TERROR RETURNS TO KASHMIR, TOURISTS MASSACRED

AFTER NEARLY FOUR DECADES, PAHALGAM CARNAGE RIPS APART SEMBLANCE OF NORMALCY

t least 26 tourists, holidaying in the famous tourist hotspot of Pahalgam in the Kashmir valley, were killed and several others were injured when a group of heavily armed terrorists, dressed in combat uniform, opened indiscriminate fire on them after verifying their religious identities on Tuesday afternoon.

After the February 14, 2019, Pulwama attack on a CRPF convoy, in which 40 jawans were martyred, Tuesday afternoon's attack is the most provocative strike on Indian soil by the terrorists sheltered by their Pakistan-based handlers operating from across the Line of Control.

The tensions between India and Pakistan may further escalate as the attack comes close on the heels of recent posturing by the Pakistan Army Chief, Asim Munir, on Kashmir. Last week, India rubbished Munir's remarks describing Kashmir as the "jugular vein" of Pakistan and said Islamabad's only link with Jammu and Kashmir is the vacation of illegally occupied parts of the union territory.

Condemning the terror attack on tourists in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said that those behind the heinous act will be brought to justice. PM Modi also directed Home Minister Amit Shah to visit the attack site in Pahalgam.

In a post on X, the prime minister said, "They (terrorists) will not be spared! Their evil agenda will never succeed. Our resolve to fight terrorism is unshakable, and it will get even stronger."

The attack also coincided with the first official visit of US Vice President JD Vance

According to eyewitness reports, the 'gruesome' attack took place around 1430hrs when a large number of tourists, after taking horse rides and absorbing themselves in the pristine beauty of Kashmir valley, were relaxing and breaking bread with their loved ones in the pic-

turesque Baisaran meadow, half-an-hour trek from Pahalgam. In a viral video, one of the attack survivors claimed that while they were having snacks, an armed man, dressed in a combat uniform, arrived and sprayed bullets at them after verifying the religious identities of the tourists present. Tourists, with their heads punctured with bullets, were also seen writhing in pain in the picturesque meadow of

As gunshots rang out, there was panic, and tourists ran for cover, but there was no place to hide in the wide, open space, said another woman tourist.

It appears the terror attack was broadly aimed at shattering the peace prevailing in the Valley at a time when tourist footfall was skyrocketing and common Kashmiris were reaping rich dividends of peace after the abrogation of Articles 370 and 35-A. In 2023, 2,11,80,011 tourists visited J and K, and in 2024, the number increased to 2,35,90,081.

Since March 26, over 8.25 lakh tourists

have visited Asia's largest tulip garden in Srinagar to see the blooming flower carpet of 17 lakh tulips of 74 varieties.

Tourists camping in Pahalgam vacated their hotel rooms in the aftermath of the gruesome terror attack. The local authorities facilitated their safe travels to instill confidence among them.

The terror attack ahead of the beginning of the Amarnath yatra is bound to affect the tourist season in the coming weeks.

The entire district administration and police force were mobilised and ambulances pressed into service. A chopper also helped evacuate those injured.

Till late Tuesday evening, the exact number of tourists killed in the terror attack was not confirmed by the police. The toll is still being ascertained, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said while describing the terror attack as "much larger than anything we have seen directed at civilians in recent years".

"I'm shocked beyond belief. This attack on our visitors is an abomination. The per-

petrators of this attack are animals, inhuman and worthy of contempt. No words of condemnation are enough. I send my sympathies to the families of the deceased," he said.

Before heading to Srinagar, Union Home Minister Amit Shah briefed the prime minister, who is on a visit to Saudi Arabia, said he was leaving for Srinagar to hold an urgent security review meeting with all agencies. "Anguished by the terror attack on

tourists in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir. My thoughts are with the family members of the deceased. Those involved in this dastardly act of terror will not be spared, and we will come down heavily on the perpetrators with the harshest consequences," Shah said in a post on X.

Amit Shah also chaired a meeting at his home in Delhi, which was attended by Intelligence Bureau Chief Tapan Deka and Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan, the sources said. CRPF chief Gyanendra Pratap Singh, J and K Director General of

Police Nalin Prabhatand some Army officials also joined the meeting through video conferencing. Mr Shah also spoke to Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, they

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh in a post on X said Deeply anguished by the news of terrorist attack in Pahalgam (Jammu and Kashmir). This dastardly attack on innocent civilians is an act of cowardice and highly reprehensible. My thoughts and prayers are with the innocent victims and their families.

Meanwhile, a massive anti-terrorist operation has been launched to hunt down the assailants, and security forces have fanned out in all directions.

Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, who accompanied the Home Minister in a special flight from New Delhi Tuesday, said, "I strongly condemn the cowardly terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam. I assure the people that those behind this despicable attack will not go unpunished."

ice President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Tuesday hit out at his critics for questioning his remarks on a recent Supreme Court order, asserting that every word spoken by a Constitutional functionary is guided by supreme national interest. He also asserted that Parliament is supreme.

This is the third of its kind remarks in recent times questioning the role and supremacy of judiciary and legislative which includes twice by the Presiding officer of Ràjya Sabha and certain BJP leaders including vocal Lok Sabha MP Nishikant Dubey. All faced severe criticism by the Opposition parties while BJP chief J P Nadda distancing itself over the controversial remarks by party members which also led slamming by the legal experts. In a related development, Rajya Sabha MP Kapil Sibal on Tuesday said



everything the Supreme court said was consistent with the country's constitutional values and guided by national interest.

Sibal's remarks in a social media post came soon after Dhankhar asserted that every word spoken by a constitutional functionary was guided by supreme national interest.

Addressing a Delhi University event, Dhankhar also said efforts of forces working against the country to tarnish and run down institutions should be neutralised, "be it that of the presidency".

Asserting that Parliament is supreme, Dhankhar said, "There is no visualisation in the Constitution of any authority above Parliament. Parliament is supreme... Let me tell you, it is as supreme as every individual in the country.'

He also underscored that there should be "no doubt" that the Constitution is for the people and its repository of safeguarding is that of the elected representatives. "They are the ultimate masters as to what the Constitution's content will be," he said.

DDA notice to Signature **Apartment residents**

→he Delhi Development Authority (DDA) has served a notice asking residents of Signature View Apartments in Mukherjee Nagar to vacate their flats at the earliest, as the deadline for evacuation, March 23, has passed.

An e-tender for its demolition was issued on March 17, shortly after the authority released standard operating procedures for the residents and the

Interestingly, residents of **Signature View Apartments in** Mukherjee Nagar are caught in a financial bind as they await rent compensation from the **Delhi Development Authority**

Resident Welfare Association (RWA) to coordinate the evacuation. In the notice dated April 15, the DDA stated, "The high court had mandated that all occupants vacate their flats between December 23, 2024 and March 23, 2025. That period has now lapsed." The DDA urged residents to vacate their flats at the earliest for their safety and to allow for the demolition and reconstruction of the building. It has asked the RWA to coordinate with all residents for a timely evacuation. It has claimed that information on the reconstruction schedule and process for compensation will be shared

The authority also stated that it is committed to complying with the court's

directive regarding rent assistance, although it plans to appeal certain aspects of the ruling. The DDA had classified the 336-flat residential complex as a "dangerous building" due to structural safety concerns. The apartment complex, declared unfit for habitation by an IIT Delhi report in 2022, was ordered in January 2023 by the lieutenant governor to be vacated and rebuilt. However, residents claim that despite months of waiting, no concrete action has been taken. Many have already vacated, while others remain trapped in deteriorating buildings.

Many families are struggling to relocate without the promised financial aid, deep ening their uncertainty. Interestingly, residents of Signature View Apartments in Mukherjee Nagar are caught in a financial bind as they await rent compensation from the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), even as the agency moves ahead with demolition plans for their structurally unsafe homes.

RWA president Amrendra Singh Rakesh said 111 residents have already vacated their flats but have not received the promised rent compensation.

"Residents were assured of financial aid once they moved out. But even after 111 families vacated, no payments have been made," Rakesh said. He added that the delay has left residents uncertain about whether they will receive the promised compensation. For many, the uncertainty surrounding the payments is preventing them from moving out. One of the resident, who still resides in the complex, is reluctant to vacate without a clear guarantee of financial support.

n an age when many couples opt for picturesque weddings in the Alps or the Amalfi Coast, a British MP returned to his roots with an emotional, culturally rich celebration that unfolded in the heart of Uttar Pradesh.

Navendu Prabhat Mishra, 36, a twotime elected Labour Party Member of Parliament from Stockport in the United Kingdom, tied the knot with Garima Tiwari of Bhopal in a spectacular Sanatan-style wedding in Lucknow on

From the earthy fragrance of turmeric during the haldi ceremony to the soulful beats of dhol echoing through a five-star hotel in Ansal Golf City, everything about the wedding exuded the charm of a quintessential Indian cel-

But what made it even more special was the groom himself-a rising British politician, clad in a cream-colored sherwani, touching the feet of elders, offering folded-hand greetings to guests, and joining the pheras with a sincerity that moved many to tears.

Goyal has a Bachelor of Commerce degree from the MS University of Baroda. She qualified for the exam with political science and international relations as her optional subject.

Parag, a Bachelor of Technology graduate in electrical and electronics engineering from Vellore Institute of Technology (VIT), Tamil Nadu, had philosophy as his optional subject, according to the civil services exam results declared by the UPSC.

