CEO authorised to relax norms: ECI

Meena withdraws 2 memos issued on counting

PNS VIJAYAWADA

In response to allegations by YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leaders regarding the relaxation of certain norms in the counting of postal ballots by Andhra Pradesh Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) MK Meena, the Election Commission of India (ECI) clarified on Thursday that no violation had occurred.

While the YSRCP moved swiftly by filing a motion petition in the State High Court, the ECI issued a statement affirming the validity of the CEO's circular. The circular in question permits the consideration of postal ballots as valid even without the presence of certain details like name, designation, or seal alongside the authorized officer's

ECI's Principal Secretary, Avinash Kumar, stated, "The circular issued by the CEO aligns with existing protocols, and hence, is deemed appro-

The High Court has issued an order granting interim anticipatory bail to Pinnelli Ramakrishna Reddy in three cases registered by the police two days ago. It ordered the police not to take any hasty action against Pinnelli including arrest.

The alleged conspiracies hatched by the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and the police to prevent Ramakrishna Reddy from getting interim anticipatory bail suffered a big blow when the court announced that the bail would be granted till June 6 to monitor the counting process.



Campaigning for final phase of LS polls ends

The high-pitched campaigning for the seventh and final phase of Lok Sabha elections in 57 seats in seven states and the Union territory of Chandigarh on June 1 ended Thursday evening.

Polling is scheduled in all 13 seats of Punjab and four of Himachal Pradesh, 13 constituencies in Uttar Pradesh, nine in West Bengal, eight in Bihar, six in Odisha and three seats in Jharkhand besides Chandigarh. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is seeking a third consecutive term from Varanasi.

Voting is already over in 486 seats in 28 states and Union territories. The turnout in the first six phases was 66.14 per cent, 66.71, 65.68, 69.16, 62.2 and 63.36 per cent respectively. Counting of votes will be taken up on June 4.

The campaigning saw BJP leaders led by Modi accusing the Congress and the INDIA alliance of being corrupt, anti-Hindu and engaging in loot, appeasement and dynastic politics.

The central bank annual report attributed the surge primarily to the withdrawal of the Rs 2,000 denomination notes announced in Mav 2023. Share of this denomination has reduced to 0.2 per cent from 10.8 per cent in the year-ago peri-

Volume-wise, the Rs 500 denomination was the highest at 5.16 lakh notes while Rs 10 denomination came a distant second at 2.49 lakh as of March 31, 2024, as per data shared in an annual report.

IRDAI mandates one-hour decision time for insurers

Insurers are to grant final authorisation within three hours of receiving a discharge authorisation request from the hospital

PNS VISAKHAPATNAM

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has introduced a new mandate requiring health insurers to decide on "cashless" payout claims within one hour. This directive was outlined in a master circular issued on Wednesday, detailing specific time limits insurers must adhere to for cashless authorisations.

"The insurer shall decide on the request for cashless authorisation immediately, but not more than one hour after receipt of the request. Necessary systems and procedures shall be put in place by the insurer immediately and not later than July 31," the circular stated.

Furthermore, insurers are required to grant final authorisation within three hours of receiving a discharge authorisation request from the hospital. The circular adds that if this three-hour window is exceeded, any additional charges imposed by the hospital will be covered by the insurer using of hospitals and healthcare

In Punjab, where the ruling AAP and its INDIA bloc partner Congress are fighting separately in a multi-cornered contest, the highdecibel campaign saw the participation of senior BJP leaders from Modi to Union ministers Amit Shah, Rajnath Singh and Nirmala Sitharaman to BJP chief J P Nadda and chief ministers of BJP-ruled states.

For the Congress, Kharge and party leaders Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra led the campaign. Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, out on interim bail in the excise policy case, also led an aggressive campaign for his

party candidates along with Punjab the people vote to save the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann. On the final day, Modi while addressing a rally at Hoshiarpur in Punjab, attacked the Congress for "ranting" about the Constitution when it was the one that "strangled" it during the Emergency and not care about it when Sikhs were killed in the 1984 riots. At the rally in favour of his party's Hoshiarpur candidate Anita Som Parkash and Anandpur Sahib nominee Subhash Sharma here, the prime minister also touched upon the issues of reservation, corruption and the Ram Temple.

Hitting out at the opposition for questioning the Agnipath scheme, he accused the INDIA bloc of making the Army a "weapon of politics" and said there cannot be a "bigger sin than this".

