Government answerable to the people: Centre to SC

he Centre on Thursday assured the Supreme Court that it will neither denotify Waqf properties, including 'Waqf by user', nor make any appointments to the Central Waqf Council and State Waqf Boards till May 5. The assurance on the matter by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta came when he informed a bench of Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Saniav Kumar and KV Viswanathan that the Wagf law was passed by Parliament with "due deliberations" and it should not be stayed without hearing the Government.

The Centre strongly opposed the Apex Court's proposal to pass an interim order including 'waqf by user', besides a stay a provision allowing the inclusion of non-Muslims in the Waqf Council and Boards. "During the course of hearing, the Solicitor General states that the respondent (Union of India) would like to put in a short response within seven days. He further states and assures that till the next date of hearing, no appointments will be made to the Council and the Boards under Sections 9 and 14 (of the Act)," the Bench said.

The Bench noted that Mehta, appearing for the Centre, also said that Waqf properties, including 'Waqf by user' already registered or declared by way of notification, shall not be disturbed and denotified till the next

week's time to the Centre to file a preliminary response to the pleas that challenged the validity of the contentious Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025. It posted the mat-

ter for further hearing on May 5. "If your lordships will say something about 'Waqf by user', what will be the fallout?" Mehta said. He added, "We, as a Government, and The CJI said if the registration of any Waqf

property had taken place under the erstwhile 1995 Act, then those properties can't be denotified till further hearing. The Apex Court, while hearing the matter on Wednesday, proposed to stay certain key provisions of the Act, including the

power to denotify properties declared as Waqf by courts and inclusion of non-Muslims in the Waqf Council and Boards. On Thursday, Mehta asked whether the

Court might consider staying, directly or indirectly, the Act based upon some prima facie or tentative reading of some of the Sections. "If your lordships are going to stay a statutory provision," Mehta said, "it by itself

He said the Union Government received several representations, which ultimately resulted in the amended Act. Opposing the stay, the Central Law Officer referred to certain instances and said private properties were usurped as Waqf in several places. Terming it a "considered piece of legislation", Mehta said the pleas were filed before the Presidential assent and taken up immediately by the Bench.

"We are not deciding the matter finally," the Bench quipped.

Mehta argued that staying the Act's provisions may be a "harsh step" and said the Government should be allowed to place its preliminary reply. "Allow me to place within a week my preliminary reply with some materials, documents and statutes to show," he said, adding "in one week, nothing will change'.

Senior Advocate Rakesh Dwivedi, representing a State Government, said, "Heavens are not going to fall if the interim order is not passed for a week or so." Mehta further assured on not making appointments in the respective Waqf Boards even if some of the States were not before the Apex Court. The CJI said, "We don't want the position to change. Parliament makes laws, executive

decides and judiciary interprets."

Dhankhar flays SC timeline for Presidential assent to Bills

ice President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Thursday severely criticised the higher judiciary by questioning the three-month timeline set by the Supreme Court for the President of India on assent to State Bills, saying this tantamount to judiciary acting as a 'super Parliament. He also opined that Article 142 of the Indian Constitution was a 'nuclear missile available with the judiciary 24x7 against democratic forces'.

He also questioned absence of even an FIR in the alleged discovery of wads of burnt currency notes from the Delhi residence of a High Court Judge, wondering whether a "category beyond law" had secured immunity from prosecution.

"If the event had taken place at his (common man's) house, the speed would have been that of a rocket. Now it is not even a cattle cart," Dhankhar said. He said while a committee of three Judges is probing the matter, an investigation is the domain of the executive and not the judiciary.

Dhankhar's strong words about the judiciary came during his speech to Rajya Sabha interns, days after the Supreme Court sought to fix a timeline for the President to grant assent to the Bills

"So, we have judges who will legislate, who will perform executive functions, who will act as super Parliament and absolutely have no accountability because the law

of the land does not apply to them," Dhankhar remarked.

The Vice President also said Article 142, which grants plenary powers to the Supreme Court, had become a nuclear missile against democratic forces (and)

available to (the) judiciary 24x7. Article 142 gives the Supreme Court the power to issue orders that ensure "complete justice" in any matter before it. This power is also known as the Supreme Court's plenary power. "There is a directive to the President by a recent judgment. Where are we heading to? What is happening in the country? We have to be extremely sensitive. It is not a question of someone filing a review or not. We never bargained for democracy for this day. The President being called upon to decide in a time-bound manner, and if not, (Bill) becomes law," Dhankhar said.

The Vice President said his worries were at the "very highest level" and he had never thought that he will have to see such a situation in his life.

He pointed out that the Indian President was in a very elevated position. "(The) President takes an oath to preserve, protect and defend the Constitution. Others, including Ministers, the Vice President, parliamentarians and Judges take an oath to abide by the Constitution," Dhankhar said. "We cannot have a situation where you direct the President. And on what basis? The only right you have under the Constitution is to interpret the Constitution under Article 145(3).

India goes for jugular vein: Pakistan should vacate PoK

Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir's remarks that Kashmir is Pakistan's "jugular vein," and asserted that the only link between Kashmir and Pakistan is Islamabad's illegal occupation of part of the region (PoK) that it must vacate.

Addressing a gathering of overseas Pakistanis in Islamabad on Wednesday, General Munir reiterated Pakistan's longstanding rhetoric on Kashmir and defended the controversial two-nation theory that led to the Partition in 1947. Pakistan Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif was present.

"Our stance is absolutely clear, it was our jugular vein. It will be our jugular vein, we will not forget it. We will not leave our Kashmiri brothers in their heroic struggle," General Munir said.

He also claimed that Pakistanis are bound by a "superior ideology and culture" and urged the diaspora to pass down the story of Pakistan's creation, rooted in the belief that "Muslims and Hindus were fundamentally different in

religion, customs, traditions, and ambitions". Rebutting his remarks, Ministry of External Affairs(MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said here: "How can anything foreign be in a jugular vein? This is a Union Territory of India. It's only relationship with Pakistan is the vacation of illegally occupied territories by that country."

India's reaction came as **Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir reiterated his** country's rhetoric on Kashmir and defended controversial **Two-Nation Theory**

On Pakistan's attempts to wash its hands off the 26/11 terror accused Tahawwur Rana, Jaiswal said, "Pakistan may try very hard but its reputation as the epicentre of global terrorism will not diminish."The extradition of Rana serves as a reminder to Pakistan that it needs to bring to justice other perpetrators of the 2008 Mumbai attacks whom it continues to shield." he said.

Will file CFSL report on authenticity of Biren tape shortly: Centre tells SC

→ he Centre informed the Supreme Court on Thursday that a forensic report on the authenticity of a leaked audio clip regarding the alleged role of former Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh in the ethnic violence in the northeastern State was ready and would be filed shortly in a sealed cover.

A bench headed by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna took note of the submissions of the counsel appearing for the Centre and the State Government to this effect and deferred the hearing on a plea filed by Kuki Organisation for Human Rights Trust (KOHUR) in the week commencing May 5.

The counsel said the report from the Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL) will be filed by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta and sought an adjournment, saying the law officer was unavailable at the moment.

Singh resigned as the Chief Minister of Manipur on February 9, amid rumblings within the State BJP and growing demands for a change in leadership of the State. Earlier, the top court sought a sealed-cover report from the CFSL on the authenticity of the leaked audio clips that allegedly hinted at then CM Singh's role in the ethnic violence that began in May 2023. KOHUR, represented by advocate Prashant Bhushan, had sought a court-

monitored SIT probe into Singh's alleged role. "The State is gradually limping back to normalcy and we will keep it (the matter) on hold at the moment," the CJI had said, adding he would see later whether the top court or the High Court should hear the case. The Solicitor General agreed with the observations.

A bench led by CJI Sanjiv Khanna noted submissions of counsel for the Centre and the State and deferred hearing on a plea filed by Kuki body KOHUR in the week commencing May 5

Bhushan termed the contents of leaked audio a "very serious matter" and said Singh was purportedly heard saying that Meitei groups were allowed to loot arms and ammunition of the State Government. "I have annexed transcripts of tape recordings," he added.

