US bases in Qatar, Iraq hit

ran launched missile attacks Monday on US military bases in Oatar and Iraq, retaliating for the American bombing of its nuclear sites and escalating tensions in the volatile region.

Qatar condemned the attack on Al Udeid Air Base attack, but said it successfully intercepted the missiles and no casualties were reported. It said its airspace was now safe.

Iran said the attack in Qatar matched the number of bombs dropped by the United States on its nuclear sites this weekend, signalling its likely desire to de-escalate.

Iran also said it targeted the base because it was outside of populated areas.

Îran announced the attack on state television as martial music played. A caption on screen called it "a mighty and successful response" to "America's aggression."

The Ain al-Assad base housing US troops in western Iraq was also targeted, an Iraqi security official who was not authorised to comment publicly told The Associated Press on condition of anonymity.

It wasn't immediately clear if there was damage to the Iraq base or any injuries.

Qatar's Foreign Ministry said the attack by Iran's Revolutionary Guards was "a flagrant violation of Qatar's sovereignty, its airspace, and international law."

Al Udeid is also home to the Combined Air Operations Center, which provides command and control of air power across the region as well as the 379th Air Expeditionary Wing, the largest expedi-

tionary wing in the world.

The retaliation came a day after the US launched a surprise attack Sunday morning on three of Iran's nuclear sites.

Just before the explosions, Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian wrote on the social platform X: "We neither initiated the war nor seeking it. But we will not leave invasion to the great Iran without

Earlier in the day, Israel expanded its war against Iran to include targets associated with the country's struggling theocracy, striking the gate of a Tehran prison notorious for holding political activists and hitting the headquarters of the military force that suppressed recent protests.

As plumes of thick smoke

rose over Tehran, Israel was attacked with yet another barrage of Iranian missiles and drones.

The persistent fire has become a reality for civilians in both countries since Israel started the war to target Tehran's rapidly advancing nuclear programme.

On the 11th day of the conflict, Israel said it attacked "regime targets and government repression bodies in the heart of Tehran," but Israeli officials insisted they did not seek the overthrow of Iran's government, their archenemy since the country's 1979 Islamic Revolution.

The Israeli military warned Iranians that it would continue to attack military sites around Tehran over "the com-

ing days" as its focuses has shifted to symbolic targets as well. The military issued the warning on the social platform X, though Iranians are struggling to access the outside world as an internet shutdown has crippled the country.

The latest strikes unfolded only hours after President Donald Trump openly raised the possibility himself after just a day earlier inserting America into the war with its unprecedented stealthbomber strike on three Iranian nuclear sites.

"If the current Iranian Regime is unable to MAKE IRAN GREAT AGAIN, why wouldn't there be a Regime change???" he asked on his Truth Social website.

Bhutto threatens war over **Indus treaty**

akistan's former foreign Dminister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari on Monday said his country will go to war if India denies Islamabad its fair share of water under the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT).

India put in abeyance the 1960 agreement soon after the April 22 Pahalgam terrorist attack. Home Minister Amit Shah last week announced to never restore the historic accord.

Bilawal's comments came two days after Pakistan's Foreign Ministry criticised Shah's "brazen disregard" for international agreements.

Bilawal, in a speech in parlia-ment, rejected the Indian decision to suspend the agreement and threatened to get Pakistan's share of water.

"India has two options: share water fairly, or we will deliver water to us from all six rivers," he said referring to the six rivers of the Indus basin.

He said that the IWT was still in vogue as the agreement cannot be held in abeyance.

"The attack on Sindhu (Indus River) and India's claim that the IWT has ended and it's in abeyance. Firstly, this is illegal, as the IWT is not in abeyance, it is binding on Pakistan and India, but the threat itself of stopping water is illegal according to the UN charter," he said. Bilawal, who is head of the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), also threatened that if India decides to follow through on the threat, "we will have to wage war again".

Canada identifies terror link, 40 years after Kanishka bombing

Porty years after the Kanishka Air India bombing on June 23, 1985, Canada has finally identified 'Mr X,' a man who was involved in testing a bomb just weeks before the incident. However, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) did not reveal his name, citing privacy laws.

This disclosure came on the eve of the 40th anniversary of the attack in which 329 people were killed. Incidentally, Mr X died without facing any charges.

On June 21, RCMP Assistant Commissioner David Teboul confirmed the death of the mysterious Mr X during an event commemorating the anniversary of the Kanishka bombing.

Dozens of relatives of the victims attended the memorial. On June 23, 1985, a bomb was detonated midair by Khalistani terrorists on Air India Flight 182, killing all 329 people on board. The plane was flying from Montreal to Mumbai with a stopover in London. The passengers were mostly Canadians of Indian origin. The explosion, which took place off the coast of Ireland, is recorded as the worst terror attack against Canadians.

Teboul, along with several other RCMP officers, was part of the Canadian delegation present at the memorial to mark the 40th anniversary of the bombing. He is the commander of fed-

eral policing in British Columbia, stated that despite the acquittals of two key suspects in the bombing case in 2005, investigators continued to pursue the case "to tie up some loose ends and discover more truth that's independent of judicial process."

This persistent investigation ultimately led to the discovery of the identity of the mystery man referred to as 'Mr X', who had travelled to Duncan. British Columbia, on June 4, 1985, with Talwinder Singh Parmar, a terrorist of Babbar Khalsa and mastermind of the terror plot. The two men then met up

with Inderjit Singh Reyat, an electrician, who was later found guilty of making and planting bombs.

The trio entered the woods and tested a bomb, while agents from the Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) were following them. They then joined Inderjit Singh Reyat and entered a wooded area to test an improvised explosive device (IED).

CSIS agents had been surveilling the trio and heard the blast, but mistakenly believed it to be the sound of gunfire. As a result, they did not pursue

For decades, investigators referred to one of the men involved in testing the bomb as 'Mr X', as they were unable to confirm his identity. According to the RCMP, he died not long ago, without ever facing

any charges. In his address at the memorial on Saturday, David Teboul reiterated that following the 2005 acquittals, the investigation continued in hopes of resolving "loose ends", eventually identifying the man who helped test the type of bomb that brought down the Air India flight 40 years ago.

Inderjit Singh Reyat was the only individual ever convicted in connection with the bombing. He pleaded guilty to helping build the bomb that exploded on AI-182 but claimed he did not know the identity of 'Mr X'. Reyat later committed perjury during the trial, which led to a longer prison sentence. He has since served his time and been released.

Talwinder Singh Parmar, the alleged mastermind behind the bombing and founder of the Babbar Khalsa terrorist group, was killed in a shootout with Punjab Police in 1992.

India extends airspace restriction for **Pakistan**

ndia on Monday extended the closure of Lits airspace for flights operated by Pakistan airlines by another month till July 24. On Monday, a fresh NOTAM (Notice to Airmen) was issued, extending the closure by one more month till July 24, 2025.

Meanwhile, Pakistan has also extended by one month the closure of its airspace for Indian aircraft till July 24.

The Indian airspace has been closed for planes operated, owned or leased by Pakistan airlines and operators, including military flights, since April 30. The ban was imposed as part of various measures taken by the government against Pakistan in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people on April 22. Initially, the ban was to

end on May 24 and was subsequently extended till June 24.

As per the NOTAM, Indian airspace will not be available for Pakistan-registered aircraft and aircraft operated, owned or leased by Pakistan airlines and operators, including military flights.

