Rural Andhra to power YSRCP

The upcoming elections in Andhra Pradesh are being keenly observed by several local media organizations as well as national TV channels. The common observation made by a majority of people in the state is that urban areas are in favour of the TDP-JSP-BJP combine, while rural areas are supporting the ruling YSRC party. Almost all TV channels operating in Telugu states have taken sound bites of urban electorate and started announcing that the days of the YSRCP government are numbered. Is it really true and is the election scene crystal clear to arrive at such a conclusion? Swatantra TV and The Pioneer made some important field studies over the last 30 days and came out with clear pointers in voting preferences in different regions of the state. Presented below are the key findings.

It is true that urban voters in Andhra Pradesh are vexed with the ruling YSRCP for not talking about development, neglecting long-standing complaints about roads, not having skyscrapers and flyovers like in Hyderabad, among other grouses. They wanted 'development talk' every day and that is something they had missed in the state for the last five years. So, they have clearly decided to vote against the ruling YSRCP.

At the same time, rural voters are standing strongly behind the YSRCP. In almost all districts, rural voters are going to vote in favour of the YSRCP. The recent Assembly elections in Electorate predominantly in villages and they are in favour of YSRCP

The devil is in the details

However, as we observe the population and the distribution of voters across the state, it is clear that urban voters are outnumbered by rural voters. In some districts, urban voters constitute less than 20 per cent of the total electorate! Only in Visakhapatnam, East Godavari, Krishna, Guntur, Nellore, Kadapa, Kurnool and Anantapur districts more than 20 per cent of the electorate are in urban areas; whereas, the rural electorate predominate in all the other districts in Andhra Pradesh. Districts like

Srikakulam, Prakasam and West Godavari have nearly 80 per cent or more voters in the rural areas. This suggests that majority of voters are in villages and they are in favour of the

Let us examine the reasons for the clear support of rural voters for the YSRCP. When we asked the rural electorate about the performance of the government, they said they were nappy with the timely release of monthly social security pensions. Remember, YS Jagan has increased the pension amount to Rs 3,000 per person per month! This has endeared him to old people in the villages who are openly coming out in support of the YSRCP. Another major factor that is

going in favour of the YSRCP in villages is the village volunteers system. The introduction of village volunteers has changed the scene in favour of the YSRCP in rural areas, where families are getting their ration delivered at their house and pension is paid at the doorstep. The help rendered by volunteers in getting statutory certificates like caste, marriage, death certificates is lauded by one and all in the villages. They aver that they have never got such attention in the past. Another important change that

appears to have won the hearts of rural voters is the significant improvement in schools and primary health centers. As far as primary schools are concerned, there is a clear improvement of infrastructure in 70 per cent of the schools. English medium has been introduced in a majority of the schools and special attention is paid to provide basic things like books, slates, and bags free of cost! Similarly primary health centers received huge makeover and the village volunteers are helping old and sick to go to PHCs and get regular medicines free of cost. This is helping lakhs of sick people who earlier had to rush to nearby towns and cities to get proper health care.

All told, the YSRCP government, by transforming administration in rural areas and by bettering the lives of the rural populace, has cemented its bonds with the rural electorate. Nothing can change their resolve to

Antarctica ice melting slowing Earth's rotation

PNS NEW DELHI

Ice melting in Greenland and Antarctica, driven by global warming, is affecting timekeeping the world over by slowing down the Earth's rotating speed, according to a new research.

As a result, a second might need to be deducted from the Coordinated Universal Time (UTC) three years later than otherwise, it found.

The study author, Duncan Agnew, explained that because the Earth doesn't always rotate at the same speed, the UTC consists of discontinuities.

Since 1972, all discontinuities have required that a 'leap second' be added, because many networked activities like computing and financial markets require the consistent, standardised and precise timescale provided by the UTC, he said.

solid Earth rotating faster has resulted in fewer leap seconds being needed to be added to the UTC in recent decades.

When extrapolated to the future, he predicted that a leap second will need to be deducted from the global primary standard of timekeeping as early as the year 2026.