The Solicitor General said the petitioner had "ideological inclinations" and there was a report by a committee of three High Court Judges which stated that there were efforts to keep the "pot

"A truth lab confirmed that 93 per cent it is the voice of the (then) Chief Minister," said Bhushan, "and truth labs are far more reliable than the FSL reports". The law officer, however, questioned the veracity of the truth lab report. On November 8 last year, a bench headed by the then CJI DY Chandrachud directed KOHUR to produce material to indicate the authenticity of some of the leaked audio clips. Bhushan had said he would also file a copy of the tape in a CD format. Mehta, however, said the plea could be filed in the High Court under Article 226 of the

Bhushan said that the recorded conversation prima facie showed the complicity and involvement of the State machinery in the violence against the Kuki Zo community. He said the clips had "disturbing conversations" and Singh could be heard instigating the violence and protecting the attackers.

KOHUR's plea alleged that Singh was instrumental in "inciting, organising and thereafter centrally orchestrating the large-scale murder, destruction and other forms of violence against the Kukidominated areas in Manipur".

"The petitioner is praying for a court-monitored investigation by a Special Investigation Team into the leaked audio tape clips as there is clear and strong prima facie evidence showing involvement of the highest functionary, ie, the (then) Chief Minister. The investigation will need to unearth the conspiracy which appears to involve the highest functionary of the State," the plea in the Apex Court said.

PM Modi directs Delhi to clean Yamuna

rime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday chaired a comprehensive Thursday change a complete review meeting on the Yamuna to assess the current status of the river and discussed the ongoing and future plans for its cleaning and rejuvenation. The agencywise action plan to clean the river was reviewed in the meeting.

It was also decided that Delhi will preare an Urban River Management Plan for holistic water management, and integrate it with the City Master Plan. The meeting discussed steps like public participation and use of real-time data and space technology to revive the heavily polluted river. The Prime Minister emphasised that the experience of the Chhath Puja celebration by the people of Delhi should improve, it said.

The meeting held at the PM residence here was attended by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Jal Shakti Minister CR Patil, Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta and senior Government officers.

The meeting discussed short-term activities (of three months), mid-term activities (three months to one-and-a-half years) and long-term activities (oneand-a-half years to three years) related to the cleaning of the Yamuna along with management of drains, sewage, industrial waste and identification of gaps in wastewater treatment.

Monitoring measures, improving the Yamuna flow, flood plain protection, green riverfront development and public outreach were all discussed with specific timelines. The urgent need to rehabilitate Delhi's drinking water system to reduce leaks and non-revenue water was emphasised. The actions to be taken for Drain Management, Solid Waste Management,

Sewage Management, Septage and Dairy Waste Management, Industrial Waste Management, gap identification of waste water treatment infrastructure and monitoring steps, improving the river flow, flood plain protection, green river front development and public outreach were all discussed with specific timelines.

During the meeting, the river as a whole was discussed, including actions to be taken in the Haryana stretch of the river, the Delhi stretch as well as the stretch downstream of Delhi up to the Sangam at Prayagrai in UP. The current status of the wastewater treatment infrastructure, and the governance issues that impact the quality of the Yamuna waters were presented to the Prime Minister.

Prime Minister Modi advised that the best available technology should be harnessed to gather micro-level real-time data to measure the flows in the drains as well as monitor the functioning of the sewage treatment plants.

Poor potter gets I-T notice for ₹14 crore deal

potter in Rajasthan with an annual income of ₹95,000 was left Autterly dumbfounded after he received two back-to-back income tax notices last month for business transactions worth ₹13.55 crore in the 2020-2021 fiscal. It was later revealed that Vishnu Kumar Prajapat (32), a resident of Jhaliji Ka Barana in Bundi district, had possibly been a victim of identity theft. A case of cheating was registered by the police on

According to police, the potter's PAN and Aadhaar Card details were allegedly misused by a Mumbai-based firm to evade the tax scanner for two business transactions. Prajapat received the first notice on March 11 through email and speed post, saying no I-T return was filed for the transaction of over ₹10.61 crore in FY 2020-21. He was directed to file a reply by

March 19. He rushed to the local police station. From there, he was referred to the cyber police station in Bundi but there too nobody listened to his complaint, Prajapat claimed. The potter then took the help of a chartered accountant who, after some enquiries, discovered that his Aadhaar, PAN and other document details were "misused" for GST registration of a Mumbai-based firm owned by an individual.

It was also revealed that the firm allegedly executed two business deals, one of ₹10.61 crore and another of ₹2.83 crore, using the potter's details.

Armed with the information, Prajapat, on March 23, visited the office of Bundi Superintendent of Police, where ASP Uma Sharma heard his grievances, took his complaint and sent it to the cyber

police station for probe. Meanwhile, Prajapat received another I-T notice on March 30, this time for a financial transaction of ₹2.83 crore in the same financial year.

"Two police personnel visited my home on Wednesday and assured me that I will not be wronged," said the potter, a graduate in Arts. He told PTI that he earns only around ₹95,000 each year by selling clay pots, a family business.

A cheating case was registered at the Gendoli police station on Wednesday night and further investigation was underway, said Assistant Sub-Inspector Mukhendrapal Singh.

The police official denied charges of delay in initiating a probe into the matter, saying the complaint was received just a few days ago and investigation into it disclosed fraud and tax theft.

Prajapat had earlier submitted his documents to a private firm in Bundi, seeking work as a daily-wager and it was likely that his personal details were leaked from there, Singh added.

Shanan Hydropower Project Row Escalates: Punjab, Himachal Clash Over Ownership as Lease Ends After 99 Years MONIKA MALIK CHANDIGARH Claims & Counterclaims Claims & Counterclaims Shanan Hydel Project Dispute: At a Glance Minister to officers

The fault lines between Punjab and again — this time over a 110-megawatt British-era hydel power project nestled in the hills of Jogindernagar in Mandi. The simmering legal dispute over the ownership of the Shanan Hydel Project has exploded into a full-blown political showdown, following sharp remarks by Himachal Deputy Chief Minister Mukesh Agnihotri and an equally defiant rebuttal from Punjab's Cabinet Minister Aman Arora.

As Agnihotri, from the stage of Himachal Day celebrations in Mandi on Wednesday, asserted that the Shanan Project "stands entirely on Himachal land" and declared that the state "will not yield an inch", Arora on Thursday shot back with a fierce counterclaim: "Shanan is Punjab's rightful property, and we will fight this battle legally and administratively till the very end."

The expiry of the 99-year lease agreement in March 2024 has reignited an ownership battle laced with legal complexity, political rhetoric, and historical baggage.

This is no ordinary infrastructure dispute — the Shanan Project, with its colonial-era roots and symbolic value, has become the epicentre of an escalating inter-state war of words. While Himachal claims territorial and moral authority over the project, Punjab insists it has legal and historical rights that cannot be dismissed. The matter is now before the Supreme Court, where both states are digging in for a prolonged legal confrontation with Haryana also joining the fray.

Built on the Uhl river in Mandi, the Shanan Project was commissioned in 1925 after an agreement between the then ruler of Mandi, Raja Joginder Bahadur, and Colonel BC Batty, a British representative and Chief Engineer of colonial Punjab. The land was leased for 99 years to Punjab for constructing and operating the project. At the time, Himachal Pradesh did not exist as a state — it was a collection of princely hill

Over the decades, the project played a vital role in powering pre-partition Punjab including Lahore, parts of Delhi, and later post-Independence East Punjab. Originally commissioned as a 48 MW plant, it was upgraded to 110 MW by Punjab engineers using state resources to meet growing electricity demands. Managed by the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL), the project also provides Himachal with 500 kW of free electricity annually, in return for drawing water from within Himachal's ter-

But with the lease expired in March 2024, both states have moved swiftly to stake their claims - Punjab through a petition seeking permanent injunction in the Supreme Court, and Himachal through a strong political push and counter-petition. Also, the political leaders on both sides are using the issue to whip up regional sentiments. Himachal Pradesh has formed a high-level committee to assert its claim, while Punjab has pledged to fight the battle "to the last

SUPREME COURT AND CENTRE'S

With emotions running high and political rhetoric intensifying, the matter has now landed squarely before the Supreme Court. In a bid to prevent immediate escalation, the Union Power Ministry had issued an interim order on March 1, 2024 — a day before the lease expired — directing both states to maintain status quo and continue operating the project without altering its ownership or

The Central Government has since maintained a neutral stand, encouraging both states to resolve the matter through appropriate legal channels. However, behind the scenes, the Centre is reportedly concerned about the precedent this case could set for similar disputes involving infrastructure assets built during colonial or pre-statehood

HARYANA TOO JOINS THE FRAY

Adding another layer of complexity, Haryana has also moved the Supreme Court with an intervention application filed in December 2024. Claiming a stake in the Shanan Project, Haryana argued that since the Uhl river is a tributary of the Beas, which feeds into the Bhakra Dam — a project jointly managed by Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, and Himachal - it, too, should be considered a stakeholder. Haryana's contention leans on its historical association as part of undivided Punjab and its legitimate share in the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB). The court is yet to decide on the maintainability of Haryana's petition, but its entry has broadened the scope of the dispute beyond a simple bilateral matter.

