"We have a serious bonding with the Gandhi family for generations. We have 'never elected a BJP person as MP. We are keen to accept Rahul but he has to live up to our trust. He can't dump us after being elected from two seats.'

This was the sum and substance of the plea by dozens of impoverished residents of Uttarpara and Kucharia villages at a late

evening meeting on Monday. Bishu Patel, in his early 20s, raised a

query before the elders at the crowded village gathering. "What is the guarantee that Rahul

wouldn't dump us after we elect him?" His pointed question silenced many. After an uncanny silence, a woman spoke up: "We are ready to embrace Rahul but the Congress has to guarantee that he will not embarrass us after winning.

The locals have now decided to summon a responsible Congress person to get some of sort of a guarantee on behalf of the Gandhi family before they take a final call on voting en mass in favour of Rahul.

Voting is scheduled on May 20 in Rae Bareli, which is made up of five



Assembly segments, four of which are held by the Samajwadi Party and one by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The Congress drew blank in Rae Bareli district in the 2022 Assembly elections although Sonia Gandhi was the only Congress contestant to get elected to the Lok Sabha from Rae Bareli

in 2019. Rahul's main challenger Dinesh Pratap Singh, a former Congressman who switched over to the BJP in 2018 and is

now a minister of state (independent charges) in Uttar Pradesh, claims Rahul Gandhi has a chequered history of switching seats and people in Rae Bareli don't take him seriously. "Rahul is struggling in his family bastion Rae Bareli despite he has positioned his hardcore loyalist Bhupesh Baghel to manage the entire election

campaign but people here have immense respect for PM (Narendra) Modi and trust in the BJP," Dinesh told The Pioneer.

Baghel, former Chhattisgarh chief minister, has been stationed in Rae Bareli with his coterie to prepare the ground for Rahul and save the party from any embarrassment on a seat which is classified as the safest seat for Gandhi family in north India.

Locals in Rae Bareli admit that Rahul has initially messed up his entire game plan as he chose Rae Bareli as the second option after Wayanad and at the last minute.

Rahul's decision to take a plunge in electoral battle from Rae Bareli rather than Amethi came as a total surprise for party cadres here because they were

unprepared for the prestigious battle. But one factor which is heavily working in favour of the Congress is the conspicuous absence of BJP's lone MLA (Rae Bareli Sadar) Aditi Singh from the election campaign.

Aditi, once considered closes to the Gandhi family in Rae Bareli, had joined the BJP in 2021 but she has been given huge headaches to the party amid reports that she has issues

with the BJP's pick for Rae Bareli. Reports say that BJP's strategist and home minister Amit Shah has stepped in to mollify the 37-year-old Aditi. She holds considerable clout in her Assembly seat. The BJP has to put its act together if it wants to walk away with the last bastion of the Gandhi family.

USCIS plans extra time for laid off **Indian H-1B workers** PIONEER NEWS SERVICE

NEW DELHI In a possible relief to scores of Indians, laid-off H-1B workers can stay beyond 60 days in the US. This directive by the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

comes amid a slew of layoffs by tech companies in the US, which have impacted thousands of employees, including Indians. The USCIS clarified that laid-

off H-1B visa holders could stay in the US beyond the 60day period.

To remain in the US beyond the grace period, the laid-off H-1B workers can apply for a new employer, change visa status, or adjust their visa status. H-1B non-immigrants can work for a new employer after filing a new H-1B petition. Tech companies like Google, Meta, Apple, Dell Twitter, Amazon, and Microsoft, among many others, have terminated scores of non-immigrant employees

living in the US, including many Indians. There is a general assumption that laid-off staffers have to leave the US within 60 days. However, the USCIS has clarified this in its latest statement. "When nonimmigrant workers are laid off, they may not be aware of their options and, in some cases, may wrongly assume that they have no option but to leave the country within 60 days," stated the USCIS in its latest release. The tech

industry continues to grapple with lay-offs, with news of new job cuts surfacing every month.

INDIA'S FIRST GREENFIELD CITY TAKING SHAPE IN C'GARH

New Delhi based CES Consultant Private Limited's service to plan the new city

At present roughly around Rs 6,500 crore has been expended to develop the city level infrastructure of the Nava Raipur, he said.

It is a role model of new developing smart city like Amravati, which is a de facto capital of Andhra Pradesh.

Situated 17 km South-East of the old urbanite, Nava Raipur's Project area comprises of 41 villages under its jurisdiction which consists of 3 layers of smart city development.

Citing amenities to be developed, the NRANDA official said: "a number of aspects which make it an apt selection over others when concerning a residential area include uninterrupted power supply, completely underground drainage system, 24 hours water supply, and BRTS system which will join Nava Raipur to the old city". medical

"State-of-the-art amenities assuring complete protection and health a service to its residents is also ensured in it", he said.

In an attempt to make Nava Raipur one of the finest smart cities in India, NRANDA opts for Central Business District (CBD) approach. Under this, establishment of a dedicated IT hub is planned and NRANDA aims at inviting all major MNC and IT sectors from around the globe.

A major component of the Capitol Complex at Sector 19 is a huge compound consisting of the Mahanadi Bhawan, the Mantralaya and the Central Secretariat which serves as an administrative edifice of Chhattisgarh state. While its north and south blocks house state headquarters of different headquarters of different departments, the ceremonial axis takes straight to the Vidhan Sabha.

The Authority has emphasized on developing world-class educational infrastructure for the entire state of Chhattisgarh and beyond. Some of the institutions already been set up here are IIIT, IIMT, HMI, IIM and ITM University, National Law University and AIIMS. The fully functional International Cricket Stadium built here has a capacity for 50,000 spectators is the 2nd largest stadium in India and 4th largest in the world.

According to plans, the construction of Raj Bhawan, the State Vidhan Sabha and Residences of ministers are underway in the second phase. These are located close to Capitol Complex.