However, Agnew also found that the increased melting of ice caps in Greenland and Antarctica has slowed down the Earth's rotation more rapidly than ever before and therefore. he estimated that the leap second will not need to be deducted until the year 2029.

The ice melting was measured by satellite gravity.

EC appoints three special observers for State

State Chief Electoral Officer Mukesh Kumar Meena has said that the Election Commission of India has appointed three special observers for the State in view of the upcoming elections. ECI has appointed 1987 batch retired IAS officer Ram Mohan Mishra as special general observer, 1984 batch retired IPS officer Deepak Mishra as special police observer and 1983 batch retired IRS officer Neena Nigam as special expenditure observer.

These three special observers are attending the meeting at the office of the Election Commission of India on Friday. They will visit the State from next week and will examine the advance arrangements being made for conducting the elections. He said that they will focus on strict implementation of EC guidelines, border areas of the State, problematic areas as well as control of political parties to attract and motivate voters. Similarly, they will participate in the meetings organ-ised by the Election Commission with District Election Officers, SPs and law enforcement agencies and give their valuable experiences, suggestions and advice, said Meena.





Control transportation of intoxicants in State: CS

90% of cannabis being transported from Malkangiri district of Odisha

PNS VIJAYAWADA

Chief Secretary Dr KS Jawahar Reddy has said that illicit liquor, cultivation of ganja, and transportation of other intoxicants in the State should be controlled. The CS said that in coordination with the DGPs of the neighbouring States, they were ordered to identify the kingpins associated with these and arrest them under the PD Act.

On Thursday, a review was conducted with the officers of Excise, Special Enforcement Bureau and the Police Department. The CS said that surveillance should be strengthened in the check-posts of the border States. Surveillance should not be limited to the check-posts. Focus on other routes and sources in the villages, too. Identify those involved and take strict action, CS Jawahar Reddy ordered the officials.

He asked them to encourage the cultivation of other crops as an alternative to cannabis, especially among the tribals. The measures to control the transportation and consumption of illegal liquor and drugs should be limited to the election peri-



Bureau Commissioner Y Ravi Prakash said that Andhra Pradesh shares a border with six States. He explained that 90 percent of cannabis is being transported from Malkangiri district of Odisha State and 10 percent from Koraput district. The Odisha DGP is taking appropriate measures to control the transportation of cannabis with their coordination. As many as 35 kingpins have been identified in the State in connection with the transportation of ganja and 25 of them have been arrested. The rest are absconding and steps are being taken to catch them with the cooperation of the police of border States.

He also said that appropriate measures are being taken to control the transportation of ganja and other intoxicating substances with the cooperation State Special Enforcement of the Narcotics Bureau. He



Commissioner of Excise Department Vivek Yadav said that there are 17 primary distilleries, 20 IMFLs and four other distilleries in the State and an assistant commissioner-level officer has been appointed as incharge for each distillery. Also, there will be CCTV cameras and monitoring of transport vehicles through GPS. He said that appropriate measures are

PA sets new cargo handling record; surpasses 80 MMT

The Visakhapatnam Port Authority (VPA) has set a new benchmark for cargo handling, surpassing 80 million metric tonnes (MMT) (80.05 MMTPA as of March 27, 2024) with four days remaining in the current fiscal year. This achievement shatters all previous records for the port. Dr M Angamuthu, Chairman of VPA, commended the port's workforce for their dedication and instrumental

role in achieving this milestone, particularly highlighting the Traffic Manager and his team's crucial contributions. Dr. Angamuthu further emphasised the importance of continued hard work from all employees to achieve even greater success in the future.

