etting the tone for 12th year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi led NDA Government which completed 11 years on Monday and giving a consecutive third term for Modi, the Union Council of Ministers and BJP's partners at the Centre as well States rallied behind the PM counting on the success stories since 2014 when BJP came on its full majority at the Centre.

On the anniversary celebrations, the PM remarked the NDA Government has delivered path-breaking changes with speed, scale and sensitivity which has come through the principle of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas'. Since first assuming office in May 2014, took the oath of office for his third straight term on June 9,

Modi asserted that under the 11 years of his Government India has not just become the fastest-growing major economy but is also a key global voice on pressing issues like climate action and digital innovation.

Cabinet colleagues of Modi and other senior leaders of the ruling NDA listed a number of measures of the Government, with the Defence Minister stating that India is moving forward stronger, prouder, and

The ministers highlighted the reach and impact of welfare schemes like 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' for sanitation, 'Ayushman Bharat' for health insurance, and 'Ujjwala Yojana' for cooking gas, besides measures for housing for the poor,

cash assistance to farmers and subsidised loan schemes without collateral for entrepreneurs. While Home Minister and Modi's long time associate Amit Shah lauded the 11 years of Modi Government as "golden period", Defence Minister Rajnath Singh asserted that India stands wellequipped and unwavering in its resolve to safeguard its territorial integrity under Modi's leadership.

Union minister and former BJP chief Nitin Gadkari said under Modi's "visionary leadership", India has undergone a historic transformation grounded in seva (service), good governance, and includevelopment. Lok Janshakti Party leader and Union minister Chirag Paswan said that the country

has seen a new era of economic rejuvenation, social justice, cultural pride and national

Modi shared a data representation on social media platforms noting that 60 per cent of the current Union ministers are from the SC, ST and OBC categories, giving a message aimed at social justice credentials of his Government.

Modi said powered by the blessings and collective participation of 140 crore Indians, India has witnessed rapid transformations across diverse sectors. "We are proud of our collective success but at the same time, we look ahead with hope, confidence and a renewed resolve to build a Viksit Bharat," said Modi.

Heatwave bakes Capital, north India

¬he national Capital region baked in extreme heat on Monday with the real-feel temperature — or heat index — ranging between 49 degrees Celsius to 51 degrees Celsius due to a combination of high temperature and humidity, with the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issuing an orange alert for the next two days, warning people to stay cautious and take steps to protect themselves from the ongoing heatwave. Monday marked the second consecutive day of heatwave conditions in the region, including Delhi.

The IMD said Ayanagar was the hottest region in Delhi which recorded 45.3 degrees Celsius with the nighttime minimum recorded at 28 degrees Celsius, Ridge saw the maximum temperature of 44.9 degrees Celsius with night time minimum recording 25,9 degree Celsius. The maximum temperature ranged between 43.4 degrees Celsius and 45.3 Degrees Celsius — three to four degrees above normal in the national Capital. According to the IMD, very hot

Mumbai's death line: four killed, nine injured harbour lines of the Central

n a disturbing mishap, four commuters were killed and Inine others injured when they fell down from two overcrowded suburban trains between Mumbra and Diva stations of the Central Railway in the Thane district during the morning peak hour traffic on Monday.

Though the commuters falling off from a speeding suburban train is a common occurrence, this is for the first time that commuters with bags and backpacks travelling on the footboards of two overcrowded trains running on parallel lines brushed against one another and fell down on the tracks.

The tragic incident took place between 9 am and 9.15 am when

Three dead in **Delhi in seperate** incidents

At least three people died in separate incidents in Delhi on Monday. Two men were killed in a fire caused by a short circuit during e-rickshaw charging in Nand Nagri while an eight-year-old boy died and another was injured after a building collapsed in Nangloi's Indira Camp. In a separate incident, a fire broke out in the signalling room at Trilokpuri Sanjay Lake metro station, disrupting Pink Line services; no casualties were reported. Authorities have launched investigations into the fire and collapse, with safety checks ongoing in affected areas

India to hit record foodgrain production this year

India is poised to achieve record foodgrain production in the 2025-26 kharif season, supported by an above-normal monsoon forecast Agriculture Minister Shivrai Singh Chouhan said. The Bystander Indore missing couple case: Wife surrenders for murder of husband

n an important develop-ment in the ongoing investigation into the mysterious disappearance of newlywed Sonam Raghuvanshi, who went missing during her honeymoon 1n Shillong Meghalaya police have claimed that she has surrendered in Ghazipur, Uttar Pradesh, in connection with the murder of husband, Raghuvanshi.

However, there seems to be a discrepancy in the statements provided by the Meghalaya police and the Indore police, with some elements of confusion still surrounding the case.

According to Meghalaya Director General of Police (DGP) I. Nongrang, Sonam was located at a roadside eatery in Ghazipur, following which she was taken into custody. Meghalaya's Chief Minister also confirmed Sonam's surrender to the authorities. However, the Indore police have provided a different version, stating that Sonam first contacted her brother, informing him of her whereabouts in Ghazipur. The local dhabha owner was

reportedly the one who informed the police about Sonam's presence, and Sonam's brother allegedly suggested informing the local authorities and reaching out to the police.

The discrepancies in the details provided by both police agencies raise questions about the accuracy of the surrender claim. Furthermore, the police have yet to record any formal statement from Sonam regarding the events leading to the tragic death of her husband, Raja, and her disappearance.

Authorities have refrained from labeling her as an accused, and as of now, it remains unclear whether Sonam played a direct role in her husband's murder.

The saga began on May 20, 2025, when Raja (28) and Sonam (25), who had married on May 11, 2025, went missing during their honeymoon in Shillong.

Raja's body was discovered on June 2, 2025, in a deep gorge near Weisawdong, Shillong. Investigators found signs of assault on Raja's body, with a weapon discovered nearby, prompting the registration of a murder case. The Special Investigation Team (SIT), formed to probe the incident, initially suspected that Sonam might have been abducted, with her family alleging threats.

On the other hand, Indore police, during a press conference, stated that they have rounded up three individuals on the basis of leads provided by the Meghalaya police. The police referred to these individuals as 'suspects' rather than 'accused', and they stopped short of using the term "arrest" for them.

India snubs Pak on Indus treaty

ven as Pakistan has reached out to India rethink on the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) 1960 27 ■Waters Treaty (IWT) 1960, New Delhi has so far not responded till its concerns regarding terrorism are addressed and the pact is completely revamped. Instead, India is proactively bolstering its water storage and canal infrastructure, strategically positioning itself to divert the flow of water from Pakistan's rivers ahead of any negotiations.

Sources said New Delhi has not responded to anv of Pakistan's letters and will not engage with the neighbouring country in any capacity till it's concerns regarding terrorism are addressed and the pact is completely revamped. Pakistan's Water Resources Secretary Syed Ali Murtaza has reached out multiple times, urging India to reconsider the decision to put the IWT in abeyance. In multiple letters to his Indian counterpart, Debashree Mukherjee, Murtaza has repeatedly expressed his government's readiness to discuss specific objections raised by New Delhi. India has not responded to any of Pakistan's letters and will not engage with the


neighbouring country in any capacity till New

Delhi's concerns regarding terrorism are addressed and the pact is completely revamped, the sources said.