Bhupesh & Co scared as probe is moving fast in Mahadev case: Arun Sao

Launching a scathing attack on the Bhupesh Baghel government in Chhattisgarh, Deputy Chief Minister Arun Sao said: "Under the patronage of Bhupesh Baghel, the Mahadev betting app spread in the state... have approved 18 lakh residences under the Prime Minister Awas Yojana. We have started Mahtari Vandan Yojana which will benefit 70 lakh mothers and sisters. The work of depositing Rs 1 lakh in their account has started. Three months' amount has gone into their bank accounts. We had talked about buying paddy @ 21 quintals per acre. We have deposited a lump sum amount in the accounts of farmers at the rate of Rs 3,100 per quintal. We had promised to increase the remuneration of tendu leaf workers. That too has been fulfilled. The promise of CBI investigation into the PSC scam has been completed. We had promised to provide darshan of Lord Ram Lala. We are taking people to Ram Lala darshan. Similarly, we had promised that we will make Chhattisgarh particularly Bastar Naxalites free. Our security forces are working with full strength in coordination with the Centre, state government and nearby states.

The aim for the next four and a half years is that Chhattisgarh should become a leading state of the country and bring changes in the lives of the people. Chhattisgarh should become a developed Chhattisgarh. Chhattisgarh has that potential.

But today the people have understood well that Narendra Modi is working on the mantra of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Viswas and Sabka Prayas' The slogan of 'Abki baar, 400

paar' is going to prove true. What is your reaction to Congress' remarks on Ram temple in Ayodhya and Sam Pitroda's remarks?

The Congress and opposition parties are against Lord Ram and Sanatan. The Congress created hurdles in the construction of the Ram temple ... refused to accept the invitation of the consecration ceremony. Now Congress leaders are saying that if our government is formed, they will purify the temple. The hatred they have towards Lord Ram is reflected again and again. That is why this party has now been marginalized and is moving towards decimation.

During the election campaign, Home Minister Amit Shah said that if the BJP comes to power for a third time, Naxalism will be eliminated from Chhattisgarh in two years. What is your plan for this?

Camps are being built continuously and we are carrying out development plans in those areas. Our security forces are working with full force to eliminate Naxalites. Our government is working together with the Center to fulfill what the Home Minister said.

"Diagnosis of uncontrolled hypertension involves careful evaluation of patients' medication regimens, as well as

identification and management contributing factors such as obesity, sleep apnoea,

and secondary causes of hypertension," added Dr Mayur Jain, Consultant -Cardiothoracic Surgeon & Heart and Lung Transplant Surgeon, P. D. Hinduja Hospital & MRC, Mahim, told IANS.

excessive "The pressure on the artery walls caused by high BP can damage blood vessels and body organs. The higher the BP and the longer it goes uncontrolled, the greater the damage it can cause, such as heart attack or stroke, heart failure, kidney problems, etc.," he said.

Importantly, resistant hypertension may, for months and years, show no symptoms but may create a significant health threat. "Because high BP may

not present worrying symptoms, it is often ignored, but I urge everyone never to delay treatment. The long-term repercussions of untreated and uncontrolled hypertension are severe," Dr Refai Showkathali, Senior Interventional

Cardiologist at Apollo Hospitals, told IANS. Dr Anand Pandey

Deeply saddened: Centre condoles Indian UN worker's death in Gaza

India on Wednesday con-doled the death of an Indian who was working with the United Nations (UN) in wartorn Gaza. Colonel Waibhav Anil Kale (retd), a 46-year-old former Indian Army officer, was killed on Monday when the vehicle he was travelling in came under attack in Gaza's Rafah region. The United Nations condoled and expressed apologies to India over the killing.

The killing marks the UN's first international casualty since the Israel-Hamas war began last year. The UN has called for a full investigation into his death while Israel has ordered a separate probe into the attack. In its first official reaction, of External Ministry Affairs(MEA) said it is deeply saddened by Colonel Kale (retd)'s death.

We are deeply saddened by the death of Colonel Waibhav Anil Kale (Retd.), Security Coordination Officer in the Radhika. The United Nations

UN Department of Safety and Security (DSS) in Gaza on 13 May 2024. We extend our heartfelt condolences to his family and dear ones," said a statement.

The Indian permanent mission to the UN in New York and its missions in Tel Aviv and Ramallah are helping in bringing back the retired soldier's body, the ministry said. "Our Permanent Mission to the UN in New York and our Missions in Tel Aviv and Ramallah are extending all assistance in the repatriation of mortal remains to India and continue to be in touch with relevant authorities regarding the investigation into

the incident," it added. Colonel Kale (retd) had taken premature retirement from the Indian Army in 2022 and joined as a Security Coordination Officer in the UN Department of Safety and Security (DSS) two months ago, officials said yesterday.

He is survived by his wife Amruta and two teenage children, son Vedant and daughter

When asked if the UN is in contact with Israeli officials regarding the attack, Haq replied in the affirmative and said, "I think the point is we are in discussion with Israel to determine exactly how this incident happened and the nature of what happened."

"I don't think at this stage we are in doubt about where the shots came from as much as what the circumstances were," he added.

Haq said the UN believes the shots came from a tank in the area. When asked that only the IDF have tanks in the region, Haq said, "I think that's a safe assumption to make, yes."

He said the convoy was going to the European hospital as "there's regular work that's going on in terms of bringing people to different sites and this

Needless to say, overall 1.53 lakh excess deaths occurred every summer, close to half came from Asia and more than 30 per cent from Europe. Further, the largest estimated death rates (deaths per population) were seen in regions with dry climates and lowermiddle incomes. The findings are published in PLoS Medicine.

The high incidence of heatwave-related mortality in India is reflective of several factors, including the country's large population, its geographical location, and the prevalence of extreme temperatures, particularly during the summer months.

Additionally, socioeconomic factors such as poverty, inadequate access to healthcare, and limited infrastructure exacerbate the vulnerability of certain segments of the population, particularly those living in urban slums or rural areas with limited resources. The authors explained that "During the warm seasons from 1990 to

2019, heatwave-related excess deaths accounted for 153,078 deaths per year, a total of 236 deaths per ten million residents or 1 per cent of global deaths." For the study, the researchers used data from the UK-based Multi-Country Multi-City (MCC) Collaborative Research Network that included daily deaths and temperatures from 750 locations across 43 countries including India.

Comparing the decade up to 2019 with that up to 1999, the duration of heat waves each year was found to have extended from 13.4 to 13.7 days on average around the world, with average ambient temperature warming by 0.35 degrees Celsius every decade.

The researchers said that while previous studies have quantified excess deaths due to heat waves locally, they have not compared these estimates across the globe over a prolonged duration.

The authors have called for a "comprehensive approach" tackling not only immediate health risks during heat waves but also implementing longterm strategies to minimise vulnerability and inequalities across communities.

