IMD forecasts Fry-days, relief only after June 1

Two die, life and property hit as Remal pounds Bengal

t least two persons were Akilled and several others injured as severe cyclonic storm Remal hit Bengal coasts on Sunday night, sources at State secretariat Nabanna said, adding the NDRF and SDRF teams were working overtime to restore normalcy in affected areas most of which lie in the vicinity of Sunderbans.

Though the speed of the storm reduced to a great degree by Monday morning, incessant rains continued to lash eight districts of South Bengal nearly throwing life out of gear.

The first death occurred after a wall collapsed under the impact of the rains at Bibir Bagan near Park Circus and Entally area of Kolkata, police said. Another person died when a tree collapsed under the impact of driving rains and gusting winds at 135 kmph at Mousuni Islands at the mouth of Bay of Bengal off Sunderbans.

At least eight other persons were injured at various places in Kolkata and Kakdwip, sources said. Severe cyclone Remal made landfall between Sagar Islands in Bengal and Khepupara in neighbouring Bangladesh, sources said on Monday.

Rivers surrounding most of the riverine islands — like had nearly stopped but rains Jharkhali, Geokhali, were still continuing. "Severe



Kumirmari, Sandeshkhali Block I, Godkhali, Bakkhali, Gosaba — of the Sunderbans areas in two 24 Parganas districts were almost brimming and threatening to breach or overflow their mud embankments — under the impact of high tide and gushing rains — sources said, adding in many villages the embankments had been breached and salty water had entered the agricultural fields.

"This flooding of the fields could have a deep impact on the local economy as there would be no agriculture for several years now," said former Minister from Sunderbans Kanti Ganguli who was actively involved in rescue work.

'Depressed, in shock' Revanna promises to meet SIT on May 31

Hassan MP Prajwal Revanna, who is facing charges of sexually abusing several women, has said he will appear before the Special Investigation Team (SIT), probing the cases against him, on May 31. Terming the cases against him as "false" and part of a "political conspiracy", he said he had gone into depression.

"I will personally come before the SIT on May 31 at 10 am and cooperate with the investigation and also respond to it (charges). I have faith in the judiciary and I am confident that I will come out of false cases, through court," Pajwal said in a video

statement. There was no independent confirmation from the JD(S) or the family of the suspended party MP immediately over

'Unwell' Kejriwal seeks weeklong reprieve from SC

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, currently out on interim bail in connection with the excise policy case, has approached the Supreme Court seeking an extension of the same by seven more days to undergo a host of medical tests, including a PET-CT scan in view of his "sudden and unexplained weight loss, coupled with high ketone levels", which are indicatives of kidney, serious cardiac ailments and even

Kejriwal, in his plea filed on May 26, stated that he will get all these tests done in the working week from 3.06.2024 (Monday) to 7.6.2024 (Friday) and then surrender on the weekend, i.e. 9.06.2024

Senior AAP leader and Delhi Minister Atishi also on Monday said Kejriwal has sought a one-week extension of his interim bail as he needs to undergo tests due to his recent weight loss and rise in ketone level which could be symptoms of some kidney problem or even cancer. Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva called this move a "drama" by the Chief

Minister to avoid going back to jail after his interim bail in a money laundering case ends on June 1. The interim bail granted to Kejriwal has stirred controversy, with BJP leaders alleging preferential treatment by the Supreme Court.
The PET-CT scan shows detailed pictures of

organs and tissues. These tests are to be done in a particular sequence and would require about five-seven days, it said, adding "sudden and unexplained weight loss, coupled with high ketone levels could be indicative of kidney damage, serious cardiac ailments and even cancer Early detection of these ailments is essential

for preventing further progress of the disease and associated life risk and Kejriwal needed to undergo these tests, otherwise his life is at "high risk", it said. The fresh plea, which is likely to be taken up

in the coming days by a vacation bench, said during the incarceration from March 21 to May 10, the Chief Minister suffered a lot of health-related complications which are also "partly attributable to the negligent and

Valley's thumbs-up to poll engagement

In the first major electoral exercise after Article 370 abrogation and the bifurcation of Jammu & Kashmir into two Union Territories, the Valley has recorded the combined poll percentage of 58. 46 per cent for the five Parliamentary seats, which is the record highest voter turnout in last points jump in poll participation compared to 2019.

Data shared by the Election Commission (EC) shows that the voter turnout of 50.86 per cent from the three Parliamentary constituencies in the Kashmir Valley echoes the faith of the people in the democratic process. The poll participation percentage witnessed 30 points jump from the last Lok Sabha polls in 2019 when it was 19.16 per cent. The three seats in the Valley — Srinagar,




Baramulla and Anantnag-Rajouri recorded turnout of 38.49 per cent, 59.1 per cent and 54.84 per cent respectively, the highest in last three decades. The other two seats in the UT — Udhampur and Jammu — recorded 68.27 per cent and 72.22 per cent voter turnout respectively.

According to data, as against 58 per cent voting reported in five LS seats in J&K this year, 44.07 per cent polling was reported in 2019, 49.58 per cent in 2014, 39.04 per cent in 2009, 34.07 per cent in 2004, 30.89 per cent in 1999, 43.35 per cent in 1998,

Pune doctors manipulated teen's blood sample, 3 held

in the case of a car accident involving a 17-year-old boy in Pune

In a major development in the Porsche car crash case, two senior doctors and an employee from the State-run Sassoon Hospital have been arrested for allegedly "tampering" with the blood samples of the minor accused in the case.

The arrests of the two doctors - Dr Ajay Taware, Head of the Forensics Department, Dr Shrihari Halnor the Chief Medical Officer of the hospital and Atul Ghatkamble, an employee who works under Dr Taware — came after the police established that the blood samples tested at the Sassoon Hospital did not match with that of the accused Porsche car crash.

The three arrested persons including two doctors — were on Monday produced before Pune's Judicial Magistrate First Class (Small Causes) AA Pande, who remanded them in police custody till May 30. Dr Taware, Dr Halnor and Continued on Page 2 | Atul have been charged with

the alleged "manipulation" of blood samples and destruction of evidence in the case While seeking police custody of the three persons, the police told the court that some financial transactions had taken place to "tamper" with the blood samples and they needed to search the homes of

the 17-year-old accused in connection with it. The police told the court that the juvenile's blood samples were thrown into a dustbin and replaced with the blood samples of another person on the instructions of Dr Taware. It may be recalled that in the small hours of May 19, the 17year-old boy — after partying with his friends at a Pune bar who had driven off in his Porsche car in his inebriated state at a speed of some 200 kmph and rammed into a motorcycle killing killing Ashwini Koshta and Aneesh Awadhiya (both aged 24 years) who were returning home

Game zone fire: Have no faith in State machinery, says Gujarat court

The Gujarat High Court on I Monday came down heavily on the Rajkot civic body over the game zone fire which left 27 persons dead, and said it does not have faith in the state machinery which gets into action only after innocent lives are lost.

The court pulled up the Rajkot Municipal Corporation and asked whether it had turned a blind eye to such a big structure coming up in its vicinity, after the RMC's lawyer submitted that the TRP game zone had not asked for requisite permissions. A special bench of Justices Biren Vaishnav and Devan Desai was hearing a suo motu PIL on the game zone fire

The court also observed that all the Rajkot municipal commissioners, from the time the TRP game zone was set up in 2021 till the time of this incident (on May 25) "should be held accountable for the tragedy that occurred," and directed them to furnish separate affidavits. The fire at the TRP game zone in the Nana-Mava locality of Rajkot on Saturday evening killed 27 persons,

including children. The game zone was operated



without the fire NOC (no objection certificate), as per

The HC on Sunday took suo motu cognisance of the fire tragedy, terming it a prima facie "man-made disaster".

On Monday, a counsel pointed out that the unfortunate incident required immediate preventive and corrective measures, and the state government will have to come forward to hold a person accountable, and this calls for drastic steps. The court then said, "Who will take such drastic steps? Honestly speaking, we do not have faith in the state machinery now. Four years after orders of this court, directing them, after their assurance, this is the sixth incident that has hap-

They only want lives to be lost and then trigger the machinery," the court observed.

To the RMC counsel's submission that the game zone had not applied to the authorities for requisite permissions, the court asked whether the civic body was blind to such a big structure having come up

under its jurisdiction. "You were blind to that, that this big structure existed, you were not aware of it? What is the corporation's explanation that the whole zone existed for the last two-and-a-half years? What fire safety did they apply for? When ticketing was done, were you aware of entertainment tax? So we take it that you are completely turning a blind

eye to the whole issue?" the court said.

The HC also wanted to know when the corporation first recognised the existence of the game zone. Till then you were complete-

ly ignorant of such a structure in the vicinity? Were you not aware of the orders of this court for fire safety (passed) in a PIL? What were you doing then? There are media reports that your municipal commissioner went there at the time of inauguration. We can't take judicial notice of that fact? For 18 months, what did the corporation do? Sat over it?" the bench asked.

The court also observed that all the municipal commissioners, right from the time the TRP

game zone was set up in 2021 till the time of this incident "should be held accountable for the tragedy that occurred," and directed them to furnish separate affidavits. "We refrain at this stage from

passing any orders, though we would certainly desire to, to suggest that the officers in question be suspended for dereliction of duty and noncompliance of the direction of this court. We do not do so with the hope to give them a chance," the bench further said. It directed the incumbent RMC commissioner and officers who held the municipal commissioner's post from July 2021 till the date of the incident to file affidavits before the court, explaining various issues regarding certificates on the structural stability of such constructions, etc.

