Delhi deluged as incessant rains bring Delhi-NCR to a grinding halt

Incessant rain on Thursday brought the national Capital and adjoining areas including Noida, Ghaziabad and Gurugram to a screeching halt with severe water logging, potholes and breakdown of buses witnessed in several parts of the city amid the India Meteorological Department issuing an orange alert for the city. An orange alert denotes heavy rainfall and also potential disruptions to rail, road and air transport. This is the second consecutive day when the commuters and daily office goers were stuck in traffic jams and waterlogging in the Capital city. Besides torrential downpours since late night, the breakdown of buses on

major roads led to traffic jams during the morning and evening peak hours. The ongoing metro construction works have also worsened the situation including disruptions in the Khanpur area. Traffic around Lutyens' Delhi was affected due to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the second Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Civil Aviation in Pragati Maidan. Some of the Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs) had to issue caution to the locals to be alert while moving out from the colonies. With the traffic situation becoming a regular menace, the Sainik Farms Welfare Association in south Delhi took to its social media groups to issue alerts and updates particularly the disruption due to metro work and rains in the area that has

disrupted the resident's daily lives. According to the MET department, in the past 24 hours till 8 am on Thursday,

city's primary weather station Sadarjung received 16 mm of rainfall, Ayanagar 15.7 mm of rainfall, Delhi University five mm of rainfall, Lodi road

16 mm of rainfall, Narela 1.5 mm of rainfall, Palam nine mm of rainfall, Ridge 11 mm of rainfall, Pitampura 13 mm of rainfall and Mayur Vihar's

Salwan Public School 13 mm of rainfall. Parts of Delhi-NCR, including India Gate, Janpath Road, R K Puram,

Kalindikunj, Gazipur, Indrapuram, Laxmi Nagar, Dwarka, Connaught Place, Noida, Safdarjung, Uttam Nagar, East of Kailash and Rohini witnessed light to moderate showers. Moti Nagar flyover, which was inaugurated in March this year by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, was waterlogged along with potholes in several places. Public Works Department (PWD) pumps were also not working, irking commuters who were caught in major jams. Mundka, Dhaula Kuan, Moti Bagh, Mehrauli-Badarpur road, Lajpat Nagar, Karol Bagh, Punjabi Bagh, Khanpur, ITO, Jahangirpuri, Safdarjung, Kashmere Gate ISBT and Okhla Estate among other areas were flooded after the showers causing slow traffic movement with

vehicles wading through knee deep water. Taking to social media platforms, Delhi police said that traffic was affected on Old Pankha Road in the carriageway from T point Uttam Nagar East Metro Station towards Pankha Road due to a large pothole on the Road. "Traffic is affected on GTK Road on both the carriageway from Mukarba Chowk towards Azadur chowk and vice versa due to water logging near GTK Depot," Delhi Traffic Police wrote in a post on X. In another post, they said that traffic is affected on MB Road in the carriageway from Khanpur T Point towards Mehrauli and vice versa due to potholes and waterlogging. Similarly, potholes and waterlogging caused traffic jams on Rohtak Road.

SC verdict on Kejriwal bail plea today

The Supreme Court will deliver its verdict today on the plea filed by Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal seeking bail and quashing of arrest by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the Delhi Excise Policy case. As per the cause list of September 13 uploaded on the apex court website, a bench headed by Justice Surya Kant is slated to pronounce the verdict. The bench, also comprising Justice Ujjal Bhuyan, had on September 5 reserved its verdict on the pleas. Kejriwal has filed two separate petitions challenging the denial of bail and against his arrest by the CBI in the corruption case filed by the central agency. Kejriwal was arrested by the CBI on June 26. Manish Sisodia, K Kavitha, Vijay Nair and several other accused in the excise policy scam case have been given bail by the courts.



AAP Rajya Sabha MP Raghav Chadha said they are "hopeful" and are waiting for the Supreme Court's decision on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's bail. "We are very hopeful. We are waiting for tomorrow," Chadha told reporters. AAP convener has challenged in the apex court the Delhi High Court's August 5 order which upheld his arrest in the corruption case. Kejriwal contended that his arrest was a strategic move. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi argued that the arrest, which followed Kejriwal's bail in a related money laundering case, was unexpected after nearly two years without action from the CBI. The high court had noted that the loop of evidence against Kejriwal was closed after the collection of relevant evidence following his arrest by the CBI and it cannot be said that it was without any justifiable reason or illegal. The high court had also granted him the liberty to approach a trial court with his plea seeking bail in the case. The matter relates to alleged corruption in the formulation and execution of the Delhi government's excise policy for 2021-22, which has now been scrapped.

In State Guidelines issued for re-engagement of retired servants

The Odisha Government has issued new guidelines for the re-engagement of retired government servants on a contractual basis. A selection committee, chaired by the Chief Secretary, will oversee the process. As per the guidelines, there will be a selection process for the re-appointment of retired government servants. Their

selection will be made through open advertisement or any method as decided by the government from time to time. For their appointment, a selection committee will be constituted that will decide the re-engagement of retired employees on the proposal of the concerned administrative department. While the Chief Secretary will be the chairman of the selection committee, the ACS of

the GA & PG Department and the Secretary of the Finance Department will be its members. The secretary of the respective department will be its member-convenor. The Secretary of the department will present the proposals before the committee and has to satisfy the committee about the compelling reasons for the re-engagement of such employees. All re-engagements shall be resorted to only

in rare cases and not as a matter of routine. Without the approval of the Chief Minister, no re-engagement will be carried out. Regarding the eligibility conditions, officers who have retired from government service on attaining the age of superannuation and are below the age of 65 years with good service records and are physically fit shall be eligible to be considered for re-employment.

10% quota for ex-Agniveers in uniform services

Amid debates over the appointment of former Agniveers, the Odisha Cabinet headed by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Thursday announced a 10% quota in state uniform services for the short-term military men. The government will provide 10% reservation for ex-Agniveers in the posts of police, Forest Guards, fire personnel and excise employees. Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja told the media that the

proposed rule aims to provide ample opportunities for ex-Agniveers to secure jobs in uniform services in all Group 'C' and 'D' posts in direct recruitment. Such reservation shall be over and above the reservation applicable for ex-servicemen. "The Agniveers serve in the military for four years. They have all the necessary training," Ahuja said. Furthermore, the Agniveers will be exempted from the physical efficiency test and given three years' age relaxation in the prescribed upper age limit.

State Cabinet nod Gopalpur Port's 95% shares to go to Adani

The Odisha Cabinet on Thursday proposed to develop the Gopalpur Port as an all-weather deep-breathing seaport through a Public Private Partnership (PPP) in the Build Own Operate Share Transfer (BOOST) mode. The Gopalpur Ports Ltd, a consortium of Odisha Stevedores Limited, Noble Group Limited and Sara International Limited with 34%, 33% and 33% shares, respectively, has developed the port. The Gopalpur Ports had earlier sought permission for

transfer of 95% of its equity shares to the Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Limited (APSEZ) from the Shapoorji Pallonji Port Maintenance Private Limited (SPPML)-56% and from Orissa Stevedores Limited (OSL)-39%. Following the due procedure, the Cabinet approved the proposal for the transfer of equity shares to Adani Ports & SEZ from Shapoorji Pallonji Port Maintenance and from Orissa Stevedores along with permission to sign a Revised Concession Agreement thereof towards the development and expansion of the Gopalpur Port.

Govt staffs' daughters to get compassionate job

Irrespective of their marital status

The Odisha Cabinet on Thursday approved three major proposals, including compassionate appointment of daughters or stepdaughters of deceased government employees irrespective of their marriage status. The cabinet meeting



chaired by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi proposed to amend the OCS(RA)

Rules, 2020 for compassionate appointment of daughters or stepdaughters of deceased

government employees subject to conditions that their 'dependency' on their parents is proved. As per provision of the OCS(RA) Rules, 2020, unmarried daughters and unmarried stepdaughters of deceased government servants are being considered for compassionate appointment whereas the case of married daughters or married stepdaughters are not considered.

In city Corporator dances with gun in idol immersion

In yet another glaring example of the rising gun culture, the Corporator of the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation's (BMC) Ward-29 on Wednesday evening al-

legedly danced waving a gun during a Ganesh idol immersion procession. A video of Corporator Arup Narayan Rout alias Jeevan dancing with the gun has gone viral on social media. The immersion procession

was taken out in the Unit-IX area under the Kharvel Nagar police station, Corporator Rout was seen dancing while brandishing a gun. However, Rout refuted the charges of carrying a gun. "It was a wooden plank in the

shape of a gun," he stated. "In the crowd, some followers passed on that gun-shaped wooden plank. Had I figured out its shape, I would have never held it. My rivals are behind in making the video viral," he claimed.

Milk farmers, Opposition decry new OMFED product

Milk farmers and opposition parties are up in arms against a new milk packet reportedly introduced by the State-owned Odisha State Co-operative Milk Producers Federation (OMFED). They claimed that the cost of milk has now gone up after rise in the prices of potato, onion, garlic and vegetables. While the new milk has hit the market in saffron colour packet, its price has increased by Rs 2 per packet, they claimed, adding that the packet also contains reduced quantity of milk. While leaders of opposition BJD and Congress have lashed out at the government over the issue, the Odisha Milk Farmers Association (OMFA) has strongly decried the move. BJD leader Goutam Buddha Das and Congress MLA Sofia Firdous said the new govern-



ment has changed the names of many welfare schemes. While the colour of LAcCMI bus had been changed to saffron earlier, now the colour of milk packets has also been changed, they said, adding that the price of milk has also increased. While each OMFED packet earlier contained 500 ml of milk, now the quantity has been reduced to 450 ml and the price has gone up by Rs 2 per packet. They also said milk price has risen to Rs 56 per litre.

OMFA chairman Rabi Behera said the input cost of the milk producers has gone up manifold. The government should provide cattle feed at subsidised rates. Milk producers have been demanding a procurement price of at least Rs 40 per litre. However, OMFED sources said the milk available in a new shape is entirely a new product with additional ingredients. The earlier products in blue and pink colour packets are still continuing at old price.

Nijukti Mela 476 new govt officials appointed

Chief Minister Mohan Majhi gave away appointment letters to 476 officers and other employees of seven government departments at a Nijukti Mela on Thursday. Majhi said they are appointed for the service of people. The people's problems and their solution are responsibility of the government and its employees. It is their duty to ensure that the government's welfare schemes reach the people at the grassroots. He further said the previous government failed to take concrete steps to fill up vacant government jobs and



for employment generation. His government is taking steps to ensure employment of 3.5 lakh youths in the industrial sector. All the recruitments would be done on merit basis.

Crorepati Assnt Engineer arrested

After detection of DA of more than Rs 8 crore

The Vigilance police on Thursday arrested and forwarded to court Prasanna Kumar Swain, Assistant Engineer (Civil) Irrigation Division, Bhanjanagar in Ganjam district, for possession of disproportionate assets (DA) of more than 8.11 crore. The anti-graft agency during houses searches found a four-storied building at Tulsinagar of Brahmapur



worth Rs 2.4 crore, another four-storied residential building in Bhanjanagar worth Rs 2.3crore, a triple-storied building, another triple-storied

building at Bhanajanagar, a double-storied building under construction, six high-value homestead plots including one in Brahmapur and five in and around Bhanjanagar, gold ornaments weighing 200 grams and bank, postal and insurance deposits of Rs 40 lakh. After inventory and further enquiry, the income, expenditure and assets of Swain, were calculated and he was found in possession of disproportionate assets which is over 1101% of his known sources of income. Further investigation of the case was in progress.

2 Jan Seva Kendras sealed for demanding bribe

2 staffs arrested

The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) has sealed two Jana Seva Kendras and arrested two persons for allegedly demanding bribes for Subhadra application forms, registration and helping women to apply for the government scheme.

The Jana Seva Kendras at Satya Nagar and Niladri Vihar



have been sealed and two employees have been arrested.

"Based on complaints, we conducted a probe and found out that two centres, one in Niladri Vihar and one in Satya

Nagar near Toshali Bhawan, were taking money from the applicants. So, we sealed the centres and have lodged an FIR against them," said BMC Commissioner Rajesh

Prabhakar Patil. However, he assured the applicants not to worry and the application forms would be available until the last applicant.

Meanwhile, the State Government has warned of strict action against those demanding bribes for the forms and the registration process. The government has urged people to lodge police complaints against those asking for money.

Odisha on alert after country's first suspected Monkeypox case

A day after the Centre said that a suspected Monkeypox (Mpox) has been identified in a young male patient in the country, Director of Health Services, Odisha, Dr Bijay Mohapatra on Monday said that the Health Department is fully prepared for the management of the rare viral infection in the State.

Speaking to the media, Dr Mohapatra said, "The suspected man has been isolated.



As per the protocol, his health is being examined. There is no need to panic."

A high alert has been sounded at all international entry points to keep a watch on the people travelling to India. The Centre has taken adequate measures to check the

travel history of people visiting India. If a person comes from an affected country, s/he is kept in isolation and his/her health condition is monitored, said Mohapatra.

Monitoring of passengers at International airports has been intensified. As there is no confirmed case of Monkeypox in India so there is no need to panic, the senior health department official said.

Sharing symptoms of the rare viral infection, Mohapatra said fevers, headaches, muscle aches and painful boils on the

skin are signs of the disease. According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), monkeypox is a viral zoonosis (a virus transmitted to humans from animals) with symptoms similar to those seen in the past in smallpox patients, although it is clinically less severe.

Monkeypox typically presents with fever, rash and swollen lymph nodes and may lead to a range of medical complications.

It is usually a self-limited disease with symptoms lasting from 2 to 4 weeks.

In Bargarh

Scrub Typhus claims 1 more life; toll rises to 4

The deadly Scrub Typhus has resurfaced in Bargarh district claiming another life. While three fatalities, including that of a minor girl, had been reported due to the bacterial disease in the last one week, the tally allegedly rose to four on Wednesday night.

Reports said the fourth patient died while undergoing treatment at a private hospital in Bargarh. However, the government was yet to officially announce the fourth death.

Many other patients are battling for their lives, said Bargarh CDMO Nirupama Sarangi.

All three patients who died of Scrub Typhus were undergoing treatment at private hospitals. There were no deaths at the District Headquarters Hospital, she said.

Notably, over 2,800 cases of



Scrub Typhus had been reported from various districts of the State in 2023 and claimed at least eight lives.

"Three deaths have been reported till now due to suspected Scrub Typhus. We have set up district public health laboratories in every district to test Scrub Typhus. These can be controlled if treated in the preliminary stage," informed Director of Public Health Nilakantha Mishra.

He further said, "I request people to see doctors if they see any symptoms. There are antibiotics to cure the disease, which can prove fatal if patients delay in reporting. I request people to immediately take blood test if they see symptoms."

Junior Teachers' recruitment

SM&E Dept's flip-flop triggers resentment

CM's intervention sought by aspirants

The negligent and arbitrary attitude of the Odisha School and Mass Education Department in the engagement of Special Educators or Junior Teachers (Schematic) has triggered deep resentment among the lakhs of aspirants in the State.

To make matters worse, the Chief Minister and the School and Mass Education Minister have been cunningly kept in the dark by the concerned officials regarding the matter. The aspirants are suspecting a huge scam in the whole re-

cruitment process.

Notably, the Odisha School Education Programme Authority (OSEPA) under the School and Mass Education Department had issued a notification (10576/23) on September 10, 2023 for 20,000 Junior Teachers (Schematic) in the Primary and Upper Primary Schools in different revenue districts of the State.

The candidates would be selected on the basis of a Computer-Based Test (CBT) examination, the notification stated.

Later, the OSEPA called the candidates for certificate verification; and, as per letter No. 13829 dated 24/6/ 24, said only candidates having BA/ BSc with 50% marks and one-year B Ed (Special Education) are eligible to be teachers in Upper Primary Schools (UPS)

and said the candidate having done two years' B Ed are not eligible. However, the OSEPA has moved the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) for further clarification and said that after the clarification is availed, the postings would be done.

Subsequently, School and Mass Education Commissioner-cum-Secretary Aswathy S in Letter No 117 dated 15/3 / 2024 to NCTE Chairperson Prof Pankaj Arora sought clarification regarding engagement of candidates as Junior Teachers having two years' B Ed (Special Education) course and stated to consider the matter.

Later, the NCTE in a letter 126655/ dated 28/ 8 /2024 stated that incumbents having a degree of B Ed two-year du-

ration after the academic session 2014-15 may also be allowed for consideration of appointment as teachers for Classes-VI to VIII subject to fulfillment of other provisions of the NCTE. Then, based on the NCTE letter, the School and Mass Education Department on 30/ 8/24 asked all DEOs/DPCs to take steps for recruitment of teachers.