A FLASHPOINT

For Himachal, the Shanan Project is more than just turbines and transformers. It has come to symbolize a long-standing sense of neglect and marginalization in national resource allocation. Himachal generates more than 25 percent of India's hydropower but consumes less than a tenth of it, often watching its rivers light up cities elsewhere.

For Punjab, however, the project is a legacy of its engineering prowess, institutional continuity, and a vital part of its power infrastructure. Officials argued that any disruption to its control over Shanan could endanger grid stability and open floodgates for other states challenging post-reorganization

The Congress Government in Himachal has made the project a rallying point to assert autonomy and control over the state's natural resources. Agnihotri's remarks were clearly aimed at galvanizing public sentiment around the slogan of "Himachal for Himachalis".

On the other hand, the AAP Government in Punjab has framed the issue as one of administrative justice and legal entitlement. Minister Arora accused Himachal of politicizing a legal matter and dismissed any notion of Punjab "surrendering" the project.

The charged atmosphere has made it difficult for either side to climb down without losing political capital. With Himachal forming a high-level committee to expedite the takeover and Punjab refusing to concede an inch, the dispute over Shanan has transitioned from a quiet lease expiration to a thunderous confrontation between two neighbours.

PNS CHANDIGARH

To resolve bill-related grievances, Haryana Energy Minister Anil Vij on Thursday directed the concerned officers to hold 'Bijli Adalats' at the circle level every Tuesday. Each Superintending Engineer must ensure that all billing complaints are addressed and resolved, he

Vij further instructed that in large-scale theft cases involving huge revenue, charge sheets be filed in court. Training should be provided to field staff on proper theftreporting procedures including preparing LL-1, collecting evidence, registering FIRs, etc. A training video should be created and shared to the field staff, he added.

Chairing the review meeting with Energy Department officers in Chandigarh, Vij has issued various directives to concerned officers or officials aimed at ensuring uninterrupted and full-voltage electricity is available to citizens 24X7.

Stating that 39,477 wrong bills were generated by UHBVN and 18,240 by DHBVN, Vij said: "These will be corrected within the next month. Additionally, an online portal will be developed to track the status of pending electricity theft cases and facilitate their payments, including options like SMS-based payment. An awareness campaign will also be launched soon in rural areas to encourage timely payment of electricity bills."

Vij said that the total defaulting amount is Rs 538.13 crores for UHBVN and Rs 1500 crores for DHBVN. Targets have been set for their recovery under which Rs 100 crore in April, Rs 200 crore in May, Rs 238 crore in June 2025 by the UHBVN and Rs 300 crore in April, Rs 600 crore in May, Rs 600 crore in June 2025 by the DHBVN.

During the review meeting, Vij also gave directives related to reducing power company losses, preventing electricity theft, replacing faulty transformers, ensuring consumer facilities, recovering pending dues, tracking defaulter connections, linking consumer Aadhaar numbers with electricity connections, correcting wrong bills, organizing Bijli Adalats, improving infrastructure, monitoring call centers and spreading awareness through various mediums. The Minister also instructed officers or

officials to coordinate with relevant government departments and submit files at the HQ level for the swift recovery of defaulting amount from government connections.

He also directed that in the case of old PDCO (permanent disconnection order) legacy defaulters, notices should be issued in the first phase to

Rs one lakh in DHBVN under the Land Recovery Act. In old PDCO cases (legacy defaulters), it has been reported by the field officers that the actual pending amount is far less than the amount reflected in the statement due to duplicate bills in R-APDRP system. It has been directed that duplicate or inflated bills be identified and corrected on priority. The Minister directed that defaulter con-

sumers who have taken new connections in other sub-divisions while staying at the same premises be traced. He also emphasized that there should be no defaulters in the industrial, NDS, and DS (urban) categories and that Aadhaar linking for all domestic consumers must be ensured. Regular field checks should be carried out for PDCO consumers to prevent unauthorized use or theft of electricity.

At the same time, he also directed that checking parties' staff be equipped with body cameras. Monthly theft reports should be classified as consumer and nonconsumer categories within a month. For theft cases without video evidence, courts should be approached based on available documents. For early hearings, applications should be filed in courts. A panel of competent advocates will also be prepared for better monitoring of recovery-related

Vij emphasized that transformers in urban areas should be replaced within one hour and within two hours in rural areas. Each sub-division must have transformers of varying capacities available. Transportation vehicles must also be made available in field offices for this purpose. Faulty feeders and conductors should be identified and replaced where breakages are frequent. Call centers should be monitored randomly to ensure swift resolution of outage complaints. Additionally, office premises should offer basic facilities to consumers such as drinking water, seating and shelters, he added.

sudden and powerful storm lashed several parts of AHimachal Pradesh late Wednesday night, uprooting over a dozen deodar, pine, and other trees in Shimla district alone. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), wind speeds reached up to 80 kmph, resulting in widespread damage to vehicles, property, and horticultural crops. In Shimla city, trees came crashing down in densely popu-

lated areas like Chhota Shimla, Sanjauli, Kaithu, Panthaghati, Kanlog, and Comely Bank. At least half a dozen vehicles were badly damaged in areas like Majitha House, Vikasnagar, and Panthaghati as heavy trunks and branches fell on parked cars. Traffic movement on the Kuftadhar road was blocked for hours due to fallen trees. Mayor Surinder Chauhan confirmed that nearly half of Shimla experienced power outages from 10 pm Wednesday until 9 am Thursday. "The IMD had issued a prior warning, and our teams were prepared. While there was no rain during the storm, the wind did significant damage. Teams from horticulture, electricity, and municipal departments were on the ground overnight to restore essential services," Chauhan said.

SAD fields Parupkar Singh Ghumman for Ludhiana West by-election

hiromani Akali Dal (SAD) on Thursday announced senior advocate and former president of the Ludhiana Bar Association Parupkar Singh Ghumman as its official candidate for the crucial Ludhiana West Assembly by-election. With the Election Commission yet to announce the polling date, Congress has fielded former Minister Bharat Bhushan Ashu and AAP has nominated sitting Rajya Sabha MP Sanjeev Arora. The BJP is yet to declare its candidate.

The announcement was made following deliberations led by SAD president Sukhbir Singh Badal, who held detailed discussions with senior party leaders, current and former municipal councillors, and the Ludhiana district leadership. The party stated that Ghumman's longstanding service to the legal fraternity and his commitment to public causes made him the natural choice for the ticket.

Ghumman, a prominent legal expert and party loyalist, has also previously served as Punjab's Additional Advocate General and vice-chairman of the Punjab and Haryana Bar Council.

SAD's senior leader Maheshinder Singh Grewal confirmed the candidature, highlighting Ghumman's consistent advocacy for citizens' rights. "Ghumman has always stood for justice. Now, he will take that fight to the people directly," said Grewal, adding that the party would soon launch an intensive election campaign, including rallies and door-to-door outreach.

In response to his nomination, Ghumman said that he would contest the election on a development agenda. "Ludhiana West has suffered neglect. The Aam Aadmi Party has failed to deliver in its three-year tenure. We will take the real issues — law and order, business stagnation, and lack of infrastructure to the people," he asserted.

Ghumman also termed the by-election a "litmus test" for the 2027 Assembly polls. "The outcome will reflect the public mood and signal the direction Punjab is heading towards. "This is not just an attack on the Congress, but on democracy itself. Turning a decade-old trust issue into a money laundering case exposes the government's intent. Independent institutions must remain impartial," said Hooda. The protest was part of a nationwide

 \mathbf{H} aryana Government has carried out a statewide registration drive to bring gig and platform workers, and other unorganized sector employees under the ambit of e-Shram portal. "Developed by the Union Ministry of Labour and Employment,

the portal is a national database for unorganized workers, which provides a formal identity and access to social security schemes, said a Government official spokesperson on Thursday, adding that the drive was undertaken by the Labour Department from April 7 to April 17. Spokesperson said that Haryana has emerged as a frontrunner in its implementation, with over 54 lakh workers registered on the portal to date. Haryana Labour Department undertook extensive outreach activities during the 10-day campaign. Camps were organized across all districts with on-the-spot Aadhaar authentication and registration assistance.