The HC also directed chief fire officers of the Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat and Rajkot municipal corporations to file affidavits on the fire safety measures (in areas of their jurisdiction), such as installation of fire hydrants, checking of fire safety equipment whether licences (to operate) were obtained from the respective collectorates or mamlat-

BJP councillors cover up dirt of Kerala CPM

 $K^{\text{erala's}}_{\text{Thiruvananthapuram wit-}}^{\text{Capital}}$ nessed a hitherto unseen and unheard of agitation on Monday as the BJP councillors of the city municipal corporation staged a unique kind of protest against the callousness of the State Government and the CPI (M) which is ruling the local body.

All the 35 councillors belonging to the BJP took to the street on Monday morning and started repairing the ring roads and thoroughfares which have been dug by the municipal corporation and remained unattended to since 2017. "Our priority was to fill the

potholes in the roads that lead to the three major Government schools in the city as these roads have been flooded in the pre-Monsoon rains. Children commuting in these stretches are sure to fall in this water filled potholes and it is their parents who stand to lose," said veteran councilor P Ashok Kumar, who led the repairing works. Though by noon, the councillors succeeded in filling the potholes and made them motorable, the police arrested all the councillors for causing public nuisance and took them all to the Armed Police Reserve Camp in the city.



Thiruvananthapuram, one of the oldest municipal corporations in Kerala (formed in 1942), are in a pathetic state and are crying for renovation and maintenance. The corporation, which boasts of the youngest Mayor in the country, has not done anything to repair or renovate the roads. Arya Rajendran, the Mayor, has courted controversies after controversies and right now she is busy fighting a legal battle with the driver of a KSRTC bus whom she alleges that he shown obscene signal with his fingers.

"The State Government as well as the rulers of the corporation are least bothered about the state of roads under their jurisdiction. The CPI (M) is busy appointing party cadres as staff of various departments in the corporation while the city is crying for attention," said a lady councillor belonging to the BJP.Ashok Kumar, a teacher by profession, said that he and others like him consider politics as a means for the welfare of the people irrespective of political differences. "But we alone cannot make things happen unless the ruling dispensation take the leadership," he

Because fire spreads very quickly due to oxygen, therefore the work of refilling oxygen cannot be done everywhere, there are some provisions for this, permission has to be taken from the government for this." Bodies of five of the seven newborns killed in the hospital fire have been handed over to their families after post-mortem while the other two bodies will be handed over after autopsy. Additionally, a Delhi court allowed the Delhi Police's plea seeking three days of custodial interrogation of the owner Dr Naveen Khichi and on-duty doctor Dr Aaksh of the hospital.

Additionally, the District Magistrate of Shahdara, Rishita Gupta, has submitted a factual report to the divisional commissioner regarding the incident on Sunday. In the report it was revealed that out of the seven dead newborn babies, four were male and three female. Barring one 25 days old boy, the rest were 15 days old infants. A detailed

report in the matter is awaited. He also said two nurses and some locals rescued the babies without worrying about their lives. "We will recommend their names for bravery awards," he added. He also

informed that the revenue department will be asked to expedite the process of compensation to the families of the babies killed and injured in the fire.

At least eight places in Delhi recorded maximum above 46 temperatures degrees Celsius, with Mungeshpur and Najafgarh logging a sweltering 48.3 degrees Celsius and 48.1 degrees Celsius, respectively. Harvana's Narnaul simmered at 47 degrees Celsius and Punjab's Faridkot at 47.4 degrees Celsius.

According to IMD chief Mrutyunjay Mohapatra, Rajasthan and Gujarat saw nine to 12 heatwave days, with temperatures reaching 45-50 degrees Celsius.

Delhi, South Haryana, South West UP and Punjab recorded five-seven heatwave days, with maximum temperatures ranging from 44 degrees Celsius to 48 degrees Celsius, said the IMD chief. Assam

also experienced a heatwave breaking record temperatures on May 25-26. The IMD attributed the heatwave in northwest India and some parts of the Central region in the second half of May to the lack of rainfall, stronger dry and warm winds an anti-cyclonic and circulation over southwest Rajasthan and adjoining Guiarat. On their part, authorities in the heatwave affected regions are taking measures to address the health risks posed by heat related illness, including reserving beds for heatstroke patients in Government-run hospitals. With temperatures remaining high even at night, many

people are struggling to find relief, especially those without access to air conditioning or proper cooling facilities, said the

Doctors are urging people to take precautions to stay safe during this challenging period, emphasising the importance of staying hydrated and avoiding prolonged exposure to the sun. They warn that the situation could worsen if the heat wave persists.

Some doctors said there has been a significant rise in urinary tract infections and kidney stones in adults due to sweltering heat conditions. Hence, one should drink water at regular intervals during hot weather, and urine colour should be like clear water. Yellow urine indicates dehydration, they said.

Similarly, cases of patients suffering from heat-related illness such as dehydration, fever, nausea and abdominal pain too are being reported from some hospitals in Lucknow.

Court dismisses Bibhay's bail plea

city court here on AMonday dismissed the bail plea of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's close aide Bibhav Kumar who is accused of assaulting AAP MP Swati Maliwal at the CM's residence. Additional Sessions Judge Sushil Anuj Tyagi of Tiz Hazari court rejected the bail plea of Kumar, a personal assistant of the CM, after hearing arguments from both

During the proceedings, Rajya Sabh MP Maliwal told the court that there was a threat to her life and "grave danger" to her family if Kumar was released. According to AAP, Kumar will approach the High Court after a city court rejected his bail plea in Swati Maliwal 'assauÎt' case. "Kumar will move the High Court against the lower court's decision," the AAP said in a state-

Delhi BJP President Shri Virendra Sachdeva welcomed the rejection of the bail application and said that the day is



not far when it will be clear why Kumar mercilessly beat up Maliwal. "From police inquiry so far it's clear that Bibhav Kumar had no personal reason to beat up Maliwal and obviously he has acted on CM's instruction. It's very obvious that both Arvind Kejriwal & his family were present in the house when Kumar beat up Maliwal but they both did not react as he was pressuring Maliwal to resign from her Rajya Sabha seat," he said. He added that there was a trespass and a report was also filed. He claimed that accusations by Maliwal are 'false' and that the FIR was lodged after three days. He also stated, "How such an incident could take place at

this place (CM's residence) where many people were present? There is no grievous injury on the vital part, so where is the question of culpable homicide not amounting to murder? Injuries can be selfinflicted." Kumar's counsel said that since the CCTV has already been recovered, there is no question of tampering. Maliwal, who countered these arguments, broke down in court and said, "They (AAP) have an army of trolls. The entire party machinery has been deployed. Continuous press conferences were held against me. This man (Bibhav Kumar) is not normal. He gets facilities that even Ministers don't do. If released, my life and my family's life is under grave danger," the Rajya

Atul Srivastava, representing the police said that prior to this incident, Maliwal never asked to take prior appointment. He also said that since she was allowed to sit in the waiting room, it implied permission and the question of trespass doesn't arise. "All the people at the place of occurrence were reporting to Bibhav Kumar. It shows that he is influential. He can tamper with the evidence," he stated. Advocate Madhav Khurana, representing Maliwal, said that the victim has the right to be heard, referring to a judge-ment on whether he could address the court or not. He said that Maliwal is receiving rape and murder threats. "The accused was found at the place of occurrence. He was interrogated but was evasive in answering. The accused allegedly assaulted a public servant earlier. If the accused is innocent, then why format his phone, tamper with the CCTV, and file a complaint on May 17?" he said to the court.

NCW directs police to obtain call records of CM in Maliwal assault case

The National Commission for Women (NCW) has directed the Delhi Police to obtain the call records of all individuals, including Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, in the alleged assault of AAP leader and Rajya Sabha MP Swati Maliwal on Monday.

The commission has claimed that Kejriwal's former PA Bibhav Kumar, who has been accused of abusing Maliwal, was called to the chief minister's residence after she reached there and sought details on whose direction he was called. In a press note issued on Monday, the NCW emphasised that this update follows its earlier communication dated May 13, 2024, where it took suo moto cognizance of a media post titled "DCW Chief Swati Maliwal accuses Arvind Kejriwal's personal secretary of assaulting her."

According to the report, Maliwal, the former DCW chief, alleged that she was assaulted by Kumar. The NCW Chairperson @sharmarekha has been sent to Commissioner of Police Delhi to take CDRs of relevant individuals, including

has revealed that during Maliwal's visit to the chief minister's residence, Kumar was summoned after her arrival. Further, to clarify the circumstances and directions under which Kumar was called, the NCW has called for an investigation into the Call Detail Records (CDR) of all involved individuals, including the chief minister. In a post on X (formerly Twitter), NCW stated, "It has come to our notice that Mr. Bibhav Kumar was reportedly called after the arrival of Swati Maliwal at CM's residence. A the CM, to ascertain on whose direction Bibhav Kumar was summoned."

In a post on Sunday, Maliwal shared that she has been getting rape threats even since youtuber Dhruv Rathee made a onesided video against her and despite her trying to reach him, he has been avoiding him. Keeping this in mind, the NCW has insisted on stringent action against individuals, who have been issuing rape and death threats to Maliwal.