The surge in cargo handling reflects a rise across various categories, particularly bulk freight. Crude oil shipments witnessed a remarkable 27 per cent increase, while iron ore and fertilisers saw growth of 12 per cent and six per cent, respectively. Notably, port activity has intensified with a 35 per cent increase in the number of ships entering the harbor, including 43 Baby Cape vessels with BHIM operating in the Inner Harbour exceeding last year's figures. Visakha Container Terminal

has also exhibited significant improvement, experiencing a 28 per cent uptick in container handling, reaching 6.65 lakh TEUs. Key performance indicators



have seen substantial enhancements as well, with a 68 per cent reduction in pre-berthing detention, a 10 per cent improvement in turnaround time, and an eight per cent decrease in idle time berthing. 2023 witnessed record-breaking cargo traffic in several months, including May, June, October, and most recently, January 2024. In January, the port achieved a historic feat by handling 4,03,978 million tonnes of cargo in a single day, surpassing the previous record

VPA's commitment extends beyond cargo handling. At the 2023 Global Maritime India Summit in Mumbai, the port signed 19 Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) aimed at elevating port management standards and fostering trade development. Furthermore, VPA actively contributes to the well-being of the local community through initiatives like road maintenance, park construction, and greening efforts.

s much as 44 per cent respondents in a survey complained that they had to pay extra Acharges to get a seat at the time of purchase of a flight ticket. Many of the respondents also reported paying between Rs 200 and Rs 2,000 as seat allocation fee, which can amount to 5-40 per cent of the air fare, LocalCircles, which carried out the survey, said in a statement. It also said there has been a very marginal improvement in the

last 12 months in the ability of consumers to get a free seat when booking their flight. The Ministry of Consumer Affairs and consumer regulator CCPA late last year convened a meeting of the airlines on the issue and questioned them about the alleged unfair trade practices and misleading claims of "free" web check-in, it said. The new survey, which received over 41.000 responses from consumers across 339 districts of the country, has focused on fliers' problems when booking for travel with family members.

NET scores to be used for PhD

The National Eligibility Test (NET) scores will be used for PhD admissions from 2024-25 eliminating the need for separate entrance tests conducted by universities and higher education institutions, according to the University Grants Commission.

The NET is conducted twice a year -- June and December. Its are currently used to

award Research Fellowship (JRF) and as eligibility for appointment as an assistant professor for those with a Master's degree.

According University Grants Commission (UGC) officials, the commission had consti-

tuted an expert committee to review the provisions of the exam and based on the panel's recommendations, it has decided that from the academic session 2024-25, the score can be used for admission to PhD programmes.

"Starting from the academic session 2024-2025, universities nationwide will have the opportunity to utilise NET scores for admissions to PhD programmes, replacing the need for separate entrance tests conducted by individual universities and higher education institutions (HEIs). This marks an important step in streamlining the admission process and enhancing accessibility for aspiring doctoral candidates.

"By leveraging the NET, which is conducted biannually, universities can offer greater flexibility to students, allowing them to utilise their scores from either session to apply for PhD programmes across various institutions," UGC Chairman Jagadesh Kumar

Kumar explained that the initiative is poised to benefit students in numerous ways.

"Firetly it eliminates the

for students to prepare and appear multiple entrance tests conducted by different universities, thereby reducing the burden of exam logistics

expenses.
"We strongly encourage all universities to adopt

NET exam scores for PhD admissions starting from the 2024-2025 academic session. This will undoubtedly contribute to fostering a more conducive environment for academic pursuit and scholarly advancement in our nation," he said.

In an official notification, the UGC said that from June 2024 onwards, the NET candidates will be declared eligible in three categories -- for admission to PhD with JRF and appointment as assistant professor; for admission to PhD without JRF and appointment as assistant professor; for admission to PhD programme only and not for the award of JRF or appointment as assistant professor.

Such a system will provide a single window for admissions and students can give their choices on a single portal instead of applying separately to universities,' a source said.

"Whether or not the idea will take off is not certain right now. It depends on the panel's findings and then we will have stakeholder consul-However, there is no clarity on when the idea tations," the source said.

Species in 17 mountains face extinction risk

Species living in 17 mountains around the world may be facing the risk of extinction due to the rapid rate at which the planet is warming, new research published in the journal Nature has found.

Researchers said that the mountains at significant risk due to global warming included those in the Iran-Pakistan region, Northeast Asia, Brazilian highlands, Western America and Mexico, and the Mediterranean basin.