The initiative saw active participation and crowd gatherings at various locations, supported by awareness measures such as print media campaign, pamphlet distribution, public announcements, door-to-door mobilization, social media campaign and coordination with local bodies and labour welfare officers. Platform-based organizations including Blinkit, Swiggy, Zomato, Flipkart, Amazon, and Urban Company, were approached and sensitized to ensure their gig workforce was informed and included in the drive.

Spokesperson said that once registered, workers become eligible for a wide range of benefits including Rs two lakh accidental insurance under Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana, Rs two lakh life insurance under Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana, and up to Rs two lakh family health cover under Ayushman Bharat, depending on eligibility. In addition, they can access pension benefits of Rs 3,000 per month under Pradhan Mantri Shram Congress agitation against what it termed "malicious targeting" of its top leadership. Preserving the past for the future's sake

World Heritage Day is all about protecting the identity, values and creativity of humanity

very year on April 18, countries around the globe come together to celebrate World Heritage Day, also known as the International Day for Monuments and Sites. This important occasion, established by the International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) in 1982 and later approved by UNESCO, serves as a reminder of the value of our cultural heritage - and the responsibility we all share to protect it.


Heritage — both tangible and intangible — is the collective memory of civilisations. It tells stories of who we are, where we came from, and how our societies evolved. While time, climate, and natural weathering have always been enemies of ancient structures and traditions, a more immediate and insidious threat today comes from political ideologies and regimes. Around the world, we have witnessed deliberate destruction of heritage as acts of dominance, revisionism, or retaliation. In trying to erase the past, these regimes destroy not just structures, but identity itself.

One of the most tragic and symbolic examples was the destruction of the Bamiyan Buddhas by the Taliban in 2001. Carved in the 6th century, these towering statues were not just monuments of religious and artistic significance — they were irreplaceable pages of Afghan history. Their demolition was a stark message: the regime rejected not only the statues, but the entire cultural lineage they represented.

In Russia, we have seen another kind of heritage demolition. After the fall of the Soviet Union, statues of Lenin and other Communist-era icons were removed or destroyed by the new regime. While many saw this as necessary to move forward from a dark period, these relics were also historic markers — powerful reminders of an era that, like it or not, shaped the modern state. Similar stories play out in other regions. In post-colonial Africa and Latin America, monuments to colonisers have been toppled by newly empowered governments or protest movements. These acts are often cathartic for communities, but they also risk oversimplifying history by eras-

India, a country with millennia of layered history, offers a complex example. On one hand, India has shown tremendous commitment to preserving its ancient temples, forts, and cities. The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) manages thousands of monuments, and sites like the Taj Mahal, Hampi, and Khajuraho receive not just national, but global attention and protection. On the other hand, certain political narratives have led to the neglect, distortion, or even destruction of heritage. Mughal-era structures and other Islamic sites have sometimes been portrayed as symbols of foreign oppression rather than integral parts of India's pluralistic history. Controversies like the Gyanvapi Mosque case or the renaming of historic cities (e.g. Allahabad to Prayagraj) show how heritage is being rewritten to fit modern ideologies. India's heritage, like its culture, is layered and syncretic. To dismantle one layer in favour of another is to misunderstand the

When a regime destroys heritage, it isn't just erasing the past — it is destroying a mirror to itself. History cannot be undone. No matter how uncomfortable, the past lives in us. Monuments are not merely stones or statues; they are vessels of memory, cautionary tales, achievements, failures, and everything in between. Their destruction is a loss to humanity, not just a nation. As political tides shift, there is a growing need for governments to adopt a more mature approach to heritage. Recognise its value beyond ideology. Understand that history, in all its complexity, must be preserved, studied, and remembered — not sanitised or destroyed. Ultimately, heritage is not just about the past - it's about continuity. In destroying it, we are only severing ourselves from what could teach us, ground us, and guide us into the future.

It, therefore, does not follow that there are no differences between one part of the globe or another, or for that matter, all humanity agrees on everything.

There are differences of belief in matters of religion, creed, and values of behaviour. In certain communities, polyandry is accepted. In others, monogamy is considered desir-

The enforcement of these values is sometimes through written laws enforceable by courts and, in certain cases, by social practices and beliefs, none of which go to a court. The varieties are many, and the practices

often differ sharply. It is this that makes the



It is a happy truth that civilisational values have progressively advanced in that direction. That there are notable exceptions understandable.

Perhaps dealing with it with patience and purpose is the way forward. It takes time but can be done with positive practices in the family and positive values in collective places like schools and elsewhere. The direction is non-negotiable, and the attempt is worth its effort.

Why we must learn to laugh at ourselves again

nce upon a time, we laughed without offence or guilt. We laughed at power, at politics, at bureaucracy, and most of all, at ourselves. It was a laughter steeped not in mockery but in a shared understanding of the absurdities of life. Remember R. K. Laxman's Common Man?

The bespectacled, bewildered figure who stood silently witnessing the nation's daily dramas was our collective conscience drawn in ink. His was the lens through which middle-class India smiled at its foibles. No one was spared, and vet no one was wounded. His cartoons, which ran for decades under the banner You Said It, didn't merely capture the socio-political temperature — they made us laugh through the chaos, without cynicism, without rage, and it inspired us to gauge ourselves on the scale of changing times. How far we've come and not for the better! Just the other day, The Times of India reported that Western Railway in Mumbai asked for the removal of a hoarding that humorously depicted Mumbai's famously crowded local trains.

Everyone who knows the city even remotely will vouch that the depiction wasn't far from reality. But even reality now seems too irreverent to tolerate. Our thresholds have shrunk. Satire is suspect. Irony is an offence. And humour — a great salve to wounded hearts — has become a minefield. It is as though

we have forgotten how to laugh without hurting, or how to humour. Closer home, the Bhakti poets gently mocked dogma be the subject of a joke without taking it personally. The pubability to process humour as a mirror rather than a missile. We have become sensitive to our peril, for laughter now is no more a medicine but an action to be indulged in stealth. We now laugh at our own risk, for not all out there are amused. But let us pause here. What does it mean to laugh at oneself? And why is it so crucial to the health of a society, and to the sanity of the individual? To laugh at oneself is acknowledging one's imperfections without shame or embarrassment. It is to accept the human comedy in which we are all actors, fumbling, contradicting, faltering and having great falls like Humpty-Dumpty.

It is an act of humility. And humility, unlike humiliation, does not diminish. It enlarges us. It softens the ego, smoothens the sharp edges of pride, and allows us to be more forgiving — towards others, yes, but especially towards ourselves. We are not meant to take ourselves too seriously. The capacity to see one s absurdity, to smile at it, and even to share it with others, is a mark of inner strength.

In that laughter is a quiet wisdom — the wisdom to know that life is far too unpredictable to be lived in perpetual indignation. And as creatures, we are too tiny and insignificant in the canvas of the cosmos. Philosophers from every tradition have hinted at this. In Zen, the enlightened monk is often depicted laughing. In ancient Greece, Socrates was known for his irony, and his capacity to deflate pomposity through

and orthodoxy. Their irreverence was rooted in love, not spite. lic frame has grown brittle. Everything is either an insult or They knew that humour could illuminate truth in ways soleman agenda. Our collective skin has thinned, and with it, our nity never could, and it was taken in its true spirit. But today, we confuse being offended with being right. And so, we silence the comedian, the cartoonist, the satirist, and slowly, we silence ourselves. We build fortresses around our fragility and call it righteousness. We seek apology where we should seek per-

This is not a defence for vulgarity or cruelty masquerading as humour, which too has become abundant in these indiscreet times. We know the difference between crassness and coolness. And we must always be vigilant against humour that punches down, that mocks the marginalised, that cloaks prejudice in punchlines or masks depravity in insensitivity. But the answer to bad humour is not humourlessness. It is better humour. Finer irony. Truer satire. And most of all, a thicker skin. As a society, we need to grow up. We need to rediscover the art of laughing together and at ourselves.

The Common Man did not need to speak because the society around him understood the language of the silent chuckle. That silent chuckle is now endangered. Let us then re-learn the ability to look at ourselves with a smile, not a scowl. Let us not fear humour; let us fear the day when we lose our humour. When people can no longer laugh at themselves, they are no longer free.