BJP alleges suspicious role of Bharadwaj's OSD in illegally running children hospital

The Delhi BJP on Monday alleged the "suspicious" role of Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj's OSD Dr RN Gupta in the "illegally running" children's hospital in Vivek Vihar where seven newborn babies died in a fire incident. Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva in a statement alleged that the health department during an inspection in 2021 found the children's hospital capable of admitting five newborns only but the officer on special duty (OSD) of the Health minister on an application of the hospital owner tried to approve the capacity to treat

Bharadwaj said that nobody will be spared if found guilty. He claimed that Sachdeva was lying and the hospital was given permission of five beds only. "The Health department had earlier also lodged cases against him that are pending in the courts," he said.Bharadwaj said that the hospital was inspected and registered in 2021 while he became the Health minister in 2023. Any attempt to link him with registration of the hospital will be dealt with legal action, he warned.

"In 2021, during an inspection, this child hospital capable of caring for only five children, but then Dr. R.N. Das, based on the hospital owner's application, tried to approve the capacity to treat 10 children and infact allowed deposit of 10 bed fees," Sachdeva said.

He accused the AAP led Delhi government of protecting the hospital running in an unauthorised manner. "Despite this, there were 12 children admitted to the hospital during the fire, indicating that the hospital was operating continuous-ly in an unauthorised manner and was under the protection of the Delhi government, hence no action was taken even on the local Residential Welfare



Association's (RWA) complaints,' he said.

Further, Sachdeva claimed that Dr. R.N. Das has been very close to former Health Minister Satyendra Jain since 2021 and also to the current Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj. "The roles of Satyendra Jain

and Saurabh Bharadwaj in this hospital case are also suspicious, and an investigation into their roles in running the hospital illegally is necessary," he alleged.

Sachdeva also claimed that Bhardwaj's OSD, along with the hospital owners, are responsible for such an incident. "It is necessary to register a case of collusion and negligence against Dr. R.N. Das along with the hospital owner and to investigate and arrest him as well. An investigation into the Fire Department is also necesbecause in the past few years, there have been several major fire accidents and every time cases of unauthorised factories, warehouses, etc., have come to fore in Delhi," he said.

He claimed that during the tenure of Delhi's Fire Department Head Atul Garg many cases of corruption has come to light. "Since 2016, Atul Garg has been the head of the Fire Department in Delhi, and during this time, cases of corruption in the Fire Department have come to light, and even in the case of the children hospital, an illegal gas filling plant was operating due to the negligence of the Delhi Fire Department," he said.

Fire took 55 lives, injured more than 300 people in city this year so far: DFS

The Delhi Fire Services (DFS) on Monday revealed that fire has taken 55 lives and injured more than 300 people in the national

According to the data by DFS, 16 people were killed in fire in January, another 16 in February, 12 in March, four in April, and seven till May 26. Fire incidents led to 51 injuries in January, 42 in February, 62 in March, 78 in April, and 71 till May 26. From January 1 to May 26, the DFS received 8,912 fire-related calls. Delhi has reported 66 hospital fire incidents over the past two years, with 30 in 2022 and 36 in 2021.

'The number of fire calls increased to 32.26 per cent this year. According to the data, the fire department received 8,201 calls up to bodies of the 11 victims, one May 20. In the same period of them a woman, were recov-

last year, the department received 5,970 calls. This year the number has gone up by more than 32 per cent with 8,912 fire related calls during the same period," an official of the Delhi Fire Services said. their lives, this year total 55 people have so far lost their lives," the official added.

On Sunday, six newborn died after a massive fire broke out at a private children's hospital in east Delhi's Vivek Vihar. The blaze broke out at the Baby Care New Born Hospital at around 11.30 pm on Saturday and soon spread to two other adjacent buildings. On February 15, 11 people died in an explosion and subsequent blaze in a paint factory at Dayalpur market in outer Delhi's Alipur.

Four people were injured in the incident. The charred bodies of the 11 victims, one ered from the factory, which doubled as a chemical

godown. The fire, which was preceded by a blast, had spread to nearby buildings, including a drug rehabilitation centre and five were injured in a massive

In another incident in February, an 83-year-old woman died and her granddaughter sustained injuries after they jumped off the fourth floor of a residential building in southwest Delhi's Dwarka when a fire broke out in their apartment.

Many hospitals in Delhi have inadequate arrangements, including the need for wider staircases.

When hospitals apply for a non-objection certificate from the fire department, they are instructed to build staircases with a larger width to facilitate the easy evacuation of patients on stretchers during

Parents of newborns clueless as firefighters toiled to douse blaze

s firefighters toiled to Adouse a massive fire at a private neonatal hospital here on Saturday night, many parents whose newborns were admitted to the facility had no clue what was going on. Madhuraj Kumar, a painter, whose eight-day-old son was among the fortunate survivors, found out about the fire when he saw the charred hospital building on his way to work on Sunday morning. Similarly, no one from the hospital reached out to Deepak Gautam, whose sixday-old daughter was admitted there. His sister informed him about the fire after she saw it on the news. Families of Madhuraj Kumar,

Gautam and others blame the hospital for negligence but are glad that their children survived.

Alternative to electoral bond scheme should be found: Shah

Home Minister Amit Shah believes the influence of black money will increase during the ongoing Lok Sabha elections following the Supreme Court's decision to scrap the electoral bond scheme, and suggested all stakeholders will have to deliberate and decide on an alternative.

If the impact of black money rises, then an alternative should be found, he said, adding that it is for Parliament to debate and decide on any other mechanism for funding to political

He told PTI in an interview on Saturday that the electoral bond scheme, which allowed donors to fund political parties anonymously by purchasing bonds from the SBI, was scrapped at a crucial time. The Supreme Court had struck down the scheme in February, a month before the Lok Sabha elections were

announced. Replying to a question on the issue, he said, "I believe and this is my guess that it will increase the influence of black money in elections and poli-



tics. When political parties submit their account for this fiscal year, then how much money is by cash donation and how much is through cheque will be known. The donation figure by cheques had reached 96 per cent at the time of the bond."

He added, "Now you will know. If the impact of black money rises, then an alternative should be found. There should be a debate in

The petition filed by advocate Shailendra Mani Tripathi also sought direction to the state bar councils to determine the "months of prevailing summer" for each state in order to exempt the wearing of the black coat and gown for those months.

It has sought a direction to the state bar councils to amend their rules and decide the time period when the lawyers would be exempted from wearing black coats and gowns depending upon the summer peaks in the particular state.

The plea has requested the top court to consider relaxing the traditional dress code for

the advocates across the states considering that the same may cause hardships and health issues in the extremity of the growing summer heat.

Wearing coats during torrid summer makes it difficult for the lawyers to move from one court to another, it said.

The top court in 2022 had refused to entertain a plea seeking exemption for lawyers from wearing black coats and gowns in the apex court as well as the high courts across the country during summer.

The apex court had said it cannot entertain the plea under Article 32 and asked the petitioner to approach the Bar Council of India (BCI) with his grievance.

Experts stress need for separate registry for AYUSH hospitals

Professor Bejon Kumar Misra, chairman of the Core Group of Experts for Insurance, Union Ministry of Ayush, on Monday stressed the need for a separate registry for Ayush hospitals even as he recommended promoting Ayush Healthcare Organisation (HCO) empanelment and adopting Ministry of Ayush-approved Standard Treatment Guidelines (STGs) and ICD-TM2 codes.

He was sharing his views at the sensitisation programme at the All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) in the national capital, aiming to integrate Ayush treatments into mainstream health insurance schemes effectively.

The initiative was prompted by the recent directives from the Insurance Regulatory Development Authority (IRDAI) to include Ayush treatments under

health insurance cover starting

from April 1, 2024. The aim was to foster a deeper understanding and collaboration between Ayush hospitals, healthcare providers, and insurance sector stakeholders, ultimately ensuring affordable and accessible Ayush healthcare for all citizens. However, intriguingly while the

government and private insurers are being encouraged to integrate ayurveda in their plans, the Centre is yet to include Ayush interventions in its flagship Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Aarogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY). Sources said that efforts by the Ministry of Ayush and the National Health Authority (NHA) are still on.

Deputy Director General (Ayush) Dr. A. Raghu emphasized the need for a flat rate design for Ayush treatments, considering longer stays and categorization based on disease and patient strength, as well as the establishment of three levels of medical management for each disease.