The international team of researchers, led by Academia Sinica in Taiwan, called for setting up more meteorological monitoring stations in mountainous areas globally, essential for developing a deeper understanding of the extent of such

In their study, the researchers found these mountain regions to have the highest climate velocity, or the rate at which "species must move to stay within their survivable habitats".

They explained a new approach they developed to estimate climate velocities in mountainous regions that considers two important influencing factors -- surface warming and humidity -- whilst incorporating the theories of atmospheric science.

Setting up meteorological observation stations in mountainous areas is challenging, leading to a global shortfall in long-term climate data for these

regions, the team said.
This knowledge gap, com-



pounded by the complex topography, has limited the understanding of warming trends, they said. The team's newly developed approach compensates for the lack of station data and assess shifts in temperature isotherms -- locations having the same temperature -- in mountain regions under climate

change, they said. In humid climates, climate velocity can be high, even as warming is less pronounced, according to lead author Wei-Ping Chan from the Biodiversity Research Center, Academia Sinica, and a postdoctoral researcher at Harvard University, US. "The mountainous regions

of Taiwan, like Japan, are more affected by humidity-induced high velocities than continental regions. Our study suggests that accounting for humidity is critical to fully understanding the variability of temperature isothermal shifts in mountainous areas worldwide," said Chan.

Lead researcher Sheng-Feng Shen, also from the Biodiversity Research Center of Academia Sinica, said, "The lack of meteorological observation data from mountains is both the most

valuable and the biggest challenge of our study.

In the absence of such data, he said they have to rely on models for making estimates, which could vary significantly depending on the model and method used. Further, global data isn't suitable for making local predictions due to differ-

ences in scale, Shen added. The unique characteristics of various mountain regions and the absence of local data mean that just because an area isn't highlighted, doesn't mean it's unaffected," he said.

Therefore, the researchers emphasised the need to set up more weather stations in mountains to better understand the real situation and tackle the effects of climate change on

CUSTODIAL DEATH CASE

Stricter approach required to decide on bail for cops

Observing that a police officer may wield more influence than an ordinary person, the Supreme Court has set aside the bail granted to a police constable in a case of custodial death.

A bench of justices Aniruddha Bose and Sanjay Kumar said a stricter approach is required to decide on the question of bail of a police official who is accused in a custodial death case.

"In cases of this nature, having regard to the overall influence a member of a police force

may wield in connection with a case against them pertaining to custodial death, a stricter view is to be taken on the question of granting bail," the court

The top court said in ordinary circumstances, it would not have invoked the jurisdiction under Article 136 of the Constitution to invalidate an order granting bail to an accused.

"But this criteria, while dealing with the question of granting bail, would not apply in a case of custodial death, where police officials are arraigned as

accused. Such alleged offences are of grave and serious nature, The apex court said so far as

the present appeal is concerned, it ought to make an exception from the general approach on the question of granting bail and adopt a stricter approach. The top court was hearing an

appeal against bail granted to a police constable in a case of custodial death. The deceased was arrested in

connection with a case involving robbery and he was taken into custody on February 11,

Truth travels freely

Kejriwal's arrest gets international attention; vendetta politics may boomerang on ED

rought to the Rouse Avenue Court amid high drama, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has described his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate in the excise policy case as a "political conspiracy." Himself making submissions in the court after taking the special judge's permission, he expressed confidence that the public will give a "fitting reply to this injustice". Seeking to establish a link between the Electoral Bond donations received by the ruling party and his arrest, the Delhi Chief Minister said that people were being turned 'approver' in the case and being forced to change their statements. "My arrest by the ED is a political conspiracy ... the approver gave the BJP Rs 55 crore," he said. As a precursor to this setting, Kejriwal's wife, Sunita, broke her silence and hinted at the impending revelation of this crucial piece of information. Kejriwal, known for his anti-corruption stance and vocal criticism of the Centre, was arrested last week on charges of being embroiled in a multi-crore liquor scam. The arrest sparked wide-