In Uttar Pradesh, while the BJP

claimed that the INDIA bloc will bring in Muslim reservation and put a 'Babri lock' in the Ayodhya temple in their speeches, the Opposition urged Constitution. In West Bengal, Modi took out a rally in Kolkata on Tuesday in support of candidate for Kolkata Uttar seat Tapas Roy. TMC supremo and Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee also held rallies for party candidates almost in each of the nine Lok Sabha constituencies. On Thursday, Banerjee walked a

rally of 12 km from the southern part of the city's Jadavpur area to Gopalnagar. Party leader Abhishek Banerjee also participated in two rallies on the final day of campaigning.

The BJP while campaigning alleged the Mamata government was involved in many scams related to coal and cattle smuggling, and irregularities in school recruitment among other issues. It also alleged how the state government was not implementing the welfare schemes of the Centre and depriving the common people of their benefits.

On the Rs 2,000 note withdrawal, it said about 89 per cent of notes under the denomination introduced following demonetization in 2016 had been around for over four years and were due for replacement, and were not commonly used for transactions, it said. The withdrawal also seems to have had an impact on the counterfeit notes detection, the annual report said, adding that the number of fake Rs 2,000 pieces detected jumped to over 26,000 from 9,806 in the year-ago period.

The same for Rs 500 notes declined to 85,711 pieces in FY24 from 91,110 a year earlier. On the recently launched central bank digital currency (CBDC) or e-rupee pilot, the annual report pegged the overall outstanding value at Rs 234.12 crore as against Rs 16.39 crore in March 2023.

Over Rs 164 crore, or 70 per cent of the e-rupee, is in the Rs 500 denomination, while Rs 200 denomination comes second at Rs 32 crore, or 13.7 per cent. As of March 31, 97.7 per cent of the Rs 3.56 lakh crore in outstanding Rs 2,000 denomination notes were returned by the public, the annual report said. In FY24, the RBI spent Rs 5,101 crore on security printing as against Rs 4,682 crore in the year-ago period.

The RBI annual report said it also carried out a survey on currency usage among the public, where over 22,000 respondents across the country indicated that cash is "prevalent" even though digital modes of payments were gaining traction.

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Contaminated water supply triggers diarrhoea outbreak

Unconfirmed reports say 4 people died, 40 hospitalised

PNS VIJAYAWADA

A diarrhoea outbreak has been reported in Patamatavari Street in the Mogalrajapuram area of the city due to water contamination. The Vijayawada Municipal Corporation (VMC) is taking measures to control the situation. VMC Water Supply officials identified that the contamination was due to borewells along the Bandar Canal at Fakeerugudem in the city.

Unconfirmed reports say four people have died from symptoms of diarrhoea after consuming contaminated water. However, VMC authorities have not yet confirmed these deaths as being caused by diarrhoea and water contamination. More than 40 people are currently receiving treatment at various hospitals. The outbreak was first noticed three days ago.

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) tested the water from these borewells and confirmed contamination.

Consequently, on Thursday, VMC officials halted the water supply from these points. Around 20,000 people reside in this area, so the authorities arranged for drinking water to be supplied from the VMC Headwater Works through the 46 MLD plant at Gangireddula Dibba, Gunadala, to address

further problems.
Additionally, VMC is supplying potable drinking water through tankers. The VMC water supply authorities are also removing unused water pipelines and drainage pipelines. The water wing authorities found that around 100 water pipeline connections had leaks due to their proximity to drainage lines. All these 100 connections, along with the unused water pipeline collections, are being removed.

Meanwhile, the NTR District Medical & Health Department continued the medical camp at Patamatavari Street, and the FSSAI is conducting ongoing water tests. Officials from the Medical and Health Department are treating people for symptoms of diarrhoea and referring individuals to the government gen-

eral hospital if necessary.

NTR DM & HO Dr. M Suhasini is monitoring the situation by continuing the medical camp at the CPM office. Adequate doctors and supporting staff, including ASHA workers, are providing medical services. Additionally, medical teams are conducting door-todoor visits to check on residents' health conditions.

FSSAI officials are conducting

on-the-spot water sample testing at Patamata Vari Veedhi and Mogalrajapuram by collecting water samples from all bores in and around Mogalrajapuram. The authorities collected around 67 samples from residents' tap connections and confirmed the water contamination by changes in water colour. Upon receiving the reports from the FSSAI, and following their suggestions, VMC officials halted the water supply from the Bandar Canal borewell points. The authorities have taken steps to supply water from the 46 MLD plant at Gangireddula Dibba in the Gunadala area, and also through tankers. However, FSSAI authorities are continuing their on-thespot water sample testing with the support of VMC staff.