Shah Margi Chirag, who has a Bachelor of Engineering degree in computer engineering from Gujarat Technological University, Ahmedabad, secured the fourth rank with sociology as her optional subject. Aakash Garg, who has a Bachelor of Technology degree in computer science from the Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi, got the fifth rank with sociology as his optional subject.

The top five successful candidates comprise three women and two men. The civil services examination is con-

ducted annually in three stages - preliminary, main and interview — by the UPSC to select officers of the Indian Administrative Service (IAS), Indian Foreign Service (IFS) and Indian Police Service (IPS) among others.

The civil services (preliminary) examination 2024 was conducted on June 16 last year. A total of 9,92,599 candidates applied for this examination, out of which 5,83,213 candidates actually

appeared in the test.

A total of 14,627 candidates qualified for appearance in the written (main) examination, which was held in September 2024. Out of these, 2,845 candidates qualified for the personality test or interview, which were held between January 7 and April 17 this year.

Of them, 1,009 candidates — 725 men and 284 women - have been recommended by the UPSC for appointment to various services.

Out of the total successful candidates, 335 are from the general category, 109 from the economically weaker sections, 318 from other backward classes, 160 from scheduled castes and 87 from scheduled tribes, according to a statement issued by the commission.

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FBI-NIA Coordination on Khalistani Terror: Arrest | 'Tax Terrorism' Row Intensifies in Punjab: BJP, AAP, of Happy Passia Signals Shift in US Approach

n a development that could mark a watershed moment in counter-terror cooperation between India and the United States, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) director Kash Patel has confirmed active coordination with India's National Investigation Agency (NIA) to bring charges against Harpreet Singh alias Happy Passia — a designated terrorist of Babbar Khalsa International (BKI). Patel's announcement, made on social media platform 'X' (formerly Twitter), came just days after Passia's arrest in Sacramento, California, and has sent strong signals about Washington's changing stance on Khalistani extremism.

Patel's remarks are being seen as a categorical acknowledgment by the US of the severity of extremist violence linked to Khalistani outfits, particularly in Punjab. For decades, Indian agencies — such as the NIA - central counter-terrorism law enforcement agency, and Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) – India's main international intelligence agency — have identified BKI, Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF), and other affiliated groups as terrorist organizations. However, intelligence agencies in the US and other Western countries had often downplayed these threats, framing them as political dissent or freedom of expression under asylum

That position now appears to be shifting under the Trump administration. "FBI will go after those who perpetrate violence," wrote Patel, adding that Harpreet Singh, who illegally entered the US via the UK route on an Indian passport, was apprehended for plotting attacks on police stations in both India and the US.

The case is of particular concern to Punjab, where Passia and his Pakistanbased handler Harvinder Singh Sandhu, popularly known as Rinda, have been linked to a wave of terror attacks. These include a rocket-propelled grenade (RPG) strike on Qila Lal Singh police establishment in Gurdaspur in April 2025 and a planted IED device near the Ajnala police station in November 2024. The targets consistently included police personnel, Hindu leaders, religious processions, and liquor contractors — all aimed at creating fear and raising terror funds.

Investigations revealed that 28-year-old Passia began as a member of the Jaggu Bhagwanpuria gang before transitioning into full-scale terrorism under Rinda's mentorship. He is accused in at least 10 FIRs linked to 16 terror incidents in Puniab between late 2024 and early 2025, including 14 hand grenade attacks, an IED blast, and an RPG assault.

The FBI's action has been hailed by Indian security agencies as a long-overdue reckoning for Khalistani terror operatives who had previously operated with near impunity from foreign soil. Sources said that the cooperation between the FBI and NIA could pave the way for wider crackdowns on terrorist financing and recruitment networks, many of which are reportedly linked to radicalized Gurdwaras in the US, UK, and Canada.

Perhaps the most chilling aspect of the Passia case is the recruitment model. According to Punjab Police, the Rinda-Passia nexus targeted vulnerable Punjabi youth — particularly drug addicts — with offers of cash or drugs in exchange for carrying out attacks. In December 2024, police arrested a 17-year-old who confessed to planting an IED at Ajnala police station. He admitted to being lured with narcotics

Passia was also involved in coordinating with overseas collaborators, including Gurudev Singh and Gurpreet Singh based in the US, and Swaran Singh from Germany. His arrest has brought hope that these international networks — long seen as a menace to Punjab's peace and security - may finally face international

With a Rs five lakh bounty placed on him by the NIA following his role in a grenade attack on a retired police officer in Chandigarh, Happy Passia's capture marksed a breakthrough. More importantly, it underscored an evolving understanding among international agencies that Khalistani extremism is not merely a political movement, but a terrorist threat with global ramifications

SAD Trade Blame Amidst Growing Trader Discontent

unjab's political battlefield is heating up as accusations of "tax terrorism" fly thick and fast between the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and opposition parties — the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD). At the centre of the storm lies a purported controversial directive from the Punjab Taxation Department, mandating monthly inspections by Excise and Taxation Officers (ETOs) — a move that has sparked outrage among traders and political circles

Notably, Punjab Congress president and Ludhiana MP Amarinder Singh Raja Warring was the first to raise the alarm over what he termed as "government-sponsored loot". On Sunday, he accused the AAP Government of unleashing "tax terrorism" through coercive GST raids, citing Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema's alleged directive to 250 ETOs to conduct at least four raids monthly, each targeting a recovery of Rs eight lakh.

BJP'S CHARGE: AAP USING TAX DEPT TO FUND DELHI LEADERS

Launching a scathing attack, Punjab BJP general secretary Anil Sareen accused the AAP Government of institutionalizing extortion through the Tax Department. "The AAP government has weaponized the taxation machinery to fill its coffers and fund the luxuries of Delhi leaders," said Sareen at a press conference in Chandigarh. Citing an April 18 order instructing each ETO to conduct four inspections monthly, Sareen warned that the plan would lead to approximately 1,200 inspections across Punjab every month, potentially extracting fines worth Rs 96 crore monthly — or Rs 1,152 crore annually.

"This is not governance — it's organized loot," Sareen said, adding, "Officials have been unofficially instructed to slap fines of Rs eight to 10 lakh per inspection. Traders are being forced into submission under threat of raids. It's tax terrorism, pure and simple." Sareen also criticized the government for failing to assess Punjab's unique challenges as a border state and for worsening the economic climate. He threatened statewide agitation if the order was not withdrawn. BJP leaders Rakesh Rathore, Vineet Joshi, Sukhwinder Singh Goldy, and Manjit Singh Rai echoed the sentiment, calling the move an "economc assault on Punjab's traders"

AAP'S REBUTTAL: BJP IS THE 'FATHER OF TAX TERRORISM'

AAP Punjab's senior spokesperson Neel Garg came out swinging, accusing the BJP of hypocrisy and selective outrage. "It's laughable that the BJP, which turned ED and IT raids into instruments of fear, is now sermonizing about tax terrorism," said Garg, flanked by AAP leader Govindar

Defending the inspection directive, Garg maintained that the Puniab Government is focused on ensuring compliance and transparency — not harassment. He highlighted AAP's unprecedented gains in tax revenue. "Excise revenue of Rs 28,020 crore in three years under AAP, more than the SAD-BJP and Congress regimes; GST collection of Rs 64,253 crore — triple that of Congress's tenure; Own tax revenue saw a 55 percent surge to Rs 57,919 crore," Garg listed out.

"Every rupee collected goes back to the people in the form of welfare schemes, infrastructure, and better governance," said Garg, adding, "Unlike BJP's corrupt regime, where revenue vanished into private pockets, we invest it transparently for the people." Garg further slammed BJP's GST policy, accusing it of taxing essential items like milk, curd, and school materials. "They harassed small shopkeepers and forced compliance without offering relief. AAP's system is revenue-driven but fair and accountable," he said.

SAD'S STAND: END INSPECTOR RAJ, RESTORE RELIEF SCHEME

Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) president Sukhbir Singh Badal on Tuesday described the AAP directive as "tax terrorism at its worst". Accusing the Mann-led government of waging war against Punjab's small and medium traders, Sukhbir said: "Ordering 1,000 inspections every month is nothing short of official goondaism."

SAD has called upon traders to resist what it termed the "Inspector Raj 2.0", alleging that the move is intended to generate illicit revenue to bankroll AAP's political extravagance. "This is not governance. It's hooliganism wrapped in bureaucracy," Sukhbir charged. Besides, SAD also demanded the reinstatement of its flagship 'Rahat' scheme, which had offered fixed tax slabs based on turnover — Rs 5,000 for Rs 25 lakh turnover and Rs 20,000 for Rs one crore turnover — while limiting physical inspections of business premises.

The trading community is already reeling from threats by extortion gangs. Now, they are being hounded by tax officers. We demand an end to this double trauma," Sukhbir said, adding that SAD would launch a public movement if the government fails to roll back the directive. As Punjab's political parties clash over the contentious directive, traders find themselves at the receiving end of growing uncertainty. BJP is threatening statewide protests, while SAD is calling for a mass movement, and AAP is defending the move as a step towards efficient tax collection.