As per situation report dated June 5 of Indus River System Authority (IRSA) the water release dropped to 1.24 lakh cusecs, compared to 1.44 lakh cusecs on the same date last year in Pakistan's Punjab, the latest data shows. The Indus level at Tarbela dam in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is down to 1,465 metres, while the dead level is 1,402 metres.

At Chasma dam in Punjab on the Indus, the water level is at 644 metres, just above the dead level of 638 metres. The Mangla dam on the Jhelum in Mirpur is at a level of 1,163 metres, just above the 1,050-metre dead level. The dead level means that below that level, there are no outlets to drain the water in the reservoir by gravity.

Pakistan anticipates a 21per cent water shortage due to India's steps in the early Kharif season, which lasts until June 10. The situation is particularly grave at Marala in Sialkot, Punjab, where the mean discharge on the Chenab dropped to just 3,064 cusecs on June 5 from 26,645 cusecs on May 28, Pakistani data shows.

Chandigarh: The Lokayukta, the anti-corruption watchdog, in Haryana will now adopt video conferencing facilities for its proceedings. The directive by the government comes as part of a broader state government initiative aimed at leveraging audio-visual electronic means for all official interactions, aligning with new central criminal laws and Supreme Court guidelines. A letter in this regard has been issued by Haryana Chief Secretary Anurag Rastogi to all administrative secretaries, heads of departments, board/corporation managing directors, divisional commissioners, deputy commissioners, subdivisional officers, and the Registrar of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, emphasizing strict compliance with these new instructions. The decision to integrate video conferencing facilities is rooted in the enabling provisions of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. Specifically, Section 336 (evidence of public servants, experts, police officers in certain cases) and Section 530 (trial and proceedings to be held in electronic mode) explicitly promote the use of audio-visual electronic means for all proceedings, an official statement said here on Monday.

HARYANA MANDATES LOKAYUKTA TO CONDUCT PROCEEDINGS

DR. BALJIT KAUR DIRECTS OFFICIALS TO ENSURE LEGAL ADOPTION PROCESS FOR CHILDREN

Chandigarh: Punjab Social Security, Women and Child Development Minister Dr. Baljit Kaur on Monday issued directives to the officials concerned to ensure that the process of adoption for orphaned and destitute children is conducted strictly as per the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. This is to guarantee a safe, loving, and dignified environment for every child. Emphasizing the importance of child welfare, Kaur stated that it is a collective responsibility to safeguard the lives of children from 0 to 18 years and provide them with high-quality services. The Minister pointed out that it has often been observed that unwed mothers or parents, who are unable to care for their children and wish to surrender them for adoption, first approach hospitals, nursing homes, or doctors. Similarly, prospective adoptive parents also tend to contact these establishments. Therefore, it is crucial that all healthcare institutions (both government and private) and medical professionals are made aware of the legal adoption process to prevent any form of illegal adoption. This will help protect the rights of children and safeguard them against risks such as trafficking and exploitation. She instructed all government and private healthcare institutions in the state that if any such case arises, they must report it within 24 hours to the Child Helpline 1098, the nearest police station, the Child Welfare Committee, the District Child Protection Unit, or a registered Child Care Institution. This will ensure that the adoption process is carried out through proper legal procedure. The Minister further stated that if any government or private institution is found violating the legal adoption procedures or concealing such information, provisions have been made for a punishment of six months mprisonment, a fine of ?10,000, or both.

HIMACHAL CM DIRECTS TO COMPLETE SHONGTONG-KARCHAM HYDRO PROJECT BY NOVEMBER

Shimla: Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Monday directed the concerned officials to complete the 450 MW Shongtong-Karcham hydroelectric project in Kinnaur district by November this year. Sukhu, who visited the project site to inspect the ongoing work, said the state would earn an annual revenue of about Rs 1,000 crore after commissioning of the project, an official statement said. The project was under construction for the past 13 years but the present state government accelerated its construction and it would be dedicated to the nation within the stipulated time period, Sukhu said. He added that the state government is taking concrete steps to ensure proper exploitation of its river water to strengthen Himachal's economy. The chief minister also said that the state government is working to take over the Dhaulasidh, Luhri and Sunni hydropower projects, and the total amount spent on these projects so far is being evaluated. Henceforth, the government would take forward the construction work of hydropower projects on its own terms so that the interests of the state could be protected, which were completely sidelined by the previous BJP government, Sukhu claimed. The state government is also moving ahead to set up a geothermal power project at Tapri in Kinnaur district, besides making advancements in the field of electricity by producing solar and green hydrogen energy, Sukhu said. "Despite being a surplus energy state, we were purchasing electricity during winters (from October to March at Rs 5 to Rs 6 per unit). "Solar energy production is being promoted as much as possible during this time period so that the government isn't required to buy electricity," the chief minister said. What began as a measure to contain Hamas has, over the years, evolved into a systematic form of collective punishment, trapping civilians in a nightmare of restricted movement, economic stagnation, and relentless bombardment. The ongoing conflict between Israel and Hamas has repeatedly left Gaza's infrastructure in ruins, its people traumatised, and its future uncertain. After the October 7, 2023 attacks by Hamas, Israel intensified its military offensive, enforcing a "total blockade" for nearly three months. During this period, food, fuel, and medical supplies were cut off almost entirely. While some aid has trickled in since, international agencies warn of a looming famine. According to the United Nations and other humanitarian groups, Gaza's children are starving, hospitals are collapsing, and entire communities are without access to clean water. Greta Thunberg, known globally for her fearless climate activism, has turned her attention to Gaza's humanitarian emergency with the same clarity and urgency. Alongside fellow activists, including Brazilian social activist Thiago Ávila and French Member of European Parliament Rima Hassan, Greta seeks to defy the blockade and deliver critical supplies. Their journey is not only symbolic — it is a desperate attempt to fill a moral void where world leaders have failed.

Defence Minister Israel Katz has declared that Madleen will not be allowed to reach Gaza, calling Thunberg and her fellow activists "antisemitic" and "Hamas propagandists." But labelling humanitarians as enemies does not negate the horror unfolding in Gaza. It only reveals the depth of Israel's moral detachment from the humanitarian consequences of its siege. Greta Thunberg's mission is not about politics — it is about principle. When Governments dehumanise an entire population, it is the duty of civil society to act. Her boat, carrying food, medicine, and dignity, represents more than aid — it is a statement that the world is watching, and that silence is no longer an option. She must be supported because she is doing what international institutions have failed to: bring real attention, real supplies, and real compassion to a suffering population. Let us not forget: humanitarian aid is not a threat - it is a right. Greta Thunberg's journey to Gaza is not merely about a boat and some supplies. It is about reclaiming our shared humanity. It is about saying no to indifference. And in this moral struggle, we must stand with her - not just in word, but in action.