But surprisingly on 6/9/ 24, the SME Department again issued another letter saying that as all programmes for Junior Teacher posting have been completed, there would be no further recruitment.

This has triggered deep anguish among the aspirants who have expressed doubts over the senior officials' motives and sought the Chief Minister's intervention to save their future from turning dark.

Teachers pooh-pooh 7-hr duty rule of HE Dept

Campuses mostly wear deserted look after 1 pm

Even though the Odisha Government has made it mandatory for all the teaching and non-teaching staff of colleges to adhere to the seven-hour work rule, the rule is found to be violated openly in different higher education institutions.

While the Government had introduced the seven-hour work rule for college faculty long ago, the Higher Education Department also issued a fresh directive to all the teach-

ing and non-teaching staff of higher education institutes before the new academic session of 2024-25 to strictly follow the norm.

In a directive, the department has asked the principals of all Government, aided and unaided colleges to ensure teaching and non-teaching staff of the institutions are present on the campus from 10 am to 5 pm every working day and submit their biometric attendance.

It further asked the authorities concerned to open the institutions' gates before 10 am for the convenience of students.

Sources said different re-

gional directorates of education (RDEs) including those at Bhubaneswar, and Brahmapur have informed the Higher Education Department that faculty members of many colleges under their jurisdiction are not registering their attendance through biometric devices even though there is a strict Government guideline to this effect.

At several colleges, faculty members are also not staying on campus after registering their attendance.

Colleges in Mayurbhanj, Baleswar, Bhadrak and Keonjhar come under the jurisdiction of RDE-Baleswar

Similarly, colleges under

Khurda, Puri, Nayagarh, Cuttack, Jajpur, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Dhenkanal and Angul come under RDE-Bhubaneswar. Ganjam, Gajapati and Kandhamal districts are under RDE-Brahmapur.

Officials of the directorates recently made surprise visits to all the colleges under their jurisdiction and found that the faculty members were missing in most of the educational institutions, particularly during the afternoon session. Most of the colleges wore a deserted look in the absence of teaching staff.

They have pointed out that both teaching and non-teach-

ing staff are coming to colleges early to register their fingerprints in the attendance device and moving out of the campus only to return to register their exit fingerprints, thereby ensuring a record of their seven-hour stay in the college.

In letters to principals of all Government, non-Government aided and unaided colleges under both the RDEs, the officials said the practice has been putting college administrations under severe pressure. They said surprise visits will be made to the colleges again in subsequent days and stringent action would be taken against the staff found deviating from

the attendance guideline.

Notably, way back in 2019 the Higher Education Department had issued an official notification to the teachers of all the Government and aided non-Government colleges in the State to perform duty for at least seven hours on every working day.

In addition to the normal teaching-related works, teachers are required to devote time for library, research, taking extra classes for late entrants, taking corrective classes for the needy students, monitoring student attendance and assisting college authorities in teaching and non-teaching assignments.

Subhadra Yojana

Let charity not be a means for empowering women

The new State Government by BJP must change the approach of the earlier government towards development of the marginalized sections, especially the poor women who constitute a major segment of State's population. The Subhadra Yojana may not produce the desired result because the interest of the majority of women is more inclined to charity than an intention for development and its economic viability, as the support amount offered by government is very less as well as the gap between instalments is long. The demand in public shows a large presence of poor women in the State looking for unaccountable and non-repayable aid out of public funds. The present government must take into consideration the non accomplishment of Mission Shakti scheme of the BJD Government while pursuing Subhadra.

The schemes must be viewed as realistic opportunities for women who deserve such support in their struggle for a decent living rather than becoming a beneficiary of a public charity. The scheme must

improve the condition of women by making them active participants in the development process not just with capital but also with skill and legal protection that can contribute to growth of Odisha's economy. The scheme must be used to promote MSME among women in Odisha. The States such as Maharashtra ,TN ,UP ,Punjab and Karnatak have more number of entrepreneurs from the marginalized sections including

women owning MSMEs as part of inclusive business initiative by their respective government.

The fact is extreme inequality in socio-economic and political sphere has deprived a vast section of people of living a life with dignity and restricts their access and opportunities and productive resources to grow at par with the others. It is denial of human rights and the right to development with human dignity. It is highly desirable that special schemes for the marginalised sections and women must create socio-economic opportunities to perform a productive role in society.

Our schemes must address the issues of inequality which are more acute and increasing due to its gender, ethnic, religious, class and caste -based differences that have continued with very insignificant change. It is said that the current income inequality is higher than its pre-independent period. In spite of many efforts to arrest extreme poverty, it has merely declined at a low rate. So the charity approach may not contribute to decreasing inequality and help in increasing the real income of the poor. The inequality in in-

come has many ramifications over our socio-political and socio-economic life that continues to slow down the progress of the marginalised sections who are otherwise resourceless and own insignificant assets. It perpetuates violence and social disturbances more in rural areas that affect economic growth, peace and happiness and above all, a better quality of social and family life.

The schemes must contribute to generate self-employment among

somehow employed in the unorganised sector go mostly low paid and are deprived of social security benefits out of a State fund that is available for the organised sector workers, mostly Government and public sector employees. This inequality in dealing with labor forces of the State must be addressed. Equity and uniformity of scope and equal opportunities must be provided to all.

The women in the market also face ethnic - caste and gender-based discrimination in access to employ-

ment because of our socio-religious and socio-cultural barriers that have been enforced for generations. The legislations, to protect the women of diverse social groups and specially women from socially excluded groups from backward areas, have very limited applications in our workplaces and still our discriminatory social customs are being enforced in the name of religion and traditional values even though the

practice sharply contradicts the internationally agreed modern value system based on principles of human rights. The current Central Government schemes for women must be integrated into State schemes for wider convergence for greater impact. All the schemes for women for their protection and development are interconnected and cannot be seen in isolation. In this context, the State of Odisha is an example because of its continued backwardness and sub-regional underdevelopment and deplorable condition of its vulnerable social groups including women, who are still struggling with poverty, distress migration and chronic employment and have a pitiable status in the areas of health, education and household basic amenities. Odisha is not just featured among backward States but also it has a majority of its population belonging to excluded social groups who are featured at the bottom of human development index. The continued inequality is not just economic or social but also political because the States having less political bargaining power with the Cen-

ter are suffering the deprivation. But this time the State of Odisha must use its double engine approach.

It is mostly the Centre that took the decision of investment and major economic interventions for development of States in the framework of national planning. It is being observed that economic policies are mostly influenced by political decisions rather than economic needs. Therefore it is also the responsibility of the Union to reach out to the backward States with a special financial package for their all-round development.

Unfortunately, the post independent economic policies of the Center have neglected the development of the poor and backward States. Added to this, the resources of the backward States such as minerals have been used for the overall national growth at the cost of the resource rich poor States but mineral bearing States are denied their due share by the Centre. So the Central Government must support such schemes exclusively promoted by backward States for its most vulnerable sections such as women. (Email-manasbbs15@gmail.com)

ASI to hold survey of Ratna Bhandar on Sept 18

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) will conduct a reconnaissance survey of the inner and outer chambers of Ratna Bhandar of the Jagannath Temple here on September 18.

"The ASI authorities have informed that a team led by the Addl DG (Conservation) and experts from CSIR- NGRI (National Geophysical Research Institute) will conduct preliminary inspection and technical survey of Ratna Bhandar of Shree Jagannath Temple this coming week," Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) Chief Administrator Arabinda Padhee posted on X.



He added that September 18 is fixed for the exercise in accordance with the government-approved SOP after a discussion with SJTA officials and sevayats.

On August 24, the SJTA had requested ASI DG to initiate scanning and geophysical investigation of the Ratna Bhandar using latest technology before undertaking repair

and renovation of the Lord's treasury. The letter was sent a day after all seven empty iron chests and almirahs were shifted from the Ratna Bhandar to a room near the Niladri Vihar museum in the temple premises.

The ASI is likely to conduct the necessary inspection work through IIT or CBRI-like institutions that have expertise while ensuring no adverse impact on the 12th-century temple.

Notably, Ratna Bhandar was opened for the first time in 46 years and the ornaments and valuables from the outer and inner chamber were shifted to a temporary strong room inside the temple on July 14 and 18, respectively.

NH blocked against Chakdar irrigation project

The project has sparked fears of submergence of many villages in Telkoi block.

Forum protests apathy towards rly dev in S Odisha

A protest under the banner of Milita Kriyanusthan Committee was held on Monday demanding the development of railways in south Odisha, especially for the neglected districts of Ganjam, Gajapati, Kandhamalb and Rayagada.

Despite decades of promises, several important railway projects remain incomplete. Brahmapur, one of the oldest railway stations in Odisha, ranks third in the State in terms of volume of passenger traffic and revenue generation, yet it lacks the essential infrastructure compared to the newer stations.

They demanded immediate construction of new railway lines, including the Brahmapur-Sambalpur line through Aska, Bhanjanagar, Phulbani and Boudh and the

Gopalpur-Rayagada line via Mohana, Ramnaguda. They also called for expanding Brahmapur station facilities, including a new coaching depot and a fifth and sixth platform.

Activist Rabindra Mishra said the long-standing demand for a railway division in Brahmapur was also raised, citing its ideal location to serve the southern region and reduce the burden on Khurda Road division. Upgradation of the station under the ABSS scheme to international standards, similar to Bhubaneswar and Puri, was also demanded.

Senior advocate Saroj Ranjan Pattnaik, retired administrator Balakrishna Panda, and development activists, including Siba Prasad Mishra and Rabi Narayan Rath, led the protest in front of Brahmapur Railway Station, drawing attention to these pressing demands.

Illegal stone crusher seized in Pallahara

5 liquor shops surround Nuapada school of 262 kids

Huge garbage of pouches, bottles, bands of hooligans are daily show before institution

The Upgraded Upper Primary School in Kusmal village, located in the Birighat Panchayat of Nuapada district, faces significant challenges, raising concerns about the community's commitment to the future of its children. Despite 262 students

(125 boys and 137 girls) attending the school regularly from classes 1 to 8, the villagers seem indifferent to improving the school's environment.

The presence of five unlicensed liquor shops, locally called "kothis," surrounding the school exemplifies this apathy. Two of these shops are situated on either side of the school's main entrance, and discarded liquor pouches and bottles litter the school grounds, often found

scattered in front of classrooms.

"We clean this garbage every morning after opening the

school," said one teacher, adding that drunk individuals trespass onto school premises after school hours by jumping the wall.

Another teacher expressed frustration, stating, "Liquor sellers and drunkards hurl abuses at us if we ask them to leave the area around the school."

The school is located along the main road between Khariar and Boden, just five kilometers from Khariar town where the excise office is situated. The villagers mentioned that after repeatedly bringing the issue to the attention of the authorities, most recently

two weeks ago, the excise officials finally arrived and instructed the liquor sellers to relocate.

In addition to the liquor problem, the school is also affected by the indifference of the district education department. Although eight teacher posts are sanctioned for the school, only five teachers are currently in place, as three have been reassigned to other schools for an extended period.

"The vacant positions must be filled, either by canceling these deputations or through transfers," urged a concerned parent Kshirasindhu Sagaria.

Class-IX boy injured in ragging by non-Odia classmates

A case of ragging has been alleged at the Navodaya Vidyalaya in Hadgarh of Keonjhar district where a Class-IX was allegedly beaten up by non-Odia students, leaving him seriously injured.

The victim accused fellow students of even trying to 'kill him'. The matter came to the fore after the victim narrated his ordeal to his parents, who have lodged a written complaint with the Soso police.

According to the complaint, despite repeated complaints to the school Principal, no action was taken against the accused students.

Earlier, the accused students had also attacked him, due to which he suffered head

injuries. He had to be admitted to a hospital and was back to school after treatment. However, they allegedly continue to harass and torture him with no action by the school authorities.

"Ragging is going on rampantly in the school. I had even informed the Principal earlier. However, he did not take any action and solved the matter amicably though my son was injured and hospitalised," alleged the victim's father.

"Luckily, he survived after treatment. They have started ragging him again now. They have once again beaten him up and torn his mosquito net. They even tried to kill him, my son informed me. Despite repeated complaints, no action is being taken. So, I have approached the police," he added.

Elephant carcass found in M'bhanj



2nd electrocution death in 24 hours

A female elephant was found dead at an agriculture field under the Betnoti Forest Range in Mayurbhanj district in the early hours of Thursday. Villagers of Kuradik spotted the carcass and informed forest officials.

According to Baripada DFO A Uma Mahesh, who along with Ranger Monwar Khan and other forest personnel reached the spot, the 14-year-old pachyderm possibly came

in contact with a temporary electric wire fence laid around the agriculture field by farmers to protect their crops, leading to its death.

This incident came a day after a sub-adult female elephant had been electrocuted after coming in contact with a live wire on the outskirts of Nuagaon village under the Panposh range of Rourkela Forest Division.

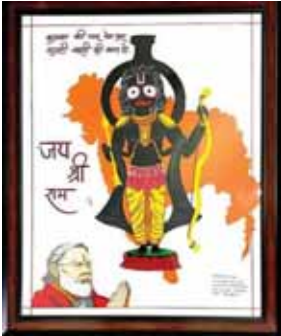
Sonu had presented Modi a painting at his public meeting at Phulbani

Fast on 5th day in B'pur demanding S Odisha rly dev

Under the banner of the Milita Kriyanusthan Committee, protesters gathered at Brahmapur Railway Station demanding immediate railway development in south Odisha.

The demonstration, which was in its fifth day of a hunger strike, focuses on the neglected districts of Ganjam, Gajapati, Kandhamal, and Rayagada, where several key railway projects have remained incomplete for decades.

My thoughts are with his family and admirers in this sad hour. Om Shanti,” the Prime Minister said. Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi said that Yechury was a protector of the idea of India with a deep understanding of the country. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge condoled Yechury's demise and said he was an excellent parliamentarian and an outstanding intellectual who served the people of India with pragmatism blended with idealism. West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said that

Yechury death is a loss to national politics. “Sad to know that Sitaram Yechury has passed away. I knew the veteran parliamentarian that he was and his demise will be a loss for national politics. I express my condolences to his family, friends and colleagues,” she posted on X. Yechury's family has donated his body to AIIMS for teaching and research purposes, the hospital said in a statement. “It is with profound grief that we announce the passing away of CPI(M) General Secretary, our beloved Comrade Sitaram Yechury, at 3.03 pm today, 12th September, at the AIIMS, New Delhi. He was suffering from a respiratory tract infection which developed complications,” CPI(M) said in a post on X. “We thank the doctors, nursing staff and the Director of the Institute for the excellent

treatment and care extended to Comrade Yechury. Details of public viewing and homage will be informed,” the CPI(M) said. In a statement, the CPI(M) said Yechury's body will be kept at the party headquarters here between 11 am and 3 pm on Saturday for public viewing and paying homage. Subsequently, the body will be taken to AIIMS, where it will be donated for medical research, according to his wishes. Yechury was admitted to AIIMS on August 19 for treatment of a pneumonia-like chest infection. He was critical and on oxygen support. Doctors said he had a fungal infection in his lungs. Yechury is survived by his wife Seema Chishti, an editor with news portal The Wire. He has three children -- two sons and a daughter. One of his sons Ashish Yechury passed away due to Covid-19 in 2021. His daughter Akhila Yechury teaches at the University of Edinburgh and University of St Andrews. Son Danish working in UK. Yechury was earlier married to Indrani Mazumdar. The leader, who started from the student's union of Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) as a member of the Students' Federation of India (SFI) and went on to become a member of the Central Committee of the CPI(M) in 1984, got elected to the Politburo in 1992. He served as a Rajya Sabha MP for 12 years, from 2005 to 2017. He became the fifth General Secretary of the CPI(M) at the 21st party congress in Visakhapatnam on April 19, 2015, and took over from Prakash Karat. He also played a significant role in the joint opposition's INDIA bloc.