Ilayaraja has demanded a formal apology and ₹5 crore in compensation from the production house. This case highlights llayaraja's unwavering commitment to protecting his creative lega cy and reinforces the importance of respecting intellectual property rights. In the past, he has repeatedly defended his works against unauthorised usage. Gone are the days when filmmakers collaborated extensively with composers to create original music. Today's trend of remixing and reusing old songs might offer short-term appeal but erodes originality and often leads to copyright violations. It is high time that filmmakers prioritised creativity over gimmicks and ensured legal compliance in music usage.

This incident underscores the growing menace of piracy and blatant copy right violations in the Indian film industry. Using a creator's work without consent not only disrespects their artistry but also sets a dangerous precedentone that undermines intellectual property rights. Ilayaraja's legal stand is a reminder that creativity must be protected, not exploited.

River ecosystems in the shadow of sand mining

As illegal mining alters the riverbeds and drains life from these once-thriving arteries, the need for sustainable management becomes urgent.

To preserve rivers as living, life-giving entities, we must shift from exploitation to stewardship, write BKP SINHA and AJAY JHA



ivers are more than just flowing water — they are living archives of the Earth's memory, coded in sediment, speed, erosion, and the contours of their valleys.

Each river carries within it a unique story of origin, shaped by the terrain it traverses and the climates it endures.

Their courses mark the pulse of the land, shifting over centuries, yet always finding a path forward. In their constant motion, rivers mirror the rhythms of nature — cyclical, adaptive, and ever-evolving.

The flow of a river is driven by the force of gravity, which is counteracted by the resistance of the terrain it flows through.

The characteristics of the surrounding environment, such as the landscape's shape, soil type, vegetation, and factors like climate, land use, and geological play a significant role in determining the river's flow rate, the course it follows, and the sediments it carries. As rivers flow through diverse landscapes, they expose the layers beneath the surface, providing a glimpse into the Earth's geological history

The sediments they carry — from fine silt to large

The sediments they carry — from fine silt to large boulders — reveal rock types, erosion patterns, and the entities that give shape to the terrain they have crossed. As rivers leave steep slopes for gentler terrain, their speed drops, reducing erosion.

They begin depositing transported sediments, with coarser materials giving way to finer silt, clay, and sand. The river may meander, forming curves and oxbow lakes, while sediment builds up along banks and floodplains, creating a more stable course and aquatic ecosystems.

Continuous erosion and deposition, however, cause these river channels to change course, often leading to braided river patterns with multiple interconnected streams.

Naturally developed embankments do help contain the river during high flows, prevent erosion of floodplains, and check disruption of ecosystems including any significant alterations to the river's path. The floods, however, deposit fertile silt on floodplains, enriching soil for agriculture like in the Indo–Gangetic plain. Again, as they approach larger water bodies, intricate deltas are formed, creating biodiverse ecosystems as exemplified in the vast Ganges–Brahmaputra Delta.

As the rivers flow, they provide a variety of resources and life-supporting services. Securing their ecological health is essential for the survival of humanity. River sand, apparently a relatively innocuous item made available by rivers, is in great demand, especially for construction activity. The extraction of river sand is regulated by the Covernment

With increasing focus on construction in recent times, however, almost all the states in the country are facing an acute problem of illegal mining of river sand. Major lengths of the rivers being in non-forest areas, the newspapers abounded with journalistic accounts regarding assaults by illegal sand miners on the revenue department's enforcement agency. Indicating, however, that the sand mafia is entering forest areas too in the current construction season, there are reports of several assaults on foresters too.



Sand is abundantly available in deserts, but the sand particles created by wind erosion are rounded and hence are less suitable for construction. Constructiongrade sand should be angular and with a certain mineral composition.

The proportion of fine particles (e.g. sand) and coarse particles (e.g. gravel), along with the cost of mining and transport, lead the extraction agencies to select the favourable spots. Indiscriminate sand mining, whether in the active channel or floodplain terraces, however, impacts the physical, chemical, and biological aspects of the riverscape apart from the human populations.

There are strong reasons for regulating river sand extraction. Depending on the type of mining, the riverbed's morphology changes, the groundwater table of the surrounding area is lowered, the stability of the riverbank is affected, and the flow regime of the river and the dynamic equilibrium of erosion and sedimentation gets permanently affected. They make way for disasters to happen.

As regards the chemical impact, the sand excavation and transport machinery severely degrade water and air quality through fuel/oil spills and exhaust

Extraction of river sand removes sediment-bound nutrients from the mining site which are then deposited on downstream sandbars. While these nutrient-rich deposits support green floodplains as seen along India's Periyar River, the process signifies a loss of nutrients from the river system but a reduced nutrient flow from land to marine environments.

Continuous removal of a sand layer of the riverbed can lead to the destruction of the habitat of microorganisms maintaining the river's biological health and endanger ecosystem services. Increased turbidity due to sand mining in active channels can block sunlight, hinder photosynthesis, and exterminate aquatic life like diatoms, macroinvertebrates, benthic algae, and fish eggs.

The shallow and braided flow impedes fish migration between flows and pools, disrupting the entire food web. Studies show that rampant sand mining has threatened species like the Ganges River dolphin and Chambal River's gharial. Further, unregulated sand mining results in the loss of aquatic flora and also riverside vegetation due to lowered water table, damaging the 'Shaded Riverine Aquatic Habitat' (SRA), which provides shade, bank stabilisation, and

nutrients to numerous organisms.

Again, the disturbed ecosystem creates conditions favourable for the proliferation of invasive species, such as the water hyacinth, in many Indian riverscapes. The repercussions of ecological instability are cumulative and far-reaching.

Water quality deteriorates, stagnant water in old sand mines impacts the health and livelihoods of local communities, and the collapse of infrastructures like buildings, roads, and bridges becomes imminent. The lowering of groundwater tables due to sand extraction is reported in the Achankovil and Manimala river basins in Kerala, where wells have dried up and agricultural productivity dropped as irrigation structures became ineffective. The decline in fisheries productivity has been reported in the Ganges River and other basins, impacting local livelihoods directly.

Meeting the ever-increasing demand for sand while adhering to sustainable sand mining practices in the interest of the river's survival is a formidable challenge today. With the Government's will to ensure the conservation and sustenance of our river systems as the non-negotiable premise, a range of responsible approaches must be adopted.

They should include creation of inventory of the

available sustainable resources based on scientific study, carefully selected locations for extraction, preand post-mining baseline surveys, controlled extraction volumes, phased mining with concurrent or subsequent reclamation of mined areas through measures
like refilling and revegetation, no extraction during
seasons of aqua fauna's high biological activity, and
third-party monitoring and evaluation as well as social
audit of mining activities involving villagers and using
GPS and drone surveillance as in Kerala.

Simultaneously, a concerted effort be made to diminish reliance on natural river sand by promoting the recycling of construction and demolition waste and the adoption of alternative materials like manufactured sand (M-sand), which is being promoted in Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.

While the ideal scenario involves widespread adherence to the above-suggested action points, developing a well-grounded strategy for effective enforcement has no alternative so far as a balanced and environmentally sound approach to sand management and riverscape conservation is concerned. Rivers have long been revered as symbols of life and spirituality.

To truly understand our rivers, we must see them as a part of the ecosystem that sustains humanity, and not just as resources to be exploited.

They deserve to be approached with cultural humility, legal innovation, and ecological wisdom. In the face of climate change and environmental degradation also, rivers stand as an eternal reminder that revival is always possible — if we learn to listen, respect, and align ourselves in harmony with nature.

Trump joins tariff talks with Japan as US seeks deals amid trade wars

resident Donald Trump on Wednesday inserted himself directly into trade talks with Japanese officials, a sign of the high stakes for the United States after its tariffs rattled the economy and caused the administration to assure the public that it would quickly reach deals.

The Republican president attended the meeting alongside Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick, top economic advisers with a central role in his trade and tariff policies.

"Hopefully something can be worked out which is good (GREAT!) for Japan and the USA!" Trump wrote in a social media post ahead of the meeting.

Afterward, he posted: "A Great Honour to have just met with the Japanese Delegation on Trade. Big Progress!

Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba told reporters Thursday in Tokyo that his chief trade negotiator, Ryosei Akazawa, told him from Washington that the talks were "very candid and constructive."