The world of dharmic war

Unlike the Abrahamic tradition of conquest and domination, the Hindu approach to war — rooted in Dharma — seeks justice, not territory; balance, not revenge

he Hindu civilisation was first exposed to a new experience when Muhammad bin Qasim, an Arab invader, arrived in Sindh. He came from Arabia by land and sea routes. While defending his kingdom, Sindh, Raja Dahir Sen, its last Hindu ruler, was killed and subsequently, common folk were butchered. For no rhyme or reason evident to Hindus, many temples were demolished, their idols smashed and priests killed.

We call this a new experience because common folk and priests, who had nothing to do with fighting the invader Qasim, too were butchered. Nor was there any reason to demolish temples, except for the reason that they were of another religion the invaders hated (and still do). In the Hindu understanding, these are outright adharmic acts. From that day in the year 712 AD to the time of writing this article, the invaders, except for the Europeans, have not bothered to understand what temples and the idols worshipped in them mean for Hindus. Temples are not mere prayer halls, as the Abrahamic places of worship are.

They are deeply spiritual, sacred places where the worshipper connects with the divine. In the Hindu worldview, a war is seldom fought with the intent of capturing the enemy's territory. Attacking others' kingdom(s) is normally to rectify a wrong and not to dispossess the enemy for selfaggrandisement.

It is not that such aggression has not been committed by Hindus against each other; there might have been a few such wars, but they were adharmic acts, deserving of punishment due to their being dushkarmas (bad deeds).

Let us look at the most recent example of Operation Sindoor. India's declared aim was to defeat and destroy terrorists only terrorists — and, as far as possible, not to touch either common folk or even enemy soldiers. Our representative regularly informed the required channels of our intent in this regard, because our military action was against terrorists, and no

That is the essence of the term dharmic, i.e., ethical, distinct from merciless. In contrast, Pakistan invariably does not care whether civilians, women and children, old or young, are hit or killed. It has chosen terrorism as it is a cheap way of fighting a superior India whose military might it can-

Uniforms aren't needed; ragtag outfits can kill and escape accountability. If terrorists are captured or killed, the sponsoring country can safely disown the slain individual. No contact is maintained with the families of the killed. All in all, from the patrons' point of view, terrorists are assets with few liabilities. Pakistani infiltrations, therefore, could continue no matter how poor the country's economy has become in recent years. It is a wonder that the country has managed to remain a member of

Organisation (UNO), which is generally seen as a respectable global body.

been the president of the Security Council y a strange 'rotating' arrangement! Fundamentally, anyone wise would agree that the proper purpose of war should be deriving as well as enjoying a lasting peace. This means that such a war ought to be a dharmic or an ethical one. In common parlance, the minimum expectation

should be no hitting below the belt.

In the Hindu view, no matter how ethical the combat or hostilities are, the killing of women and children is unthinkable. The murdering of husbands in the presence of their wives and children is even worse, because, to a Hindu woman, her husband's life is more sacred than her own. All this is so far as means go.

As far as the ends are concerned, it should not be the acquisition of another country's territory or assets to enrich one's own country. India's experience of invaders like Mahmud of Ghazni and Muhammad Ghori has been detestable. Ghori, an Afghan Turkic invader, was routed by the Hindu monarch of Delhi, Prithviraj Chauhan, in the First Battle of Tarain in 1191 AD, but his life was spared by the Hindu victor.

Ghori, instead of remembering his debt to Maharaja Prithviraj Chauhan, attacked again in 1192 AD. He managed to win the Second Battle of Tarain but, far from showing any gratitude for being let off alive the previous time, had Prithviraj blinded and

would be that in such a combat, there murdered. This was the Islamic invader's 'gratitude' towards a man who could have easily had him killed but chose to spare his life.

Europe has over the centuries witnessed many a war. The cruelties witnessed, especially in the intra-Christian wars (Catholic versus Protestant, Orthodox versus non-Orthodox) were harsh.

World Wars I and II claimed up to 100 million people, soldiers and civilians. WWI solved nothing; it only led to WWII, which produced the infamous Cold War, which ended in 1991 with the dissolution of the Soviet Union, which formerly had been the Czarist Russian Empire. Europe is still at war. There are guidelines set out by the Geneva Convention on how to treat

captured and/or wounded soldiers in war. However, there are no ethical rules. The concept of the dharmic has no place in the European ethos. The difference between the Hindu and Western/Abrahamic worldviews is stark.

How women are reshaping the future of business leadership

ndia is witnessing a significant transformation in its educational and professional landscapes, with an increasing number of women enrolling in Master of Business Administration (MBA) programmes and advancing into top leadership roles in the corporate world. This shift marks not only a welcome departure from past trends but also signals a more inclusive and dynamic future for Indian businesses. Historically, business education in India was pre-

dominantly male-dominated. However, recent data highlights a steady and substantial increase in the participation of women in MBA programmes.

According to the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), women accounted for 42.11 per cent of total MBA enrolments in the 2022-23 academic year — an impressive leap from 33 per cent in 2018-19. In raw numbers, this represents a jump from 78,374 women in 2018-19 to 1,20,142 in 2022-23. This progress is not limited to statistics alone. The country's top 10 business schools have reported that 50 per cent or more of their 2024 MBA cohorts comprise women, marking a notable move towards gender parity. Even at the state level, such as in Maharashtra, the shift is evident. According to data from the state's Common Entrance Test

(CET) cell, women now form nearly half of all MBA stu-

dents — a remarkable rise. While metro cities lead in women's business education, tier 2 and tier 3 cities are not far behind. Cities like Indore, Nashik, and Coimbatore have seen a 27 per cent rise in women enrolling in MBA programmes since 2020, as noted in the India Higher Education Report 2023.

Regional business schools are playing an instrumental role in this expansion. The digital revolution has also democratised access to business education. A KPMG report revealed that between 2021 and 2023, online MBA enrolment by women in non-metro cities rose by 54 per cent, allowing women to access quality education without need-

ing to relocate - an essential consideration for many. Several factors have contributed to this positive trend. First and foremost is economic empowerment. An MBA is increasingly seen as a gateway to financial independence and career advancement, enabling women to break traditional socio-economic barriers. Secondly, business schools are becoming more inclusive. Many institutions now offer scholarships, mentorship programmes, and flexible learning options specifically designed for women. There is also a notable push for innovation in financing, particularly for students from tier 2-3 regions, including customised scholarship schemes and staggered fee payment plans. In addition,

Government and corporate initiatives are fuelling this shift. For instance, the Maharashtra Government introduced a 100 per cent fee waiver for girls pursuing pro-

fessional courses from families earning less than ₹8 lakh per year — a move expected to significantly boost female participation in higher education. The increased participation of women in MBA programmes is translating into real impact in the business world. Women MBA graduates are making their mark in industries ranging from finance to tech.