Opposition sweeps bypolls PIONEER NEWS SERVICE

Tith its political future at stake following V the drubbing in Delhi, the AAP secured massive victories in bypolls in Punjab's Ludhiana West and Guiarat's Visavadar. Meanwhile, the Congress-led United Democratic Front (UDF) secured a decisive win in Kerala's Nilambur. The BIP. despite fielding candidates in all five bypolls, managed to only bag Gujarat's Kadi while Bengal's ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) retained the Kaligani seat. The encouraging performance of the AAP, which has kept a low profile since its loss in the Delhi Assembly polls, will also give it a boost. The bypolls tested the political mettle of the BJP and the INDIA bloc, especially in West Bengal and Kerala, where elections are slated for next year.

Amid speculations, AAP supremo and former Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal, addressing a press conference, said he would not go to the Rajya Sabha, after the party's sitting Upper House member Sanjeev Arora won

Punjab. The buzz over Kejriwal going to the Rajya Sabha intensified after winning the Ludhiana West bypolls in Punjab on Tuesday. "Many times I have been sent to the Rajya Sabha. I want to tell you I am not going to the Rajya Sabha. The political affairs committee of the party will decide whom to nominate," he said.

In Visavadar seat, AAP former state president Gopal Italia turned out to be a giant slayer as he defeated former BJP district president Kirit Patel by a margin of 17,554 votes, according to data shared by the Election Commission. Despite its near-total dominance in the State, the BJP has

the Ludhiana West bypolls in not won the Visavadar seat since 2007. The seat fell vacant in December 2023 after the AAP legislator then Bhupendra Bhayani resigned and joined the ruling BIP. The win means the AAP has reasserted its hold over a seat it won in the 2022 election, only to see the then-winner, Bhupendra Bhayani, cross to the BJP.

The AAP retained the Ludhiana West seat, with former Rajya Sabha MP and industrialist Sanjeev Arora winning by a margin of over 10,000 votes. The bypoll was being seen as a litmus test for the AAP, which has kept a low profile since its loss in the Delhi Assembly polls.

DGCA begins audit of Air India

◄he Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) on Monday commenced the detailed audit at Air India's main base in Gurugram that will cover operations, flight scheduling, rostering and various other areas. Top sources said an eight-member team from the DGCA has started the annual audit of Air India's main base. Generally, a threemember team carries out the yearly audit. The airline has come under intense scrutiny after its London-bound Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner plane crashed soon after take-off in Ahmedabad on June 12, killing 270 people, including 241 peo-

ple onboard. "DGCA has started the audit at Air India's main base at Gurugram. The annual exercise will cover all aspects, including operations, flight planning, scheduling, rostering and **IOCC** (Integrated Operations Control Centre)," the source said. Air India is headquartered in Gurugam, Haryana.

The audit exercise also comes at a time when the regulator has taken action against some Air India officials for repeated safety lapses.

On June 21, DGCA sought details on the airline's planned and unplanned inspections, audit, cockpit/en route, station facility, ramp and cabin inspection, among others, from its flight operations inspectors since 2024. The communication was sent out a day after the regulator issued a show-cause notice to the airline for Flight Duty Time Limitation (FDTL) violation and also ordered the removal of the airline's three senior officials from their respective roles for certain lapses

Meanwhile, DGCA has also put in place a new framework for comprehensive special audits to generate a 360-degree evaluation of the aviation ecosystem, reflecting both its strengths and areas needing

improvement. These special audits will be over and above the regulatory audits carried out as per the Annual Surveillance Programme. In a detailed circular dated June 19, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said a comprehensive special framework to assess aviation ecosystem and strengthen aviation safety architecture is being put in place.

"Traditionally, regulatory and safety oversight functions within Indian aviation have been conducted in silos, with different directorates performing inspections and audits specific to their respective domains," it said.

from tankers meant for the Indira Gandhi International Airport and selling it illegally as Mineral Turpentine Oil (MTO), commonly used in the ink and paint industry, police said on Sunday. Police also recovered 72,000 litres of ATS from their posses-

sion causing a loss of over ₹1.62 crore to the national exchequer every month, with an estimated 5,000 litres of fuel being stolen daily for three years. Among the eight accused, six were arrested and the remaining two were detained as they helped the truck driver in transporting the fuel to the factory, police said. The ATF was originally dis-

patched from HPCL's Asoda Depot in Bahadurgarh for delivery to IGI Airport. However, tanker drivers, in connivance with the transporter and godown owner, manipulated GPS tracking data and diverted the tankers to a concealed location in Mundka," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) Aditya Gautam said.

The security locks on the tankers - meant to be opened only at the designated airport depot - were bypassed using duplicate master keys. Forged dip rods were then used to fake proper delivery readings, he added.

The siphoned fuel was transferred into barrels and sold as Mineral Turpentine Oil (MTO), commonly used in the ink and paint industry. "Three oil tankers carrying 24,000 litres of ATF each were seized from the spot along with siphoning pipes, drums, and cash," the officer said.

In addition to the tankers, police also recovered two pickup trucks meant for transporting the stolen fuel, ₹1.05 lakh in cash, siphoning equipment, nine empty drums, and three duplicate master keys.



AAP Secures Resounding Win Amid Cong Infighting and BJP-SAD Irrelevance

AAP's Arora wins by 10,637 votes, defeating Cong Ashu; BJP finishes third; SAD forfeits security

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), in what is being seen as a crucial mid-term endorsement of its governance in Punjab, on Monday clinched a decisive victory in the Ludhiana West Assembly bypoll. The party's candidate, industrialist-turnedpolitician and sitting Rajya Sabha MP Sanjeev Arora, defeated Congress veteran and former Minister Bharat Bhushan Ashu by a comfortable margin of 10,637 votes, reaffirming AAP's grip over urban Punjab, especially amid doubts following its drubbing in the Delhi Lok Sabha polls.

The win is not just a constituency-level triumph, but a symbolic milestone for AAP, which has been under pressure to prove its political resilience and administrative credibility ahead of the 2027 Punjab Assembly elections. While AAP's energetic and issue-based campaign, early candidate announcement, and promise to elevate Arora to a Cabinet berth clearly worked in its favour securing 39.02 percent of the total 90,160 votes polled, the result also exposed the deep fissures within the Congress camp and the fastfading relevance of the BJP and the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) in urban Punjab politics.

The low voter turnout -51.33 percent — also played a pivotal role in determining the result, favouring the party with a stronger and more mobilized cadre. With Congress still entangled in internal factional feuds and BJP grappling with delayed candidate selection and weak booth-level penetration, AAP's disciplined ground-level organization and sharp messaging tipped the scales in its favour.

AAP's resounding victory in the Ludhiana West bypoll can be attributed to a smart mix of political foresight, welfare-driven governance, and a carefully orchestrated campaign. One of the biggest advantages was AAP's early declaration of Sanjeev Arora's candidature, announced as early as February — months before the bypoll was officially notified. This gave Arora ample time to build grassroots connections, amplify his develthrough MPLADS, and cement his public image as a solutionoriented leader focused on local issues. His groundwork among industrial workers, slum dwellers, and civic associations helped him carve a space beyond traditional vote banks. The campaign gained further momentum with the direct involvement of AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal and



Mann. Their presence on the ground, repeated visits, and public endorsement of Arora along with the promise of his induction into the Cabinet added both emotional appeal and political weight. Framing the election as a battle between "humility" and "arrogance", AAP cleverly turned the bypoll into a referendum on performance and

access to power corridors.

The party also benefited significantly from its pro-poor schemes like 600 units of free electricity and monthly ration distribution — tangible benefits that resonated deeply with Ludhiana West's large working-class population. Being the ruling party added an edge, as voters saw continuity in power as a means to expedite local development. Crucially, the fragmented opposition — with Congress imploding from within and BJP-SAD lacking local traction — enabled AAP to retain a unified vote share in induction of Kamaldeep Kaur Karwal, a known rival of Ashu, further confused the cadre and sapped campaign energy.