34 critically endangered vultures transferred from Haryana to Maharashtra

total of thirty-four long-billed and white-rumped vultures, both critically endangered species of birds, were handed over to the Maharashtra forest department at Pinjore in Haryana on the occasion of Earth Day

In a statement, the Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) stated that the birds were being transferred from the Jatayu Conservation Breeding Centre in Pinjore to Maharashtra, where they will be reintroduced to the wild.

As part of India's ongoing vulture reintroduction programme, 34 captive-bred vultures, including 20 long-billed and 14

white-rumped, were successfully transferred from the JCBC to three key sites in Melghat, Pench, and Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserves in the state. The transfer marks a significant step in reviving critically endangered vulture populations in central India.

According to the statement, vultures, aged between two to six years, were chosen following comprehensive health checks to ensure their fitness for release into the wild. The birds were carefully distributed across all three locations to maintain ecological balance, support successful breeding in the wild and ensure a balanced sex ratio at each site.

The vultures were transported in individual wooden boxes, one bird per box, to minimise stress and ensure safety during the

journey, and they were fed two days in advance as per standard protocol. The birds were moved in three air-conditioned tempo travellers to maintain optimal temperature and ventilation throughout the transit.

Punjab Hikes Interest-Free Wheat Loan to Rs 9,700 for Class-IV Staff ment in eight equal monthly installments

unjab Government, in a significant welfare-oriented move, has enhanced the interest-free wheat loan for Class-IV (Group-D) employees to Rs 9,700 for the financial year 2025-26. Announcing the hike, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema on Tuesday said that the initiative reflected the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Government's steadfast commitment to safeguarding the interests of its lowest-paid employees.

Cheema underscored that this step is not a standalone measure but part of a sustained drive to uplift those who have long been neglected. "Under the leadership of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, we are walking the talk when it comes to welfare for the working class," he said. Notably, this marked a cumulative increase of 21.25 percent in the wheat loan amount over the last three financial years.

The interest-free loan, intended to help Class-IV employees procure wheat at the government-fixed rate of Rs 2,425 per quintal, will cover the cost of four quintals of wheat per family, ensuring food security for thousands of government employees. The Rs 9,700 loan amount will be disbursed by May 29, 2025, with repay-

starting from the June 2025 salary (payable in July). This structure ensured that the entire loan is recovered within the same fiscal year, without imposing any additional financial burden. Calling the scheme a "backbone sup-

port" for the administration's Class-ÎV workforce, Cheema said that this segment often struggles with rising household costs and inflationary pressures. "These employees may not be in the limelight, but their contribution to the functioning of government offices and public service delivery is invaluable. This loan is our way of respecting that contribution," he added.

Punjab Minister orders immediate joining of transferred Tehsildars, Naib Tehsildars

aking a stern stance on administrative laxity, Punjab Revenue and Rehabilitation Minister Hardeep Singh Mundian on Tuesday issued strict directions to the Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars, who were transferred a day before, to immediately report to their new postings. Warning of surprise inspections, the Minister has also made it clear that any officer found absent from duty will face swift and decisive action.

Mundian, in a social media post on 'X' (formerly Twitter), said that he would personally conduct checks in revenue offices across the State to ensure compliance. "Absenteeism and indiscipline in public offices will not be tolerated. People should not face harassment or inconvenience due to officials not taking their responsibilities seriously," he wrote, reiterating the State Government's commitment to efficient and corruption-free governance.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)-led Puniab Government, under Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, had recently ordered the transfer of 56 Tehsildars and 166 Naib Tehsildars as a part of sweeping administrative reforms in the Revenue Department. The move followed persistent complaints from the public regarding inefficiency, delays, and alleged misconduct in revenue offices. However, several officers have reportedly failed to join their new positions despite the transfer orders being issued. Mundian emphasized that these trans-

fers were made in line with the government's zero-tolerance policy towards corruption and poor service delivery. "Public grievances and administrative shortcomings prompted the transfers. Our objective is to restore people's trust in government functioning, and no one will be allowed to sabotage that goal," he added.

This is not the first time the Revenue Department has come under the scanner. On March 5, a similar round of transfers was carried out, following a strike by revenue officials protesting the arrest of a Tehsildar by the Vigilance Bureau. At that time, the Chief Minister himself had intervened and visited field offices to assess the ground reality. When around 18 officers failed to rejoin duties within the stipulated timeframe, they were promptly suspended, and others were transferred, some even up to 250 kilometers away from their previous postings.

Building on that precedent, the latest directive underscored the government's intention to maintain discipline and accountability among its officers. Mundian has made it clear that disciplinary inertia will not be ignored. "If officials continue to disregard orders, the government will not hesitate to replace them," he said firmly.

The Revenue Department plays a crucial role in public administration, especially in matters related to land, property, and legal documentation. Mundian's move is seen as a bid to cleanse the system of inefficiencies and ensure people do not have to suffer delays or bribery while accessing

Procure crop through offline medium in villages where land consolidation yet to be done: Hry CM

aryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Tuesday directed the officers concerned to purchase Lcrops from farmers in villages where consolidation has not yet been completed, through an offline medium rather than the Meri Fasal-Mera Byora portal.

Presiding over a review meeting of the Food, Civil Supplies, and Consumer Affairs Department, Saini emphasized that the government remains committed to supporting farmers and ensuring they do not face any hardships. In villages where consolidation had not been completed, farmers were facing difficulties in selling their crops due to the lack of relevant data on the Meri Fasal-Mera Byora portal. To address this issue, the government has decided to facilitate crop procurement through an offline medium in these villages instead of the portal, he added.

During the meeting, the Chief Minister was informed that 17.40 lakh women had registered under the Har Ghar-Har Grihini Yojana. The Chief Minister instructed officers to verify the data of Ujjwala Scheme beneficiaries and BPL (Below Poverty Line) families through door-to-door checks. He also directed gas companies to set up camps at depots to assist consumers with LPG cylinder distribution. He reiterated that BPL families would continue to receive LPG cylinders

at the subsidized price of Rs 500.

APPROVES RS. 37.68 CRORE INCENTIVE FOR PIONEERING MEDICAL OXYGEN PLANT

Presiding over the 17th meeting of the Haryana Enterprise Promotion Board (HEPB), the Chief Minister approved a special incentive package of Rs 37.68 crores for Vayu Products Pvt. Ltd for setting up a State's first Medical Liquid Oxygen Plant in Jhajjar and a Captive Solar Power Plant in Ambala. During the review of the project, Saini said that the establishment of the project in the Chemicals & Petrochemicals sector would not only attract significant investment to the state but also generate numerous job opportunities for local youth, thus strengthening the state's economy. Of the total investment of Rs 125.49 crores, Rs. 72.24 crores will be allocated for the Medical Oxygen Plant, while Rs 48.25 crores will be invested in the Captive Solar Power Plant. This project will mark Haryana's first Medical Liquid Oxygen Plant, which is expected to create approximately 100 jobs within the state.

LAUNCHES PORTAL FOR CASH AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIP MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR ATHLETES

During the review meeting of the Sports offering various facilities to athletes. Department, the Chief Minister directed that special plans be prepared to ensure high-qualtraining in state sports stadiums and sports nurseries. He also emphasized setting up excellence centers focusing on specific elite sports and issuing unique IDs to athletes. During the meeting, a new portal for managing cash rewards and scholarships for sportspersons was launched. Through this portal, athletes can apply for scholarships and cash rewards provided by the Sports Department, ensuring transparent and convenient access to benefits. Since 2014, under the cash reward scheme, 16,305 athletes have been disbursed Rs. 599.43 crore by the department. Discussing the state's sports infrastructure, officers shared that Haryana presently has 3 state-level, 21 district-level, 25 sub-division level stadiums, 163 Rajiv Gandhi Sports Complexes, and 245 mini rural stadiums, all

Additionally, there are around 1,500 sports nurseries, with a target to increase this numity infrastructure and support for athletes' ber to 2,000 by the financial year 2025–2026.

Saini also gave directions about the improvement of cricket stadiums in the state during the meeting. He directed that the ground and seating area of Panchkula Cricket Stadium be upgraded. Besides this, the installation of high-mast lights and other modern facilities should also be ensured in the stadium. Similar improvements are planned for Raja Nahar Singh Stadium in Faridabad. Besides this, discussion on developing an international-level sports complex on 100 acres in Palwal was also held. A special project has been proposed, which includes a cricket stadium, multipurpose hall, badminton and boxing halls, athletics field, fitness and rehab center, hotel and restaurant, and seating capacity for 35,000-50,000 spectators.

Punjab Becomes First State to Grant Child Care Leave to Single Fathers, Parents of Severely Disabled Children

n a historic stride towards inclusive governance and family-friendly work policies, the Punjab Government has amended its Child Care Leave (CCL) provisions to extend benefits to single fathers and parents of children with severe disabilities. The landmark decision makes Punjab the first state in the country to formally recognize the caregiving rights of single male parents and those attending to the needs of children with chronic and lifelong conditions.

The progressive move acknowledges the complex realities of modern family structures, where caregiving isn't confined to mothers alone, and offers vital institutional support to those balancing professional obligations with extraordinary caregiving responsibilities. The amended policy not only promises greater flexibility to single fathers, including widowers, divorced or unmarried men, but also ensures that parents of severely disabled children can avail CCL even after the child crosses the age of 18, removing an important limitation in the previous frame-

Announcing the decision, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that the new policy reflected the Bhagwant Mann-led government's commitment to inclusive, compassionate, and forward-thinking governance. "Earlier, the CCL provision was only available to female employees with minor children. While that addressed a crucial need, it failed to reflect the diversity of caregiving roles and the intense demands faced by single male parents or families with children suffering from long-term, complex disabilities," said Cheema.