A study by Institutional Investor Advisory Services (IiAS) revealed that women now occupy 18 per cent of board positions among the top 500 NSE-listed companies. There are 22 women board chairs, 25 women CEOs, and 62 women holding executive directorships among these firms. Moreover, women are showing stronger performance in placements. Data indicates that female MBA graduates have a 36.7 per cent higher selection rate than their male counterparts, showcasing their preparedness and industry relevance. Entrepreneurship is also seeing a surge among women with MBAs. Armed with formal training and a fresh perspective, many are launching their ventures, driving innovation, and contributing significantly to the economy. While the progress is commendable, sustained efforts are required to deepen and expand the gains. Organisations must implement policies that promote gender equality, such as equal pay, anti-discrimination practices, and transparent promotions. Mentorship networks should be developed to provide women with guidance and role models. Additionally, flexible work arrangements can help balance professional and personal responsibilities, further reducing attrition.

Assembly elections in Bihar

The assembly election in Bihar is due later this year, and the new assembly will have to be constituted before November 22. There is intense political activity in Bihar with speculation about the final shape of rival alliances. The BJP is not confident. The 'jungle raj' dig of the party aims to remind people of the lawlessness during the 15 years between 1990 and 2005. The NDA coalition is finding it difficult to respond to the 20 years of 'jungle raj 2' jibe between 2005 and 2025. The past few months in particular have witnessed daylight robberies, shootouts, kidnapping of women and a brazen display of firearms.

On June 2, Congress leader Alka Lamba, on a visit to Patna, reminded the media of the extraordinarily high number of incidents of sexual violence and killing of minor girls in just the previous fortnight. The discomfiture of the BJP has also increased after a C-Voter survey this week showed Tejashwi Yadav leading the race as the preferred chief minister with a 36.9 per cent approval rating. Nitish Kumar trailed at the second position, with an approval rating of 18.4 per cent, with other contenders behind him. Another point to note is that the Prime Minister's appeal is seemingly not as strong as earlier, with people recalling his failed promises and calling out the tall claims made by the BJP in manifestos before assembly elections in 2015 and 2019.

She lost her vision entirely just before her board examinations. She, however, completed her schooling with the help of audiobooks and became the first blind CLAT aspirant to get admission into the National Law School of India, Bengaluru.

She completed her law degree in 2023. In her first appearance before the Supreme Court, Batheja represented a petitioner challenging the constitutionality of the Advertisement dated 16.05.2025 issued for recruitment to the Uttarakhand Judicial Service Civil Judge (Junior Division).

The petitioner is a person with 100 per cent visual impairment. When there's a huge pendency of cases even in the Apex Court, the initiative of this young lawyer can become an eye-opener for the judiciary to emulate her as a glorious example in the legal field.

CJI REFORMS AIM TO RESTORE PUBLIC TRUST IN JUDICIARY

hief Justice of India BR Gavai's attempts to enhance the image of the judiciary are commendable. He has taken steps to reform the judiciary since he assumed office. His attempts to bring transparency, commitment and accountability to the judiciary are certainly appreciable.

The most praiseworthy step taken by the CJI is the public declaration of assets and properties by the judges of the Supreme Court, including the Chief Justice himself. Such declarations help restore the trust of people in the judiciary. Another significant declaration is that the CJI and some of his colleagues won't accept post-retirement

positions from the Central Government. This is significant in the context where many former Chief Justices and judges have accepted positions from the Government, It raises questions about the ethical rightness of the judiciary. Live streaming of all Constitution bench cases is another significant move. It will

help the public understand judicial processes and dispel suspicion about the judgement of cases. Despite all these measures, corruption still lingers in the judiciary. The case of Justice Yashwant Varma of the Delhi High Court serves as a reminder. That a judge can be removed only through impeachment shows the deficiency of the judicial system.

However, a motion will be tabled in the next session of Parliament to impeach Justice Yashwant Varma. From declaring judges' assets to refusing postretirement positions and live-streaming Constitutional cases, these actions help rebuild public confidence. However, cases like that of Justice Yashwant Varma remind us that corruption still casts a shadow. The upcoming impeachment motion highlights the need for deeper systemic reforms to ensure the judiciary remains ethical, independent, and above reproach.

India's skilled workforce can power the ageing world

The developed world does not require capital; it requires skilled, mobile, and motivated individuals. With a cohesive strategy, legal and ethical frameworks, and a visionary approach; with its young workforce India can become the world's hub for skilled individual exports



y 2030, the world will face an unprecedented workforce shortage of nearly 50 million in developed economies such as the United States, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Canada, the United Kingdom, and Australia. A recent Global Access to Talent from India (GATI) foundation report indicates that this deficit could soar to 250 million by 2050 due to an ageing population, declining birth rates, and shrinking domestic talent pools

While automation and artificial intelligence (AI) may offer some solutions, the pace of technological substitution will not keep up with the demand for human capital from ageing industrial economies. In this context, India has a significant advantage with its demographic dividend of over 900 million working-age individuals, which is often seen as our greatest asset but could also become a demographic burden. To address this challenge, developing the largest pool of skilled and semi-skilled youth and India's established reputation for adaptability and competence could serve as a vital solution.

India exports around 700,000 of its workforce overseas each year, primarily to sectors such as healthcare, transportation, technology, and hospitality. However, this number could increase to 2.5 million annually with an integrated national plan. Such growth in India's workforce exports would not only help meet global demand.

But also, it could generate up to \$300 billion in annual remittances — more than double the current \$129 billion, which ranks India at the top globally. This makes foreign employment a key pillar of India's global economic outreach.

Global Demand Hotspots

The GATI report indicates that 20 nations will account for nearly 90 per cent of the projected global work-

force shortage. The United States will require 11 to 12 million additional workers, followed by the United Kingdom (5 to 6 million), South Korea, Poland, Hungary, and the Czech Republic (4 to 5 million each), Germany and Russia

(3 to 4 million each), and Japan (2 to 3 million). Other countries, including Canada, Australia, the Gulf Taiwan, the states, Netherlands, Austria, and Italy, will each need an additional 1 to 2 million workers.

Additionally, smaller but high-income nations such as Singapore, Romania, Bulgaria, and Hong Kong will experience shortages ranging from 0.5 to 1 million. The demand is apparent, and India is poised to meet

The estimated global demand, 70 per cent will be for medium — and low-skilled jobs: approximately 18 to 20 million for low-skilled positions, 6 to 8 million for medium-skilled roles, and 10 to 12 million for high-skilled jobs. Therefore, India's policy must align workforce training with this demand matrix.

The challenge is not just to send more workers abroad but to align the right skills with the right locations and industries. A new approach to migration should focus on three key strategies: unleashing global demand, enhancing domestic supply, and building a resilient long-term migration ecosystem.