Up in flames

Ten fatalities in overnight Delhi fires reflect poorly on CM Kejriwal, who is busy campaigning

tragedy of the highest order and an act of unpardonable negligence by civic authorities: Two blazes in Delhi have claimed 10 lives in separate incidents. A fire broke Nout late on Saturday at a children's hospital in East Delhi, resulting in the death of seven babies. The other incident, in the same district, occurred in the early hours of Sunday when three persons were killed in a fire that engulfed a residential building. The hospital fire which burnt seven infants alive is a horrible incident. The Capital, grappling with these tragedies, finds itself in grief and introspection. The Delhi incidents come on the heels of another inferno in Gujarat, where 27 children were charred to death in a gaming arcade. It is summer when, understandably, Delhi is more prone to fire incidents. Before the blame game starts and accountability fixed, someone in the Delhi Government must own moral responsibility and strict action should be taken against those who played with human lives. Prima facie it is a case of utter negligence as oxy-



gen cylinders stored on the ground floor burst open, though the fire may have been triggered by a short circuit incident. Safety protocols exist only on paper and the authorities concerned look the other way when it comes to complying with the norms. Often, fire protocols that mandate safety measures are flouted at will, including fire drills which never happen. In a particularly devastating case, an entire family perished due to a fire caused by an electrical short circuit. Firefighters, despite their best efforts, face significant challenges due to narrow approach lanes and inadequate water supply in certain areas. These tragic incidents have sparked a public outcry

for improved fire safety regulations and more robust enforcement of existing laws. Amidst this sorrow and anger, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's absence has not gone unnoticed. Currently out on interim bail and engrossed in election campaigns in Punjab, his stance that he can manage Delhi's affairs from within jail has become a contentious issue. This claim, though technically plausible with today's technology, seems detached from ground realities that demand immediate and hands-on governance. The Chief Minister's current focus on electioneering in another State raises legitimate concerns about where his priorities lie and whether he can adequately address the urgent needs of Delhi while physically away from home and office. Indeed, the responsibility for these tragic incidents is multifaceted. On the one hand, the immediate causes point to systemic issues; on the other, the wider accountability lies with the city's administration and leadership. But whether it is the Ghatkopar tragedy, the gaming arcade fire or the Delhi blaze, we learn nothing from these incidents. After the initial hue and cry, everything is normalised and life goes on. It is time we at least ensure proper fire audits of at least hospitals and schools and do not put children's lives at risk. Hope our activist Chief Minister will take action and things will improve in the Capital before it is too late.

Buddhist influence on Tagore's work



Gurudev drew heavily from Buddha's teachings on non-violence and respect for all life, which resonate deeply in a world starved for peace, offering tranquillity

he relevance of Buddha's teachings in the contemporary world is profound. His principles of non-violence and compassion offer a path toward greater harmony in a world often plagued by conflict. The Buddha's teachings also emphasise respect for all forms of life and interdependence, principles crucial for addressing today's environmental challenges. Embracing these values fosters sustainable practices and a deeper connection with nature. Ethical living, as outlined in the Buddha's Eightfold Path, remains pertinent in personal, professional and societal contexts, promoting integrity and cooperation.

Practitioners of this philosophy such as the Vietnamese Zen Master Thich Nhat Hanh, alias Thay have advanced the principles of non-violence, compassion and mindfulness to promote global peace. Their "Engaged Buddhism" encourages integrating mindfulness into everyday life and social activism, advocating for peaceful conflict resolution and environmental care. His teachings on deep listening and loving speech, help bridge divides and heal communities. Similarly, the Tibetan spiritual leader, the Dalai Lama promotes interfaith dialogue, compassion and ethical responsibility, inspiring global movements for human rights and sustainability. These leaders illustrate how ancient Buddhist principles can address modern challenges, fostering a culture of peace and understanding world-

Nobel Laureate Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore drew inspiration from Buddhism, which can be seen in his work. His vision of universal humanism aligns with the Buddha's teachings of compassion and loving-kindness. Tagore's works often reflect themes of inner peace and selfrealization, akin to Buddhist concepts. His holistic approach to education also emphasised the development of the whole person and mirrored the Buddhist focus on the cultivation of wisdom. Buddha's teachings emphasise ment, symbolising the triinclusivity, compassion and the inherent potential for enlighten-

social status. He rejected the caste system, asserting the importance of ethical behaviour over birthright. British Historian and author Karen Armstrong notes that Buddha challenged the social and religious norms of his time by not endorsing the caste system. Even Buddha's monastic community, the 'Sangha', welcomed individuals from all backgrounds, promoting spiritual equality and inclusiveness. In one of his plays

"Chandalika," Tagore articulates the notion of oneness through the character of Prakriti, a woman from the untouchable caste and Ananda, a revered Buddhist monk. Drawing inspiration from Buddhist scriptures, Tagore reimagines the narrative to explore the enduring struggle against societal divides, particularly the historical plight of untouchables in ancient India. Ananda's humble acceptance of water from Prakriti poignantly rejects caste prejudice and acknowledges her intrinsic dignity. Despite Prakriti's attempt to ensnare Ananda with a spell in a desperate bid for affection, his unwavering faith in Buddha's teachings serves as a beacon of purity. Divine intervention ultimately frees Ananda from the enchant umph of spiritual integrity over worldly desires - which is ment in everyone, regardless of one of the characteristics of

beings, advocating for empathy and support within the community, especially towards those who are suffering or marginalised.

His First Noble Truth, addressing 'dukkha' (suffering), underscored the universal human experience of suffering, fostering a shared commitment to alleviating it for everyone. To this, Thich Nhat Hanh reflects, "Understanding suffering gives rise to compassion and from compassion, understanding deepens" (The Heart of the Buddha's Teaching). Buddha's teachings on right livelihood and ethical behaviour promoted social justice and fairness, contributing to a more inclusive and compas-

In Buddhist philosophy, the 'Middle Way' focuses on avoiding extremes and finding balance, a principle reflected in Rabindranath Tagore's works. For example, in his play "The King of the Dark Chamber," ('Raja' in Bengali), Tagore explores the themes of light and darkness and ignorance and enlightenment, mirroring the Buddhist search for harmony. The main character's journey to understand and accept both the light and dark aspects of life represents the Middle Way's emphasis on

Science archives preserve our scientific legacy

Establishing a National Science Archives Centre in India is crucial to safeguarding our scientific heritage for future generations

s an ever-evolving discipline, science continually shapes our understanding of the world and our place within it. Each discovery, innovation and technological advancement contributes to the present and builds the foundation for future generations. Most scientific activity in our laboratories may become part of tomorrow's history. People who have seen and overcome the COVID-19 pandemic may understand the hardships people faced during the pandemic. The innovations and discoveries developed to combat the global pandemic are now part of scientific history. Similar is the case with most of our scientific discoveries and inven-

Scientific knowledge is inherently cumulative. Each generation of scientists builds upon the work of their predecessors, advancing our understanding of complex phenomena. For instance, the development of quantum mechanics in the early 20th century paved the way for modern advancements in computing. Scientific developments also prototype instruments can the evolution of scientific



help in driving the economy and civilisations. We can see the imprint of the scientific strength of our pre-historic period through archaeological pieces of evidence.

Science is a critical component of our cultural and intellectual heritage. It reflects our collective curiosity, ingenuity and drive to understand the world around us. Historical scientific documents, such as Darwin's notes on evolution or Einstein's manuscripts on relativity, are valuable for their scientific content and cultural artefacts that highlight the intellectual milestones of humanity. Preserved scientific materials handled by great scientists serve as invaluable research and educational resources. Original research papers, laboratory notebooks, communications with contemporary

researchers and policymakers,

email communications and

highlight the pain the researchers undertook during that time. It can act as an inspiration for future researchers to move forward. Unfortunately, we dig into the past of a scientist only when their work gets global recognition. By this time, we might have lost all resources related to the discovery except for the research publications available on the public database. Science archives are essential for preserving human knowledge's vast and intricate tapestry. They store various materials, including research notes, correspondence between scientists, experimental data, publications and even artefacts such as laboratory equipment and specimens. This preservation is critical because it ensures that valuable scientific information is not lost over time. For example, the archives of the Royal Society in London contain records dating back to the 17th century, chronicling the early days of modern science. These documents provide insights into the time's experimental techniques and intellectual debates, allowing historians and scientists to trace

thought and practice. In India, the Archives at NCBS (https://archives.ncbs.res.in/) serve as a novel initiative to preserve the scientific history of modern India. The centre has over 250,000 processed objects across 30+ collections in various forms, ranging from paper-based manuscripts to negatives to photographs, books, fine art, audio recordings, scientific equipment, letters and field and lab notes.

The documents stored in volatile electronic or digital storage are susceptible to being permanently erased by a single button press or the malfunction of a hard drive. If these artefacts are not systematically conserved, they will be permanently lost, leading to what has been referred to as the Digital Dark Age. The Government should also make it mandatory for every researcher to periodically submit the documents to archives so that age and memory don't fade the significance of their research work.

GUIDELINES FOR A HEALTHY LIFE

Madam — Apropos the news story "Key takeaways from ICMR's new dietary guidelines," published on May 27, this is my response. The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the National Institute of Nutrition (NIN) have released new dietary guidelines to address the significant burden of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in India. With 56.4 per cent of diseases linked to poor dietary habits, these guidelines aim to promote healthier eating and lifestyle choices. The recommendations emphasise a balanced diet incorporating a variety of food groups, with a focus on whole grains, millets and natural protein sources. Limiting fat intake to 30 per cent of daily calories and including fresh vegetables and fruits in every meal are also crucial.

