll campaign in October 2020: "Yeh kya item hai!" So, the lesson is that while individuals have the right to express their opinion, such expression must remain within the boundaries of decency. Also, fostering a culture of empathy and understanding can contribute to a more conducive environment for political discourse.

The concept of "Access, Equity, Quality, and Affordability & Accountability" under this was also applied as a pillar for NEP 2020 for implementation in higher educational institutions (HEIs).

The motto is to enhance the quality of education in HEIs and to compete Indian HEIs with the best institutions in the world. Based on this notion another transformative reform has been done by the Ministry of Education, Government of India through the formation of Dr. Radhakrishnan's committee for revisiting the NAAC accredita-

Dr. K. Radhakrishnan who is the Former Chairman of ISRO and Chairperson of the Standing Committee of the IIT Council proposed a new binary accreditation system for assessing HEIs where the assessment will be more technology-driven. It is a trust-based, transparent, and integrated 'Unified Elicitation Tool' where higher academic institutions will provide their informa-tion on the "One Nation One Data" platform. It will reduce the annual visits of the teams in HEIs and validation of the data will be transparent over the digital portal.

A system of high penalties is also proposed for those providing wrong information. Besides, two major features of this accreditation report were Binary Accreditation and Maturity-Based Graded Accreditation. While the Binary Accreditation will segregate the HEIs based on "Accredited" "Awaiting Accreditation" and "Not accredted", the Maturity-Based Graded Accreditation will customise it in Process-Limited-Outcome five different levels i.e. Level 1 to Level 5 where the HEIs have to cross each level to go up to Level these actions will convert HEIs



4 "Institutions of National Excellence" and Level 5 "Institutions of Global Excellence for Disciplinary Research and Education". It will also create a roadmap for aligning ranking and accreditation bodies like NAAC, NBA, and NIRF by providing them with a centralised database.

The new accreditation system has suggested various categories of HEIs including Multidisciplinary Education and Research-Intensive Institutions, Teaching-Intensive Institutions, Specialised Institutions, Vocational and Skill-Intensive Institutions, Community Engagement & Service related Institutions, Institutions of Rural & Remote location under its "one-size-fits-all model" where the levelling will be done on the orientation of the particular HEI. Further, the aim is to convert the present Score-based, Multiple Grade Accreditation with Binary Accreditation, Portal Self-Disclosure with Public Self-Disclosure, Single Accreditation institutions with Approved Accreditation institutions, One-Size-Fits-All Model with University-Typebased process, and input approach with Majorly Outcome-Based approach. All

Since the Dr. Radhakrishnan Committee's recommendations were put together to improve the calibre and reputation of Indian higher education institutions, they represent a paradigm shift in the accreditation process. The Committee while preparing the report has gone through numerous procedures from putting the suggested draft on the 'MyGov' portal and 'MoE' website for soliciting public opinion/stakeholder engagement. The workshop featured 34 panellists, more than 250 diverse HEIs and 950 participants from HEIs around the nation.

This report discusses estab-

lishing criteria and policies for these accrediting organisations, choosing specialists, creating self-assessment report formats, and growing the Accreditation Network to reach the HEIs located in rural areas, remote areas, tribal areas, and other smaller territories. To achieve its goal the report has also done a comparative analysis of the existing accreditation system and the visions of NEP 2020. It has also studied the best global ractices of education understand their model of education and to establish the Indian education system on the same platform.

Based on the suggestions received while formulating the draft, the committee has also classified the accreditation system into three different parameters. They are Pre-Accreditation, Accreditation Process, and Results and Post-Accreditation Incentives. The Pre-Accreditation includes processes like training the institutions, data collection, uploading the self-disclosure guidelines, etc, the Accreditation Process and Results as the name suggests focuses on validation and credit given to the HEI by the peer team. The Post-Accreditation Incentives are important for providing priority status to the institutional body. Care has been taken for step-by-step reforms to ensure the creditability of the system.