Scaling up Skills

Regarding demand, India must actively engage with destination countries to harmonise skill certifications and expedite mutual recognition agreements. To scale up skills on the supply side, India needs to invest significantly in enhancing technical education, soft skills, and foreign language training, particularly in countries like Japan and Germany, where language proficiency is crucial. Key strategies to overcome these barriers include school-level language exposure, industry-centric training, and efficient grievance redressal systems. Some forward-thinking state Governments are already making progress; for instance, certain Delhi Government schools have started offering Japanese as a language option and states like Telangana are pioneering returnee integration programs

However, these efforts require a nationwide

approach and coordination. It is time for India to establish a centralised agency for global workforce mobility, similar to the Department of Migrant Workers in the Philippines or the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training in Bangladesh. Such an organisation could unite all stakeholders ministries, state Governments, skill councils, recruitment agencies, and industry bodies — to coordinate recruitment, ensure ethical migration practices, and monitor global demand in real-time. Equally impor-INDIA EXPORTS AROUND 700,000 tant is developing financial support options for migration to help cover travel, training, and placement expenses, particularly for low and middle-income workers. The country also needs robust welfare systems to protect Indian workers abroad and facilitate SECTORS SUCH AS HEALTHCARE, grievance redressal and reintegration support for TRANSPORTATION, TECHNOLOGY, returnees. Additionally, it is essential to continuously map and focus on high-demand sectors for Indian AND HOSPITALITY. HOWEVER, THIS talent. Beyond the traditionally prominent fields of NUMBER COULD INCREASE TO 2.5 healthcare, hospitality, domestic work, and logistics, India should also concentrate on emerging sectors such as green jobs in renewable energy, infrastructure development, digital public goods, and sustainability-linked startups, where skill gaps rapidly widen worldwide.

Addressing Migration Barriers

Despite progress, several challenges remain: Indian qualifications are often not globally recognised, and workers face high migration costs along with risks of exploitation by unscrupulous agents. The political discourse surrounding immigration remains contentious in countries such as the US, Canada, and Australia, with much of the opposition focusing on illegal migration. However, skilled, structured, and lawful migration is a top priority for most developed economies, not out of goodwill, but due to economic necessity. These countries require sufficiently skilled staff to sustain growth, support ageing populations, and maintain critical public services. This is where India, with its youthful population and expanding training infrastructure, can position itself as a credible global partner.

Diplomatic Push

Several initiatives have already been launched. For instance, Germany is expanding its Skilled Worker Visa program, while Japan has increased the categories of apprenticeship visas available for Indians.

There are ongoing discussions with Eastern European countries regarding recognising Indian driving licenses. Meanwhile, India is signing Governmentto-Government migration agreements with countries such as Australia, Austria, Denmark, Italy, and the UK. Through the Young Professionals Scheme, up to 3,000 Indians each year can reside and work in the UK for two years

Eight-Point Strategy

India must implement an eight-point agenda to address these challenges effectively. First, it is essential to strengthen institutional coordination between central and state Governments. Second, a national migration agency should be established, incorporating international best practices.

Third, skill certification requirements need to align with global standards. Fourth, a national industry association should be created to oversee and facilitate international mobility. Fifth, frameworks for migrant financing and insurance should be developed. Sixth, a new regulatory system must be implemented to monitor recruitment agencies and prevent exploitation. Seventh, support for the reintegration of returnees should be enhanced. Finally, bilateral and multilateral agreements must safeguard labour rights and welfare.

The Way Forward

The developed world does not require capital; it requires skilled, mobile, and motivated individuals. As ageing economies seek workforce support, India is uniquely positioned to provide this talent. With a cohesive strategy, legal and ethical frameworks, and a visionary approach, India can become the world's hub for credible, trained, and empowered individuals. The next wave of growth will not be driven by capital or commodities but by a capable workforce.

Chirag Paswan's political chess: General seat, BJP and family feud

Those who had predicted that Chirag Paswan would contest from a reserved seat were proven wrong when it was announced that he would enter the Bihar Assembly elections from a general seat. The Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) has officially decided that Chirag Paswan will contest from an unreserved constituency — a significant political move, marking his first foray into state assembly politics. A resolution confirming this was passed at a party meeting, and now Chirag is poised to establish his own political turf — ready, like Hanuman, for a trial by fire.

What prompted this bold decision? A significant undercurrent of pressure seems to be at play. The recent meeting between former LJP MP Pashupati Kumar Paras and Prince Raj Paswan with Union Home Minister Amit Shah has undoubtedly raised the political temperature for Chirag. During the last session of Parliament, Chirag made several statements that seemed at odds with the BJP's stance — on issues such as the creamy layer in reservations, lateral appointments, and the Waqf Board Amendment Act, 2024. His assertive tone unexpectedly invigorated the INDIA bloc, sparking speculation about a potential political shift in Bihar.

In response, the BJP appeared to send a subtle message — neither Pashupati Paras nor Prince Raj is off-limits. The saffron party held individual meetings with several LJP MPs, leaving Chirag visibly unsettled. Even MPs close to the Paswan family were forced to issue clarifications. Meanwhile, RJD MLA Mukesh Roshan claimed that the BJP was in touch with three of Chirag's MPs. It seemed like an orchestrated pressure tactic by the BJP — an indirect attempt to rein in Chirag and remind him of the options available to

According to Sangh sources, the BJP prefers the LJP to remain united under a single umbrella. They believe that splitting the Paswan vote through multiple factions could weaken its effectiveness. Yet, the BJP has always been adept at quiet, incremental consolidation. In the Lok Sabha elections, Pashupati Paras was appeased with promises, while Upendra Kushwaha was accommodated in the Rajya Sabha. Now, Paras has his hopes pinned on the 2025 assembly elections — but he also knows that neither the BJP nor JDU is likely to sacrifice seats to accommodate him separately.

In the upcoming NDA seat — sharing arrangement, both Chirag and Paras will have to find a way to coexist within the limited number of seats allocated to LJP. If they fail to reconcile, it could deepen the rift and weaken the alliance. A splintered LJP — with Rashtriya Lok



Janshakti Party (Paras faction) potentially fielding candidates against Chirag — might end up damaging the NDA by splitting the Paswan vote.

There's also a looming risk that the Paras faction could drift toward the

This possibility gains traction considering that Chirag Paswan faces opposition from within his extended family. RJD leader and Ram Vilas Paswan's son-in-law, Anil Kumar Sadhu, often targets Chirag publicly. In the Congress camp, Sunny Paswan — son of Nitish Kumar's minister Maheshwar Hazari - is also gearing up to challenge Chirag. Former Samastipur MP

Prince Raj Paswan, too, could

emerge as a contender. Despite these tensions, Pashupati Paras has indicated that he's open to reconciliation. In media statements, he has hinted that the relationship with his nephew can be mended, famously saying, "Blood is blood." Paras has even expressed this wish to the NDA leadership. But Chirag has remained firm. In interviews, he has reminded everyone how Paras had once broken away with MPs from Ram Vilas Paswan's original party and evicted him from the party office founded by his father. At that time, Chirag remarked, Paras saw neither his nephew nor his own brother's son.

of the LJP under a manageable umbrella During the Lok Sabha elections, it was Pashupati Paras who bore the brunt of this internal cold war — losing both his ministerial berth and MPs. When he asked for a ticket for his ally Sunil Pandey in the Tarari bypoll, BJP denied the request.