spread outcry and protests, with supporters of Kejriwal alleging political vendetta and the BJP's bid to settle political scores with the AAP upon losing the MCD elections after 15 years. Apart from being charged with soliciting kickbacks from liquor traders in exchange for favours, the Delhi Chief Minister is also accused of being the "kingpin and key conspirator" in the nowscrapped policy. The agency has already arrested at least 14 top AAP leaders, including Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia and Minister Sanjay Singh, in connection with the case. Meanwhile, the international community has also been

drawn into the fray, with the US making remarks regarding Kejriwal's arrest that have drawn the ire of Indian officials. The US State Department expressed concern over what it termed as "the apparent suppression of dissent" in India, calling for due process and respect for human rights. However, Indian authorities swiftly responded, asserting that the comments were unwarranted interference in the country's internal affairs. Germany was the first country to speak against Kejriwal's arrest. Whenever a politician is put behind bars, there are consequences to it. The Union Government should be doubly sure that it has a watertight case against the accused person, else there are high chances that it will boomerang. Due to the lack of information on the case in public domain, we shall assume that the authorities have a strong case against the Delhi CM and that due process of law would be followed. But if it is an exercise in haste, Kejriwal's words might prove prophetic as elections are just around the corner. The citizens are discerning enough to read any signs of political vendetta. The outcome of this legal battle and its broader implications remain uncertain, but one thing is clear – the events unfolding around Kejriwal have captured the attention of the nation and the world, highlighting the enduring struggle for transparency, accountability and justice in the corridors of power.

Dandi March: Salt, soul and satyagraha

The Dandi March serves as a reminder that peaceful protest can be a potent weapon against injustice and oppression

he 1980s film 'Mard' immortalised poignant scene that encapsulates the essence of patriotism, rebellion, and sacrifice in Indian cinematic history. In this scene, the protagonist, amidst relentless flogging by the heroine armed with chains, whispers with unyielding spirit, "For this salt, our Mahatma led a revolution." This homage vividly captures the spirit of the Salt Satyagraha of 1930, a pivotal moment in India's quest for independence, led by Mahatma Gandhi.

Social media often promotes formation of echo chambers and spread of false news

ocial media, a ubiquitous phenomenon in contemporary society, has revolutionised the way people communicate, share information and interact with one another. From its humble beginnings as online forums to the expansive platforms of today like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Telegram, Snapchat and many more, the term 'social media' has reshaped human interaction and societal norms to a large extent.

Today, it has become an integral part of everyone's life, especially Generation Z and the impact is complex and multifaceted, encompassing both positive and negative aspects. Social media has fundamentally transformed communication dynamics, making it easier for individuals to connect with others globally. It has transcended geographical barriers, enabled real-time interaction and fostered virtual communities based on shared interests, identities and ideologies. Moreover, social media platforms have become instrumental in political discourse, activism and social movements, empowering voices that were previously marginalised and amplifying diverse perspectives.

Millennials and Generation Z rely heavily on social media as a primary source of news and information which at times can lead to issues such as the spread of misinformation, echo chambers and filter bubbles, where individuals are only exposed to viewpoints that align with their own beliefs. Various studies have also shown that spending too much time on social media, especially before bedtime, disrupts the sleep pattern. Blue light suppresses the production of melatonin, a hormone that regulates sleep, making it more difficult to fall asleep and reducing the overall quality of sleep. Studies also reveal that constant exposure to short-form content and distractions on social media platforms can lead to a decrease in attention span and difficulty concentrating on tasks that require sustained focus. Another major role of social media platforms which is responsible for various disruptions is promoting of unrealistic beauty standards through the use of filters, photo editing tools and the prevalence of influencers with idealised appearances, leading to body dissatisfaction and negative body image among Generation Z.