"The strategies include climate change mitigation policy, heat action plans (e.G., heat early

warning system), urban planning and green structure, social support program, healthcare and public health services, education awareness, and community engagement and participation," they said.

The study echoes findings of a recent report by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) which said in India alone, severe heat waves in April and June resulted in about 110 reported fatalities

due to heatstroke in 2023. Yet another analysis by an international team of leading climate scientists from the World Weather Attribution group has called for urgent measures to mitigate the impact of heat waves which are likely to intensify in coming

vears. Some countries, such as India, have comprehensive heat action plans in place. Yet, to protect some of the most vulnerable people, these must be

expanded with mandatory reg-

ulations. Workplace interventions for all workers to address heat stress, such as scheduled rest breaks, fixed work hours, and rest-shade-rehydrate programs (RSH), are necessary but have yet to become part of worker protection guidelines in the affected regions," it said.



Bongaon: Muslims divided over CAA narrative in Matua bastion

In the Matua stronghold of Bongaon, considered the cradle of the citizenship movement that shaped the CAA, there's a diverse array of beliefs, aspirations, and divisions within the Muslim community.

The Matuas, a Hindu refugee community originally from East Bengal (now Bangladesh), has long been a dominant force in Bongaon's socio-political landscape. With their roots deeply entrenched in the struggle for citizenship rights, the CAA represents a beacon of hope, promising a pathway to citizenship for persecuted Hindu minorities from neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Afghanistan.

The Indo-Bangla border region, characterised by lush fields and tight-knit communities, is currently experiencing a notable split as political parties adopt contrasting positions on contentious issues, with apprehensions of NRC looming large. Juxtaposed against this narrative, Bongaon's Muslim population faces uncertainty regarding the CAA, adding to their challenges.

While some see it (CAA) as a compassionate Act to help persecuted minorities, others regard it as a means of discrimination, worsening



existing socioreligious tensions.

What is the need for CAA when all of us are citizens here. How come we can cast our votes and have all necessary documents," said 62-year-old Amirul Mondal of Mallickpur village along the Indo-Bangla border in Bongaon.

Mintu Rahman, a weathered farmer with hands calloused from years of toil, voiced the fears of many. "Why target Muslims," he questioned,

The schism within Muslim community in Bongaon is palpable, mirroring the broader national discourse

argue that the CAA, by explicitly excluding Muslims, contravenes the principles of equality enshrined in the Constitution, thereby marginalising an already vulnerable community. Conversely, there are Muslims

in Bongaon who, albeit reluctantly, express tacit support for CAA. Their rationale stems from a pragmatic assessment of the socio-political landscape, where aligning with the dominant narrative might offer a semblance of security and acceptance.

"CAA is for persecuted minorities from neighbouring countries. The Act is about giving citizenship and not taking it away. Muslims like us who have been living here for generations are citizens of this country," Amirul Dafadar told PTI.

Amirul, BJP's booth president of Sayestnagar in Bongaon, has been tediously reaching out to every Muslim households in his area trying to apprise people about the "negative campaign" going on over CAA.

'It is the TMC which is instigating the Muslims against the CAA. They are misguiding them," he said. Moidul Sheikh echoed similar sentiments, emphasising that as long as their identity and citizenship remained unquestioned, people from the community should not worry about the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) as much as they did about the NRC in Assam. "If our rights and status are secure, there is no need for undue concern regarding the

CAA. We are opposed to NRC but not against CAA," he said. However, this support is often

accompanied by a sense of apprehension, as they grapple with the moral implications of endorsing a policy that appears to "disenfranchise their community".

"Many people say that we are going against our community but it is not about opposing or supporting anything. It is about a humane approach," Moidul Sheikh said.

The recent enactment of the CAA has sparked fears of a potential NRC exercise that could leave many in the Muslim community vulnerable to statelessness.

With the implementation of the CAA, there is a looming fear that the NRC might follow suit, subjecting us to scrutiny and uncertainty about our citizenship status," Bapan Sheikh said, echoing the sentiments of many in

Bongaon. A large section of Muslim residents fear that they may face similar challenges in proving their citizenship, especially considering the lack of documentation. "As Muslims are persecuted

Already costly, food items to be dearer on the back of heatwave, poll expenditures

Jith wholesale inflation hitting a 13-month high of 1.26 per cent in April and the mercury poised to peak in the next two months, stubbornly rising food prices are worrying many a family across the nation. This rise was driven as both food and fuel became dearer. Interestingly, India's retail inflation, measured by the consumer price index (CPI), fell to an 11-month low of 4.83 per cent year-on-year in April 2024, compared to 4.85 the previous month. The Reserve Bank of India primarily considers retail inflation when formulating monetary policy. However, for the average person, the rise in WPI is concerning as it is primarily influenced by food items, both processed and unprocessed, as well as manufactured goods. India is experiencing an ongoing heatwave, which is expected to affect vegetable prices. WPI inflation is forecast to increase to 2-3 per cent in May 2024; it is expected to spiral up and reach its peak in June 2024. WPI food inflation, which includes primary food articles and manufactured food items,



increased for the third consecutive month to an eightmonth high of 5.5 per cent in April (compared to 0.4 per cent in April 2023), driven by both manufactured food products (reaching a 15-month high of 1.2 per cent) and primary food articles (reaching a four-month high of 7.7 per cent).

The increase in WPI inflation in April was attributed mainly to fuel and food items. However, there is a silver lining as the outlook for food inflation has improved due to expectations of a normal monsoon, which is anticipated to boost agricultural production. Additionally, commodity prices have rebounded on hopes of increased demand from China. Since it is an election

year, there is an automatic push to prices based on market speculation and uncertainty over continuation of governance policies, not to mention that the cost of election is recovered from the common man via higher prices. The funding of political parties by corporates and traders often reflects in the spiralling prices, pre- and post-elections. Logistic bottlenecks, labour shortages and increased transportation costs, thanks to oil prices, all contribute to the overall inflationary pressures, amplifying the challenges faced by food producers and consumers alike. Amid the backdrop of escalating food prices, election discussions revolve around economic policies and their impact. High prices and employment concerns loom large as hot topics, reflecting the broader sentiment of economic anxiety among voters. Generally, the ruling party bears the brunt of inflation as people hold it responsible for not keeping the prices in check. Effectively managing inflation entails employing a comprehensive strategy that harmonises short-term interventions with enduring structural changes. Swift actions, like directed subsidies and mechanisms for stabilising prices, can provide temporary respite to consumers contending with rising food expenses. Until that happens, we can happily fulfil our tax obligations by paying through our nose. Indeed, inflation is taxation without legislation!

ith phase four of the polling over, we are than more halfway through the ongoing Lok Sabha polls. There is no denying that the opposition INDIA bloc, led by the Congress, has been able to create a perspective that it isn't a one-sided battle and the fight was on all the seats.