VP Dhankhar condemns Rahul Gandhi's US remarks as unpatriotic, accuses of treason

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Thursday said there was nothing more condemnable and intolerable than one in constitutional position becoming part of enemies of the Nation, in an apparent attack on Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi over his remarks made in the United States. Dhankhar's assertion came a day after the BJP hit out at Rahul Gandhi over his meeting with US lawmaker Ilhan Omar and others during his visit to the country, alleging that the Congress leader is indulging in “dangerous and mischievous” activities by reaching out to people abroad who are known for their anti-India stand. Addressing participants of the third batch of Rajya Sabha Internship Programme here, Dhankhar, also the chairperson of the upper house, said he was pained and disturbed that some people in position have no idea of national interest. The vice president did not name anyone in his address. He said, “If we are true Indians, we will never side with the enemies of the nation.” The BJP has attacked Rahul Gandhi over his remarks on reservation



and religious minorities in India and China. “I am pained and disturbed that some people in position have just no idea of Bharat. They have no idea of our Constitution, they have no idea of our national interest... I am sure your heart must be bleeding at what you see,” the vice president said. He said people have given supreme sacrifice in getting freedom. “Mothers have lost their sons, wives have lost their husbands. We can't ridicule our nationalism,” he said. Dhankhar said every Indian outside the country has to be an ambassador of the nation. “How painful that one who holds a constitutional position is doing just the reverse of it. Nothing can be more condemnable, despicable and intolerable than that you become part of enemies of the nation,” he said. Dhankhar was of the view that such people do not understand the value of freedom as also that the country has civilisation depth of 5,000 years. The vice president asserted that the Constitution is sacred and was structured over three years of painstaking work by the founding fathers of the document.

He said the members of the Constituent Assembly met without disruption, disturbance, sloganeering and any posters being raised. “And now, some people want to divide our nation. This is ignorance in extremity,” he said. In a press conference at the National Press Club in Washington on Tuesday, Rahul Gandhi criticized the Narendra Modi government over its handling of the conflict with China, telling reporters that it is a disaster that 4,000 square kilometres of Indian territory is occupied by troops from the neighbouring country. But the leader of the opposition in Lok Sabha indicated that the Congress is in broad agreement with the BJP-led government on other major foreign policy issues, including relations with the US, no talks with Pakistan unless terrorism ends and concerns over extremist elements in Bangladesh. Answering a question about China, Gandhi said, “Well, if you call having Chinese troops in 4,000 square kilometres of our territory handling something well, then maybe. We've got Chinese troops occupying land the size of Delhi in Ladakh. I think that's a disaster. Media doesn't like to write about it.” Meanwhile, the BJP on Thursday upped the ante against Rahul Gandhi, saying the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha has committed “treason” with his remarks in the US. “Rahul Gandhi has committed ‘rashtradroh’ (treason) in the US. The entire country is hurt by the kind of image of India he has projected in the US,” BJP national spokesperson Sambit Patra said at party headquarters here while replying to media queries.



Rajnath Singh urges global unity amidst wars

His remarks come in the backdrop of calls for India's potential role in pushing peace talks between Russia and Ukraine as New Delhi has good relations with both the nations. The minister said India is collaborating with friendly nations on a range of advanced and high-tech projects. While exercises like Tarang Shakti have significant tactical value, they also serve as a platform to foster greater mutual cooperation, coordination, and trust among participating countries, he noted. “Such initiatives build confidence among our partners, reinforcing our collective commitment to stand united when needed. Through Tarang Shakti, we have further solidified our defence relationships with partner nations,” he said. Rajnath Singh urged the foreign dignitaries present on the occasion to thoroughly explore and study India's aerospace sector. “This first hand experience will provide insight into the rapid advancements and promising capabilities of India's defence manufacturing industry. It is an excellent opportunity to discuss how we can advance our collaboration in defence manufacturing,” he said. The minister said India is enthusiastic about working together and aims for partnership to extend beyond political and technical realms. “We want our cooperation to be not limited to just political or technical synergy but to transform into a heart-to-heart synergy,” he said. The defence minister said today, India stands not only as the fastest growing economy globally but also is home to one of the world's most formidable armed forces.



NSA Doval meets Vladimir Putin amid Ukraine conflict talks

National Security Advisor Ajit Doval on Thursday met Russian President Vladimir Putin amid renewed efforts to find a solution to the Ukraine conflict. The meeting took place on the margins of a conclave of national security advisors of the BRICS (Brazil-Russia-India-China-South Africa) nations in St Petersburg. In the talks, Putin hoped that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will travel to Russia's Kazan next month to attend the annual BRICS summit. The Russian President also proposed a bilateral meeting with Modi on October 22 on the sidelines of the BRICS summit to analyse bilateral engagement and to discuss “future-oriented” actions. “We are waiting for our good friend Modi and best regards to him,” the Russian media quoted Putin as saying in the meeting with Doval. On Wednesday, the NSA held wide-ranging talks with his Russian counterpart Sergei Shoigu and discussed important issues of “mutual interests”. It is understood that Modi's talks with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy in Kyiv on August 23 figured in the talks between the two NSAs. “Both sides reviewed progress in bilateral cooperation and discussed important issues of mutual interest,” the Indian embassy in Russia said on the talks between Doval and Shoigu. Doval's visit to Russia comes two-and-a-half weeks after Modi paid a high-profile trip to Ukrainian capital Kyiv. In his talks with Zelenskyy, Modi said both Ukraine and Russia should sit together without wasting time to end the ongoing war and that India was ready to play an “active role” to restore peace in the region. The prime minister said India was on the side of peace since the beginning of the conflict and he would even like to contribute personally for a peaceful resolution of the crisis.

SC displeased with Punjab, Haryana HC inaction on judicial officer's reinstatement

The Supreme Court has expressed displeasure over the Punjab and Haryana High Court's decision of not reinstating a judicial officer, sacked for an alleged affair with a lady judicial officer, despite the top court setting aside his termination letter in 2022. The issue has been moving between the high court and the apex court since 2009. A bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice P B Varale, in its recent order, noted that the apex court on April 20, 2022, set aside the high court's October 25, 2018, order dismissing the male judicial officer's plea against his termination from service. It had directed the full court of the high court to reconsider its decision of sacking the judicial officer. The Supreme Court had also noted that on October 26, 2018, the same division bench of the high court allowed the petition of the lady judicial officer and set aside the termination order, after disbelieving the allegations of an illicit relationship. “Once the termination order is set aside (by SC in 2022) and the judgement of the high court dismissing the writ petition challenging the said termination order has also been



set aside, the natural consequence is that the employee should be taken back in service and thereafter proceeded with as per the directions,” the top court bench said recently. The apex court bench said that once the termination order is set aside then the employee is deemed to be in service. “We find no justification in the inaction of the high court and also the state in not taking back the appellant (judicial officer) into service after the order dated April 20, 2022. “No decision was taken either by the high court or by the state of taking back the appellant into service and no decision was made regarding the back wages from the date the termination order had been passed till the date of reinstatement which should be the

date of the judgement of this court,” the bench said. It added the judicial officer would thus be entitled to full salary for the period from the date of judgment dated April 20, 2022, till a fresh termination order was passed on April 2, 2024, to be calculated with all benefits admissible treating the appellant to be in continuous service. The bench directed that insofar as the period from December 18, 2009, that is after the termination order of December 17, 2009, was passed till April 19, 2022, the date prior to the judgement and order of this court, “we are of the view that ends of justice would be served by directing that the appellant would be entitled to 50 per cent of the back wages treating him to be in service continuously”. It added such back wages to be calculated with all benefits admissible under law to the appellant as if he was in service. The bench granted liberty to the judicial officer to challenge before the high court, the resolution of the full court of the high court dated August 3, 2023, and the termination order dated April 2, 2024. The judicial officer joined Punjab Civil Services (Judicial Branch) in 2006. At the time of joining the service in December 2006, the appellant was already married.

BJP slams Congress for Police lathi-charge, violence in Himachal, Karnataka

The BJP on Thursday slammed the Congress for police lathi-charge in Himachal Pradesh on protesters demanding demolition of an alleged illegal portion of a mosque in Shimla, asking the party to stop appeasement politics. Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters here, Lok Sabha MP and party national spokesperson Sambit Patra also played the Congress over violence in Mandya district of Karnataka, alleging that stones were pelted and slippers were thrown at Lord Ganesha's idol at the behest of the party. The Congress rules both Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka. Protesters demanding the demolition of an alleged illegal portion of a mosque in Shimla's Sanjauli area clashed with security personnel on Wednesday, breaking barricades and pelting stones as the police used water

cannon and charged batons to disperse them. About 10 people including police and women were injured. Violent clashes broke out between two groups during Ganesh idol procession in Nagamangala town of Mandya in Karnataka. The police have arrested 46 people in connection with the incident, authorities said on Thursday. Accusing the Congress of pursuing appeasement politics in the two states under its rule, Patra said, “Rahul Gandhi's ‘mohabbat ki dukan’ is not only getting lathi charged and tear gas fired on Hindus in Himachal Pradesh, it is also engaged in getting stones pelted and slippers thrown at Lord Ganesha's idols in Karnataka.” “Love for an illegal mosque and lathi-charge on Hindus will obviously happen when Rahul Gandhi meets (US law-maker) Ilhan Omar,” he added. The BJP leader condemned the incident of police lathi-charge and demanded that the mosque in Shimla should be done away with if it is illegal. “It's surprising that the local municipal council has served several notices seeking documents but the mosque administration is yet to do so,” he said. “Lathi-charge Hindus and recharge of the mosque will not be allowed.”

IMD warns of extremely heavy rain in Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Thursday a depression that originated over central India is expected to bring heavy to extremely heavy rain in Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh and their adjacent region over the next two to three days. According to the latest IMD update issued at 1 pm, the system was located around 50 kilometres south-southeast of Agra and 50 kilometres north-northeast of Gwalior. It is expected to continue moving towards the north-northeast direction and gradually weaken on Friday. The IMD said Uttarakhand is likely to experience light to moderate rainfall from September 12 to 14, with heavy to extremely heavy rainfall in isolated areas. Haryana is expected to see light to moderate rain, with heavy rainfall at times between September 12 and 15. East and west Uttar Pradesh may experience heavy to extremely heavy rainfall during this period. In Madhya Pradesh, heavy rainfall is expected on September 12, followed by moderate to heavy rain over the next few days.

Niti Aayog suggests Public Health Emergency Management Act for future pandemics

With Covid-19 pandemic exposing significant gaps in global health preparedness, a report by Niti Aayog expert group has underscored the need for responding in the first 100 days of an outbreak and suggested enacting separate legislation to handle public health crises if any in future. The report, “Future Pandemic Preparedness and Emergency Response – A Framework for Action,” proposes the creation of a Public Health Emergency Management Act (PHEMA), which would facilitate a holistic approach to health management, covering prevention, control, and disaster response. The report which provides a blueprint for the country to prepare for any future public health emergency or pandem-



ic and have a rapid response system comes amid WHO warning to tackle the unknown deadly ‘Disease X, which could be 20 times deadlier than COVID-19’. Led by Dr. Renu Swarup, with members including Dr. Soumya Swaminathan and Dr. Sujeet Singh, the expert group's proposals aim to better equip India and the global community for future pandemics and

health emergencies. “It will allow a holistic approach to health management, covering prevention, control, and disaster response, the report added. “The Act would also provide for the creation of skilled public health cadres at national and state levels,” said the report which also outlines recommendations for establishing a dedicated Pandemic Preparedness and

Emergency Response (PPER) fund and creating institutionalised and empowered governance mechanisms. “The report highlights the need for a well-structured scorecard mechanism to regularly monitor progress on key preparedness targets, especially in light of WHO warnings about potential new zoonotic outbreaks. As countries and international organizations work to enhance their readiness for novel pathogens, the WHO has identified approximately 30 viral and bacterial families with potential epidemic or pandemic risk. These targets necessitate focused research, development of advanced diagnostic techniques, and effective countermeasures. The report's recommendations align with global efforts to bolster pandemic preparedness and response capabilities.

Entod Pharmaceuticals to challenge suspension of PresVu

Mumbai-based Entod Pharmaceuticals said on Thursday that it has decided to move the court to challenge the national drug regulator's suspension of permission to manufacture and market its ophthalmic solution formulation, branded as PresVu. The company denied the regulatory authority's allegation that it has engaged in unauthorised promotion of the product through media. Nikkhil K Masurkar, CEO of the pharma firm, in a press statement said that this action is against a pharma company in the MSME sector, which is purely research and innovation driven and attempts to bring new therapeutic options to the Indian market.



“As a result, we have decided to challenge this suspension in the court of law to get justice,” said Masurkar. “Our fight will not only allow innovative medicines to be available in India but also encourage other pharmaceutical entrepreneurs and companies in the MSME sector to continue the research drive in India without facing similar obstacles,” he said. The company also said that it has not made any unethical or false presentation of facts to the media or public when it comes to PresVu eye drops. All facts disclosed to the media were strictly on the basis of the recent approval by the Drugs Controller General (India) for

treatment of presbyopia in adults and the results of the phase 3 clinical trial conducted by us in India. “Announcing the new product launch to the media is a routine industry practice followed by all pharma companies in India and in the recent past, many such announcements have been made. In our case, media reports went viral and public imagination led to an unusual escalation for which Entod Pharmaceuticals is not responsible,” he said. The approval by DCGI was based on a valid controlled clinical trial in 234 patients which was successful in showing efficacy and safety of these eye drops in patients of presbyopia, who used these drops without eye glasses and could read additional lines on Snellen's chart which is a yardstick of near vision improvement.

Political Parties to recalibrate poll strategy to nullify impact of AIP on vote bank

With the arrival of the Chief of Awami Ittehad Party (AIP) and Parliamentary from Baramulla, Sheikh Abdul Rashid, in Kashmir Valley on Thursday the mainstream political parties may have to recalibrate their poll strategy to nullify its impact on their traditional vote bank in the run-up to the first phase of polling on September 18. Rashid, lodged in Tihar jail since August 2019, was granted interim bail till October 2 in the terror funding case on Wednesday. Soon after stepping out of the Tihar jail in New Delhi on Wednesday Sheikh Abdul Rashid announced his party intends to contest between 35 to 40 seats in the upcoming Jammu and Kashmir Assembly elections without forming coalitions with any political party. Around three dozen candidates have filed their nomination papers from different assembly

constituencies in Kashmir Valley. His presence during the campaign period is set to boost the poll prospects of his party candidates. On the other hand, it may also force the other key players to calibrate their campaign strategy to counter his campaign, especially in his strong bastion of North Kashmir. Rashid's party emerged ahead of National Conference during the Lok Sabha polls on at least 14 Assembly segments. He handed over a crushing defeat to former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah by a margin of over 2 lakh votes. As was expected, soon after landing in Srinagar, Rashid played to the galleries at every step. Moving out of the airport premises, he deboarded from his four-wheeler and went on his knees to kiss Mother Earth. Returning home after more than five years in prison, Rashid, in his first remarks said no one needs peace more



than the people of Kashmir but they want it on their conditions and not on terms set by the Centre. “We want to tell (Prime Minister Narendra) Modi that no one needs peace more than we do. But that peace will come at our conditions, not yours. Expressing gratitude to his supporters who had assembled outside the airport to welcome him, the Baramulla MP said he wants to convey to the people of

Kashmir that they are not weak at all. “The people of Kashmir will win as the people of Jammu and Kashmir are on the path of truth. He later drove straight to Delina, Baramulla where he addressed a public rally. In his trademark style, Rashid attempted to woo the jubilant crowd amid loud slogan shouting and passionate cheering. He called for an end to imprisoning Kashmiris in

Tihar Jail while urging the centre to resolve the Kashmir issue once and for all. “Tihar bhejna bandh karo, Kashmir ka masla hal karo.” (Stop sending us to Tihar, resolve Kashmir's issue), he said as his supporters kept cheering. Later addressing a press conference Sheikh Abdul Rashid claimed his party would extend full support to the INDIA alliance if it brought a resolution about restoration of Article 370 in the Parliament.

“Let me clarify this. If the INDIA alliance gives me written assurance that it will introduce a resolution in the Parliament about restoration of Article 370, I along with my party leaders will extend full support to it.” Seeking people's support Rashid appealed to the people to give him at least 40 seats in the upcoming elections in J&K. Targeting the National Conference Vice President Omar Abdullah, Er Rashid said that the NC has released a detailed manifesto promising this and that. “Why couldn't the party do the same when they were in power,” he asked. He also attacked PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti continuously. Rashid said that it was the then PDP patron Mufti Muhammad Sayeed who said that voting for PDP was a must to stop BJP's entry into J&K. “Then what happened? The same PDP provided a launching pad to BJP who bulldozed our dreams,” Er Rashid said.