Thus, the vision is to implement the new accreditation policy proposed by Dr Radhakrishnan's committee by December 2024. This new policy is aimed at creating futuristic universities for future generations. It will bring a transformative change in the HEI-Approval, Accreditation and Ranking System to make Bharat v isnwaguru.

ince ancient times, the medical profession has been considered a noble profession, for its members render a valuable service to mankind by preventing, alleviating, controlling or eliminating disease, pain and suffering. Through the knowledge of the physical body and the laws of health and hygiene, doctors provide patients with measures of great relief and recovery when they are passing through a great physical or mental crisis, are facing the worst of physical troubles or mental tensions or are fighting for life. So, the members of the profession truly needed to be complimented by the society

However, it has been observed lately that many members of the medical profession in this era of increasing urbanisation and the spread of industrial civilisation and technological culture also face the great pressures of materialism and are hard-pressed for time. Being always in a hurry and with the object of providing medicine to the largest possible number of patients within the set time limits, they are now more and more preoccupied with only the physical well-being of their patients, almost overlooking the changes required in the outlook or personality traits of the patients.

The reason for this is that their main attention is on the symptoms and

on prescribing suitable medicines.

But, if we think deeper, we find that, without controlling, reducing or eliminating the psychic or the behavioural causes, there cannot be any lasting cure for many diseases. Another serious thing that occurs as a result of moral or social ill-health of a person but which is not given serious attention is that not only does the person himself suffer from its evil effects on his body but, as a result of these psychic factors, he causes ill-health to many others also who live with him, work with him or deal with him. For example, a person of an irritable nature, or one who easily loses his temper or is prone to anxiety, not only suffers from avoidable worry and tension but often causes mental tension and anxiety to others also. Worse still is the social strife, family turmoil or political upheaval the moral and social ill-health of a person creates. Hitler, for example, was socially and morally ill and men-

Most of our present-day problems are due to the moral and social illhealth of our citizens, most of them generating a chain reaction and contributing peacelessness to the total atmosphere. So, while doctors talk of holistic health, hypertension, psychosomatic diseases, drug addiction or AIDS, we wish that due attention is also paid to the turmoil caused by one's moral sickness or social illness in the socio-political or socioeconomic atmosphere of society.

Mechanisation needed to tackle farm issues



The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Food Processing underscores the importance of mechanisation



he Parliamentary Standing Committee on Ágriculture, Animal Husbandry, and Food Processing insists on the urgent need to increase the mechanisation of farms for small and marginal farmers in India. Their recent report highlights that wholesome mechanisation is not only essential but crucial to overcoming the multifaceted chal-lenges faced by the farming sector, which plays a pivotal role in the country's economy.

Despite India's accounts for only 2.4 per

cent of the world's geographical area and 4 per cent of its water resources, its farming sector supports 17 per cent of the global population and 15 per cent of the livestock, contributing 20 per cent to the nation's GDP and creating employability to 65 per cent population. Therefore, there is a dire need to enhance productivity and profitability through increased mechanisation among small and marginal farmers and in low mechanisation areas to revitalise Indian agriculture and boosting farmers' incomes requires moving beyond traditional practices to advanced mechanisation.

Status of Mechanisation: Our country's agriculture mechanisation level is below 40 per cent lower than developing nations such as China 60 per cent and Brazil 75 per cent. It is worth noting that agrarian states like Punjab and Haryana had led the green revolution having mechanisation levels around

40 per cent, while in other areas such as

the north-eastern states of India, it is neg-

The Committee has pointed out that 86 per cent of the total land holdings are in small and marginal size groups, which require special efforts for their mechanization. They have emphasized that small farmers face significant difficulties in purchasing machinery unless machines appropriate for small holdings are made available or farmland consolidation takes place. It is expected to take another 25 years to reach the level of 75

per cent mechanization. A Catalyst for Growth: The imperative

role of farm mechanisation is instrumental in reducing cultivation costs and enhancing productivity through efficient resource utilisation.

The diversity in farming, whether large-scale or small-scale and rural labour scarcity necessitates a broad spectrum of agricultural equipment. From basic tractors to sophisticated combine harvesters, the sector requires a nuanced understanding of the equipment's specific applications and requirements, spanning feeding equipment, poultry tools, corral systems for cattle and more attributed to the Indian agricultural machinery market is estimated to be worth a whopping US\$16.73 billion in 2024 and is projected to reach an impressive ÚS\$25.15 billion by 2029.

Fourth, Funding for R&D: The budget allocation for the Research and Development (R&D) of the Farm Mechanisation Scheme has been declining steadily over the past four years, with a significant decrease of 30 per cent from 2019-20 to 2023-24.