The two key amendments to the existing Child Care Leave policy are extension of child care leave to single male parents and relaxation of the 18-year age cap for availing leave for children who suffer from 40 percent or more disability.

The single male parents can be widowers, divorced fathers, and unmarried men who are the sole caregivers of their children. Besides, the disability among the children may be caused by conditions such as Cerebral Palsy, Muscular Dystrophy, Chronic Neurological Disorders, Multiple Sclerosis, Deaf-Blindness, and other profound intellec-

tual or multiple disabilities. "These reforms ensure that policies keep pace with social realities and do not leave out vulnerable groups merely because of outdated assumptions. Fathers are equal partners in parenting, and it's high time our policies reflected that," added Cheema.

The Finance Minister emphasized that the Mann Government is committed to fostering a compassionate work culture where employee well-being, family care, and professional growth go hand in hand. "This decision is a step forward in promoting genderneutral and disability-sensitive governance, and we hope it inspires similar reforms across the country," he said.

By amending the CCL policy, Punjab has set a national precedent for progressive, inclusive, and empathetic public administration - one that supports its employees not just as workers, but as caregivers and human

Boost to Police Infra: Faridkot gets Cyber Crime Police Station; Moga a Smart Control Room

eaffirming the Punjab Police's commitment to modernize policing and strengthen the fight against drug Marafficking, Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav on Tuesday inaugurated several key infrastructure projects in Faridkot and Moga districts. In Faridkot, DGP Yadav inaugurated a state-of-the-art Cyber Crime Police Station, a hi-tech Conference Hall, and a Briefing Hall with a seating capacity of 250. These facilities are aimed at enhancing operational efficiency and inter-agency coordination. Later in Moga, he inaugurated a futuristic Smart Police Control Room, equipped with cuttingedge surveillance and crime-monitoring DGP Yadav, speaking to the media in Faridkot, emphasized the transformative role of technology in crime prevention and investigation. "The newly inaugurated Cyber Crime Police Station, equipped with advanced digital forensic tools, will significantly boost our capacity to tackle online financial frauds, identity theft, cyberstalking, and bullying," he

Highlighting early achievements, he informed that Faridkot Police have already returned 260 lost mobile phones to rightful owners and helped recover Rs 90 lakh lost to cyber fraud, thanks to the proactive work of its cyber unit.

Faridkot, the DGP said, has emerged as the top-performing district in Punjab in terms of registering FIRs based on public tips received via the Punjab Government's antidrug helpline 'Safe Punjab - 9779100200'. Since the launch of 'Yudh Nashian Virudh' on March 1, 2025, the district has seen over

300 drug peddlers arrested and 150 FIRs reg-

Faridkot SSP Dr Pragya Jain said that the police also recovered 4.7 kg heroin, three kg opium, 130 kg poppy husk, and seized drug money worth Rs 3.83 lakh, apart from freezing assets worth over Rs five crore under the NDPS Act.

DGP Yadav also took part in the 'Bada Khana' community lunch hosted by Faridkot Police, using the occasion to foster dialogue between officers of various ranks and build camaraderie essential for field coordination. He later participated in a public outreach program, urging citizens to strengthen the collective resolve in Punjab's war against drugs.

In Moga, while inaugurating the Smart Police Control Room, the DGP noted that the facility will serve as the technological nerve centre for policing. It includes AIenabled surveillance systems to monitor public spaces, traffic, and inter-district checkposts.

He also announced the installation of 100 additional CCTV cameras across Moga's Nihal Singh Wala, Baghapurana, and Dharamkot subdivisions, aimed specifically at curbing drug trafficking and preventing

Moga SSP Ajay Gandhi said that under the Yudh Nashian Virudh campaign, Moga Police arrested 282 drug peddlers, registered 171 FIRs, and seized 6.2 kg heroin, 148 kg poppy husk, 12 lakh intoxicant pills, and Rs 3.11 lakh in drug money. SSP Gandhi expressed gratitude for the DGP's continued focus on infrastructure and surveillance to counter the drug menace.

Vance's India trip is being billed as a family-focused tour, with cultural visits to Jaipur and Agra aimed at helping his children connect with their Indian heritage through their mother, Usha

However, even such personal diplomacy carries weight. As the highest-ranking US official to visit India under the current administration, his presence alone sends a strong signal: despite recent tensions and Trump-era trade policy headwinds, the US values its long-term strategic relationship with India.

While the official itinerary includes only one major formal engagement — a meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi followed by a state dinner — the subtext of that conversation is expected to be significant. Trade negotiations between the two nations remain in a delicate phase, especially with Trump's reciprocal tariffs on Indian goods paused only temporarily until July. The resumption or removal of those tariffs hinges on political will from both sides. Vance's visit offers a diplomatic window for quiet discussions, signalling a willingness from Washington to keep dialogue channels open even if the Trump administration's broader rhetoric leans toward economic nationalism.

Vance's visit comes just weeks after Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard's trip to India, indicating a deliberate staggered engagement from Trump's key officials. Vance's attendance at regional and business forums in Jaipur, including a speech at the Rajasthan International Centre, and his interactions with political figures, provide an opportunity to reinforce bilateral ties beyond just military or economic frameworks.

His presence also comes at a time when Modi is preparing for a high-profile visit to Saudi Arabia, underscoring how both nations are recalibrating their global engagements and seeking balance in a multipolar world order. Vance's India stop, sandwiched between Italy and other key visits, thus plays a quiet yet strategic role in maintaining American visibility in the Indo-Pacific theatre.

By prioritising a family-led cultural immersion alongside limited political engagements, Vance is walking a fine line. It's a display of soft power — highlighting shared values, people-to-people ties, and the significance of diaspora connections — while also reaffirming the transactional, interests-based nature of current US foreign policy under Trump.

The symbolic guard of honour, shopping trips for Indian handicrafts, and visits to Jaipur's heritage sites are diplomatic gestures that soften the harder edges of policy friction. This duality makes Vance's visit a potent blend of optics and opportunity. Whether Vance's trip translates into tangible outcomes on trade or security remains to be seen. But the fact that his first visit to India is being positioned as a cultural one, while quietly engaging on serious policy matters, reflects the Biden-Trump transition's lingering complexities — and how Vance is being groomed not just as a vice president, but as a statesman with cross-cultural appeal.

In a time of strained alliances and recalibrated partnerships, JD Vance's India visit is a quiet assertion: that while policy may shift, relationships endure — and sometimes, it's the personal visits that pave the way for political resets. As India and the United States navigate a landscape marked by shifting alliances and political flux, visits like Vance's offer more than ceremonial value. They signal intent, test the waters of diplomacy and often sow the seeds for future policy recalibration. In an age when optics can drive narrative, such symbolic overtures may well prove to be the quiet bridges over turbulent geopolitical waters.

India bolsters ties with Sri Lanka

As China deepens its presence through major investments, India is doubling down to protect its strategic interests — offering aid, infrastructure to send a message that it is Sri Lanka's most reliable partner

mid the intensifying India-China battle for influence in Sri Lanka, New Delhi has reason to be satisfied following the recent two-day state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the island nation during which economic, defence, and energy ties with an important neighbour were shored up. India's strategic interests are intrinsically tied with those of Sri Lanka, hence the need to maintain close and robust bilateral relations with it. New Delhi also sought to convey to the Anura Kumara Dissanayake - led Government the message, yet again, that it can reap greater benefits from India, which is a reliable friend.

The underlying message herein being that China isn't one. It was also conveyed to Colombo once again that protecting India's security interests as well as its own should be of paramount importance. Towards this end, New Delhi also extracted from President Dissanayake an assurance, yet again, that he will keep in mind India's security interests.

To New Delhi's undoubted relief, President Dissanayake reiterated that he will not allow Sri Lankan territory to be used in any manner that will threaten India's security interests. For now, the Dissanavake Government appears to be walking the talk on this account going by news reports that Sri Lanka cancelled a joint naval exercise with India's arch-foe Pakistan, which was to be held in the waters off the strategically located Trincomalee, not too far from the Indian coastline. But not before New Delhi intervened and made its security concerns known, following which the exercise which was to have been held around the dates PM Modi was to visit the island nation - was scrapped. Given its strategic imperatives in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), it's essential for New Delhi to consolidate its influence in Sri Lanka where India no longer holds sole sway, and to maintain robust ties with the new Government in place there.

In its outreach to the island nation, New Delhi is also seeking to burnish its credentials as a leader of the Global South, projecting itself as a dependable partner for nations facing economic hardship, and who need not fear falling into a debt trap as is often the case when they avail of loans from China.

During the PM's visit, there was also important messaging for Colombo about the perils of hob-nobbing too closely with Beijing, with PM Modi stating during the visit, "We have shared security interests. The security of both countries is inter-connected and co-dependent." As a maritime neighbour in the Indian Ocean straddling vital sea far with the Dissanayake Government.



lanes, New Delhi knows that Chinese expansionism can pose a strategic threat to both India and Sri Lanka.