Still, during his recent meeting with Amit Shah, Paras reiterated his party's commitment to supporting the NDA in the 2025 assembly elections. Yet, his political future remains uncertain, caught between fading influence and limited bargaining power.

Historically, LJP's performance in state elections has been inconsistent. In 2015, when it was part of the NDA, it contested 42 seats and won only two. In 2020, when Chirag went solo, the party contested 143 seats but won just one. The 2025 assembly elections will be the first time LJP contests as part of a broader NDA coalition that includes BJP, JDU, HAM, and RLM. BJP and JDU are expected to contest an equal number of seats — perhaps 100 each — leaving limited space for allies like LJP.

Currently, a political "Laxman Rekha" has been drawn: Chirag Paswan's brother-in-law has been appointed Chairman of the SC Commission, and Jitan Ram Manjhi's son-in-law as Vice-Chairman-indicating NDA's effort to balance caste dynamics and internal ambitions. But the road to 2025 remains rocky, with family rivalries, alliance tensions, and a changing electoral map all in play.

Hamid returns to Bangladesh month after departure sparked uproar

angladesh's former president Abdul Hamid, who served two terms during deposed premier Sheikh Hasina's regime, returned to the country on Monday after receiving medical treatment abroad.

The 81-year-old ex-president returned from Thailand a month after his "secret departure" sparked protests in Bangladesh for being allowed to leave despite being accused in a murder case.

"He landed here in predawn hours on a Thai Airways flight. He left the airport on completion of required immigration formalities that took nearly an hour and a half," an official of the Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (HSIA) told reporters.

Hamid returned like other ordinary passengers, said HSIA Executive Director



Group Captain SM Ragib Samad. Private TV channels also shared footage of his car leaving the airport.

He left Dhaka on May 8 through the same airport after completing the required formalities but his quiet departure sparked loud protests.

Hamid is one of the accused in a murder case in his hometown in northern Kishorganj. The case was lodged in connection with last year's violent movement, also dubbed the July Uprising, led by Students against Discrimination (SAD), a large part of which later emerged as NCP.

Deposed premier Hasina, her expatriate son Sajeeb Wajed Joy and daughter Saima Wazed Putul, stationed in New Delhi as the WHO regional director for Southeast Asia, were also named in the case.

The NCP and SAD called Hamid a "cohort" of Hasina though he completed his term months ahead of the ouster of the past regime on August 5, 2024.

Pakistan delegation in UK following talks in US over conflict with India

Pakistan's high-level delegation led by former foreign minister. Pri eign minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has arrived in the UK following diplomatic engagements in New York over the recent military conflict with India, a media report said.

The nine-member group on Sunday held talks with United Nations representatives, diplomats from member states, and senior US officials to present Pakistan's narrative on the conflict following the Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives, The Express Tribune reported.

In response to the Pahalgam terror attack, India targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, following which Islamabad resorted to military action, leading to clashes between the two countries' military.

"Our message was clear -Pakistan seeks peace," former foreign secretary Jalil Abbas Jilani, a member of the delegation, said here.

Jilani said Islamabad sought the resolution of all issues, including the Indus Waters Treaty, through dialogue.

Speaking to the media, lawmaker Khurram Dastgir highlighted the regional impact of the water dispute and called for the restoration of the 1960 World Bank-mediated treaty, which India said remained in abeyance until Islamabad ended its support for crossborder terrorism.

"We explained to US officials that India's suspension of the treaty endangers the livelihood of 240 million people and undermines the region's stability," he said.

Dastgir stressed the water dispute was a matter of survival for Pakistan, asserting the country would not compromise on it.

He pointed out that the Americans initially assumed the ceasefire brokered by US President Donald Trump required no further involvement. "Our mission was to make them understand that intervention is necessary as India wants neither a neutral inquiry nor talks,"

Dastgir said. Trump claimed to have played a role in stopping hostilities between India and Pakistan following the

Pahalgam attack, a claim rejected by India. New Delhi has rejected a third-party intervention on

bilateral issues with Islamabad. Senator Sherry Rehman, another member of the group,

said the mission was focused on advocating for peace and ensuring the water treaty and Kashmir issue remained on the international agenda. In the UK, the delegation is

expected to meet senior British officials to highlight Pakistan's stance on the conflict and its broader implications. British Foreign Secretary

Explosion at US air base in southern **Japan injures** four Japanese soldiers

n explosion at a storage site for unexploded ordnances at a US military base on Japan's southern island of Okinawa injured four Japanese soldiers, though the injuries are not life threatening, officials said on Mondav.

The four soldiers sustained finger injuries while working at a facility that belongs to Okinawa prefecture and temporarily stores unexploded ordnance, mostly from wartime and found on the island, local officials said. One of the harshest battles of World War II was fought on Okinawa.

Prefectural officials said the injuries were not life threatening, but no other details were immediately known.

The US Air Force said in a statement that the explosion occurred inside the facility managed by the Okinawa prefectural government at Kadena Air Bases munitions storage area. It said no US servicemembers were involved in the incident.

The Self Defence Force's joint staff said one of the ordinances suddenly exploded when the soldiers were inspecting it at the facility. The blast occurred when the soldiers were trying to remove rust to examine details of the unexploded ordnance, NHK television reported. The SDF said they are trying to confirm what caused the accident.

Hundreds of tons of unexploded wartime bombs, many of them dropped by the US military, remain buried around Japan and are sometimes dug up at construction sites and elsewhere. Many of them are still found on Okinawa, where about 1,856 tons of unexploded US bombs are believed to remain.

Majid Al Futtaim is a mainstay of the local consumer economy. It's also a giant in the broader Gulf Arab region, owning and operating prominent hotels, entertainment venues and shopping malls.

Its portfolio includes the Mall of the Emirates, a major tourist draw in Dubai that houses the Middle East's firstever indoor ski slope. It also runs regional franchises for global brands, including Lego. Majid Al Futtaim's revenues last year topped \$9 billion.

As crown prince in the 1990s, Sheikh Mohammed mediated a succession dispute between Al Futtaim, the founder, and a cousin. Al Futtaim used the funds from that settlement to start his namesake company.

The findings, published in the journal Nature Human Behaviour, also showed that respondents backed policies, including a global carbon pricing scheme, in which the remaining global emissions budget — how much can we emit more before we breach 2 degrees Celsius warming — is divided according to population, with countries receiving emission rights they can trade.

"We were pleasantly surprised by the results. Politicians should not be too afraid of citizens when pushing ahead with global climate protection," coauthor Linus Mattauch, head of societal transition and wellbeing research group at Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research, said.

A second survey, conducted in 2023 among 8,000 people in the US and European Union, showed that the respondents supported a concrete timeline for carbon pricing — with, for example, \$90 per tonne of carbon dioxide in 2030, and a per capita reimbursement of \$30 per month for every adult worldwide. This would be a

substantial financial inflow to the Global South, where per capita carbon emissions are relatively low and where 30 dollars has more purchasing power than in the wealthy Global North, researchers said.