VMC chief urges public not to panic

VIJAYAWADA: The Vijayawada Municipal Corporation (VMC) has urged the public not to panic messages regarding water contamination. Extensive sample tests conducted by the corporation at the sources of drinking water, i.e. for Krishna River water, the borewell water, the overhead tanks and the distribution pipelines and all tests have shown negative results for any contamination. In a press release, on Thursday, Commissioner Swapnil Dinakar Pundkar said they assured residents that the drinking water supplied by VMC is safe. There is no need for concern, he added. Please disregard the unfounded rumours and trust the official reports provided by the municipal authorities, he said.

DECADE-LONG NORTH ANDHRA ILLEGAL LAND DEALS

A tale of allegations, inaction, and accountability

For over a decade, the contentious issue of illegal land transactions in Uttarandhra has sparked fierce debates and dal, involving encroachment, occupation, and forgery of thousands of acres, has implicated numerous officials and political figures, raising serious questions about governance and integrity within Andhra Pradesh's administration.

Successive governments, both the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and the Yuvajana Sramika Rythu Congress Party (YSRCP), have taken steps to investigate the rampant illegal transactions in Visakhapatnam. Special Investigation Teams (SITs) were established by both parties, amassing extensive details and producing comprehensive reports. Yet, the findings of these investigations have been consistently kept from public scrutiny, fuelling accusations of corruption and administrative

In 2017, the TDP govern-ment, led by IPS officer Vineet Brijalal, formed an SIT to delve into the land grab cases. Key



figures in this investigation included then Visakhapatnam Police Commissioner T Yoganand and then Joint Collector G.Srijana. The team's thorough thousand-page report confirmed irregularities worth thousands of crores. However, despite the report's damning conclusions, the TDP government chose not to release it, allegedly due to the involvement of high-ranking IAS officers. At that time, YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, then the opposition leader, vociferously demanded the report's release and called for accountability, but his appeals were ignored.

Upon YS Jagan Mohan Reddy's ascension to Chief Minister, the expectation was that the YCP government would take decisive action. Instead, the 2017 SIT report

As the heat of summer is on, mangoes become a must-have fruit for many. However, this year's reduced yield has led to a scarcity in the market. To meet the high demand, traders are resorting to artificial ripening methods, raising health concerns. Typically, mangoes take several days to ripen, during which some spoilage occurs. To minimize losses, traders are using chemicals like ethylene to hasten the ripening process. Ethylene gas, derived from Ethephon, can change the color of the fruit within 24 to 48 hours. While ethylene is naturally occurring and can be safe in controlled amounts, traders often misuse it by spraying it directly on the fruits in liquid form,

which is highly dangerous. Ethylene application should not exceed 100 parts per mil-

lion (ppm). However, direct spraying significantly surpasses this limit, leading to potential health hazards. In addition to ethylene, some traders continue to use calcium carbide, despite its known risks. Calcium carbide, when reacting with oxygen, releases acetylene gas, commonly used for welding, to artificially ripen mangoes. Consuming fruits ripened this way can lead to serious health issues, including

Doctors warn that consuming chemically treated fruits can cause immediate and longterm health problems. These include digestive issues. headaches, dizziness, mental confusion, memory loss, insomnia, and even cerebral oedema Long-term effects may

include severe body system disruptions and an increased risk of cancers. Consumers



can identify chemically treated dark colour, bland taste, and ripened with calcium carbide mangoes by their unnatural reduced juice content. Fruits often cause a burning sensation

in the mouth and can lead to stomach pain, diarrhoea, and sore throats. The Food and Safety Standards Department already launched a special drive to inspect mango sales from

Speaking to The Pioneer, District Food Safety Officer GAB Nandaji stated that ten samples have already been collected and sent for testing. If ethylene levels exceed 100 ppm, or if calcium carbide use is detected, strict actions including fines and imprisonment will be imposed.

Exceeding ethylene limits could lead to fines and up to two years in prison while using calcium carbide could result in six months of imprisonment and fines up to two lakh rupees. Consumers are urged to be vigilant and prioritize naturally ripened mangoes to avoid health risks associated with chemically treated fruits.

21 killed, 47 injured as bus falls into gorge in Jammu

Twenty-one people were killed and 47 injured after a bus carrying pilgrims skidded off the road and rolled down into a gorge in Jammu district on Thursday, officials said.

Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor (LG) Manoj Sinha has expressed anguish at the loss of lives in the accident. The accident took place at the Tungi-Morh

the district, the officials said, adding that the bus rolled around 150 feet down into the gorge. A police spokesperson said at about 12:35 pm, the

in the Chowki Chora belt of

bus bearing registration number UP81CT-4058 fell into the gorge, killing 21 passengers and injuring 47. The bus was carrying devotees from Haryana's

Kurukshetra and was headed towards Shiv Khori in the Pouni area of Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district. It had started its journey from Uttar Pradesh.

The bodies have been shifted to the Akhnoor sub-district hospital, the police spokesperson said, adding that of the injured, seven have been admitted in the Akhnoor hospital and 40 in the Government Medical College (GMC) hospital

in Jammu. The rescue operation is going on, the official The injured were initially shifted to the Akhnoor hospital for treatment. Subsequently, 36 of them, including six in a critical condition, were shifted to the GMC hospital in Jammu in ambulances, the officials said. "More than 36 passengers have been brought

to the GMC hospital. Six of them are in a critical condition. Timely treatment is being given to the patients," principal of the hospital Dr Ashutosh Gupta said. The injured passengers said the accident took place

when the driver was negotiating a blind curve and a speeding car was coming rom the opposite direction. "A car was coming from the opposite direction. The driver tried to negotiate a

blind curve but failed, resulting in the vehicle rolling down into the gorge," Amar Chand, one of the injured people undergoing treatment at the

Akhnoor hospital, said. Those who sustained injuries in the incident said they had come for a pilgrimage to Shiv Khori. Senior Superintendent of Police, Traffic, Faisal Qureshi, the transport commissioner, along with other officials, visited the spot and supervised the operation. The SSP said it seems there

was no overloading of passengers in the bus. The SSP and the deputy commissioner of Jammu visited the GMC hospital to inquire about the injured.

He reportedly left for Germany on April 27, a day after Hassan Lok Sabha segment went to polls, and is still at large. On May 18, the Special for Court Representatives had issued an arrest warrant against Prajwal Revanna, following an application moved by the SIT.

Appeals no more

The last phase of Lok Sabha polls gets over on June 1 after weeks-long campaign and slogans

he biggest electoral contest in the world will conclude with the seventh phase of voting on June 1. It has been a dynamic election season; the battleground vibrant with slogans, promises and appeals. The major coalitions, the NDA and INDIA, have each deployed strategic messaging to galvanise voter support. When it comes to sloganeering, the BJP-led NDA has been a hands-down winner, coming up with not one but several catchy phrases to woo the electorate. 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas' (Together with all, Development for all, Trust of all) has been a cornerstone of its campaign. 'Naya Bharat' (New India), aimed at portraying the vision for a progressive and self-reliant nation, was another NDA slogan. Along the same lines was 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' (Self-reliant India) which reflected the NDA's focus on boosting local industries and reducing dependency on foreign goods. But more interesting were its jumlas (catchy phrases) that were floated intermittently to give the NDA 'top recall



value': 'Abki baar 400 paar' (this time, we will cross 400) and 'Modi ki guarantee'. The major takeaways from the NDA's election pitch were of course its 'Sankalp Patra', heavily focused on economic progress, showcasing initiatives like Make in India, Digital India and the push towards a \$5 trillion economy. The NDA alliance also highlighted its efforts in strengthening national security. The message is clear — a strong leadership to safeguard the nation.

Not to be outdone, the INDIA bloc also used several slogans to reach voters' hearts. Prominence was given to slogans critical of the Modi Government's unpopular policies and its actions to subvert democracy by

sending Opposition leaders to jail. 'Jai jawan, Jai kisan, Jai samvidhan' (Hail the soldier, the farmer, the Constitution) drew heavily on this sentiment. 'Bharat Jodo' (Unite India), a call for unity across the nation's diverse fabric to counter divisive politics, was inspired by Rahul Gandhi's pan-India foot march. Yet another slogan from the INDIA stable was 'Nyay' (Justice), a promise to address disparities and ensure equitable growth. The INDIA alliance has positioned itself as the protector of social justice, focusing on uplifting marginalised communities, ensuring minority rights and addressing caste-based and religious discrimination. The INDIA bloc has promised to tackle issues like farmer suicides, inadequate MSP (Minimum Support Price) and the need for comprehensive agrarian reforms. Of course, 'Save democracy' has been its main theme. The NDA's pitch was more country-centric security, \$5 trillion economy and so forth but INDIA's pitch was more about people, their sufferings and plight due to economic hardships. INDIA's focus on social justice and inclusivity is designed to attract voters who feel marginalised. Their promises to address agrarian distress and safeguard democratic values are aimed at rural voters, farmers and the educated urban electorate. Who really touched people's hearts, we shall get to know on June 4.