Two men held for attack on young Army officers near Mhow in MP

Police on Thursday said they have arrested two of the six persons who allegedly assaulted two army officers and raped their female friend near Mhow in Madhya Pradesh. Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi slammed the BJP over the incident. The incident took place near Mhow-Mandleshwar road, 30 km from Mhow in Indore district in the wee hours Wednesday. The six men assaulted the two young army officers and raped one of their two female friends, police said. The army officers, aged 23 and 24, undergoing the Young Officers course at the Infantry School in Mhow cantonment town, had gone out for a picnic along with their two female friends. A search is underway for the other four persons allegedly involved in the attack and rape, police said. The group of six reached the picnic spot around two a m and started assaulting one of the officers and his female friend, who were sitting in the car, police said. Upon hearing the commotion, the other officer and his woman friend, who were on a hilltop, reached the spot. After police reached the spot, the army officers and their female friends were brought to Mhow civil hospital, where a medical examination confirmed that one of the women was raped, an official said. A case has been registered under sections 70 (gang rape), 310-2 (dacoity), 308-2 (extortion) and 115-2 (voluntarily causing hurt) of

the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and under sections of the Arms Act based on the complaint filed by the officer. One of those arrested reportedly has a case of loot registered against him in 2016. Wednesday's incident took place in Jam Gate area of the hilly region surrounded by forests, Superintendent of Police (Rural) Hitika Vasal said. Badgonda police station in-charge Lokendra Singh Hirore said the accused held one of the couples captive while beating them up, and told the other couple that the hostages would be released only when they give them Rs 10 lakh. “The complainant has told us that the accused took his woman friend away to a place and he suspected that she was raped. The woman's statement is yet to be recorded,” the official said. Rahul Gandhi slammed the BJP over the attack, saying the negative attitude of the BJP government towards increasing crimes against women is “extremely worrying”. Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said the prime minister talks big about women's safety, but women across the country are still waiting for a serious effort for their safety. In a social media post, Rahul Gandhi said the violence against the two army men and the rape of their female companion in Madhya Pradesh is enough to shame the entire society. In her social media post, Priyanka Gandhi said the incidents of gang rape of a woman after holding army officers hostage in Madhya Pradesh and finding of the naked body of a woman on the highway in Uttar Pradesh are “heart-wrenching”.

CPI(M) in quandary over next party chief election

Race for the top job in CPI(M) has begun days ahead of the demise of Sitaram Yechury, the general secretary of the party. M A Baby, the polit bureau member from Kerala is the front runner for the post as he has set his eyes on the post of general secretary. Baby, who had won the assembly election once from Kerala and became the education minister in the government led by E K Nayanar was addressed as the Second Mundassery as he had tried to replicate the reforms initiated by the first education minister of the State Prof Joseph Mundassery (1957-1959). “While Joseph Mundassery revolutionized the education sector in Kerala, Baby could not make any impact other than making things worse,” said A Jayasankar, Kerala's veteran political critic. Baby is known more as Prakkulam Che Guevera (Prakkulam being the village where he



was born and Guevera, his God). P Sujathan, a close observer of the CPI(M) politics, is of the view that it would be a tough job for the CPI(M) to find out an alternative to Yechury. “Sitaram Yechury is known for his articulation, communication skills and was a master strategist. The truth is that there is no one in the party who could take up the position held by him,” said Sujathan. The names being heard are that of Brinda Karat and Prakash Karat. “The latter may continue till the next party congress scheduled for April-May 2025 and then

make way for a new person. We do not know how the Marxists will view the possibility of Brinda Karat becoming the party boss,” said Sujathan. The death of Yechury comes at a time when the CPI(M) is facing severe crisis in Kerala, the one and only State which is ruled by the party. There is a strong move in the party ousting Pinarayi Vijayan from the Chief Minister's post and it is widely believed that Baby is the main force behind this mission. Hence the chances of Vijayan and his cohorts supporting Baby for the job look bleak. The names of Mohammed Salim , the Bengal State secretary and Surjya Kant Mishra are also in circulation. Salim being a member of the minority community has better prospectus than others because of his standing in the party. The truth is that there are no other members in the party's polit bureau who has wider acceptability among the cadre.

Former Congress MLA breaks down as party denies ticket

Former Haryana Congress MLA Lalit Nagar Thursday broke down in tears on being denied a ticket for the October 5 Assembly polls, saying even though he worked hard to strengthen his party, he was “stabbed in the back”. 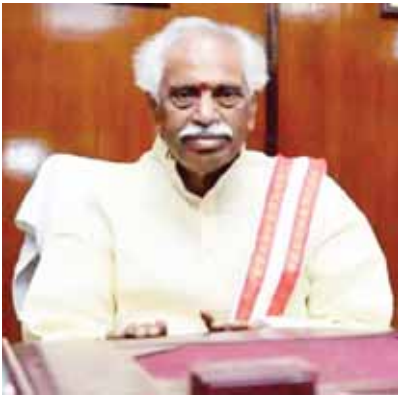
After the BJP, the Congress too is facing resentment in the state from some of the aspirants who have been denied tickets. Lalit Nagar told his supporters that he was hoping to get a ticket but “some conspirators stabbed me in the back”. On the Congress picking Rohit Nagar instead to contest from Tigaon, the former MLA said, “Had my party filed a strong candidate, I could have understood. But such a candidate has given a ticket whom people don't even know.” He also sought suggestions from his supporters who asked him to enter the fray as an Independent candidate. “Now, you will have to fight my election,” Lalit Nagar

added. Rathore, a former MLA and ticket hopeful from Ballabhgarh, also broke down in tears in front of her supporters after she was denied a ticket by the Congress. Her supporters alleged that she had been “betrayed” by her party. Resentment also came to the fore in the Sohna assembly segment in Gurugram where strong contender and senior party leader Jitender Kumar Bhardwaj was not given a ticket. “Sorry friends, today, service, dedication and devotion have lost,” Bhardwaj posted in Hindi on social media. The Congress Thursday announced the candidature of new joinee Rohtash Khatana, who has been associated with JJP previously, as the party candidate from Sohna. The ruling BJP in Haryana also faced rebellion on a few seats after the party denied tickets to some leaders. Voting for the 90 assembly seats in Haryana will be held on October 5 and votes will be counted on October 8.

Haryana Governor Bandaru Dattatreya dissolves the State Assembly

Haryana Governor Bandaru Dattatreya on Thursday dissolved the state Assembly with immediate effect, a day after the state cabinet recommended the move to avoid summoning the House before the expiry of the six-month period from the last sitting. According to a notification issued by Haryana Vidhan Sabha secretariat, the Governor has dissolved the assembly with immediate effect in exercise of the powers conferred under Article 174 (2) (b) of the Constitution of India, which gives the Governor of a state the power to dissolve the state's legislative assembly. The Haryana cabinet had on Wednesday recommended to Governor Dattatreya to dissolve the Assembly to avoid summoning the House before the expiry of the six-month period from the last sitting. The term of the current Vidhan Sabha expires on November 3. After the governor's move to dissolve the assembly, the Nayab Singh Saini government will continue as a caretaker government till a new one is formed, sources said. Official sources had earlier said that



summoning of the House before the end of the six-month period from the last session is a constitutional requirement. The cabinet move to recommend assembly's dissolution appeared to avert any constitutional crisis. The Haryana Assembly's last session was held on March 13 when the Saini government had won the trust vote and the next session had to be convened by September 12. Saini replaced Manohar Lal Khattar as chief minister in March. Khattar is now a Union Minister. Earlier, the Haryana Cabinet had met here Wednesday evening and accorded

approval to a proposal regarding the dissolution of the 14th Haryana Vidhan Sabha, an official release had earlier said. “The proposal will now be sent to the Haryana governor for approval,” it had said. Polls have already been announced in Haryana which are scheduled to be held on October 5 and the results are slated to be out on October 8. The government has been summoning the monsoon session in August, mostly after Independence Day. However, polls were announced on August 16 after which the government did not summon a session. In the 90-member Assembly, which has been dissolved now, the present strength of ruling BJP members was 41 including the Speaker, Congress 28, JJP 6, Haryana Lokhit Party and Indian National Lok Dal 1 member each, Independents 4, while 9 seats are vacant. Among the nine seats, while seven fell vacant as legislators across parties resigned after joining other outfits, Badshahpur seat is vacant after Rakesh Daulatabad, Independent MLA representing the seat died in May while Mulana seat is lying vacant after Congress' Varun Chaudhary, who represented it, fought parliamentary polls and got elected from Ambala.

Congress, BJP leaders file their nominations for Haryana Assembly polls

Congress leader Randeep Surjewala's son Aditya Surjewala, BJP's Shruti Choudhry, the granddaughter of former Chief Minister Bansi Lal, and Kurukshetra MP Naveen Jindal's mother Savitri Jindal were among several leaders who filed their nominations on Thursday for the Haryana Assembly polls. Indian National Lok Dal (INLD) leader Abhay Chautala filed his papers from Ellenabad while BJP nominee and minister Mahipal Dhandra and former Haryana deputy chief minister Chander Mohan, a Congress candidate, filed their nominations from Panipat Rural and Panchkula seats, respectively. Polling for the 90 assembly seats in Haryana will be held on October 5 and votes will be counted on October 8. Thursday was the last day for filing nominations.

The scrutiny of the nomination papers will be done on September 13 and nominations can be withdrawn till September 16. Aditya Surjewala filed his papers from the Kaithal assembly seat. He was accompanied by his father and the Congress' Rajya Sabha MP Randeep Surjewala. Shruti Choudhry filed her papers from the Tosham seat in the presence of her mother and Rajya Sabha MP Kiran Choudhry and the BJP's Haryana in-charge Biplab Kumar Deb. The BJP's Kurukshetra MP Naveen Jindal's mother Savitri Jindal, who was an aspirant for a poll ticket from the party for the Haryana Assembly elections, filed her nomination from the Hisar seat as an Independent. She had aspired for a BJP ticket to contest the polls from Hisar but the party renominated sitting MLA and state minister Kamal Gupta from the seat.

Forbes India has listed Savitri, the wife of noted industrialist late O P Jindal, as the richest woman in the country this year having a net worth of USD 29.1 billion. Savitri was elected as an MLA from the Hisar seat twice. She represented Hisar in the Haryana Assembly for the first time in 2005 as a Congress MLA and was reelected from the seat in 2009. She was made a minister in the Bhupinder Singh Hooda government in 2013. She quit the Congress in March this year when her son Naveen Jindal also left the party and later joined the BJP. After filing her nomination, she said, “I have pledged to serve Hisar for its development and transformation. The people of Hisar are my family and Om Prakash Jindal had established my relationship with this family.” “The Jindal family has always served Hisar. I am fully

dedicated to living up to the expectations of the people and maintaining their trust,” Savitri Jindal said. Congress nominee Ashok Arora, accompanied by senior party leader and former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, filed his papers from the Thanesar seat in Kurukshetra district. Party nominee Nirmal Singh filed his papers from Ambala City, Akram Khan from Jagadhri, Bharat Singh Beniwal from Ellenabad, Ram Niwas Rara from Hisar, Anita Yadav from Ateli and Bhagwan Dass from Nilokheri. The scrutiny of the nomination papers will be conducted on September 13 and nominations can be withdrawn till September 16. The ruling BJP is eyeing a hat-trick in the assembly polls but faces a stiff challenge from a resurgent Congress, which is looking to cash in on the anti-incumbency factor.

Four states join Kerala's push for reform in Central funding

The finance ministers of four opposition-ruled states expressed solidarity with Kerala on Thursday in its quest for fiscal flexibility and a performance-based share of funds from the Central government. The non-BJP-ruled states -- Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Punjab -- took part in the conclave organised by the Left-ruled Kerala here, which was also attended by the senior officials of the participating states. Telangana Deputy Chief

Minister and Finance Minister, Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu, Tamil Nadu Finance Minister Thangam Thennarasu, Karnataka Revenue Minister, Krishna Byre Gowda, and Punjab Finance Minister Sardar Harpal Singh Cheema took part in the conclave and raised voices against the fiscal policies of the BJP-led Central government. Earlier, Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan inaugurated the conclave presided over by Finance Minister K N Balagopal and attended by Leader of Opposition in the

Kerala Assembly, V D Satheesan. Addressing the gathering, Karnataka Minister Gowda said there was no reciprocation from the union government for the states that have been contributing to the Centre. Punjab Minister Cheema said he expects the 16th Finance Commission to devise a formula for the allocation of the divisible pool that not only incentivises states to perform better on the development matters but also allocates ample resources to the states that need support to



enhance their performance. Telangana Minister Mallu said the Centre often exceeds its own fiscal deficit target

and creates an unjust situation where fiscally responsible states are restricted in their borrowing

capacity, while the union government enjoys greater financial flexibility. “It is necessary that the Kerala interpretation of Article 293 is followed and the powers of Centre are redefined in favour of state fiscal autonomy. The framers of our Constitution never intended centralised financial control. The Finance Commission was established to ensure fair and equitable distribution of resources between the Centre and the states. “I suggest that we study the impact of devolving more funds to the poorest states so

that we can explore changes if necessary,” Mulla said. The Telangana Dy CM said there should be an increase in the states' share in Central taxes from 41 per cent to 50 per cent, resisting the Centre's increasing use of cesses and surcharges, reducing the Centrally sponsored schemes and allowing the states to spend on their local priorities. He said it was not just about technical adjustments but was about justice, equity and the future of Indian federalism. “We must ensure our states have the resources and autonomy needed to chart

their own development path,” Mulla said. Meanwhile, Tamil Nadu Minister Thennarasu said the Indian polity has an “inherent imbalance” in the distribution of powers and responsibilities between union and the states. He said while the states are entrusted with the majority of responsibility related to the development of society and delivery of public services, including education, health, agriculture, and social welfare, the union retains the majority of the powers of revenue generation.

Ayushman bhav!

The Union Cabinet extends Ayushman Bharat to senior citizens Above 70; a move that would benefit six crore people

In a significant move the Union Cabinet has approved the extension of the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme to all citizens above 70 years of age, regardless of their income or social standing. The Cabinet's decision fulfils a key promise made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during the 2024 Lok Sabha election campaign. This move is expected to transform healthcare for senior citizens, providing much-needed relief to millions who have been struggling with rising medical costs and insufficient insurance coverage. Since its launch over five years ago, Ayushman Bharat has provided healthcare access to millions across India, covering hospitalisations and treatments for families that otherwise couldn't afford medical care. However, data has shown that nearly every fourth person admitted to hospitals under this scheme has been a senior citizen, highlighting their disproportionate need for medical support. Out of over one crore admissions, 24% were of citizens aged 60 and above, demonstrating how



essential this safety net is for the elderly. The latest decision to extend coverage to all citizens over 70 is particularly significant as this age group is often neglected by private insurers. Most health insurance companies either refuse to offer policies to those above 70 or charge prohibitively high premiums. Even when insurance is available, pre-existing conditions are often excluded for the first two to three years, leaving many senior citizens without immediate access to treatment for serious ailments like heart disease, kidney issues, and diabetes. With the new policy, six crore people over 70 years of age are expected to benefit, receiving health insurance coverage up to Rs 5 lakh per year. This applies on a family basis, ensuring that elderly individuals, even those abandoned by families or facing financial hardships, can now access free or affordable medical care. The extension of Ayushman Bharat to all citizens above 70 comes at a critical time. Procedures like dialysis, heart surgeries, and cancer treatments are not only expensive but also frequent among senior citizens. The new policy provides a safety net for seniors who have, until now, been forced to bear these expenses themselves or rely on insufficient public health programs. Rs 5 lakh coverage under Ayushman Bharat will lift much of this financial burden, enabling families to access quality healthcare without worrying about their savings. Apart from the direct medical benefits, this policy could have far-reaching social implications. India's senior citizens, especially those in rural or economically disadvantaged areas, often face neglect and abandonment when they become ill. This policy not only promises improved healthcare outcomes but also offers dignity and security to millions of older Indians at a time when they need it most. As this initiative rolls out, its impact on families, communities, and the healthcare system at large will likely be profound, marking a significant leap toward inclusive and accessible healthcare for all.

Resignation shakes Trinamool Congress

Jawahar Sircar's resignation from Rajya Saha highlights growing discontent in Bengal over the State's response to crimes against women

Trinamool Congress Member of Rajya Sabha and former Chairman of Prasar Bharati Jawahar Sircar has resigned both from parliament and the party. Sircar tendered resignation to protest the 'mishandling' of the trainee-doctor rape-cum-murder case at RG Kar Medical in Kolkata. The resignation is significant as Sircar is part of 'Kolkata Bhahdralok' which has so far remained steadfast in its support of West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee. The move also indicates that the West Bengal assembly passing a 'very stringent anti-rape law' bill has not cut much ice with the people, who so far have resisted condoning the errors committed by the Mamata government in the matter.