In addition to dietary changes, the guidelines highlight the importance of regular physical activity—at least 30-45 minutes for adults and 60 minutes for children. Special advice for pregnant and lactating women includes exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months. For cooking and storage, using air fryers, granite-coated utensils and earthen pots is recommended to maintain nutritional quality and

MITIGATING THE E-WASTE CRISIS

It can be tackled with innovations, regulations and corporate responsibility



oday with the advancements in the field of science and technology, computers and other mobile devices have become such an integral part of everyone's work and personal lives that it is hard to imagine life without them. Not only that, but along with that the problem of e-waste continues to grow every year as consumers frequently upgrade their gadgets leading to the high turnover of electronic devices. E-waste or electronic waste refers to discarded electronic devices and appliances that have reached the end of their useful life or are no longer wanted by their owners. It is one of the significant problems due to its complex composition, rapid generation and the challenges it poses to human health and the environment. Due to the presence of various toxic substances such as lead, mercury and cadmium present in batteries and semiconductors can cause of neurological damage and can even damage the kidneys and bones. Not only this the toxic chemicals released from such wastes can leach into soil, making it infertile and unsafe for

Not only will the soil get contaminated but the other sources of the environment that is water and air will also be affected badly as improper disposition of e-wastes can contaminate the waterbodies thereby affecting the water supplies and aquatic life and; toxic fumes released for extracting valuable metals will contribute to respiratory problems. It is believed that airborne toxins can travel long distances, affecting air quality and human health. Quite often in many developing countries, informal e-waste recycling activity is a significant source of income. Such activities are often unregulated and the workers are exposed to high levels of toxic substances without adequate protection



This exposure can lead to respiratory problems, skin disorders and other severe health issues. The improper disposal and recycling of e-waste contribute to greenhouse gas emissions thereby contributing to environmental degradation and increased carbon footprints. According to the Global E-waste Monitor 2020, the world generated 53.6 million metric tons of e-waste in 2019 and this figure is expected to grow to 74.7 million metric tons by 2030. Only a fraction of this waste is properly recycled, with much ending up in landfills posing significant environmental

Proper recycling of such wastes is the only solution that can help recover valuable materials and reduce the need for new resource extraction and the same is possible only and only when the Government enacts and enforces stringent regulations for e-waste management, including proper collection, recycling and disposal practices such as e-waste collection drives and recycling centres to facilitate proper disposal. Manufacturers should also be held responsible for the entire lifecycle of their products, including take-back programs and recycling initiatives. Investing in advanced recycling technologies can help improve the efficiency and safety of extracting valuable materials from e-waste. Encouraging the manufacturers to design such products that are easier to recycle, repair and upgrade can reduce e-waste generation. Educating consumers at the same time about the importance of proper e-waste disposal and the available recycling options can reduce improper disposal practices. Establishing international standards for e-waste management can help ensure safe and efficient recycling practices worldwide. Strengthening international regulations to prevent the illegal export of e-waste to developing countries where it is often processed unsafely. Remember, from gadgets to green initiatives, every individual living on this planet should recycle their e-waste and pave the way for a cleaner greener tomorrow.

Raisi's legacy endures in Iran, despite West



Over three million mourners gather in Mashhad to honour the late President Raisi. The hold of hardliners in the country is much stronger than the West might think

ver three million Iranians have gathered in Mashhad, Iran's second-largest city, to honour the late President Raisi, who tragically perished in a heli-copter crash along with eight others. The massive turnout, which filled the streets to capacity, reflects the deep respect and admiration many citizens held for Raisi, contradicting assertions by Washington that he was widely despised. Raisi's interment at the holy shrine of Imam Reza, a significant and unprecedented honour for a political leader, accentuates his esteemed status in the country. This unprecedented event defies the distorted and often misunderstood sentiments of the Iranian populace towards their leaders. Often, those who are demarcating the enemies, forcing others to accept their version of the story as gospel truth, are met with a ground reality that tells us the exact

The circumstances of the incident, however, have fuelled a wave of conspiracy theories. Moments after the crash, US Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer declared there was no evidence of foul play, citing intelligence officials, despite Iran's rescue teams not yet having reached the crash site. Subsequently, some blame the secret organisation of Iran's arch-enemy State, Israel's Mossad. Others speculate that the death was the result of an inside job. However, this tragedy marked a significant event not only in Iranian politics but in the constantly growing West versus Rest dynamic, which is now more strongly questioning the partiality of international organisations while strengthening the established strong alternatives such as BRICS and the New Development Bank. Iran is playing a pivotal role in this.

Meanwhile, a segment of Western media recently published a series of stories about the helicopter crash suggesting that American sanctions have severely hindered Iran's ability to maintain its fleet of American-manufactured helicopters. It was suggested that a technical failure caused the crash, but so far there's no evidence to support this. The helicopter was one of three Bell 214 models; the other two returned safely, but President Raisi's did not. An Iranian defence firm, under the Iranian Aviation Industries Organisation (IAIO), specialises in maintaining and reverse-engineering US-model helicopters for Iran's military and the IRGC. Added to the US Department of the Treasury's SDN list in January 2018, its assets under US jurisdiction are frozen and transactions with US parties are prohibited under Executive Order 13382, targeting WMD proliferators. However, contrary to suggestions that Raisi's helicopter was overloaded and that this put undue strain on its engines, the aircraft was not operating beyond its capacity. The helicopter was carrying nine passengers and crew combined, well within its maximum capacity of 15 persons. The notion that the helicopter's age contributed significantly to the crash is also questionable. While the media has painted the Bell 214 as ancient, in reality, it was built in 1994 by Bell Helicopter Textron in Canada. With a global average age for commercial helicopters at around 23 years, Raisi's helicopter, though slightly older, was not exceptionally outdated. Moreover, helicopters used for presidential transport typically receive meticulous maintenance.

As Stephen D. Bryen, a leading expert on technology security who led the Pentagon's technology policy efforts during the Reagan

administration, pointed out, the engines of Raisi's helicopter, Pratt and Whitney PT6Ts, are also Canadian-made and widely regarded for their reliability. The implication that the helicopter's maintenance was compromised due to sanctions lacks substantiation, especially considering the high-profile nature of the passengers. The critical question of whether Canada currently supplies spare parts to Iran remains unclear, adding another layer of complexity to the narrative. Nonetheless, the assertions of technical failure due to sanctions remain speculative without concrete evidence and the focus should be on a thorough and unbiased investigation into the actual causes of the

President Raisi was focused on cooling down border tensions and extending his diplomatic outreach to neighbouring Arab countries. His chosen Foreign Minister, Amir-Abdollahian, who also passed away with him, was instrumental in reengineering Iranian foreign policy. A notable example of this effort was the steps taken to normalise Iran-Saudi Arabia diplomatic relations. This Chinese-backed diplomatic initiative is crucial for reshaping the West Asian diplomatic terrain. Similarly, the recent irrigation project constructed across the Aras River, which Raisi jointly inaugurated with his counterpart in Baku, is a demonstration of this new diplomatic approach.

The Aras River, spanning 1,072 km, originates in Eastern Turkey and flows along several borders: Turkey and Armenia, Turkey and Azerbaijan, Iran and Azerbaijan and through Azerbaijan into the Kura River. This region, a small riverine area in the Caucasus between the Black Sea and the Caspian Sea, has witnessed numerous tragedies, including the often-overlooked Armenian Genocide, which claimed around 1.5 million lives. The 689 km Iran-Azerbaijan border, demarcated by the Aras River, highlights the geopolitical sensitivity and strategic importance of this area. After the Soviet Union's collapse in 1991, Azerbaijan gained indepen-

Nagorno-Karabakh War saw Azerbaijan seize full control of the western border with Iran, heightening tensions. Relations between Iran and Azerbaijan slightly improved under President Hassan Rouhani, but Baku never hesitated to provide Israel with a strategic opportunity. Israel strengthened its alliance with Azerbaijan, turning it into a significant market for advanced weaponry. The 2020 conflict between Armenia and Azerbaijan over Nagorno-Karabakh resulted in approximately 5,700 deaths, with Israel supplying a significant portion of Azerbaijan's arms, highlighting the deepening strategic ties between the two nations. As a result, Azerbaijan was able to absorb the Artsakh Republic, also known as Nagorno-Karabakh, a self-proclaimed republic dissolved in January this year.

In exchange for Israeli weapons, Azerbaijan provided oil. Ilham Aliyev, president since 2003, was reelected for a fifth term on February 7 with over 92 per cent of the vote. Aliyev, who succeeded his father, Heydar Aliyev, a former Soviet KGB officer, has strengthened Azerbaijan's ties with Israel. Alivev amended the constitution in 2009 to permit unlimited presidential terms and, in 2016, extended the presidential term from five to seven vears. Azerbaijan can be seen as a family-run State prioritising clan interests, yet Aliyev has skilfully navigated relations with Eastern and Western powers to serve his political aims. It is not hyperbole to say Aliyev is a skilled Machiavellian politician in contemporary politics. An investigation by Israeli media outlet Haaretz published recently detailed the strategic relationship between Israel and Azerbaijan, through which Tel Aviv has supplied Baku with billions of dollars worth of weapons in exchange for "oil and access to Iran."

This extensive military cooperation underscores the depth of the strategic alliance between the two nations. Azerbaijan has reportedly permitted Israel's Mossad intelligence agency to establish a presence in the dence and assumed control of part country to monitor Iran, its southof the Iran-Soviet border, leading to ern neighbour. Additionally,

Azerbaijan has facilitated the setup of an airfield for Israel to potentially strike Iranian nuclear facilities from its territory. In exchange, Azerbaijan receives the most advanced weapons, including ballistic missiles, air defence systems and kamikaze drones. However, as Yossi Melman, a noted Israeli writer and journalist who is an expert on intelligence and strategic affairs, affirmed, it is unlikely for Israel, particularly Mossad, to be involved in such an assassination as it never targets such individuals. But one should not forget that it was under President Raisi that Iran launched its first-ever direct attack on Israel, the single largest drone attack ever carried out by any country.

left a legacy far greater than what they achieved while in power. Their deaths are more impactful than the assassination of President Mohammad Ali Rajaei and Prime Minister Mohammad Javad Bahonar, who were cut short in an explosion set by the Mojahedin-e Khalq Organisation, in August 1981. Despite expectations of seclusion and controversy, Raisi navigated international relations adeptly, maintaining uranium enrichment and escalating tensions with the West, but also restoring ties with Saudi Arabia, which advanced talks in Yemen and prevented military escalation.