"Of course the talks are not easy, but President Trump stated his intention to make this negotiation a top priority," Ishiba said. "I believe we had talks that lead



Ishiba said he will closely watch how ministerial talks go and plans to visit Washington to meet with Trump at an appropriate time.

Trump's choice to get directly involved in negotiations points to his desire to quickly finalise a slew of trade deals as China is pursuing its own set of agreements. It's an open test of Trump's reputation as a dealmaker as countries around the world seek to limit the potential damage unleashed by his import taxes.

The sweeping tariffs that Trump announced on April 2 triggered panic in the financial markets and generated recession fears, causing the US president to quickly put a partial 90-day hold on the import taxes and increase his already steep tariffs against China to as much as 145per

The pause temporarily spared Japan from 24per cent across-the-board tariffs, but there continues to be a 10per cent baseline tariff and a 25per cent tax on import-

With Japan charging an average tax rate of 1.9 per cent on other countries' goods and having a longstanding alliance with the US, the talks on Wednesday are a crucial indicator of whether the Trump administration can achieve a meaningful deal that reassures the markets, American voters and foreign allies.

US economic rival China, meanwhile, is trying to capitalise on the turmoil around Trump's announcements, with its leader, President Xi Jinping, touring nations of Southeast Asia and promoting his country as a more reliable trade partner.

Japan is among the first countries to start open negotiations with the US Trump and other administration officials have said the phones have been "ringing off the hook" with dozens of countries calling, eager to strike deals with a president who views himself as a master negotiator to avoid tariffs when the 90-day pause ends.

Israel and Vietnam have offered to zero out their tariff rates, but Trump has been noncommittal as to whether that would be sufficient. On Thursday, Trump is scheduled to meet with Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, who will likely be carrying messages on behalf of the European Union about how to resolve the tariffs Trump placed on the 27-state group.

The upcoming deployment of the Carrier Strike Group, named Operation Highmast, is described as an opportunity for the United Kingdom's armed forces to conduct a major global deployment and a chance to exercise complex operations alongside partners and allies such as India.

Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh and his British counterpart David Williams co-chaired the dialogue. aimed at deepening bilateral defence cooperation

"The group will transit through the Indian Ocean, conducting exercises and port visits with partners including the US, India, Singapore and Malaysia, before joining 19 partner nations for Exercise Talisman Sabre near Australia, and then training alongside the Japanese Self-Defence Forces and conducting a port visit to India," stated the UK Ministry of Defence.

The Indo-Pacific is seen as a "critical region" for United Kingdom trade, with imports and exports in the region worth billions of pounds for the United Kingdom economy.

◄he Donald Trump administration has threatened to revoke Harvard University's eligibility to enrol international students if it doesn't submit detailed records of its foreign student's "illegal and violent activities".

Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem on Wednesday wrote a "scathing letter" demanding detailed records on Harvard's foreign student visa holders' illegal and violent activities by April 30, or face immediate loss of Student and Exchange Visitor Programme (SEVP) certification, a DHS news release said. "With anti-American, pro-Hamas ideology poisoning its campus and classrooms, Harvard's position as a top institution of higher learning is a distant memory. America demands more from universities entrusted with taxpayer dollars," Noem said.

China President Xi Jinping arrives in Cambodia to wrap up 3-nation Asia tour

Chinese President Xi Jinping arrived in Cambodia on Thursday for a two-day state visit that serves as an opportunity to further strengthen already robust relations. The visit, Xi's first since 2016, will conclude a three-nation Southeast Asian tour that included stops in Vietnam and Malaysia. China has been increasing its influence in the region over the past decade, largely by exercising its substantial economic leverage.

Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet recently described Beijing as "an important and indispensable friend of Cambodia that has helped support the country's economic and social development." Xi was formally greeted at the airport in Cambodia's capital Phnom Penh by head of state King Norodom Sihamoni. During his visit, Xi is also scheduled to meet Prime Minister Hun Manet and Senate President Hun Sen, who is Hun Manet's father and predecessor as prime minister. Bangladesh, **Pakistan** hold talks after 15 years

angladesh and Pakistan on Thursday held a foreign secretary-level Foreign Office Consultation here after a gap of nearly 15 years and discussed the entire range of bilateral issues focusing on trade ties.

The meeting took place days ahead of Pakistan's Deputy PM and Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar's visit to Dhaka. Bangladesh Foreign Secretary Jashim Uddin and Pakistan's Foreign Secretary Amna Baloch led their respective sides during the Foreign Office Consultation held at the state guest house Padma, state-run news agency Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha said. During the meeting, the two sides discussed the entire range of bilateral issues between the two nations, the BSS said.

Baloch, who arrived here on Wednesday, is scheduled to pay courtesy calls on Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus and Foreign Affairs Adviser Touhid Hossain later in the day.

The last FOC between Bangladesh and Pakistan was held in 2010. Dar's scheduled visit to Dhaka later this month, will be the maiden visit to Bangladesh since 2012.

Israeli strike kills family of 10 in Gaza

sraeli strikes on the Gaza Strip overnight into Thursday killed at least 23 people, including a family of 10, local health officials said.

The United Nations meanwhile raised alarm over the mounting impact of Israel's six-week-old blockade preventing all food and other supplies from entering the territory. Israel ended its ceasefire with Hamas last month and renewed its bombardment, killing hundreds of people and seizing large parts of the territory to pressure the militants to accept changes to the agreement. A strike in the southern city of Khan

Younis killed five children, four women and a man from the same family, all of whom suffered severe burns, according to Nasser Hospital, which received the bodies. Strikes in northern Gaza killed 13 people, including nine children, according to the Indonesian Hospital. The Israeli military says it tries to avoid harming civilians and blames their deaths on Hamas because it operates in residential areas. There was no immediate comment on the

The UN humanitarian office, known as OCHA, said that almost all of Gaza's more than 2 million people now rely for food on the only 1 million prepared meals produced daily by charity kitchens supported by aid groups.

Other food distribution programmes have shut down for lack of supplies, and the UN and other aid groups have been sending their remaining stocks to the charity kitchens. The only other way to get food in Gaza is from markets. But most cannot afford to buy there because of spiralling prices and widespread shortages, meaning humanitarian aid is the primary food source for 80 per cent of the population, the World Food Programme said in its monthly report for April on Gaza's markets. "The Gaza Strip is now likely facing the worst humanitarian crisis in the 18 months since the escalation of hostilities in October 2023," OCHA said.

Most people in Gaza are now down to one meal a day, said Shaina Low, a



spokesperson for the Norwegian Refugee Council. "It's far lower than what is needed," she said. Water is also growing scarce, with Palestinians standing in long lines to fill jerry cans from trucks. Omar Shatat, an official with a local water utility, said people are down to six or seven litres per day, well below the amount the UN estimates is needed to meet basic needs.

Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz said Wednesday that preventing humanitarian aid is one of the "central pressure tactics" used against Hamas, which Israel accuses of siphoning off aid to maintain its rule.

Israel is demanding that Hamas release more hostages at the start of any new ceasefire and ultimately agree to disarm and leave the territory. Katz said that even afterward Israel will continue to occupy large "security zones" inside Gaza.

Hamas is currently holding 59 hostages, 24 of whom are believed to be alive. It says it will only return them in exchange for the release of more Palestinian prisoners, a full Israeli withdrawal from Gaza and a lasting truce, as called for in the now-defunct ceasefire agreement reached earlier this year.

The war began when Hamas-led militants attacked southern Israel on October 7, 2023, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting 251. Most of the hostages have since been released in ceasefire agreements or other deals. Israel has rescued eight and recovered dozens of bodies. Israel's offensive has killed over 51,000 Palestinians, mostly women and children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not say how many of the dead were civilians or combatants. Israel says it has killed around 20,000 militants, without providing evidence.

The war has destroyed vast parts of Gaza and most of its food production capabilities. The war has displaced around 90 per cent of the population, with hundreds of thousands of people living in tent camps and bombed-out buildings.

Iran confirms second round of nuclear talks with United States set in Rome

ran confirmed on Wednesday that the next round of nuclear talks with the ■ United States this weekend will be held in Rome after earlier confusion over where the negotiations would be held.

The announcement by Iranian state television came as Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian formally approved the resignation of one of his vice presidents who served as Tehran's key negotiator in its 2015 nuclear deal with world powers.