They added that three-quarters of the participants in the EU, and more than half in the US, expressed support for the idea, despite understanding that their own country might incur a financial loss under these conditions.

Government eyeing record foodgrain output: Chouhan

ndia is likely to achieve a new record in foodgrain production during the 2025-26 kharif season starting next month, buoyed by forecasts of above-normal monsoon rains, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Chouhan said.

In an interview, Chouhan also called for stringent laws to curb the sale of fake and substandard pesticides, and better implementation of soil health cards to ensure balanced fer-

The minister, who is leading a 15-day nationwide Viksit Krishi Abhiyan (Developed Agriculture Campaign) across the country, said the outreach program ahead of kharif sowing would help refine policies and research plans to boost agricultural production.

According to the agriculture ministry's third estimate, India's foodgrain production hit a record 168.06 million tonnes in the 2024-25 kharif season. Kharif foodgrain output has risen 31.23 per cent since 2014-15.

The ongoing campaign will help further boost agriculture production in the kharif season



farmers' concerns and educate them about new technologies and practices," Chouhan said.

During visits to 10 states so far, the minister said he learned from farmers that existing crop varieties in some areas have developed resistance to emerging pests. Farmers also raised concerns about fake pesticides and sought greater protection during price crashes.

Research plans and policies for short, medium and longterm implementation will be developed based on these inputs, he said.

"With these efforts, plus

likely good monsoon, should help achieve a new record in kharif foodgrain production in 2025-26," Chouhan said.

Sowing of kharif crops like paddy begins in July with the southwest monsoon onset. Monsoon rains are projected to be normal this year. The India Meteorological

Department (IMD) has forecast an above-normal southwest monsoon for the entire 2025 season (June to September).

Monsoon's progress had stalled since May 26, and IMD forecasts that after a pause, the southwest monsoon is expected to revive between June 12 and 18, 2025, advancing into central and eastern India.

As farmers prepare their fields for kharif sowing, Chouhan said, farmers complained about substandard pesticides in the market.

"We need to frame a strin-

gent law to address this. Now they get away with paying some penalty. We should come out with a strict law to punish those engaged in selling poor/substandard pesticides," he said. On pulses and oilseed production, the minister said output has improved, but India still has far to go to achieve self-

reliance and reduce import dependency.

The Government is working with a mission approach, distributing better quality seeds and educating farmers on best practices while ensuring procurement. These efforts will be intensified to address yield gaps, he added.

To tackle per-hectare yield gaps, the Government is identifying 100 districts under the Pradhan Mantri Dhan Dhyan Krishi Yojana scheme.

"The contours of the schemes are getting ready and will be launched soon,"

Microfinance suffers harsh recovery practices

icrofinance continues to suffer from the vicious cycle of over-indebtedness, high interest rates and harsh recovery practices, RBI Deputy Governor M Rajeshwar Rao

Addressing HSBC's event for financial inclusion here last week, the senior Reserve Bank official noted that microfinance has placed itself as a promising avenue for providing formal financial services to the excluded sections of the population. While microfinance has played an important role in financial inclusion, some issues need attention, Rao said.

"The sector continues to suffer from the vicious cycle of over-indebtedness, high interest rates and harsh recovery practices. While some moderation in interest rates charged on microfinance loans has been observed in recent quarters, pockets of high interest rates and elevated margins continue to persist," he added.

Even lenders with access to low-cost funds have been found to be charging margins significantly higher than the rest of the industry and in several instances, appear to be excessive, Rao said

Lenders should look beyond the conventional "high-vielding business" tag for the sector and approach it with an empathic and developmental perspective, recognising the socio-economic role that microfinance plays in empowering vulnerable communities, the deputy governor pointed out. "The frequency of disruptions in the microfinance sector has increased of late. Incidents of high borrower indebtedness coupled with coercive recovery practices sometimes lead to tragic consequences," Rao said.

He stressed that it is in the collective interest of all stakeholders that such disruptions are pre-emptively addressed and avoided.

In this regard, he said regulated entities must also enhance their credit appraisal frameworks to prevent overleveraging

"Additionally, they must eschew any coercive or unethical recovery practices, ensuring that financial services are delivered in a manner that is both responsible and sustainable," he said. In his address, he also mentioned reports of mis-selling financial services like insurance

SEBI fines Motilal Oswal Financial Services for violating norms PRESS TRUST OF INDIA New Delhi

arkets regulator SEBI on Monday imposed a penalty of ₹3 lakh on Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd for violating stock brokers' norms.

The fine needs to be paid within 45 days, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) said in its

The regulator conducted a thematic inspection of Motilal Oswal Financial Services Limited on the theme 'Control over Authorised Persons' for the period from April 2022 to January 2024.

In its probe, SEBI found that trad-

ing terminals were not found at authorised places.

"During inspection, 13 terminals (NSE) were not found at the reported location. Further, on verification of trade data as on 04-03-2024, it was observed that trades have been executed from 5 out of 13 terminals, 9 terminals (BSE) were not found at the reported location, and trades have been executed from 1 terminal,"

During inspection on Verification of terminals (NSE), it was observed that 4 terminals were not operated by approved users to whom the terminals were allocated. Also, it was observed that 4 trading terminals



(BSE) were operated by users other than the approved users, it added.

Under the rule, a stock broker's hall will be liable for a monetary penalty in respect of extending the use of trading terminals to any unautho-

rised person or place.
Also, SEBI noted that Motilal Oswal Financial Services had conducted the onsite inspection of two APs (Authorised Persons) and had submitted the inspection report to BSE and NSE. However, it failed to identify fund-based activities during AP inspection and did not report fund-based activities between AP and the client to NSE in the MIS (Margin Intraday Square off) report.

Solar Federation urges extension for transmission charge waiver

¬he National Solar Energy Federation of India (NSEFI) has urged the Government to protect the viability of numerous renewable energy projects facing risks from delays beyond the control of developers, according to a

person familiar with the matter. In the letter to the advisor to the Prime Minister's Office, the federation urged that the Inter-State Transmission System (ISTS) charges waiver be extended to projects getting commissioned by June 2026

and meeting a specific criterion relating to connectivity application status, financial closure, land acquisition beyond the 50 per cent threshold, and if orders for equipment have been made.

The federation, representing a broad spectrum of stakeholders across the solar value chain, stated that while the ISTS waiver, originally announced by the Ministry of Power (MoP), has played a "pivotal role in making renewable power more competitive", its delayed implementation by the Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (CERC) in February 2023 left many developers in a limbo.

ISTS charges are the fees levied for using the transmission infrastructure to move electricity between states. They are imposed to cover the costs relating to building and maintaining transmission lines and other infrastructure required for interstate electricity transfer. According to an energy expert, industry estimates state that renewable energy projects of nearly ₹5 lakh crore would be impacted if the waiver of ISTS charges is not extended.