Fifth, Tax and Duty Incentives: To promote low horsepower tractors, which are mostly used by small and marginal farmers and orchard growers, the tractor and its components attract 12 per cent GST. This means a small tractor costing about Rs 5-7 lakh leads the farmer to pay Rs 60-84 thousand Directorate of Agricultural or 5 per cent to make it more

affordable for small farmers. Tax and duty incentives are also essential to support manufacturing units in low-mechanisation areas for sustainable growth.

In conclusion we can only agree with the Standing Committee.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee stresses the urgent need for enhanced farm mechanisation to support India's small and marginal farmers. Despite its significant agricultural contribution, India's mechanisation levels lag behind global counterparts, hindering productivity and profitability.


With 86 per cent of land holdings in small and marginal categories, targeted efforts are crucial. Mechanisation not only reduces costs but also enhances productivity and conserves resources. To drive mechanisation, the committee recommends establishing agricultural engineering directorates, expanding access to farm machinery through banks, revitalising measures are essential for revitalising Indian agriculture, increasing farmers' incomes, and ensuring sustainable sectoral growth. By embracing comprehensive mechanisation, India can overcome multifaceted agricultural challenges and secure its position as a global agricultural leader while empowering its farming community.



From addiction to artistry: Painting a new future

Decorative wall painting is transforming the lives of substance users in Manipur and beyond, giving them a purposeful life to the fullest extent

anglemba Ningombam was 29 when he started experimenting with drugs like many of his friends in his village in Imphal, Manipur. When it started to impact their lives, some of them were able to give it up. Ningombam wasn't one of them. Over the next 15 years, this addiction would spin his life into a vicious cycle of highs and lows. Personal crisis and the death of his parents exacerbated his loneliness, leading him to consider ending his life. Fortunately, a local NGO was able to reach out in time and admit him to a drug addiction and rehabilitation centre. This was to change his life forever.

dence that this intervention has been able to restore among the trainees. It has also been accepted by their families. For Bhimo, 37, learning a new skill and get-ting a job as a trainer at Makers Foundation helper him not only to stay off his addiction to alcohol but also helped regain the trust, respect and support of his family. When positive impacts like this and the encouraging feedback from the community led to the scale-up of the intervention to Assam last year, Bhimo

was also in keeping with Therapeutic their Community Model based on the premise that a rehabilitated alcohol/drug user was better equipped to inspire other users to achieve their potential.

Though it has been challenging, with 44 per cent of the 6.7 million substance users being adolescents, the initiative has so far trained 200 persons admitted to rehabilitation centres in Assam's Hopefully, this initiative will now be able to empower the many invisible substancedependent women and girls in need of a helping hand. Hunter's tax case heads to courtroom as his defence seeks to have it tossed out

President Joe Biden's son has pleaded not guilty to the nine felony and misdemeanour tax offenses. He's asking the judge to toss out the case, arguing that the prosecution was politically motivated, was tainted by leaks from İRS agents who claimed publicly the case was mishandled and includes some allegations from before he moved to California.

He has also been charged in Delaware with lying on a federal form to buy a gun in 2018 by saying he wasn't using or addicted to illegal drugs, even though he has acknowledged being addicted to crack cocaine at the time. He has pleaded not guilty in that case, which also accuses him of possessing the gun ille-

Both cases are overseen by special counsel David Weiss and now have tentative trials scheduled for June, though defense attorneys are also trying to get the Delaware gun charges tossed out. The two sets of charges come from a

years-long federal investigation that had been expected to wrap up over the summer with a plea deal in which Hunter Biden would have gotten two years of probation after pleading guilty to misdemeanour tax charges. He also would have avoided prosecution on the gun charge if he stayed out of trouble.

Defence attorneys argue that immunity provisions in the deal were signed by a prosecutor and are still in effect, though prosecutors disagree.