On the ground, the

Congress machinery was conspicuously missing. Local leaders were absent from booths, voter outreach was patchy, and the party failed to channel public frustration over law and order issues, drug abuse, or economic stagnation into votes. The reduced voter turnout dropping from 64 percent in 2022 to 51.33 percent in this bypoll — hurt Congress the most, as its traditional base among urban middle-class voters and traders appeared unmotivated. The lack of visible leadership and coherent messaging left many of its supporters disillusioned. Accepting moral responsibility, Ashu resigned as Punjab Congress working president, a move that underscored the internal crisis rather than resolving it.

The saffron party's under-

a low-turnout scenario. The win was less a stroke of luck and more the result of a meticulously executed strategy that balanced policy, perception, and people's pulse.

The Congress's defeat in the stands as a textbook example of how internal discord and lack of campaign coherence can sabotage even a potentially winnable seat. For Punjab Ćongress president and Ludhiana MP Amrinder Singh Raja Warring, the result was particularly embarrassing, as it exposed deep fractures within the state unit under his leadership. The party's candidate, Ashu, had hoped to redeem his political career following his 2022 defeat and a high-profile arrest in a foodgrain scam. However, he failed to rally his own party behind him. The most damaging blow came from within — Warring himself refrained from campaigning, and other senior leaders like Partap Singh Bajwa, Sanjay Talwar, and Simarjit Bains kept Chief Minister Bhagwant their distance. The last-minute forming SAD and relegating its

whelming performance in the Ludhiana West bypoll, despite its lead in the constituency during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, highlighted critical strategic missteps.

The most glaring was the delayed announcement of its candidate, Jiwan Gupta, who was named just days before the nomination deadline. This left insufficient time to build campaign momentum or establish a connect with local voters. While the party banked heavily on national narratives and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's popularity, it failed to present a localized agenda that such as traffic congestion, poor sanitation, and the woes of MSMEs — concerns that matter deeply in an industrial hub like Ludhiana.

A notable silver lining for the BJP in Ludhiana West bypoll was its third-place finish with a respectable 22.54 percent of the total votes polled. Party candidate Gupta secured 20,323 votes, outper-

Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) once wielded significant influence across Punjab, but its steady decline was starkly visible in the Ludhiana West bypoll, where its candidate Parupkar Singh Singh Ghumman garnered a mere nine percent of the vote — forfeiting his deposit.

The constituency, a Hindu-dominated urban seat, is emblematic of SAD's growing irrelevance in non-rural regions. Once dependent on its alliance with the BJP for urban traction, the 2020 break-up left SAD without a foothold in cities like Ludhiana.

Despite SAD president Sukhbir Singh Badal personally leading the campaign, it lacked energy and coherence. Booth-level mobilization was weak, and there was virtually no digital outreach, signaling a party out of sync with contemporary campaigning. Urban voters, increasingly aligned with AAP's welfare agenda or BJP's national pitch, clearly no longer view SAD as a credible alternative in

Post-Bypoll Tensions Grip Punjab Cong; Ashu's Resignation **Highlights Deepening Factionalism**

The aftermath of Ludhiana West bypoll defeat has plunged the Punjab Congress into a fresh bout of internal discord, with senior leader and party candidate Bharat Bhushan Ashu resigning as working president of the Punjab Pradesh Congress Committee (PPCC) and publicly hinting at deep-rooted factional fissures. The Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) Sanjeev Arora won the seat by a margin of 10,637 votes, but it is the Congress party's internal unraveling that has drawn greater attention in political cir-

As soon as the results were declared, a social media post allegedly shared by Punjab Congress president Amarinder Singh Raja Warring began circulating, showing a "victory" hand symbol, even though the party had lost. While the post was soon deleted, it triggered a wave of speculation about whether it was an intentional dig at Ashu, with whom Warring has had strained relations for months.

The incident set off a series of veiled remarks and reactions within the party, exposing the fault lines that many insiders and stood by Ashu. "Our worksay had already marred the ers fought hard. The result is

Reacting to the viral post, Ashu offered a sharp but measured response, calling it a result of "small-mindedness". "If someone from our own party shared a victory symbol after the loss, it shows a petty mentality," he said, adding that the results clearly proved the contest was no cakewalk for the ruling AAP. "We gave a tough fight. The reasons for the loss are out there if anyone cares to look," Ashu said, subtly pointing to the lack of unified support within his own party.

Sources close to the campaign confirmed that Ashu had categorically requested the high command to keep both Warring and senior Congress leader Partap Singh Bajwa away from his campaign, given their well-documented differences. His team had reportedly asked for autonomy during the campaign, preferring support from other loyalists like former Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi, Rana Gurjeet Singh, who remained present throughout the poll battle.

Responding to the internal rumblings, Kaputhala MLA Rana Gurjeet Singh defended the efforts of Congress workers

Political observers believe that unless the Congress urgently undertakes a structural and leadership overhaul, it risks ceding more space to AAP and BJP in the run-up to the 2027 Assembly elections. For a party that once dominated Punjab politics, the inability to present a united front even during a high-stakes bypoll speaks volumes of its





What began as a shadow conflict between Israel and Iran has now erupted into a wider confrontation with global stakes, as Washington's intervention risks igniting a regional conflagration with cascading consequences for energy security, international diplomacy, and global peace. In a moment of grave international concern, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi emerged as a voice of restraint and reason. He spoke directly with Iran's newly elected President, Masoud Pezeshkian, and urged immediate de-escalation, emphasising dialogue and diplomacy as the only viable path forward. The entry of the US into the fray dramatically raises the stakes. With multiple US military bases spread across the Gulf and Iran's bid to block the Strait of Hormuz - a vital chokepoint through which over 20 per cent of the world's oil passes - the risk of a broader regional war is real and immediate, resulting in hardships for many nations dependent upon Gulf oil, including India. India, with its deep energy dependence on Gulf states and close ties to both Iran and the US, is vulnerable to the ripple effects of the conflict. A disrupted oil supply could cause domestic inflation to spike, derail economic forecasts, and strain foreign exchange reserves. Moreover, India's strategic investment in Iran's Chabahar Port — a crucial component of its connectivity to Afghanistan and Central Asia - could be imperilled by continued instability. India's diplomatic tightrope walk is therefore not just about foreign policy symbolism; it is about national interest and regional stability. PM Modi's appeal reflects not only India's strategic calculus but also its potential to play the role of a mediator in a time of intensifying hostilities.

Beyond regional tensions, the current escalation has shaken global oil markets. Prices have surged amidst fears of supply disruption. This is not merely an Israel-Iran war anymore. It has the contours of a conflict that could draw in global powers, unsettle economies, and rupture the fragile world order. With tensions at an all-time high, the window for diplomacy is narrowing. Yet, it is precisely at this point that the world needs more statesmanship and less brinkmanship. Iran must be given diplomatic avenues to avoid escalation without losing face.

The US must show strategic restraint and allow space for mediation. Israel must realise that regional peace cannot be achieved through unilateral military campaigns. In this fragile moment, countries like India can serve as credible voices for peace. By engaging all sides through backchannels and multilateral forums like the UN, BRICS, and the Non-Aligned Movement, India could help forge a ceasefire framework - or at least open lines of dialogue. In this fraught hour, the world must heed calls like that of Prime Minister Modi — calls for de-escalation, dialogue, and a return to diplomacy.