Such platforms are designed to be addictive, with features such as likes, comments, and notifications triggering dopamine release in the brain and can lead to compulsive use and dependency which is no less like other forms of addiction. Moreover, the constant exposure to carefully curated images and posts can create unrealistic expectations and foster feelings of FOMO (Fear Of Missing Out) among users. To mitigate the negative effects of FOMO irrespective of the generation gap, it becomes important to promote digital literacy, encourage healthy social media habits and foster offline connections and experiences such as practicing mindfulness, setting boundaries for screen time and cultivating meaningful relationships and activities that are not dependent on social media val-

Additionally, fostering a supportive and inclusive online community can also help alleviate feelings by emphasising authenticity, empathy and acceptance. There is no denying the fact that social media has brought about numerous benefits for Millennials and Generation Z in terms of connectivity, self-expression, and access to information, but at the same time it also poses challenges and risks that require careful consideration and management. Despite its transformative potential, social media presents a myriad of challenges that warrant attention. The addictive nature of social media and its impact on mental health, particularly among young people, raise concerns about excessive screen time, cyberbullying, and negative self-comparison. Balancing the advantages and drawbacks of social media usage is essential to harness its potential while mitigating its negative impacts on their well-being and society as a whole.

Quantifying happiness is perplexing

The World Happiness Report places India at 126th rank, raising legitimate concerns about the methodology and biases inherent in such assessments



appiness is complex and difficult to define, but this in no way implies that we do not know when we are happy. Happiness cannot be a permanent state of euphoria as the mind constantly changes its contours and shades and, by and large, remains an individual experience. Hence any exercise that seeks to generalise the impressions of a large number of individuals like those living within a country and brand them as happy or unhappy people is bound to be fraught with controversies. It will also inevitably reflect the biases of the measurers. When the definition of a variable cannot be agreed upon, its measurement will raise more controversies, but when such rankings are internationally publicised for branding countries and peoples which may influence the decisions of investors and donors, it is no longer a benign exercise without any accountability. On March 20 every year for the last seven years, which date has been marked by the UN as the International Day of Happiness, a New York-based agency called Sustainable Development Solutions Network has been bringing out an annual World Happiness Report, whose 2024 edition has placed India at 126th rank among 143 countries, much below countries like Saudi Arabia (28), China (60), Russia (72), Venezuela (79), Senegal (99), Iran (100), Palestine (103), Ukraine (105), Pakistan (108) even Myanmar (118).

These countries are either strife-torn or warravaged, where the basic security of human life is not guaranteed, or ruled by autocrats and dictators who ruthlessly suppress the civil liberties of their people, especially of women, countries which are reeling under relentless crises in their democracy, polity

and economy. This raises legitimate questions about the methodology used in the exercise that can produce such weird results. Finland has topped the ranking in each year so far, and the top 10 countries have also remained more or less the same, Finland, Denmark, Iceland, Sweden, Israel, Netherlands, Norway, Luxemburg, Switzerland and Australia. A common thread runs through all of them - high per capita income. Other higher-capita income countries also rank higher in the list, like New Zealand (21), UK

(20), USA (23), Germany (24), or France (27). This is no surprise, because to the materialistic West hung on a culture of conspicuous overconsumption, money remains the primary and often the only source of happiness, unlike in Asian and other continental cultures.

The only Asian country to feature

in the list is Kwait at 13th position,

and the next one is Saudi Arabia at 28th. While Singapore features in 30th position, Japan, which has the largest concentration of longest-living people in the world, at 51st position, below Uzbekistan (47) and Kazakhstan (49). This raises natural questions about whether the index also reflects the inherent civilizational bias of the West against Asia, most of which used to be their colonies once-to treat them as superior or even equal would be an anathema to the West. Bhutan which reckons happiness as a core responsibility of Government and has adopted its Gross National Happiness (GNH) Index as a development indicator in its 2008 Constitution, was ranked 95th in 2019 and has not been ranked this year. GNH was the first such index and is far broader - having nine parameters, all non-income.