But the deal that could have spared Hunter Biden the spectacle of a criminal trial during the 2024 presidential campaign unraveled after a federal judge began to question it. Now, the tax and gun cases are moving ahead as part of an unprecedented confluence of political and legal drama: As the November election draws closer, the Justice Department is actively prosecuting both the Democratic president's son and the presumptive Rupublican nominee, Donald

Hunter Biden's original proposed plea deal with prosecutors had been pilloried as a "sweetheart deal" by Republicans, including Trump. The former president is facing his own criminal problems -91 charges across four cases, including that he plotted to overturn the results of

the 2020 election, which he lost to Joe

Hunter Biden's criminal proceedings are also happening in parallel to so-far unsuccessful efforts by congressional Republicans to link his business dealings to his father. Republicans are pursuing an impeachment inquiry into President Biden, claiming he was engaged in an influence-peddling scheme with his son. No evidence has emerged to prove that Joe Biden, as president or previously as vice president, abused his role or accepted bribes, though questions have arisen about the ethics surrounding the Biden family's international business dealings. In launching their Biden impeachment inquiry last year, the House Republicans relied in large part on unverified claims from an FBI informant released by Senate Republicans suggesting that payments totalling USD 10 million from Ukrainian energy company Burisma to the Bidens were discussed.

The now-former FBI informant, Alexander Smirnov, was arrested last month in a case also overseen by Weiss He has pleaded not guilty to charges that he fabricated the bribery allegations. If convicted of the tax charges, Hunter Biden, 53, could receive a maximum of

 \mathbf{I}^{t} was the middle of the night when a dispatcher's warning crackled over the radio: A massive cargo ship had lost its steering capabilities and was heading toward the Francis Scott Key

Within about 90 seconds, police officers who happened to be nearby responded that they managed to stop vehicle traffic over the Baltimore bridge in both directions.

One parked sideways across the lanes and planned to drive onto the bridge to alert a construction crew once another officer arrived. But he wouldn't get the chance. Powerless and laden with huge containers, the vessel smashed into a support pillar. "The whole bridge just fell down," a frantic officer said. "Start, start whoever, everybody ... the whole bridge just collapsed."

When the container ship Dali slammed into the pillar around 1:30 am Tuesday, it caused a long span of the bridge, a major link in the region's transport networks, to crumple into the Patapsco River. The loss of the bridge is expected to snarl commuter traffic and disrupt a vital shipping

port.
At least eight people went into the water. Two were rescued but the other six, part of a construction crew that had been filling potholes on the bridge, were missing and presumed dead. A search for their bodies was underway Wednesday morning, according to Maryland State Police spokesperson Elena Russo.

Among the missing were people from Guatemala, Honduras and Mexico, according to diplomats from those countries. The Honduran man was identified as Maynor Yassir Suazo Sandova. Federal and state officials have said the crash appeared to be an accident. Investigators on Wednesday plan to collect evidence on the ship, including electronics and paperwork, said National Transportation Safety Board Chair Jennifer Homendy. The US Coast Guard already boarded the vessel and down-loaded the voyage data recorder

demanding things that we do." There are "few things that are scarier than a loss of power in restricted waters," he said. And when a ship loses propulsion and steering, "then it's really at the mercy of the wind and the cur-

Video showed the ship moving at what Maryland Gov. Wes Moore said was about 9 mph (15 kph) toward the 1.6-mile (2.6-kilometer) bridge. Traffic was still moving across the span, and some vehicles appeared to escape with only seconds to spare. The crash caused the span to break and fall into the water within seconds, and jagged remnants were left jutting up from the water. Police said there is no evidence anyone went into the water other than the workers, though they had not discounted the possibility. A senior executive at the company that employed the crew, Brawner Builders, said they were working in the middle of the bridge when it fell. "This was so completely unforeseen," said Jeffrey Pritzker, the company's executive vice president. "We don't know what else to say. We take such great pride in safety, and we have cones and signs and lights and barriers and flaggers." Jesus Campos, who has worked on the bridge for Brawner Builders and knows members of the crew, said he was told they were on a break and some were sitting in their trucks.

Indian crew sustained | Presidents of France and Brazil announce \$1.1 billion investment plan for Amazon

▲ French presidents have announced a plan to invest 1 billion euros (USD 1.1 billion) in the Amazon, including parts of the rainforest in neighbouring French Guiana.

The two countries' governments said in a joint state-ment the money will be spread over the next four years to protect the rainforest. It will be a collaboration of state-run Brazilian banks and France's investment agency. Private resources will also be welcomed, Brazil and France said.