Rethinking Language in Indian Education

As global examples from Germany to Japan reaffirm the value of native-language education, it is time India embraced its own plurality — not as a barrier, but as the very foundation of holistic learning and national identity

he linguistic and cultural diversity of any country must be celebrated with great attention and in its true spirit. India's multilingual phenomenon has always been an integral part of society, but the nature of plurality of languages differs greatly. India, as one of the richest linguistic nations in the world, represents the plurality and diversity in its society, which has been seen as its biggest strength.


The dominance of English as a global language of education has derecognised the linguistic, cultural and epistemic identities of multilingual people. During the colonial days, English was taught for vested interests. It was believed to have the quality of broadening the horizons of knowledge, and because of the variety of texts, it was thought to promote critical thinking and analytical skills, which was ably supported by the learning of rhetoric.

Even after independence, we fail to appreciate the mother tongue as a cognitive and pedagogical resource and find absolutism in the dogma of monolingualism as a language-teaching resource. English has been, for most people, a skill to master, not just a language to learn to express. English is, for the most part, a foreign language, but treated as a second language in India.

The immense damage done by communicative English language courses - by shifting the onus of communication to the receiver of the communication rather than the creator — has led to a peculiar situation of incomplete cognitive processing, or at best, partial understanding. If we look at the globe, we can see that some leading countries like Germany, China, and Japan, with the highest technological expertise, are offering primary education in their mother tongue.

The push for teaching in a universal language such as English has been shown to hinder children's educational progress in such countries. The key to human resources development is education, and the English-only policy fails to appreciate the mother tongue as a cognitive and pedagogic resource.

As a hapless victim of linguistic robbery, the schoolchild is terminally disabled from utilising the immense linguistic arsenal offered by his mother tongue. This reveals the fact that primary education in the mother tongue is as effective and functioning as it could be in any other dominant language. The use of home language, local language, and mother tongue-based primary and secondary education also entails that each language can provide cog-



The policy recognises the significance of language as a potent instrument for fostering effective communication, advancing

students' cognitive abilities, and cultivating cultural awareness. It further states that, wherever possible, the medium of instruction should be the mother tongue or the local or regional language. Thereafter, the home or local language shall continue to be taught as a language wherever possible.

It further emphasises that all efforts should be made to ensure that any gaps that exist between the language spoken by the child and the medium of teaching are bridged. NEP 2020 also provides fluidity to the three-language formula, as there is no specific language that shall be imposed on any State. The States, regions, and the students as well, are free to choose the three languages which the students want to learn, whereas at least two

of them are to be native to India — one of which is most likely to be the home, local, or regional language. The objective of the NEP 2020 is to make India a knowledge superpower by equipping its students with the necessary skills and knowledge, and to eliminate the shortage of manpower in academia, science, technology, and industry. In recent years, education in mother tongue, regional, local, or home languages has attracted serious attention worldwide. Mother tongue plays a critical role in the cognitive and intellectual development of a learner. Studies have shown that individuals fluent in their mother tongue tend to have higher educational success rates than those who are not.

Languages are instrumental in preserving cultural values and traditions, and having a strong foundation in one's mother tongue can aid in learning new languages. Unfortunately, many countries — particularly those that were colonised — continue to use the language of their colonisers as the medium of instruction in higher education. This is often done under the pretext of the unavailability of books and journals in local languages.

However, this practice puts students who come from schools that use local languages at a disadvantage, particularly in specialised fields such as medicine, science, literature, technology, and law. It is essential to recognise the importance of the mother tongue and to encourage its continued use in education and wider society to develop

the foundational skills of a society — such as literacy and critical thinking. The initial investment in multilingual programmes seems to be high because of the additional cost of developing new learning material, especially for languages that have not been standardised or do not have a script. It would also require teachers trained to

teach in a multilingual classroom. This requires renewed resource allocation and a clear policy to enrich the local languages to achieve the ultimate end of an effective mother tongue-based education system. It has now become essential to promote home, local, and regional languages to ensure the continuation and transmission of culture, customs, and history. UNESCO, too, is taking urgent action to encourage broad and international commitment to promoting multilingualism and linguistic diversity, including the safeguarding of endangered languages.

Mother-tongue education needs to be prioritised in policy development to ensure nore responsive and nuanced approaches that take into account the unique linguistic and cultural needs of learners. Unfortunately, as everyone is a language user, they think they can comment on language — as it is everybody's business and nobody's business.

Household savings are declining

According to a report by CAREEdge Ratings, the household savings rate was 32.2 per cent in the financial year 2015, which has declined to 30.7 per cent in FY 2024. This marks the third consecutive year of decline, bringing savings close to just 18.1 per cent of the GDP. Despite rising incomes and controlled inflation, it is evident that people are left with little to no money for savings. Even though workers' incomes have increased and inflation is under control, rural savings continue to fall. It is expected that lower interest rates and reduced inflation will boost demand. At the same time, household debt has increased to 6.2 per cent of GDP, nearly double compared to the previous decade. This suggests that people are increasingly relying on loans to meet their expenses and needs. Meanwhile, in the IT sector, employee-related expenses are showing signs of slowing.

While salary expenses had jumped 261 per cent in Q3 of FY 2023, they rose only by 4 per cent in Q3 of FY 2024, indicating that companies are becoming more cautious with their spending. There is hope that overall demand will see a broad-based recovery in the near future. The decline in savings is not just a statistical concern — it reflects deeper economic vulnerabilities. Strengthening financial literacy and household resilience must now be a national priority.

Safeguarding voter privacy The Election Commission of India (ECI), in a letter dated

May 30, directed State Chief Electoral Officers to destroy CCTV, webcasting, and video footage of the election process after 45 days — if no legal challenge is raised to protect the privacy of voters and non-voters alike from possible political harassment.

Yet, a deeper privacy concern lies in the current method of EVM-based counting. Unlike the earlier practice with paper ballots — where votes from different booths were mixed to maintain secrecy — EVMs reveal polling station-specific results. At counting centres, results from each booth's EVM are displayed and recorded in Form 17C in the presence of party agents, exposing voting trends down to the street or village level.

This risks political targeting and undermines voter anonymity. To address this, the ECI proposed using a "totaliser" as early as 2008. This device combines votes from 14 EVMs, concealing booth-wise data. The Law Commission, in its 255th Report, also backed amending Rule 66A of the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961, to enable its use. During the 2024 general elections, the ECI confirmed that totaliser technology — developed by BEL and ECIL — is ready. Its widespread implementation is vital to uphold the voter's right to secrecy, ensuring truly free and fair elections.

US STRIKES IRAN, IGNORES PAKISTAN: WORLD'S SELECTIVE LOGIC

n a typically dramatic move, US President Donald Trump launched military strikes on Iran's nuclear facilities at Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan - just two days after claiming he had opened a two-week diplomatic

Using B-2 stealth bombers and bunker-busting bombs, the US targeted Iran's uranium enrichment programme, reversing Trump's earlier stance on avoiding foreign wars and sparking fears of Iranian retaliation. Ironically, Iran currently possesses no nuclear weapons, but the US deemed it a threat.

Meanwhile, Pakistan, a nucleararmed nation with a proven terror footprint, continues to enjoy diplomatic courtesies. Pakistan's army chief, Asim Munir, was even invited for a cordial lunch - suggesting diplomacy works differently when it's convenient. Interestingly, Pakistan condemned the US strikes on Iran, even after recently

endorsing Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for his "decisive diplomacy" during the India-Pakistan crisis. This contradiction exposes the farcical nature of international politics. If Iran is labelled the top terror sponsor, then what about Pakistan, which continues to support cross-border terrorism, including a recent attack that killed 26 tourists in Kashmir?