The head of the United Nations' nuclear watchdog, Rafael Mariano Grossi of the International Atomic Energy Agency, also arrived in the Islamic Republic on Wednesday. His talks may include negotiations over just what access the IAEA inspectors can get under any proposed deal. The state TV announcement said Oman will again mediate the talks on Saturday in Rome. Oman's foreign minister served as an interlocutor between the two sides at talks last week-

end in Muscat, the sultanate's capital. Officials initially on Monday identified Rome as hosting the negotiations, only for Iran to insist early Tuesday they would return to Oman. American officials so far haven't said publicly where the talks will be held, though Trump did call Oman's Sultan Haitham bin Tariq on Tuesday, while the ruler was on a trip to the Netherlands.

The stakes of the negotiations couldn't be higher for the two nations closing in on half a century of enmity. US President Donald Trump repeatedly has threatened to unleash airstrikes targeting Iran's nuclear program if a deal isn't reached. Iranian officials increasingly warn that they could pursue a nuclear weapon with their stockpile of uranium enriched to near weapons-grade levels. Pezeshkian praises former vice presi-

dent while acknowledging his resignation The former vice president, Mohammad Javad Zarif, served as a key supporter of drew criticism from hard-liners within the first round of talks with the US, while Iran's Shiite theocracy, who long have alleged Zarif gave away too much in negotiations. In March, Zarif tendered his resignation to Pezeshkian. However, the president did not immediately respond to the letter. Zarif has used resignation announcements in the past in his political career as leverage, including in a dispute last year over the composition of Pezeshkian's Cabinet. The president had

rejected that resignation. But on late Tuesday, a statement from the presidency said Pezeshkian wrote Zarif a letter praising him but accepting his resignation.

"Pezeshkian emphasised that due to certain issues, his administration can no longer benefit from Zarif's valuable knowledge and expertise," a statement from the presidency said.

The president in a decree appointed Mohsen Ismaili, 59, to be his new vice president for strategic affairs. In Iran's political system, the president has multiple vice presidents. İsmaili is known as a political moderate and a legal expert. Grossi visit comes as Iran has restrict-

ed IAEA access

Grossi arrived in Tehran for meetings with Pezeshkian and others. He met Wednesday night with Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, writing on the social platform X after the meeting: "Cooperation with (the IAEA) is indispensable to provide credible assurances about the peaceful nature of Iran's nuclear programme at a time when diplomacy is

urgently needed." Iran's state-run IRNA news agency described Araghchi as briefing Grossi on Pezeshkian in his election last year but

also urging the IAEA to "adopt a clear and transparent stance regarding threats against Iran's peaceful nuclear facilities." Both Israel and the US have threatened to attack Iran's nuclear sites if a deal can't

be reached to limit Tehran's programme. "As variety of spoilers are gathered to derail current negotiations, we need a Director General of Peace," Araghchi wrote on X. "Our predisposition is to trust Grossi in mission to keep the Agency away from politics and politicisation, and to retain focus on its technical mandate."

Since the nuclear deal's collapse in 2018 with Trump's unilateral withdraw of the US from the accord, Iran has abandoned all limits on its programme, and enriches uranium to up to 60 per cent purity near weapons-grade levels of 90 per cent.

Surveillance cameras installed by the IAEA have been disrupted, while Iran has barred some of the Vienna-based agency's most experienced inspectors. Iranian officials also have increasingly threatened that they could pursue atomic weapons, something the West and the IAEA have been worried about for years since Tehran abandoned an organised weapons programme in 2003.

Any possible deal between Iran and the US likely would need to rely on the IAEA's expertise to ensure Tehran's compliance. And despite tensions between Iran and the agency, its access has not been entirely revoked.

Iran's foreign minister questions contradictory responses from US envoy Meanwhile, Araghchi on Wednesday warned the US about taking contradictory stances in the talks.

That likely refers to comments from US Mideast envoy Steve Witkoff, who this week initially suggested a deal could see Iran go back to 3.67 per cent uranium enrichment — like in the 2015 deal reached by the Obama administration. Witkoff then followed up with saying "a deal with Iran will only be completed if it is a Trump deal."

BluSmart cab services suspended in Bengaluru, Mumbai, Delhi-NCR

lectric cab-hailing platform BluSmart remained non-operational on Thursday across Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru, and Mumbai, as the market regulator cracked down on its co-founder over alleged misuse of funds at an affiliated company.

BluSmart app, that offered more than 8,000 taxis in the three metros, stopped taking bookings on Wednesday evening and remained unoperational on Thursday as well. The sudden suspension puts the livelihood of thousands of drivers at risk and has led to customers venting out their frustration on social media.

The company, backed by BP Ventures an arm of the global energy giant BP did not immediately offer any comments

"We've decided to temporarily close bookings on the BluSmart app," the firm said in an email to customers without giving any reasons.

Earlier this week, Sebi (securities and exchange board of India) banned brothers Anmol and Puneet Jaggi from the stock market and ordered a forensic investigation into their listed renewable energy company Gensol. The investigation focuses on allegations that they used funds intended for procuring electric vehicles to purchase luxury apart-

"I have almost 20K balance in BluSmart and today morning got this mail that BluSmart services are suspended. What is this???When can get the refund of BluSmart is getting closed," said a customer in a post on X on Wednesday and attached the screenshot of the company's

BluSmart in the e-mail assured to initiate a refund to customers within 90 days.

"We truly appreciate your support. While we strive to be back soon, we will initiate a refund within 90 days if services do not resume before that," the e-mail said Another customer wrote on X: "I loved

In his resignation letter addressed to Anmol Singh Jaggi, one of the promoters of the company, Menon said, "There was growing concern on the leveraging of GEL balance sheet to fund the capex of other business's; and the sustainability of servicing such high debt costs by GEL." Menon's resignation came a day after Sebi on Tuesday barred Gensol Engineering and its promoters — Anmol Singh Jaggi and Puneet Singh Jaggi — from the securities markets till further orders in the fund diversion and governance lapses case.

The markets watchdog also directed Gensol Engineering Ltd (GEL) to put on hold the stock split announced by it and restrained the promoters from holding the position of a director or a Key Managerial Personnel in any listed firm.

Shrimp exporters seek Government intervention as Tariffs stir uncertanity

ndian shrimp exporters are keeping their fingers crossed as the US is set to Legin its review of anti-dumping and countervailing duties on shrimp next month, and are seeking Government intervention to help secure relief amid stiff global competition, industry experts say.

The exporters said that the formula of the US to calculate these duties is incorrect, and the Indian Government should take up the issues with them bilaterally, as domestic traders are facing tough competition from Ecuador and Vietnam in the American market.

'The US authorities consider India's RoDTEP and duty drawback schemes as incentive schemes, which is not the case. Both are WTO-compliant duty refund schemes only," Kolkata-based seafood exporter and MD of Megaa Moda Yogesh Gupta said.

He added that the US uses a 'zeroing' method to impose anti-dumping duty on shrimp, which is not correct and needs to be re-looked as it distorts the calculation of the margin of dumping.

He said that exporters are concerned and the Government should come forward to support them by re-introducing the Transport and Marketing Assistance

The US is not making a fair comparison between the export price and the normal value, leading to distorted dumping margins. Besides these duties, Indian shrimp exporters face a 10 per cent baseline tariff

(TMA) scheme.

Through this, the United States is not making a fair comparison between the export price and the normal value, lead $in\bar{g}$ to distorted dumping margins.

Besides these duties, Indian shrimp exporters face a 10 per cent baseline tariff imposed by the US on April 2. Giving a big relief, America has suspended the additional 26 per cent duty on India.

Currently, Indian shrimp exports to the US face an effective customs duty of 17.7 per cent, including 5.77 per cent in countervailing duties and 1.8 per cent in antidumping duties. Seafood Exporters Association of India Secretary General K N Raghavan has recently urged the Government to focus on securing a "levelplaying field" for the country's seafood exports during upcoming trade talks before the tariff pause expires.

Another exporter said Écuador is India's

biggest competitor in the sector, as it faces lower duties and enjoys a major advantage in shipping due to its proximity to the US

Odisha-based exporter Rajen Padhi said the anti-dumping duty has been in place for two decades, and it's time the US sets a uniform rate for India.

"As per an international agreement, no taxes should be exported. So now we can convince the US that the RoDTEP (Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products) scheme is not an incentive scheme as we have a mechanism in place to do the verification," said Padhi. Commercial Director, B One Business House Pvt Ltd.