The West Bengal bill, which has now been referred by the Governor to the President, has also not found much echo outside the state. The Aparajita Woman and Child (West Bengal Criminal Laws Amendment) Bill, 2024, passed by the West Bengal Assembly is not the first of its kind. In the past five years, Andhra Pradesh (Disha) and Maharashtra (Shakti) passed similar bills with a death penalty clause against the rapists but they are still to bring any change in the matter. All these bills were preceded by Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2013 through which Capital Punishment for rape made its entry into the Indian Penal Code. This followed the public outrage after the brutal gang rape and murder of a woman on a moving bus in Delhi on December 16, 2012, which shook the collective conscience of the nation. Parliament passed the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2013 to allow the death penalty in rape cases where the accompanying brutality leads to death or leaves the victim in a persistent vegetative state. Whatever name you may give Aparajita, Disha or Shakti, these bills are meaningless as long as cases about rape remain pending in the courts for years together. In 2022, com-



mitted with those brought in the previous years, courts had around 2 lakh cases for trial. However, trials could be completed in only a little over 18,000 cases, which was less than the number of incidents as well as police charge sheets filed that year. Finally, the conviction rate of 27.4% in rape cases means seven out of every 10 accused persons were acquitted. So just making the laws doesn't help. Speaking at a function some months back, Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud had quoted BR Ambedkar saying, "However bad a Constitution may be, it may turn out to be good if those responsible for its functioning happen to be a good lot." Maker of the Constitution in the concluding speech before the Constituent Assembly had said, "However good a Constitution may be, it is sure to turn out bad because those who are called to work it, happen to be a bad lot. However bad a Constitution may be, it may turn out to be good if those who are called to work it, happen to be a good lot. The Constitution can provide only the organs of the State such as the Legislature, the

Executive and the Judiciary. The factors on which the working of those organs of the State depends are the people and the political parties they will set up as their instruments to carry out their wishes and their politics." If the rapes are not stopping in this country or if the anti-rape laws are not proving to be effective in punishing the rapists, its a failure of culture more than the law. Our society is not very forthcoming the accommodating the woes of a rape victim, and in most cases, the survivor and the family are subjected to terrible humiliation. Those tasked with implementing the Constitution have to possess the spirit of public service rather than political expediency. There is a recent case study carried out by the Uttar Pradesh Police in Ghaziabad district which reiterates the premise. There is an existing government policy for establishing Pink Police Outposts under every police station. The rules have been there but not much work has been done beyond the customary launching of the programme with much fanfare. However, Ghaziabad Police last year

decided to implement the programme in mission mode, and 20 Pink Booths exclusively manned by female police personnel were established in September 2023. A year later the results were for all to see. The mere presence of a force for women's safety had its impact. According to the data released by Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems of Uttar Pradesh Police, crime against women which included dowry deaths, dowry-related cases, molestation, rape and kidnapping came down by approximately 24 per cent. The biggest fall of over 36 per cent was in dowry deaths thus at least securing women inside their homes. If such an initiative by Ghaziabad Police can achieve such results one is sure at the state government level such steps can be taken more effectively. One is not sure how effectively have these pink police outposts been functioning in West Bengal, where the government has just brought a more stringent anti-rape law. The erosion of local cultures and the rise of digital colonisation

DIPLOMATIC BOOST TO SEMICONDUCTORS

India and Singapore are building a resilient semiconductor supply chain

Domestic politics may be a key issue for the ruling NDA alliance, however, it has not taken away Prime Minister Narendra Modi's focus on constantly working on fine-tuning India's foreign policy. PM Modi recently was in Brunei a first for any Indian Prime Minister on a bilateral state visit, to a country located strategically in the South China Sea. Brunei's visit was topped by the PM's visit to Singapore, an important technology ally for India in the region. India and Singapore will be entering into the 60th year of diplomatic relationship next year and both countries have decided to upgrade their existing bilateral partnership to a Comprehensive strategic partnership, which would in turn expand the areas of cooperation. One of the key focus, during PM Modi's visit to Singapore was expanding the digital cooperation between the countries. The joint statement released read "Both Prime Ministers welcomed the signing of the MoU on cooperation in the field of Digital Technologies and affirmed common interests in data, AI and cybersecurity. Building on this, both Prime Ministers agreed to deepen collaboration in the digital space, including in facilitating trusted cross-border data flows, cybersecurity, and the interoperability of digital systems." A crucial element of the partnership was a demonstration under the trade trust framework. Singapore is home to many large Technology companies, many of whom have regional headquarters in the island state, with the business geography, spread all across Asia primarily India.



Advance technology manufacturing and semiconductors formed another crucial element of the PM's visit. The statement read "Both Prime Ministers agreed to explore cooperation in the area of critical and emerging technologies. Both Prime Ministers agreed that advanced manufacturing, particularly in developing resilient semiconductor supply chains, can be a new pillar of bilateral cooperation. Both Prime Ministers welcomed the signing of the MoU on the India-Singapore Semiconductor Ecosystem Partnership. Immediately after the PM visited Singapore the US government also announced a new partnership with India to explore supply chain opportunities in India. Funded under the International Technology Security and Innovation (ITSI) Fund, created by the CHIPS Act of 2022 (CHIPS Act) of the US, it allows the department to spend some money on developing a trusted supply chain ecosystem with partners and allies. A US State Department press release read, "The initial phase includes a comprehensive assessment of India's existing semiconductor ecosystem and regulatory framework, as well as workforce and infrastructure needs. The state anticipates that key Indian stakeholders, such as state governments, educational institutions, research centres, and private companies, will participate in this analysis steered by the India Semiconductor Mission. The insights gained from the assessment will serve as the basis for potential future joint initiatives to strengthen and grow this critical sector. The United States and India are key partners in ensuring the global semiconductor supply chain keeps pace with the global digital transformation currently underway. Manufacturing of essential products ranging from vehicles to medical devices relies on the strength and resilience of the semiconductor supply chain." This week India also hosted SEMICON a global conference that attracts investments in the Indian semiconductor ecosystem. India is trying to attract investments for a crucial component of most modern equipment and machinery called chips. The recent visits by the PM to Singapore and the Memorandum of Understanding with the US may provide the much-needed kickstart for India's semiconductor ecosystem. *(The writer is a policy analyst; views expressed are personal)*

India's Paralympic journey of resilience and triumph

Through sheer determination and perseverance, para athletes have steadily overcome the odds, earning global recognition and bringing glory to the nation

The Paris Paralympics unfolded as a captivating display of athletic excellence, particularly for the Indian contingent. It was a spectacle, with each athlete embodying a harmonious blend of strength, determination, and skill – almost like poetry in motion. As an avid follower, I found myself engrossed in nearly every performance, regardless of the challenging (IST) time difference that saw events commence under the glowing silhouette of the Eiffel Tower. On the rare occasions when I could not watch live, social media provided timely updates, fuelling my enthusiasm and admiration for these remarkable athletes. Their tenacity and commitment to realizing their dreams on the global stage were evident as they competed and excelled across multiple disciplines, leaving an indelible mark on the world of sports. India delivered its best-ever performance at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games, achieving a historic 29-medal haul that included seven gold, nine silver, and 13 bronze medals. This outstanding achievement surpassed the 19-medal tally from Tokyo 2020, where India had won five golds, and marked a significant milestone as the country crossed the 50-medal mark in its Paralympic history. A record 84 para-athletes represented India across 12 disciplines, including the debut participation in para-cycling, para-rowing, and blind judo. Among the shining stars, Avani Lekhara became the first Indian woman to win two golds at the Paralympic Games, defending her title in the women's 10m air rifle standing SH1 shooting event with a world-record score. Meanwhile, India saw its first-ever one-two finish in athletics, with Dharambir and Parnav Soorma clinching gold and silver in the men's club throw F51 event. Dharambir also set a new Asian record of 34.92m. In athletics, several Indian para-athletes etched their names in the record books. Praveen Kumar set an Asian record en route to winning the high jump T64 title, securing India's sixth gold medal – their highest total at the Paralympics. Javelin thrower Sumit Antil made history as the first Indian man to defend his Paralympic title, winning gold in the men's javelin throw F64 with a stunning throw of 70.59m, breaking his record from Tokyo 2020 not once but

three times. Mariyappan Thangavelu, with a bronze in the high jump T42 class, became the first Indian to win medals at three consecutive Paralympic Games, having previously won gold at Rio 2016 and silver at Tokyo 2020. Preethi Pal secured India's first-ever medal in a track event at the Paralympics with a bronze in the women's 100m T35 race and won another bronze in the 200m, becoming India's most successful athlete at the Games with two medals. The track events also saw Deepti Jeevanji become the first intellectually impaired Indian athlete to win a Paralympic medal with a bronze in the women's 400m T20 class. India's achievements extended beyond the track and field to other disciplines. In archery, armless archer Sheetal Devi briefly set a world record in the ranking round and later teamed up with Rakesh Kumar to achieve a world record score in the compound mixed team qualification event. It was a perfect example of poetry in motion. At just 17, Sheetal made history as India's youngest Paralympic medalist by winning a bronze in the mixed team event. Moreover, India's dominance in archery was further confirmed when Harvinder Singh became the country's first-ever Paralympic archery champion. The outstanding performances by Indian para-athletes at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games underscored India's emergence as a formidable contender on the global stage. Originating in 1948 with a sports event for World War II veterans with spinal injuries, organized by Sir Ludwig Guttmann in Stoke Mandeville, England, the Paralympics evolved into an international event in 1960 in Rome with 400 athletes from 23 countries. Since then, the Games have grown significantly, challenging stereotypes and promoting inclusivity, while celebrating the exceptional talents and resilience of athletes

with disabilities. India began its Paralympic journey in 1968, overcoming numerous challenges such as limited resources, inadequate facilities, and low public awareness. Despite these hurdles, Indian para-athletes gradually rose to prominence on the global stage. A pivotal moment came in 2004 when Devendra Jhajharia won India's first Paralympic gold, setting a world record in the F46 javelin throw. This achievement heralded a new era for Indian para-sports, culminating in 35 medals across 12 Paralympic Games. The Paralympics exemplify India's commitment to inclusiveness, reflecting a broader national strategy to promote equity in sports. Government initiatives such as the 'Target Olympic Podium Scheme' (TOPS), 'Khelo India,' and increased funding for para-sports provide athletes with special abilities access to advanced training facilities, coaching, and financial support. To foster a more inclusive sports ecosystem, India regularly hosts events like the National Para Games and Para Athletics Championships, enhancing visibility and opportunities for para-athletes. What is needed is corporate sponsorships and media coverage which are crucial in transforming societal perceptions of disability, empowering athletes and promoting social inclusion and awareness. Globally, several countries have successfully promoted inclusiveness through sports. The United Kingdom, for example, has been a pioneer in fostering an inclusive sports culture. Looking back at the success of Team GB at the London 2012 Paralympics, where they ranked third with 120 medals, which stemmed from years of investment in para-sports proves this point. The UK government, along with organizations like the British Paralympic Association, provided substantial funding, advanced training facilities, and comprehensive

support for athletes. The extensive broadcasting and marketing of the London 2012 Paralympics also helped transform public perceptions of disability, inspiring a new generation of para-athletes. Similarly, Australia has excelled in promoting inclusivity in sports through the Australian Paralympic Committee, which focuses on talent identification, athlete development, and grassroots inclusivity. Further, Japan's efforts during the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics highlighted its commitment to accessibility, with significant investments in inclusive infrastructure, such as accessible public transport, venues, and accommodations, demonstrating a strong commitment to para-sports. Moreover, the Paralympic Committee's 'ImPOSSIBLE' program, an educational initiative by the Agitos Foundation, was introduced in schools across Japan to educate children about the Paralympic values of courage, determination, inspiration, and equality, fostering a culture of inclusivity from a young age. In India, the road to achieving inclusiveness in sports has been long and challenging, but progress is evident. The success of para-athletes at the Paralympics 2024 has helped break down barriers and challenge stereotypes, paving the way for a more inclusive society. However, there is still much work to be done to ensure that people with special abilities have equal access to sports and the opportunity to compete at the highest level. The future of Indian para-sports looks promising, as it is a powerful reminder that success in sports is not limited by physical ability but defined by determination, skill, and the spirit to overcome adversity. Israel’s crackdown on West Bank insurgency killing youths

As the world’s attention focuses on the deadly war in Gaza, less than 80 miles away scores of Palestinian teens have been killed, shot and arrested in the West Bank, where the Israeli military has waged a months-long crackdown. More than 150 teens and children 17 or younger have been killed in the embattled territory since Hamas’ brutal attack on communities in southern Israel set off the war last October. Most died in nearly daily raids by the Israeli army that Amnesty International says have used disproportionate and unlawful force. Amjad Hamadneh lost son Mahmoud when the 15-year-old’s school dismissed students at the start of a May raid. “He didn’t do anything. He didn’t make a single mistake,” says Amjad Hamadneh, whose son, a buzz-cut devotee of computer games, was one of two teens killed that morning by a sniper. “If he’d been a freedom fighter or was carrying a weapon, I would not be so emotional,” says his father, an unemployed construction worker. “But he was taken just as easily as water going down your throat. He only had his books and a pencil case.” It is clear from statements by the Israeli military, insurgents and families in the West Bank that a number of the

Palestinian teens killed in recent months were members of militant groups. Many others were killed during protests or when they or someone nearby threw rocks or home-made explosives at military vehicles. Still others appear to have been random targets. Taken together, the killings raise troubling questions about the devaluation of young lives in pursuit of security and autonomy. The Israeli army said in a statement to the AP that it has stepped up raids since Oct. 7 to apprehend militants suspected of carrying out attacks in the West Bank and that “the absolute majority of those killed during this period were armed or involved in terrorist activities at the time of the incident.” On the June afternoon that 17-year-old Issa Jallad was killed, video from a neighbor’s security camera shows, he was on a friend’s motorbike with an Israeli armored vehicle in close pursuit. Days later, a poster outside his family’s home in Jenin showed him cradling an assault rifle and declared him a holy warrior. But the grainy tape, reviewed by the Associated Press days after the raid, and others from nearby cameras do not explain where he fit in the conflict. The Israeli army said that its soldiers had spotted two militants handling a powerful explosive



device. When the pair tried to flee, troops opened fire and “neutralized them.” But an Israeli human rights group, B’Tselem, says its review of multiple security camera videos showed Jallad and his friend posed no threat. “We all expected to be in this situation,” said the teen’s brother, Mousa Jallad. “It could happen to any of us.” Jenin’s refugee camp has long been notorious as a hotbed of Palestinian militancy, raided repeatedly by Israeli forces

who have occupied the West Bank since seizing control in their 1967 war with neighboring Arab states. The embattled territory was already seeing deadly clashes before the war began. But Israeli forces, which police about 3 million Palestinians while assigned to protect 500,000 Jewish settlers, has significantly stepped up raids in the months since. Youths represent almost a quarter of the nearly 700 Palestinians slain in the West

Bank since the war began, the most since the violent uprising known as the Second Intifada in the early 2000s. More than 20 Israeli civilians and soldiers have been killed in the territory since October. A military spokesman said the Israeli army makes great efforts to avoid harming civilians during raids and “does not target civilians, period.” He said human rights group focus on a few outlier cases. Military operations in the West Bank are fraught because forces

are pursuing militants, many in their teens, who often hide among the civilian population, said the spokesman, Lt. Col. Nadav Shoshani. “In many cases many of them are 15, 16 years old who are not wearing uniforms and might surprise you with a gun, with a knife,” he said. Critics say the crackdown is shaped by retribution, not only military strategy. When sirens erupted at the start of the May raid, Amjad Hamadneh says, he called

Mahmoud on his cell phone and was relieved to hear that the brothers had reached their school. But then Mahmoud’s twin brother, Ahmed, called back to say that the principal had dismissed classes. As students poured into the street, the brothers were separated in the chaos. Four bullets hit Mahmoud as he fled, and another pierced his skull. He was the third student from his school killed in a raid since the war began. A former classmate, Osama Hajir, who had dropped out of school to work, was also killed, along with a teacher from a nearby school and a doctor from the hospital down the street. “Now when I hear the sound of sirens I go to my room and stay there,” says Karam Miazneh, another classmate, who was shot during the raid but survived. “I’m still in fear that they will come to shoot me and kill me.” Immediately after the May raid, a spokesman for the army said it had carried out the operation with Israeli border police and the country’s internal security agency, destroying an explosive device laboratory and other structures used by militants. But police recently declined to comment, and three weeks after the AP asked the military to answer questions about the May raid, an army spokesman said he was unable to com-

ment until he could confer with police. When Amjad Hamadneh heard his son had been wounded, he sped through Jenin’s twisting streets, drawing gunfire as he neared the hospital. But Mahmoud was already gone. Nearby, Osama’s father, Muhammad, broke down as he leaned over his son’s body. Months earlier he’d snapped a photo of the smiling teen beside graffiti touting Jenin as “the factory of men,” tirelessly cranking out fighters in the resistance against Israel. Now, he pressed that same, still-smooth face between his hands. “Oh, my son. Oh, my son,” he sobbed. “My beautiful son.” Since Mahmoud Hamadneh was killed, his siblings ask frequently to visit his grave. His younger sister now sleeps in his bed so her surviving brother, Ahmed, will not be in the room alone. “I feel like I cannot breathe. We used to do everything together,” Ahmed says. His father listens closely, despairing later that such grief could drive the teen into militancy. If the risk is so clear to a Palestinian father, he says, why don’t Israeli soldiers see it? “They think that if they kill us that people will be afraid and not do anything,” he says. “But when the Israelis kill someone, 10 fighters will be created in his place.”