French President Emmanuel Macron and his Brazilian counterpart Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva are meeting this week to revive the relationship between the countries after years of frictions with former President Jair

Macron started his three-day visit to Brazil in the Amazon city of Belem, where he met his long-time ally Lula. The French president then took a boat to the Combu island to meet with Indigenous leaders.

Both Macron and Lula saw a protest by Greenpeace Brazil with banners that read "No oil in the Amazon." Brazil's government has contemplated allowing the tapping of oil in a region close to the Para state, where Belem lies. Lula said during a speech that Macron's visit is part of a global effort to beef up rainforest protections.

Lawmakers approve same-sex marriage bill in Thailand

Lawmakers in Thailand's lower house of Parliament overwhelmingly approved a marriage equality bill on Wednesday that would make the country the first in Southeast Asia to legalise equal rights for marriage partners of any gender. The bill passed its final reading with the approval of 400 of the 415 members of the House of Representatives in attendance, with 10 voting against it, two abstaining and three not voting. Thailand has a reputation for acceptance and inclusivity but has struggled for decades to pass a marriage equality law. Thai society largely holds conservative values, and members of the LGBTQ+ community say they face discrimination in everyday life. The government and state agencies are also historically conservative, and advocates for gender equality have had a hard



time pushing lawmakers and civil servants to accept change. The bill now goes to the Senate, which rarely rejects any legislation that passes the lower house, and then to the king for royal endorsement.

This would make Thailand the first country or region in Southeast Asia to pass such a law and the third in Asia, after Taiwan and Nepal.The bill amends the Civil and Commercial Code to change the words "men and women" and

uals" and "marriage partners." It would open up access to full legal, financial and medical rights for LGBTQ+ couples. Danuphorn Punnakanta, a

pokesperson of the governing Pheu Thai party and president of a committee overseeing the marriage equality bill, said in Parliament that the amendment is for "everyone in Thailand" regardless of their gender, and would not deprive heterosexual couples of any rights.

China asks Pak to 'Restricting technology access won't stop China's advance' probe attack on **Chinese citizens**

hina on Wednesday asked ←Pakistan to "thoroughly investigate" and "hunt down" the perpetrators behind Tuesday's suicide attack on Chinese citizens amid speculation that Beijing may push Islamabad to accept its security agencies to guard the CPEC projects following a spike in attacks on them in the last few days.

At least five Chinese nationals were among the six persons killed on Tuesday when an explosives-packed vehicle rammed into their bus in Pakistan's troubled province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, in the second suicide attack on the personnel working on the Chinabacked hydropower project since 2021

"China asks Pakistan to thoroughly investigate the incident as soon as possible, hunt down the perpetrators and bring them to justice," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian told a media briefing here when asked about Beijing's response to the suicide attack, the second on Chinese nationals in the area since 2021.

Notwithstanding the recurring terror attacks, China continues to back Pakistan, its iron-clad ally to protect thousands of its nationals working on the USD 60 billion China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)

Lin said, "China firmly supports Pakistan in fighting terrorism. China and Pakistan have the resolve and capability to make the terrorists pay the price."

"Our two countries are allweather strategic cooperative partners. Our iron-clad friendship is deeply rooted in the two peoples. No attempt to sabotage China-Pakistan cooperation will ever succeed", he said.

He declined to comment on reports that the new Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will visit Beijing in the coming

China sends 1,500 tonnes of drinking water to Maldives

Male (PTI): The Maldives government Tuesday announced that 1,500 tonnes of drinking water donated by China from the glaciers in Tibet has reached the archipelago nation amidst an acute water shortage

The decision to provide Maldives with drinking water was reached during the official visit of China's Tibet Region's Autonomous Chairman, Yan Jinhai to the Maldives, where he met President Dr Mohamed Muizzu last November, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said. The 1,500 tonnes of drinking water shipment has been brought into the country, Edition.my, a news portal said, quoting an announcement by the Ministry At the time (in November), it was deliberated to donate water that is produced out of frozen water procured from glacial

regions which are highly clean, clear and rich in minerals. Moreover, Tibet (Xizang in Chinese) Autonomous Region is known to produce high-cost premium brands of water, the ministry said.

China asks Nepal to speed up BRI implementation plan

hina has urged the new Cdispensation in Nepal to finalise the implementation plan for its ambitious BRI projects that have struggled to make any headway due to continuous political changes in the Himalayan nation.