The usual gimmicks of stock market predictions and illegal 'satta' gambling forecasts have started to emerge on social media and private WhatsApp groups. However the underlying message is that come what may, the BJP shall be able to form the Government. This probably emerges from the faith the BJP supporters have in the abilities of Prime Minister Narendra Modi being a leader with gargantuan mass appeal. However, there is also no denying the fact that the opposition was in tatters when the poll campaign started but by the passing of time have been able to create an image of a close fight, which in the end could prove to be just a mirage. Nevertheless, the Congress campaign in the 2024 polls, whatever the results, would remain an area of discussion among the political scientists in the times to come.

Congress's poll preparation could be said to have begun from the conclave it had at Udaipur in 2022. The declarations at the 'Udaipur Shivir' talked talked of building a vibrant organisation. This came in the backdrop of desertions plaguing the party especially from their most prominent leader Rahul Gandhi's coterie. In 2022, when the Congress met in Rajasthan, one right decision it took was to hold the polls for the post of the president of the All India Congress Committee. It did activate the party and in Mallik arjun Kharge, the party has found a good campaigner, who not only campaigns hard but makes a lot of sense with

alliance despite the initial hiccup caused by its very convener, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar walking out of the formation. Though some point out that Kharge and not Nitish was foisted as the chair of the alliance, as given his track record, Nitish's opposition to the BJP was always suspect. This could work both ways, if there is an undercurrent, it would bring bonus points and if there is voter indifference, the performance should not fall below, as they say in commerce, the reserve price.

To counter this challenge, we must adopt environmentally friendly cultivation and processing methods. Electric tractors are

one of the globally emerging excellent alter-natives for future farming. It can reduce farming costs and zero emissions effectively addressing the issue of a sustainable environment and reducing our dependence on imports of crude oil.

As the world's largest tractor manufacturer, India sells over 1 million tractors annually. However, the adoption of electric tractors has been slower than other electric vehicles (EVs) like two-wheelers, three-wheel-ers, passenger cars and electric buses. It's time to take action and promote electric tractors. This will foster an environment for mass adoption and position India as a global exporter of electric tractors. To achieve this, we must integrate electric tractors into incentivised EV policies. It's unacceptable that no incentives are being offered for electrifying tractors.

Electric Tractors Could be Fetched in FAME-3 Scheme: The FAME-2 scheme (April 2019-March 2024) was a central Government subsidy that aims to promote the Fast Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles (FAME). The scheme ended on 31st March, with a total outlay of Rs 10,000 crore to support the production of 7,000 electric buses, half a million electric three-wheelers, 55,000 electric passenger cars and one million elec-tric two-wheelers. However, the scheme excludes electric tractors, which means that manufacturers cannot significantly reduce

the cost of producing electric tractors. The Ministry of Heavy Industries has recently proposed the FAME-3 scheme, which has an outlay of Rs 12,600. The scheme is expected to be implemented after the Lok Sabha elections. Farmers are hoping that the scheme will include electric tractors, which will reduce their costs significantly. With a subsidy of up to Rs 2.4 lakh (capped at 40 per cent of the tractor's base price), the burden of high purchasing costs on farmers will be greatly reduced. To promote the use of electric vehicles, several States such as Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Madhya Pradesh offer concessions or a waiver on the road tax between 50 per cent and 100 per cent. Other States, including Delhi, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Rajasthan, offer direct cash incentives on top of the road tax waiver through a similar approach to the central FAME scheme. The incentives range from Rs 2,500 to Rs 10,000 and the subsidy cap ranges from Rs 60,000 to Rs 2.5 lakh, depending on the battery capacity. Punjab and Haryana offer incentives (up to 40 per cent of the ex-showroom price) for e-tractors in their EV policies. Other key agricultural States should consider following this approach to promote sustainable agricultural practices. Rationalisation of Taxes: Tax rationalisation has proven to be an effective way of promoting electric vehicles through discounted taxes and insurance fees. The existing fiscal incentives provided for zero-emission



motor vehicles should be extended to zero-emission tractors as well. While electric vehicles are charged a reduced GST of 5 per cent, e-tractors are still taxed at the same rate as diesel tractors, which is 12 per cent. Additionally, electric vehicles receive a 15 per cent discount on third-party insurance premiums, whereas this provision is not available for e-tractors. The International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT) has analysed that reducing the GST to 5 per cent or even nil and providing discounted insurance would reduce the cost gap between electric and diesel tractors by almost 40 per cent.

Training and skill development initiatives for farmers, technicians and service providers on electric tractor operation, maintenance and repair are crucial. Empowering stakeholders with the necessary knowledge and skills will facilitate the transition to electric tractors and ensure their effective use in agricultural operations.

Zero Emissions in Electric Tractor: A study by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, reveals that the agriculture sector in India is responsible for almost 14 per cent of the country's greenhouse gas emissions, with diesel-powered machinery playing a major role. However, electric tractors could be a solution to these challenges.

Currently, most tractors used in and has the potential to boost India are powered by diesel, which accounts for approximately 7.4 per cent of the country's annual diesel consumption, equivalent to the amount consumed by buses. While incentives have been introduced to encourage the electrification of buses, no such incentives have been introduced for tractors. The adoption of electric tractors presents some challenges, such as the initial cost, infrastructure development and promoting their use among farmers. Diesel-powered machinery, notably tractors, accounts for approximately 12-15 per cent of the total cost of agricultural production, which varies by crop type and geographical region. However, electric tractors have many advantages, including zeroemission and a reduction in fuel and maintenance costs due to having fewer moving parts. According to a study by the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IÅRI), electric tractors could reduce

maintenance costs by up to 40 per cent over their lifetime, providing a more reliable, environment friendly and cost-effective option for farmers. The Way Forward: India's tractor manufacturers have developed advanced technology and moved beyond incentives to introduce electric tractors. However, the primary challenge at present is the cost. On-road zero-emission electric tractors cost 40 to 50 per cent more than diesel tractors. This high cost could deter farmers, even though electric tractors are more cost-effective when used in the field. Urgent support from the Government is needed in the early stages of the market to bridge the cost gap between e-tractors and diesel-driven tractors.