The spreading tentacles of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in Sri Lanka too have given New Delhi sleepless nights. As China's footprints in Sri Lanka increase, New Delhi

knows well that it cannot afford to let its guard down vis-à-vis Beijing as the latter builds deep inroads into India's immediate and extended neighbourhood. This has forced

India to redouble its efforts to ramp up its engagement and pro-

vide all manner of development assistance to countries in its neighbourhood so that they remain within its sphere of influence. In the case of Sri Lanka, India provided financial assistance totalling \$4.5 billion in 2022 and 2023 to it during its post-pandemic economic meltdown. This played a vital role in helping Sri Lanka obtain an IMF bailout. India's outreach to the Dissanayake Government has also seen it convert \$20.66 million given as lines of credit into grant assistance to reduce Sri Lanka's debt burden. All this, plus New Delhi's willingness to help Sri Lanka achieve economic stability, is possibly what has helped it forge close ties thus

Despite pursuing a policy of 'Neighbourhood First, India's strategic space in the IOR is increasingly shrinking amidst a relentless Chinese onslaught. Though India has coined the new term 'Mahasagar' (Mutual and Holistic Advancement for Security and Growth Across Regions) replacing the earlier coinage of 'Sagar' (Security and Growth for All) for countries in the IOR, containing China's influence remains a challenge. India's efforts don't always bear fruit, especially when China-leaning Governments are in power in the neighbourhood. Besides, the offer of Chinese loans and financial assistance to build infrastructure is too tempting to resist for cash-strapped neighbours of India struggling to execute mega projects.

In the case of Sri Lanka, the Left-leaning

Dissanayake has adroitly managed to balance his country's diplomatic ties with the two Asian giants in the six months since he took charge. It also means that the island nation for now is seeking to reap the benefits from the fierce India-China rivalry in Sri Lanka and the wider IOR. So if Dissanayake earlier this year managed to secure the largestever FDI (foreign direct investment) of \$3.7 billion for his country from China for a stateof-the-art oil refinery at Hambantota to be built by Sinopec, he's being wooed by India as well in the area of energy security. PM Modi's visit saw the joint launch of the plan to build the Sampur solar power plant.

It will be developed by the Trincomalee Power Company, which is a joint venture between Ceylon Electricity Board and India's NTPC. To boost the island nation's energy security, all the more imperative as it went through a crippling forex crisis post the pandemic — which meant huge fuel shortages

the visit saw a tripartite agreement between India, Sri Lanka, and the UAE to develop Trincomalee as a regional energy hub. India needs to consolidate its foothold in Trincomalee on the island nation's eastern coast and keep China at bay. With its huge natural harbour, Trincomalee is of immense geo-strategic import and has the potential to be developed as a naval base. India is also already jointly redeveloping with Sri Lanka World War II — era strategic oil tank farms in Trincomalee. Apart from Trincomalee, New Delhi is also keeping a close eye on another strategic port, the one in Kankesanthurai, which lies not too far away from the Indian coastline. The port in Sri Lanka's Tamil-dominated northern province is close to the Indian coastline and is being "rehabilitated" with a \$61.5 million grant assistance from India. Given its vital security stakes in Sri Lanka, a defence cooperation agreement with the island nation, the first between the two countries, inked during the visit would also help India counter

Chinese moves in the region. After all, China's hegemonic ambitions present a real and present danger to India and indeed the entire IOR.

Overthinking is injurious to mental health



verthinking is a subtle but destructive habit that many people silently suffer from. It often disguises itself as caution or deep reflection, but in truth, it's a mental loop that traps individuals in cycles of worry, doubt, and inaction. While it may seem like a method of preparation or problem-solving, overthinking is far from harmless it quietly undermines peace of mind, self-confidence, relationships, and even opportunities.

What begins as a desire to make the right choice or prepare for future outcomes quickly spirals into obsessive thinking. The mind replays conversations, dissects every detail, and invents endless "what ifs" and "should haves

Instead of arriving at clarity, individuals find themselves stuck in a loop of mental noise that prevents real progress. A 2013 study published in the Journal of Abnormal Psychology found that overthinking is closely linked with anxiety and depression. Repetitive negative thinking was shown to be a shared factor in many mental health issues. This highlights that overthinking isn't just an annoying quirk it's a serious risk factor that drains emotional energy, limits engagement with real life, and inhibits personal growth.Overthinkers often question every decision they make, fearing failure or embarrassment. This undermines


self-trust, making even small choices feel high-stakes. When action. Journaling is another powerful tool. Writing down someone begins to believe that every decision must be perfect, they become paralysed by the fear of imperfection, holding themselves back from growth, both personally and professionally. Relationships are also affected. Overthinkers tend to overanalyse texts, tones, or expressions, often creating negative narratives. A delayed response from a friend can spiral into "They're mad at me," or "I must've said something wrong." These imagined scenarios create emotional distance. tension, and unnecessary stress, making it hard to connect authentically. On top of that, the constant mental activity can interfere with sleep, leading to insomnia or disrupted rest, which further affects emotional well-being. So what fuels this habit of overthinking? At its core, overthinking is driven by fear — the fear of failure, of being judged, of losing control.

Often, these fears stem from past experiences where mistakes were punished or outcomes were unpredictable. As a coping mechanism, the brain tries to take control by playing out every possible scenario. Ironically, this attempt at control results in more chaos and mental fatigue. To escape the grip of overthinking, the first step is awareness. You can't change what you don't recognise. Start by observing your thought patterns and identifying when helpful reflection turns into rumination. The next step is to disrupt the cycle. One effective technique is to set a "thinking deadline." For instance, give yourself 30 minutes to evaluate a decision, weigh the pros and cons, and then make a choice. This method trains your brain to move from overanalysis to your thoughts gets them out of your head and onto paper, immediately reducing their emotional charge. It also engages the logical part of the brain, helping you process emotions more constructively.

Cognitive-behavioural therapy (CBT), a scientifically supported method, is built around this very idea — challenging irrational thoughts and replacing them with more realistic, balanced perspectives. Most importantly, take action. Overthinking convinces us to wait until we feel perfectly ready, but clarity often comes after we start. Even the smallest step — sending a message, making a phone call, beginning a project — can break the mental gridlock and build momentum.

We begin to see that the consequences of our decisions are rarely as catastrophic as we imagine, and even when things go wrong, we gain experience and resilience. Building trust in yourself is crucial. Each small, confident decision reinforces your capability. Along the way, practising self-compassion helps loosen the grip of perfectionism. You don't need to be flawless or have all the answers. Life is unpredictable by nature, and embracing that truth allows space for peace and growth. In the end, overthinking drains our most valuable resources — time and mental peace. It disguises itself as preparation but only delays action and postpones growth. Life isn't meant to be overanalysed — it's meant to be lived fully and authentically.

A BREWING CRISIS THREATENING **KERALA'S COMMUNAL HARMONY**

unambam, the jewel of Vypeen Island in Kochi, is a picturesque suburban area nestled along the Arabian Sea. However, it has now become the Achilles' heel of Kerala. In 1902, Abdul Sattar, a prominent member of the Kutchi Memon community - a Muslim trading group from Gujarat that had migrated to the state - was granted a lease for over 400 acres of land in Munambam by the princely state that governed the area. Later, in 1948, his close relative Mohammed Siddique Sait registered the deed, and in 1950, he endowed the land to Farook College in Kozhikode.

Over time, the college sold portions of the land to various encroacher-occupants. In 1971, the Paravur Sub Court ruled that the land was covered under a formal wagf deed. This decision was upheld by the Kerala High Court in 1975. Reports submitted by the Ernakulam Collectors to the High Court in 2008 and 2009 also confirmed the land's wagf status. Subsequently, in 2019, the Kerala Waqf

Board formally registered the property as waqf, effectively nullifying all previous land sales. Amid the ensuing confusion, numerous tourist resorts have been established on the disputed land. The residents of the area - primarily Latin Catholic fisherfolk have been staging a relay hunger strike for over 175 days, demanding recognition of their revenue rights over the land they have long inhabited. Unfortunately, the issue has been framed as a Christian-Muslim conflict, driven by partisan political narratives that now threaten Kerala's communal harmony. Union Minister Kiran Rijiju, during his speech in Parliament while introducing the Waqf (Amendment) Bill 2025, stated that the Munambam issue would be resolved in favour of the residents once the Act came into force. These statements reflect a lack of sincere intent to address the serious concerns of the affected residents. A respected Archbishop recently told the media that the hope for a resolution now lies with the State Government. - HARIDARSAN RAJAN | KOZHIKODE

Why India must cut GST on farm equipment?

As rural labour dwindles and food security demands rise, mechanisation is no longer optional — it's imperative. Yet the very tools needed to modernise farming are taxed more than luxury items, placing an unjust burden on small and marginal farmers



ndia's agricultural sector, the backbone of rural livelihoods, is at a critical juncture. The transition to modern and mechanised farming is no longer a choice but is necessary to ensure food security, optimise productivity, and improve farmers' incomes. Yet, a significant bottleneck hampers this transition — the irrational Goods and Services Tax (GST) structure on tractors and other agri-implements.