Starmer plans ‘major surgery’ to reform country’s health service

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer on Thursday announced plans for “major surgery” that is needed to reform the National Health Service (NHS) after a damning new review warned that the country’s state-funding health service is in “serious trouble”. Starmer pledged the “biggest reimagining of our NHS since its birth” in a speech after former surgeon Lord Ara Darzi’s probe concluded the service is in a “critical condition” amidst surging waiting lists and a deterioration in the nation’s underlying health, identifying serious and widespread problems for people accessing services. Based on Darzi’s diagnosis of the challenges facing the NHS, Starmer outlined greater digitisation, reducing care burden on the hospitals and a greater focus on prevention rather than cure as the fundamental areas of reform. “What we need is the courage to deliver long-term reform – major surgery not sticking plaster solutions,” Starmer said in his major speech at the healthcare charity King’s Fund in London. “The NHS is at a fork in the road, and we have a choice about how it should meet these



rising demands. Raise taxes on working people to meet the ever-higher costs of aging population, or reform to secure its future,” he said. “We have to fix the plumbing before turning on the taps. Hear me when I say this: No more money without reform,” he added. The rapid review into the taxpayer-funded service, which employs a large number of Indian doctors and nurses, had been commissioned by the newly elected Labour government soon after the July 4 general election. It sets out the problems in the NHS and themes for the government to incorporate into a 10-year plan for reforming the health service. “This government is working at pace to build a 10-year plan; something so different from anything that has come before. Instead of the top-

down approach of the past, this plan is going to have the fingerprints of NHS staff and patients all over it,” said Starmer. “And as we build it together, I want to frame this plan around three big shifts – first, moving from an analogue to a digital NHS. A tomorrow service not just a today service. Second, we’ve got to shift more care from hospitals to communities... and third, we’ve got to be much bolder in moving from sickness to prevention. Only fundamental reform and a plan for the long term can turn around the NHS and build a healthy society. It won’t be easy or quick. But I know we can do it,” he said. Darzi is an independent House of Lords peer and practising surgeon with 30 years of experience in the NHS. He examined over 600 pieces of analysis from across the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC), NHS England and external organisations during his investigation. He notes a deterioration in the nation’s health over the past 15 years, with a substantial increase in the number of people living with multiple long-term conditions. At the same time, NHS waiting lists have swelled and waiting times have surged.

UK waives settlement fees, unveils new visas for bereaved partners

London (PTI): Eligible foreign nationals dealing with the death of a partner and facing financial hardship will soon be able to apply to have the application fee for settlement in the UK waived, under new rules laid out in Parliament this week. Currently, people who wish to apply for settlement in the UK following the death of their British citizen partner are required to pay a GBP 2,885 fee, irrespective of a change in financial circumstances following a loss. Indian-origin migration and citizenship minister Seema Malhotra told Parliament on Tuesday that this fee will now be waived from October 9 as part of a “fairer and more compassionate approach” to those wishing to stay in the UK and facing acute financial vulnerability during times of grief. “Losing a loved one is a deep and unimaginable pain, all too often compounded by the immense financial strain faced by those left behind,” said Malhotra. “Widows, widowers, and their dependent children who had become integral parts of our communities can now apply for a fee waiver if facing destitu-

tion, in order to settle and keep the life they have built. This marks a fairer and more compassionate approach to those unable to afford the settlement fees, but who have often worked, paid their taxes and contributed to life here in the UK, including the partners of our military veterans,” she said. Those who qualify include partners on a family visa who meet the criteria for destitution, if their partner had either been a British citizen, had indefinite leave to remain in the UK, or was from the European Union (EU), Switzerland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein and had pre-settled status. Bereaved partners of members of the Armed Forces, Gurkhas or Hong Kong military unit veterans – discharged before July 1997, may also benefit from such a fee waiver. In her written statement in the House of Commons, Malhotra also announced the introduction of a new diplomatic visitor visa process as part of the UK border being transformed to include digital pre-travel checks. Under this, the current Diplomatic Visa Waivers (DVWs) will be phased out in favour of a “Diplomatic Visa Arrangement”.

US to sell anti-submarine sonobuoys to India

Washington (PTI): The US has decided to sell High Altitude Anti-Submarine Warfare (HAASW) sonobuoys worth USD 52.8 million to India, a move that would enhance New Delhi’s capacity to conduct anti-submarine warfare operations. Sonobuoys are air-launched, expendable, electro-mechanical sensors designed to relay underwater sounds to remote processors. These are effective and affordable anti-submarine warfare (ASW) that are capable of being used by airborne ASW warfighters. “The proposed sale will improve India’s capability to meet current and future threats by enhancing its capacity to conduct anti-submarine warfare operations from its MH-60R helicopters. India will have no difficulty absorbing this equipment into its armed forces,” the Defence Security Cooperation Agency said in a notification to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee this week. As per the Arms Export Control Act, Congress has 30 calendar days to review the sale.

N Korea has fired ballistic missile toward sea: South

North Korea fired multiple short-range ballistic missiles toward the sea on Thursday, South Korea’s military said, days after North Korean leader Kim Jong Un vowed to put his nuclear force fully ready for battle with its rivals. South Korea’s Joint Chiefs of Staff said it detected the missiles launched from North Korea’s capital flying 360 kilometers (about 220 miles) before landing in the waters between the Korean Peninsula and Japan. Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida instructed officials to ensure the safety of ships and aircraft, but there were no immediate reports of damage. The reported fight distances suggest the missiles were designed to attack South Korea. The South Korean Joint Chiefs of Staff condemned the launches as a provocation that poses a serious threat to peace on the Korean Peninsula. The launches were North Korea’s first public weapons firing activities in more than two months. On July 1, North Korea claimed to have tested a new tactical weapon capable of delivering a “super-large” 4.5 ton-class warhead. In a Monday speech marking his government’s 76th foundation anniversary, Kim said he would redouble efforts to make his nuclear force fully ready for combat with the United States and its allies. Kim made such a pledge saying North Korea faces “a grave threat” because of what he called “the reckless expansion” of a U.S.-led regional military bloc that is now developing into a nuclear-based one. Kim has made similar vows numerous times, but his latest threat came as outside experts believe North Korea could carry out a nuclear test explosion or long-range missile test-launches ahead of the U.S. presidential election in November to boost its leverage

in future dealings with the U.S. On Sunday, North Korea’s state media published a photo of Kim inspecting a 12-axle vehicle that would be the the country’s biggest missile launch platform. That sparked speculation that the North could be developing a more powerful intercontinental ballistic missile designed to strike the U.S. mainland. Recent commercial satellite images indicate that North Korea’s northeastern nuclear test site incurred minor damage from heavy summer rains in recent weeks and that no notable recent work was detected at its tunnels, 38 North, a North Korea-focused website, said an analytical piece published Wednesday. Thursday’s launches also came after North Korea flew hundreds of huge balloons carrying rubbish toward South Korea for five straight days through Sunday. Since 2022, North Korea has sharply ramped up its weapons testing activities in part of its efforts to perfect its capabilities to launch strikes on the U.S. and South Korea. The U.S. and South Korea have responded by expanding military drills that North Korea calls invasion rehearsals. Last month, Kim had still held off from missile tests or other provocative military demonstrations as the United States and South Korea conducted large-scale summertime military exercises. North Korea has previously reacted with other major U.S.-South Korean military training with its own weapons tests. But prior to the U.S.-South Korean exercises, Kim staged a big ceremony in Pyongyang to mark the delivery of 250 nuclear-capable missile launchers to frontline military units and called for a ceaseless expansion of his country’s nuclear program. The Aug. 4 event added to concerns about Kim’s push to deploy battlefield nuclear weapons along the tense border with South Korea.

Billionaire takes pvt spacewalk from SpaceX capsule

Cape Canaveral (AP): A billionaire stepped out for the first private spacewalk Thursday, teaming up with SpaceX on the daring endeavour hundreds of miles above Earth. Tech entrepreneur Jared Isaacman and his crew waited until their capsule was depressurised before popping open the hatch. Isaacman emerged first, joining a small elite group of spacewalkers who until now had included only professional astronauts from a dozen countries. “Back at home, we all have a lot of work to do. But from here, it sure looks like a perfect world,” said Isaacman. The commercial spacewalk was the main focus of the five-day flight financed by Isaacman and Elon Musk’s company, and the culmination of years of development geared toward settling Mars and other planets. All four on board donned SpaceX’s new spacewalking suits to protect themselves from the harsh vacuum. They launched on Tuesday from Florida, rocketing farther from Earth than anyone since NASA’s moonwalkers. The orbit was reduced by half — to 460 miles (740 kilometres) — for the spacewalk. This first spacewalking test, expected to last close to two hours, involved more stretching than walking.

Spanish PM meets exiled Venezuelan opp leader

Venezuela’s opposition presidential candidate Edmundo González met with Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez on Thursday, four days after fleeing to the European country in a negotiated deal with Nicolás Maduro’s government. González’s flight to exile — after weeks of seeking refuge in the embassies of the Netherlands and Spain in Caracas — had dealt a major blow to millions who placed their hopes in his opposition campaign. His supporters in Venezuela and beyond, along with the United States gov-

ernment, consider him the legitimate winner of the July 28 presidential election. Sánchez, who was on a trip to China when González arrived, posted a video of their meeting Thursday on the social media platform X. The two are seen strolling together in the Moncloa Palace gardens in Madrid. Spain has welcomed González as a sign of its “humanitarian commitment and solidarity with Venezuelans,” Sánchez said in his post. On Wednesday, the Spanish Parliament approved a proposal from the conservative Popular Party urging Sánchez’s left-wing coalition

government to recognise the opposition leader as the elected president of Venezuela. The motion is non-binding. Spain’s government supports the European Union position of demanding that Maduro make public the raw polling results before the bloc recognises a winner. The European Parliament will debate the outcome of the Venezuelan elections on Tuesday in Strasbourg, France. González’s arrival has further strained relations between Madrid and Caracas. On Wednesday, Jorge Rodríguez, president of Venezuela’s National Assembly, asked

for “the immediate rupture of all diplomatic relations, of all commercial relations.” “Let all the representatives of the Spanish government delegation leave, and let us bring our own,” Rodríguez said in the Assembly and also called for “the immediate closure of all commercial activities of Spanish companies.” González, who was Venezuela’s former ambassador in Argentina during the presidency of late Hugo Chávez, landed Sunday at a military airport near Madrid. He travelled aboard a Spanish military plane. Following the election, González and the

Venezuelan opposition’s de facto leader, María Corina Machado, went into hiding as security forces rounded up more than 2,000 people — many of them young Venezuelans — who spontaneously took to the streets to protest Maduro’s alleged theft of the election. With his flight into exile, González joined the swelling ranks of opposition stalwarts who once fought Maduro before seeking asylum abroad in the face of a brutal crackdown. In Spain, he joins at least four former presidential hopefuls who were imprisoned or faced arrest for defying Maduro’s rule.

Pope lauds S’pore’s skyscrapers, calls to remember migrants

Singapore (AP): Pope Francis on Thursday praised Singapore’s economic strength as a testament to human ingenuity but urged the city-state to look after the weakest, too, especially foreign workers, as he opened the final leg of his tour through some of Asia’s poorest countries in one of the world’s richest. Singapore celebrated his arrival by unveiling a new hybrid orchid named for him, the “Dendrobium His Holiness Pope Francis.” Presented during an official welcome ceremony, the orchid “exudes a serene and pure beauty” of ivory white petals with a pink tinge at the center, according to

the National Parks Board. Francis arrived in Singapore from East Timor and began his official program Thursday by meeting with President Tharman Shanmugaratnam and Prime Minister Lawrence Wong before addressing government authorities and the diplomatic corps at the National University of Singapore. There, Francis marveled at Singapore’s modern skyscrapers “that seem to rise from the sea” and the government’s commitment to providing public housing and quality education and health care to its people. But he urged authorities to beware of rewarding excel-

lence at all costs, a reference to Singapore’s highly competitive work and educational culture. “I would like to highlight the risk entailed in focusing solely on pragmatism or placing merit above all things, namely the unintended consequence of justifying the exclusion of those on the margins from benefiting from progress,” he said. In a common appeal from history’s first Latin American pope, Francis called especially for dignified pay and conditions for migrant workers, who have helped build Singapore into one of the world’s most advanced economic powerhouses. “These workers contribute a

great deal to society and should be guaranteed a fair wage,” Francis said. Singapore has no minimum wage policy for locals or foreigners. Singapore is the last stop of Francis’ 11-day tour that is the longest and farthest of his papacy after earlier stops in Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and East Timor. The economic disparities were obvious upon arrival Wednesday as Francis landed in Singapore’s high-tech airport aboard the lone aircraft belonging to Aero Dili, the national carrier of East Timor, where around 42% of its people live below the poverty line.

Blinken wraps up Europe trip with arms request

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken is wrapping up a three-nation, Ukraine-focused European tour in Poland after hearing repeated appeals from Ukrainian officials to use Western-supplied weaponry for long-range strikes inside Russia.

Blinken traveled to Warsaw on Thursday after spending a day in Kyiv with British Foreign Secretary David Lammy during which they pledged to bring the Ukrainian requests to their leaders. President Joe Biden and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer are to meet in the United States on Friday

amid signs both Washington and London are growing more receptive to allowing the Ukrainians to use their arms to hit targets farther inside Russia than previously okayed. NATO member Poland, which shares a border with Ukraine, has been supportive of the Ukrainians and Blinken is likely to hear further requests for easing weapons-use restrictions from Polish President Andrzej Duda, Prime Minister Donald Tusk and Foreign Minister Radoslaw Sikorski.

On Wednesday, Blinken and Lammy announced that the United States and Britain had pledged nearly \$1.5 billion in additional aid to Ukraine during their visit to Kyiv.

Blinken announced more than \$700 million in humanitarian aid, while Lammy confirmed that his country would provide another \$782 million in assistance and loan guarantees. Much of the effort was aimed at bolstering the energy grid that Russia has repeatedly pounded ahead of an expected difficult winter. Ukraine's wish list is long and non-military assistance is certainly on it, but Ukrainian officials made clear their most important ask is for easing restrictions on where Western weapons can be used. Air-raid sirens sounded repeatedly during the visit, causing delays in their schedule and forcing them to cancel a wreath-laying ceremony.

Blinken said he would bring the discussion with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy about the missiles "back to Washington to brief the president" and that Biden and Starmer will "no doubt" talk about the issue when they meet in Washington. "Speaking for the United States, we have adjusted and adapted as needs have changed, as the battlefield has changed. And I have no doubt that we'll continue to do that as this evolves," Blinken told a news conference. His language was very similar to that which he used in May, shortly before the U.S. green lit Ukrainian use of U.S. weapons just inside Russian territory.

Lawyers for Kremlin's foe Navalny face trial

Three lawyers who once represented the late Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny went on trial Thursday in Russia, part of the Kremlin's unrelenting crackdown on dissent that has in recent years reached levels unseen since the Soviet times. The three — Vadim Kobzev, Igor Sergunin and Alexei Liptser — were arrested in October 2023 on charges of involvement with an extremist group. The case has been widely seen as a means to ramp up pressure on the Kremlin's fiercest foe at the time and to discourage defence lawyers from taking on political cases.

When they were arrested, Navalny was already serving a 19-year prison term on several criminal convictions, including extremism. The extremism charges against the opposition politician stemmed from a 2021 court ruling that outlawed his organisations in Russia — the Foundation for Fighting Corruption and a vast network of regional offices — as extremist groups.

Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party allegedly attacked military installations following his arrest.

The court raised concerns over the potential trial of a civilian in a military court, emphasising that the issue is a matter of serious concern for both the petitioner and the judiciary.

During the hearing, Justice Miangul Hassan Aurangzeb asked Assistant Attorney General Azmat Bashir Tarar to seek directions from the Attorney General's office over the issue and provide a clear

response to the court. "You are saying there is no case now, but could there be one later?" the judge asked, highlighting the uncertainty surrounding the matter. The court adjourned the hearing until September 16, giving the federal government time to submit its response. PTI in a WhatsApp message also confirmed that the IHC ordered the government to file a reply on "possible military trial of Imran Khan by Sep 16". If the government denies any plans for a military trial, the petition will

be rendered moot. However, if such a trial is under consideration, the court will proceed to hear and decide the case. The 71-year-old PTI party founder has been in jail since August last year after being convicted in some of the nearly 200 cases slapped on him since his ouster in April 2022. Various government officials have been indicating about holding the military trial of Khan, but any such decision will depend on the final judgment of the Supreme Court.