Central and State-level incentives would send a positive signal to the industry to invest more in zeroemission tractors. Additionally, this aligns with India's goal of improving air quality and energy security India's tractor exports. Countries such as the US, Europe, Japan and Canada have implemented strict regulations for tractor emissions and have expressed interest in decarbonising farm machinery. The global electric tractor market is projected to grow from USD 0.7 bil-lion in 2024 to USD 3.4 billion by 2030, presenting a strategic opportunity for India to leverage its manufacturing capabilities. It can enhance its economic competitiveness, play a pivotal role in achieving net-zero emissions, strengthen the rural economy and shape a sustainable and resilient farm future. The Biden administration has told key lawmakers it would send more than USD 1 billion in additional arms and ammunition to Israel, three congressional aides have said. But it was not immediately known how soon the weapons would be delivered.

It's the first arms shipment to Israel to be revealed since the administration put another arms transfer, consisting of 3,500 bombs of up to 2,000 pounds each, on hold this month.

The Biden administration, citing concern for civilian casualties in Gaza, has said it paused that bomb transfer to keep Israel from using those particular munitions in its offensive in the crowded southern Gaza city of Rafah. The package disclosed Tuesday

includes about USD 700 million



for tank ammunition, USD 500 million in tactical vehicles, and USD 60 million in mortar rounds, the congressional aides said. They spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss an arms transfer that has not yet been made public. There was no immediate indication of when the arms would be sent. Two congressional aides said the shipment is not part of the long-delayed foreign aid pack-age that Congress passed and

Biden signed last month. It wasn't known if the shipment was the latest tranche from an existing arms sale or something new. The Biden administration has come under criticism from both sides of the political spec-trum over its military support for Israel's now seven-month-old war against Hamas in Gaza - at a time when Biden is bat-tling for reelection against for-mer President Donald Trump. Some of Biden's fellow Democrats have pushed him to limit transfers of offensive

weapons to Israel to pressure the US ally to do more to protect Palestinian civilians. Protests on college campuses around the US have driven home the message this spring. Republican lawmakers have seized on the administration's pause on the bomb transfers, saying any lessening of US support for Israel — its closest ally in the Middle East weakens that country as it

fights Hamas and other Iran backed groups. In the House, they are planning to advance a bill this week to mandate the delivery of offensive weaponry for Israel.

Despite the one-time suspension of a bomb shipment, Biden and administration officials have made clear they will continue other weapons deliveries and overall military support to Israel, which is the largest recipient of US military aid. Biden will see to it that "Israel has all of the military means it needs to defend itself against all of its enemies, including Hamas," national security spokesman John Kirby told reporters Monday.

"For him, this is very straightforward: He's going to contin-ue to provide Israel with all of the capabilities it needs, but he does not want certain categories of American weapons used in a particular type of operation in a particular place.

Slovakia's populist Prime Minister Robert Fico was wounded in a shooting Wednesday afternoon and taken to hospital. Reports on TA3, a Slovakian

station, said that Fico, 59, was hit in the stomach after four shots were fired outside the House of Culture in the town of Handlova, some 150 kilometers northeast of the capital, where the leader was meeting with supporters. A suspect has been detained, it said.

Police sealed off the scene, and Fico was taken to a hospital in Banska Bystrica. The shooting in Slovakia comes

three weeks ahead of crucial European Parliament elections, in which populist and hardright parties in the 27-nation bloc appear poised to make gains. Deputy speaker of par-liament Lubos Blaha confirmed the incident during a session of



Slovakia's Parliament and adjourned it until further notice, the Slovak TASR news agency said.

Slovakia's major opposition parties, Progressive Slovakia and Freedom and Solidarity, canceled a planned protest against a controversial government plan to overhaul public broadcasting that they say follow the direction of Hungary under populist Prime Minister would give the government full control of public radio and television.

Dutch anti-Islam party nears government tormation

Brussels (AP): Anti-Islam firebrand Geert Wilders is on the verge of brokering a four-party coalition in the Netherlands six months after coming in first in national elections, opening the prospect that yet another European Union nation will veer toward the hard right weeks ahead of EU-wide elections.

Wilders has said he does not expect to become prime min-ister himself, because he remains too extreme for his coalition partners, but his Party for Freedom would be the driving force in the coalition.

With hard right and populist parties now part of or leading a half dozen governments in the 27-nation bloc, they appear positioned to make gains in the

June 6-9 EU polls. "I hope we will get there. I think we will get there. I cannot see it going wrong," Wilders told the broadcaster NOS early Wednesday after the four parties reached a deal on government financing, the last major stumbling bloc in the talks. It remains unclear who will

become prime minister. "That is still crucial. If you want a government to succeed, you need a prime minister that unites," said Pieter Omtzigt, leader of the centrist New Contract party Outgoing prime minister Mark Rutte's center-right People's Party for Freedom and Democracy and the populist Farmer Citizen Movement are also in the coalition talks.

Yemen's Houthi rebels on Wednesday claimed tar-geting a U.S. Navy destroyer and a commercial ship in the Red Sea. However, the attack on the warship apparently hap-pened nearly two days earlier and saw the vessel intercept the missile targeting it.

The latest statement from the Houthis comes as their attacks on shipping, which have dis-rupted trade through a vital corridor leading onto the Suez Canal and the Mediterranean Sea, have slowed in recent weeks. Though the rebels have not acknowledged the slowdown, the U.S. military has suggested its airstrikes and interceptions of Houthi fire have disrupted their assaults and chewed into their weapon stockpiles.

Recently, the Houthis have been claiming days-old attacks. Houthi military spokesman Brig. Gen. Yahya Saree said the rebels targeted the USS Mason with missiles and launched an attack on a ship he identified as the Destiny. Multiple vessels have that name in shipping reg-



istries The Mason, an Arleigh Burke-class guided-missile destroyer, has been in the Red Sea and the wider region as part of a U.S.led coalition trying to prevent Houthi attacks on shipping. On Monday night, the Mason "suc-cessfully engaged and destroyed one inbound antiship ballistic missile launched by (the) Iranian-backed Houthis from Yemen over the Red Sea," the U.S. military's Central Command said.