Today, farm equipment is taxed at 12 per cent, more than a luxury watch is taxed at 5 per cent. For a small or marginal farmer purchasing a low-horsepower tractor costing ₹5-7 lakh, this means paying ₹60,000 to ₹84,000 upfront as GST alone — a prohibitive cost for most. This, in turn, delays the mechanisation process in areas where it is needed

Pre-GST Scenario Was More Farmer-Friendly

Before the implementation of GST on July 1, 2017, tractors and most agri-implements were exempt from excise duties and subject to only 4-6 per cent Value Added Tax (VAT), depending on the state. Fertilisers, an essential element of agriculture, were previously taxed at 6 per cent (1 per cent excise and 5 per cent VAT). In the GST regime, the introduction of a 12 per cent GST rate on fertilisers was reduced to 5 per cent. However, on agricultural machinery still, 12 per cent GST disrupted the affordability landscape, disproportionately impacting small and marginal farmers, who make up over 86 per cent of India's total landholdings and are responsible for producing more than 60 per cent of the country's food grains.

While GST has unified the country's indirect tax system, it has also inadvertently penalised these vulnerable farmers by making essential farm tools more expensive. Rationalising GST to 5 per cent or even zero for tractors, their components, and agri-implements would significantly ease their financial burden and accelerate rural mechanisation.

Haryana's Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini has recently written to the Union Finance and Agriculture Minister seeking GST exemption on 10 essential farm implements like rotavators, zero-till drills, super-seeders, straw-balers, and tractormounted spray pumps — a move and other states CMs should also collectively endorse.

Policy Contradictions: Subsidise on One Hand, Tax on the Other

The contradiction is glaring. The Government's flagship schemes, like the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) and the Sub-Mission on Agricultural Mechanisation (SMAM), offer subsidies of up to 50 per cent on machinery such as tractors, combine harvesters, sugarcane harvesters, cotton pickers, for establishing custom hiring centres (CHCs) and also to individual farmers for buying pump sets, tractor mounted sprayers, zero till and seed drills. Yet, these efforts are undermined when the same equipment attracts a steep GST rate.



INDIA'S AGRICULTURAL FUTURE

HINGES ON WIDESPREAD

MECHANISATION, YET HIGH GST

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A reduced GST rate on farm machinery will empower smallholder farmers and reduce the Government's subsidy burden. Lowering upfront taxes means farmers can buy machines at more reasonable prices, translating into more minor subsidy requirements for the Government.



Inconsistencies in the Green Energy

The policy incongruities extend to the renewable energy sector as well. Renewable energy devices such as solar panels, biogas plants, and windmill components attract only 5 per cent GST to promote sustainability. Electric vehicles (EVs) also enjoy a 5 per cent GST and a 15 per cent discount on third-party insur-

ance premiums. Yet, electric tractors - vital for reducing agriculture's carbon footprint — are taxed at 12 per cent GST, the same as diesel tractors, and do not qualify for any insurance premium relief. According to a study by the International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT), aligning electric tractors with EV incentives could reduce the price gap between electric and diesel tractors by nearly 40 per cent, helping India make a greener shift in agriculture.

The Urgency for Mechanisation

Mechanisation is the key to addressing India's agricultural productivity paradox. Despite India being the world's second-largest agricultural producer, only 47 per cent of its farming processes are mechanised, compared to 95 per cent in the United States, 75 per cent in Brazil, and 57 per cent in China. At this pace, India will need at least 25 more years to reach comparable levels.

Labour shortages due to rural-to-urban migration have further exacerbated the crisis. The share of the agricultural workforce has dropped from 59 per cent in 1991 to just 39 per cent in 2023. Mechanisation is essential to offset this shrinking labour force, increase yields, reduce drudgery, and make farming more attractive to rural youth.

Limited uptake

Tractors dominate India's farm equipment market,

while implements such as harvesters, seed drills, tillers, and planters account for only 15-20 per cent of the market share. This limited uptake is due to the prohibitive costs and a lack of awareness about the productivity benefits of modern equipment.

The Government and multilateral agencies are already focusing on mechanisation schemes. However, these interventions will not reach their full potential unless complemented by lower tax-

Farm mechanisation is not merely about replacing manual labour; it is about optimising inputs, improving efficiency, and securing rural incomes in a challenging agrarian landscape. It is time for the GST Council to undertake an urgent review of agri-implement tax slabs. A uniform GST rate of 5 per cent or zero on all agricultural machinery and their components would make mechanisation affordable for small and marginal farmers, stimulate demand in under-mechanised regions, encourage the adoption of green technologies like electric tractors, and reduce Government subsidy outflows in the long run. The 'magical' character of farm mechanisation needs a booster dose. Rationalising GST will empower farmers, create rural entrepreneurship opportunities via CHCs, and help India achieve sustainable development goals. It will bridge the mechanisation gap and unlock the true potential of Indian agriculture. Mechanisation is the future, but affordability is the

India's agricultural future hinges on widespread mechanisation, yet high GST rates on essential farm equipment act as a major roadblock. Small and marginal farmers — who form over 86 per cent of India's agrarian base — are unfairly burdened by the 12 per cent GST on tractors and implements, a rate higher than that on luxury items. This policy contradiction undermines Government subsidies offered through schemes like RKVY and SMAM, inflating costs and stalling progress. Haryana's call for GST exemption on key implements is a step in the right direction that other states must support. The mismatch extends to green technologies too — electric tractors face the same GST rate as diesel ones, with none of the incentives that electric vehicles enjoy. This hinders both affordability and sustainability goals.

Meanwhile, India's mechanisation rate lags behind other major agricultural economies, slowed further by rural labour shortages and high upfront machinery costs. Rationalising GST to 5 per cent or zero for all agricultural equipment is critical. It would ease financial pressure on farmers, reduce Government subsidy burdens, and accelerate the adoption of both conventional and green technologies. Mechanisation is not a luxury — it's a necessity. Affordability, enabled through fair taxation, is the key to unlocking a more productive, sustainable, and prosperous agricultural future.

RTI amendment erodes transparency

By removing the public interest safeguard from Section 8(1)(j), the amendment now imposes a blanket exemption on all personal data — even when linked to public duties — thereby crippling the citizen's ability to hold public officials accountable

≺he recent amendment to the Right to Information (RTI) Act, 2005, through the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, 2023, marks a pivotal retreat from the transparency regime that India painstakingly built over nearly two decades. By shielding personal information under a blanket exemption, the Modi Government has altered the balance between privacy and the public's right to know.

The operation of the RTI Act — informed by several judgments by the Supreme Court and High Courts - has shown that personal information not related to public activity was already protected.

It underlines that there was already sufficient judicial restraint in place to protect genuinely private data. Landmark rulings like Girish Deshpande vs CIC (2013), and the Puttaswamy (2017) privacy judgment, drew clear boundaries between personal data and information relevant to public interest. Courts consistently held that unless the disclosure of personal information served a larger public cause, it should be denied.

Therefore, the amendment was not needed and shows legislative overreach, reflecting mistrust in judicial discretion. It signals a shift from a principle-based regime to a bureaucratic shield where no scrutiny is possible. The amendment now legalises the denial of information that courts had earlier allowed when public interest was evident-setting a regressive precedent that may encourage arbitrariness and corruption.

The SC judgment reinforces that safeguarding personal privacy and promoting institutional transparency are not mutually exclusive but are jointly essential.

This point underscores a vital democratic balance. The Supreme Court, especially in the Puttaswamy case, held that privacy is a fundamental right but not an absolute one; it must be balanced with transparency, especially when public interest is involved. The original RTI Act embodied this balance by permitting the release of personal information where larger institutional accountability or public interest was at stake.

The amendment breaks this balance by giving unchecked primacy to privacy, even when it is used as a smokescreen to hide inefficiency, nepotism, or corruption. For instance, public access to officials' attendance, disciplinary records, or property



details - which can reveal disproportionate assets - would now be blocked. The implication is that institutions become unanswerable to the public, reducing the citizen's role from a watchdog to a mute spectator.

The

sweeping

changes have been introduced through the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, 2023, amended which Section 8(1)(j) of the RTI Act. Earlier, this section exempted disclosure of personal information unless there was an overriding public interest. The amendment

removes this public interest override and comprehensively exempts all personal data from disclosure under RTI, regardless of its connection to

public duties. It is a fundamental shift from a "case-by-case" evaluation to an "absolute bar" on access to personal information, thereby hollowing out the core of the RTI

The implication is grave: details about the conduct, performance, assets, and public duties of Government officials — even when crucial to detect corruption-can now be shielded from public scrutiny under the excuse of "Privacy". It turns the RTI from a transparency-enabling instrument into a tool riddled with opaque exemptions, undermining citizens' ability to hold officials

accountable. This proviso was a crucial equaliser — it mandated that any information which cannot be denied to Parliament or a State Legislature should not be denied to a citizen.

Its removal gives disproportionate access to legislators while stripping ordinary citizens of equal standing in accessing information. It opens the doors for selective transparency, where MPs and MLAs can access sensitive Government information while citizens are stonewalled. This defeats the spirit of the RTI Act, of 2005 which was built on the idea that transparency is not a privilege but a right.

The move indicates a central tendency to empower the political class at the cost of democratic equity. It also allows the bureaucracy to selectively disclose information to suit political interests while denying the same to activists, journalists, or public-spirited individuals.

This technical change has a wide-ranging impact. By using the DPDP Act to amend Section 8(1)(j) of the RTI Act, the Government has effectively introduced a data protection regime that overrides the RTI's foundational purpose-access to public information. The phrase "all personal information" is undefined and absolute, allowing information officers to deny almost

anything under the guise of personal data. Details such as educational qualifications, performance appraisals, transfer postings, and reasons for disciplinary action can all

now be denied, even if such data expose abuse of power or fraud. This will embolden non-performance, discourage whistle-blowers, and limit the ability of journalists, lawyers, or citizens to demand accountability. In essence, it turns a democratic law into a bureaucratic fortress.