Retail inflation rises to 3.65 per cent, remains within RBI target

Retail inflation marginally increased to 3.65 per cent in August and remained within the Reserve Bank's target of 4 per cent, the government data showed on Thursday.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based retail inflation was 3.6 per cent in July 2024 and 6.83 per cent in August 2023. Inflation in the food basket was 5.66 per cent in August, marginally up from 5.42 per cent in July, according to the data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO). The inflation also was below 4 per cent in July.

The government has tasked the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to ensure that the CPI inflation remains at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side.



The combined inflation (rural and urban) fell to 3.65% in August 2024, compared to 6.83% in August 2023. However, it has increased by 110 basis points when compared to the previous month's 3.54%.

This was the second time in nearly five years that overall retail inflation fell below the Reserve Bank of India's 4% inflation target. The last time was July 2024.

The RBI's inflation target is

4% with a tolerance band of +/- 2 percentage points, meaning that the target is within the range of 2% to 6%.

Urban inflation fell to 3.14% in August 2024, compared to 6.59% in August 2023. Rural inflation fell to 4.16% in August 2024, compared to 7.02% in August 2023.

The combined Consumer Food Price Index (CFPI), which shows food inflation was 5.66% in August 2024, compared to 9.94% in August

2023. Urban food inflation fell to 4.99% in August 2024, compared to 10.42% in August 2023.

Rural food inflation fell to 6.02% in August 2024, compared to 9.67% in August 2023.

Tomatoes have exhibited the lowest year on year inflation (-47.91%) as well as lowest MoM change in index (-28.8%).

The prices of vegetables rose the most by 10.71%, compared to the other item categories. In urban areas, the rise was 13.22% and in rural areas, it was 13.22%.

Bihar witnessed the highest combined inflation among all Indian states in August 2024 at 6.62%, followed by Odisha at 5.63% and Assam at 5.03%.

On the other hand, Telangana had the lowest combined inflation of 2.02% followed by Uttarakhand at 2.37% and Delhi at 2.52%.

Nifty hits lifetime high

Benchmark Sensex hit the historic 83,000 level for the first time on Thursday and the Nifty settled at a lifetime high after a rally in blue-chip shares, surge in global markets and foreign fund inflows.

A sharp fag-end rally drove the 30-share BSE Sensex to the 83,000 level for the first time. The barometer surged 1,593.03 points or 1.95 per cent to hit its lifetime intra-day peak of 83,116.19 in the last hour of trade. The index closed at a record high of 82,962.71, up by 1,439.55 points or 1.77 per cent.

The NSE Nifty surged 470.45 points or 1.89 per cent to settle at a record closing high of 25,388.90. The benchmark hit its fresh all-time intra-day high of 25,433.35, a jump of 514.9 points or 2 per cent. Nifty and Sensex opened higher and traded in a range till late afternoon trade.

Among the 30 Sensex firms, Bharti Airtel, NTPC, JSW



Steel, Mahindra & Mahindra, Adani Ports, Tech Mahindra, Larsen & Toubro, Tata Steel, State Bank of India and Kotak Mahindra Bank were the biggest gainers.

Nestle emerged as the only laggard from the blue-chip pack.

While the session remained subdued for the most part, strong buying in heavyweight stocks across sectors propelled the indices sharply upward in

the final hours, Ajit Mishra - SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd. In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo and Hong Kong settled with significant gains while Shanghai ended marginally lower.

European markets were trading higher. Wall Street ended with sharp gains on Wednesday.

"Latest US inflation numbers are mildly positive for markets. August CPI inflation coming at 0.2 per cent has brought down the

12-month inflation to 2.5 per cent from 2.9 per cent earlier.

"This paves the way for a rate cut by the Fed in September. But since core inflation continues to remain high at 3.2 per cent the Fed is likely to be cautious and refrain from a 50 bps rate cut, finally settling for a 25 bps rate cut," said V K Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Financial Services.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth Rs 1,755 crore on Wednesday, according to exchange data.

FIIs turning buyers in the cash market during the last three days is another indication that the market will continue to be resilient, Vijayakumar added.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 1.39 per cent to USD 71.59 a barrel. The BSE benchmark dropped 398.13 points or 0.49 per cent to settle at 81,523.16 on Wednesday. The NSE Nifty declined 122.65 points or 0.49 per cent to 24,918.45.

DGCA orders audit of flying schools

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has ordered a special audit of flying training organisations in the country amid recent accidents involving training aircraft. The audit of flying training organisations (FTOs) will be conducted in three phases from September to November 2024. It will cover 33 FTOs.

"This audit aims to thoroughly assess the safety standards, operational procedures, and systemic deficiencies within flying training organisations to ensure the highest levels of safety and compliance," DGCA said in a release on



Thursday.

The regulator said the move follows a series of recent training aircraft incidents that have sparked concerns regarding the compliance of FTOs with respect to the established aviation regulations and safety protocols. The last such special audit was conducted in 2022.

"The audit will scrutinise each FTO's adherence to DGCA's regulatory standards, including aircraft maintenance, airworthiness, and training operations," the release said.

India, China talk aviation cooperation

India and China on Thursday discussed ways to strengthen cooperation in the civil aviation sector, including resumption of direct flights between the two countries.

Civil Aviation Minister K Ram Mohan Naidu, Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlungmang Vualnam and other senior officials met with representatives from China on the sidelines of the Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference on Civil Aviation in the national capital.

In a post on X, Naidu said he along with senior officials had a courtesy meeting with a Chinese delegation led by Song Zhiyong.

The meeting focused on

exchange of views regarding "further strengthening civil aviation cooperation between the two countries, especially promoting early resumption of scheduled passenger flights between us," the minister said in the post.

Later, Naidu told reporters that the Chinese side mentioned about resumption of direct flights but no decision has been taken.

A decision will be taken after discussions with the external affairs ministry and other stakeholders.

Currently, there are no direct flights between India and China. The services stopped at the time of coronavirus pandemic.

IndiGo and Air India had flight services to China.

Oil prices drop, fuel costs may follow

Price of international crude oil - the raw material for making petrol and diesel - dropped to a three-year low before marginally recovering but a revision in domestic petrol and diesel rates is likely only if lower rates are sustained, industry sources and officials said.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures fell below USD 70 per barrel on Tuesday - the first time since December 2021 - but gained thereafter after Hurricane Francine hit crude supply in the Gulf of Mexico.

Brent rose above USD 71 a barrel on Thursday while West Texas Intermediate advanced to trade near USD 68.

Petrol and diesel prices - which have been on a freeze for over two years now



barring a pre-election reduction earlier this year - will be revised if the declining trend sustains, they said.

Oil Secretary Pankaj Jain speaking to reporters on the sidelines of an event here, said the oil companies will be taking appropriate decisions on reducing fuel prices if international oil prices were

to settle lower on a sustained basis.

Industry sources said the three state-owned fuel retailers are making good profits on petrol and diesel but want the trend to continue before deciding on a revision.

"They don't want a situation where they cut prices and are faced with a situation where international prices rise," an official explained.

Brokerage Emkay Global Financial Services in a note said it expects Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) to cut petrol and diesel prices before elections in Maharashtra.

"We believe there are expectations of a retail price cut in auto-fuels for oil

marketing companies (OMCs) amid the upcoming state elections. While we do not rule out the same, the model code of conduct for J&K and Haryana is on for a month. There could be a cut only toward Diwali and before Maharashtra election's model code of conduct, which could be Rs 2 per litre each for petrol and diesel and possibly coupled with an equivalent increase in excise duty," it said.

However, during the next month, OMCs can earn supernormal marketing margins, covering LPG under-recoveries and inventory losses to a large extent.

We estimate implied July-September gross marketing margins at Rs 9.7/8 per liter for petrol/diesel vs Rs 4.7/3.8 in Q1 (April-June) and a normative range of Rs 3.5-4 each," it said.

Health cover for age 70 and above to bring relief to million families: Industry

The government's move to provide health coverage to all persons aged 70 years and above will bring much-needed relief to millions of families and is a significant milestone in providing essential healthcare services to the elderly, industry players said on Thursday.

The Union Cabinet had on Wednesday approved health coverage to all persons aged 70 years and above under the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) irrespective of their income, benefiting around six crore senior citizens. The Rs 5 lakh free

health insurance cover would benefit senior citizens of around 4.5 crore families.

Reacting to the announcement, Healthcare industry body NATHEALTH President Abhay Soi said, "We believe this initiative will bring much-needed relief to millions of families and strengthen India's position as a leader in inclusive healthcare".

The benefit package needs to be tailored to the population segment so that it encompasses the entire continuum of care, he said, adding that NATHEALTH is ready to support the government with the rollout.

Similarly, Organisation of

Pharmaceutical Producers of India (OPPI) Director General Anil Matai described the initiative as "a significant milestone in providing essential healthcare services to the elderly".

"It is undoubtedly a crucial step towards fostering a more inclusive healthcare ecosystem and OPPI welcomes the move," he added.

Matai further said that while this initiative marks a major advancement in healthcare accessibility, OPPI takes this opportunity to emphasise the importance of including the 'Missing Middle', those who are currently excluded from both government and private



health insurance schemes, as part of the AB PM-JAY.

"These individuals represent a segment that must be

brought into the fold of financial protection," he asserted.

Welcoming the government's move, Medical Technology Association of India (MTAI) Chairman Pavan Choudhary said the decision to extend health coverage to all senior citizens aged 70 and above - irrespective of income under AB PM-JAY is commendable.

"MTAI, having consistently advocated for this inclusion, recognises this move as a landmark step toward equitable healthcare for India's ageing population," he added.

Paras Health Group Chief Operating Officer Santy Sajjan described the government's

step as a much-needed step towards ensuring that India's elderly population has access to essential healthcare services.

"As India's senior population grows, the demand for geriatric care is increasing, and this initiative is a timely response to that need. By providing comprehensive health coverage to our senior citizens, the scheme not only alleviates the financial burden on families but also reinforces the importance of accessible healthcare for all age groups," he added.

Similarly, FICCI (Health Services) President Harsh Mahajan said, "As our elderly population grows, so does the

need for specialised geriatric care, and this expansion will enable more families to access essential services without the burden of overwhelming medical expenses".

However, he said, expanding the beneficiary base by such a significant margin presents real-life challenges, particularly regarding the viability of the scheme for smaller and medium-sized hospitals.

"These institutions often operate on tight margins, and the added pressure of accommodating a larger patient base, especially with senior citizens requiring more intensive care, could strain their resources," Mahajan said.

Industrial output growth slows down

India's industrial production growth slowed down to 4.8 per cent in July this year mainly due to poor show by mining and manufacturing sectors, according to official data released on Thursday.

The factory output, measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) witnessed a growth of 6.2 per cent in July 2023.

India's Index of Industrial Production increased by 4.8 per cent in July 2024, an official statement said.

The data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) showed that the manufacturing sector's output grew 4.6 per cent in July 2024 against 5.3 per cent in the year-ago month.

Mining production rose by 3.7 per cent and power output increased 7.9 per cent in July 2024.

In the April-July period, the IIP grew 5.2 per cent against 5.1 per cent in the year-ago period.

In case of a default, the company will be obliged to initiate criminal/ civil proceedings against the consumers under the relevant provisions of Electricity Act, 2003 and DERC Regulations. Consumers can pay their bills through various means, such as Cheque, Demand Draft (DD), Debit Card, Credit Card and various online modes, or Cash.

Soyabean oil imports surge amid price drop

India's crude soyabean oil imports reached a seasonal high of 4,54,639 tonnes in August, even as local soyabean prices have dropped below the minimum support price (MSP), industry body Solvent Extractors Association (SEA) said on Thursday.

According to SEA, crude soyabean oil imports in August 2023 stood at 3,57,890 tonnes.

The share of non-palm oils, including soyabean oil, made up 48 per cent of the total vegetable oil imports.

The surge in imports comes as local soyabean prices dropped below the MSP, raising concerns about farmers' income with the new crop's arrival expected in the coming weeks.

SEA praised the government's efforts to procure soyabean at MSP in Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Karnataka, but suggested increasing import duties on crude and refined edible oils by 20 to 25 per cent across the board as a more effective solution. "This



will translate into remunerative price to the farmers for his produce and the market forces will be able to pay above MSP price to the farmers and at the same time the government does not have to procure at MSP," SEA said in a statement.

The industry body noted that in the last two months, soyabean ex-mandi prices were Rs 550-600 per quintal below the MSP of Rs 4,892 per quintal causing unrest among farmers.

However, total vegetable oil imports declined to 15.63 lakh tonnes in August from 18.66 lakh tonnes a year ago. In the non-palm oils segment, crude sunflower oil imports fell 22.34 per cent to 2.84 lakh tonnes in August.

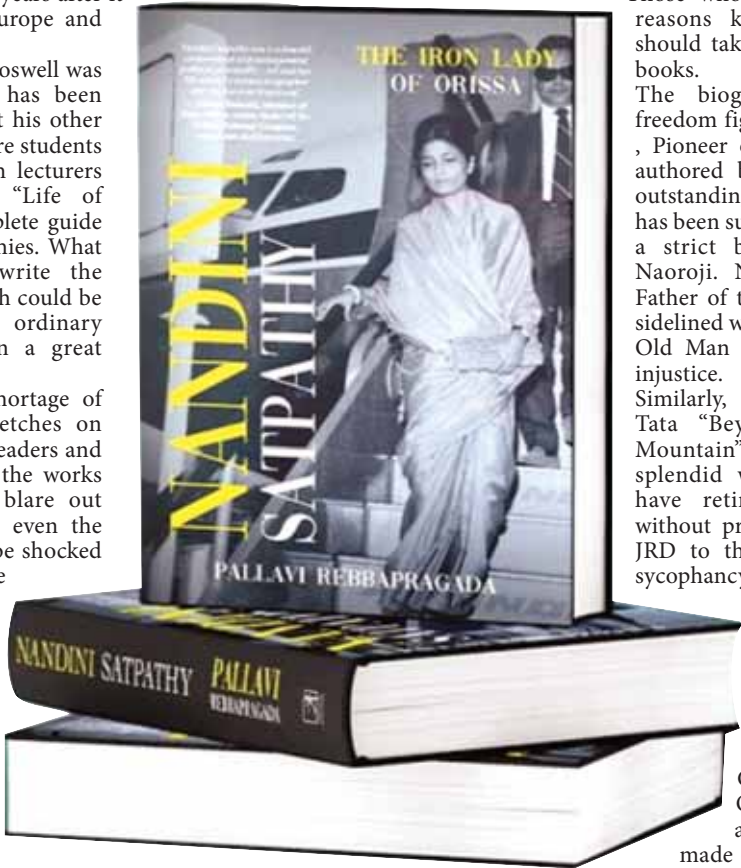
THE LIFE AND TIMES OF NANDINI SATPATHY RETOLD

NANDINI SATPATHY, former union minister and chief minister of Orissa was one who lived during the days of titans of Indian politics. Though not a leader in the true sense of the word, she too had her successes and failures. Nandini’s life sketch is introduced to the readers 18 years after her demise but she had disappeared from public life much earlier. Author **PALLAVI REBBAPRAGADA** deserves kudos for bringing Nandini back amongst us.