The US Navy's Mideast-based 5th Fleet did not immediately respond to a request for comment regarding the claimed attack on the Destiny. The Houthis say their attacks

on shipping in the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden are aimed at pressuring Israel to end its war against Hamas in Gaza, which has killed more than 35,000 Palestinians there, according to local health officials. The war began after Hamas-led militants attacked Israel on Oct. 7, killing 1,200 people and taking some 250 others hostage

The Houthis have launched more than 50 attacks on shipping, seized one vessel and sunk another since November, according to the U.S. Maritime Administration. Shipping through the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden has declined because of the threat.

Speaking at parliament, Prime Minister Gabriel Attal, who attended a two-hour meeting with top ministers at the Elysee, said the aim of the state of emergency would be "to restore order in the short-

est time possible." A decree on the methods to impose the state of emergency is to be presented to the

French Cabinet on Wednesday afternoon. In a statement, Macron emphasized the need for a resumption of political dialogue and asked the prime minister and the minister of the interior and overseas territories to invite New Caledonian delegations to

"All violence is intolerable and will be the subject of a relentless response to ensure the return of order," the statement said.

There have been decades of tensions on the archipelago between Indigenous Kanaks seeking independence and descendants of colonizers who want to remain part of France. French Minister of Interior and Overseas Territories Gérald Darmanin said that 100 gendarmes were evacuat-

ed during violence overnight following "an attack on their station with an ax and live ammunition.

"Calm must absolutely be restored," Darmanin said in an interview with French broadcaster RTL.

On Tuesday, the French Interior Ministry sent police reinforcements to New Caledonia, which long served as a prison colony and now hosts a French military base. About 1,000 gendarmes and 700 police officers have been deployed and a dozen professionals from a specialized police intervention and riot control unit have also been mobilized, the territory's top French official, High Commissioner Louis Le Franc, said at a news conference in New Caledonia.

Jurors in Trump's hush money trial are getting front row seat to history

Some of the most explosive moments in Donald Trump's hush money trial have played out for most of the world to see - except for the people who are actually deciding his fate: the jury. The 12-person panel is shown

evidence and witness testimony so they can decide whether the former president is guilty of a scheme to buy up and bury seamy stories in an effort to illegally influence the 2016 presidential election. But it's a highly curated experience; jurors are not getting the full picture seen by those who follow along each day.

They don't even witness Trump enter or exit the courtroom. He's

already there by the time they are brought into the room, and he stays until they are dismissed

This is by design. Laws carefully govern how a criminal case is tried to ensure that a jury's decision on guilt or innocence isn't affected by fights over evidence or other legal sparring. It's routine to hold back a jury while trial lawyers argue with the judge about what can and can't be included for jurors to see during the trial. And attorneys often gather quietly at the judge's bench to talk about sensitive topics, out of their earshot. Jurors, too, agree to a set of rules when they're chosen for a trial. They can't research the case.

They must avoid all news about

it. They also agree not to discuss



the case outside of court and not talk about it among themselves until deliberations, when all the evidence has been presented and they're deciding whether the defendant should be convicted. If they break any of these rules, they could be kicked off the panel and replaced with an and fined USD 10,000 for vioalternate juror, or a mistrial

could be declared. So if they're taking their civic duty seriously, the Trump jury has never heard the Republican presidential candidate criticize Judge Juan M. Merchan as "totally conflicted." They don't know that Trump has been threatened with jail time and

"That is so prejudicial and so incredible for a jury to hear," Trump's attorney Todd Blanche argued. He blamed prosecutors for asking questions that elicited intimate details of the alleged encounter.

Judge Merchan refused to throw out the case.

Trump's attorneys also wanted to modify a gag order that bars him from talking about witnesses in the case. "He needs an opportunity to respond to the American people," Blanche argued.

Judge Merchan denied that request too. And an appeals court on Tuesday upheld the gag order; finding that Trump wasn't claiming the restrictions infringed on his right to a fair trial. He was arguing that being prohibited from talking about the case could adversely impact his 2024 presidential campaign.

But Trump's lawyers have won some, too. Merchan said no to prosecutors' request to play jurors a 1999 CNN interview in which Trump discussed his familiarity with campaign finance laws. And just before court let out lastn Friday, Merchan told prosecutors they should inform Cohen "that the judge is asking him to refrain from making any more statements" outside court about the case or about Trump.

More routine actions are also decided outside of the watchful eyes of the jury. The judge and attorneys talk about scheduling and days off - including this Friday, when the Republican presidential nominee will be attending his son Barron's high school graduation. And they've talked about potential upcoming witnesses.



Wong sworn in as Singapore's new Prime Minister

Conomist Lawrence Wong Ewas on Wednesday sworn in as Singapore's fourth prime minister in a planned political transition for the island state. Wong, 51, succeeded Lee Hsien Loong, 72, who relinquished his position after two decades; both belong to the ruling People's Action Party (PAP) that has been driving Singapore's economic progress for more than five decades.

Wong, who was the deputy prime minister, will be leading the fourth generation PAP politicians' government as the Prime Minister and the Finance Minister.

President Tharman Shanmugaratnam, 67, administered the oath to Wong, described by the local media as a low-key leadership transition. Wong cited continuity, stability and the need to avoid disruptions as reasons for not making major changes at the minister (cabinet) level.

"With all other ministers holding on to their portfolios across

the leadership transition from Lee Hsien Loong's government to Wong's, it also testifies to the consistency in Wong's decisionmaking," a Channel News Asia report said

In April 2022, Wong was named as the leader of the PAP's fourth-generation, or 4G, team, and in June of that year promoted as the Deputy Prime Minister. Wong is mar-ried to Loo Tze Lui. Prior to entering politics, Wong was a civil servant for 14 years before joining the Ministry of Trade and Industry in 1997.

The Wong-led government is expected to continue pro-business policies, given Singapore's status as an Asian financial hub generating investments for Asia, including India, and a trading centre with a global network

Lee will stay on in the Cabinet as senior minister as has been the case with the first two Prime Ministers of the city state Lee Kuan Yew and Goh Chok Tong.