The Modi Government claims that legal obligations under RTI remain unaffected but this assertion is misleading. Section 44(3) of the DPDP Act directly amends the RTI Act itself, thereby altering the legal obligation.

There is a common perception amongst the citizens having consciousness about the RTI Act that the center should pause and review the amendment which reflects a broader democratic concern as it will dilute the purpose of the entire process of seeking information. The vociferous demand to reconsider the amendment is a red flag from the opposition and civil society as these changes are not about protecting privacy but about restricting scrutiny.

The repeal demand stems from fears that the Government is creating an architecture of secrecy behind the smokescreen of data protection. If allowed to persist, this may institutionalise opacity and convert public institutions into information black holes-something antithetical to participatory democracy.

The RTI Act was a landmark law that was an unprecedented achievement of the people's movement under Magsaysay winner, Aruna Roy that democratised access to governance and brought the citizen to the center of accountability. By altering its core provisions, the Modi Government risks reversing this progress.

While data protection is necessary in the digital age, it should not come at the cost of institutional transparency. Instead of finding a nuanced balance, the Government has chosen to impose blanket opacity.

The implications go far beyond legalese-they erode the foundations of a transparent republic, where the citizen has the right to question power. This amendment must be revisited, reviewed, and if necessary, repealed to restore the sanctity of the RTI Act.

Pope's calls made him revered figure in Gaza

angladesh has rejected New Delhi's charge that the recent killing of a Hindu leader was part of a "pattern of systematic persecution" of minorities in that country.

Body of Hindu community leader Bhabesh Chandra Roy, 58, a resident of Basudebpur village of Dinajpur district in north Bangladesh, was recovered on Thursday night. His son has claimed Roy was allegedly abducted from his home in the village, about 330 kilometres northwest of Dhaka, and beaten to death.

"It is unfortunate that the death of Mr Bhabesh Chandra Roy has been described as part of a 'pattern of systematic persecution' of Hindu minorities under the interim government," interim government chief Muhammad Yunus' press secretary Shafigul Alam told the state-run Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) news agency late Monday.

Alam, who is currently accompanying Yunus to an international conference in Qatar, said Bangladesh is not a country where one would find government-sponsored systematic discrimination against minorities. Rather, he claimed, the Bangladesh government protects the rights of all of its citizens irrespective of religious

The Bangladesh reaction came days after India condemned the alleged abduction and killing of the Hindu minority leader in Bangladesh and called on the interim government in Dhaka to live up to its responsibility of protecting the minorities. This killing follows a pattern of system-

atic persecution of Hindu minorities under the interim government even as the perpetrators of previous such events roam with impunity," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X on Saturday.

Roy's family had lodged a case with Dinajpur police after his murder against four named suspects and several unnamed individuals. "The accused took my father to an unknown location and beat him to death in a premeditated manner," Roy's son 28-year-old Swapan Chandra Roy, alleged in his written complaint.

Swapan Chandra Roy named Atikur Rahman as accused number one, who according to media reports, runs an informal money lending business.

Police said according to the family complaint, Roy borrowed Taka (Tk) 25,000 from Rahman agreeing to repay it in monthly installments of Tk 3,250 but financial hardship debarred him from regular repayment despite the lender's insistence making him sick.

Roy's son, in the complaint, said that on

April 17 afternoon the accused went to Roy's house on two motorbikes and took him away under the pretext of an urgent discussion and added that he received a call in the evening when a co-accused, Ratan Islam told him his father had fallen sick.

The accused abandoned Roy on a spot near his home and fled and doctors declared him dead as the family took him to a hospital.

Yunus's press secretary, however, said "in this particular case, we have ascertained that the victim went out with some individuals previously known to him" and the autopsy report did not detect any prima facie sign of bodily injury.

'This notwithstanding, the authorities have ordered viscera analysis to conclusively determine the cause of death," he said, adding that appropriate actions would be taken once the viscera report is available. 'We invite all quarters to refrain from making fabricated and insightful comments on the incident," Alam added.

Roy's son said his father was a farmer by profession and also served as the vicepresident of the local unit of Puja Udjapan

Dinajpur's district police chief Marufat Hossain acknowledged the filing of the case by Roy's son. "We are taking the matter seriously and conducting a thorough

Reforms key to India's growth story over next two decades: FM

ndia's quest for sustained growth over the next two decades hinges on a new paradigm, driven by bold reforms, enhanced domestic capabilities, and strategic institutional collaborations suited for the evolving global landscape, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said on Monday.

The last two Union Budgets have laid the groundwork for this transformation, with a clear multi-sectoral policy agenda, she said, while speaking at Hoover Institution at Stanford University California.

In the last decade, she said the government has undertaken structural reforms, rationalising over 20,000 compliances, decriminalising business laws and digitising public services to reduce friction.

She further said a significant thrust on infrastructure development has also created a strong foundation for manufacturing-led growth by bolstering investor confidence over the last 10 years.

Our experience with implementing the Business **Reform Action Plan by different** state governments has demonstrated that deregulation is a powerful catalyst for industrial

This has been enabled by a more than four-fold increase in the union government's capital expenditure between 2017 18 and the 2025-26 Budget, she said.

"Our experience with implementing the Business Reform Action Plan by different state governments has demonstrated that deregulation is a powerful catalyst for industrial growth," she said.

Going forward, the Finance Minister said, sustaining India's growth momentum calls for a fresh approach of bold reforms, adaptive strategies in line with changing global landscape.

"Over the next two decades, sustaining

India's growth momentum calls for a fresh approach grounded in bold reforms, stronger domestic capacities, renewed institutional partnerships and adaptive strategies suited for the evolving global landscape," she said.

India has set a goal to become a developed nation by 2047, the year when the country would enter the 100th year of its independence from British rule.

"As we lay the foundation for a developed India, we must stay committed to longterm goals, without losing sight of present realities. The global order is changing. That poses challenges but also opportunities. We must be prepared to tackle the former while seizing the latter," she said.

India's journey to become a 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047 is not merely an aspiration but a shared national mission powered by a vision for inclusive, sustainable, and innovation-led growth, she said.

Despite the pandemic shock and a banking crisis, she said, "our progress over the past decade, anchored in strong macroeconomic fundamentals and steady reforms, gives us confidence and direction for the road ahead." As a result, she said, India has risen from the world's tenthlargest economy to the fifth-largest.

Quoting a report by Indiaspora and BCG, she said, Indian first-generation immigrants founded 72 unicorns between 2018 and 2023 and these unicorns were worth at least USD 195 billion in valuation and employed nearly 55,000 people.

More than 65 per cent of Global Capability Centres (GCC) in India have their headquarters in the US, she said, adding, these GCCs provide high-valueadded, bespoke services in areas such as R&D, management consulting and auditing. Observing that the US is a mature start-up hub which has developed over 50-60 years, while India's start-up journey is a nascent one, she said, "over the course of the last decade, the government's focus was on reducing the cost of entrepreneurial risk-taking by removing regulatory and infrastructural barriers.Rs

India, US have finalised terms for BTA: USTR

ndia and the US have finalised the terms of reference outlining the roadmap for negotiations of the proposed Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA), according to a statement issued by the

US Trade Representative (USTR) Jamieson Greer said that these ongoing talks will help achieve balance and reciprocity by opening new markets for American goods and addressing unfair practices that harm US workers.

"India's constructive engagement so far has been welcomed, and I look forward to creating new opportunities for workers, farmers, and entrepreneurs in both countries," he said in a statement.

"I am pleased to confirm that USTR and India's Ministry of Commerce and Industry have finalised the Terms of Reference to lay down a roadmap for the negotiations on reciprocal trade," Ambassador Greer said.

He claimed that there is a "serious" lack of reciprocity in the trade relationship with India. India and the US on Monday said that they made "significant progress" in negotiations for a mutually beneficial bilateral trade pact as Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US Vice President JD Vance held wide-ranging talks here.

Vance is the first US vice president to visit India in 12 years after Joe Biden visited New Delhi in 2013.

On February 13, the two countries announced to negotiate the BTA. It was decided to finalise the first phase of the pact by the fall (September-October) this

to the USTR, the United States is looking at increasing market access, reducing tariffs and non-tariff barriers, and negotiating a robust set of additional commitments to ensure long-term benefits.

US has long recognised significant trade barriers with India and as a result, the US ran a USD 45.7 billion goods trade deficit with India in 2024, a 5.1 per cent

The US total goods trade with India was estimated at \$129.2 billion in 2024. According to the US. India's average applied tariff is 17 per cent, among the highest of the world's largest economies

(USD 2.2 billion) increase over 2023, the statement said. "The US welcomed the tariff reductions India implemented during the Prime Minister's (Narendra Modi) meeting with President (Donald) Trump in February and its willingness to further reduce tariffs on US products as part of the BTA," it added.

The US total goods trade with India was estimated at USD 129.2 billion in 2024. According to the US, India's average applied tariff is 17 per cent, among the highest of the world's largest economies, while America's average applied tariff is 3.3 per cent.