The US is the largest market for the domestic shrimp industry. Out of India's total shrimp exports, the country ships 40 per cent to America.

Ecuador and Indonesia are major competitors of the domestic exporters in the US market. There are around 1 lakh shrimp farms in India, most of which are in Andhra Pradesh.

The export of frozen shrimps during 2023-24 was 7,16,004 tonnes. The US imported 2,97,571 tonnes last fiscal year, followed by China (1,48,483 tonnes), the European Union (89,697 tonnes), and Japan (35,906 tonnes).

Campa Cola to open new bottling plant in Bihar

ampa Cola, the soft drinks brand owned by Reliance Consumer ✓Products Ltd, the FMCG arm of Mukesh Ambani-led Reliance Industries, will open a new bottling plant in Bihar.

According to reports, Reliance Consumer Products Ltd (RCPL)-owned brand will have a new plant on 35 acres of land in the Begusarai district of Bihar, where it will invest around Rs 1,000 crore. Confirming the development, the state Government's agency, Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority (BIADA) through a post on social media platform 'X' informed that the plot has been allotted to EPIC Agro Product Ltd, a company that produces and distributes Campa

The upcoming facility will integrate both bottling and manufacturing operations. This marks a significant milestone in Campa Cola's aggressive growth strategy, with a sharp focus on expanding its footprint in eastern and northeastern India.

The move comes just two months after the launch of a similar plant in Assam.

This year in February, RCPL inaugurated a new plant in Guwahati, Assam, strengthening the presence of Campa Cola in Northeast India.

Reliance, which has entered into the fastgrowing beverage market in August 2022 after acquiring Campa Cola, is expanding its presence across the country by setting up required infrastructure as supply chain, gistics network and bottling plants.

Campa, which is directly competing with Coca-Cola and PepsiCo, leading players in the cola segment, has disrupted the segment with its aggressive pricing and higher margin to retailers. It has forced players to reduce prices in the select markets where it is available.

On January 16, in its Q3 results, Reliance, which has ambitions to become a relevant player into the FMCG segment, said its Campa brand is projected to cross Rs 1,000 crore turnover in FY25.

Commenting on the development, Nuvama Institutional Equities Executive Director (Research) Abneesh Roy said this indicates Campa is now getting more aggressive in the eastern and northeastern parts of the country. We expect these investments to con-

tinue and expect that eventually Campa will have a pan-India manufacturing and distribution presence," he said. Under the Campa brand, RCPL has

launched a range of beverage variants including cola, orange, lemon, and energy drinks.

here are certain institutions across the world the names of which arouse in the mind a sense of respect and dignity. Pan Am, BOAC, Qantas, international airlines head-quartered in the US, Britain and Australia are known for safety, security, punctuality and courteousness to the customers. Automobile giants like General Motors, Chrysler, Ford, Mercedes-Benz, and Rolls-Royce too evoke adulation. These feelings are rooted in decades of immaculate track record. Such institutions with top global ratings are very few in India. The licence-permit raj in vogue from 1947 to 1998 had blown out the spirit of entrepreneurship from the minds of Indians. "Chalta hai" was the hallmark of the country's average citizen.

Despite these shortcomings, there are few institutions based in India which have done the country proud. All India Radio is one such organisation respected all over the world for its credibility, clarity and reliability. All India Radio, the Hindi name of which is Akashvani, is the voice of India and is the largest radio network in the world. What started as a broadcast of a small music programme from Bombay in November 1922 underwent many transformations over the decades and has become the

nation's pride. The history of Akashvani is not without blemishes. The days of internal emergency (June 1975-March 1977) saw the reputation of Akashvani suffering a setback thanks to the craving by the then Prime Minister to somehow hang on to office. The AIR network earned the not-so-good reputation as IndiraVani, as the news, fea-

tures and even cultural programmes aired by it were paeans in honour of Indira Gandhi. I do remember a radio commentator by name Ravi Chaturvedi weeping during the live commentary of the 1975-76 cricket Test match between India and West Indies which was won by India. The whole cricket fraternity who were tuned



in to the radio listened to Chaturvedi attributing India's victory to the Twenty Point Programme and Five Point Programme initiated by Indira Gandhi and Sanjay Gandhi respectively.

the idea of selling his innovation for personal gains and wanted the radio to benefit humanity. During the sesquicentennial event held at Cambridge University, invited scientists from all five continents described Prof Bose as a scientist who thought much ahead of his times, said Prof Nair who was one of the lead organisers of the event. In a subcon-

state-owned AIR is beaming myriad programmes catering to the tastes and requirements of the population. Akashvani has played a major role in popularising the folklores and tribal music which are aired as Lok Sangeet. The National Programme of Music featuring Hindustani, Carnatic and Rabindra Sangeet has become an essential ingredient in daily life. The archives of AIR are a repertoire of presentations by the Great Masters.

This is said to be the world's biggest collection of music recordings. The Farm and Home programmes (Krishi Darshan) of AIR have survived the test of time,

while private operators are yet to tap this significant segment. The Green Revolution that elevated India to be a country that exports foodgrains has been supplemented to a great extent by the Farm and Home programmes. As the saying goes, a rut has set in the way Akashvani is functioning. It is time for rebooting the radio in tune with the changed times. Mann Ki Baat, the monthly programme aired by AIR in which the PM shares with listeners various topics, proves

that radio is here to stay. What Akashvani lacks is an exclusive national channel broadcasting round-theclock news, music, newsreels, discussions and debates. Though there is a medium wave relay station at Nagpur, the programmes broadcast through this transmitter are hardly audible outside Maharashtra. The launching of a channel exclusively for news and current affairs should be given top priority. An institution with the motto "Bahujan Hitaya: Bahujan Sukhaya" can easily set up a twochannel system. Kudos to Pande and Kulkarni for this work which is a must-read for all those who are associated with mass media. I still remember the care with which AIR engineers set their clock in sync with the master clock maintained in New Delhi AIR at 4 PM every day for accuracy and tinent like India, the sharpness.

BCCI removes assistant coach Nayar; support staff all set for overhaul

he Indian cricket team's assistant coach Abhishek Nayar has been sacked just eight months into the assignment amid speculation of a rift with a high-profile member of the support staff even though Test debacles against New Zealand and Australia are being cited as the reason for his ouster.

If board sources are to be believed, Nayar has already been intimated of the BCCI's decision to part ways with him.

"While India's recent Test debacles (against New Zealand and Australia) has led to the churning but there is also a feeling in the BCCI that Nayar became a scapegoat in the turf war between an important member of the support staff and a senior star player," a BCCI source told media. Fielding coach T Dilip, and Strength and Conditioning coach Soham Desai are also on their way out after completing more than three years in their

respective positions.

The new Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) of the BCCI has capped the support staff's tenure at three years

It is learnt that India's first ever Strength and Conditioning coach Adrian Le Roux is likely to return for a second stint. The South African is widely credited for ushering in a new fitness culture in the then Sourav Ganguly-led Indian team during



the 2003 World Cup. BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia, when contacted by media, chose to sidestep the query.

"Certain things are being finalised. You will receive a press note from BCCI in some days," Saikia said when asked about the development.

The 41-year-old Nayar, a former all-

rounder who played three ODIs but was largely a domestic stalwart with 103 firstclass games, didn't respond to a text message sent by media. His presence deemed 'counter-productive"

It is learnt that Nayar's removal was on the cards after Sitanshu Kotak was added to the Indian team's support staff as an additional batting coach. "...Just after the tour of Australia, there was a review meeting conducted by the BCCI. The top officials of the board, including secretary Devajit Saikia and vice-president Rajeev Shukla, were present along with important members associated with the Indian team, and the national selectors," the BCCI source said.

"On the sidelines of the meeting, a powerful member of the support staff expressed his apprehensions about Nayar's presence and said how him being in the dressing room is proving to be counterproductive.

"While the BCCI didn't act immediately but they brought in Kotak, the former Saurashtra run-accumulator. It was a way of side-lining Nayar during the Champions Trophy," the source added.

It is understood that Nayar was not the first-choice assistant for head coach Gautam Gambhir when the appointments were finalised.

He was appointed to act as a bridge between Gambhir and skipper Rohit Sharma, with whom he has shared a close friendship owing to their time together as Mumbai teammates.

Nayar and Dilip have been the Indian skipper's "most trusted lieutenants" and it is not known whether Rohit was kept in the loop by the BCCI mandarins about