The strategic partnership between the two countries was discussed during the meeting of Nepal's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Narayan Kaji Shrestha, who is on his first visit to China after taking over office, with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi on Tuesday. China looks to speed up its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) projects in the Himalayan nation what with Nepal witnessing the new political alignment after Prime Minister Pushpa Kumar Dahal 'Prachanda' formed a government with the Communist Party of Nepal (Unified Marxist-Leninist), headed by the pro-China leader K P Sharma Oli. Wang said as a friendly neigh-

bour and strategic partner, China has always placed Nepal in an important direction of its neighbourhood diplomacy. "China is ready to work with

Nepal to promote the highquality Belt and Road cooperation, and advance the China-Nepal strategic partnership of cooperation featuring everlasting friendship for development and prosperity to a new and higher level," Wang told Shrestha, an official press release said here.

He said China firmly supports Nepal in safeguarding its national sovereignty, independence, and national dignity and will continue to assist the best of its ability for Nepal's economic and social development. In Nepal, the Kathmandu Post reported that during the meeting the two countries reiterated their commitment to "very soon" sign the implementation plan of BRI, which, it said, "will pave the way for working out financing and investment modality of the projects to be executed in Nepal under the initiative."

Things remain stuck with China due to our delay in signing the BRI implementation plan. Once Deputy Prime Minister Shrestha returns home, we will further discuss the signing of the plan, the Post quoted a Nepali official.

Siddiqui was sacked on October 11, 2018, by the SJC based on a speech he had delivered weeks ago at the Rawalpindi Bar Association in which he accused the Inter-Services Intelligence

Meanwhile, legal community and politicians demanded an independent probe into the allegations following te stunning letter by IHC judges. The IHC Bar Association (IHCBA) "strongly condemned the interference of one institution into the matters of another institution" and demanded the chief justice for a "transparent inquiry" into the matter and that action be taken against those involved.

Imran Khan demands judicial probe in May 9 violence, Feb 8 elections

Tailed former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan once again on Wednesday demanded a judicial probe into the May 9 violence and the February 8 elections, urg-Isa to hear the petitions filed by his party on the two issues. Khan, 71, while speak ing to journalists after attending a court hearing in the 190 million pound corruption case, said the establishment was using the May 9 violence following his arrest in a corruption case as a pretext to dismantle his Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party.

Khan claimed that the plot to dismantle his party was hatched in London by the nowruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party and urged Chief Justice Isa to set up a judicial commission to probe the matter, Dawn News reported. Khan's supporters resorted to violence, burning civil and military installations following his arrest by the National Corruption Bureau (NCB) outside the Islamabad High Court premised in a corruption case. The May 9 violence, also dubbed as the "Black Day" violence was used as a pretext to arrest thousands of Khan's supporters and his party leaders across the country. "The culprits could have been identified through CCTV footage, but these have been stolen. Those behind the footage theft were

responsible for the May 9 episode," the PTI

Khan alleged that the closure of cases related to the Sharif family and President Asif Ali Zardari was a "part of the London plan". He said the PTI would not consider the National Assembly was "a product of rigged exercise" in the first place.

In reply to a question about the hearing in US Congress on the cipher controversy last week, the PTI chief said it would have been a disaster for the Biden administration had Donald Lu, the US diplomat, stated that Washington supported the ouster of his government. "Lu did not disclose facts before the Congress hearing since it would have been damaging for the Biden administration," the cricketer-turned-politician claimed.

Khan said Asad Majeed, Pakistan's former amba-ssador in Washington, had informed the National Security Committee about the "threatening tone" of Lu.

The jailed former prime minister said he was not responsible for the security of the cipher (secret diplomatic communication) as a protocol was in place for the safe keeping of secret documents.

He rejected the Election Commission of Pakistan's investigation into allegations of rigging and said the ECP could not carry out an "impartial probe" since it had con-

Separately, Khan's wife Bushra Bibi told the media that Khan was in "good physical and mental health" in jail.

She, however, also said the Chief of Army Staff General Syed Asim Munir, Inter-Anjum, and the chief of the Counter Terrorism Department would be responsible if "anything happened" to her husband.

The nation will not tolerate such an incident," she said. Meanwwhile, A high court in Pakistan on Wednesday accepted a petition by jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf to hold a rally in Islamabad and ordered authorities to let the party organise its activity under the law.