India's average applied tariff rate on agricultural products is 39 per cent while the USA's is just 5 per cent. "In addition to tariffs, technical barriers to trade, regulatory barriers, and restrictions on access to the market in the services, industrial, and agricultural sectors also reduce US exports to India," it said.

On April 2, President Trump imposed a 10 per cent tariff on all countries and individualised reciprocal higher tariffs on nations with which the US has the largest trade deficits in order to level the playing field.

"The ToR (Terms of Reference) announcement with India is a critical step forward in negotiations with India to achieve reciprocal trade with one of our most strategic partners and deliver results to the American People," the statement

ToRs include issues such as tariffs, non-tariff barriers, rules of origin, and customs facilitation.

They discussed the transformative evolution of India's digital infrastructure under the Digital India initiative in recent years, positioning the country as a global leader

in digital adoption.

Kurian appreciated India's AI Mission and the trajectory India is taking under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He also emphasised the need to connect India to the global network through land and sea cable infrastructure.

During another meeting with Turing CEO Jonathan Siddharth, the Finance Minister highlighted India's policy framework for Artificial Intelligence (AI) and encouraged his company to explore opportunities for collaboration and fruitful engagement. ¬raders' lobby CAIT on Tuesday demanded setting up of an indepen-L dent regulatory body for digital commerce for oversight and fixing accountability on e-commerce and quick commerce platforms, alleging anti-competitive practices like predatory pricing, deep discounting and exploitation of gig workers. The Confederation of All India Traders

(CAIT) also sought expeditious roll-out of the National e-Commerce Policy and e-Commerce rules under the Consumer Protection Act, both currently under finalisation by the Commerce as well as Food & Consumer Affairs Ministries, respectively, to safeguard the interests of retail traders. It recommended an imposition of a 'luxury tax' under the prevailing GST framework on goods sold via e-commerce platforms, arguing that the practice of buying goods online be considered a 'lux-

Currently, goods and services tax is a four-tier tax structure with slabs at 5, 12, 18, and 28 per cent.

Dhairyasheel Patil, National President, All India Consumer Products Distributor Federation (AICPDF), and CAIT's Senior Vice President, told PTI that as per estimates, as many as 10 lakh kirana stores have shut down operations in the last two-three years, owing to lack of viability and affordAt a conclave organised by CAIT, traders' representatives adopted a resolution demanding immediate enforcement of FDI and ecommerce policies and rolling out of e-commerce rules



The 19-year-old Meena dominated the men's pole vault event as he bettered his earlier national mark of 5.32m which he had scaled while finishing on top during the Uttarakhand National Games in February

Tamil Nadu athletes M Gowtham (5.15m) and G Reegan (5.10m) took the silver and bronze respectively. Former national record holder S Siva - also of Tamil Nadu — finished fourth with an effort of 5.05m.

Meena, however, fell short of the Asian Championships qualification mark of 5.51m set by the Athletics Federation of India (AFI). Asian Championships will be held in Gumi, South Korea from May 27-31. Pole vault is one event in which there is a huge gap between Indian and international athletes.

The Asian record in men's pole vault is 6m, set by Ernest John Obiena of the Philippines in 2023, while the world record stands in the name of Swedish superstar Armand Duplantis at 6.27m.

Meena said he was a bit disappointed at missing out on the Asian Championships qualification mark.

"I wanted to raise the bar but there was light drizzle and my coach advised agan-

ist continuing," Meena said.

delivery. Hasan, who survived twice because of poor fielding by Zimbabwe on Monday,

added just five runs to his overnight total. Pacer Victor Nyauchi (1-28) was rewarded for his excellent line and length by dismissing Mominul after forcing the batter to play and edge behind. Mominul

The all-rounder's slot belongs to Nitish Kumar Reddy for the time being. There would be a slot for one extra middle-order batter if it is a squad of 15. A couple could be added if they beef it up to 16 for the assignment that will start June 20 and wind up only in the first week of

While no one would like to zero in on them right now, there are at least six names that are expected to be discussed as per PTI's understanding. One, if not two, can find their place in the senior team while the rest will certainly be a part of the India A series against England Lions which will be held at the same time.

B Sai Sudharsan With seven tons in 29 first-class games,

Sai Sudharsan is a player to watch out for even in red ball cricket. He has already been a big hit for Gujarat Titans in the IPL. The reason why selectors will have a closer look at the southpaw is his tight technique and he also did well for India A in Australia before getting injured. His biggest strength is that he can open

of premium and having played 14 Tests, including one in England in 2022, Iyer knows a thing or two about challenges. After being dropped from central contracts, he has played a lot of domestic crick-

et and looked at ease. Whether he will get another shot at red ball is the question.

Rajat Patidar

If one goes purely by statistics, then Patidar has probably blown away his chance at Test cricket by not even getting a single fifty against England at home. However, there are very few players outside the current India set-up who are as classy as the MP batter with strokes all round the park. Add to it, his elegance which also at

times can be his undoing. The Ranji season (less than 450 runs) didn't go as per plan but can Agarkar's committee show a leap of faith is the pertinent question.

Karun Nair

One of India's only two triple centurions in Test cricket, Karun Nair lost his way in the middle before finding his mojo for Vidarbha in what has been a dream domestic season with more than 850

first-class runs. He had once tweeted a couple of seasons ago "Dear cricket, give me one more

chance" and who knows the England tour could be that for him. In 2018, he didn't impress Ravi Shastri and Virat Kohli during net sessions and perhaps 2025 could be a different script for the Bengaluru man. **Devdutt Padikkal:**

Another sinewy left-hander, who got a chance to make his Test debut in Australia due to the absence of Rohit Sharma in the first game. Padikkal did show glimpses of his talent in the second innings during an effective stand with Yashasvi Jaiswal. He has been in good touch in IPL and if he doesn't make the senior team cut, he will be in and around the India A team for sure.

Sarfaraz Khan

After he scored a 150 against New Zealand in Bengaluru in October, Sarfaraz should have sealed his place in the Test squad but some atrocious shot selection in the following Tests put him down in the pecking order. In Australia, he was more of a tourist and was not even discussed for a place in the first XI. However for the sake of continuity, selectors can still look at him.

SRH DESPERATELY NEED WIN AGAINST MUMBAI INDIANS

Jasprit Bumrah has not been at his menacing best when it comes to taking wickets but

the ace India bowler has begun nailing his line and lengths perfectly.

This could be a warning sign for the SRH batters given MI tend to use Bumrah more strategically, with Trent Boult and Deepak Chahar sharing the new ball. Novak Djokovic returns to Madrid Open

ormer champion Novak Djokovic has returned to the → Madrid Open for the first time in three years in hopes of achieving his 100th tour-level title. Djokovic is seeded fourth in the same half of the draw as second-seeded Carlos Alcaraz, the home favorite who arrives at the Caja Magica this week with fitness concerns after reaching consecutive claycourt finals.

The 37-year-old Djokovic, a three-time champion in Madrid, hasn't played in the Spanish capital since losing to Alcaraz in the 2022 semifinals, their first meeting. Djokovic won his 99th title last August at the Paris Olympics. He has lost four finals since then, most recently last month in Miami. The 100-title club features only Jimmy Connors (109) and Roger Federer (103).

Over the last two weekends, Alcaraz has won the Monte Carlo Masters and lost in the Barcelona Open final, where he needed treatment on his upper right leg on Sunday.

"I'm confident it won't affect me in Madrid," he said. "That's what happens when you play so many matches and have so few days to rest. It's so demanding, and you have to give 100 per cent every day. Having played a tournament like Monte Carlo and arriving in Barcelona with few days to adapt is really tough." Alcaraz said fellow Spaniard Rafael Nadal, a fivetime winner in Madrid, wrote to him after the Barcelona final to encourage him and say he hoped he wasn't injured.

"I bow at the feet of Rafa because of what he did week after week," Alcaraz said. "You

have to respect that." Alexander Zverev, number 2 in the world after winning in Munich at the weekend, was the top seed in Madrid and Taylor Fritz was the third seed. Defending champion Andrey Rublev was the seventh seed. Djokovic has a 30-9 record in Madrid, with titles in 2011, 2016 and 2019. He beat his coach Andy Murray in the 2016

Alcaraz won Madrid in 2022 and 2023.

Sabalenka leads women's draw

The women's draw has 29 of the top 30 players. Number 15 Barbora Krejcikova is missing because of an injury.

Top-ranked Aryna Sabalenka seeks her fourth final appearance in Madrid in five years.

It was not on my roster: Harsha Bhogle on absence from commentary panel

Morgan said KKR failed to forge partnerships in chase of 199 as they finished at an ordinary 159 for eight.

"It was interesting to hear Ajinkya Rahane talk about 199 being a chaseable score because towards the back end of Gujarat Titans' innings, we thought the

ball held up more than we expected (and) that made finding boundaries harder," Eoin Morgan said.

Morgan added, "But there was no rhythm, no substantial partnerships almost the polar opposite of what Gujarat Titans displayed.

Morgan was all praise for India and GT pacer Prasidh Krishna who delivered another vital spell of 4-0-25-2

"He's the purple cap holder at the moment, and his rhythm just keeps getting better. We know he has that extra bit of pace to work with, but you have to admire the strength he brings during the middle phase of the game," he said.

"As a captain, having a seamer who can make that kind of impact in the middle overs is absolutely priceless.'