President Raisi and his top diplomat

This diplomatic success, seen as strategic pragmatism, opened dialogue with other regional powers and reduced tensions. Raisi revived the Chabahar port deal with India, defying US sanctions and facilitated a major prisoner exchange with the US, demonstrating diplomatic flexibility. Though Iran was blamed for supporting Hamas in the October 2023 attacks on Israel, no concrete evidence linked Iran directly, yet its backing of such groups has increased its regional influence and garnered support for Palestinians from other Arab countries. Iran lost two great politicians, but it is hard to assume it will change the Iranian political structure rather it will be strengthened.

The day is not far off when all the Government-run hospitals in Kerala will spot the hoarding "Patients, enter at your own risk". This is not an exaggerated Statement as botched-up surgeries and wrong diagnoses have become the hallmarks of State-run hospitals.

Recently, a four-year-old girl was admitted to Government Medical College Hospital in Kozhikode for the removal of her sixth finger. However, the doctor who performed the surgery operated on her tongue while leaving the finger untouched. Though her parents alerted the hospital authorities, the initial reaction was denial of the faux pas by the latter. Remember, the Kozhikode Medical College

The minister, a former newsreader in a private TV channel who made a lateral entry into the CPI(M) is yet to take any action on the incident while Harshinia is staging a sitin in front of the medical college hospital demanding solatium. The standard reply given by the Department of Health is that it was an isolated incident that is being blown out of proportion by vested interests.

In yet another shocking incident, a patient admitted to the ICU post-surgery was raped and molested by a hospital employee who is a trade union leader affiliated with the CPI(M). The nursing officer who reported the matter to the

higher authorities was shunted out to a far-off hospital while the rapist is walking free in search of his next victim. health care. The authenticity of the Kerala Model of Development and Health Care has come down like a pack of cards. According to senior doctors who have been in Government service for more than three decades, the ruling CPI(M) itself is behind the collapse of Kerala's health sector. 'Israeli airstrikes kill 35 in Rafah'

Palestinian health workers said Israeli airstrikes have killed at least 35 people and hit tents for displaced people in the southern Gaza city of Rafah, and "numerous" others were trapped in flaming debris. Gaza's Health Ministry said women and children made up most of the dead and dozens of wounded.

The attacks came on Sunday, two days after the International Court of Justice ordered Israel to end its military offensive in Rafah. where more than half of Gaza's population had sought shelter before Israel's incursion earlier this month. Tens of thousands of people remain in the area while many others have

Footage from the scene of the largest airstrike showed heavy destruction. Israel's army confirmed the strike and said it hit a Hamas installation and killed two senior Hamas militants. It said it was investigating reports that civilians were harmed. Defence Minister Yoav Gallant was in Rafah on Sunday and was briefed on the "deepening of operations" there, his office

A spokesperson with the Palestinian Red Crescent Society said the death toll was likely to rise as search and rescue efforts continued in Rafah's Tal al-Sultan neighbourhood about two kilometres northwest of the city centre.

The society asserted that the location had been designated by Israel as a "humanitarian area" The neighbourhood is not included in areas that Israel's military ordered evacuated earlier this month.

The airstrike was reported hours after Hamas fired a barrage of rockets from Gaza that set off air raid sirens as far away as Tel Aviv for the first time in months in a show of resilience more than seven months into Israel's massive air, sea and ground offensive.

There were no reports of casualties in what appeared to be the first long-range rocket attack from Gaza since January. Hamas' military wing claimed

responsibility. Israel's military said eight projectiles crossed into Israel after being launched from Rafah and "a number" were intercepted, and the launcher was destroyed.

Earlier Sunday, dozens of aid trucks entered Gaza from southern Israel under a new agreement to bypass the Rafah crossing with Egypt after Israeli forces seized the Palestinian side of it earlier this month. Israel's military said 126 aid trucks entered via the nearby Kerem Shalom crossing. But it was not immediately

clear if humanitarian groups could access the aid — including medical supplies — because of fighting. The crossing has been largely inaccessible because of Israel's offensive in Rafah. United Nations agencies say it is usually too dangerous to retrieve the aid.

The World Health Organization last week said an expanded Israeli incursion in Rafah would have "disastrous" impact.

'With the humanitarian operation near collapse, the secretary-general emphasizes that the Israeli authorities must facilitate the safe pickup and delivery of humanitarian supplies from Egypt entering Kerem Shalom," the spokesperson for UN chief Antonio Guterres said in a statement.

Egypt refuses to reopen its side of the Rafah crossing until control of the Gaza side is handed back to Palestinians. It agreed to temporarily divert traffic through Kerem Shalom, Gaza's main cargo terminal, after a call between US President Joe Biden and Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sissi. The war between Israel and

Hamas has killed nearly 36,000

Palestinians, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between civilians and fighters in its count. Israel blames civilian deaths on Hamas because the militants operate in dense, residential areas. Around 80% of Gaza's 2.3 million people have fled their homes, severe hunger is widespread and U.N. officials say parts of the territory are experiencing famine.

Bint Jbeil (Lebanon) (AP): An Israeli strike targeting a motorcycle in southern Lebanon on Monday hit next to a hospital entrance, killing at least one person and wounding several civilians who were gathered outside, local health officials said The strike killed the motorcycle driver in the town of Bint Ibeil It was not immediately clear who the driver was. The Israeli army did not immediately give a statement on the strike but said it had targeted other areas of southern Lebanon in response to "terror ist launches." The Lebanese militant group Hezbollah has been exchanging strikes with Israeli forces in the border area almost daily since Oct 8, a day after the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza began Mohammed Suleiman, director of the Salah Ghandour Hospital in Bint Jbeil, said they had received one person killed and nine wounded in the strike, most of whom were "civilians who were in front of the hospital, where family members and people accompanying the patients usually gather".

Two of the wounded were in "highly sensitive" condition, he said. The strike also caused minor damage to the hospital, an Associated Press photographer at the scene said.

Israeli strikes have killed more than 400 people in Lebanon since the war in Gaza began, most of them militants with Hezbollah and allied groups but also including more than 70 civilians and non-combatants. On the Israeli side, strikes from Lebanon have killed 15 soldiers and 10 civilians. The clashes have displaced tens of thousands on each side of the border. Western countries, in particular the US and France, have come forward with a series of proposals for a cessation of hostilities on the Lebanon-Israel border. Hezbollah has refused to enter into an agreement until a ceasefire is implemented in Gaza Initially, the proposals stipulated that Hezbollah would move its forces several kilometers away from the border, but a French diplomatic official said the latest proposal has abandoned this idea as Hezbollah would not agree to it unless Israel also halted its overflights in Lebanese air-

British opposition leader Keir Starmer made his first major speech of the UK election campaign Monday, telling undecided voters that they can trust his Labour Party to safeguard the country's economy, borders and security. Starmer is the favourite to win the July 4 election, with polls giving Labour a doubledigit lead over the governing Conservatives under Prime Minister Rishi Sunak.

North Korea announced plans to launch a rocket apparently carrying its second military spy satellite during an eight-day period starting rebukes from neighbours South

Korea and Japan The notification of the planned launch, banned under UN resolutions, came as South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida met Chinese Premier Li Qiang in Seoul for their first trilateral meeting in more than four years. Japan's coast guard said it was notified by North Korea about its planned launch of a "satellite rocket", with a warning of caution in the waters between the Korean Peninsula and China and east of the main Philippine island of Luzon beginning Monday through midnight June 3.

North Korea provides Japan with its launch information because Japan's coast guard coordinates and distributes

maritime safety information in East Asia. North Korea's planned launch is thought to be an attempt to put its second military spy satellite into orbit. South Korea's military said Friday it detected signs of suslaunch a spy satellite at North Korea's main Tongchangri launch facility in the northwest. The UN bans North Korea from conducting any satellite launches, viewing them as covers for testing long-range missile technology. North Korea has steadfastly maintained it has the right to launch satellites and test missiles. It says spy satellites will allow it to better monitor the US and South Korea's moves and enhance the precision strike capability of its nuclearcapable missiles. "Any launch (by North Korea) using ballistic missile technology would directly violate UN Security Council resolutions and undermine peace and security of the region and the world," Yoon said at the start of the meeting with Kishida and Li. "If North

Korea presses ahead with its launch despite the international warning, I think the international community must sternly deal with it." Kishida said he strongly urges North Korea to cancel the launch. China is a n't mention the North Korean satellite.In phone talks earlier Monday, senior diplomats from Japan, South Korea and the United States agreed to call on North Korea to abandon the launch. South Korea's Unification Ministry, which deals with North Korea, separately called a satellite launch by the North "a provocation that seriously threatens our and security".Later South Korea regional Monday, mobilised 20 fighter jets for a drill meant to demonstrate its resolve to punish North Korea in the event of provocation, according to South Korea's military. Japanese officials said their missile interceptors remain ready to shoot down any debris from a North

Japanese territory. Last November, North Korea sent its first military reconnaissance satellite into orbit as part of efforts to build a space-based surveillance network to cope with what it calls increasing US-led military threats Korean leader Kim Jong Un later told a governing party meeting that the country would launch three additional military spy satellites in 2024. Whether the North Korean satellites can produce militarily meaningful imagery is widely doubted, but some civilian experts say operating several satellites could help North Korea continuously monitor big enemy targets. The latest launch notification to Japan identifies the same danger zones for potential rocket debris as those identified prior to North Korea's last launch. That suggests North Korea would use the same first and second rocket stages as before, said Chang Young-keun, a missile expert at the Seoul-based Korea Research Institute for National Strategy

Tornadoes rip through Texas, Oklahoma at least 15 dead

t least 15 people, including Atwo kids, have died as powerful storms ravaged the states of Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas in the central US, destroying homes and plunging thousands into darkness amid rising temperatures over the Memorial Day weekend.