Unveiling the enigma of an unusual election.



In this election, accusations of tampering with constitutional values take centre stage, punctuated by issues such as the annulment of OBC certificates by the Calcutta HC


t is one of the strangest elections. Nobody speaks out. Visibly there is no wave. Election commission warnings to defaulting speakers are in nuances. More than the prices and unemployment, saving the Constitution has become the prime concern. This is an onslaught on their rights, asserting the Dalits, OBCs, Scheduled tribes and other marginalised classes. An issue raised by the Congress leader Rahul Gandhi seems to reverberate. Swelling crowds at Phulpur and Lalganj in the suburbs and Allahabad city at Congress and Samajwadi Party speak a lot.

Another key aspect is the campaigning gusto with the nominations by Rahul Gandhi at Rae Bareli and family friend Kishori Lal Sharma at Amethi. It is being called Rae Bareli syndrome. It has infused life to Indian alliance workers — AAP, Samajwadi Party and Congress almost everywhere. It has enthused the opposition parties, who now want to clinch

This is in sharp contrast to BJP leaders' meetings, which are marked by empty chairs as also apologetic clarifications that they re not for changing the statute. But the '400 paar' slogan of the BJP is being equated with a design to change the sacred Constitution of BR Ambedkar. The opposition, INDIA, seemingly has become a trailblazer and the ruling NDA is busy clarifying its

Rally after rally of the NDA is countering the accusations of toying with the statute and trying to alter its basic principles. Selling of public sector assets to preferred private groups comes next. The rulers are saying that major PSUs like ISRO and HAL remain intact. They are, however, quiet on Indian Oil and Railways.

There are emerging issues like the sudden nullification of OBC certificates issued till 2010 by the Calcutta High Court. It is a dou-Trinamool Congress Government in West Bengal and the Central Government alike. The poll is being keenly contested and results are difficult to guess, particularly with the EC revising the total extra votes polled by over 1.7 crore. The jerky expressions of BJP leaders, stressing on mangal sutra to Muslims instead of the achievements of the party have put it on the back foot with each day partly leaders dishing

out new figures on the lower side. This gives jitters to the party cadre. It is another story that the cadre is mostly missing. They are not seen moving robustly in constituencies and managing the booths. It is being said that the cadre has been told by the organisation to stay put and not seek to vote for anyone.

The cadre apathy is said to be reflected in its performance. More so the voters are getting alerted by its slogan "abhi to yah trailor hai", spoken by top BJP leaders often, may not suit the BJP. Quite a few YouTube news channels and skits like "Dadi Poti ke Khat" have viewership in lakhs. These are setting the basics for election narratives across the country in different languages.

How these are influencing the voters would be known as boxes open on June 4. BJP leaders' shrill deliveries and the brash expressions from public platforms are not taken kindly. Still predicting the elections is not easy. The Election Commission adding to 1.7 crore votes to the numbers cast after a few days may do wonders. The election this time with regional flavours of all kinds and quiet voters may if it is free and fair. Nobody should wonder if the post-June 1 exit polls reflect a trend that could be different from the actual.

TURNING A BOLD NEW LEAF IN FOREIGN POLICY

India's geopolitical strategy is poised for transformation

n a week from now, a new central Government would be in place, picking up from where the last Government had left. If the BJP comes back to power for a third time, India's foreign policy push would be towards enhancing its stature globally. In a couple of interviews with various media, PM Modi has stressed a confident India now actually mediating on critical global affairs, than the earlier practise of being an observer. In most of the interviews, he mentions the role India played or continues to play, behind the scenes in the Ukraine situation, a sensitive topic. India has a historical relationship with Russia, which has never attempted to alter the relationship, however, Russia has of late started getting into a tighter embrace with China, cooperating on several critical projects including hydrocarbons and technology partner-

Meanwhile, India has grown closer to the US and has been rightly projected as a key ally for the Indo-Pacific region. PM Modi has also highlighted that his third term would ensure, that the Indian PM would be the senior most among democratically elected leaders, serving as he would post a decade of tectonic shifts in geo-political affairs. He hinted that a more confident India has to act more responsibly with its allies while expanding the network, especially with an aggressive China in the neighbourhood. It was no coincidence that external affairs minister S Jaishankar while delivering a key note on the Nikkei Future of Asia forum mentioned "The world is undergoing a flux - driven by geopolitical, geo-economic and geo-technological developments. In the last four decades, economic and political rebalancing accelerated by globalisation has been driving us towards multipolarity.