The Islamabad High Court (IHC) heard the case by the PTI to hold a rally which it initially wanted to hold on March 23 or 30 but it rescheduled it for April 6. The party had approached the court after the capital district administration refused to allow the rally due to security reasons.

IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq presided over the hearing of the plea and after hearing arguments provided the relief to the PTI. "One's right of assembly cannot be taken away," said the judge as he directed the federal capital's administration to specify their conditions for the rally.

Death toll in Moscow concert hall attack rises to 140

The death toll from last week's Moscow concert hall attack rose to 140 on Wednesday after another victim died in a hospi tal, Russian officials said. That person was one of five still hospitalized in "extremely grave condition," and the doctors "did everything they could" to save them, Russia's Health Minister Mikhail Murashko said.

A total of 80 people injured in the attack remain hospitalized, the official added, and 205 others have sought outpatient medical assistance. The Friday night massacre in Crocus City Hall, a sprawling shopping and entertainment venue on the northwestern outskirts of Moscow, was the deadliest terrorist attack on the Russian soil in nearly 20 years. At least four gunmen toting automatic rifles shot at thousands of concertgoers and set the venue on fire. An affiliate of the Islamic State group claimed responsibil-

intelligence said it had information confirming the group was responsible. French President Emmanuel Macron said France also has intelligence pointing to "an IS entity" as responsible for the attack. Russia's Federal Security Service, or the FSB, said it had arrested 11 people the day after the attack, including four suspected gunmen. The four men, identified as Tajik nationals, appeared in a Moscow court on Sunday on terrorism charges and showed signs of severe beatings. One appeared to be barely conscious during the hearing. Russian officials, however, have insisted Ukraine and the West had a role, claims Kyiv vehemently denies. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy accused his Russian counterpart, Vladimir Putin, of trying to drum up fervor as his forces fight in Ukraine. FSB chief Alexander Bortnikov also alleged that Western spy agencies could have

Zelenskyy replaces top security official

Kyiv (Ukraine) (AP): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has replaced one of the country's top security officials with the head of Ukraine's foreign spy agency in a new reshuffle as the war with Russia drags into a third year.

Zelenskyy dismissed Oleksii Danilov, who served as secretary of the National Security and Defense Council, thanking him for his service in a video address late Tuesday. He gave no reason for the shake-up and said, without providing details, that Danilov will be "reassigned to another area.'

Zelenskyy replaced Danilov with Oleksandr Lytvynenko, who served as the head of Ukraine's Foreign Intelligence Service.

The National Security Council is a policy coordination body that includes top officials and is chaired by Zelenskyy. Danilov had held his position since October 2019, a few

Gourmangi Singh feels something is "amiss" in the Indian dressing room, while former forward Dipendu Biswas slammed Stimac's skewed team selection for the disastrous show and demanded his immediate

similar Echoing veteran Subrata Bhattacharya said that foreign coaches never brought laurels to the Indian team and called for an Indian coach to produce players of the calibre of "fivesix" Sunil Chhetris.

"Remember that these are the same players who got praise for their historic draw against Qatar (in World Cup qualifiers 2022)," Gourmangi

Having overcome the early jitters and nervousness in his first game, Pant would be eager to regain his mojo quickly as his match-up against the likes of Trent Boult, Ravichandran Ashwin and Yuzvendra Chahal would be the highlight of the

Ponting chose David Warner and Mitchell Marsh to open the innings in the hope that the duo would score enough runs to take the pressure off Pant lower down the order. But the two failed to capitalise on good starts and the pressure soon came on Pant.

Wicketkeeper-batter Abhishek Porel's unbeaten 32-run cameo was the only bright spot in DC's batting, which lifted them to a respectable 174/9 from a precarious 138/7 at one stage. Porel was used as an impact player as Delhi were a bowler short. The problem was worsened further after Ishant Sharma twisted his ankle. The lanky pacer could miss a few matches as well.

Any team is bound to miss a bowler like Shami: Mohit

ujarat Titans pace bowler Mohit Sharma conceded it was hard to replace a bowler of the calibre of Mohammed Shami as his team succumbed to a massive 63-run defeat at the hands of reigning IPL champions Chennai Super Kings here.