Seven fatalities were reported in Cooke County, Texas, near the Oklahoma border, where a tornado Saturday night ripped through a rural area near a mobile home park, officials said. Storms also caused damage in

Oklahoma, where guests at an outdoor wedding were injured. "It's just a trail of debris left. The devastation is pretty severe," Cooke County Sheriff Ray Sappington said.

The dead included two children, aged 2 and 5, and three members of a family, the sheriff said. A tornado tore apart houses and businesses, flipped

mobile homes and knocked down trees and power lines. Areas near the community of Valley View were especially

Sappington said 60 to 80 peowere injured at a truck stop called the AP Travel Center on Interstate 35. Many had rushed there to take shelter. Semitrailers were overturned

further to the south in the neighbouring Denton County, closer to Dallas. Multiple people were taken to hospitals, some by helicopter, but the full extent of their injuries was not immediately known. More than 4,70,000 people

were without power_in states stretching from Texas to Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas, Tennessee and Kentucky, according to a power outage website. Hugo Parra, who lives in Farmers Branch, north of Dallas, said he rode out the storm with about 40 to 50 people in the bathroom of a gas station. "A firefighter came to

Georgian parl rejects veto of 'foreign agents' law

Georgian parliament com-Amittee on Monday rejected the president's veto of the "foreign agents" legislation that has sparked massive protests for weeks. The move by the parliament's judiciary committee sets up the possibility of a vote of the full legislature on Tuesday to override President Salome Zourabichvili's veto of the measure, which she and other critics say will restrict media freedom and obstruct Georgia's chances of joining the European Union. The law would require news media and non-governmental organisations that get more than 20 per cent of their budget from abroad to register as "carrying out the interests of a foreign power". Opponents denounce it as "the Russian law" because it resembles measures pushed

through by the Kremlin. Zourabichvili vetoed the law on May 18 after it was passed in parliament by deputies from the governing Georgian Dream party and its allies. That bloc

Spain's King Felipe VI met Zelenskyy at the capital's Barajas airport. The Ukrainian leader was due to hold talks with Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez about what local media reported is a planned 1.1 billion euros (\$1.2 billion) agreement for Spain to supply Ukraine with more weapons. Zelenskyy had been due to visit Spain earlier this month but he postponed all his foreign trips after the Kremlin's forces launched a cross-border offensive in the northeastern Kharkiv region and left

Ukrainian troops reeling. That push has further strained Ukraine's already depleted army, which in recent months has been fighting Russia's intense drive deeper into the partially occupied eastern

The government says Poland, which supports neighbouring Ukraine in its defence against Russia's aggression, is being targeted by hostile actions from Russia and Belarus. They include cyberattacks, attempted arson and migrants being pushed illegally across the border, which officials describe as intended to destabilise the European Union, of which Poland is a member. The government is also making preparations in the case of a military attack, while stressing the primary role of deterrence. The government of Prime Minister Donald Tusk has planned a range of security measures including in cyberspace, as

well as a more than USD 2.5 billion investment in strengthening surveillance, deterrence and defence along the eastern border, a system known as Shield-East that is to be completed in 2028. The shield will include "all kinds of fortifications, barriers, monitoring of the air space on every level and upgrading the existing systems," and will be integrated with the defence system across the country, Kosiniak-Kamysz said.He stressed it was the biggest program to strengthen NATO's eastern flank since 1945, when World War II ended.

PML-N and PPP invite Imran Khan's party to 'meaningful' talks

Lahore (PTI): The ruling coalition of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) has invited jailed former prime minister Imran Khans Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party to abandon its street protests and engage in "meaningful" dialogue with the government, a media report said on Monday.

Senate Chairman Yousuf Raza Gilani and Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal emphasised the government's openness to talks but stressed that the beleaguered party of Khan must decide with whom it wants to negotiate, The Express Tribune newspaper reported. Gilani, speaking to the media in Lahore, reiterated the government's willingness to negotiate. However, the former prime minister said Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) "seems intent on negotiating with someone else".

The 71-year-old veteran PPP politician said Imran Khan's party wants to carve its path by confronting the establishment and the government in court.

"(Our) doors are open for meaningful talks but the PTI will have to decide with whom they want to negotiate," Gilani said. The actcountry currently suffers from instability and therefore all political leaders must come on the

same page. Gilani said during their time in opposition under the PTI-led government, they were willing to engage in political talks, despite the PTI's reluctance to do so, the newspaper quoted him as saying. Replying to another question, Gilani emphasised that the PPP remains committed to supporting the current government.

The PPP has never indicated that it is not part of the government; we are aligned with the government in all matters," Gilani said. The former prime minister said consultations within the party are underway regarding joining the cabinet at both the Centre and in Punjab. Meanwhile, Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal said that the government's doors were open to all parties for purposeful and meaningful negotiations.

Iqbal said the PTI was the ruling party in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa province and they should serve the people there. "I advise the PTI leadership to shun streets (protests) and enter the (parliamentary) houses," he added.

23 militants, 7 soldiers killed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa clashes

t least 23 militants affiliat-Aed with the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) were killed and seven Pakistani soldiers died in three separate clashes since Sunday in the troubled north-western province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the army said on Monday. According to a statement issued by the media wing of the Pakistan Army, the fighting took place on Sunday and Monday as the security forces increased pressure on the rebels affiliated with the TTP, which has been allegedly operating out of Afghanistan. "Twentythree terrorists were sent to hell by the security forces in three séparate operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province," the army said.

The army stated that an intelligence-based operation was conducted on Sunday in the Hassan Khel area near Peshawar in which six terrorists were successfully neu-tralised by the security forces and multiple hideouts were busted. However, an officer



In another operation conducted in the Tank district of the province on Monday, Pakistan troops effectively engaged the terrorists' location, as a result of which ten terrorists were killed.

The third clash occurred in the Bagh area of Khyber district, wherein the security forces killed seven terrorists while two were injured. However, during the intense exchange of fire, five soldiers were killed.

"A large quantity of weapons, ammunition and explosives was also recovered from the killed terrorists, who remained and a soldier were killed in the actively involved in numerous

China on Monday voiced its support for Pakistan's investigation into the recent suicide attack targeting Chinese personnel at a hydroelectric dam in that country but refrained from holding Afghanistan's Taliban interim government responsi-ble for sheltering the militants, as alleged by Islamabad. Five Chinese engineers and their Pakistani driver were killed when an explosives-packed vehicle rammed into their bus in the troubled province of Khvher Pakhtunkhwa in March, in the second suicide attack on the personnel working on the China-backed hydropower project since 2021.The Chinese were working on the Dasu hydropower project, which is about 300 km to the north of Islamabad. The 4,320 MW project is being constructed Gezhouba with funding from the World Bank. "China attaches great importance to the important progress made by the Pakistani side on the investigation of the terrorist attack," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning told a media briefing here. She was responding to a question about Pakistan's Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi press conference on Sunday during which he asked Afghanistan's Taliban government to hand over the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) terrorists allegedly involved in the attack on Chinese workers.

Naqvi alleged that the attack was planned in Afghanistan and executed with the help of handlers and facilitators based in Pakistan.

Whether Afghanistan tries the terrorists (in the court of law) or not, it should hand over the militants to Pakistan," he had said. 7 die, 15 mn without power as cyclone Remal batters B'desh

Dhaka (PTI): At least seven people were killed and millions were left without power as Severe Cyclone 'Remal' lashed the coasts of Bangladesh with devastating winds of up to 120 kph and storm surges, inundating hundreds of villages. 'Remal' weakened into a cyclonic storm on Monday morning, sustaining wind speeds of 80-90 kilometres per hour, following landfall around midnight of Sunday, the

Met Department said. The department said that the weather system, which lay 150 km northeast of Sagar Island at 5.30 am, brought torrential rain and moved northeastwards to weaken further into a cyclonic

Remal is the first cyclone in the Bay of Bengal ahead of this year's monsoon season, which runs from June to September. The cyclone was named Remal (meaning sand in Arabic) by Oman, according to a system of naming cyclones in the Indian Ocean region.

The cyclone has been accompanied by gusty winds and heavy rains, impacting areas including Barisal, Bhola, Patuakhali, Satkhira, and Chattogram.

In Patuakhali, one person was washed away by a storm surge while returning home to bring his sister and aunt to a shelter. Another person died in Satkhira after falling as he ran for cover during the storm.