Trump's America thrives on selective justice and commercial threats. The real irony? The US exists because of a historical genocide, yet continues to dictate global morality. If Trump had stayed true to his 14 promises of nonintervention, perhaps Pakistan's terror infrastructure would have been dismantled by now. So, who's the real bully? The world must look beyond headline diplomacy and demand accountability without double standards. Only then can global peace be more than a slogan.

India's Diplomatic Renaissance: Modi's Strategic Trilateral Tour

ime Minister Narendra Modi's whirlwind Canada and the G7 diplomatic journey across Cyprus, Canada, and Croatia from June 15 to 18, 2025, was more than a packed travel schedule — it was a calculated demonstration of India's evolving global role. Against the backdrop of a recent military confrontation with Pakistan and escalating tensions with Turkey, the trip signified a shift in India's diplomatic posture — from cautious balancing to confident engagement. This trilateral outreach served as a powerful articulation of New Delhi's strategic recalibration, issue-based partnerships, and foreign policy

Cyprus: Strategic Moves

Modi's first stop, Cyprus (June 15-16), marked the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to the Mediterranean island in over 20 years. While the destination may have seemed peripheral to global power dynamics, the timing and optics were anything but incidental.

The visit came amid deepening strains with Turkey, exacerbated by Ankara's alleged indirect involvement in the April 2025 Pahalgam terror attack via Turkish-origin drones. India's Operation Sindoor, a swift military response, had already drawn Ankara's ire. Turkey's growing alignment with Pakistan — especially on Kashmir — and its continued recognition of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), added fuel to the fire.

In this context, Modi's visit to Nicosia carried both symbolic weight and strategic clarity. It was a signal — subtle yet unmistakable — to Turkev that India was not above engaging with its adversaries' adversaries. Standing in solidarity with Cypriot sovereignty and the UN-led peace process, Modi's potential visit to the Green Line — the demilitarised buffer zone dividing Greek and Turkish Cypriots — underscored a nuanced rebuke of Turkey's regional ambitions.

Beyond symbolism, substance dominated the bilateral talks. Modi and President Nikos Christodoulides explored collaborations in maritime security, multilateralism, and digital connectivity. Cyprus reaffirmed its support for India's core international aspirations, including its bid for permanent membership in the UN Security Council and the Nuclear Suppliers Group.

It also reiterated its stance against cross-border terrorism, implicitly supporting India's position on Pakistan. Equally significant was Cyprus's role in the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) — a visionary alternative to traditional trade routes compromised by Red Sea disruptions and geopolitical bottlenecks.

As Cyprus prepares to assume the rotating presidency of the EU Council in January 2026, the visit also reenergised momentum for the India-EU Free Trade Agreement, which both sides hope to conclude by the end of this year.

The second leg of the tour took Modi to Canada for the G7 Summit at Kananaskis (June 15–17), where speculation had been rife about India possibly being cold-shouldered due to recent diplomatic tensions with Ottawa. Instead, what unfolded was a reaffirmation of India's growing indispensability in global decision-making forums. This marked India's 11th appearance at a G7 summit and Modi's fifth consecutive attendance since 2019.

Far from a token presence, India played a pivotal role in critical discussions ranging from the Indo-Pacific and energy transition to digital governance and supply chain diversification. Modi's keynote address underscored India's foreign policy principle of strategic autonomy — a theme deeply woven into his administration's diplomatic fabric. He rejected any notion of external mediation in South Asian affairs, issuing an implicit rebuke to Western pow-

ers that have long sought to play arbiter in India-Pakistan disputes. The timing was telling. Just days before the summit, US President Donald Trump had claimed credit for the ceasefire that ended the recent India-Pakistan military exchange.

In a firm rebuttal, Modi clarified in a 35-minute phone call with Trump

that Pakistan had requested the ceasefire after India's forceful response — and

that no third-party mediation was involved. By publicly challenging the assertions of a former U.S. president, India demonstrated an uncommon diplomatic audacity — signaling its refusal to be patronised or misrepresented. Modi further declined Trump's invitation to visit Washington, citing a prior engagement in Croatia. While diplomatically courteous, the move clearly conveyed that India's international engagements are guided by interests, not flattery.

On the G7 floor, India's voice resonated in discussions on global digital architecture, AI ethics, climate finance, and democratised green transitions. India's Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) model and its proposals for inclusive AI frameworks found favorable responses. Moreover, Modi's meetings with G7 leaders helped India secure additional support for IMEC and digital connectivity with Europe.

Croatia: A Strategic Gateway

Modi concluded his journey with a historic visit to Croatia (June 18) — the first by an Indian Prime Minister to the Balkan state. While Croatia may not command the diplomatic spotlight like Western European powers, its geographical positioning makes it a crucial strategic partner. Flanked by

Central Europe, the Balkans, and the Adriatic Sea Croatia holds promise as a key logistical node in the IMEC corridor. In Zagreb, Modi held talks with Prime Minister Andrej Plenkovic and President Zoran Milanovic.

The agenda spanned defense cooperation, space research, agriculture, cultural exchanges, and education. One of the key outcomes was a long-term defense collaboration framework involving maritime security, joint military training, and technology exchange. This aligns with Croatia's naval strengths and India's desire to deepen its European maritime engagement. On the space front, potential cooperation between ISRO and Croatian scientific institutions could bolster data-sharing, satellite innovation, and climate tracking. In agriculture, both countries agreed to promote tech-driven farming solutions, agri-startups, and sustainable processing systems. Croatia's ports, meanwhile, offer vital transshipment opportunities for Indian exports, especially in light of Europe's shifting logistics networks. Discussions focused on aligning customs standards, boosting Indian private investment in Croatian infrastructure, and enhancing air and sea connectivity to create seamless trade flows.

Diplomacy of Balance and Purpose

Modi's tri-nation tour wasn't just about optics it reflected a strategic deepening of India's global engagements. Each leg of the journey served a layered purpose: Cyprus symbolised India's resolve to call out aggression and align with those who support its sovereignty. Canada and the G7 reflected India's elevated stature and its insistence on being treated as an equal stakeholder, not a junior

Croatia highlighted New Delhi's evolving Europe strategy — expanding influence in regions often overlooked in traditional diplomacy. This trio of engagements exemplifies a new phase in India's foreign policy — one that is not defined by ideological camps or outdated alignments. Instead, it is driinterest-based coalitions, flexible partnerships, and a strong commitment to national agency. India no longer seeks validation on the global stage — it seeks voice, influence, and agency.

Modi's tour marks a pivot from reactive diplomacy to agenda-setting leadership. From trade corridors to digital frameworks, defense cooperation to cultural diplomacy, India is charting a course defined by dialogue without dependency, ambition without aggression, and leadership without hegemony. As the global order fragments and reconfigures, India's non-aligned yet assertive diplomacy could emerge as a stabilising anchor — balancing power with principle, and pragmatism with with purpose.

The real backbone of modelling: A yoga mat

hen people think of modelling, they imagine high heels, bright lights, and glamorous photo shoots.

They rarely picture the gruelling 14-hour days, the emotional toll of constant scrutiny, or the pressure to stay poised when everything inside you feels

As someone who has walked countless ramps from Delhi to Dubai, posed for luxury campaigns and worked with photographers across time zones, let me tell you a secret: the true backbone of a modelling career isn't found in stilettos. It's found on the yoga mat.

With International Yoga Day just around the corner, I find myself reflecting on how yoga hasn't just helped me survive this industry — it's helped me thrive in it.