India's premier pacer Shami is sitting out of the IPL as he is recuperating from an ankle make his comeback with the home Test series against Bangladesh later this year after missing the five-Test series against England. Shami will also miss the T20 World Cup to be jointly hosted by the West Indies and the USA in June.

"Any team is bound to miss a bowler like Shami, and you can't replace him with anyone. But injuries are uncontrollable, and you must see how to move ahead with it," said Sharma, who played for CSK between 2013 and 2015 and has been with the Titans since 2022, during the post-match press

conference. "As for GT, it's the first year for Spencer (Johnson) and Azmatullah (Omarzai). They haven't played much cricket yet. Therefore, we must be patient with them and not become too result-oriented.

"We must not bother about the runs leaked or the result of the contest, but how successful we are with our plans and how we are working on it backstage. These things would come in handy in the second half (of the event)," opined Sharma. CSK posted a huge 206 for six, with openers Ruturaj Gaikwad (36) and Rachin Ravindra (46) being the stars alongside Shivam Dube (51). GT bowlers took a lot of beating with

Umesh Yadav going for 27 in two overs, while the crafty Afghanistan ace spinner Rashid Khan went for 49 in four overs although he took a couple of wickets.
Sharma added that CSK

milking runs in powerplay also contributed to the big loss. "Not much of a difference (in

CSK's strategy). It used to be the same when I used to play for CSK, and we usually tried to get the maximum out of the powerplay overs," he said. CSK were 69 for 1 after powerplay overs. "We knew it was going to be a similar scenario, especially with Rachin (Ravindra's) batting of late. However, we failed to execute our plans properly and also failed to judge the width and

length during our bowling. "We failed in executing our plans properly. We began to

bowl the slower ones too early and too wide off the off stump, leading to them scoring freely. It happens that the plans always don't get executed properly every time.

"But it's a big tournament, and we have ample time to go back to the drawing board, rectify our mistakes and start afresh. "We had a target of 200 as the CSK played just the way we had thought. They were on course for 225-230 before settling for 206, but since we failed to implement our plans, we believed we gave away 15-20 runs extra."

Sharma also defended the visitors' decision to bowl first, stating that dew is always a factor in night games, though interestingly, there was hardly any dew on Tuesday night. "Don't think the pitch has a

role to play. Generally, if we win the toss and decide to bowl, it's because we know that the dew might play a factor later during the game.

"But, there was no dew (Tuesday). As usual, we decided to bowl and restrict them to a par total, while dew would have been an added positive for us.

"Had the wicket been drier, CSK would have moved in with two spinners. But, had the (GT) pacers bowled in the right areas, it would have been tough for them to hit," he

considered. 'WON'T SAY WE FAILED TO SCORE RUNS, BUT CREDIT TO CSK BOWLERS': Despite the 63run loss, Mohit refused to

blame the batters for the poor show. CSK bowlers implemented their plan to perfection to restrict GT to 143/8 with Sai Sudharsan (37) being GT's top scorer. "I won't say we failed to score

runs, but credit to the CSK bowlers for bowling brilliantly. Deepak (Chahar) started well, and at the end of the day, it all boils down to the number of variations you possess and when and how to use them. "Don't think it was a pressure

scenario for us. The wicket was good, and 200 was a gettable total here.

"But the wickets that we lost initially, leading to lack of partnerships, followed by CSK bowlers bowling the right length, led to our inability to up the run rate, and we began lagging in every over," he signed off.

back to his devastating best very soon thanks to the unflinching support of the franchise. "First of all, he's not going to be any

burden. In fact, it's going to be more positive impact which he brings along with him because as a player, he's one of the most talented cricketers in India, in fact in the world cricket right now," he pointed out.

"Obviously in the first game, he did not look at his fluent best but that is obvious because it's not easy after coming back from injury...But the intent was good from him. With a few more matches, he will be back in his elements as a match-winner," Tiwary

Tiwary said the backing of coach Ricky Ponting and mentor Sourav Ganguly has been a key factor in aiding Pant's comeback.

"From last year itself, the coach of the team, Ricky Ponting, brought him into the dugout...If we all can recollect, two months ago, Sourav Ganguly said that he's going to be the captain.

So when the mentor and the coach wants him in the team from very early, that means they are not thinking him as a burden. Even if he doesn't score runs, he is still their captain, he is their leader," he said.