Trying to measure the immeasurable will have its inherent contradictions. Happiness is a state of being, rather than a fixed state like a goal to be achieved that can be quantified and measured. Such measures therefore confuse happiness with "well-being" which is produced by the interplay of numerous extraneous factors like income, health, education, liberties, choices, relationships, physical and social security, etc. But even then, it is a subjective sense of well-being, which is neither

measurable nor quantifiable. The rankings used in the World Happiness Report are based on six parameters of "subjective wellbeing": (1) per capita income, (2) healthy life expectancy at birth, (3) social support, (4) freedom to make life choices, (5) generosity, and (6) perceptions of corruption. The happiness rankings are based on what the authors say are "life evaluations", on which Gallup World Poll (GWP) provides the data by asking respondents to evaluate their current life on a scale of 0 to 10 (happiest), using a typical sample size of 1000 for each country regardless of its population,

and using a three-year average.
The sample size is too small for a country like India to represent all its diversity and complexity. Data for per capita GDP on purchasing power parity (PPP) are taken from the World Development Indicators (WDI) of the World Bank, and then a natural log that fits the observa-

The mind is influenced by social and cultural factors; hence how we perceive happiness also depends on these factors. It also depends on the questions asked and the way they have been framed: Just ask "How much time you spend with your parents every week", or "For how long you have been married to your present spouse", and see how the scales turn against the rich western

In collectivist societies in Asia, people reckon happiness more as a shared experience rather than individual satisfaction with life, whereas in individualistic societies, people perceive happiness more in terms of individual satisfaction. bonding within social groups and families contributes positively to happiness. Individualistic Western nations would score higher given the way the GWP questions have been framed.

As every Indian knows from experience, we are not unhappy people, having been brought up to regard values and relationships as more important than wealth and to be content to live a simple life with few material possessions, with strong bonds with our extended families and the community. Even though perceptions are changing in a growing economy, these basic values have remained intact. We do not need to feel depressed at our 126th ranking. Instead, we should ignore such a phoney index and go about our lives and business as

greenback. The local unit finally settled at 83.39 (provisional), registering a loss of 6 paise from its previous close. On Wednesday, the rupee declined 4 paise to close at 83.33 against the US dollar. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.34 per cent higher at 104.42. Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said the Indian rupee depreciated on Thursday on strong US dollar and dollar demand from oil marketing companies (OMCs).

Coal India achieves 610.8-MT supply to power sector, tops annual target

Coal India Ltd (CIL) has surpassed its annual supply target of 610 million tonnes to the thermal power sector, achieving 610.8 MT till March 27, a company official said. "This marks the highest coal supply till date to the power sector," he said. CIL's coal supply to the sector rose by 29.3 million tonnes in absolute volume terms compared to the corresponding period last fiscal, he said. The miner's current average daily supply to coalfired plants stands at 1.76 million tonnes, reflecting the growing demand from the power

sector, according to a company statement. CIL is aiming at boosting production in the wake of the estimated peak demand for electricity of 250 GW this summer. In 2022-23, offtake to power plants reached 586.6 million tonnes, surpassing the commitment of 565 million tonnes, the official said. As per data, coal stock at domestic coalbased power plants stood at 47.1 million tonnes as of March 26, an increase of 13.7 million tonnes as against the corresponding period last year.



Ambani, Adani join hands

Relaince picks 26% stake in Adani power project

In the first collaboration between rival billionaires, Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries has picked up a 26 per cent stake in a Madhya Pradesh power project of Gautam Adani, and signed a pact to use the plants' 500 MW of electricity for captive use.

Reliance will pick up 5 crore equity shares in Mahan Energen Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Adani Power Ltd, of face value Rs 10 at par (Rs 50 crore) and will use 500 MW of generation capacity for captive use, the two firms said in separate stock exchange filings.

The two businessmen hailing from Gujarat have often been pitted by media and commentators against each other but they have for years tiptoed around each other to reach the top two rungs of Asia's wealth

With Ambani's interests spanning oil and gas to retail and telecom and Adani's focus on infrastructure spanning sea ports to airports, coal and mining, they rarely crossed each other's path except in the clean energy business

where the two have announced multi-billion

investments Adani aspires to be the world's largest renewable energy producer by 2030 while Reliance is building four gigafactories at Jamnagar in Gujarat -- one each for solar panels, batteries, green hydrogen, and fuel cells.

Adani is also building three giga factories for manufacturing solar mod-ules, wind turbines and hydrogen electrolysers.