The Body as a Tool

As models, our body is our instrument. It needs to be expressive, balanced, and aligned. But constant travel, late-night fittings, uncomfortable shoes, and physically demanding poses can throw the body into chaos. I've seen fellow models develop posture issues, chronic back pain, and repetitive strain injuries from years of ignoring body

Yoga — gentle yet strengthening has been my antidote. My routine includes daily sun salutations and targeted asanas for hip and shoulder

opening. Not only has this improved my flexibility and posture, but it has made a noticeable difference in the way I carry myself — on and off the runway. Photographers often comment on how "grounded" I seem in my frame. That's yoga.

It also helps with recovery. After a long day of back-to-back shoots, a 20-minute restorative session helps my muscles release tension, improves sleep, and gets me ready for the next day — something even the fanciest spas can't always guaran-

Mental Resilience

Behind every beautiful campaign is a sea of selfdoubt, rejection, and insecurity. Models live in a world where "not now" is more common than "yes," and where appearance is constantly under microscopic examination.

Yoga has been my therapist on the mat. Through practices like pranayama (breath control), dhyana (meditation), and simple mindfulness, I've learned to separate my self-worth from the fleeting nature of gigs and likes. I've learned to respond instead of react. That pause between a breath — that space of awareness — is everything when you're in a high-pressure green room or staring down the lens of a judgmental casting

Yoga has also helped manage performance anxiety. Before a major show, I do five minutes of deep belly breathing backstage.

It centres me, slows the mind, and replaces fear with focus. In an industry where you're constantly being compared and evaluated, that internal silence is gold.

A Global Career

One of the beautiful things about yoga is its portability. You don't need fancy equipment or a full studio. I've practised in airport lounges, on hotel balconies, and in between wardrobe changes. My yoga mat is the most important thing I pack more important than makeup or heels.

It offers a sense of continuity in a life full of change. Wherever I go, my practice brings me back to myself. It's a daily ritual that

reminds me that while my schedule, location, or agency may change, I remain

Beyond the Self: A Bigger **Purpose**

This year, the theme for International Yoga Day — "Yoga for Self and Society" — couldn't be more fitting. In modelling, we're often encouraged to focus inward, to compete, to perfect. Yoga teaches the opposite: that true growth happens when you look beyond the mirror.

Over the last year, I've been running small yoga circles for newer models — short 30minute sessions to help them ease into the chaos of their first fashion weeks. It's my way of giving back. Many of them have told me they sleep better, feel less anxious, and are better able to deal with industry pressures. That, to me, is the real power of yoga — it creates ripples far beyond the

Trump claims monumental damage inflicted on Iranian nuclear sites

resident Donald Trump asserted on his Truth Social platform that Iran's nuclear sites sustained "monumental damage" in the American attack, though a US assessment on the strikes is still underway.

"The biggest damage took place far below ground level. Bullseye!!!" he wrote.

US defence officials have said they are working to determine about just how much damage the strikes did.

Belarusian dissident vows to fight on, after five years in prison

¬iarhei Tsikhanouski is Salmost unrecognisable.
Belarus' key opposition figure, imprisoned in 2020 and unexpectedly released on Saturday, once weighed 135 kilograms at nearly 6'4" tall, but now is at just 79 kilos.

On Saturday, Tsikhnaouski was freed alongside 13 other prisoners and brought to Vilnius, the capital of neighbouring Lithuania, where he was reunited with his wife, exiled Belarusian opposition leader Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, and their children. Speaking to The Associated Press the day after, Tsikhanouski tries to smile and joke, but struggles to hold back heavy sighs recalling what he endured behind

"This is definitely torture," Tsikhanouski told The Associated Press in the first sit-down interview since his release. Prison officials "kept telling me: You will be here not just for the 20 years we've already given you.' We will convict you again," he said.

"They told me that 'You would never get out.' And they

kept repeating: You will die here." One of Belarus's most prominent opposition figures, Tsikhanouski said he "almost forgot how to speak" during his years in solitary confinement. He was held in complete isolation, denied medical care, and given barely enough food. "If you had seen me when they threw only two

He was sentenced to 19 years and six months on charges widely seen as politically motivated. His wife ran in his stead, rallying crowds

across the country. Official results handed Lukashenko his sixth term in office but were denounced by the opposition and the West

Lukashenko has since tightened his grip, securing a seventh term in disputed January 2025 elections. Since mid-2024, his government has pardoned nearly 300 prisoners - including US citizens - in what analysts see as an attempt to mend ties with the

Monday, June 16, Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Canada to participate in the G7 Summit in Alberta. This visit is an important rematch, occurring more than ten years after his previous trip to Canada in April 2015, which was at the invitation of then-Prime Minister Stephen Harper. Significant transformations have unfolded since Harper's electoral loss in October 2015, marked by Justin

Trudeau's rise to power. The increasing political influence of Khalistani narratives in Canada has been notable, alongside Trudeau's ill-fated trip to India in 2018 and the ensuing efforts to depict India negatively. This trajectory reached a peak with the public claim that "agents of the Indian Government" were involved in the June 2023 assassination of Khalistani activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

The accusation resulted in the removal of high commissioners, the halting of visa services, and a significant freeze in diplomatic relations between the two nations. The invitation to the G7 serves as a strategic move to repair relationships and initiate

a subtle reestablishment of connections at the highest echelons, all while avoiding the visibility and political hazards associated with a separate bilateral meeting. Trudeau faces scrutiny not

only for the allegations surrounding Nijjar but also for his ongoing involvement in Indian domestic affairs, including his backing of the farmers' protests. Trudeau's choice to exit the political arena has successfully eliminated a longstanding source of annoyance and the emblematic figure representing the pro-Khalistan stance within Canadian governance. The Canadian political land-

scape was significantly disrupted by Trump's threats of tariffs, his renegotiation of trade deals, and his open thoughts about incorporating Canada as America's "51st state". The outcome: a clear triumph for Mark Carney, the former Governor of both the Bank of Canada and the Bank of England, who ascended to the role of prime minister with a substantial presence in Parliament. His primary opponent, Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre, was perceived as being overly aligned with Trump's ideology. In the meantime, Jagmeet Singh, the leader of the NDP, which ranks as the third largest party, and a prominent advocate for Khalistani causes, faced a significant setback, further reducing a source of tension in the relationship between India and Canada.

This underscores the compelling strategic rationale for Canada to fortify its ties with India. India, characterised by its vast and expanding consumer market, a burgeoning middle class, and a strong demand for energy, technology and infrastructure investment, presents a ularly in cases where Indian

mate security concerns, partic-

diplomats experience targeting or intimidation disguised as protected speech.

Canada considers the murder of a Canadian citizen within its borders to be a serious violation of its sovereignty. India has firmly rejected any allegations, labelling them as "absurd and driven by ulterior motives." As four Indian nationals face trial for the murder of Nijjar, New Delhi is ready to allow the Canadian legal proceedings to unfold as intended. The ongoing dialogue regarding law enforcement and security provides a structured platform to tackle these issues through recognised avenues.

That is why Prime Minister Mark Carney engaged with the leader of the world's largest democracy without hesitation.

The result-PM Mark Carney had ample grounds to take pride in the achievements of the Canadian presidency. "In Kananaskis, Canada's leadership demonstrated our commitment to forging new

international partnerships, strengthening alliances and guiding member nations into a transformative era of global collaboration."