Wong is retaining Heng Swee Keat, 63, and promoting

President Tharman said he has full confidence in Wong's ability to lead as Singapore ven-tures into uncharted waters internationally, noting Wong's key role in shaping the coun-try's economic and social poli-cies, Channel News Asia said. "He will be his own person, with his own approach to building consensus and finding the best way forward for the country. And he will no doubt do so to his own rhythm and beat," Tharman said at the ceremony

All eyes are now set on the next General Election, which must be held by November 2025, only after which significant changes to the Cabinet are expected. At a press conference earlier this week, Wong said: "Continuity and stability are key considerations (for the cabinet), especially as we are approaching the end of this term of government." "There is no higher priority for

me and that is to form the best possible team to serve Singapore and Singaporeans," he added.

Among Indian PAP parlia-mentarians, Murali Pillai, 56, has been promoted as minister of state in the Ministry of Law and the Ministry of Transport. Pillai, a lawyer, will be sworn in on July 1, 2024. 'Radical Saudi Arabia scholar held for years should be tried or released'

Dubai (AP): A radical Sunni scholar whose criticisms of Saudi Arabia's government and the West drew praise from the late al-Qaida founder Osama bin Laden should be immediately tried or released from a yearslong arbitrary detention by the kingdom, independent experts working with the United Nations said Wednesday.

Safar bin Abdulrahman al-Hawali had been one of the prominent voices behind the Sahwa, or "Awakening" movement, in the kingdom, which called for strictly observing hardline Wahhabi beliefs and criticized its royal Saud family. Al-Hawali has been held without trial since 2018 as part of a wider crackdown on all dissent under King Salman and his assertive son, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman. Al-Hawali, now in his mid-70s, was cited specifical ly by bin Laden in his 1996 declaration of war on the United States as one of the clerics detained by the kingdom purportedly on the order of the Americans. The UN Committee on the

Rights of Persons with Disabilities called for al-Hawali's release, saying ailments from strokes he suffered in 2005 and 2006 have made it difficult for him to speak or care for himself.

Lanka's minority Tamil-dominated regions on alert

Colombo (PTI): Sri Lanka's security forces were placed on alert in the northern and eastern regions to counter attempts to commemorate LTTE members killed in the group's bitterly-fought conflict for a separate homeland for the minority Tamils, ahead of the anniversary of the long-drawn battle's end. Security forces received information about events being organised throughout the island nation's Tamil-dominated North and East to commemorate the outlawed Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) to mark the 15th anniversary of its final battle.

The three-decade-long armed, which started in 1983, was ended by the island nation's military by killing the leaders of the LTTE in 2009.Although the military decided against deploying troops, a special task force of the military and the police would keep a close eye on the possible LTTE commemorations from Wednesday to May 20. Security forces said that the distribution of pro-LTTE literature was seen at several commemorative events. At some events, calls were also made for the revival of the LTTE, which is under proscription internationally, including in India. Police have said that any group trying to commemorate the LTTE would be arrested.

However, Tamil political and rights groups say the events planned are to commemorate their kith and kin, who died in the long-drawn-out conflict since the mid-1970s. In Mullaitivu — the scene of the

final battle - the main commemorative event is to take place at the beachfront in Vellamullivaikkal. In Tamildominated Jaffna, university and civil groups began the 'Mullivaikkal week' on May 11. Blood donation campaigns are being held in the memory of the fallen.

Porridge was distributed to mark the once-a-day serving civilians received when they were trapped in Mullaitivu when the final battles raged between the LTTE and the government troops. Police arrested four people, including three women, in the eastern town of Sampur for violating a court order banning the LTTE commemorations, it said on Tuesday. The LTTE ran a parallel administration in parts of the northern and eastern regions until May 2009. The armed conflict officially came to an end on May 19,

2003, when LTTE supremo Velupillai Prabakaran's body was found in the lagoon of the northeastern region of Mullaivaikkal. FGN13

US to send an unofficial delegation as Taiwan's president is sworn in

The White House will send an unofficial delegation to Taiwan this weekend for the inauguration of the island's democratically elected president, the Biden administration announced Wednesday, in a move that is certain to upset China but unlikely to draw excessive responses from Beijing as the two countries try to stabilise relations. A senior White House official

said the move is in line with longstanding US practice to send the delegation — which includes two former senior officials and a scholar — to the inauguration ceremony Monday. Lai Ching-te of the Democratic Progressive Party will take office, succeeding Tsai Ing-wen of the same party.Beijing, which sees Taiwan as part of Chinese territory and vows to seize the island by force if necessary to achieve unification, sees Lai as a supporter of Taiwan's independence and has long opposed any official contact between Washington and Taipei."In what ways the US deals with the new Taiwan authorities on May 20 and afterwards will affect (the) cross-Strait situation and also the China-US relations in the future," Liu Pengyu, spokesman for the Chinese Embassy in Washington, said Tuesday before the announce-

ment, referring to the Taiwan Strait. "So we urge the US side to act on President Biden's commitment of not supporting Taiwan independence," he said

The US delegation will be in Taipei "to represent the American people," the White House official told reporters on condition of anonymity to discuss details of the trip before it was announced. The official called Taiwan "a model for democracy not only in the region but also globally." Despite an absence of formal

relations with Taiwan, the US is the island's strongest ally and is obligated under a 1979 law to help Taiwan protect itself from invasion.

It's unclear how Beijing would respond to an unofficial US delegation at the Taiwanese inauguration, but "Beijing will be the provocateur should it choose to respond with additional military pressure or coercion," the US official said, adding that the administration is not predicting how China would respond. Beijing has repeatedly warned Washington not to meddle with Taiwan's affairs, which it says are a core interest for China because it is a matter of sovereignty and territorial integrity. Beijing sees Washington's support for Taiwan as provocative. The US insists any differences be resolved peacefully and

opposes any unilateral changes

by either side to the status quo. We do not support Taiwan independence," the administration official said. "We support cross-Strait dialogue."

Taiwan has topped the agenda in US-China relations, which have soured over issues ranging from trade, cybersecurity and human rights to spying. The Biden administration, in its competition with China, has engaged in "intense diplomacy" aimed at preventing tensions from spiraling out of control.

Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and Secretary of State Antony Blinken have recently visited China in the administration's latest effort to keep communications open and minimize misunderstanding.

Shortly after Lai was elected in January, President Joe Biden sent an unofficial delegation to Taipei to meet Lai, drawing protests from Beijing. Members of Congress also have travelled to Taiwan to meet the president-elect. Plans are underway for a congressional delegation to visit Taiwan shortly after the inauguration. Gen Zs, millennials globally optimistic about economy, social situation: Survey

More than half of Gen Zs and two-thirds of millennials globally are optimistic about the economic and social situation of the country and expect it to improve further, a Deloitte survey said on Wednesday.