Five people were killed in Barishal, Bhola and Chattogram, Dhaka-based Somoy TV reportIn Mongla, a trawler sank, leaving two people, including a child, missing.

The rural power authority has cut off electricity to 15 million people in coastal areas to minimise the damage from 'Remal', BD News reported.

The power outages have lasted over 12 hours in some areas, but electricity workers are preparing to restore the connections once the storm subsides.

Biswanath Sikder, chief engineer (planning and operation) of the Bangladesh Rural Electrification Board, said the storm was still ongoing as of 9:45 am in the coastal areas.

He estimated that a total of about 15 million people in the affected areas were without

According to the Met Office, Cyclone Remal has moved northward, crossing the coast and is currently positioned near Koira in Khulna.

The cyclone is expected to continue its northward trajectory, bringing increased rainfall and weakening to a lower intensity within the next 2-3 hours, the Met Department of Bangladesh said in a special bulletin at 3:30 am on Monday.

'Remal' sustained wind speeds of 80-90 kilometres per hour, following landfall around midnight of Sunday, the Indian Met Department said.

Heavy to very heavy rainfall with wind gusts on Monday morning braced most of Bangladesh under the influence of the storm. Despite accurate forecasts and

increased public awareness, weak embankments failed to withstand the cyclone's force, inundating many villages. Coastal areas experienced waves as high as 5 to 6 feet, exacerbating the destruction, according to the Met Office.

The storm on Sunday forced authorities to close the country's three seaports and the airport in the second-largest city Chattogram, BSS News reported. Maritime ports of Payra and Mongla have been advised to keep hoisted great danger signal no 10. As the cyclone progresses, the sea and coastal environments are predicted to gradually calm, although heavy rains and gusty winds persist in Dhaka and

its surrounding areas. Fishing boats and trawlers oper-

ating in the North Bay of Bengal and the deep sea have been advised to remain in a safe harbour until further notice.

Payra and Mongla ports have been instructed to hoist danger signal number 10, indicating severe conditions.

The Meteorological Department has warned that due to the cyclone's intensity and the air pressure difference, coastal districts and their remote islands and chars could face wind-driven tides 8-12 feet above normal. Cyclone-prone Bangladesh designed most schools in coastal regions as cyclone shelters alongside dedicating structures to enable people to take refuge during surges and many of these multi-storey facilities have space for sheltering cattle as well.

Record RBI dividend at 0.6 per cent of GDP may not be sustained: Fitch

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Fitch Ratings on Monday said the record-high dividend transfer by the RBI to the government is equivalent to 0.6 per cent of GDP, and such high level of dividends as a percentage of GDP is unlikely to be maintained.

The board of India's central bank last week decided to transfer a record Rs 2.1 lakh crore dividend to the government out of the profits earned in fiscal 2023-24. This is more than double of Rs 1.02 lakh crore that was budgeted by the government.

Fitch said an important driver of higher RBI profits appears to be higher interest revenue on foreign assets, though the central bank has not yet provided a detailed breakdown.

"The RBI recently announced a record-high dividend transfer to the government equivalent to 0.6 per cent of GDP (Rs 2.1 trillion) from its operations in FY24. This is above the 0.3 per cent of GDP expected in the FY25 budget from February, so will aid the authorities in meeting near-term deficit reduction goals," the rating agency said in a statement.

Fitch said transfers from the Reserve Bank of India to the government can be significant at the margin for fiscal performance but depend on various factors, including the size and performance of assets held on the central bank's balance sheet and India's exchange rate.

Transfers may also be influenced by the RBI's views on what level of a buffer is appropriate to be maintained in balance sheet, it said.

"The potential volatility of transfers means there is significant uncertainty about their medium-term path, and we do not anticipate that dividends as a share of GDP will be sustained at such a

KAL Airways, Kalanithi Maran to seek ₹1,323 crore in damages from SpiceJet

Airways and Kalanithi Maran on Monday said they will seek more than Rs 1,323 crore in damages from SpiceJet and its chief Ajay Singh as well as challenge the recent Delhi High Court order in the ongoing dispute between the

two sides. On May 17, a division bench of the court set aside a single judge bench order that had upheld an arbitral award asking SpiceJet and its promoter Ajay Singh to refund Rs 579 crore plus interest to Maran.

The bench allowed the appeals filed by Singh and SpiceJet challenging the single judge's order, passed on July 31, 2023, and remanded the matter back to

the court concerned to ne petitions the ark: consider the challenging award afresh.

Against this backdrop, Maran and his firm KAL Airways have decided to challenge the ruling after consultation with their legal counsel.

The decree holders — KAL Airways and Maran — "believe that the aforesaid judgement is deeply flawed warrants further scrutiny". "In parallel, they are also seeking damages in excess of Rs 1,323 crore, as determined Consulting LLP, United a globally firm that Kingdom, renowned that specialises in estimation of losses arising out of breach of contractual commitments," KAL Airways said in a



statement on Monday. Further, it said the claim for damages had originally been presented by KAL Airways and Maran before the arbitral

tribunal and "has always remained an integral part of their quest for justice" By pursuing both the challenge to the Delhi High

and equitable resolution to the contentious dispute, the statement said. The dispute arose due to a breach of trust by SpiceJet and has caused "enormous hardship to both KAL Airways and Kalanithi Maran for more than a decade," it added.

According to the statement, they will pursue the execution of the arbitral award, seeking a refund of the pending dues amounting to Rs 353.50 crore. 'This action is also in full compliance with, and supported by, the orders dated February 13, 2023, and July 7, 2023, passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court directing that the award in favour of the decree holders is executed in its entirety," it returned the money.

Court judgement and the claim for damages, the decree holders hope to secure a just said. On May 22, SpiceJet said it will seek a refund of Rs 450 crore out of the total Rs 730 crore paid to the airline's former promoter Maran and KAL Airways following the Delhi High Court ruling.

The case dates back to early 2015, when Singh, who owned the airline earlier, bought it back from Maran after it was grounded for months due to resource crunch.

As part of the agreement, Maran and KAL Airways had claimed to have paid SpiceJet Rs 679 crore for issuing warrants and preference shares. However, Maran approached the Delhi High Court in 2017, alleging SpiceJet had not issued convertible warrants and preference shares

available for Saturday's final in London. The illness surely doesn't help Lunin's chances, though, and many had already expected Ancelotti to go with the more experienced Courtois despite his lack of minutes this season.

FROM SETBACKS TO SUCCESS: SHREYAS IYER'S JOURNEY TO IPL VICTORY

Then Shreyas Iyer recreated Lionel Messi's famous famous Cup celebration after lifting the IPL Trophy as Kolkata Knight Riders captain in Chennai, it was nothing short of an Argentina moment for the embattled Indian cricketer at an individual level. His central contract torn up a few weeks before the IPL besides a recurring back injury threatening to derail him, Iyer faced numerous challenges at the start of the year.

He finally found a deep sense of triumph and vindication in this victory, much like Messi did after exorcising the ghosts of losing the 2014 final and winning the trophy for his country after a 36-year-wait. For the two-time IPL champions, the wait lasted 10 as Iyer redemption song following a topsy-turvy start to the year. Little wonder then that he chose to imitate the man who knows all about rising from setbacks.

So, Iyer, with the trophy in his hands, took a playful walk towards his teammates, quite

similar to what Messi did after the final against France in Doha, and handed the big prize to them.

*I am hearing a lot about Gautam Gambhir, who has created a magnificent culture in the KKR team. But this guy (Iyer), I don't think he is getting enough credit. to Abhishek Sharma came out of Mitchell Starc's hands, it was game over. It was destined to be the best ball of the IPL - an absolute peach at a time when it was so important," Hayden told Star Sports Cricket Live. Former England batter Kevin Pietersen said Starc's ability to

get his wrist position right towards the end of IPL and cranking up extra pace along with Narine's all-round ability

"Mitchell Starc was averaging around 136-137 kmph during the majority of the season. But in the last two weeks he has gone above 140 kmph and that is his average. He is bowling fast," Pietersen said.

"We never saw him swing the ball for the first seven, (or) maybe even eight weeks of this tournament. (But) in the last few weeks, he has got his wrist in a good place and started to swing the ball back," he added. Pietersen was lavish in praise of Narine, saying that the KKR veteran gave his critics a perfect reply.

"I was one of the most vocal



critics at the start of the tournament saying I didn't like Sunil Narine at the top of the order, due to his inconsistency. He would typically hit a six and then get out, disrupting the

"However, this season he has been consistent. He has thought like a batter, batted like a batter and got the runs of a batter. He has averaged more than many batters and his strike rate has been phenomenal. He has played both sides of the wicket exceptionally well."

'We don't need to say much about his bowling - he is an out-and-out superstar. His ability to change his action and still produce such impressive numbers is quite something. He is the heart and soul of this outfit," Pietersen said.

Australia's first match of the tournament proper which is against Oman on June 5.

"It's important to be flexible. Guys who have been at the IPL have been playing a lot of cricket. We prioritised giving them a couple of days at home to see their families, refresh, and play the long game for this tournament," Marsh said. We will get our 15 (all together) eventually, but really important that we give them a break, even if it's just a couple of days at home, that's really

important." According to ICC rules, players taking to the field in the warm-up games must be from the country they are representing.