Today, the global order is visibly under stress, with Asia and the Indo-Pacific very much part of this transformation. But it is not just change we are seeing; there is also much greater risk-taking. It is visible in the conflict in Ukraine, in violence in the Middle East and the disregard for international law and agreements in Asia and the Indo-Pacific. This has economic facets, perhaps even more concerning. The supply chain challenge, over-concentrations stemming from globalisation and the use of economic coercion by States have put a premium on resilience and redundancy. Equally important is the technology challenge that has created a new level of inter-penetration and inter-dependence." Mr Jaishankar underscored India's future foreign policy roadmap with a firm focus on neighbours in the East, West and the Indian Ocean. He also highlighted the centrality of the Indo-Pacific in India's progress. Cross-border road infrastructure and integrated port facilities have found traction in India's external policy in the recent past.

The Iran-based Chabahar port, whose long-term maintenance contract India secured a few weeks back, providing access to crucial landlocked Central Asian countries and beyond is a recent example. External Affairs minister highlighted in his speech the pace at which road and rail networks are getting built in India, even when one of the largest democratic exercises in the world, India elections are underway. He said "The transformation of India is critical to strengthening multipolarity in Asia itself, a pre-requisite for a multipolar world. India's growing weight will ensure that the overall balance in the world order remains in favour of freedom, openness, transparency and a rules-based order. Equally, its greater sense of responsibility and more contributions are also making a difference. Indian naval ships are currently operating in the Red Sea to protect maritime shipping. India has been a First Responder for natural disasters across the Indian Ocean, sometimes

RBI dividend aids Government finances



The RBI's dividend transfer provides a substantial fiscal cushion to the cash-strapped Government, but it must be prudent in fiscal management and resource allocation



the amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act through the Finance Bill 2018-19 (the amendment was based on the recommendations of Dr N K Singh's committee man-dated to review the FRBM Act (2003)), the Modi - the Government had pledged to achieve fiscal deficit or FD (excess of total expenditure over total receipts) of 3 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) by the FY 2020-21. Following the Corona pandemic that played havoc with the economy leading to plunging revenue and ballooning expenditure during 2020-21 and the resultant zooming of FD to 9.1 per cent, it changed this fiscal glide path.

In her budget speech for FY 2021-22, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced the Government's decision to achieve FD of 4.5 per cent by FY 2025-26. From 9.1 percent during 2020-21, the FD descended to 6.7 percent during 2021-22; 6.4 percent during 2022-23 and 5.8 percent during 2023-24. For 2024-25, in the interim budget presented by her on February 1, 2024, she has set the target at 5.1 per cent. If the Government can achieve this target, then 4.5 per cent for 2025-26 should be within easy reach.

Against this backdrop, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has come up with a bonanza for the Centre. The RBI Board has approved a record dividend transfer of Rs 210,000 crore to the Centre for its (read: RBI) FY 2023-24. This will be reflected in the accounts of the central Government for the FY 2024-25. This amount is 2.4 times the dividend transfer of about Rs 87,400 crore made by the RBI for its FY 2022-23 and available for use by the Centre during

Even when compared to the provision of about Rs 80,000 crore made by Sitharaman in the interim budget for 2024-25, the dividend amount available from the RBI i.e. Rs 210,000 crore for use by the central Government during the year will be over two-and-a-half times. This gives a cushion of Rs 130,000 crore (210,000-80,000).

to the Government in managing its fiscal situation and ensuring easy compliance with the 5.1 per cent target, there is no room for complacency.

First, it shouldn't forget that the new glide path of 4.5 per cent for 2025-26 is way behind the original FD target of 3 per cent for 2020-21 as per the FRBM (Amendment) Act 2018. The Corona pandemic of 2020 was once in a lifetime event. Its impact was transitory and it won't be logical to use it as a basis for altering the medium-term fiscal trajectory. This is all the more when from 2021-22 onward, the economic situation was more or less back to normal.

The Government ought to be aiming at an FD target of 3 per cent by 2025-26 and going by this benchmark, it has still a long way to go. SECTOR Second, we need to assess things from the RBI perspective. Unlike a public sector bank (PSB) or any other public sector undertaking (PSU), the RBI is not a commercial enterprise hence, is not expected to pay any dividend. Instead, it is a 'full service" central bank.