A clash was also forecast when Adani group applied to participate in an auction of spectrum or airwaves capable of carrying fifth generation (5G) data and voice services. However, unlike Ambani, Adani bought 400 MHz spectrum in the 26 GHz band, which is not for public net-

On the contrary, the two have been far from rivals. In 2022, a firm with erstwhile links to Ambani sold its stake in news broadcaster NDTV to Adani, paving the way for the takeover.

The board of Ambuja Cements has approved the conversion of 21.20 crore warrants into shares of promoter entity Harmonia Trade and Investment at the rate of Rs 314.15 per share. The fund's infusion will be instrumental for the cement business of the Adani group, which has plans to enhance its capacity to 140 million tonnes per annum by 2028, according to a statement from billionaire Gautam Adani-owned Ambuja Cements. This investment

follows an infusion of Rs 5,000 crore by the promoter into the company for exercising the warrants issuance approved by the board in October 2022. "With this, the Adani family have increased their stake in the company by 3.6 per cent to attain 66.7 per cent holding," said Ambuja Cements which also owns a controlling stake in another cement firm ACC Ltd. On October 18, 2022, Ambuja Cements allotted 47.74 crore convertible warrants to Harmonia, a member of the promoter group of the Company, at an initial subscription amount of Rs 104.72 per warrant, which was 25 per cent of the issue price of Rs

India can achieve a growth rate of 10 per cent in the next decade and become the second-largest economy by 2032 and the largest by 2050, given the energies and transformation driving the nation to overcome its challenges, said RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra.

He was delivering a keynote address on The Indian Economy: Opportunities and Challenges at Nomura's 40th Central Bankers Seminar in

Kyoto, Japan on March 25. India's growth trend is on the cusp of a post-pandemic upshift, with early signs of it rising above 7 per cent record-



ed during the 2000s before COVID-19 struck, he said.

"India's recent growth performance has surprised many, triggering a flurry of upgrades. For instance, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has cumulatively revised its forecast for 2023 upwards by 80 basis points between April 2023 and January 2024," Patra said.

In its latest update, IMF expects India to contribute 16 per cent of global growth, the second largest share in the world in terms of market exchange rates.

By this metric, India is the fifth largest economy in the world and positioned to overtake Germany and Japan within the ensuing decade.

In purchasing power parity (PPP) terms, the Indian economy is already the third largest in the world.

The tailwinds driving the growth, the deputy governor said, include favourable demography, the rupee being among the least volatile currencies in 2023 and transformative change leveraged on technology.

IPL 17 opening day registers record breaking viewership: Broadcaster

The 17th edition of the Indian Premier League opened to blockbuster viewership numbers with 16.8 crore viewers tuning in to watch the season's first game between Chennai Super Kings and Royal Challengers Bengaluru on March 22, the tournament's official tournament's official broadcaster said on Thursday. Disney Star said the opening day also registered a watch-

time of 1276 crore minutes -the highest-ever for the first day of any season. The watchtime minutes are a compilation of the time spent by each viewer in watching the game.

The 17th season of IPL also witnessed the highest-ever peak TV concurrency for an opening day, with 6.1 crore viewers watching the broadcast simultaneously on the Disney Star network. "Disney Star had recorded 870

crore minutes on the IPL's opening day in 2023. In comparison to the previous edition, there is a growth of 16 per cent in TV consumption," the company stated.

Defending champions Chennai Super Kings defeated Royal Challengers Bengaluru by six wickets in the seasonopener in Chennai.

"This growth is a reaffirmation of the incomparable capacity of Live Cricket to aggregate audiences

on TV and provides a blockbuster start to the tournament. We will continue to enrich the magic of one of the world's biggest sporting events to take forward the launch momentum and deliver unprecedented viewership," a Star Sports spokesperson said in a press

release. The channel said that the record-breaking TV viewership on the opening day comes on the back of an

array of programmes in the lead-up to the 17th season which attracted more than 24.5 crore viewers till a week prior to the start of the tournament.

In the digital space, JioCinema clocked 11.3 crore viewers on the first day of the IPL.

The streamer claimed that it registered a 51 per cent jump over day one of IPL 2023. The total watch time on JioCinema on day 1 was 660 crore