Canada possesses the essential resources that are in high demand globally, along with the admirable values that many strive to emulate. "Canada is addressing this moment with intention and resilience," stated Mark Carney. Following the address by the Canadian Prime Minister regarding his G7 presidency, Mark Carney and Narendra Modi engaged in a

private meeting.

between India and Canada has

faced significant strain, particularly following events in September 2023, when Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau accused Indian government agents of being involved in the assassination of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a Canadian citizen and Sikh separatist leader. This scenario has led to a significant diplomatic impasse, marked by the removal of diplomats and a suspension of trade discussions. While both parties have expressed a readiness to revitalize their relationship, deeply rooted challenges, particularly concerning the Khalistan move ment and perceived external interference, continue to pose

substantial barriers. The Indian Modi Government has been blaming the Canadian Trudeau government for giving space to extremist and anti-India elements for years. Because of that, the dynamics between Canada and India have notably deteriorated, particularly concerning matters of Khalistan advocacy and associated security issues. Finally, recent developments indicate that Canadian security agencies have officially recognised the threats posed by specific factions within the Khalistan movement, representing a notable change in Canada's stance on these activities. Following a 15-year period during which former Prime Minister Justin Trudeau denied the issue, the Canadian

Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) has now officially documented concerns regarding Khalistan activities in its reports The 2024 annual report from CSIS highlights that individuals with Khalistani extremist views are actively functioning in Canada, engaging in fundraising, disseminating propaganda and strategising violent actions, primarily aimed at India.

The report marks the initial occasion on which Canada's intelligence agency has formally recognised these activities as a matter of security concern. That is an issue that the former prime minister did not recognize. He views it as an expression of free speech.

The acknowledgment from CSIS presents a major obstacle to Khalistani groups functioning within Canada. The formal documentation of activities by the intelligence agency as a national security threat carries serious consequences for various

Firstly, there appears to be a significant change in the approach taken by Canadian authorities regarding the evaluation of these Khalistani activities. This could result in heightened monitoring, inquiries, and possible legal measures against organisations considered a threat. Furthermore, the official documentation establishes a structured approach for improved collaboration between security agencies in Canada and India. This could limit the operational flexibility that certain groups have historically experienced within Canada.

Also, the official recognition by CSIS carries substantial consequences for the diplomatic ties between Canada and India. The documentation offers authoritative confirmation of longstanding Indian security concerns that have been highlighted over the years. This advancement may significantly shape upcoming diplomatic interactions and collaborative agreements between the two countries.

Nonetheless, the circumstances are intricate, as certain Canadians have also recognised threats posed to Canadian residents by individuals from India.

Ultimately, the CSIS assessment signifies a transition from Canada's earlier, more lenient position to a heightened emphasis on security measures. Nonetheless, the effects are expected to differ based on whether their actions are classified as protected political expression or if they venture into activities considered threatening by security agencies.

As we progress, this development could shape the operational dynamics of the Khalistan movement in Canada, likely necessitating a more defined separation between non-violent political engagement and actions deemed extremist or threatening by security agencies.

With time and a new leader. "Of course, domestic politics will continue to shape Mark Carney's policies, but I think when there is a change of Government or leadership, there is always an opportunity for a fresh start."

That is also likely to happen between India and Canada and both countries will likely move to normalise the relationship." Despite Trudeau's constant damage to bilateral relations, I think there is an opportunity now to reset the relationship and rebalance it.

he Ministry Statisftics Programme Implementation(MoSPI) on Monday announced the setting up of a technical expert group under chairmanship of Surjit S Bhalla to advise on an income distribution survey tentatively scheduled in 2026.

The technical expert group (TEG) will guide the National Statistics Office towards conducting an all-India income distribution survey, tentatively scheduled for 2026, a ministry statement said.

The MoSPI has constituted a TEG under chairmanship of Surjit S Bhalla, former Executive Director of India, International Monetary Fund.

The expert group will provide guidance with regard to finalisation of concepts and definitions, preparation of the survey method and instruments, sampling design and



method of estimation and incorporate best practices as adopted across the world.

The survey will also strive to assess the impact of technology adoption on household income (wages).

The TEG will also provide guidance for finalisation of the survey results and report for release. In addition the chairman and several official from MoSPI and other ministries/ departments, other members of the TEG are Aloke Kar, Former India's Consumer Economy, School of Economics.

The TEG may seek assistance of subject matter experts within and outside the Government and may co-opt them as members according to necessity with the approval from the competent authority.

The TEG may invite subject experts in the meeting as special invitee, if necessary, in order to meet specific requirements. The National Sample Survey (NSS) is internationaly recognised for the pioneering scale and scope of its household surveys, conducted annually and quarterly on a wide range of subjects since its

inception. The first survey was launched in 1950 and since then NSS has played a crucial role in providing data-driven insights for policymaking. However, despite its extensive experience, NSS has not yet undertaken a comprehensive full-fledged survey on income

Adani pilots off-grid green hydrogen plant

dani Group has commissioned India's first Amissioned mana monomorphisms of the megawatt green hydrogen pilot plant in Kutch, Gujarat, the conglomerate said in a statement on Monday.

An off-grid green hydrogen plant is a facility that produces hydrogen using electrolysis powered by renewable energy sources, such as solar or wind, and is not connected to the main electrical grid. This means the plant relies entirely on its own renewable energy generation for the hydrogen production process. The five MW plant has been

built by Adani New Industries Limited (ANIL) — the clean energy unit under the group's flagship firm Adani Enterprises Ltd. Calling it a key milestone towards enabling India's National Green Hydrogen Mission, the group said the successful commissioning demonstrates technical feasibility and sets a benchmark for off-grid, renewable-powered industrial applications of green hydrogen and its derivatives in



emissions-intensive sectors. "The state-of-the-art plant is 100 per cent green-powered by

solar energy and integrated with a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS), enabling it to operate completely off-grid. This represents a new paradigm in decentralised, renewable-powered hydrogen production," the statement said.

Hydrogen is the lightest and most abundant element in the universe. It is also the cleanest form of energy, producing just water vapour when burnt.

Hydrogen is colour-coded based on how it's produced and the associated environmental impact. When produced from fossil fuels, it is grey.

"This breakthrough reinforces the Adani Group's commitment to innovation, sustainability and leadership in the emerging green hydrogen economy. n a step towards powering India's remote and underserved areas, Tata Power Delhi Distribution Limited (Tata Power-DDL), in partnership with Japan-based Nissin Electric Co. Ltd., has commissioned the country's first Micro Substation equipped with a Power Voltage Transformer (PVT). This innovative power solution has been installed in Sector 22 of Rohini, North

Delhi, and is currently supply-

ing electricity to around 20 to

30 families as part of a trial. The Micro Substation is equipped with a specially designed Power Voltage Transformer that has the unique ability to directly convert extra high voltage (EHV) electricity from overhead transmission lines to low voltage electricity suitable for home use. This allows areas that lack grid infrastructure to still benefit from transmission lines passing nearby, eliminating the need to build costly and spaceconsuming substations.

An official associated with the project highlighted the cost-efficiency of the innovation: "To build a traditional

power network in remote or challenging areas typically costs around ₹50 to 60 crore and requires a lot of land. But with this PVT-based Micro Substation, the same can be done in less than ₹2 crore and with minimal space." "Additionally, the project can

cater the power requirements of 50-60 families with one micro power substation, which is best suited for areas with lesser density." he added.

The project aims to tackle one of India's long-standing issues — supplying reliable and affordable electricity to places where power grids are

either underdeveloped or completely absent, but where highvoltage transmission lines are already available. With a growing need for decentralised and efficient power systems, especially in remote terrains and space-constrained urban settlements, this Micro Substation represents a practical and futuristic solution

This pioneering project is part of the "International Demonstration Project on Japan's Energy Efficiency Technologies," led by the New Energy and Industrial Technology Development Organisation (NEDO), a

Japanese Government-backed body. The journey started in January 2024, when NEDO signed a Letter of Intent with India's Power Finance Corporation (PFC), followed by a formal agreement between Tata Power-DDL and Nissin Electric in August 2024.