"Several RE developers made early investments, securing



land, achieving financial closure, and signing definitive agreements based on the original MoP notification," the federation said. However, due to aspects like the nearly two-year lag in CERC's ratification and these developers are now at risk of missing the commissioning deadline of June 30, 2025, making them ineligible for the

The federation flagged multiple aspects, including prolonged approvals under Section 68(1) of the Electricity Act due to an ongoing Supreme Court case on Great Indian Bustard conservation, delay in transmission planning and connectivity effectiveness, and delayed commissioning of critical transmission infrastructure.

The federation has proposed a milestone-based eligibility

Consolidation in cement to continue: Dalmia Bharat

ector consolidation in the cement industry by the big players is expected to continue as the leading companies are likely to enhance their capacity share to more than 60 pe cent in the next two years, said the Dalmia Bharat leadership.

Moreover, Dalmia Cement expects a bounce back in growth to 7-8 per cent for the cement sector in FY26, which witnessed a subdued cement demand growth of around 5 per cent last year amidst the general elections and erratic rains, according to the latest annual report of India's fourth-largest cement manufacturer.

"We believe that the demand



growth will bounce back to 7-8 per cent Y-o-Y in FY26, driven by healthy demand from all key drivers — housing, infra-structure building and private investments. The year is also expected to benefit with stronger pricing and a focus on cost savings," said its Managing Director Gautam Dalmia and Managing Director and CEO

Puneet Yadu Dalmia. Over the pace of sectoral consolidation, they said it has increased during the last three years, and the capacity share of the top four companies has nearly 58 per cent in 2024-25. "Within this, in FY25 alone,

we witnessed 52 million tonnes of capacity changing hands," they said, addressing their shareholders. However, the overall installed cement capacity, over the last two decades, the indus try has grown at a CAGR of 5-6 per cent.

"During the next couple of years, the supply is expected to grow at 7-8per cent CAGR, which could possibly keep the sector capacity utilisation at its current levels. Within this, the industry leaders will continue to expand at a faster pace, and are thus expected to enhance their capacity share to more than 60 per cent in the next two years,"

ity is estimated to reach approximately 670 million tonnes (MT) by the end of FY25, supported by the commissioning of around 33-35 MT of new capacity dur-

Australia's faces South Africa's ambition in WTC final

hen it comes to major cricket finals, Australia is in a league of its own. Only Australia has won all four men's global trophies. It is hard to beat in finals, having won 10 of 13 across the 50over World Cup, 20-over World Cup, Champions Trophy, and World Test Championship. And let's not get started on the women's team, which is even more dominant.

The men go for world title Number 11 from Wednesday in the WTC final against South Africa at neutral Lord's.

That ruthless focus Australia brings on the biggest stages is in marked contrast to South Africa, a perennial underachiever. The Proteas have won just one of cricket's major international titles, the Champions Trophy's inaugural predecessor in 1998, when most of the cur-

rent Proteas were toddlers. An experienced squad — average age 29 1/2 — compensates with a bond that can't be underestimated, a determination to have each other's backs.

That showed often in the 2023-25 WTC cycle as the Proteas, who used 30 players — more than any other team - found a run-scorer or wicket-taker at just the right time. They won their last seven tests and were first to qualify for the final.

"We haven't been super dominant in our performances," South Africa captain Temba Bavuma said when the team qualified in December.

"We definitely haven't been clinical or ruthless when the opportunity or the situation is called upon. But I think what we've done is that we've found ways to make sure that the result is on our side.'

Who opens with Khawaja? Australia already had a veteran team when it won the 2023 final by crushing India by 209

runs at the Oval. Ten of that 11 are back. Only David Warner is missing, retired from the test format.

India gear up for Hong Kong test in Asian Cup Qualifiers

Kowloon (Hong Kong)

eeking its first win in the tournament, the Indian football team will face another acid test when it takes on Hong Kong in a crucial AFC Asian Cup 2027 round three qualifier match here on Tuesday.

As per reports in the local media, all 50,000 tickets for the match have been sold out, setting a new attendance record for Hong Kong football.

Manolo Marquez's men will have their task cut out as they face a Hong Kong side that has been revitalised under the guidance of manager Ashley Westwood, who knows a lot about Indian football and will certainly look to use his knowledge to the home side's advantage. Placed in Pot 1 for the qualifiers, India, ranked 127th, got off to a slow start with a draw against Bangladesh in March.

Meanwhile, Pot 2 side Hong Kong, ranked 153, also managed only a point in Singapore, meaning there is still nothing to separate the four sides in Group C after the first matchday.

For Hong Kong, the day will be a historic. The game is not only a crucial qualifier in their search for only a second AFC Asian Cup berth in 59 years, but also the inaugural football match at the 50,000 seater Kai Tak Stadium, part of the Kai Tak Sports Park, the largest sports complex in Hong Kong.

In preparation for the match against India, Hong Kong played a non-official friendly against Manchester United FC that they lost 1-3 on May 30, and then a FIFA friendly against Nepal on June 5, which was a scoreless affair. Lallianzuala Chhangte shared his thoughts on the opponents. "Playing against Hong Kong is a significant challenge because they have a good defensive setup, and we know their coach as well. He has a lot of experience in India, Chhangte said.

"Hong Kong are a good counter-attacking team as well, and we have to be well aware of that. We have a plan, and it's all about executing. If we go into the game with the right mindset, attitude and hunger, we can win this game," said the winger, who celebrated his 28th birthday on Sunday.

WRESTLER HAKUHO QUITS JAPAN SUMO ASSOCIATION

-akuho, a retired "yokozuna" or grand champion and viewed by many as the sport's greatest wrestler, said on Monday he has quit the Japan Sumo Association after an apparent falling out with the governing body of the ancient sport.

The Mongolia-born Hakuho was earlier sanctioned by the Japan Sumo Association, accused of failing to control the behaviour of a wrestler in his so-called stable, the term used for a training team headed by retired wrestlers. Hakuho's stable was closed a year ago. Japanese media reports say the wrestler in question engaged in physical violence. But closing a stable, instead of just punishing an individual wrestler, was unusual. He did not directly criticize the professional Japan Sumo Association, but he said wrestlers who had trained under him were treated unfairly. Hakuho, who was granted Japanese citizenship, said he had been in talks with the association but recently decided to quit because there was no hope of reopening his stable.

His farewell and future

"After 25 years of loving sumo and being loved by sumo, I want to advance toward a new dream, Hakuho told reporters Monday at a Tokyo hotel. Hakuho said he wants to create a body to govern sumo outside Japan — the "world sumo pro-



ject." He called it a "new dream" to 'expand sumo to the world."

When I think of my situation, I think it's best to contribute to sumo from the outside," he said, wearing a dark suit and referring to the Japan Sumo Association.

Appearing with a lawyer and other officials he had tapped for his team, Hakuho said they were getting corporate sponsors to back sumo grand slams, which draw amateur sumo wrestlers from around the world, including children and women.