Apart from managing the currency and payment systems and keeping inflation/prices in check, it is also mandated with managing the borrowings of the Union Government and Governments; and supervising or INSTEAD. IT IS A regulating banks and non-banking finance companies (NBFCs). While carrying out these functions or operations, it generates a surplus. Typically, the RBI's income comes from the returns it earns on its foreign currency assets (FCA) — which could be in the form of bonds and treasury bills of other central banks or top-rated securities and deposits with other central banks. It also earns interest on its

short tenures, such as overnight. Its expenditure is mainly on the printing of currency notes and staff, besides the commission it gives to banks for undertaking transactions on behalf of the Government across the country and to primary dealers, including banks, for underwriting some of these borrowings. The excess of income over expenditure is the "surplus".

After making provision for bad and doubtful debts, depreciation in assets, contributions to staff and superannuation fund, etc. and for all matters provided for under the RBI Act (1934), the balance of surplus is paid to the Union Government by Section 47 (Allocation of Surplus Profits) of the Act. Apart from this routine stuff, the financial crisis in the early 90s, when India's foreign exchange reserves had plummeted to a level barely enough to buy two weeks of imports, brought to the fore a dire need to prepare the RBI for dealing with 'unexpected' and 'unforeseen' events by enhancing its capacity to absorb financial shocks, ensure financial stability and provide confidence to the markets. So, it started transferring part of the surplus to a 'Contingency Fund'. This was in line with the recommendation of a committee to build contingency reserves (CR) of 12 per cent of its balance sheet.

In 2013, a panel led by Y H Malegam, then a member, of the RBI board, also reiterated the need for building CRs. Subsequently, in its annual report for 2015-16, the central bank alluded to a "draft economic capital/provisioning framework to assess its risk-buffer requirements in a structured and systematic manner." Meanwhile, in 2018, the RBI set up a Committee on Economic Capital Framework

contingency risk buffer (CRB) of 5.5 - 6.5 per cent of its balance sheet as risk buffer. The ECF was to remain in force for five years. The RBI adopted the ECF on August 26, 2019. During accounting years 2018-19 to 2021-22, it determined the surplus transferred to the Union Government taking the CRB at the lower end of the range i.e. 5.5 percent of its balance sheet. For arriving at the transferrable surplus during 2022-23, the CRB was increased to 6 per cent. However, for calculating the amount for 2023-24, it has used the higher end of the band prescribed by the Committee i.e. 6.5 per cent. The surge in dividend transfers for 2023-24 over 2022-23 despite the increase in CRB is due to the substantial increase in the RBI's interest. income from foreign securities as well as exchange gain from foreign exchange transactions (according to the State Bank of India (SBI), these two factors accounted for 60 - 70 per cent of the increase in income of the RBI from Rs 235,000 crore during 2022-23 to around Rs 375,000 400,000 crore during 2023-24). This in turn was due to a sharp hike in interest rates by the US Fed and central banks of other developed countries; the hikes were prompted by the dire need to bring down high inflation in those countries. But the situation may not be sustained as the US Fed prepares to move the interest rate 'south' from the latter half of 2024 and other central banks follow suit. Even if it doesn't happen so soon and RBI repeats its performance during 2025-26, it would do well to retain more surplus with itself in the CRB. India to grow 7% in FY25: RBI

Indian economy is projected to grow at 7 per cent -- the fastest among major economies across the world -- in the current fiscal year, underpinned by a sustained strengthening of macroeconomic fundamentals, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said in its latest annual report on Thursday.

While the central bank expected headline inflation to moderate further, it flagged risks to food inflation saying that it remains vulnerable to

supply-side shocks.
The RBI's balance sheet size surged 11.08 per cent to Rs 70.48 lakh crore (about USD 845 billion) as of March 31, 2024. This was nearly 2.5 times that of Pakistan's entire GDP of close to USD 340 billion.

The Indian economy, it said, expanded at a robust pace in 2023-24 (April 2023 to March 2024 financial year), with real GDP growth accelerating to 7.6 per cent from 7.0 per cent in the previous year -- the third consecutive year of 7 per cent or above growth pace.

Rumours of their separation first surfaced in February this year, 10 months after their wedding. This started when Dalljiet deleted all her wedding pictures from Instagram and dropped



Seeing the team here and meeting them again, spending time, having fun with them, having a conversation with them, I really enjoyed," a beaming Pant said.