One of the features of this Micro Substation technology is that it removes the dependency on diesel generators in rural mini-grids. Diesel generators are not only costly to operate but also contribute significantly to air pollution and carbon emissions. In contrast, the PVT system promises lower opera-

tional costs, minimal maintenance and a major reduction in carbon footprint, aligning with India's "24x7 Power for All" mission, said the officials.

In urban contexts too, the micro substation offers benefits. As cities grow and space becomes a premium, building new power infrastructure is increasingly difficult. This compact substation model provides a reliable alternative, especially in areas where the grid is under stress during peak demand, such as during the scorching summer months. Tata Power-DDL, which cur-

rently serves nearly 9 million consumers in North Delhi, has taken full control of the pilot project. The company, along with Nissin Electric, will monitor performance metrics such as power quality, reliability, and operational efficiency over the coming months. If successful, the model is expected to be replicated in other parts of India. As per the officials, the partners have already initiated discussions with Odisha's power distribution companies to identify future sites where this model can be deployed. Site visits and action plans are being prepared to scale the solution to other regions.

7ith the escalation of Iran-Israel conflict, rice exporters in Haryana — which accounts for 30 per cent of the country's basmati rice shipments to Iran — are struggling with major disruptions in ship movements and payment delays. While Karnal is the main hub of basmati exports, Kaithal and Sonipat too contribute to the foreign demand.

"The ongoing Iran-Israel conflict has impacted the trade," said Sushil Jain, Rice Exporters Association's State unit president. "Nearly 10 lakh metric tonnes of Basmati rice is exported from the country to Iran, of which Haryana's share is about 30-35 per cent," he said, adding that shipments of about one lakh metric tonnes of basmati rice for Iran are stuck at ports. tock market benchmark Sindices Sensex and Nifty tumbled on Monday, as intensifying tensions in the West East after the US bombed three major nuclear sites in Iran unnerved investors.

Besides, selling pressure in IT, tech and auto stocks amid elevated global crude prices dented market sentiments, traders said.

After losing over 900 points in day trade, the 30-share index recovered some lost ground to close with a loss of 511.38 points or 0.62 per cent at 81,896.79. During the day, it tumbled 931.41 points or 1.13 per cent to 81,476.76.

As many as 2,204 stocks declined, while 1,854 advanced and 182 remained unchanged on the BSE. The 50-share NSE Nifty dropped 140.50 points or

0.56 per cent to 24,971.90.
"The entry of the US into the Israel-Iran conflict heightened tension as panic selling by investors triggered major correction in early trade. Also, if oil prices shoot up rapidly due to the ongoing war, higher import bills would lead to a fast decline in the local currency against the dollar and weigh on inflation. "However, FIIs turning out buyers of local

shares worth over ₹10,000 crore in the past 4 sessions shows that India's strong fundamentals continue to attract foreigners despite global uncertainty," Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd, said. The US bombed three major nuclear sites - Fordow, Natanz and Isfahan - in Iran, directly engaging itself in the Israel-Iran conflict.

From the Sensex pack, HCL Tech, Infosys, Larsen & Toubro, Mahindra & Mahindra, Hindustan Unilever, ITC, Tata Consultancy Services and Maruti were the biggest laggards. In contrast, Trent, Bharat Electronics, Bajaj Finance and Kotak Mahindra Bank were among the gainers.

The BSE smallcap gauge climbed 0.57 per cent, and the midcap index rose 0.20 per cent. Among BSE sectoral indices, BSE Focused IT lost 1.48 per cent, IT tanked 1.46 per cent, teck (1.10 per cent), auto (0.88 per cent), FMCG (0.62 per cent), telecommunication (0.50 per cent) and bankex (0.38 per cent).

Retails credit grows at slower pace in Q4

he retail credit market continued to see a softening in the last quarter of 2024-25, as new loan originations (partly a measure of credit demand and supply) grew at a slower rate of 5 per cent in March 2025 against 12 per cent a year ago, according to a report. The slowdown was despite the RBI slashing its benchmark lending rate by 25 basis points to 6.25 per cent in February.

This and other factors pushed the Credit Market Indicator (CMI) to a two-year low of 97, according to TransUnion CIBIL's June 2025 Credit Market Report.

A higher CMI reading indicates improving credit market health, while a lower reading indicates a decline.

"The muted demand was more pronounced among consumers 35 years old or younger. Consequently, the share of New-to-Credit

(NTC) consumers that lenders supplied decreased by three percentage points during the same period, given that a large share of younger consumers constitute the NTC segment," it said.

The slowdown was despite the RBI slashing benchmark lending rate by 25 basis points

However, it said, signs of improving credit performance emerged, particularly through consistent month-over-month declines in credit card delinquencies from January to March 2025. The slowing of credit demand from younger consumers was evident from the fall in the share of enquiries from those aged 35 years or younger to 56 per cent for the quarter ending March 2025, down from 58 per cent in the quarter ending

Shooters to compete in national selection trials

■ ndia's top shooters will be seen in action again as the national selection trials 3 and 4 for Group 'A' athletes commences at the Trishul Shooting Range here from Tuesday.

These trials will help in selecting the Indian team for the 16th Asian Shooting Championships 2025 in Kazakhstan in August and ISSF World Cup in Ningbo, China, in September.

The first day of the trials will see the stage 1 qualifying round of rapid fire pistol men, which has been divided into three relays. Three finals of T3, 10m air rifle men, 25m rapid fire pistol men and 50m 3 positions women are scheduled on the second day of competitions.

The shooters come into this selection phase following an encouraging run in the double-legged South American ISSF World Cup tour, which marked the beginning of the new international calendar and also the recently-concluded Munich

leg of the World Cup.
Across all three legs in Argentina, Peru and Munich the Indian shooters reached 39 finals, including mixedteam medal rounds, and brought home a total of 19 medals, eight of them gold.

Suruchi Singh, who created history by becoming the first Indian to win gold in three consecutive world cups, Munich gold medallists Arya Borse and Arjun Babuta, Olympic medallists Manu Bhaker, Sarabjot Singh and Swapnil Kusale, current World Cup medallists Saurabh Chaudhary,

Neeraj Chopra aims win at Golden Spike Athletics

orced to skip the last two editions due to fitness issues, Indian javelin throw superstar Neeraj Chopra will look to claim the title when he makes his debut at the Golden Spike Athletics meet on Tuesday, an event that his coach Jan Zelezny won nine times in a storied career.

The 27-year-old Chopra has had an impressive season so far, having won his first Diamond League title in two years in Paris after also breaching the elusive 90m mark during his second place finish in Doha DL in May.

He was to take part at Golden Spike — a World Athletics Continental Tour Category A event — in 2023 and 2024 but had to skip the meet on both occasions. In 2024, he was present as a guest after opting out of competition due to an adductor muscle niggle. The double Olympicmedallist will be all the more eager to win the title as the Golden Spike was world record holder Zelezny's happy hunting ground during his playing days. The Czech legend, now 59, won nine titles between 1986 and 2006 — few of them with 90m-plus throws - in this prestigious event

which was first held in 1961. Chopra has competed in Ostrava in the past but not at Golden Spike. He was part of the Asia Pacific team that competed in the IAAF Continental Cup in 2018 and



had finished sixth with a throw of 80.24m.

"When I was kid, I watched lot of videos and photos of athletes such as Usain Bolt competing here. I came last year but I didn't compete because of injury. Now I feel good, but I don't want to put any pressure on myself for 90m. But I'll try really hard," Chopra said ahead of the competition on Tuesday.