Both generations are optimistic about GenAI and its potential benefits in improving the way they work with 4 in 10 undergoing training, the Deloitte's 2024 Gen Z and millennial survey said. The survey also found that nine in 10 Gen Zs and millennials say the purpose is important for job satisfaction and are likely to reject work or employers that do not align with their ethics and beliefs.

The survey gathers insights from more than 22,800 Gen Z and millennial respondents across 44 countries and explores how Gen Zs and millennials perceive the transformations occurring in the world around them.

Fieldwork for the survey was completed between November 24, 2023 and February 13, 2024. Gen Z respondents were born between January 1995 and December 2005 and the millennial respondents between January 1983 and December 1994.

According to the survey, millennials are feeling more optimistic about the overall economic, financial, and social outlook compared with their global counterparts and this sentiment is boosted by India's sustained economic growth amid a global slowdown.



Two-thirds of millennials (65 per cent) and more than half of the Gen Zs (58 per cent) expect the country's economic outlook to improve in the next one year. It is a significantly better situation compared with the previous year, as more Gen Zs (62 per cent) and millennials (64 per cent) are now confident of their financial situation.

As per the survey, both the generations believe GenAI will have a positive impact on their work-life balance and how they work. More than half of the Gen Zs (5) per cent) and millennials (54 per cent) frequently use GenAI at work and strongly feel that it will free up their time for creative and strategic work

Exports up one per cent in April; trade deficit widens to four months high

India's merchandise exports rose by 1 per cent to USD 34.99 billion in April even as the trade deficit widened to a four-month high of USD 19.1 billion during the month, according to government data. Healthy growth in sectors such as electronics, chemicals, petroleum products and pharmaceuticals has helped in registering positive growth in despite exports global economic uncertainties.

Imports also increased by 10.25 per cent to USD 54.09 billion in the month under review from USD 49.06 billion in April 2023



due to a significant jump in gold imports. The imports of precious metals

more than doubled to USD 3.11 billion in April this year. Crude oil imports rose by 20.22 per cent to USD 16.5 billion.

Trade deficit, or the gap between imports and exports, in April 2023 stood at USD

14.44 billion. The previous high in the deficit was recorded in December 2023 at USD 19.8 billion. In March 2024, the outbound shipments dipped to USD 41.68 billion from USD 41.96 billion a year ago. Briefing media on the data,

Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal said the figures show that the new fiscal year started on a good note and hoped that it would continue.

He informed that the data for the country's total exports in goods and services for 2023-24 has been revised to USD 778.21 billion, which is the "highest" so far. Merchandise exports in the last fiscal was aggregated at

USD 437.1 billion, while services exports stood at USD 341.1 billion. In merchandise exports, 13 of the 30 key sectors exhibited positive growth in April as compared to same period last year. These include coffee, tobacco, spices, plastic and handicrafts. According to the commerce ministry data, released on Wednesday, the estimated value of services exports for April is USD 29.57 billion compared to USD 25.78 billion in April 2023.

Imports of services estimated to be increased to USD 16.97 billion during the month as compared to USD 13.96 billion in April 2023.

Is it time to worry about another trial, asks Aman Sehrawat

man Sehrawat, the lone male Indian wrestler to have qualified for Paris Olympics, finds it annoying that instead of shifting his focus on preparing for the Games, he still has to worry about cutting his weight to prepare for another round of trials

The 20-year-old Under-23 world champion saved India the blushes by securing a berth in men's freestyle 57kg for the Games at the recent World Qualifiers in Istanbul. In 11 other weight categories where the country's male wrestlers competed, Índia drew a blank as none of them could qualify. "So many times I have cut my weight. How many times I have to do it? It causes a lot of weakness. I don't understand do I think of now winning trials again or start preparing for Olympics. I think the work I need to put for a good preparation will be affected if I am asked to go through the trials again," Aman told PTI in an interview.

"By the time trials are finished, Olympics will be almost there,

when do we start compete against each other preparations? In my opinion trials should not be held," said winner Aman. Aman, whose natural body

weight is 62kg. Aman, who is Asian Games bronze medallist and Asian Championships title winner, is confident that he will be in reckoning for a medal at the Games.

"I see myself in top-3 in the world. Russia and Albania are strong and it will be close with them, others I can manage," he said.

Aman had lost to Albania's Zelimkhan Abakarov in the 2023 World Championship where Serbia's Steven Andria Micici had emerged champion. Zavur Uguev, the two-time world champion from Russia is also a strong wrestler, who had defeated Ravi Dahiya in the Tokyo Games gold medal match.

Most probably Aman will have to beat Ravi Dahiya when the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) holds trials.



FIFA moves toward ending soccer tradition and letting league games be staged in other countries

AP BANGKOK

 $F^{\rm IFA}_{\rm toward}$ ending decades of soccer tradition by reviewing the rules that currently block domestic league games being played in other countries.

Fans are likely to object to their teams' home matches potentially being moved thousands of miles (kilometers) away. The United States and Saudi Arabia are expected to be willing hosts to lure competitive games from top European countries, and FIFA recently agreed to withdraw from an ongoing court case in New York filed by promoter Relevent to challenge the policy. The new FIFA policy will likely be attractive to the growing number of international owners of European clubs, including the wave of U.S. Investors in the English Premier League, Italy's Serie A and France's Ligue 1, and state-backed teams like Abu Dhabi-owned Manchester City, Qatar-owned Paris SaintGermain and Saudi-owned Newcastle.

FIFA is now creating a panel of 10-15 people representing soccer stakeholders to advise within months on amending the rules on so-called "out-ofterritory" games. The rules were last amended in 2014. Attempts since then to have European league games games abroad, including taking Barcelona to Miami in 2019, were blocked as U.S. Promoters seek to give fans more than just preseason exhibition games involving the world's best club involving the world's best club teams. FIFA directed its working group, which is yet to be appointed, to consider fairness and giving "advance notice to fans who may miss the opportunity to attend a home or away match in the home or away match in the home territory." Other factors for the FIFA panel include "respect for the recognized structure of international football" and potential disruption to fans, teams and leagues in the country hosting

"out-of-territory" games.