The art of writing a book, whether it is novel, essays, short stories, poetry or history is a job of creativity. It is the writer's hands-on experiences or tough realities he/she faced in life that come out as literary works. Lessons one learnt from the course of life, certain incidents which leave unforgettable experiences in the mind and conversations with individuals who leave an impact in the heart are the epicenters of these literary works. One who sets out to write the life-sketch of eminent persons should have first hand interaction with the subject. Those experiences alone would help the writer to come out with something new that would remain etched in the minds of readers for decades to come. Dr Samuel Johnson is rated as the most distinguished man of letters in English history. Johnson (1709-1784) was a literary critic par excellence and he was the trendsetter in this field. His style and thought process has resulted in the Samuel Johnson's school of criticism and continues to be the benchmark of this field of literature. But what is equally important is the biography of Johnson authored by James Boswell, a lawyer and writer. Scotland-born James Boswell wrote "Life of Samuel Johnson" which was published in 1791 based on the series of interviews and dialogues he had with Johnson. This biography stands out as

the "most famous single work of biographical art in the world of literature" even after 223 years after it hit book stalls across Europe and US. It cannot be stated that Boswell was a genius as not much has been heard or discussed about his other literary pursuits. Literature students were told by the English lecturers to compulsorily read "Life of Samuel Johnson", a complete guide on how to write biographies. What Boswell did was to write the biography in a style which could be comprehended by even ordinary people. Thus was born a great literary work. In India, there is no shortage of biographies and life-sketches on freedom fighters, social leaders and politicians. But most of the works are hagiographies and blare out qualities of the subjects even the latter themselves would be shocked to hear. Books on the Father of the Nation, first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, his daughter and late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi are proof of this kind of works. Dhananjay Keer (1913-1983) is unique among the Indian biographers and he chose his subjects meticulously. His works on Veer Savarkar and Dr Ambedkar are path



breaking books as he had personal contacts with these great sons of India. Those who lambast Savarkar for reasons known to them only should take time and read Keer's books. The biography of the great freedom fighter Dadabhai Naoroji , Pioneer of Indian Nationalism, authored by Dinyar Patel is an outstanding work as the author has been successful in maintaining a strict balance in describing Naoroji. Naoroji, was the real Father of the Nation. But he was sidelined with the honorific Grand Old Man of India! It was gross injustice. Similarly, the biography of JRD Tata "Beyond The Last Blue Mountain" by R M Lala is a splendid work. Lala could not have retired from the scene without presenting the unknown JRD to the world. There is no sycophancy or prolix throughout this book and this made it interesting. The book remains memorable as it was written by Lala, a close associate of the Grand Old Man of Indian Corporates. Of late our politicians and businessmen have made it a point to publish their biographies by hiring writers. Needless to say that these works would

not be read even by the persons who review the same. There are people whose biographies and life-sketches should be written. This is because they serve as a beacon of light for the readers. A biography of Nandini Satpathy, the former chief minister of Orissa has been published by Simon and Schuster and authored by Pallavi Rebbapragada, a journalist and public policy consultant based in New Delhi. It is a good mission as nothing much has been heard about Nandini Satpathy since 1980 as she withdrew from active politics and faded out since her rejoining the Congress. Nandini had an uneventful career at the Center as deputy minister for information and broadcasting. Those were the days when Akashwani was described as Indirawani because the babus in Mandi House preferred to pay obeisance to the Prime Minister than their profession as broadcasters. Nandini returned to Orissa in 1972 and was crowned as chief minister at the instance of Indira Gandhi. Her tenure saw hundreds getting imprisoned for questioning the declaration of internal emergency. By December 1976, towards the fag end of emergency, Nandini quit the Congress along with Jagjivan Ram, Chandra Sekhr, Mohan Dharia and Hemavati Nandan Bahuguna to form Congress For Democracy. The slogan coined by the opponents of Indira Gandhi at that period read like this: "Jagjivan Poyi, Jivan Poyi, Bahuguna Poyi, Gunavum Poyi, Nandini Poyi,

Nanavum Poyi" which was the Malayalam for "With Jagjivan's exit, the party lost its life, With Bahuguna's exit, the party lost quality and with Nandini gone, the party lost the last vestige of whatever reputation" . To be candid, Nandini Satpathy's name hogged the national limelight when she left the Congress party. Had she been effective as chief minister of Orissa, the State should have made giant strides in development and progress. But Orissa remains one of the least developed regions in India. A thorough probe should be held on how the politicians managed to make Orissa remain as a poverty stricken State despite its vast natural resources and sufficient assistance from the Center. The author has used theatrics in the narration to sell Satpathy to the readers. Her claim that Nandini Satpathy was the Iron Lady of Orissa is far-fetched. The designation Iron Lady was used by international experts to describe Gold Meir, the fourth Prime Minister of the State of Israel (1969-1974). Perhaps, the over dependence on TV anchorpersons might have put the author in a minefield of wrong information. Biju Patnaik would have been an ideal topic for her to write about since not much has been written about the titan from Eastern India.

The stories of the 22 women featured in the book, such as Ratna, a construction worker who is paid less than her male counterparts and Garima, a business owner balancing her

entrepreneurial ambitions with unpaid family care, are presented with empathy and respect. Setty portrays these women not as just statistics but as individuals with their own struggles, aspirations and contributions. This humanising approach makes the book more than just an academic critique, it serves as a tribute to the resilience and strength of women who significantly contribute to their communities despite facing considerable barriers. The visual elements of the book, including the evocative black-and-white photographs, enhance its impact by providing a tangible connection to the stories being told. The images capture moments of both work and reflection, helping readers appreciate the real, everyday labour performed by these women. This visual storytelling underscores the book's central message: that behind every overlooked contribution is a person whose work deserves recognition and respect. While Setty's book does not offer specific policy recommendations, it

effectively prompts readers to question entrenched societal norms and economic assumptions. By raising questions about why certain types of work are valued over others, the book encourages a broader discussion on how to more accurately reflect the value of all forms of labour in economic metrics. *Invisible - Hands of the Indian Economy* is a significant and thought-provoking addition to the discourse on gender, economics, and social justice. Setty's ability to blend emotional storytelling with a critical examination of economic systems makes this book a powerful call to action. It urges readers to acknowledge and value the invisible labour that supports both families and the broader economy. For anyone interested in gender equality, social justice and the future of economic measurement, Setty's debut is an essential read that promises to challenge and inspire.

DRAUPADI'S MEMOIRS

A new perspective on mythic fiction

In *The Empress of Indraprastha*, Sonali Rajе brings a refreshing contemporary voice to one of the most complex female characters in Indian epics - Draupadi writes **SANJAY CHANDRA**



Through her first-person narrative, Rajе explores the layers of Draupadi's life, from her enigmatic marriage to the five Pandavas to her strategic foresight in a hostile world. With easy-to-follow language and modern mythic fiction style, Rajе's debut offers a fresh take on ancient tales, appealing to readers of all ages. Draupadi is one of the most polarizing characters in Indian epics—adored and maligned in equal measure. Her silent acceptance of her mother-in-law Kunti's words, which made her the shared wife of five men, remains puzzling to many. Equally difficult to comprehend are her dismissive remarks towards Karna, rejecting him as low-born during her swayamvar, despite her intelligence. *The Empress of Indraprastha*, the first book in Sonali Rajе's five-part series, opens with preparations for Draupadi's wedding. Draupadi recalls her mother's empowering words: she has the right to refuse any suitor, even if they succeed in the challenges set for her swayamvar. Her mother's strength leaves a deep impression on Draupadi, shaping her into a strong-willed woman. The story also introduces her twin brother Dhrishtadyumna, both born from a sacred fire, and Shikhandi, her older transgender sibling, who leads the army—an indication of the gender inclusivity of their times. The swayamvar becomes a pivotal moment when Draupadi refuses to let Karna attempt the challenge, leading to Arjuna's triumph. However, Draupadi's life takes an unexpected turn when Kunti unknowingly orders her sons to share whatever they have brought home, including Draupadi. While shocked by this command, Draupadi soon realizes the deeper need for unity among the brothers to navigate a dangerous world. Her acceptance is portrayed as both strategic and pragmatic. As the story unfolds, Draupadi's foresight comes into play. She repeatedly urges her husbands to seek partition, a move that eventually grants them a kingdom—though not as they imagined. The Pandavas are given Khandavaprastha, a barren wasteland, but with confidence in their abilities, they set out to build a mighty empire. Sonali Rajе's *The Empress of Indraprastha* is told in the first person, offering Draupadi's own perspective on the events of her life. The 138-page book, part of a new genre of contemporary mythic-fiction, is accessible and engaging for readers of all ages. Rajе's scientific background and experience as an associate professor of chemistry add a unique depth to her storytelling, especially in revisiting a subject that has been explored by many authors before her.

PRAGGNANANDHAA, VAISHALI STAR IN INDIA'S STRONG START AT OLYMPIAD

Praggnanandhaa set the tone on the top board as the Indian mens team blanked Morocco 4-0, while the women romped home against Jamaica, conceding just a draw in the process, in the first round of the 45th Chess Olympiad here.

With world championship challenger D Gukesh taking a break in the opening round, Praggnanandhaa delivered the goods against Tissir Mohamed out of a Sicilian defense game while Vidit Gujrathi, Arjun Erigaisi and P Harikrishna also pulled off comfortable wins to start off confidently on Wednesday.

In the womens section, R Vaishali and Tania Sachdev scored fine victories in the first time control itself. However, on the other two boards there was stiff resistance as Divya Deshmukh had to sweat hard for a much-needed victory while Vantika Agarwal was forced to concede a draw in the endgame against her rival. It was business as usual for the top guns despite the occasional hiccups. Top seeded United States also won 3.5-0.5 against Panama. Wesley So was the



lone American who was unable to force matters and had to be content with a draw. Armenian-American Levon Aronian came out of an early mishap to turn the tables and ensure smooth sailing for the American team into round two. As many as 99 teams in the open section started off with wins giving them all two points

each. A total of 182 teams were paired while 15 teams were still grappling to reach Budapest. Praggnanandhaa was up against a Sicilian by top Moroccan Mohamed who had only himself to blame after the opening got over. The Indian teen had a stronghold on the king side that he utilised to the fullest to take the first point home for

the team. Not very far behind was Gujrathi who was clearly in his elements. He also got an opening advantage out of a King pawn game against Jacques Elbilia as he knocked down a pawn and never looked back. Erigaise may have had to work harder but the Indian youngster, who is currently

ranked number four in the world, was never far from winning his game. Harikrishna faced some initial resistance from Anas Mosyad in a closed Sicilian but his superior understanding of the structure gave him the vital point. The second round will see the Indian men clash with a spirited Iceland. In the womens competition,

Vaishali had no trouble in converting her position with black pieces as D Harika was rested on the top board. Tania Sachdev was in command right through and despite a little mess-up, she did not let the advantage slip through her hands playing on board four.

On the second board, there were some serious issues for Divya Deshmukh but the recently-crowned world junior girls champion proved her mettle out of an equal position. The same, however, was not the case with Vantika as she was forced in a drawn queen and pawns endgame.

The womens event features 178 teams as of now with 19 still awaited to join the extravaganza from round two onward.

Harmanpreet's brace hands India 3-1 win over Korea in ACT hockey

Skipper Harmanpreet Singh scored a brace as defending champions India beat Korea 3-1 to register their fourth consecutive win at the Hero Asian Champions Trophy here on Thursday.

Paris Olympics bronze medalist India had defeated China 3-0, Japan 5-0 before thrashing last years runner-up Malaysia 8-1.

Already assured of a semifinal berth, India will play arch-rivals Pakistan on Saturday in their last league match in the six-team competition. The top four teams from the league stages will qualify for the semifinals scheduled on Monday, while the final will be played next Tuesday.

India continued their fine form and struck twice early in the first quarter to take a 2-0 lead. Aarajeet Singh Hundal, who scored a brace against Malaysia, scored the first goal in the eighth minute before Harmanpreet, regarded as one of the worlds best dragflickers, converted two penalty corners in the ninth and 43rd minutes. Koreas lone goal was scored by Jihun Yang in the 30th minute from a penalty corner. As has been the case in the tournament so far, the Indians started on an aggressive note with Aarajeet handing his side the lead with a brilliant strike after being fed by Sukhjeet Singh.

A minute later, the promising Raj Kumar Pal, who struck a hat-trick against Malaysia on

Wednesday, earned a penalty corner for India and captain Harmanpreet converted the chance with a powerful dragflick.

Indias reserve goalkeeper Suraj Karkera was impressive under the bar, denying Korea on a few occasions in the second quarter.

After an impressive first quarter, the Indians seemed to have gone into a shell in the next 15 minutes as Korea dominated the proceedings with continuous forays on the rival citadel.

The Indian defence stood tall until Korea pulled a goal just at the stroke of half-time through Yang whose effort went into the net after getting a deflection from Manpreet Singhs stick from a penalty corner opportunity.

The Koreans secured back-to-back penalty corners in the 35th minute but India defended bravely.

India secured their second penalty corner two minutes later but wasted the chance.

The holders managed to restore their two-goal lead in the 43rd minute when Harmanpreet scored with a powerful low flick to the left of the Korean goalkeeper Jaehan Kim.

At the start of the fourth quarter, Jarmanpreet Singh conceded a penalty corner but the Indian defence was up to the task.

Thereafter, the Indians controlled the proceedings and did not let Korea create any scoring opportunity.

Virat Kohli played a big role in turning the cricket around: Ricky Ponting

Australian great Ricky Ponting hailed former captain Virat Kohlis "big role" in revolutionizing Test cricket in India and said the countrys batters dont fear the big stage anymore, evidence of which is their success in challenging conditions overseas. Ponting also lauded the contributions of former head coach Rahul Dravid, who stepped down from the post after guiding India to the T20 World Cup title triumph in June.

"Going back to Kohlis start of captaincy, (he) played a big role in turning the cricket around, and (Rahul) Dravid has continued the same in the recent four years. The influence of someone like that (Kohli) around a team would be great, and theyve got star players," Ponting told Sky Sports. Under Kohlis captaincy, India became the first Asian side to win a Test series



in Australia, besides recording some memorable wins elsewhere. With his aggressive captaincy, Kohli made everyone believe that the Indian team can win overseas as well, and his confidence rubbed on the side even when he was not around. During the last Test series in Australia in 2020-21, Kohli left for India after

the first match due to the birth of his daughter Vamika. But India, under the captaincy of Ajinkya Rahane, battled injuries and the absence of key players to eke out a historic 2-1 series win.

"They won a game at the Gabba, which just doesnt happen. I think their batters adapt to overseas batting

conditions very well.

"I dont think theyre as daunted by the Gabba or the Optus Oval as they maybe once were. Maybe it is a selection thing, or they just dont fear the big stage anymore," observed Ponting.

During Kohlis tenure, India won 40 matches and lost 17, with 11 ending

in draws out of the 68 Tests they played.

This time around, Kohli will tour Australia under longtime India colleague Rohit Sharmas captaincy. "Their fast-bowling depth is great. The leadership in the last 6-7 years has been strong."

Ponting also praised the Indian Premier League for producing players who like to play fearless cricket.

"For the last 10 years being around the IPL, Ive noticed that a lot of the young guys (play aggressively without fear) as the IPL is high-pressure. It is like a World Cup for them.

"Their batsmen are all very aggressive stroke-making players. They are not scared of failing," he concluded.

The Aussies have failed to win the Border-Gavaskar Trophy since their last series victory in 2014-15 at home. The Indians have claimed the title on four successive instances since then, winning twice each at home and away.

Chopra, Sable spearhead Indian challenge in Diamond League season finale

Javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra will have lofty expectations to live up to, while for steeplechaser Avinash Sable, it would be an opportunity to make up for a disappointing Olympics, when the star-studded Diamond League season finale begins here on Friday, featuring the best of world athletics.

The showpiece is spread over two days for the first time and the field features top athletes from all continents, including an unprecedented number of Olympic medal winners, who will be vying for the top honours in 32 disciplines.

Pole vault world record holder Armand DuPlantis, American sprint queen ShaCarri Richardson, and superstar hurdler Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone are among the big names who will light up the King Baudouin Stadium here.

National record-holding 3000m steeplechaser Sable, after finishing 11th in the Olympic Games, will be in action on Friday in his maiden appearance in the DL season finale.

Chopra, who added a silver to his Olympic medal tally in Paris following a historic gold in the Tokyo Games, will be aiming to end his season on a high on Saturday. It is for the first time that a DL finale features two Indians.

Sable finished 14th in the overall Diamond League standings with three points from two meetings. But four athletes ranked higher than him — Lamecha Girma (injured) of Ethiopia, Geordie Beamish of New Zealand, Ryuiji Mura of Japan and Hillary Bor of the USA — pulled out, allowing him to sneak inside the top 12 cut-off.

Five meetings out of the 14 in the DL series across the world this season had mens 3000m



steeplechase event.

The 29-year-old Sable had finished sixth with a national record time of 8:09.91 — bettering his own earlier mark — in the Paris leg of the Diamond League on July 7. He was 14th at the Silesia leg with a time of 8:29.96 on August 25.

Chopra, on the other hand, made the DL final cut after finishing fourth in the overall standings with 14 points from his two second-place finishes in the one-day meets held in Doha and Lausanne.

Each Diamond League season finale champion is awarded a Diamond Trophy, USD 30,000 prize money and a wild card for the World Athletics Championships. The runner-up gets USD 12,000.

Chopra skipped the last series meet in Zurich last week.

The 26-year-old finished two points behind Czechias Jakub Vadlech. Grenadas Anderson Peters and German star Julian Weber took the top two spots with 29 and 21 points respectively.

Chopra has been struggling with his fitness this season and is expected to meet a doctor to rectify a groin injury that has affected him all season and came in the way of his quest to hit the 90m

mark.

He had won the Lausanne leg in 2022 and 2023 and finished

second behind Vadlech in the winner-takes-all finale in Eugene, USA, last year.