Having scored 446 runs in 13 IPL games, Pant is slowly getting back into the groove. The leaner and fitter Pant looked in nice touch at the India nets at the Cantiague Park on the outskirts of New

Former Australia captain Ricky Ponting has picked Indian Premier League (IPL) top performers Jasprit Bumrah and Travis Head to excel among the bowlers and batters respectively in the T20 World Cup starting June 2.

India's pace spearhead Bumrah stood tall among the bowlers with 20 wickets in 13 matches for Mumbai Indians despite the five-time winners enduring their worst-ever campaign in 17 editions of the IPL, while Australian Head struck 567 runs in 15 matches. Despite MI's all-round struggles, Bumrah shone brightly with his supreme control with the ball, maintaining an envious economy rate of a mere 6.48 in a tournament wherein each of the top 10 bowlers went for at

least eight runs per over.
"My leading wicket-taker for the tournament will be Jasprit Bumrah. I just think an outstanding performer, contributor for a number of years now. He's just come off an outstanding IPL" Ponting was quoted as saying in 'The ICC Review'.

Indian women's hockey team gets rousing welcome in London FC Goa, midfielder Brandon

The High Commission of India here gave a rousing welcome to the country's women's national hockey team as dignitaries sang paeans to the players for their achievements in the sport after overcoming obstacles on the road to success.

The women's team, along with the senior India men's squad, is in the United Kingdom for the FIH Pro League fixtures starting this weekend. The Indian men's and women's sides are scheduled to play their counterparts from Germany here on Saturday. "Each one of them represents every

part of India and every region and community of India. Their stories are the most wonderful stories of what is possible in India," said Indian High Commissioner to the UK Vikram Doraiswami, in his address at the reception.

The reception was held at the India House on Wednesday evening. "Each one of these girls is a story of

sacrifice and struggle by their parents, and also a story of triumph and of

spirit.
"These young ladies inspire every one of us today because what they have achieved tells us that there is no ceiling to human ambition, there is no ceiling in a country like India - where

anything and everything can be possible," Doraiswami added.
The team, led by captain Salima Tete and coach Harendra Singh, were greeted by cheering supporters as



community leaders and sports fans gathered at a special reception in their honour.

Their first fixture will take place when they play Germany in London on Saturday and members of the Indian diaspora were encouraged to turn out in large numbers to support the team. The Indian teams are coming to the UK after playing some difficult Pro League matches in Belgium against sides such as Argentina, Ireland and the hosts.

The Indian envoy, himself a hockey player, reflected upon how playing England on their home soil will bring back some memories for the women's team after narrowly losing to them in

the last Olympics' playoff.
"We really look forward to being able to come and support you and to tell everybody what great stuff is happening in Indian hockey and what great stuff Indian women are doing in

"The reason that Australia has become so good at hockey is because

game that you play and every day that you train and get better, India becomes a better country. And for that thank you very, very much," he said.

The Australian High Commissioner to the UK, Stephen Smith, was among the special guests at the event, and he said India "taught" Australia how to improve their hockey and become a

the Indians taught us everything," said Smith in his address. "In Australia, as in every continent in

the world, there is a large Indian diaspora and in the 1950s and 1960s that Indian diaspora taught Australians how to play hockey. It is the case that we adjusted to the artificial turf game, and what I call the horizontal game, better or more

quickly than India.
"But that doesn't mean that India is not a hockey playing country to be admired, both in the men's game and in the women's game," he added.

The Deputy High Commissioner of India to the UK, Sujit Ghosh, indulged in light-hearted conversations with some of the players and their coach and discovered the many hidden talents of the team. In his address in Hindi, coach Harendra said, "India taught the whole world how to play hockey... If there is a vishwa guru in hockey, then that's India.

Yes, there are ups and downs in this iourney, but I am extremely proud to see what our women's team has achieved in the last few years."

He added, "Winning or losing aside, whenever our team is on the pitch there is a certain fear among the opponents. This reflects the changing landscape of our country as a whole, where women have a large share in the rise of India today."

Over the next couple of weeks, the Indian teams will play their matches at the Lee Valley Hockey and Tennis Centre at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park in London.

FC Goa CEO Ravi Puskar said in a statement released on the club's website, "He became ingrained into the fabric of the club and was one of the pillars upon which sporting success was built in the seasons he was with us.



Puskar said the club will be open to have Fernandes back in their fold in any capacity. While he leaves us today, Brandon will always be

welcomed back to FC Goa in whatever capacity he may choose with open arms."
Fernandes, who has also played 25 matches for India

since 2019, helped the national side win the SAFF Championship in 2021. He is expected to join Mumba City FC for the next season.
